An Extreme Stitch in Time

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Citrus Heights-area student athletes know when it's time to purchase a high-quality varsity letterman jacket, there's only one place to go.

That's Extreme Stitch Embroidery at 7250 Auburn Blvd., Suite F, which will celebrate its 20th anniversary in early 2023, said owner Wendy Hamby.

Extreme Stitch Embroidery, a family-owned and operated company began in Hamby's Loomis home and has been growing steadily ever since.

"We weathered the pandemic, have outlasted all our competition and continue to thrive," said the mother of two sons, graduates of Mesa Verde

and Del Oro high schools.

Extreme Stitch serves private and public high schools throughout Sacramento and Placer County, including six high schools in the San Juan Unified School District. The Citrus Heights company creates 350 or more custom-designed letterman-style jackets each year, she said.

Her student-athlete customer base is 60 percent male to 40 percent female. Each jacket is unisex and made in the United States.

Hamby has added additional embroidery equipment since the competitors have left the local market and is looking to hire staff, "no experience required" who can help her keep pace with a growing work demand, she said.

Customers see the walls of Extreme Stitch adorned with every kind and combination of school colors, mascot logo and team sports patches from which to choose from. While walk-in customers are typical, Hamby has received telephone orders from customers in Stockton, Vallejo, and as far away as Massachusetts and even Texas, she said.

Student-athletes work one-on-one with her to determine the personal design of each jacket's school colors and patch arrangement. Each jacket, Hamby said, "makes a statement on campus and will highlight your achievements, school spirit, and your own personality."

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On Sept. 27, 2022, San Juan Unified Board of Education meeting it was announced by unanimous vote that current Deputy Superintendent of Schools and Programs Melissa Bassanelli has been selected as San Juan Unified's next superintendent of schools. She will assume the role starting Jan. 1, 2023.

"Melissa demonstrated a deep and thoughtful understanding of the work that San Juan Unified is engaged in, combined with new ideas on how to address some of our most pressing challenges," said Board of Education President Dr. Michael McKibbin. "Her inquiry-based style of leadership can help us evolve and reach new heights in how we provide services to students and families."

Bassanelli has been San Juan Unified's deputy superintendent of schools and programs since 2019 with responsibility for the Division of Teaching and Learning. She played a key role in the development, implementation and refinement of the district's strategic plan, Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP), Expanded Learning Opportunities (ELO) plan and Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER) plan. Prior to her current position, she served as the assistant superintendent of elementary and K-8 education, director of professional learning and curriculum innovation, director of extended learning and support programs, and as a vice principal and principal. ★

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The former Patelco Credit Union building at 5499 Sunrise Boulevard at the corner of Uplands Way may have a "sweet" future ahead of it.

A building permit application by San Diego-based Schuss Clark Brandon Architects Inc. of San Diego on August 11th on behalf of their client, See's Candies, headquartered in South San Francisco, is described as "tenant improvements to an existing building."

The permit application was returned to the architect on August 16th by the Citrus Heights building department with comment

for further review.

"Our review of their application was quick,"

said Susan McLendon, development services technician for the city building

department. "The city had some specific concerns

Low-Cost Clinic Keeps Pets Healthy and Home

clinic's affordable microchipping services on the third Thursday of every month, as well as prevent illness. Pets with up-to-date vaccinations and preventive care are protected from illnesses including heartworm, kennel cough, Bordetella, parvo and Lyme disease. If unvaccinated animals contract illnesses, an owner may face costly treatments and surgeries for these preventable diseases. And when pets receive rabies vaccinations, it not only helps to prevent them from contracting the disease from bats, skunks, and raccoons, but it also protects residents from contracting the virus if bitten by an infected animal.

Licensing can be done at the same time as vaccinations and microchips for as little as \$15. Owners may also conveniently purchase a license online. This inexpensive service proves a pet's ownership and home address, and animals found by County animal officers can be returned immediately to the home, saving the stress of a shelter stay for the animal and the owners.

Vaccinations, microchipping and licensing cost a small fee that proves priceless when owners have safe, healthy pets at home where they belong.

Don't have a pet? The Bradshaw Animal Shelter has many available pets for adoption looking for loving homes. Adoptions include spay/neuter surgery, vaccines and microchipping. Visit the Bradshaw Animal Shelter's website to view a list of adoptable pets. ★

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Pet owners whose animals venture outdoors can be keenly aware of the possible dangers to their animals, such as rabies and other illnesses as well as pets becoming lost. However, indoor animals may occasionally get out and face the same risks. In partnership with VIP Pet Care, the Sacramento County Bradshaw Animal Shelter offers low-cost vaccination and microchip clinics every third Thursday of the month, 3 - 5 p.m. at 3839 Bradshaw Road, Sacramento, CA 95827.

