# **Grants Aiming to Help** California to give \$2,500 training grant to workers who lost jobs during pandemic



economically distressed folks like McLaughlin in mind when last year they approved half a billion dollars on education grants worth \$2,500 to help workers displaced by the pandemic acquire new

McLaughlin is among the first 3,000 or so recipients of this grant, adult learners who were issued checks in a pilot program this spring and summer. Now the state is opening the grant to a wide range of adults with low incomes who lost their jobs or saw their hours severely cut during the pandemic. Half of the grant funds are reserved for displaced workers with children under 18.

job-related skills.

Golden State Education and Training Grant Program.

Among the few stipulations to receive the grant, applicants must fill out a short application that takes about 10 minutes to complete and attest that they lost a job or hours after March 4 2020, when Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a state of emergency. Applicants also must affirm that they weren't enrolled in an educational or job-training program when they lost their jobs. There's an income threshold as well.

Part of what makes the application quick to complete is how little it asks. Unlike other grant applications for college, this one is self-reported and self-certified, wrote Judith Gutierrez, spokesperson for the state financial Continued on page 4

# **Board Revises Approved** FY 2022-23 **Budget**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted on September 7, 2022, to revise the Approved Budget for the 2022-23 fiscal year.

The Approved Budget in June totaled \$7.3 billion. With the completion of the County's FY 2022-23 year-end financial closing activities and updated information, an increase of \$540 million was proposed, bringing the Budget Recommended for Adoption to \$7.9 billion in appropriations. The increase includes a \$228 million increase in General Fund appropriations, and a \$313 million increase in appropriations in other funds.

The increase in General Fund appropriations included \$19 million of additional investments in new or enhanced programs, including addressing critical needs related to homelessness and behavioral health.

Among other additional allocations, the Board set aside \$5 million for a pilot project aimed at utilizing property tax rebates for participating multi-family landlords to provide housing at below-market rates.

According to First District Supervisor Phil Serna, who proposed the idea, "It would work much the same as Williamson Act Contracts except that instead of providing a property tax break to farmers who conserve agricultural acreage, the purpose here would be to provide a valuable tax incentive to property owners who agree to offer rental units at affordable rates."

Serna continued by stating, "As far as we know, this idea has not been tried before, but given the dearth of affordable housing, it is incumbent on us to try new, creative ways to keep our constituents from spiraling into the depths of homeless."

The proposal means county executive staff will work in the coming months to design the mechanics of the proposal and deploy it with the intent of assessing its efficacy so that it might be considered for expansion at a later date.

# Women's Empowerment to Hold Brighter Futures Gala

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento non-profit Women's Empowerment invites community members to attend its 21st annual gala at 6pm on Sept. 29 at the California Railroad Museum. Guests will gather in person at the Brighter Futures Gala for the first time since 2019 to raise funds for Sacramento women and children experiencing homelessness and celebrate the accomplishments of program graduates. The event will include dinner, presentations by program graduates, a live auction, award ceremony and more.

The annual gala is the organization's largest fundraiser of the year, raising a fifth of the group's budget to empower women experiencing homelessness to secure employment and safe homes for their families. "As we step back in time at the historic Railroad Museum, we will honor the resilient women who have graduated from

To ensure safety of guests and graduates, proof will be required of either Covid vaccination or a negative Covid test within

48 hours. The venue is well ventilated with high ceilings and outdoor spaces.

Women's Empowerment is a Sacramento nonprofit providing an eight-week employment-readiness and empowerment program, paid job training, childcare and support services so women and their children can break the cycle of homelessness. Women's Empowerment offers the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women experiencing homelessness and their children. On average, 70% of women in the program find housing during the ongoing housing crisis. Last year, 142 job placements were achieved by Women's Empowerment graduates. Since its founding in 2001, the award-winning organization has graduated 1,752 women and their 3,879 children. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and grants. **SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - With gas prices still hovering above \$5.30 per gallon and many people leaving their 'gas guzzlers' in the driveway, the Sacramento SPCA is reminding the community that it's the perfect time to donate their unwanted vehicle to benefit the animals.

