Council Considers Funding Requests for Public Services

citrus Heights, ca (MPG) - At the October 13 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered the 2023 allocations for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The grant is used to fund capital projects and public service agencies, as well as cover the cost of administration.

Citrus Heights is expected to receive approximately \$600,000 in CDBG funds for 2023, and the City must submit a Draft Action Plan and Funding Recommendation to HUD, outlining the plans for the grant. An estimated 20% of the funding will go to administration at \$120,000 and \$390,000 will be allocated to capital projects. The remaining \$90,000 will be distributed to public services agen cies in the community that applied for funding.

The proposed totals for the public services allocations for 2023 are \$10,917 to Campus Life Connection for their Sayonara After-School Program, \$11,655 to Meals on Wheels for their Senior Nutrition Program, \$16,000 to Sacramento Self-Help Housing for Housing Counseling and the Homeless Navigator program, \$22,524 to Sacramento Self-Help Housing for the Renters Helpline, and \$28,904 to Sunrise Christian Food Ministry for the ongoing Emergency Food Closet. If the City receives more funding than currently estimated, the extra funding will be added into the pub-

lic services allocations.

The proposed capital projects for CDBG funding would include citywide accessibility improvements, such as installing or repairing sidewalks and installing ADA-compliant pedestrian ramps, as well as relocating drainage inlets at various locations.

The City also has \$270,960 in unexpended prior-year CDBG funds, which it was recommended be used to fund the City's

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Kings sixth year guard De'Aaron Fox recently partnered with the Albie Aware Breast Cancer Foundation to surprise local breast cancer survivors.

Fox and Albie Aware were joined on the surprise squad by Kaiser Permanente and the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District on October 7.

"The Sacramento Kings, Kaiser Permanente, Metro Fire and Albie Aware have come together to celebrate breast cancer survivors," said Courtney Quinn, breast cancer survivor and executive director of Albie Aware Breast Cancer Foundation. "Also, we are creating awareness as many individuals missed their breast cancer screenings throughout the pandemic and Albie Aware is here to provide this support in the greater Sacramento area."

According to Albie Aware, Sacramento County has a higher death rate due to breast cancer than state and national averages. Additionally, the county did not reach its Healthy People 2020 goals for mammograms in the past two years for women ages 50-74.

"A cancer diagnosis can be life-changing for so many, and Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento is committed to providing our patients with high-quality, compassionate care," said Claudia De Young, MD, an internal medicine physician at the Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento Medical Center, who also runs the breast clinic and breast cancer survivorship program. SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert warns the public that rainbow fentanyl pills are now in the Sacramento community. Law enforcement has recently made the first significant rainbow fentanyl fake M30 pill seizure in the Sacramento region.

These colorful fentanyl pills look exactly like Smarties candies, and they are designed to attract kids and teens.



Quick facts include: Fentanyl is deadly: just a few grains can kill; Fentanyl is everywhere: fake pills, powders, party drugs, now rainbow pills disguised as candy; 99% of Oxycodone M30 pills seized and tested in Sacramento County

contain fentanyl; It's virtually impossible to tell if a pill, or any form of a drug, is fake and contains fentanyl; If a drug didn't come from a pharmacy, assume it contains fentanyl.

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -A parcel map application was submitted recently that lays out a footprint for a potential hotel at the corner of Sunrise Blvd and Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights. The proposed hotel land use at the 2.8acre site supports the vision set forth in the Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan to redevelop the 100-acre Sunrise Mall property into a mixed-use destination with multifamily residen-

tial, retail, entertainment,

hospitality, office and community space.

Applicant Antioch Street Limited, LP acquired the property last year in part because of the potential the Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan creates: "The Specific Plan's long-term vision added to our enthusiasm about this acquisition and we are excited to be part of it," says General Partner Patrick Ellwood.

Antioch Street Limited, LP is engaged in discussions with Presidio Companies, a prominent hotel developer and hotelier headquartered in Davis, CA who has developed and operated hotels under Hilton, Hyatt and Marriott brands. Presidio Managing Principal Guneet Bajwa sees the Specific Plan's potential as well, saying, "Citrus Heights has great market potential and the Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan creates an opportunity for Presidio to tap into this key strategic location with the signature quality, destination-style product we are known for".

After the Specific Plan's approval in November 2021, the parcel map submission is an exciting next step in the City of Citrus Heights strategy to redevelop the aging mall, says Mayor Porsche Middleton; "Citrus Heights took charge of its own future by creating and approving the Sunrise Tomorrow Specific Plan. City leadership and staff have been working hard behind the scenes since then to advance projects, and this submission shows this work is yielding

After operating the train, the student engineer is promoted to 'junior engineer' and given a 'Junior Engineer' badge to wear.

New this year is the 'One Foot Challenge' inviting the public to create a scale model diorama in a 12"x12" square space. Think you're up to the challenge?

