CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A San Francisco-based micro food hall concept, Local Kitchens, is expanding its presence in the greater Sacramento area with a new site planned for Citrus Heights.

Updated leasing materials published by the property owner/manager Merlone-Geier for Sunrise Village in Citrus Heights now undergoing a major renovation, show the micro food hall will occupy a 2,030-square-foot space in a stand-alone building in the Sunrise Village Shopping Center at 7855 Madison Avenue in Suite C. Little Caesars Pizza is an adjacent tenant.

Local Kitchens was founded by Jon Goldsmith and Andrew Munday, both who were colleagues at DoorDash. Their concept helps restaurants expand beyond their brick-and-mortar locations. Each location houses a variety of individual concept restaurants under one roof, allowing customers to mix and match their orders into a single order for dine in, takeout or delivery. Convenient online and mobile ordering, paired with fast and friendly service is offered.

Sunrise Village at 5425 Sunrise Boulevard includes businesses such as Joann Fabric and Crafts, Rite Aid, a planned City Sports Club and a 38,000-square-foot grocery store.

Press representatives for Local Kitchens in San Francisco and Merlone-Geier, the property owner, were unavailable for comment.

According to the Local Kitchens, their concept is described as ideal to meet the needs of families, foodies, and large groups with a wide variety of cuisines from the best local restaurant brands to accommodate every palette and preference, all with seamless online ordering and fast, reliable service. Great dishes from multiple

restaurant brands can then be available all under one roof, prepared fresh to order by Local Kitchens' culinary team

Local Kitchens, which operates six locations in the Bay Area, has opened at the Highland Reserve Marketplace in Roseville – its first location outside the Bay Area. A second Roseville location in the Renaissance Creek shopping center along Sierra College Boulevard opened earlier this spring. Additional locations are in the works for Folsom and Natomas, according to the company.

The Roseville location features food from five different specialty restaurants: Señor Sisig, Curry Up Now, The Melt, Nash & Proper and Garden of Eat'n. The last two – Nash & Proper and Garden of Eat'n – are popular Sacramento-area originals. Which restaurants will be featured in the new Citrus Heights location has yet to be announced.

For those voters or soon-to-be voters that need to register or update their registration file, Monday, Oct. 24 is the last day to make those changes or register online. After the 24th, you can still visit the Election Office in person, or visit one of the Vote Centers that open starting Oct. 29.

The Sacramento County Department of Voter Registration and Elections is committed to running a fair, honest and transparent election process. Want to come see for yourself? Come tour our office, see our equipment and processes. You'll learn a lot and walk away feeling better than ever about elections in Sacramento County. Tours are every Wednesday and Thursday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the Registrar's office (7000 65th Street).

Once staff begin the ballot tabulation process (running the ballots through the "counting machines"), watch a 24/7 live stream of the tabulation process on our website.

By Mail: All registered voters received a ballot in the mail. Place the voted ballot inside the envelope provided, sign the envelope and return – your postage is paid!

ASI Children's Center Distributes Free Diapers

- Working mom and fulltime Sacramento State student Gabby McCartney doesn't have the luxury of buying just any diapers for her 2-year-old daughter, Emilia.

"I have looked at different brands and the quantity of diapers you get for the price," McCartney, 23, said. "I found one that was cheaper, and I like to get them from Costco because

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Playmakers Goes National

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Local non-profit organization The Playmakers has been teaching character and leadership through sports since the founding in 2009. The Playmakers founder Greg Roeszler, known as Coach Roz, saw the need for at-risk kids, such as foster youth and kids with developmental differences, to have real opportunities to be included and build relationships through team sports.

Playmakers has reached thousands of local kids through their summer football camps and after-school programs, all of which are free to students and their families. And Playmakers is expanding their reach by taking the football camps national: This summer, in addition to the local Sacramento camp, Playmakers hosted camps in Ohio, Iowa, and Florida.

It costs about \$10,000 to host a camp, and they are completely free for the students and their families. The camps are funded through private and corporate donations, various fundraising events, and with support from local civic groups, schools, and churches.

The camps are facilitated by athletes from the local high schools, who oversee the activities and participate along with the kids. Coach Roz said, "It's been encouraging to see high school kids want and be willing to serve. ... A lot of kids are craving that."

