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Adult School Now in Session

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -With flexible options for in-person and online classes, San Juan Adult Education is welcoming students to the start of its fall term.

"Classes start September 6th," said Richard S. Judge, principal of the San Juan School of Adults, part of the San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD). Classes are offered at the Sunrise Tech Center in Citrus Heights and the Creekside Adult Center.

Judge taught at Mira Loma High School before moving into administration. He became principal of the San Juan School of Adults in 2020.

Guiding the San Juan School of Adults through the pandemic with a robust hybrid learning model where one-third of all students meet in person, and two-thirds now meet online, Judge is especially proud of what the San Juan School of Adults continues to accomplish for the community it proudly serves.

"We have great students and enthusiastic staff," Judge said. He estimated that opening fall enrollment will begin with over 800 students but increase to over 1,500 students by the end of the year.

The SJUSD Adult Education Program offers free high school credit courses which count toward the completion of a high school diploma. Adult students, 18 years of age and up, can work at their own pace in multi-subject classes under the direction of credentialed teachers, as needed, Judge said.

"We're also reaching out more to prospective students through all forms of social media than we've ever done before, with options they can consider to achieve their educational and professional goals," Judge said.

Popular adult education classes include English as a Second Language (ESL), basic citizenship and general workforce training. The San Juan Adult School also offers individual Career Technical

Education (CTE) pathways in healthcare, early childhood education and apprenticeship partner programs.

Judge said he hopes more ESL classes can be offered as additional staff becomes available. "There's a waiting list for these much-needed classes," he said. Student progress dictates advancement to the next ESL class level.

SJUSD adult education serves the Greater Sacramento area and has partnerships with local apprentice programs to provide apprenticeship training in firefighting and other professional careers. Adult education assists with the related and supplemental instruction component of the apprenticeship training program.

"Once a student turns 18, they can enroll in Adult Education to pursue their high school diploma, or their GED, or other goals," Judge said. "It's a long haul to the 220 credits required by the district for a high school diploma, where a GED might

Ranadivé Set to Buy **River Cats**

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In 2013, Vivek Ranadivé purchased the Sacramento Kings. Now nearly a decade later, he is nearing a deal to acquire another Sacramentobased professional sports franchise.

It was first reported by The Sacramento Bee on July 26, that Ranadivé and a group of investors have been negotiating a deal with the Savage family dating back to last year, in the ballpark of \$100 million. However, it was reported by Sportico on August 18 that the actual sale price may be closer to \$90 million.

Even at a lesser price than what was initially reported, the cost for Ranadivé and his group would be a record for the selling price of a Minor League Baseball (MiLB) team and its corresponding stadium. According to Ballpark Digest, most MiLB teams have an estimated value of around \$40-50 million.

The Savage family has owned the River Cats and its ballpark since the franchises' inception in 2000.

Ranadivé made the following statement back in 2015 when he invested in Sacramento Republic FC, a USL Championship team, a league that is one tier below Major League

"This is another major step in revitalizing downtown and making the entire Sacramento region an even better place to work, live and play," Ranadivé said. "We're committed to our vision of making Sacramento the world class city its citizens deserve."

With the purchase of the River Cats and potential looming purchase of Sac Republic, Ranadivé may be positioning himself to stand alongside other sports owners of multiple teams like Stan Kroenke, Joel Glazer and Shahid Khan.

Chief Gets Soaked at ALS Association Fundraiser

The Greater Sacramento Chapter of ALS (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis) Association recently partnered with Sacramento Downtown Commons (DOCO) at 405 K Street, Sacramento for its inaugural CEO Soak to raise funds for those suffering from what's commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease.

On August 12, CEOs from the region participated in ALS Association's ice bucket soaking to donate a total of \$15,265 for the association's efforts in providing funds in a three-pronged approach against the disease, including patient care, public policy, and global research.

Senior Vice President of Territory Management for the ALS Association, Amy Sugimoto, stated, "Our programs and services allow for people across the 24 counties we serve to have access to support group meetings, durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs and ramps, speech communication devices, and so much more."

"Sunrise Village was in need of a serious refresh, and I think the people of Citrus Heights will enjoy its fresh new look once it's done," he said.