In addition to keeping pets healthy, the clinic focuses on making sure pets can safely find their way home. Most pets who get lost and find their way to the shelter have no identification tags and no microchip, making reunification difficult.

For only \$30, pet owners

can buy the extra security that has proven to reunite many owners and their pets. Though visible tags are the first line of identification for animals, they may wear off, fall off or get lost. Unlike traditional ID tags, permanent microchips can contain owner contact information, pet information and Bradshaw Animal Shelter's contact information, and most vets and shelters can easily scan them.

"A microchip greatly increases the chances your pet will be returned to you when lost," said Annette Bedsworth, Director of the Bradshaw Animal Shelter. "It just takes a moment to scan, and then we can quickly reunite pets with their families. Sadly, most pets who enter our shelter are not microchipped, and we have seen many beloved pets stay for several months before their owners finally tracked down where they were. It's heartbreaking."

we wanted the architect to address and we're looking forward to their reply."

Schuss Clark Brandon has designed several ground-up retail centers and tenant improvement spaces, according to its website. As of now, the project is on a tentative hold pending the resolution of a landlord-client issue, said a representative of Schuss Clark Brandon Architects, Inc. in a telephone interview.

Patelco Credit Union in Citrus Heights closed its two-story branch office at 5499 Sunrise Boulevard at the corner of Uplands Way on Friday, July 22nd and has since moved to a new location in the Marketplace at Birdcage, 6100 Birdcage Lane, Suite 125.

Branch manager Crickett Luna said at the time of the credit union's July move to Birdcage in Citrus Heights that a considerable amount of office furniture and other furnishings were left behind in the former branch on Sunrise Boulevard for re-use by the new owners.

The two-story, 10,000-square foot former bank building was built in 1978. Bank offices were located on the second floor. The branch also featured two drive-up banking lanes which may be repurposed for retail sales according to an initial drawing.

Nearby local businesses include a Boston's Pizza across the street along Sunrise Boulevard and a nearby Olive Garden Restaurant.

since the mall's opening in 1972. Store management said they had been asked about the pending new location in the former credit union branch and referred all comments to See's corporate office in South San Francisco.

Susan Portman, corporate director of public relations at See's Candies corporate office did not respond to a request for further comment concerning the planned Citrus Heights new location.

The company founded by Charles See, his wife Florence, and his mother Mary in Los Angeles, California in 1921. See's Candies retail shop locations typically feature a candy counter where customers can either create their own custom-mixed box of chocolates and candies to order or purchase boxed chocolates, truffles, nuts and chews, lollipops, and sugar free candy. ★