Since 2017, the Sacramento SPCA has partnered with CARS, Inc. to accept vehicle donations at no cost to donors, regardless of whether the vehicle is running or not. Proceeds from sales of the used cars, trucks, boats, RVs, and motorcycles donated help the Sacramento SPCA provide care to more than 40,000 animals that enter their doors each year.

"Unfortunately, we've seen vehicle donations decline by 33% in 2022," said Kenn Altine, Sacramento SPCA CEO. "This has occurred as new vehicle sales also decreased in 2022, due to rising vehicle prices and less inventory."

The average vehicle donation to the

Sacramento SPCA is approximately \$1,500 - which can provide lifesaving surgeries for three animals or cover the cost of microchips and vaccines for fifteen animals.

Donating a vehicle to the Sacramento SPCA is as easy as filling out the online vehicle donation form or picking up a phone and speaking to a live donor support representative - and every donation helps save animals' lives. The partners at CARS, Inc. will tow the vehicle at no cost to the owner (regardless of whether it's running or not), and donors will receive a donation receipt.

aid agency running the grant, in an email. "We are not requesting any documentation,"

McLaughlin wasted no time once she received her grant in June, 2022. After taking courses part-time at American River College, a community college in Sacramento, since October of 2020, she decided to go full-time to pursue her first ever-degree this fall and chose accounting as her major.

The \$2,500 is paying for her textbooks, software required for schoolwork and other supplies – anything remaining she's putting in a personal education account. Though she receives tuition waivers as part of a state financial aid program and additional dollars through the Cal Grant, the Golden State grant gives her extra confidence that she can afford an education while earning around \$38,000 a year.

"I spend my lunch break doing schoolwork," she said. After returning from the office, she takes her associate degree courses online. McLaughlin's younger son is a virtual charter school student, so the two complete their homework side by side.

"I feel that it's showing him how important an education is and to never give up because here I am, 47, and in college," she said.

At first blush the Golden State Education and Training grant, which will last through 2024 and is funded mostly through one-time federal stimulus funds, is yet another example of the state's growing effort to lower the cost of college for adults and bring more Californians into college classrooms.

In the past two years, public funding grew by nearly 50% for the California Student Aid Commission, which oversees most of the higher-education grant aid to students, to nearly \$3.6 billion. That growth includes more tuition and cash support for community college students, middle-class students at the University of California and California State University, students formerly in foster care, students raising children and the Golden State training grant, among others.

But the Golden State grant's eligibility rules start where other state and federal grants drop off, extending cash assistance to would-be students who otherwise wouldn't be eligible for traditional college financial aid.

The Golden State grant can cover education programs that are shorter than about four months – something the federal Pell and state Cal Grant do not. Students receiving the Golden State grant may also use the money for extension and so-called noncredit programs, such as English-as-a-secondlanguage courses, bicycle repair and various landscaping certificates. There's no minimum program length for this grant – and because state dollars cover some of the grant costs – undocumented students are also eligible for the \$2,500. Anyone getting the grant needs to already know which training program they plan to pursue.

So that displaced workers with no ties to a college also apply, the Student Aid Commission is working with regional workforce boards, The California Workforce Development Board and other agencies to get the word out about the grant, said Jake Brymner, director of governmental relations for the Student Aid Commission.

Grant recipients can also use the funds if they enroll in certain workforce training and apprenticeship programs unaffiliated with colleges or universities. The Student Aid Commission is reviewing which workforce training programs are eligible and will soon add those to the approved list on the grant

application. Students will only be able to use their grants at California public colleges, universities and these approved workforce training programs.

During the pilot when only public colleges and universities were eligible, 84% of the grant applicants sought educations at community colleges, data from the Student Aid Commission shows.

'This specific grant has great potential," said Daisy Gonzales, interim chancellor of the California Community Colleges. "What it does is it provides an entry point to our colleges for students that may not know about us." Students with no exposure to community colleges can gain access to food pantries and coordinators who are familiar with other state and local social services for which students could qualify.