Green perimeter fencing around the job site diverts parking lot traffic around Jo-Anne Fabrics behind Olive Garden towards Rite Aid.

"We're completing the gutting and reconstruction of all the existing commercial spaces within the Sunrise Village Shopping Center and then building new space for two new anchor tenants, City Sports, a new fitness gym, and a grocery store."

Two large components of the project involve the building of an approximately 38,000-square foot commercial space between the existing Rite Aid drug store and new 36,182-square-foot City Sports Club. The name of the new retail grocer has not yet been disclosed.

In the vacant space where Tuesday Morning and Jo-Anne Fabrics previously stood before relocating, steel roofing has been removed, and new concrete block walls are going up.

Concrete flooring was taken up, crushed and then recycled on site, creating large sand piles which are visible from Sunrise Boulevard.

Moorefield Construction has completed similar construction projects before, stripping away the physically dated exteriors of oncebusy shopping centers to the bare bones, and then starting over, Larry Moorefield said.

Sloped blue roofing tile of all its recognizable separate buildings was stripped off, Moorfield said. Original store window glazing was kept in place.

New framing construction of two separate buildings which face Madison Avenue, and a strip of suites situated to the right of the Rite Aid drug store are now enclosed offering shade to future customers.

Exterior demolition of a 5,274-square foot shuttered restaurant which faces Uplands Way has also begun.

Through the generosity of the Citrus Heights Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.

On August 11th, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved two ordinances that will ban homeless encampments in several important locations. As this was an intensely controversial vote, and since homelessness is by far the number one issue that constituents talk with me about, I wanted to take the time to explain the details of these ordinances, and why I wholeheartedly supported them.

The ordinances do several key things. First and foremost, they ban homeless encampments from the American River Parkway and the Dry Creek Parkway. They also ban camps near any critical infrastructure, schools, and libraries. And they also ban the use or maintenance of a container with flammable or combustible liquid or a generator.

Now these all seem like fairly obvious things, and you are likely wondering why these were not already illegal and why it's taken until now to crack down on this. It all stems from a ridiculous 9th Circuit Court of Appeals decision back in 2018 which declared that local governments cannot enforce anti-camping ordinances who don't want the help? if they do not have enough homeless shelter beds term solution to our Folsom, Orangevale, available for their home-homeless problem in Antelope, North less population. yers have been studying this issue and have found that while we cannot make homeless encampments illegal everywhere, we can deem some areas as off-limits. While it's likely there will be a lawsuit in the future that tests this, our lawyers feel confident that these bans are legally justifiable and will hold up in court. If our lawyers thought we could do more than this, I would have also supported it – but they believe this is as far as we can safely go without jeopardizing county taxpayers with costly lawsuits.

I have just finished conducting seven community meetings in various parts of my district, and I heard the same thing at each of them. The vast vast majority of my constituents are fed up. The homeowners and renters, especially those with young children, say that they are not alright with the status quo. These people pay their taxes, and rightly expect to be able to walk outside in safety without trash, human excrement, and homeless encampments.

They also largely agree that throwing money at the problem is clearly not working. We continue to spend money on new housing options, as well as drug/alcohol/mental health treatment (the things I consider to be the root cause of homelessness), but our homeless population is growing at a rapid pace even as we massively increase homeless spending. People who want help can seek it and are given support, but how do we hold those accountable

I believe that the long

are actively building as So what changed? The I write this. These are Sacramento County law- essentially low cost tiny home villages that have full-time staff at them to keep it safe, clean, and provide substance abuse and mental health treatment to homeless people. Building these will allow us to then go to our homeless encampments in our neighborhoods and give them a choice. They can either move into these sanctioned encampments, or they can move somewhere else - but they can't stay there. If they move into our safe stay sites, great! We can then move them somewhere safe, clean, and off the streets. If they decline that and move somewhere else, great! We can clean up the site, not allow these encampments to grow into the huge sites we have now, and they can keep repeating this cycle of getting their camp moved until they actually accept the help they need.