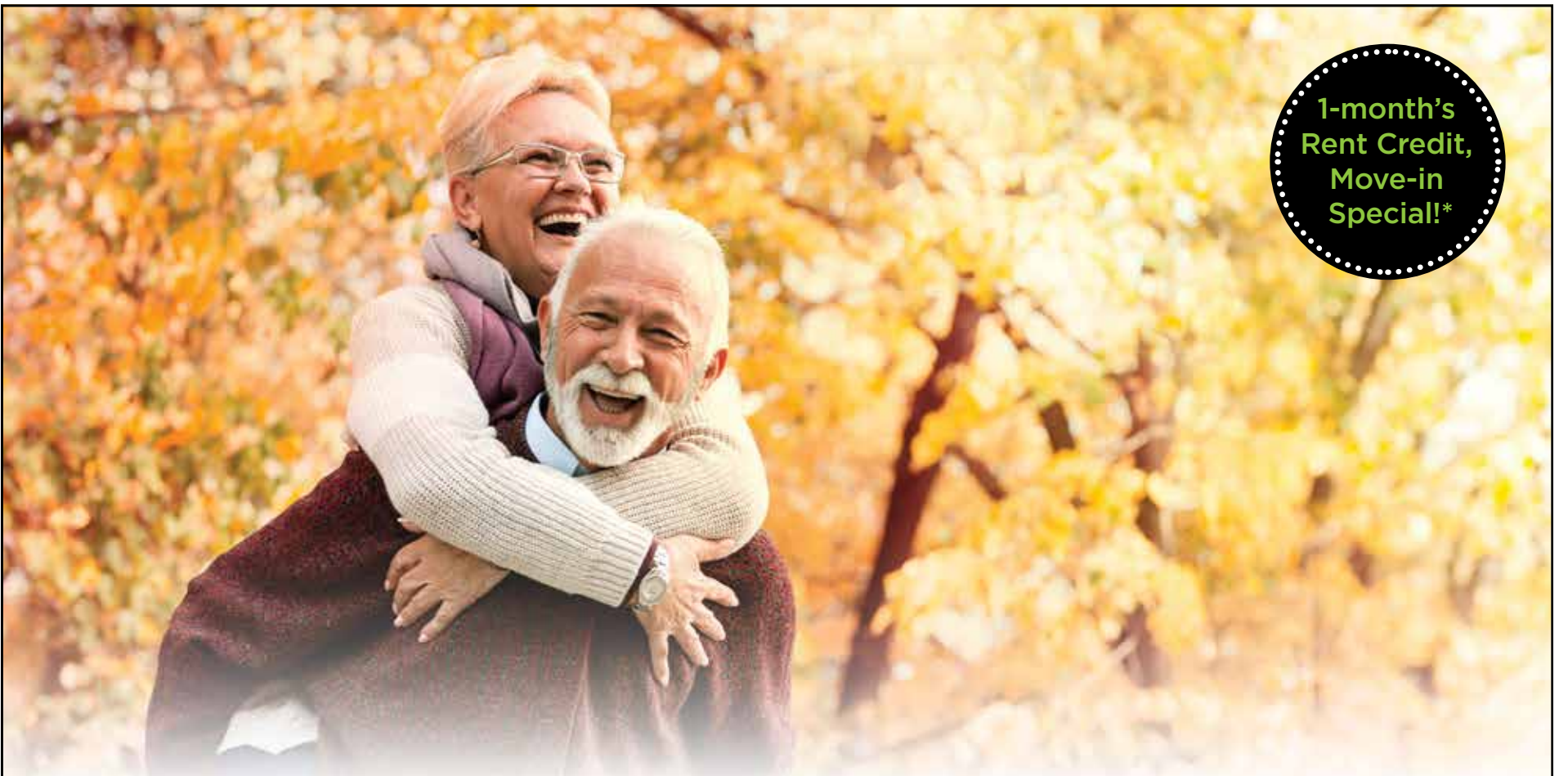

jacket to precisely fit each customer. The cost of a custom-fit varsity jacket in a customer's choice of school colors is about \$450, up about \$50 due to supplier costs. Jackets are available in all sizes, youth through adult, Hamby said.

"We require a small deposit of \$200 down to pay for the cost of the jacket. Customers can then make payments on their jacket until they pay the balance off."

"The turnaround time delivery for a typical letterman jacket is 6-8 weeks. All jackets are tailor-made to order and are altered as needed to precisely fit each customer." Student-athletes should place their jacket order now to be ready for pickup in time for June graduation, she said.

Adult customers who may want to reproduce a jacket in the colors of their own high school alma-mater can place an order as well.

Hamby's business offers a variety of embroidery and printing services to the general public. Customers can order garments from a variety of vendors or bring in their own items. Extreme Stitch

specializes in tackle twill, chenille embroidery, and direct to garment printing.

Caps for a golf tournament or aprons for a barbecue can also be done in an economical and timely fashion, Hamby says. Her goal is to provide her customers with "the best possible price, the fastest service and the highest quality."

Extreme Stitch also offers custom embroidery and design services for clubs, companies, associations, and teams.

The company offers personalized merchandise customized to their client's specifications. They offer stock designs with exacting attention to detail and quality. Custom logos can also be created. Digital production equipment makes the addition of text or other graphics simple.

Grant Highlights Safety Messiah Lutheran Holds a Crafty Saturday

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- A federal grant is helping the California Highway Patrol (CHP) increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety throughout the state. The CHP was awarded \$1.2 million in grant funding through the Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety, Education, Enforcement, and Awareness Program (BESEEN) program. "The most vulnerable roadway users are pedestrians and bicyclists," CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray said. "This grant will promote the importance of drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians looking out for one another so that everyone can safely share the road."