She's also hopeful the grant may help to recover some of the colossal enrollment loss the system suffered in the past two years.

Even if grant recipients qualify for free tuition, especially at community colleges where nearly half of learners attend for free, they can use the money to cover gas, housing, food and other expenses. It's an added perk for learners who had no spare dollars to afford an internet connection or other expenses associated with attaining a degree.

Muideen Olawoyin was one class away from earning an associate degree in human services, a stepping stone toward social work. But a series of bad breaks and a long-term injury left him cash-dry.

"I (couldn't) even afford internet then, it was so hard," he said. When he picked up the Golden State check from his school, Cosumnes River College, he was able to get back online, enroll in that final course and earn his degree this summer.

The average income of the roughly 3,000 grant recipients was about \$22,000 when they first applied, according to California Student Aid Commission data provided to CalMatters.

Not all training and education programs are made equal, however. Some research shows that shorter-term college certificates – like the kind in which students with this grant can enroll – have a mixed record of boosting the earning power of graduates.

Overall, these certificates lead to higher wages, but noncredit programs are less remunerative than traditional for-credit certificates. Still, associate degrees and bachelor's degrees lead to even higher wage gains for graduates, according to a 2020 Urban Institute study. Meanwhile, a fifth of certificate programs at public colleges and universities lead to lower wages than what workers with high school diplomas earn, a Hechinger Report analysis of national data showed.

California's foray into funding short-term credentials could inform the national conversation on whether to permit federal grant aid to pay for educations that are shorter than four months. For a few years now advocates have been trying to introduce "short-term" Pell grants, but the idea hasn't won over enough lawmakers yet.

None of the four Golden State training grant recipients CalMatters spoke with were pursuing short-term credentials - all wanted an associate degree. McLaughlin, who now works as an accountant for a fencing company, is dreaming bigger.

Her goal is to transfer to Sacramento State to earn a bachelor's - something her current employer encouraged her to pursue.

"I want people to know you're never too old for school," McLaughlin said. "And to never stop trying to reach your goals."

# Black And White



# Mommy Can You Hear Me?

A state program that provides children's hearing aids may be expanded to include more families

A proposal to expand a year-old California program that provides hearing aids to children was approved by the state Legislature in the final days of the session that ended Wednesday.

If Gov. Gavin Newsom signs the bills, the expansion will add about 2,000 additional deaf or hard of hearing children who have partial insurance coverage and up to age 21who are not currently eligible for the income-based Hearing Aid Coverage for Children Program. If approved, it will go into effect Jan. 1,

"For the families that weren't eligible before this is relief they have been waiting for a long time. Young adults who are aging out of the program will be able to stay on," said Mike Odeh, senior director at Children Now, an advocacy organization focused on children. "We know hearing aids are not just a nice-to-have medical device. It's truly important for all sorts of communication, socialization, and development that are important for kids and youth thriving."

Ensuring more children are eligible is good news for parents and advocates but it raises the question about whether the program, which has been plagued with problems, can actually serve them. In its first year, the program provided hearing aids to a tiny fraction of the 2,300 kids it intended to reach annually. Overall, about 7,000 kids currently qualify but they typically only need devices every three years.

In addition, the application process is complex and takes a long time, families with some insurance coverage are not eligible and few qualified providers who serve children are accepting the program. For physicians and audiologists, the state reimbursement rates are low and they could wait years to get paid, advocates said.

The last-minute addition to the budget bills this week followed a CalMatters story about the program's challenges, a strident letter from the Republican Caucus to the state about the failure of the program to reach more children, and continued work by advocates and Central Valley Assemblymember Joaquin Arambula.

"I'm so grateful," said Michelle Marciniak, founder of Let California Kids Hear, an advocacy organization that works to increase access for deaf and hard of hearing children. "It was a huge weight seeing a certain population excluded from this program."

Earlier this year, as part of the budget process, the Legislature had requested additional funds to improve

the program and proposed expanding it to include children with partial insurance coverage. But that proposal did not make it into the governor's revised budget released in May.