And next summer, in addition to the existing camps, Playmakers will be expanding to Washington D.C.—hosting a camp at Gallaudet University for the deaf and hearing impaired. And the high school students who help out locally at the Sacramento camp will have the opportunity to travel with Playmakers to Washington D.C.

to help at that camp, allowing them to further practice their leadership skills in a new venue.

"There are kids everywhere that need this opportunity," said Coach Roz. "We can expand anywhere there is an interest."

For many of the kids who attend these camps, it's the first time they've had a chance to play a sport with other people and be included this way – and Coach Roz said it means so much to both the kids and their families. "It's a great experience for everyone

involved," he said.

"It all just revolves around relationships," explained Coach Roz. "We're learning so much, spending time with them." And these lessons are expanding into a new avenue for Playmakers, as they give the high school athletes the opportunity to become leaders of inclusiveness on their own campuses. Just launched this school year is a calendar of events, a playbook for the athletes to follow as they take the initiative and build relationships with the special education


classes at their schools. The Playmakers' calendar of events includes activities such as painting pumpkins for Halloween and decorating ornaments for Christmas. Coach Roz said these activities keep the kids involved and the relationships connected throughout the school year.

So, in multiple states across the country, as this new school year is getting started, high school athletes are taking those lessons of connection and inclusion to heart, and forging

relationships with special education students to make them an integral part of the social life on campus.

As Playmakers is growing and expanding, these high school students are serving as delegates, bringing that message into the schools, serving as role models to other students on how to lead with character and compassion and make a difference for those who need it most.

Voter's Choice Act, traditional polling places were replaced with Vote Centers that are open for up to 11 days, including Election Day. This means voters can choose when, where and how they want to vote - at ANY Vote Center in the County. Avoid the lines, vote early.

At the Vote Center you can drop off your completed ballot OR vote in person. There is even weekend voting.

Eighteen Vote Centers open for 11 days beginning Oct. 29, 2022. An additional 69 Vote Centers open for four days beginning Nov. 5, 2022. Eligible residents can also register to vote, update their registration and cast their ballot at a Vote Center, even on the day of the election.

Drop Boxes: Voted and signed ballots may be placed in any of the 60 secure Drop Box locations throughout Sacramento County beginning Oct. 10, 2022.

When using a drop box, ensure that is an official, secure box provided by your County Election's Office. All official Sacramento County dropboxes are pink and have the Sacramento County wave logo on them.

Election Results

The first release of results will happen after 8 p.m. on Election night. Ballots may take several weeks to process, due to the increased popularity of returning Vote by Mail ballots, and the trend of waiting to return them until Election Day. Want election results to be final sooner? Vote early!

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Fukumi Japanese Restaurant located in Citrus Heights is a target. Unfortunately, the restaurant that specializes in serving Hakata-style ramen dishes and soups isn't the target of an adoring fan base. It's the target of one or more criminals who keep showing up in the dead of night to cause as much destruction as possible.

Every large picture-framed style window at the Citrus Heights location was smashed to pieces on the night of Sunday, September 17th. It is the third time this year, so far, that vandals have chosen to target this one Fukumi location at 5410 Sunrise Blvd. The windows of other businesses that share the same building location near Sunrise and Madison Avenues were not touched.

This latest incident follows vandalism attacks that took place last June and again in February of this year. Video from security cameras positioned outside Fukumi Restaurant reveal a suspect wearing a dark ski mask and dressed in black clothing. The suspect uses a large hammer to break or shatter as many windows around the business as possible before running off.

The Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD) is very much aware of this latest attack. Sgt. Shaun Gualco says the Investigations Unit is focusing on whether the attacks might be related and who is behind them.

Prominent supporters of his candidacy include former SJUSD President Paula Villascaz, current SJUSD Vice President Zima Creason, Sacramento Municipal Utility District Board President Brandon Rose, Sacramento City Mayor Pro Tem Eric Guerra, among other elected leaders, educators and parents.

Moe Sarama is a community advocate, businessman and parent who is running to represent Citrus Heights on the San Juan Unified School District Board of Education. Shooting Investigation on Crux Drive

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - On September 26, 2022, just after 3:30 AM, Citrus Heights Police dispatchers received a 911 call advising of shots fired in the 6900 block of Crux Drive. The reporting party was passing by a residence located on Crux Drive when they heard three gunshots. Our officers arrived on scene and quickly established a perimeter around the residence where the gunshots were believed to have originated.