In California, nearly 20

percent of all traffic-related deaths are pedestrian and bicycle fatalities. In 2020 and 2021 combined, 926 of the 4,651 people killed in crashes throughout CHP jurisdiction were pedestrians and bicyclists. This grant launches a yearlong effort to educate and enforce traffic safety laws for drivers, bicyclists, and pedestrians through September 30, 2023. Enforcement patrols will focus on areas with higher bicyclist and pedestrian traffic and crashes. Officers will also conduct public awareness campaigns in communities throughout the state. In addition, this grant funds bicycle safety training and educational presentations to promote safe and courteous traffic safety behaviors by drivers

and bicyclists, as well as safety publications, bicycle helmets, reflective gear, and other vital safety equipment. October is National Pedestrian Safety Month with National Walk to School Day on October 12, 2022. CHP officers in plainclothes will work with uniformed officers to monitor crosswalks and areas surrounding schools for motorists who fail to yield the right-of-way or who take unsafe and illegal actions. Funding for this program was provided by the California Office of Traffic Safety through a grant from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

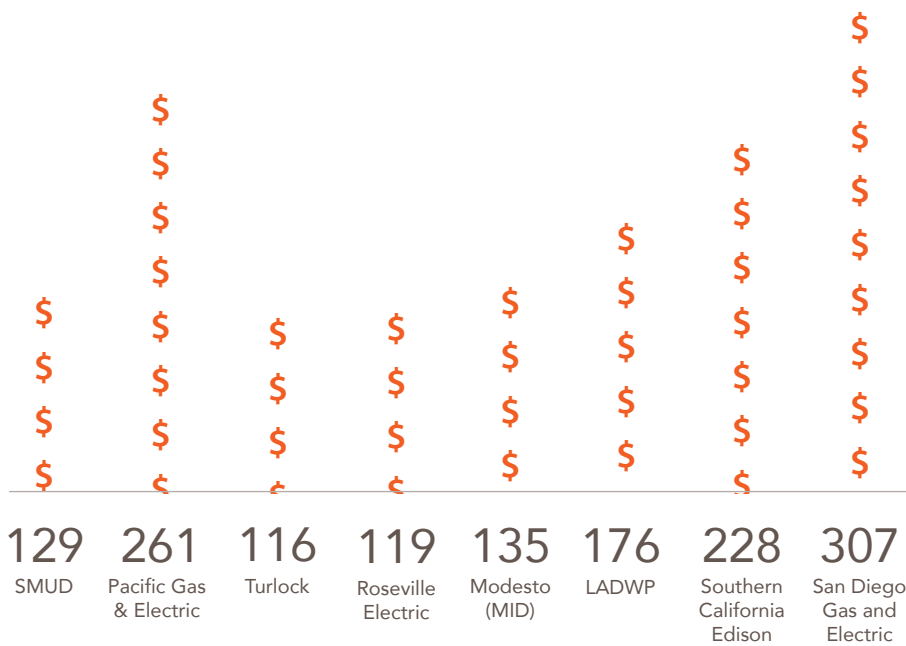

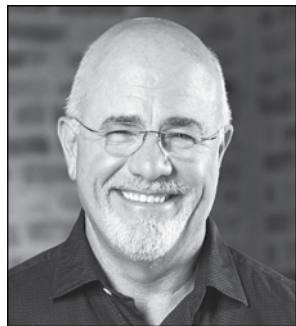

Measure A on November Ballot will Make Long-Awaited Improvements

Yes on Measure A News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The citizens' initiative Measure A on the November ballot will fund long-awaited improvements to Sacramento County's roads, bridges and transit system. Every city and community in Sacramento County will benefit.

The Yes on Measure A campaign represents a broad-based coalition led by labor, business, transportation, air quality advocates and others. The initiative will raise \$8.5 billion over 40 years to improve the quality of life for all Sacramento County residents, reduce traffic congestion, improve air quality, and help drive economic growth for decades to come. Measure A must receive more than 50% of the vote to become law.

"Sacramento voters have an opportunity to support an \$8.5 billion generational investment in local transportation infrastructure," said campaign Co-Chair Michael Quigley, Executive Director of the California Alliance for Jobs. "A vote for Measure A is a vote for transportation improvements residents have long demanded — improved road safety, expanded transit access, better air quality and more jobs."

Measure A's highest priority is to fix potholes and repave deteriorating streets. In addition, it will invest in: Safer streets, intersections and routes to school; American River Parkway safety, maintenance and preservation; Bike and pedestrian improvements

throughout the region; Senior and disabled transportation improvements and reduced fares; Congestion relief and freeway interchange modernization; A new south-county expressway connecting Highways 50, 99 and Interstate 5 to reduce congestion and shorten travel times between Folsom and Elk Grove.; Extension of Light Rail to the Airport; Improvements to major commute routes through our neighborhoods; Critical steps to fight climate change; Bus/light rail safety and service improvements; Creation of over 3,000 good-paying jobs.