Then last week, Arambula carried the language that was inserted into broader budget bills.

"This budget item means so much to so many children and families. I applaud the advocates whose tenacity helped achieve this, and I'm profoundly grateful to the State Administration for working with us to ensure the Hearing Aid Coverage for Children Program can be expanded this year to underinsured children in need," he said in an email. "We know these hearing aids and services are vital in helping these children develop and learn and, most importantly, bolster their well-being and connect with

the world around them." Odeh pointed out that while the expansion is great news, advocates will continue to lobby the state to improve the clunky and long application process, to increase reimbursement for providers and to get more audiologists and doctors to accept the program.

Hearing aids for children typically cost from \$3,000 to 10,000 and need to be replaced every three years.

The program, which debuted in July 2021, currently provides hearing aids for children who do not qualify for Medi-Cal, the state's insurance program for low-income residents, or do not have any other insurance. Families must meet certain income requirements. It was created after a 2019 legislative proposal to classify hearing aids as medically necessary so health insurers would have to cover them. That bill was opposed by health insurers and was pulled by the author after the Newsom administration said it would fund a program instead.

In its first year, the program dispensed only 39 hearing aids, according to data from the California Department of Health Care Services, which oversees the program. The agency did not say why the program reached so few children in its first year.

On Aug. 12, the Senate Republican Caucus expressed concern about the program in a letter to the Department of Health Care Services and demanded answers. In the letter, they asked why the program has served so few children and what is going to be done to correct the problems.

"It strains belief that, after a year of operation, this program has only assisted a fraction of those estimated to be eligible, and without explanation," they wrote.

According to the office of Lancaster Republican Sen. Scott Wilk, the caucus has not yet received a response from the Department of Health Care Services.

Agency spokesperson Anthony Cava said it is still preparing a response for the caucus. If the expansion becomes official, Cava said it would update all communication, including websites, applications, and correspondence with the new

January 2023. Getting hearing aids early in life is critical for infants and children. They stand to lose speech, language and social-emotional development if they are not able to hear soon enough, according to a study in the journal Pediatrics.

The goal among physicians is to fit children with hearing aids by the time they are 6 months of age, said Dr. Dan Duran, audiologist and manager of audiology at Valley Children's Hospital in Madera.

Any delays in getting hearing aids make it nearly impossible for kids to catch up to their hearing peers.

"These delays can impact kids in terms of their speech and language development," Duran said. "It can also set them back in other important milestones as they are developing and growing."

Duran said the expansion of eligibility will benefit families who struggle to pay their share of costs after insurance or who wait to gather up the funds or put off getting devices for their children because of cost. He expects the center will be even busier because families come from as far as Santa Barbara and Stockton for care.

Marciniak said the lack of providers accepting the program is a huge problem for families who have to drive long distances to reach them. Expanding the provider list is next on advocates' list of things to

For single mom Kimberly Nguyen, in Sacramento, the expansion comes a little too late for her family to use now but it will be a great benefit in the future, she said.

She had been waiting to see if any changes to the program would cover her family because they have partial insurance. After waiting more than a year and seeing no hope for change this year she used money she saved from working extra hours to finally purchase a pair of hearing aids for her youngest daughter last month.

Nguyen has two daughters, 10 and 7, who typically need hearing aids every three years. Next time she hopes the state program will save her thousands of dollars. That is if she can find a provider in Sacramento. Currently the closest doctors on the state's provider list are in San Francisco.

"This is great for all the families who can now access the program and who don't have to worry about how to pay the difference," said Nguyen, who has testified before the Legislature and advocated for the change. Her insurance covers \$1,000 of the \$6,000 hearing aids she purchased.

At the same time this week, the California Public Employees' Retirement System, which administers health benefits for state and local government employees and retirees, announced that its basic plans would cover hearing aids for children starting in January 2023. That means instead of covering just a fraction of the cost, the insurers will fully pay for the devices.