Dioramas must arrive at the IRF Fall Square Foot Challenge Table by noon on the Saturday of the show, October 22nd. The public will be able to vote until 3:45 pm. on Saturday. The votes will be tabulated, and the winner(s) announced at 4 pm.

"There's no restriction on what scale can be used, it just needs to be a scale model. Just create a big scene in a square foot," said Tom Campbell, who's overseeing the contest.

"Entrants must have at least one element that's related to railroads, and it must have at least one element that is related to the fall season which has a lot of creative possibilities."

Sac State Football Runs Away from Eastern Washington, 52-28

No. 5 Hornets Equal Best Start in School History at 6-0

CHENEY, WA (MPG) - Sacramento State rushed for a season-high 385 yards to pull away from Eastern Washington, 52-28, on Saturday at Roos Field.

The fifth-ranked Hornets improved to 6-0 overall and 3-0 in the Big Sky Conference. The six consecutive wins to start a season matches the school record, which was set in 1991, and is the best start in the Div. I era (1993-pres.). The Eagles, who have endured a brutal early season schedule, fell to 1-5 overall and 0-3 in league.

Sacramento State jumped out to a 21-0 lead only to have EWU tie the contest with 21 unanswered points of its own. The Hornets then closed the first half with a pair of touchdowns in the final five minutes and never looked back. The two teams combined for 56 points in the first half as Sacramento State entered the break with a 35-21 lead.

After the Hornet defense forced a 3-and-out on the opening drive of the game, the offense went to work with a methodical touchdown drive. Sacramento State rushed nine times during the series, and the points came on a 1-yard rush from Asher O'Hara.

The Hornets quickly added to that advantage when Brock Mather picked off Gunner Talkington and weaved his way into the end zone for a 22-yard touchdown. The TD was the second pick six for the Hornet defense this season, following Caleb Nelson's 98-yard return in the season opener against Utah Tech.

A wild sequence of events saw the Sacramento State throw an interception of its own and was followed by a big pass play from the Eagles to take the ball deep into Hornet territory. However, EWU had to settle for a field goal

attempt which was blocked by Jett Stanley and returned by Cameron Broussard across midfield.

Shortly after, Cameron Skattebo caught a screen pass on the left side of the field, hurdled a defender, juked another, and then ran through a third would-be tackler for a 37-yard touchdown reception. That touchdown gave the Hornets a 21-0 lead at the end of the first quarter and a 71-7 edge in the opening period this year.

Eastern Washington got on the board with a touchdown on the opening drive of the second quarter. The big play came on a 31-yard strike from Talkington to Jakobie James which took the ball to the 2-yard line. After being stopped on its next two plays, Talkington hit Jett Carpenter for a touchdown in the front right corner of the end zone.

The Eagles kept the momentum by forcing a fumble and then scoring two plays later on a 26-yard pass to Efton Chism. After a forcing a 3-and-out, Eastern Washington drew even on a 15-yard end around from Justin Jackson.

Sacramento State was able to thwart the run with an 8-play, 75-yard drive to move ahead, 28-21. The team had three plays of at least 10 yards during the drive and also drew a pass interference call in the end zone. O'Hara scored his second TD of the game with a 1-yard leap over the pile.

After a defensive stop, the Hornets provided the final points of the first half when Jake Dunniway hit Marshel Martin for an 11-yard touchdown to give the team a 35-21 lead at the break. The 35 first-half points tied Sacramento State's season best which previously came against Utah Tech.

The second half began with the Hornets piecing together a drive which abruptly ended when the Eagles picked off a pass in the end zone. However, EWU gave the ball back when a pass on a fake punt fell incomplete giving Sacramento State the ball at the Eagle 38.

A 28-yard run from Skattebo moved the ball to the 10-yard line before O'Hara scored his third touchdown of the game with a 5-yard scramble. The game marked the second time this season that O'Hara has rushed for three touchdowns, and he now has 11 TD's this season.

Less than two minutes later, Eastern found the end zone again to make it a two-score game, but any hopes of a comeback were dashed when Kyle Sentkowski converted a 36-yard field goal and Parker Clayton caught an 8-yard TD pass for the only score of the fourth quarter. The Hornets outscored EWU, 17-7, in the second half.

Sacramento State's 385 rushing yards were the third most in the

school's Div. I era, and the most since rushing for 392 against Cal Poly in 2000. Skattebo led the way with a career high 201 rushing yards (29 carries, 6.9 yards per tote) while O'Hara added 94 and Elijah Tau-Tolliver had a 57 yards on six carries.

The quarterbacks combined to complete 13-of-19 passes for 140 yards and three touchdowns. Skattebo, Pierre Williams and Marshel Martin tied for the team lead with three receptions.