Beautification Crew Program to Reduce Blight and Increase City Vibrancy

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The City of Citrus Heights has taken a critical step to help reduce blight and maintain a vibrant and clean community by launching recruitments to staff a new Beautification Crew Program.

On June 23, 2022, the Citrus Heights City Council unanimously approved the Beautification Crew Program voicing enthusiasm for the program's potential to address one of their key areas of focus, improving community image for residents and business. The City is contracting two limited term full-time positions to provide maintenance and beautification services, including: Litter and weed abatement, illegal sign removal, removal of unauthorized materials in the public right of way, graffiti removal, augmenting existing contracted services, support for encampment material removal, pressure washing, and clearing of debris along sidewalks and

The crew will deploy in a fully outfitted utility truck to support the program. Like other communities, Citrus Heights

has experienced increased levels of visible blight largely attributed to illegal dumping, negligent littering, inattentive property owners, and transient activity. These challenges adversely affect Citrus Heights businesses and threaten the economic vitality of our community and the quality of life for our residents. This current, complex situation is the result of many factors outside the City's control, which include but are not limited to relevant case law related to unlawful camping activity, lack of affordable housing, and a historical lack of local resources to proactively address blight. The one-time American Rescue Plan Act funding has provided Citrus Heights a unique opportunity to increase local control and advance community image goals by deploying resources directly into the community that will proactively address blight.

The Beautification Crew Program is a part of the City's multipronged approach to improve and maintain community image and vibrancy. Be on the lookout for the Beautification Crew at upcoming events as the City ramps up outreach and education around the program and services that will be provided.

give them a better option."

A high school diploma in the San Juan Unified School District is earned after successful completion of 220 credits in specified subject areas.

Some 1,245 students were enrolled in San Juan Adult Education during the 2020-21 school year, according to the district. Thirty-one high school diplomas and equivalencies were earned. Seventy-four percent of students were between 18 and 39 years of age. Three out of four students were women.

Sixty percent were enrolled in English Language Acquisition (ELA) classes, and 37 percent in either basic or adult secondary skills. Seventy-one percent were non-native English speakers with the top two languages being Farsi and Spanish.

Starting this fall, the San Juan School for Adults will offer free California Basic Skills Assessment Test (CBEST) classes to help address the shortage of

qualified substitute/guest teachers in the San Juan Unified School District, Judge

Popular continuing education classes took a hit during the pandemic, Judge said, cut down to two offered this fall, which will include community concert band and bicycle repair.

"We hope to offer many more such classes in the future," Judge said.

Summer is here! This season is one of the most popular times to travel and if you or your family members are planning a summer vacation, make sure to check off getting your REAL ID from your travel checklist. Wherever your summer vacation is taking you, REAL ID is your ticket to fly! This time next summer, federal regulations will require you to show a REAL ID driver's license or another federally approved form of identification (passport, military ID, etc.) to travel within the U.S. and to visit secure federal facilities (military bases, federal courthouses). Note that a REAL ID cannot be used for international travel, a passport is still required.

It's no secret, we're all ready to start traveling again. And with a REAL ID, you'll be ready! The REAL ID process is easier than ever with the DMV's online services. Get ahead of the summer break rush and start your simple online application today.

Q: My children are 7 and 11 years old. Will they need REAL IDs to fly to Florida next summer?

A: No. The TSA does not require anyone under the age of 18 to provide identification when traveling with a companion within the United States. However, the companion will need a form of federally accepted identification (REAL ID, U.S. Passport, U.S. Passport Card, DHS Trusted Traveler Card,

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

How do you know if a will or a trust is best for you?

Dear Monica,

This is a great question, especially since August is National Make-a-Will Month. The first thing you should do is take a serious look at your needs, your wishes and your overall life and financial circumstances.

If you're like the average person with a couple of kids, a home and some savings, a will is all you need. There's no reason to bring lawyers into the mix, unless there's something

complicated about your situation. In cases like this, you can even set one up online that's perfectly legal in just a few minutes.

If you're older, your kids are grown and your estate is worth \$1 million or more, a trust is the way to go. By doing this, you can avoid probate in a way that wills don't allow. Now, if you have a large estate and dependents, having both a will and a trust is a good idea. And you don't have to worry about the two bumping into each other. They're separate legal instruments, and there's generally no conflict between them. If there is a legitimate, legal conflict between them, the trust usually overrides the will.