# **Newsom Feels the Heat** on Farm Labor Measure

Gov. Gavin Newsom will soon write a new chapter in California's decades-long conflict over the unionization of workers in the state's huge agricultural industry - and what he does could affect his obvious quest to become a national political figure.

Assembly Bill 2183, a measure that would make it easier for the much-troubled United Farm Workers Union to organize farmers' employees is sitting on his desk, passed by overwhelming margins by Newsom's fellow Democrats in the person Erin Mellon said. Legislature.

Newsom vetoed an earlier version of the bill last year, saying, it "contains various inconsistencies and procedural issues related to the collection and review of ballot cards," and adding, "Significant changes to California's well-defined agricultural labor laws must be carefully crafted to ensure that both agricultural workers' intent to be represented and the right to collectively bargain is protected, and the state can in a political pickle. faithfully enforce those fundamental rights."

This year's version contained some changes that the UFW and its allies hoped would placate Newsom, but just before final votes last month, Newsom once again indicated his opposition. "We cannot support an untested mail-in election process that lacks critical provisions to protect the integrity of the election," Newsom spokes-

Newsom's unusual pre-The union's drive for emptive declaration may have been an indirect request that the Legislature not send him a second measure, but it didn't deter legislators from acting with 55 votes in the Assembly and 26 in the Senate.

If anything, it spurred the UFW to redouble its public campaign, including a highly publicized weeklong march to the Capitol from Delano, site of a 1965 grape worker strike that led elections, which now are to formation of the UFW and in 1975 to passage of the state's Agricultural Labor Relations Act.

The UFW also formally joined the California Labor Pawel chronicled in her Federation after former authoritative book, "The Assemblywoman Lorena

Gonzalez took the umbrella organization's helm and obtained expressions of support from national political figures such as House Speaker Nancy Pelosi and, this week, President Joe Biden.

"In the state with the largest population of farmworkers, the least we owe them is an easier path to make a free and fair choice to organize a union," Biden said on Labor Day.

All of this puts Newsom

If he signs the bill, he will not only be reversing himself on a high-profile issue – never good optics for an ambitious politician - but could be providing critics with ammunition should he someday be seeking presidential votes in agricultural states that are critical in White House contests, such as Iowa, Ohio and Florida.

However, if he vetoes the measure, it could make it much more difficult for him to gain support in the Democratic Party's progressive/activist wing, to which unionization of workers in agriculture and other low-wage industries is a holy grail. Delores Huerta, the UFW's most revered figure, has predicted that Newsom would sign the bill because he'll want union support for a presidential campaign.

A veto would also mean that he would probably see another UFW bill next year and every other year of his governorship.

# Younger Widow Asks About **Collecting Survivor Benefits**

Dear Rusty: My husband died several years ago in 2019. It is my understanding that I should be receiving some portion of his Social Security payments. However, when I called to notify Social Security that he passed, they told me not to touch his last check because it would be taken back. I was 8 years younger than my husband, so I am still only 58. I also have always made more income than he did. How do I find out if there is some sort of residual that I should still be receiving? *Signed*:

Widowed Wife Dear Widowed Wife: The reason you were told "not to touch" your husband's last check is because benefits are not payable for the month a person dies. Social Security pays benefits in the month following the month they are earned, so someone who dies before month ends isn't entitled to benefits for that month. Social Security will, indeed, take that payment back. As a survivor, you aren't entitled to those benefits because they were awarded to your

taken back because he didn't live the full month.

As for any benefits you are entitled to as your husband's survivor, you cannot collect a monthly survivor benefit until you are at least 60 years old (unless you are disabled, in which case you can collect as early as age 50). Sixty is the earliest age to collect survivor benefits, but claimed at age 60 the survivor benefit will be reduced by 28.5% from what it would be at your full retirement age (FRA) of 67. Survivor benefits reach maximum at your FRA, but taken any earlier will be reduced by .396% per month early, to a maximum reduction of 28.5%. You are, however, entitled to a onetime lump sum death benefit of \$255, for which you can contact Social Security at 1.800.772.1213 (or at your

local SS office). You should also be aware that taking any monthly SS benefit before reaching your full retirement age of 67 will subject you to Social Security's "earnings test," which limits how much you can earn before they take back some (or all) of your benefits. The earnings limit changes annually but for 2022 the limit is \$19,560 and, if that is exceeded, SS will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 over the limit (they "take back" by withholding future benefit payments or requiring you to repay in a lump sum). If you're working full time and earning substantially more than the annual earnings deceased husband and will be limit, it's usually not prudent

(and may not even be possible) to claim your monthly survivor benefit before your full retirement age.