Armon Bailey paced the Hornet defense with nine tackles, including two for loss and a pass breakup. Fellow linebacker Jeremy Harris had eight stops. Mather had five tackeles (three solos) and a quarterback hit to go along with his pick six.

Sacramento State returns home for its next two games. The first coming on Oct. 22 against Montana. The game will start at 8 p.m. and air nationally on ESPN2.



I am getting older, and health issues over the last year have made me begin thinking about selling my small business. I have spoken with a couple of potential buyers recently, and one of them seems to be the kind of person who would handle the company very well. How and when do I tell my employees about what is going on and what may happen?

In my mind, to be a good, effective leader you have to be willing to share and discuss things with your team - whether they're good or bad. When talking to the folks at my company, I

try not to get into a lot of too, in addition to knowing unnecessary stuff, but if there's any doubt, I'm going to over-share rather than leave them fearful, uninformed or confused.

Think about it this way. If the roles were reversed, and you were in their shoes, when would you want to know? If you'd worked for someone a few years, would you feel betrayed if you didn't know about something like this? It might sound simple, but I think that's a good, fair way to process the situation.

If I make a mistake with my team, it's always going to be in terms of over-communication. I expect and trust them to be mature adults in the workplace, and they know this ahead of time. Still, I try to make sure I'm very transparent about how we're doing as a team and as a company. No small business owner can be successful unless they have great people around them. Your team needs to hear that once in a while,

you're always going to keep them in the loop and shoot straight with them.

Human beings just want to be treated with dignity and respect. They want to know what's going on where they work. When it's something that impacts their day-to-day lives - and potentially their livelihoods they deserve to know the facts as quickly as possible.

OAKLAND, CA (MPG) - The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has delivered preliminary flood maps for Sacramento County and the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom and Sacramento. The maps identify revised flood hazards along Arcade Creek, Cripple Creek, Hinkle Creek, Humbug Valley Basin and Alder Creek tributaries. These new maps will help building officials, contractors and homeowners make effective mitigation decisions, thereby contributing to safer and more disaster resilient

Before the new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) become effective, there is a 90-day appeal period from Oct. 6, 2022 to Jan. 4, 2023. During that time, residents or businesses with supporting technical and scientific information, such as detailed hydraulic or hydrologic data, can appeal the flood risk information on the preliminary maps, which can be viewed at fema.gov/ preliminaryfloodhazarddata.

Flood hazards are dynamic and change frequently for many reasons, including weather patterns, erosion and community development. Officials from FEMA, Sacramento County and the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, and Sacramento worked together to provide updated information that accurately reflects the flood risk. These changes may also affect future building standards or insurance requirements.

The local mapping project is part of a national effort led by FEMA to increase local knowledge of flood risks and support actions to address and reduce the effects of flooding on new and improved structures. FEMA encourages residents to review the preliminary flood maps to learn about local flood risks, potential future flood insurance requirements and identify any concerns or questions about the information provided.

Risk of flooding affects almost every corner of the nation. In total, 98% of counties have experienced a flood event, which makes floods the most common and widespread of all weather-related natural

Community Gives High Grades to Local Bus Service

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - It's often said that a ride on the local bus can determine how good or bad a day is going to be. In the case of bus service provided by the Sacramento Metropolitan Transit District (SacRT), it's been a series of good days.

That's the feedback that resulted from a public meeting hosted by SacRT at the Carmichael Library on October 11, 2022. Anyone who had complaints or issues about local bus service in Citrus Heights or Carmichael was invited to show up. Not many did.

"A lot of what we do to improve bus stops and bus stop access (in Sacramento County) is work with our partners with the cities and counties," said SacRT's James Drake during the meeting. "We're out here tonight to check our work a little bit. We've done our own evaluations, but we're holding these open houses to take any questions about how we are doing."

Drake is a Principal Planner with SacRT. He told Messenger Publishing that his agency is holding five public hearings on bus service in the county. Additional meetings have been or will be held in South Sacramento, Rancho Cordova, North Sacramento and virtually as well.

"The overall goal of the project is to find the bus service or bus stop improvements that people want," Drake said. "SacRT has about 3,000 bus stops in Sacramento County, and we have customers who want more service, more neighborhoods and more stops in those neighborhoods."

The recent meeting did attract a small handful of SacRT customers like Jessica Williams of Citrus Heights. She uses the bus religiously to commute to her job at American River College.

"I feel safer riding the bus," she confided to Messenger Publishing. "I was in a car accident four years ago. Ever since

then it's been easier and safer for me to take the bus."

Williams gave SacRT glowing reviews, but did indicate that improvements could be made at some of the bus stops located on San Juan Ave. near Greenback. She also mentioned that she would like to see SacRT service extend east of Sunrise Ave. in Citrus Heights.

