Bill Signed to Crack Down on Street Racing and Illegal **Sideshows**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

On Monday, September 19, Gov. Gavin Newsom signed Assembly Bill (AB) 2000, which will prohibit street racing and sideshows from occurring in parking lots across the state.

The bipartisan measure, authored by Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel (D - Woodland Hills), aims to crack down on dangerous driving including street racing, "sideshows," and street takeovers - which continue to cause injuries and fatalities across California.

"Far too frequently, street racing and illegal sideshows devastate families, harm innocent bystanders, and cut short young lives," said Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel. "Communities in the San Fernando Valley and across California are sick and tired of this reckless behavior. I'm grateful for Governor Newsom's leadership on cracking down on this dangerous activity and signing this commonsense measure that will save lives across our state."

"AB 2000 will help us save lives and prevent further crashes and drivers going to prison for manslaughter," said Lili Trujillo, Founder and Executive Director of Street Racing Kills, a non-profit created in 2014 after Trujillo's 16-year-old daughter, Valentina, was killed in a street racing incident. "An exhibition of speed in a parking lot is way too common now and people are being hurt and killed, AB 2000 is definitely a great tool to help us save lives."

"There are countless stories every week throughout California about illegal street races and dangerous sideshows shutting down streets, causing accidents, damaging neighborhoods, and endangering lives," said Assemblymember Vince Fong (R - Kern County), a joint author of the measure. "They are unpredictable, destructive, and can lead to senseless deaths that devastate families. AB 2000 is an important and needed step in cracking down on illegal sideshows to make our communities safer."

Across the state, COVID-19 has caused a sharp rise in illegal street racing activity as drivers Continued on page 10

Candidates Discuss New Taxes

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -"I agree."

This is one of the most common lines spoken during a recent Citrus Heights City Council Candidates Forum hosted by the Chamber of Commerce. The event hosted at Heights Church on Sylvan Road drew six of the eight candidates that

are running for three City Council seats.

Two of the seats are up for grabs as the current officeholders have announced intentions to retire from public office. The third seat is currently held by Mayor Porsche Middleton. She is running for re-election, but also faces a challenger in political newcomer Natalee Price.

Ray Riehle serves as

Chair of the Chamber's Political Action Committee and presented a series of questions to the six candidates in attendance. The questions ranged from economic development, improving traffic corridors, dealing with homelessness and police department funding. Many of the candidates found themselves in agreement with others when it came to issues such as redeveloping Sunrise

Mall or criticizing previous City Council efforts to cut police funding. All six candidates offered sharply differ-

ent opinions, however, in response to managing the city's budget and the issue of raising taxes. Price, who owns and manages the Taste of Tuscany restaurant, is running for the City Council seat in District 5. She told Messenger

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -An exciting addition to the city of Citrus Heights is in the works, a project of the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band (CHCMB).

In an announcement to CHCMB band supporters, band manager Sarah Schmelzer released the good news: "It is my honor along with Bill Cook and Kody Tickner to unveil to you another momentous project that we are taking on in the Citrus Heights community! Our executive director Bill Cook will be renewing his contractor's license one more time to begin construction on the brand new 'Kathy Cook Amphitheater' to be built at Rusch Park.

The newly announced 'Kathy $C \circ o k$ Amphitheater' performing arts pavilion will be the largest outdoor stage in the entire region! It will be similar in purpose to the band shell at Carmichael

If all goes smoothly, it is our goal to break ground on this exciting new project by the beginning of 2023. We will be looking for municipal and corporate sponsors in the coming weeks to pledge their support.

The Kathy Cook Amphitheater will be a great addition to our wonderful city that will bring our community together to enjoy music, theater, dancing and much more."

The Sunrise Recreation and Park District will manage the facility which will be located on Antelope Road near the Historic Rusch Home and behind one of the ball fields. It is the perfect site as it sits next to a small transformer to provide power and has public bath2005 to serve as entertainment for the Annual Citrus Heights Red, White, and Blue Parade until its final parade in 2019. The community band experience has grown into a yearround, all ages, all talents performing arts experience which performs 20 times a year in events such as parades, concerts, sports events and band competitions.

Band executive director, Bill Cook, will be designing and constructing the massive outdoor stage at Rusch Park in Citrus Heights, which will be dedicated to the memory of the founder of the Citrus Heights Community Marching Band, Kathy Cook!

Continued from page 1 Publishing that she won't vote to raise taxes.

"A majority of our residents are on a fixed income," she said. "Many of them are still suffering from issues related to COVID, and I don't think I need to throw a tax hike at them.'