From what you've shared, it doesn't appear that you are currently entitled to any Social Security survivor benefit, other than the onetime death benefit of \$255. You may consider claiming a survivor benefit when you are sixty, but your work status and earnings level may restrict or eliminate your ability to collect a monthly survivor benefit at that time. Once you reach your FRA, however, the earnings test no longer applies, and you can apply for any benefit available to you. When the earnings test goes away at your FRA, you can also choose to take your smaller survivor benefit first and let your personal SS retirement benefit grow, to maximum at age 70 if you wish.





# FBI Field Office Warns of Scammers Posing as FBI Agents

Sacramento FBI Field Office

SACRAMENTO. CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation Sacramento Field Office (FBI Sacramento) is cautioning the public to be wary of any unsolicited call, especially if the caller claims to be from the FBI.

"Nothing sends a person into a panic like a call from law enforcement, especially when the call informs them that they have been a victim of a crime or may be wanted for a crime," explained Acting Special Agent in Charge Dennis Guertin. "Sadly, that response is something scammers are leveraging with increased frequency, so it is important to educate the public about what to look out for."

Scammers are sophisticated and any unsolicited call, text or email can be a path for a scammer to attempt to gain your trust and separate you from your hard-earned money. To ensure your security and safety:

Never click on links contained in unsolicited emails or texts. The links may route you to fake websites or deploy malicious software on your phone or computer; Never trust the caller ID number; the displayed telephone number can be manipulated with software; Never be afraid to hang up on an unsolicited caller; Always consider sending unsolicited phone calls to voicemail. Most scam call centers will not leave a message; Always check the email address of seemingly official communications and feel free to reach out to your bank or credit card company directly by calling the telephone number on the back of your card to verify if the email is legitimate.

Some scammers impersonate FBI agents over the phone. "The public should not be afraid to hang up on an alleged agent. An authentic FBI agent will find other ways to contact you, if necessary," said Guertin.

An official FBI special agent will never provide you with a badge number or telephone number to attempt to verify their identity without additional verification. Instead, they will direct you to the official FBI website www.FBI.gov to locate the local field office's telephone number and encourage vou to make a call.

FBI will never call or email you to do any of the following:

Make demands for money, wire transfers, gift cards, or bitcoin; Coordinate financial transactions of any kind; Threaten arrest.

Reporting scams is an important step to protect yourself and others from victimization. All scams can be reported online on the FBI Internet Crime Complaint Center website, www.ic3.gov, or call your local FBI field office.



Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) regional administrator authorized the use of federal funds to assist the state of California in combatting the Mosquito Fire burning in Placer

and El Dorado counties.

On Sept. 9, the state of **OAKLAND**, **CA** (**MPG**) - The California submitted a request for a Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG). At the time of the request, the fire threatened approximately 3,600 homes in and around Foresthill, CA. The fire also threatened a high school,

middle school, elementary school, Placer County Community Center, a Placer County Sheriff substation, Cal Fire Station 11, two hydro power plants, Foresthill Water Treatment Plant, Foresthill Fire Protection District, Sugar Pine Dam and Reservoir, and two public radio towers for fire and

law enforcement communications.

FMAGs provide federal funding for up to 75 percent of eligible firefighting costs. The Disaster Relief Fund provides allowances for FMAGs through FEMA to assist in fighting fires that threaten to become a greater incident.

Eligible costs covered by

FMAGs can include expenses for field camps, equipment use, materials, supplies and mobilization, and demobilization activities attributed to fighting the fire.