Citrus Heights is home to three distinct SacRT bus routes. The number one bus serves riders on Auburn and Greenback. The #21 bus serves all of Sunrise Ave. from the northern border south to Rancho Cordova. The #23 bus serves a portion of Fair Oaks Blvd., San Juan Ave., and Greenback Ave. to the Sunrise Mall.

Drake confirmed there is no regular bus route service east of Sunrise Ave. in Citrus Heights or SacRT routes in the Orangevale area. He told Messenger Publishing that there isn't much demand for regular bus routes east of Sunrise, but customers in those areas can still get service from Smart Ride Shuttles that offer curb-to-curb service

The results from a SacRT Community Survey held earlier this year should be released soon, according to the SacRT website. In addition, SacRT is hosting Community Walk Audits to gather additional feedback from residents, and identify issues with bus stops and other problems.

SacRT has partnered with a community organization called Civic Thread to help raise awareness about bus services and future open houses. Formerly known as Walk Sacramento, Civic Thread works at the regional and local level to elevate the needs of underserved communities.

Council Considers Funding Requests for Public Services

Critical Home Repair Grant Program to assist low-income homeowners with critical health and safety repairs.

Representatives from the public service agencies spoke during the public hearing for this item to describe their services and thank the Council for their support of these programs.

Council continued final action on this item until the October 27 meeting, when they will hold the final vote on the CDBG allocations.

The Council then considered a resolution to accept the 2022 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Funds. The Bureau of Justice Assistance partners with the Bureau of Justice Statistics each year to allocate federal funding that can be used to augment public safety expenditures.

The Citrus Height Police Department (CHPD) applied for \$23,593 in JAG funding in order to support the department's equipment and training initiatives, by replacing outdated laptops in police vehicles. The funds will allow the CHPD to purchase five tablets for their police vehicles, which the department says will support their goal to provide exceptional police services to the community and enhance officer safety.

The Council voted unanimously to approve the 2022 JAG funding for the CHPD

Council next considered amending the Citrus Heights Municipal Code to allow for the establishment of an underground utility district, which is a geographic area in which all overhead utilities are required to be installed underground and utility poles removed. Establishing an underground utility district is supported by the City's General Plan, which suggests undergrounding of utilities whenever it is feasible and on all new commercial development of private property.

In 2013, undergrounding of overhead utilities was completed on Auburn Blvd. between Sylvan Corners and Rusch Community Park as part of Phase 1 of the

Auburn Blvd. Complete Streets Project – the largest public works project that the City has undertaken. Now the City is finalizing plans for Phase 2 of the project, which will include undergrounding utilities on Auburn Blvd. between Rusch Park and the northern city limits. As part of that work, the existing utility providers are requiring the City to create an underground utility district to ensure all future utility installation along that corridor will be underground.

The current municipal code doesn't prevent a new utility company from coming in later and setting up overhead installation, and the City wants to prevent that from happening. Underground utilities are preferred due the aesthetics of a clean corridor and providing more space for pedestrians on the sidewalks.

This item has no fiscal impact because it would only amend the code. But if approved, then staff will come back at a later meeting to recommend the creation of an underground utility district that would encompass public right-of-way areas in both Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the Auburn Blvd. Complete Streets Project.

Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer asked if this would create more responsibility for the City when it comes to utility repairs, but staff clarified that the utility companies would still be fully responsible for all repairs and maintenance.

Regina Cave of the General Services Department explained that this code amendment is required in order to move forward with undergrounding as part of the Auburn Blvd. Complete Streets Project. The existing utility companies are requiring that this district be created to protect their investment in this corridor, to ensure that no future utility company can come in and erect poles and overhead utilities along this public right-of-way. Creating this district "demonstrates to SMUD and the other utility companies that their investment would be in perpetuity," said Cave.

Council voted unanimously to approve the amendment to the Municipal Code. ★

If you have a Medicare health or prescription drug plan, you should review the materials your plan sends you and make sure your plan will continue to meet your needs in the coming year.

If you need help understanding your plan and other options available to you, there is a free, state-registered non-profit organization in your area that can help. It is HICAP (the Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program.

HICAP's volunteer counselors can help you decide whether you want to:

Switch from Original Medicare to Medicare Advantage; Switch from Medicare Advantage to Original Medicare; Switch from one Medicare Advantage plan to another; Switch from one Medicare Part D prescription drug plan to another; Enroll in a Medicare Part D plan if you didn't enroll when you first were eligible for Medicare

HICAP is administered by the California Department of Aging. Its trained volunteer counselors are available in person, by phone or by video-conferencing to answer questions and help seniors and other eligible recipients understand their Medicare rights and benefits.

HICAP counselors can provide information about Medicare supplemental insurance (Medigap policies); Medicare Advantage plans; employee and retiree coverage; long-term-care insurance and how to appeal coverage denials.