Candidate Steven Durham, who is running in the newly created District 2 seat, shares the same

"I'm not voting to put a tax hike on any ballot," he told MPG. "We are taxed enough. In fact, I think we should be taxed a little less. We need to attract developers who will help build a community and increase the tax base. You don't tax your way out of an issue."

Price and Durham offer a stark difference from the makeup of the current City Council. On

The positions stated by

July 23, 2020, councilmembers voted 4-1 to place a sales tax hike on the November ballot. It would appear as Measure M, which sought to hike the local sales tax a full percentage point from 7.75 to 8.75 percent.

The effort, which drew opposition and criticism from Councilman Bret Daniels, needed only a simple majority vote to pass. It failed. Nearly 53-percent of the Citrus Heights voters who cast ballots in the November 2020 election rejected it.

Three of the council members who voted in favor of placing the measure on the ballot chose to retire from office rather than run for re-election. This includes Jeff Slowey, who was replaced by current officeholder Tim Schaefer in 2020. Councilmembers Jeannie Bruins and Steve Miller also chose not to run for office again this year.

The lessons from the fallout that resulted from Measure M are not lost on candidate MariJane Lopez-Taff. She is also running for the District 2 seat.

"I know the sentiment that drew the no vote on Measure M," she told MPG. "People recognize and respect thoughtful processing of information rather than a simple yes or no. Tax proposals are anything but simple."

Lopez-Taff wouldn't rule out the

possibility of placing another tax hike measure on the ballot. Neither would candidate Al Fox, who is running for the seat in District 4. He previously served as an appointed member on the city council.

"Measure M was a very good idea," he told MPG. "Its only flaw was that it didn't have a sunset date of roughly seven years. I won't support a regional tax measure because the money doesn't stay in Citrus Heights. However, a tax measure set up by a small community is something I would support because the money stays in Citrus Heights."

Candidate Michael Nishimura is a 40-year resident of Citrus Heights and serves on the city's Planning Commission. He is

running for the District 2 seat. He believes Measure M was a bad idea, as it would have hindered business development.

"I can't see any reason why I would support a tax hike," he told MPG. "We can't avoid state taxes, but I can't see why we would need additional city taxes."

Mayor Middleton told MPG that as a first-time councilmember. she feels she may have missed the mark in voting to put Measure M on the ballot. However, she won't rule out taking a similar action if she is elected to a second term.

"I needed to better understand the concerns of the opposition," the Mayor said. "That included the lack of a sunset date and better accountability."

'Love, Talk, Read' and Improve Your Child's Speech and Language

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - When should your child say his first word? What sounds should your young child be saying, and at what age? If you are worried that your child might have a speech and/or language delay, where do you turn?

Dr. Celeste Roseberry-McKibbin, a public school speech-language pathologist in the San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD), examines these important concerns in her new book, "Love, Talk, Read to Improve Your Child's Speech and Language: Quick Tips for Busy Caregivers", now available on Amazon in ebook, and in print edition.

McKibbin, an Orangevale resident, is a professor of communication sciences and disorders at Cal State, Sacramento. She provides direct services to students from ages 3-18 in the San Juan Unified School District in Carmichael. Her husband, Dr. Mike McKibbin, is a SJUSD board member.

She's concerned about how children's speech and language have been impacted by the pandemic.

"I know that this is a global phenomenon. As both a mother and practicing speech-language pathologist (SLP), I am deeply concerned that we might have a 'lost generation' of children whose speech and language delays may negatively impact their whole life trajectories," she said.

Her new book for parents

and other caregivers of 0-5-year-old children recognizes developmental milestones of speech and language, what to expect, and when she feels parents or guardians should be concerned.

"I felt inspired to write this book, because in my whole career, I have never seen the kinds of speech and language delays in children that I'm now seeing post-pandemic," McKibbin said.

McKibbin shared her own journey with her son Mark who had special needs as he was growing up. Dyslexia, ADHD, and neurological problems were not what was expected from the child of two parents with doctorate degrees.

"The purpose of the book is to provide scientifically based, proven, techniques which caregivers can incorporate into their daily routines with their children," she said. "If children are delayed, their caregivers can begin the process of obtaining early intervention services," she said.

McKibbin offers practical advice to creating conversations with simple research-based techniques to expand a young child's early spoken sentences with tips to build their vocabulary in daily routines.

She provides a list of a child's first 100 words, describes strategies for preparing for kindergarten by encouraging basic reading, writing and social skills and offers easy, fun activities designed to further childhood speech and language development. She also includes a link to her YouTube channel offering 'how-to" examples.