Measure A will require citizen oversight, audits and annual public reports. And it will provide the local financial match to secure hundreds of millions of additional state and federal investment dollars.

The ballot initiative will require compliance with state and federal environmental laws and mitigation of greenhouse gas impacts to meet regional goals. A formal agreement between Sacramento Transportation Authority and Sacramento Area Council of Governments ensures regional coordination and compliance with these provisions.

Measure A also includes projects that will finally address needed river crossings: Replacing the 111-year-old I Street Bridge across the Sacramento River. Supporting planning for a new American River Bridge from downtown Sacramento to South Natomas.

DWR Takes Actions to Support State's Future Water Supply Strategy

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- On September 29, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) announced new steps that, if approved, could save enough water to supply 4.7 million Californians annually while making conservation more affordable through financial assistance and tax exemptions. The actions improve long-term water conservation and reduce wasteful outdoor water use as California adapts to a hotter, drier future driven by climate change.

The new actions will build on California's ongoing long-term efforts to make water conservation a way of life while advancing water efficiency efforts outlined in California's Water Supply Strategy: Adapting to a Hotter, Drier Future. DWR will be implementing and supporting actions that include:

Outdoor Water Use Recommendations

To help prepare for a hotter and drier future, DWR has submitted outdoor water use efficiency recommendations to the State Water Resources Control Board. With outdoor water use accounting for 50 percent of urban residential water use on average, the recommendations outline standards that would provide urban retail water suppliers with a framework to support more efficient outdoor residential water use. The framework will also include standards for the irrigation of large commercial, industrial, and institutional (CII) landscapes in their service areas.

DWR's outdoor water use recommendations combined with indoor residential water use recommendations submitted in November 2021 would result in expected long-term water savings of 450,000 acre-feet per year starting in 2030 – enough water to supply about 1.6 million homes or about 4.7 million residents for both indoor and outdoor annual needs. The recommendations would also result in near-term savings of 100,000 acre-feet a year starting in 2023. DWR's recommendations will be evaluated by the State Water Resources Control Board through a formal rulemaking process, which will include additional analysis, engagement, and opportunity for public comment.

Indoor Water Use Legislation Signed

California also recently took additional steps to increase indoor water use savings with Governor Newsom's signing of Senate Bill 1157 (Hertzberg), which adopts recommendations made by DWR and the State Water Board last year to reduce indoor water use targets to 47 gallons per day by 2025 and 42 gallons by 2030. By adjusting indoor water use standards to reflect the joint recommendation of DWR and the State Water Board, the legislation will help increase water conservation and water use efficiency, ensuring a more water-resilient future for California.

Financial Assistance for Turf Transition and Conservation

DWR has developed a set of funding programs that will help build resiliency in all communities including underrepresented communities and Tribes. The funding programs include financial assistance for projects that strengthen resiliency in urban communities, turf transition for residential and commercial landscapes and water conservation programs for urban water suppliers. DWR's programs will help to clear some of the hurdles that underserved communities face with direct install programs and support for local water agencies, while also helping build resiliency with equity in mind. DWR plans to release these grant programs in October. These new programs will build on the momentum created by the millions of dollars in grant funding that has been distributed by DWR in 2022.

Turf Tax Exemption

For those making smart water decisions to replace their lawns now and, in the future, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bill 2142 (Gabriel), which will exempt from state income tax calculations any grant, rebate or additional financial assistance awarded from a state or local agency for turf transition. The law will provide the exemption through tax year 2027.

New Study Proves Breastfeeding Sheds COVID Shot mRNA

A new study published on September 26 by the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) warned women who received the COVID shot regarding breastfeeding their infants younger than six months.

The study included 11 healthy lactating women who were asked to collect and immediately freeze samples of their breast milk after receiving either the Moderna or Pfizer shot within six months of delivering their newborn babies. Of the 11 volunteers, six received Pfizer and five received Moderna injections during lactation. After vaccination, breast milk was analyzed for the presence of mRNA nanoparticles. Seven samples from five women were positive for the

presence of mRNA with the samples appearing in higher concentrations than whole milk. The participating women also provided breast milk samples before vaccination and for five days post vaccination.

The study said, however, that no vaccine mRNA was detected in pre-vaccination or post-vaccination samples beyond two days of collection.

The study warns, "Caution is warranted about breastfeeding children younger than 6 months in the first 48 hours after maternal vaccination until more safety studies are conducted. In addition, the potential interference of COVID-19 vaccine mRNA with the immune response to multiple routine vaccines given to infants during the first 6 months of age needs to be considered. It is critical that lactating individuals be included in

future vaccination trials to better evaluate the effect of mRNA vaccines on lactation outcomes."