Armed Suspect Apprehended

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - On 10/16/22, Citrus Heights Police Officers attempted to stop a stolen vehicle, but the driver fled from officers. The vehicle subsequently crashed, and the suspect fled from the vehicle with a firearm in his hand. The suspect forced his way into an occupied residence located outside Citrus Heights, within the unincorporated county of Sacramento. The residents were able to escape from the home, leaving the suspect inside. Sacramento County Sheriff's Office took over the incident and after several hours, the suspect was arrested.

At approximately 8:00 p.m., Citrus Heights Police were alerted to a stolen vehicle traveling northbound on Sunrise Blvd from Madison Avenue. Officers were in the area and located the vehicle. While waiting for additional resources, officers followed the vehicle out of Citrus Heights and into unincorporated Sacramento County. When the officers attempted to stop the vehicle, it fled, resulting in a short pursuit. The suspect vehicle collided with a tree, and the suspect fled on foot carrying a handgun. A Sacramento Sheriff's Office helicopter was overhead and confirmed the suspect was armed. The suspect attempted to get into a nearby residence and was unsuccessful. The suspect then jumped over a fence and forced his way into a home located in the 6000 block of Long Acres Court.

A resident came outside as officers surrounded the house and advised officers that his wife was still inside. As officers were preparing a plan to utilize a fire department ladder and rescue the female,

she jumped from a second-story window moments after the suspect forced his way into the room where she was hiding. The elderly woman was safely rescued by officers but was injured and transported to a local hospital for treatment of injuries resulting from the fall.

The Sacramento Sheriff's Office Special Enforcement Detail took over the incident and handled it as a barricaded suspect. After several hours, the suspect was arrested with the assistance of a Sheriff's K9. Citrus Heights officers transported him to a local hospital for treatment of his injuries. A firearm was recovered at the scene.

The suspect is identified as James Jarrad, a 38-year-old resident of Pittsburg, who was confirmed to be a parolee at large with a significant criminal history. Once treated for his injuries, he will be booked into the Sacramento County Jail on charges of Home Invasion, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Fleeing an Officer, and Elder Abuse.

Chief of Police Alex Turcotte said, "I am very proud of our policing professionals and regional partners. Whenever feasible, law enforcement officers utilize patience, de-escalation, and technology to obtain the safest possible outcome. This was a very dangerous situation that reached a positive resolution due care and concern of our emergency responders."

California Takes Action to Combat Illicit Cannabis Grows

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Taking aggressive action to protect communities, consumers and the environment alike, Gov. Gavin Newsom has directed the creation of a new multi-agency, cross-jurisdictional taskforce of enforcement agencies designed to better coordinate agencies combatting illegal cannabis operations and transnational criminal organizations.

This new "Unified Cannabis Enforcement Taskforce," which has been actively working since late summer, is co-chaired by the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and is being coordinated by the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) through its Homeland Security Division. The taskforce has been charged by the Governor to better align state efforts and increase enforcement coordination between state, local and federal partners.

"The State of California is committed to combatting illicit commercial cannabis activity which is causing pervasive harm to California communities, the environment, consumers and legal cannabis businesses," said Nicole Elliott, Director of DCC.

"We cannot allow harmful, illicit cannabis operations to lay waste to the environment or threaten our communities," said Mark Ghilarducci, Director of the Cal OES and the Governor's Homeland Security Advisor. "We are bringing together the combined law enforcement resources of our state, local and federal agencies in a coordinated enforcement action against these bad actors and criminal organizations."

"California has an abundance of public lands set aside for conservation, recreational use and the enjoyment of the people of this state," said CDFW Director Charlton H. Bonham. "Unfortunately, criminal organizations are impacting these areas by exploiting some of our most pristine public lands and wildlife habitats as grow sites for cannabis."

Since its inception, the taskforce has been actively coordinating with federal, state, local and tribal agencies to disrupt this illegal market, including: Combatting

the non-linear threat of transnational crime that extends to areas of California beyond the border and into some of most rural parts of the state. Establishing a new data sharing agreement which allows state and local enforcement officials to more broadly share information and cross-match data across jurisdictions. Leveraging and better aligning the authorities and legal provisions of federal, state and local law enforcement and regulatory agencies in conducting search warrants, indictments and maximizing arrests and prosecution of perpetrators, while also maximizing administrative, regulatory and civil penalties for bad actors. Disrupting human traffickers and illegal firearm and drug smugglers. Interdicting illegal cannabis shipments crossing California's borders. Coordinating with local police chiefs, sheriffs and federal officials to deploy personnel and equipment where needed.

By investigating, removing and reclaiming illegal grow sites as well as shutting down illegal manufacturing, distribution and retail operations, and by apprehending and applying meaningful repercussions to offenders and traffickers, state, local and federal law enforcement agencies are protecting consumer and public safety, safeguarding the environment, and depriving illegal cannabis operators and transnational criminal organizations of illicit revenue that undercuts the regulated cannabis market in California.