During our investigation, several people were observed coming and going from the residence and were contacted as part of our investigation. As a result, three arrests were made, and one firearm was seized. The suspects arrested were 21-year-old, Leroy Vonbehren of North Highlands for being a felon in possession of a firearm, 28-year-old, Anthony Gomez

of Sacramento for an outstanding warrant related to possession of controlled substances, and 31-year-old, Aaron Bucher of Citrus Heights for outstanding domestic violence related charges.

Out of an abundance of caution, our SWAT team was utilized to make entry and ensure there were no additional occupants inside the home. During this incident, our staff contacted a nearby Montessori school to suggest they close the school for the day to ensure their safety and prevent concerns from parents and students. There were no injuries as a result of this incident.

This investigation is ongoing, and we urge anyone with additional information to contact the Citrus Heights Police Department at 916-727-5500. We want to thank our community members for their patience as we worked to bring a peaceful resolution to this incident.



In uncomfortable scenarios, it's always a good idea to try to put yourself in the other person's shoes. Let's pretend you own a business, and you just hired a young lady. A few weeks later, someone comes in, completely out of the blue, and offers her more than double what she's making with you. I can tell you what would happen at my company. I'd tell her to take it. I'm serious. I mean, as an employer I'm certainly not going to double her income that quickly. And while I'd be surprised, and a little disappointed, I'd be happy she has the chance to take such a big step up.

If an organization cares about its people, and one of those team

members has the opportunity to significantly increase their income and they're not breaking a contract or promise in the process – this type of scenario is perfectly reasonable, even if it's a little inconvenient for the current employer in the short term. 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

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Subject in Window Smash Series Investigation Arrested

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -Over the past several months, the Sacramento region experienced a series of window smash vandalism crimes targeting local businesses. Detectives from multiple jurisdictions coordinated efforts to collect evidence, develop leads, and identify motives and witnesses to these crimes. The investigation revealed multiple victims and

included multiple county jurisdictions linked to the potential series of vandalisms.

Many of the business victims suffered extensive losses totaling thousands of dollars to repair their large glass windows. It is estimated that the total loss to the collective businesses exceeds \$500,000. A few businesses suffered losses on multiple occasions. In Citrus Heights, a pizza restaurant at 7700 Sunrise Blvd and a noodle restaurant at 5400 Sunrise

Blvd. were targeted on two separate occasions.

On September 29, 2022, Detectives from the Citrus Heights and the Sacramento Police Department served simultaneous search warrants at a residence and a business location of a person of interest in this felony vandalism series of crimes. During the service of the search warrant, Philip Archuleta, a 30-year-old male of Roseville, was arrested for unrelated crimes including possession of a stolen assault weapon, and child endangerment.

The investigation is ongoing, and we anticipate additional charges related to the vandalism series in the near future. Archuleta was running the business of "Brothers Doors and Glass" without a contractor's license. Throughout this investigation we determined this not to be a hate related crime.

We would like to thank the Sacramento Police Department Detectives for their collaboration

with the investigation of these crimes, and we would like to thank our businesses and our community partners for their patience and cooperation while we worked to identify those responsible for the damage caused to the various businesses in the region.

Without the collaborative efforts of our Detectives, and the Sacramento Detectives, and the use of advance investigative technology, this case would likely not have been solved.

California Refusing to Release **School Test Results**

California's Department of Education has finally acknowledged the obvious: It is arbitrarily delaying the release of results from this year's round of academic testing.

In years past, scores from the spring Smarter Balanced tests of academic achievement have been released in late summer or early fall, but this year, the department denied a request for statewide results even though it authorized individual districts to make their data available.

Why?

Mary Nicely, chief deputy state superintendent for instruction, told EdSource, a website devoted to California education issues, which had requested the data, that the numbers would be released as part of a "dashboard" that includes other "metrics" on how schools are performing.

"We are on track to release the data as we did last year. If we can come out sooner, we will," she said. "We are not withholding anything; people are working hard to finalize the data."

That doesn't wash.