Simply put, everyone needs a will. But not everyone needs a trust. Trusts can be more than you need, but they can also be a great tool

if you have a larger estate. So, if you're in the vast majority of folks who don't need a trust, just get yourself a will. You'll spend a lot less money and feel so much better knowing your stuff will go to the right people—and that your family will be taken care of!

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -Sacramento State men's soccer alum Max Alvarez

has "come home," accepting the position of assistant coach with the Hornets for the 2022 season, Head Coach Michael Linenberger announced.

"We are very excited to have Max join our staff," Linenberger said. "He is a very good young coach who has a lot to offer our players. He was a very successful player as a Hornet, helping lead us to two conference championships and to two NCAA second round appearances, and also had a successful four-year career as a pro in the USL Championship, including three with the Sacramento Republic FC."

Alvarez followed up a brilliant playing career by spending the last three years launching his coaching career in his hometown of Napa, Calif. He served as the Director of Boys programs at Napa Sport SC from 2020-22 and was an assistant coach at Napa Valley Community College in 2021-22, helping the Storm to their fourth consecutive Bay Valley Conference title.

He then took a position as a head coach at San Juan SC in 2022 in addition to his duties with the Hornets.


A four-year letter winner for Sacramento State from 2009-12 and a twotime All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation second-team selection as a freshman and junior, Alvarez finished his Hornet playing career ranked tied for third on the program's all-time scoring list with 53 career points, scoring 20 career goals to go with 13 assists. His 20 goals rank fourth on the school's career chart, while also holding career records with 175 shot attempts and six made penalties. He also ranks third with 79 shots on goal.

Alvarez's MPSF-leading 23 points in 2009 stand fourth on the school's single-season list, while his 10 goals that season are tied for third. He also holds the program's season mark with 66 shots that year.

As a freshman in 2009, Alvarez helped Sacramento State to a 12-6-3 overall record and a 6-0-1 mark in MPSF play, claiming the league title and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Sacramento State scored a 2-1 win over Loyola Marymount in the opening round before falling to No. 6 UCLA by the same score with Alvarez accounting for the team's

A year later, Alvarez accounted for a pair of assists during another NCAA Tournament run as the Hornets finished 11-5-7 overall and won the MPSF crown, defeating Santa Clara in the opening round before falling to the Bruins for the second consecutive

Following his collegiate career, Alvarez went on to play professionally with FC Tucson in the USL PDL, leading the club to a playoff appearance, and signed with the Sacramento Republic FC in 2014, finishing with a pair of goals and three assists while helping the club to a USL championship in his first season before spending some time on loan with the San Jose Earthquakes of Major League Soccer in 2016. Following his stay in Sacramento, he made a move to the Midwest, signing with Saint Louis FC in 2017.

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
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

Outman has Historic Major League Debut with Dodgers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Just one day removed from getting the call that he was going to "The Show," former Sacramento State outfielder James Outman made sure that his Major League Baseball debut was not only memorable, but historic.

Starting in right field and batting ninth for the Los Angeles Dodgers in the final game of a four-game series with the Colorado Rockies, Outman homered in his first career at-bat and finished a triple short of the cycle, adding three RBI in his new club's 7-3 victory on July 31.


In the process, he became the only player in Dodgers franchise history to finish his Major League debut with a home run, three hits, three RBI, and a pair of runs scored, while becoming the eighth player in franchise history – and the fourth since the club relocated to Los Angeles, joining Keibert Ruiz in 2020, Garey Ingram in 1994, and Jose Offerman in 1990 – to homer in his first career at-bat.

"It was a dream come true," Outman said in the Dodgers' post-game interview. "It's something that I've been envisioning since I was eight years old. I'm kind of still processing everything, but it's been awesome

"As soon as I took the swing (on the home run) I blacked out. I was just telling myself before the at-bat to relax because I knew I was going to have a lot of nerves, so I just wanted to relax and let what I've been doing for 20 years take over."