Large scale, illicit outdoor cannabis cultivation can be harmful to the environment. Non-compliant cultivation sites can negatively affect wildlife, vegetation, water, soil, and other natural resources when they utilize chemicals, fertilizers and terracing, and even poach local wild animals. Illegal cannabis cultivation results in the chemical contamination and alteration of watersheds, diversion of natural water courses, elimination of native vegetation, wildfire hazards, poaching of wildlife and harmful disposal of garbage, non-biodegradable materials and human waste.

Untested cannabis products also pose safety hazards to consumers, while all illegal activity undercuts the regulated market and hurts licensed cannabis business owners.

California Takes Action to Combat General Tree Squirrel Season Underway

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California's 2022-2023 general tree squirrel season is open from Saturday, Sept. 10, 2022, through Sunday, Jan. 29, 2023.

Tree squirrels may be taken only in open zones during the open season and in observance of the shooting hours for resident small game, which is one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset. A map of the state's tree squirrel hunt zones can be found on the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) website, along

with the full tree squirrel regulations.

Four types of tree squirrels are game species in California. The Western gray squirrel and the Douglas squirrel are both native to California while the Eastern fox squirrel and the Eastern gray squirrel have been introduced and not native to the state. These tree squirrels can be hunted under authority of a hunting license in California and no other validations are required. To learn more about how to hunt for these squirrels and their distributions, habitat and patterns, watch the "Hunting California Tree

Squirrels" recorded webinar on CDFW's YouTube channel.

A fifth species of tree squirrel, the Northern flying squirrel, is not a game species and may not be taken. Northern flying squirrels are small tree squirrels that are native to the boreal forests of North America and can be found as far south as the Sierra Nevada. They are seldom encountered due to their nocturnal nature and preference for mature forest habitats with complex canopy structure.

Tree squirrel population levels fluctuate from year to year based on prevailing weather conditions and the annual production of nuts, acorns and seeds for forage.

National forests provide some of the best opportunity to hunt tree squirrels in California. Bureau of Land Management lands and CDFW wildlife areas may also provide opportunity for squirrel hunting. As a friendly reminder, nonlead shot is required when taking any wildlife with a firearm anywhere in California.

The California DMV offers specialized options for seniors over 70 years old

The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) wants to help you maintain your driving independence for as long as you can drive safely. The DMV offers resources to help you take care of your DMV tasks from the comfort of your home or at your local field office. California drivers, aged 70 years or older, have until the end of 2022 to take advantage of a temporary rule that offers driver's license or identification (ID) card renewal online or by mail, even if a renewal notice states that the driver is required to visit a DMV field office. If you still need to apply for your REAL ID for the first time you will still need to visit a DMV field office to complete the application process. You can shorten your in-person visit at the DMV by starting the REAL ID application online and uploading the required documents before making an appointment at a field office.

Q: Are there other alternatives for DMV services besides online or in-person?

A: The DMV continues to develop innovative approaches to streamline processes and limit the time customers spend in field offices by offering many services online that used to require an office visit. In many instances, the customer starts the process online and then is contacted later by a DMV representative through email to complete the transaction. The DMV also increased the number of items that can be taken care of at a kiosk as well as increased kiosk language options.

Q: I am 70 years old and need to renew my license, but do not feel safe coming to a DMV office. What can I do?


A: Until the end of 2022, eligible senior drivers and REAL ID cardholders can renew noncommercial driver's license and ID cards at dmv.ca.gov/online or by mail, even if your renewal notice states a visit to a DMV office is required.

Q: Once I receive my renewal notice in the mail, how long should I wait to renew my driver's license or ID card?

A: If you choose to take advantage of the DMV's online services to renew, you should try to do so upon receiving your renewal notice in the mail. Keep in mind that driver's licenses and ID cards generally arrive in the mail within two to four weeks following renewal.





Something We Can All Agree On — We All Hate Measure A

We live in a time of extreme polarization, even more obvious during the run up to an election. But there is one issue on the Sacramento County ballot this November where almost everyone seems to agree. Organizations across the political spectrum urge a "NO" vote on Measure A.

Measure A would impose a countywide half percent sales tax increase that Sacramento area taxpayers would pay for the next 40 years, raising the sales tax in Folsom and Elk Grove to 8.25%, Sacramento City and Rancho Cordova to 9.35% - almost \$1 on every \$10 spent, \$10 on every \$100. The Measure is bankrolled by wealthy special interests like the Cordova Hills Development Corporation, who want taxpayers to pay hundreds of millions of dollars to build new roads that will enable them to profit or "line their pockets" by developing the surrounding land.

The proponents claim that the new tax will provide funding for needed roadway infrastructure, and these proponents primarily include developers and construction labor unions, as well as politicians who are indebted to them. Developers will benefit because road construction opens up new development opportunities.