There's absolutely no reason that data already given to school districts should not be made public now and included in the

"dashboard" later.

It's likely that the test results will show a sharp decline in the abilities of California's school children in basic skills, such as reading and math, due to the state's shutdowns of schools during the COVID-19 pandemic.

State officials probably want to sugarcoat the bad news by delaying it until after the Nov. 3 election and combining it with other material that would dilute its importance. Tony Thurmond, the state schools superintendent, will be on the ballot along with Gov. Gavin Newsom and other Democratic officeholders and while all are favored to win re-election, bad news on schools would be embarrassing.

We know that the post-pandemic test results are likely to be disappointing. That's been the pattern in other states. Los Angeles Unified has already released its quite negative test results, reversing about five years of gradual progress in the state's largest school system.

In LA Unified, about 72% of students did not meet state standards in math, five percentage points higher than pre-pandemic testing. In English, 58% were subpar, two points higher.

"The pandemic deeply impacted the performance of our students," said LA Unified Supt. Alberto Carvalho. "Particularly kids who were at risk, in a fragile condition, prior to the pandemic, as we a journalist for nearly expected, were the ones 60 years, spending all who have lost the most but a few of those years ground."

If LA Unified had newspapers.

enough guts to tell its voters and parents the harsh truth, there's no valid rationale for Thurmond not to do so for the entire state.

After its request for statewide results was denied, EdSource pressed the issue with a letter from its attorney requesting reconsideration.

"EdSource considers delay tantamount to denial as it effectively robs the public of its vital role in overseeing the CDE (Department of Education) and individual districts and in holding both accountable to its students and the public. This is especially important during what continues to be one of the most challenging and impactful times to our educational system due to the COVID pandemic," EdSource attorney Duffy Carolan wrote.

EdSource's letter told the Department of Education that it "cannot identify any 'public' interest in non-disclosure that could justify its denial position, let alone an interest that 'clearly outweighs' the substantial public interest in access to this information."

This is not only a politically tinged education issue but a major test for the state's Public Records Act, which allows public agencies to withhold information only under extreme circumstances. If records can be withheld for obvious political purposes in this case, the Public Records Act might as well be junked entirely.

ASI Children's Center Distributes Free Diapers

it's about \$50 for 160, and that lasts almost half a month.

"I spend about \$100 a month on diapers."

With the rising price of food, gas and other essentials, there isn't a lot of wiggle room in McCartney's budget – and she's not alone.

To help McCartney and other Sacramento County families struggling with the region's high cost of living, the Associated Students, Inc. (ASI) Children's Center is giving away free diapers.

The center has partnered with the Sacramento Food Bank to become a federally funded National Diaper Distribution site.

Anyone in Sacramento County with young children can obtain from the center 50 free diapers a month, sizes 3 through 5.

"People are struggling because of inflation and have to make some very serious choices between feeding their children or taking care of their diapering needs," said Sherry Velte, ASI Children's Center director. "So, children can be left in diapers too long, which causes

"It's a health concern for children. It can be very severe when children's bottoms are bleeding and have wounds and sores."

Within days of launching on Sept. 2, the Children's Center distributed more than 1,800 diapers, Velte said.

The numbers don't lie, said Lorena Carranza, the Sacramento Food Bank's community resource manager. When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, the number of families the Sacramento Food Bank served doubled from 150,000 a month to more than 300,000, she said.

As the world began to recover last year, the lines at the food bank diminished slightly, only to grow again about four months ago.

"It's because of inflation," Carranza said.

"It's really hitting families hard, so we are right now at 250,000 families a month.

"The cost of living is very high here in Sacramento, and we see it in all the demographic groups. There are a lot of families with little ones. You have to change diapers, there's no way around it. Babies don't wait."

The Sacramento Food Bank became a national diaper distribution site in July 2021 and works with six other organizations in Sacramento County to provide diapers.

The Sacramento Food Bank also partners with Sac State to provide food for the ASI Food Pantry and knowing college students' needs makes the collaboration "a perfect fit," Carranza said.

In addition to special trainings, Velte had to determine how to transport the large boxes of diapers and find a clean, dry place to store them.

"It's not what we're designed to do. We're a childcare facility," she said. "But we're providing diapers to the campus and the community because I know this will be a tremendous service to my student-parents, who are primarily on financial aid.'