Added manager Dave Roberts, "It was really fun to watch. You could just see his joy and a day he's dreamt about. For it to play out like this, I can only imagine how he's feeling, how his family is feeling."

A seventh-round draft pick (No. 224 overall) by the Dodgers in the 2018 June Amateur Draft and the Dodgers' No. 17 prospect, Outman became the

third active Hornet in the Major Leagues, joining Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins and former Sacramento State teammate Sam Long, who is with San Francisco. He is the ninth Sacramento State baseball player to appear in the Major Leagues and the first since Long made his debut on June 9, 2021, against Texas.

Outman was called up by the Dodgers on July 30 after splitting time between Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City to start the season. In 90 games between Double-A Tulsa and Triple-A Oklahoma City, Outman hit .279 with a .915 OPS, slugging 21 home runs and driving in 69, while scoring 72 more on his own. In Tulsa, Outman hit .295 with 16 home runs and 45 RBI, collecting a .946 OPS before being promoted to Oklahoma City on June 29, where he has hit five more home runs and driven in 24 in 22 games with a .475 slugging and .340 on-base percentage.

Over 368 career minor league contests, Outman hit .256 with 64 doubles, 18 triples, 69 home runs, and 212 RBI, while posting an .833 OPS.

In his three seasons at Sacramento State, Outman was a two-year starter in the outfield for the Hornets as a sophomore and junior, earning Western Athletic Conference All-Tournament Team and WAC All-Academic Team honors in each of those seasons. He led the league with 11 home runs and ranked second on the team with 40 RBI as a junior in 2018, which followed a sophomore campaign that saw him slug 11 home runs and lead the team with 53 RBI, helping Sacramento State to a conference title and NCAA Regional berth.

Following Sunday's game, Outman and the Dodgers head to San Francisco to take on the Giants - and a possible head-to-head match-up with his former Hornet teammate Long – just 30 minutes away from his hometown of Redwood City, Calif.

Starting immediately, you and vour spouse or domestic partner are restrained from:

1. removing the minor children of the parties from the state or applying for a new or replacement passport for those minor children without the prior written consent of the other party or an order of the court;

2. cashing, borrowing against, canceling, transferring, disposing of, or changing the beneficiaries of any insurance or other coverage, including life, health automobile, and disability, held for the benefit of the parties and their minor children:

transferring, encumbering. hypothecating, concealing, or in any way disposing of any property, real or personal, whether community, quasi-community, or separate, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life; and

4. creating a nonprobate trans-fer or modifying a nonprobate transfer in a manner that affects the disposition of property subject to the transfer, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court. Before revocation of a nonprobate transfer can take effect or a right of survivorship to property can be eliminated, notice of the change must be filed and served on the other party. You must notify each other of

any proposed extraordinary expenditures at least five business days prior to incurring these extraordinary expenditures and account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after these restraining orders are effective. However, you may use community property, quasi-community property, or your own separate property to pay an attorney to help you or pay court

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California Faces Existential Threat of a Megaflood

California had been a state for scarcely a decade and was home to fewer than 500,000 people when it was hammered in the winter of 1861-62 by the most powerful series of rainstorms in recorded history.

"This event, which was characterized by weeks-long sequences of winter storms, produced widespread catastrophic flooding across virtually all of California's lowlands - transforming the interior Sacramento and San Joaquin valleys into a temporary but vast inland sea nearly 300 miles in length and inundating much of the now densely populated coastal plain in present-day Los Angeles and Orange counties.'

That description comes from a new study suggesting that due to climate change California is at ever-increasing risk of another disastrous chain of storms, one that would be devastating, both in human and economic terms, in a state with nearly 40 million residents.

mate change has already increased the risk of a (1862) megaflood scenario in California, but that future climate warming will likely bring about even sharper risk increases," the study

studies about the likelihood that California could experience a series of storms similar to the 1861-62 event, researchers Xingying Huang and Daniel Swain say such an event "would likely produce widespread, catastrophic flooding and subsequently lead to the displacement of millions of people, the long-term closure of critical transportation corridors and ultimately to nearly \$1 trillion in overall economic

the National Center for Atmospheric Research and Swain is a UCLA climate scientist.