In addition, page 12 of the Pfizer documents that were released by the FDA as part of a court-ordered disclosure schedule stemming from an expedited Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request reveals that out of 133 breastfeeding vaccinated mothers reported, there were 17 cases of adverse events in breastfed infants. Three of them were "serious." These adverse events included pyrexia, rash, infant irritability, vomiting, diarrhea, insomnia, etc.

Liberty Counsel Founder and Chairman Mat Staver said, "The evidence continues to unfold that these COVID shots are neither safe nor effective, and babies are now victims in this massive cover-up. This is a crime against humanity." ★

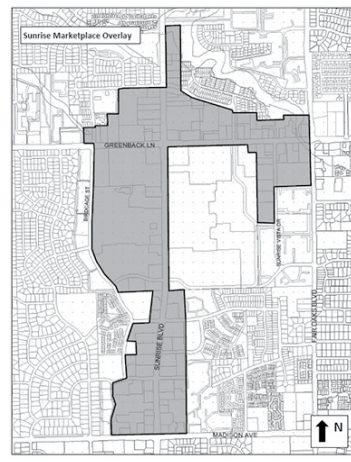

Zoning Amendment - Sunrise MarketPlace Overlay (PLN-22-22)

The City Council will be considering a Zoning Code and Zoning Map amendment which will establish the Sunrise MarketPlace Overlay Zoning District. The overlay zone will prohibit certain automobile focused land uses including, but not limited to gas stations (Service Stations), car washes, and vehicle services/repair, storage facilities (mini-storage) within the proposed boundary. The Planning Commission reviewed the proposal on September 28, 2022 and recommended approval.

Environmental Determination: The project is exempt from CEQA under the "common sense" exemption because the project establishes increased land use regulations and does not involve a physical effect on the environment per Section 15061(b)(3).

Election Fraud Ten Times Bigger than '2,000 Mules'

After the release of "2,000 Mules," Gregg Phillips told the Arizona Assembly, "We do indeed have a matter brewing that is 10 times bigger than the Mules." That information was disclosed in The Pit Conference held August 13, 2022 in Arizona sponsored by True The Vote investigative journalists and founders Gregg Phillips and Catherine Engelbrecht to journalists gathered to hear more of what was discovered ("China Interfered in the 2020 Presidential Election, After All," Harold Pease, Ph. D., LibertyUnderFire.org).

When True The Vote proved in "2000 Mules" that domestic vote fraud was more than enough to have "elected" Joe Biden,

that was the most serious crime in American history – even a coup to overthrow the president of the United States. But their research also documented collusion between many high profile Americans with a foreign country, China. For Americans "knowingly" involved this was treason as well and for a foreign country, an act of war against the United States (See. 18 US Code 2384 Seditious Conspiracy and 18 U.S. Code 2381-treason).

Phillips and Engelbrecht took their documents to the FBI. At the lower levels of the organization they received support and encouragement but as the evidence went up the ladder, hostility. The FBI began accusing them of having stolen their documentation from China (X22 Report, Ep. 2849b, Aug. 15, 2022, 18:55). They found themselves being investigated by the FBI instead of the FBI investigating the server in Wuhan University that had a data base on 1.8 million Americans, – everyone who had worked as a volunteer in an election in the United States – and their private personal information, collected and stored by the

China Communist Party. Some Americans had colluded with the Chinese government in what is potentially the crime of the millennia – at least since Columbus in 1492 discovered America. The China Communist Party (CCP) was in the very center of the plot. This was a new type of **conquest from within and by infiltration rather than by invasion; most certainly ten times bigger than "2000 Mules."**

This bothered them immensely. "The national security agencies of the federal government should have taken action long ago. The fact that private citizens are having to expose the CCP infiltration of national security structure and take action while the DOJ FBI, CIA, NSA, Cyber Command and CISCA are either caught napping to this threat or are complicit in covering it up, is infuriating and alarming." (X22, Ep. 2866b, Sept. 4, 2022, 29:25) Given the FBI reaction at the top and their efforts to censor the Hunter Biden laptop from the 2020 Presidential Election information, we suspect the latter. If they "knowingly" covered up the China connection they were working for a

foreign government.

With collusion and censorship by the Deep State media and the national security agencies of the federal government, True The Vote had to form their own investigative body. They needed other investigative journalists to prob further with them. They called their group of "over 100 experienced thinkers and researchers," The Tiger Project. One of these, Brian Cage, wrote: "The Tiger Project was explained to us and then we were asked for help. We gave it!"