Measure A includes 26 new capacity building projects that well exceed the 2020 "Metro Transportation Plan & Sustainable Communities Strategy" produced by the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) after years of analysis and negotiated agreement among the six counties (El Dorado, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Yolo and Yuba). The big prize is the Capital Southeast Connector, a

34-mile highway between Interstate 5 in Elk Grove and Highway 50 in Folsom. This idea was defeated in 2016, withdrawn at the last moment in 2020, and now tossed onto the ballot along with 25 other projects.

But look at who is opposing Measure A!

The Sacramento Taxpayers Association opposes Measure A because it exploits the "citizens' initiative," which only requires a majority vote, by using a loophole that would normally require a new special tax to require a two-thirds vote. The special interests who are sponsoring Measure A spent \$1.7 million (or \$22.25 per signature) to buy the signatures for it to qualify as a "citizens" initiative.

The Sierra Club and Save the American River Association oppose Measure A because it will promote sprawling development, create more traffic, and destroy hundreds of acres of open lands, wildlife habitat, and farmland, all of which help to take carbon out of our atmosphere and keep it there. The Sacramento County

Farmers Bureau is against it because it will destroy valuable agricultural land.

Environmental groups like ClimatePlan and 350 Sacramento urge a no vote on Measure A because it will exacerbate climate change and worsen our air quality. According to the American Lung Association, Sacramento consistently ranks in the top ten worst cities in the country for its poor air quality. Analysis by the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (which was peer reviewed) concluded that if the Measure passes, the region will likely fall short of meeting its state mandated climate goals, which in turn will jeopardize the region's ability to compete for billions of critical state and federal funding for affordable housing, infrastructure, and transportation.

Transit riders and the Sacramento Area Bicycle Advocates oppose Measure A because it heavily favors roads and cars over other options like transit, walking, and biking. Only 3% of the tax dollars raised would be spent on seniors and the disabled.

And the biggest surprise of all? Republicans and Democrats alike oppose the Measure. The Sacramento County Republican Party urges a no vote. On the other side of the aisle, the Environmental Democrats of Sacramento County, the Town and Country Democratic Club, Queer Democrats, and the American River Democrats are in opposition. The nonpartisan League of Women Voters, Sacramento, urges a no

And the list of strange bed fellows continues! Former Sacramento Mayor Heather Fargo (2000 to 2008); Michael McKeever, former Executive Officer of the Sacramento Area Council of Governments; the Libertarian Party of Sacramento County; the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association; and others from across the political spectrum have lined up to consistently oppose Measure A as there seems to be something for everyone to hate!

W. Bruce Lee, President of the Sacramento Taxpayers Association comments,

"They aren't concerned that this new tax will hit low and middle income households and seniors the hardest, at a time when we are already being crushed by inflation. This is why the NAACP and the National Action Network worked with us previously to stop this measure. Developers or land speculators aren't concerned about the fact that more cars and traffic will lead to more air pollution and health problems, or that more greenhouse gas emissions will worsen climate change."

Even the Sacramento Bee, which is generally pro-labor, says that "voters must reject Measure A." In their opinion, "The proposal was sponsored and dishonestly crafted by political operatives, mega-developers. and other special interests seeking to benefit from more than \$8.5 billion in taxpayer money. They concocted an initiative loaded with pet projects that will make them rich, counting on voter apathy in a midterm election and understandable frustration with the condition of local roads and infrastructure."





California Faces a Housing, Wildfire Conundrum

California must ramp up housing construction to reduce the ever-widening gap between supply and demand and ease the high shelter costs that drive families into poverty and contribute to the state's homelessness crisis.

However, given the seemingly nonstop series of uber-destructive wildfires California is experiencing, prudence dictates that we should also avoid housing construction in what's called the "wildland urban interface" where fires are most likely to have cataclysmic impacts.

The friction between those two imperatives is played out in the political arena, where officialdom makes land use policy.

A case in point: Two years ago, by overwhelming bipartisan majorities, the Legislature passed a bill that would have required local governments to make fire safety a major factor in approving housing developments in fire-prone areas by compelling developers to include protective features.

The measure was passed in response to a wave of killer fires, including the Camp Fire that destroyed the rural community of Paradise in 2018, killing 86 people.

Gov. Gavin Newsom vetoed the bill, saying

that while he supported as part of the environmenits aims it "creates a loophole for regions to not where best to place new comply with their housing development, and mitirequirements."

"Wildfire resilience must become a more consistent part of land use and development decisions. However, it must be done while meeting our housing needs," Newsom wrote.

In the absence of clear policy from the Legislature and the governor on limiting construction in fire-prone areas of the state, Attorney General Rob Bonta has intervened.