"By one year of age babies should be pointing regularly and saying several words. By two years old, children should be saying 200-300 words and speaking in sentences of up to 3-4 words in length," she said.

"It's never too early to start reading. Children need to see adults around them reading. Children do what their role models do," she said. "Be a role model by reading yourself," McKibbin said.

She also explains the benefits of a child speaking and reading in more than one language.

"Children from multilingual homes are more cognitively flexible and have better vocabularies, phonological awareness, memory, creativity, mental flexibility, and problem-solving skills than children from mono-lingual homes," she writes.

Recent research about the use of electronic books reveals that young children show better focus and comprehension when parents use print books, and not ebooks.

"It takes great discipline, time, and yes, sacrifice to interact with our children rather than let technology

babysit them," she writes. "The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends less screen time the better, especially before the age of five," she said. "If parents choose to do so, they need to place consistent limits on the time spent and develop a family use plan."

"Screen time with small children should be very limited; and when it is allowed there needs to be joint media engagement where a caregiver watches with children and discusses what they have seen," she said.

She offers some closing advice to young parents. "Be both consistent and persistent and your efforts will pay off."

Final Farewell for Queen Elizabeth II

It was a spectacle few will see again. A Queen – perhaps the greatest monarch in history – borne to rest with pageantry beyond Cecil B. De Mille. Monday's funeral The nonagenarian bore the yoke of duty until death.

Service came at a price. Her babies lacked a mum's hands-on guidance and later blundered into mistakes she so deftly avoided. But three Windsor generations' heartfelt mourning

was a masterpiece only the Queen's horses and men could achieve; meticulously choreographed by the lady herself.

The massed pipers, gun carriage and swaying naval phalanx was not just pomp. Pragmatic to the last, Elizabeth II knew great pageantry stirs sentiment. What better tonic for royal continuance? What better kick-start for her heir's succession?

Ten thousand military officers and the tears of a grateful nation accompanied an Empress into legend. Elizabeth was not born to her role, yet this accidental monarch managed sovereignty so peerlessly that her death was – for millions – like the loss of a mother, a grandmother or great grandmother.

The Queen encapsulated the Greatest Generation. Her radio voice comforted Londoners during Hitler's blitzkrieg. Her wedding dress was purchased with clothing ration coupons. The Navy bride followed her husband's deployments, and she paraded children at her coronation. As a Commonwealth leader, she walked a steel tightrope through 70 years of diplomacy. During pandemic, she reassured locked-down subjects, "We will meet again."

demonstrated the brood's profound love.

When I was a little girl, I waved to the Queen from a street crowd. In pale flesh, I beheld the icon from New Zealand's stamps and pound notes. When I met her many years later, I was told to address her as her ma'am. Through nerves, I called her "mum." She looked at me askance, but the irony was surely not lost on the mother of the Commonwealth.

I was then a court correspondent in London. Palace press corps members saw her frequently, but the jokey banter of Charles and Diana's entourage was absent with the Queen. Some people called her shy; I found her reserved. I recall achingly polite conversations about the weather. Her sapphire gaze was beguiling. But in disapproval, what she called "the look" could silence cannon fire.

Stoicism is not the same as snobbery. As much as her 15 prime ministers, the Monarch knew adaptability was key to survival. In tune with her times, she knighted rock stars, agreed to pay taxes, shelved her minks, mothballed her yacht and shook hands with activists.

She bent only as far as her principles allowed. The Queen gave no

interviews; nor did she pander to the press. She believed a monarch should be seen – hence her bright ensembles – but heard as little as possible. In an age of celebrity narcissism, the world's greatest celebrity eschewed exposure of emotions or private life. Her children divorced; a son was disgraced; a grandson defected. The matriarch seethed or grieved in private. Her

husband died; she soon donned lavender ensembles and returned to work. Her policy to neither explain, complain or comment served her well.

ment served her well.

The Queen nevertheless knew the age when few questioned colonialism – or Britain's right to the Koh-in-Nor diamond – were over.

Abdicating from dynastic problems on September 8, her final coup was to

unite stewing elements of the Commonwealth in mourning.


Elizabeth II's most crucial legacy is the king she groomed. What Charles missed in motherly cuddles was not stinted in his training. The mentor likely hammered in responsibility to a changing society over tea and scones.

When Elizabeth ascended, her realms were emerging from war years

with adoration for Queen and Country. Charles III inherits national crises and a complaining Commonwealth. But as passionately as one Sovereign believed in contouring monarchy for the times, so will her heir.