On Telegram he framed what was already documented. These follow: 1) "Almost all the software code in the ABS platform is being used to run elections in hundreds of U.S. counties ... written by programmers from the CCP" (China Communist Party). 2) These were "owned by CEOs running companies with direct ties to the CCP." 3) "CCP law means whatever code they write, whatever app they own, any platform they have a right to take digital information on the Apple platform and download it to China because they own it. It's theirs. [If] you use a CCP owned and connected digital highway the information you

put into it can become their property. If you're on WeChat or Tick Tock get off now." 4) "And since they own the data and it belongs to them, once the data is inside mainland China they can do whatever they want with it." 5) "It was discovered by Catherine Engelbrecht and Gregg Phillips of True The Vote that China has been downloading some of the data running over these CCP connected EMS apps and platforms. The detailed personal identification, PII, from 1.8 million US election workers is just the start of what the CCP considers itself to own." 6) "CCP wrote the code for and manages and operates the EMS system in multiple countries, and it considers all the data it gets its hands on via the EMS system, to be theirs and they can do whatever they see fit with it." 7). "This makes removing the CCP controls and affiliates so for apps and platforms from the US election system in hundreds of U.S. counties a serious matter of national security" (X22 Report, Ep. 2866b, September 4, 2022, 25:00-30:00).

He told us what must be done after the country is fully awakened to the

fact that "our election system has been corrupted by a hostile foreign power." Then all "CCP controlled affiliate EMS apps and platforms" and machines must be discarded and we must return to only paper ballots.

Thus far Deep State platforms have given no rebuttal to the information respecting the Pit findings or the Tiger Project. It, as with its predecessor "2000 Thousand Mules," benefits from an enemy that argues with silence and censorship. But with a team of a hundred investigative journalists attempting to discover and report more fully this coup, LibertyUnderFire will have opportunity to share more details later.

What we do know is that China operates an election management system that is used in hundreds of our cities and counties that allows them to influence our elections, perhaps select our leaders as well as per Biden, and thus they have conquered half of America without their firing a missile or a bullet. We also know that they have records and personal data on at least 1.8 million U.S. election workers plus their families, the vast majority of Americans oblivious to it all. ★

New Laws Trade One Gerrymander for Another

California once had a history of epic political and legal battles over redrawing legislative and congressional districts after each decennial census.

The Legislature, dominated then as now by Democrats, would create maps that enhanced the party's prospects of gaining, or at least holding, power and if the governor was a Democrat, the gerrymandered districts would become law.

That happened after the 1980 census when then-Gov. Jerry Brown signed redistricting bills that were especially one-sided. The late Congressman Phil Burton, who largely drew weirdly shaped, but highly partisan, congressional maps called them "my contribution to modern art."

The initial set of maps was challenged by Republicans via referendum and voters rejected them, but Democratic legislators and Brown simply passed slightly amended versions.

However, if the governor happened to be a Republican, he would veto the Democrats' maps and the state Supreme Court would step into the impasse and appoint a special master to draw replacement maps that tended to favor neither party. It happened under Republican Gov. Ronald Reagan after the 1970 census

and 20 years later under GOP Gov. Pete Wilson.

A twist on the process occurred after the 2000 census. Although a Democrat, Gray Davis, was governor, leaders of both parties agreed on what amounted to a bipartisan gerrymander, freezing in place the partisan status quo in the Legislature and congressional delegation. An indirect threat that the Republican-led U.S. Justice Department would thwart a Democratic gerrymander forced the compromise.

The obvious self-interest of Capitol politicians dictating the shape of legislative and congressional districts ultimately sparked a backlash — a 2008 ballot measure to shift legislative redistricting to a 14-member commission of five Democrats, five Republicans and four declined-to-state independents. Two years later, voters extended the commission's authority to congressional districts.

The professional politicians in both parties didn't like losing their authority. Democrats were particularly unhappy since they had legislative majorities and the national party tried to thwart having the commission change congressional districts.

Nevertheless, the commission drew new districts after the 2010 and 2020 censuses and while their maps may have been imperfect, they more fairly captured the population's very diverse makeup.

So if it's a good idea at the state level, why not for local governments, such as city councils, county boards of supervisors and school boards, which are just as prone to self-interested redistricting?

In 2016, the Legislature

decreed that a 14-member commission would redraw districts of Los Angeles County's five-member Board of Supervisors. A year later, virtually identical legislation was passed for San Diego County and this year, clones were enacted that affect Fresno, Riverside and Kern counties.