This year he joined forces with environmental groups to stall a huge housing and golf resort project in Lake County, where wildfires are a constant threat. A Lake County judge declared that local authorities and the developer had not paid sufficient attention to the Guenoc Valley project's vulnerability to fires.

basic fact: Local governments and developers have mostly a tinderbox. a responsibility to take a hard look at projects that exacerbate wildfire risk and endanger our communities," Bonta said. "We can't keep making shortsighted land use decisions that will have impacts decades down the line. We must build responsibly."

This week, Bonta took another step, issuing a set of guidelines that local authorities should follow ramp up pressure for more in assessing the potential housing construction, also wildfire dangers of proposed developments.

It declares that it's "imperative that local jurisdictions making decisions to approve new developments carefully working for California consider wildfire impacts newspapers.

Unveiling the policy in San Diego County, whose fast-growing inland communities are in constant peril from wildfire, Bonta said, "This is the new normal. When it comes to development, we can't continue business as usual. We must adjust. We must change."

Bonta's guidelines don't have the force of law, but they contain the implicit threat that his office will intervene if they are ignored, as it did with Guenoc Valley.

Avoiding housing in areas of extreme fire danger would seem to be common sense, but except for a narrow strip of land fronting the Pacific Ocean, the flatlands of the Central Valley The ruling "affirms a and the deserts of Southern California, the state is

Moreover, Californians prefer, if they can, to live in single-family homes in scenic locales and therefore developers want to comply with those preferences, which is why they propose projects such as Guenoc Valley.

The issue demands something more definitive than a document from the attorney general. Newsom and the Legislature should, as they delineate where it should and should not — occur.

New Owners of Former Tokyo Buffet File for Construction Permit

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - New owners of the former Tokyo Buffet restaurant building at 7217 Greenback Lane, shuttered since a fire occurred at the site in 2019, have filed a construction permit with the City of Citrus Heights to begin work on a new Japanese-style restaurant on the site.

The shuttered restaurant was purchased in 2021 for \$1.8 million by Lincoln-based Kobe Hibachi and Sushi, Inc. which will do business under that same name according to information previously published by

Kobe Teppanyaki & Sushi is listed as both the owner and builder of the project on construction plans submitted to the City of Citrus Heights on September 7, said Susan McClendon, a development services technician for the Citrus Heights Building Department.

"We reviewed their initial plan submission and then sent it back to the owner/ builder for corrections on September 8th. We've not heard further from them what their intentions are," McClendon said.

"Once they resubmit their revised plans

with corrections to us, we'll review them promptly to see if they've satisfactorily answered all of our concerns, and then issue a construction permit."

Kobe Teppanyaki & Sushi is a Japanese-Asian fusion style restaurant which features propane-heated, flat-surfaced teppanyaki grills where chefs prepare a meal of Kobe Beef, Lobster tail, or one of their combination plates right before their customers.

Workers erected scaffolding around multiple exterior walls of the restaurant in late September, but that has since been

Tokyo Buffet closed in August 2019 due to a kitchen fire that damaged the restaurant's heating, ventilation, and cooling system. The fire occurred during business hours and all patrons at the time were safely evacuated. Its original interior restaurant furnishings and tables remain in place.

A representative of Kobe Teppanyaki & Sushi, open at 131 Ferrari Ranch Road in Lincoln confirmed by phone that the new owners do intend to open their new restaurant in Citrus Heights under that name, but said opening date isn't anticipated until early 2023.



SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Saturday, March 29, 2008, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call regarding the discovery of possible human remains in the area of Tyler Island and the Georgianna Slough, located

in Sacramento County. Patrol deputies arrived to the location and determined the remains appeared to be human and requested Sheriff's Homicide Investigators respond to the scene. Over Investigators, Criminalist from the Sacramento County District Attorney's Laboratory of Forensic Services and the Sacramento County Coroners Office processed the scene and exhumed the remains. The Coroner classified the case as a homicide and determined the victim was most likely killed in the fall of 2004.

Over the past 13 years, Sheriff's Investigators and the Coroner's Office have worked to identify the victim. The investigation included reviewing hundreds of Missing Persons reports, providing the media with photographs of clothing and jewelry found with the remains as well as a composite drawing of what the victim may have looked like. A facial reconstruction, using the victim's skull, was also released to the media at the time but the victim

remained unidentified. In 2021, Investigators began a Genetic Genealogy Investigation. As a result of this investigation, the

the next 3 days, Homicide victim has been identi-(born 1969). Her identity has been confirmed with the DNA of a close familv member. Vielguth used several last names, including Judkins, Hutchings and Joyce. Investigators learned Vielguth was transient during the 6 months prior to her murder, staying in Missouri, Oklahoma, Kentucky, Colorado, Nevada, and California. Based on law enforcement records, Vielguth was most likely in Reno Nev., and Sacramento in October of 2004 which coincides with the time she was most