Elizabeth II was the right Queen for her era. Thanks to her unflinching example, I believe Charles III will be the right King, for his.



COVID-19 School Closures Undermined Learning

Whether California's schools should remain open or be closed was a hot issue when the COVID-19 pandemic was raging in 2020

Although medical authorities quickly concluded that children had a much smaller risk of being infected or experiencing severe effects if infected, California schools were mostly closed, in large measure because teachers and their powerful unions insisted on it.

With schools closed, local administrators scrambled to provide on-line classes, what became known as "zoom school," but they were poor substitutes for the real thing — especially for English-learner students and those from poor families.

Those children roughly 60% of the state's nearly 6 million public school students — were already trailing their more privileged contemporaries academically when the pandemic hit. The closures made it worse, for obvious

reasons. They tended to lack internet access and proper equipment for on-line classes. Their parents were often compelled to work outside the home to

from on-line classes was widespread.

Affluent parents, particularly those who could easily work from home during the pandemic, made certain that their kids attended on-line classes, helped them with their school work, formed informal collaboration groups and/or hired tutors. Thus, the ill effects of closures were mitigated. And, of course, private schools, such as the one Gov. Gavin Newsom's kids attend, either remained open or minimized closures.

For months, politicians from Newsom downward quarreled over how the schools should function and angry parents formed the core of a movement to recall him from office. Newsom survived the recall, but the educations of millions of kids did not, as new data confirm.

While the state Department of Education has not released 2022 academic test data that would allow comparisons with pre-pandemic results, individual school districts are doing so and the numbers from the state's largest school district, Los Angeles Unified, are stunning.

About 72% of the district's students are not meeting state standards in math and 58% are behind in English, essentially wiping out five years of progress that it had recorded prior to the pandemic.

"The pandemic deeply impacted the performance of our students," LAUSD Supt. Alberto Carvalho said. at risk, in a fragile condition, make ends meet, so kids prior to the pandemic, as we were often left to fend for expected, were the ones who themselves. Absenteeism have lost the most ground."

While the district released gross data, it did not break down the test results by ethnic or economic subgroups. The Los Angeles Times, however, gleaned the detail from a school board document marked "not for public release."

Why the secrecy? Apparently, it was to mask the particularly disturbing data about Black and Latino kids.

"About 81% of 11th-graders did not meet grade-level standards in math. About 83% of Black students, 78% of Latino students and 77% of economically disadvantaged students did not meet the math standards," the Times reported.

We won't know how the state as a whole fared until — and unless — the Department of Education finally releases 2022 complete "Smarter Balance" test results. But there's no reason to believe that what happened — or, more accurately, what didn't happen — in Los Angeles isn't also true of other systems, particularly those with large numbers of at-risk students.

The educational deprivation that California inflicted on its kids is not only shameful, but will reverberate for decades. Children who fail to master the basics of education in lower grades will be ill-prepared for high school and post-high school training and education. If they are not prepared to take their place in the work force, the state's economy will suffer.





Bera: Bipartisan Bill Protects **Physicians from Medicare Pay Cuts**

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - U.S. Representatives Ami Bera, M.D. (D-CA)

and Larry Bucshon, M.D. (R-IN), introduced on September 13, 2022, bipartisan legislation to provide critical relief to physicians who are scheduled to receive Medicare payment cuts. The Supporting Medicare Providers Act of 2022 would ensure payments to these providers are kept stable and extend certain increases in payments for physicians' services under the Medicare program through 2023.

"As an internal medicine doctor by training, I know that cutting payments for physicians further strains our health care system and the ability for health care professionals to provide the best care for their patients," said Representative Bera. "It's time Congress reforms Medicare provider payments to ensure that we have a stable Medicare payment system so that we can transition move towards value, not volume."

Reps. Bera and Bucshon have been long standing champions and have led successful efforts to mitigate proposed cuts in health care payments. Last week, they issued a Request for Information regarding the implementation of the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015 to identify steps Congress should take to stabilize the Medicare payment system, without dramatic increases in Medicare spending, while ensuring successful value-based care incentives are in place.

In 2023, physicians face more than 8.42% payment cuts, this bill would stop the 4.42% cuts in Medicare payments providers will face on January 1st.