Although a megaflood could hit many regions of the state, the 300-mile-long Central Valley is at greatest risk because of its geography. It is in essence an elongated bowl into which, in normal times, water flows benevolently from melting snow in the Sierra. Water that's not consumed in the valley eventually flows into the Pacific Ocean via San Francisco Bay.

We've had instances in the past when the valley's drainage system was overwhelmed by heavy runoff, the worst occurring when warm tropical storms suddenly melted the snowpack. Just a few years ago, the nation's highest dam, Oroville, nearly collapsed when it received more runoff than it could handle.

So there it is. Add megaflood to earthquakes and wildfires on the list of existential threats to California and its millions of residents. What can we do to minimize the danger?

Slowly, federal, state and local governments have been bolstering levees in areas with the highest Huang is a scientist at risks, although officials in Stockton have complained that they have gotten a disproportionately low share of flood control spending. However, even the projects underway are being engineered for floods of lesser intensity than the megaflood outlined in the new study.

The study authors suggest that not only more money is needed for flood control but that California should give the creation of flood plains more priority. Sacramento already depends on two dedicated flood plains, called "bypasses," to prevent heavy flows from overwhelming river levees.

California should also rethink how its residents are insured against catastrophes. Perhaps we could create a statewide umbrella policy to provide basic flood, earthquake and fire protection, financed by property-related fees, that individuals could supplement.

The worst response would be to do nothing.

Defendant Convicted of Murdering His Father

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Matthew Holverstott was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of James Holverstott and elder abuse.

The victim was Matthew Holverstott's father. Matthew Holverstott threatened to kill his father over a real estate deal. The next day, Matthew Holverstott met his father in the parking lot of a church. He then called 911 claiming his father slipped and fell. The father was rushed to

the hospital and died the same day. Matthew Holverstott immediately tried to obtain his father's pension and estate assets valued at approximately \$800,000-\$900,000. An autopsy determined the father suffered six separate blunt force injuries to the head and 14 separate blunt force injuries to his body.

Holverstott faces a maximum sentence of 16 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for August 31, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen Sumner.

Defendant Sentenced for Sexually Abusing Child in Multiple Cities

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Edwin "Vin" Cuxeva was sentenced to 28 years in state prison. On June 30, 2022, Cuxeva pled guilty to 11 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child.

Cuxeva molested the victim when she was 12 to 17 years old and committed the abuse in multiple cities across the state, including Sacramento and Los Angeles. The sexual abuse included multiple acts of sexual intercourse, oral copulation and fondling.

During an emotional sentencing hearing before Commissioner Ken Brody, the victim, along with her siblings and mother, delivered poignant statements that detailed the trauma they endured over several years of abuse. In closing her statement, the victim articulated, "I am here to say that in spite of Edwin Cuxeva, today I have found my joy, my peace, and my justice. I know that nothing will ever give me back what he grotesquely stole from me and my family but we have many more branches we can grow beyond this garden."



Aerospace Museum Feels 'the Need for Speed'

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento-area Aerospace Museum of California in McClellan celebrated its first evening Open Cockpit event on Saturday, August 20, 2022. Since it has a "Top Gun" F-14 Tomcat and the movie "Top Gun: Maverick" is out this summer, the museum staff decided to open fourteen of their plane cockpits for viewing on Saturday afternoon.

Traditionally, the Aerospace Museum sponsors Open Cockpits twice a year during the day — once on May 4th for "May the Fourth be with you" and once on Veterans Day on November 11th. These events, which have proven to be popular with attendances up to one thousand, have now been reformatted into Top Gun Open Cockpit.

The event was an enjoyable date for visiting with volunteers, staff and the public about their experiences with the Museum. Karen Jones, Advancement Director at Aerospace Museum of California, oversees its fundraising and pointed out that the Covid experience in the last couple of years was beneficial for the faciliy. They profited in many ways, reinvented the experience and kept staff busy refurbishing their exhibits, when they could not be open to the public. A new café was opened during this time and a new exhibit built around the Makani, a large energy kite named after the Hawaiian word for wind they received from the manufacturer in 2020.