All five measures, however, deviate significantly from the state model of even-handed party representation. They require that county redistricting commissioners reflect the partisan makeup of each county's registered voters.

That means Democrats dominate the Los Angeles and San Diego commissions and will do so in Fresno and Riverside counties as well. Republicans have a slight voter registration edge in Kern County, however.

In effect, therefore, these county redistricting commissions are being stacked to enhance the power of the dominant local party — exactly contrary to the party-neutral intent of the state commission.

Sponsors of the local bills said they were needed to prevent county supervisors from gerrymandering their own districts. But as constituted, the local commissions will be empowered to create gerrymanders of a different kind.

Institutionalizing party control of local redistricting also further undermines California's historic commitment to non-partisan local government. That's not progress.

Aerospace Museum: We Did Do It!

MCCLELLAN, CA (MPG) - The Aerospace Museum hosted its second annual STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) 'We Can Do It' event on Saturday, September 24, 2022. The co-chairs Heidi Sanborn and Linda Martin put together an experience meant for girls in junior high and high school. The program encourages them to consider studies and careers in math, science and engineering. Specializing in aerospace technology from multiple eras, the Museum is uniquely situated to provide this.

Statistically, girls participate in STEM endeavors less than boys. Twenty-six percent of STEM participants are female. The program leads interests in such areas as robotics, space and many other math-based careers. Also offered are the satisfaction of career choice as well as challenges in scientific and intellectual pursuits of all kinds. For the intellectually curious, these paths are not only personally rewarding but also beneficial to a technologically based society. The Aerospace Museum called on Rosie the Riveter as a mascot for the Saturday event. During World War II, women became involved in assisting the Allies by working in factories. Iconic views of Rosie the Riveter appeared on t-shirts worn by volunteers, attendees and staff. They also sported red scarves with white dots

following the female factory workers of the 1940s.

A story about women who broke ground laying the foundations for the U.S. space program became famous recently in the movie Hidden Figures. The Museum is currently working on a mural featuring famous women in the history of aviation. Also prominent on the museum floor is a display highlighting women historical figures in science and math.

Spearheading the Saturday encounter were two co-chairs, both highly passionate about students becoming involved in STEM activities. Linda Martin is the Museum Board's President and was formerly an Assistant Supervisor of the San Juan Unified School District, one of the Sacramento area school districts and located nearby the museum. She feels strongly that girls

should be exposed to science and math so that doors can open, and women can enter careers in the field. For this, role models and mentors are needed.

Heidi Sanborn is the other co-chair of the event. She is an elected official on the SMUD Board. Her

other passion is waste and recycling. She was instrumental in getting California State SB 54 passed which will aid in achieving zero carbon in packaging by 2030. As the daughter of a chemist, she was inspired to look into a STEM career herself and has been

challenged and inspired by it. She wants the community to know that STEM activities at the museum are monthly and a strong focus of the facility. San Juan Unified School District partners with the Aerospace Museum. As a great illustration of support, girls were bussed from various junior high and high schools to attend the event. The busses were packed with girls representative of the cultural diversity in the Sacramento region. They visited the planes, used program passports to show their viewing of various displays and connected with career mentors. On the lighter side, snacks were enjoyed, pictures with friends were taken, a few stepped into cultural dance steps as the disc jockey played lively and cultural tunes with a beat around and

had pictures taken, generally enjoying themselves. The general atmosphere was both entertaining and educational

Volunteers and staff are an integral part of the venue on special days like 'We Can Do It'. Phyllis Caesar, a former principal in SJUSD, was enjoying her first volunteer event at the museum. Liz Stowell, a passionate STEM advocate, has been at the museum for quite some time. She began as an air traffic controller in New York and then went on to work with high voltage power grids. Her father was a pilot and bomber in World War II, so she has had an interest in aviation for a long time.

Elliot Lopez entered into the spirit of the day by sporting the bandana and t-shirt. He has been part of the educational support staff at the museum for a few months and loves his job there, as do many of the other enthusiastic staff.

A panel of speakers took the stage in the afternoon to discuss their careers and interests in STEM and hopefully inspire others to participate in like pursuits.

Since the museum does not receive local or state funding, it relies heavily on its support partners and Saturday was no exception. SJUSD paid for and provided the busses for enthusiastic junior high and high school students. SMUD brought giveaways and information. The Girl Scouts, a local robotic team, and volunteers from St. Francis High School in Sacramento also participated. ★