"The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' 2023 Medicare

Physician Fee Schedule proposed rule, if implemented, will result in untenable Medicare pavment cuts for physicians and jeopardize patients' timely access to primary care. That's why the American Academy of Family Physicians endorses the Supporting Medicare Providers Act of 2022, which will avert these cuts and ensure physicians can continue serving Medicare patients for another year. Importantly, this legislation signals that more administrative and legislative action is needed to ensure sustainable Medicare physician payment, transition to value-based care, and address health disparities. The AAFP continues to advocate for payment reforms that appropriately invest in primary care and ensure physicians have the resources and flexibility they need to care for all their patients. Only then can we truly move the needle on health equity, better population health, and health care expenditures," said Sterling N. Ransone, Jr., MD, FAAFP, President, American Academy of



took advantage of roads emptied by stayat-home orders. In 2020, the California Highway Patrol responded to more than 25,000 calls involving illegal street racing activity statewide, an alarming increase of more than 3,500 calls from the year before.

In Southern California, street racing and sideshows have become extremely popular. In August and October of 2021, respectively, a Calabasas teen was among three people killed by apparent street racers in a three-vehicle collision in Burbank caused by street racing, and a Woodland Hills woman was killed and seven others were injured after a driver lost control while racing. Just last week, police arrested three dozen people at several illegal street takeovers

in and around Los Angeles and the San Fernando Valley.

Statewide law enforcement groups have identified driver's license suspensions as an effective tool for the deterrence of illegal street racing activity. Expanding on AB 3, which was signed into law last year, AB 2000 allows courts to issue a driver's license suspension for the exhibition of motor vehicle speed during a sideshow taking place in a parking lot - an area not currently covered under the law - and thereby helps to further deter individuals from engaging in these dangerous activities.

Flood Insurance Industry Undergoing **Massive Regulatory Change**

Commentary by Mac Armstrong

In this age of extreme weather and worsening natural disasters, it is crucial that we refresh and modernize our approach to disaster mitigation and recovery. A good place to start would be floods, which cost our nation approximately \$17 billion in damages each year.

Californians who live in a 'mandatory' flood zone as defined by FEMA are required by lenders to obtain flood insurance before purchasing their home. Residents in such zones must acquire flood insurance as a condition of the home purchase, and they have historically purchased insurance from the federal government through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). Pending regulatory changes would allow private insurers to better compete with government insurance, but for the moment the NFIP enjoys an effective monopoly in mandatory zones. However, it's important to understand that damaging floods occur outside these 'mandatory' zones every year. Approximately 20% of NFIP claims, for example, come from flood events in FEMA's 'moderate' and 'low' risk zones, where residents are not required to purchase flood insurance. According to the NFIP's own flood calculator, just one inch of standing water due to flooding can cause \$25,000 dollars of damage to

Consumers deserve choice, especially considering government-mandated changes to NFIP that will dramatically increase the cost of government flood insurance to cover program losses. How big a change? According to analysis by Redfin, 81% of the NFIP flood policyholders are seeing an increase in their premium as of April 1 of this year. In California, 79% of NFIP policyholders are now paying more for their government insurance. The NFIP price hike impacts all types of communities but is most pronounced in majority-Hispanic neighborhoods, where 84% of residents have seen their premiums increase.

The combination of under-insurance and price hikes raises troubling questions about our collective resilience to flood damage. According to the First Street Foundation, our country's annual losses from flood - currently at \$17 billion - could grow to \$32 billion by the year 2051. Of course, this figure does not include the cumulative cost of tornadoes, hurricanes and other wind events, fires, and earthquakes. Over the past five years, the average annual cost for all natural disasters in the United States was \$51 billion. If policyholders facing premium hikes discontinue NFIP coverage, the costs of uninsured losses will be borne by American communities and threaten the ability of government entities at all levels to finance needed repairs and recovery

In short, we need to stop depending solely on government to restore our communities after disaster strikes. We envision a chain of community resilience where government, NGOs, community leaders and insurers work seamlessly to maximize available resources in support of Americans in need. A property that lacks adequate protection against flood or other events creates costs that are shifted to other links in the chain of resilience - government aid, or NGOs and philanthropies. In an era of tightening budgets and worsening weather, this is not sustainable.

The urgent order of business is to ensure that Californians are aware of their risk from flood damage and have multiple affordable options to protect their families. Private flood insurance is now an even more attractive alternative for California families and businesses, especially in an age of higher prices for everything from gasoline to housing. It's crucial that Californians educate themselves about their options and potential alternatives to the NFIP. Above all, it's crucial that vulnerable homes and businesses obtain coverage so that costs of recovery are not transferred to the federal government or to NGOs. The time to update our approach to disaster response is here, and we must seize the moment.