McCartney picked up diapers on the first day. "It will help out tremendously," McCartney said. "Prices for everything have been extremely high, and children go through so many diapers. I'm constantly having to buy them."

McCartney, who commutes to campus from Elk Grove, said free diapers mean she'll worry less if there's another spike in the cost of gas or food.

"The ASI Children's Center is an amazing program, and I'm very grateful I'm able to get diapers from here now."

In January, Kiley introduced AB 1638, an urgency measure that would have immediately suspended the gas tax and saved Californian's over 50 cents per gallon at the pump. That bill was rejected in the Assembly on multiple occasions. Instead of providing relief, the Speaker of the Assembly created the Select Committee on Gasoline Supply and Pricing to study the issue. To date, the committee has held two hearings and has yet to produce anything

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Republic FC's Open Cup Dream Ends with Heads Held High

ORLANDO, FL (MPG) - After the finality of it all began to dissipate, Sacramento Republic FC's players and staff collectively applauded the travelling fans in the upper reaches of Exploria Stadium, who responded in kind at the end of a dream that ended 15 minutes too soon.

The players and coaching staff then went to collect their finalist medals, where they were greeted by handshakes and commiserations from the dignitaries on hand led by USSF President Cindy Parlow Cone.

And then, in an uncommon turn, they returned to the catwalk placed on the field leading to the stage and surrounded it on either side, offering a guard of honor to the Orlando City SC players and staff that had just defeated them to claim the 2022 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

If there was a gesture that summed up Republic FC's historic run, and what the club is made of and stands for, its last act before departing the stage was the perfect illustration.

Glory in victory, honor in defeat.

"The guys did our club, our city, extremely proud," said Republic FC Head Coach Mark Briggs on September 7.

For more than an hour, Sacramento more than held its own against its Major League Soccer opponent. The Lions held more possession, and created shots, but none which threatened Republic FC goal-keeper Danny Vitiello. The home supporters among a club record of 25,527 appeared to be getting restless.

It was, in fact, Republic FC that produced the first shot on target of the game. With 16 minutes to go, Douglas Martinez Jr.'s header off an angled cross from Rodrigo Lopez was claimed by Orlando goalkeeper Pedro Gallese.

It only took a minute, however, for everything to come undone. A misjudgment by Republic FC defender Dan Casey led to a turnover in the defensive end, and within seconds the ball was on the left foot of Uruguayan international Facundo Torres. His strike from the top of the penalty area was perfectly placed, as was his penalty kick five minutes later that sealed the first trophy for the Lions since they claimed the 2013 USL Championship Final, a victory that arrived nine years

prior to the day of Wednesday night's triumph.

"When you make mistakes like that, they punish you," Briggs said. "That's the level they play at. You make mistakes at this level, and you get punished. And that's what happened tonight."

As difficult as the ending proved, Sacramento's run brought pride and a sense of rejuvenation to both the club and the tournament. From the large – and loud – contingent of travelling support that made

its presence felt throughout the night at Exploria Stadium to the thousands that attended the club's watch party back on the west coast, Republic FC not only burnished its reputation with its longtime fans but made new ones both locally and nationally.

"At the end of the day we have to be proud of ourselves, you know?" said Lopez, whose four goals tied him for the tournament lead. "We made history. We did things that no-one thought we could do. Put

ourselves in a situation to play a final. That's something that everyone should hold on to."

There is more to come for Republic FC, both this season and in the years to come. The club's attention will immediately turn to securing a place in the USL Championship Playoffs, where it currently sits fourth in the Western Conference, and pursuing a second USL Championship title in its history.

Then there's the promise of a new downtown stadium, an Academy program that continues to turn out talented professional prospects and youth internationals, and an ever-growing support base in its city.

"The guys gave a fantastic representation of themselves individually and as a group collectively," said Briggs. "[They] gave a great representation of the USL Championship. They should be proud of the performance they put out there and hopefully it highlights there are good players in the second division. There are good players that have the potential to move on and play on a stage like they played on tonight, if you take the time to look."

As it departed Wednesday night's stage, final handshakes complete, heads held high, Republic FC showed the country what a great club looks and feels like


