Next Steps Approved for Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)

- At the August 11 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered a response to a memo from Sacramento Environmental Commission requesting the city participate in a no-cost Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) recently adopted by Sacramento County, the City of Sacramento, and the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD).

The MOU sets the framework for how participating agencies coordinate electrification efforts in building updates and in new construction. Benefits of participation would be increased information sharing, fewer duplicative processes, shared resources, increased community input, and a competitive advantage for requesting related grant funding.

Participation in the MOU would not create any ordinance or regulation within the city or tie the city to actions by other jurisdictions. It would meet policies in the City's general plan, such as encouraging green building practices, cooperating with regional agencies, and looking at programs with SMUD for further energy conservation efforts. Associate Planner Eric Singer explained that the MOU is designed to promotes electric use as a greener way forward, thereby decreasing the use of natural gas. Councilmember Steve Miller said he found the language in the MOU to be disingenuous, since it didn't specify that the main purpose is to reduce natural gas usage. Councilmember Bret Daniels said he didn't have enough information to support it at this time. Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer said he saw the MOU as an opportunity for the "powers that be" to mandate more policies to the cities. While the MOU wouldn't cost the City any money or mandate any policies, he said he "has huge concerns." Councilmember Jeannie Bruins asked if there would be any impact for the City if they chose not to participate, and Singer explained there would be no change to current practices. Mayor Porsche Middleton reminded Council that SMUD is trying to get to Zero Carbon Neutral by 2030 and will be doing that by increasing Continued on page 5

Grant Considered for Nonprofit to Procure Senior Housing Property

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the meeting on August 11, City Council gave direction to the City Manager to execute a non-binding Letter of Intent where the City of Citrus Heights would sponsor an application for a Community Care Expansion Program (CCEP) acquisition grant to permanently dedicate Auburn Oaks Senior Apartments as low-income

senior housing. Coloradobased nonprofit The Life Foundation is in contract to buy the apartments at 7501 Sunrise Blvd, a property with a history of serving as assisted living and lower-cost senior housing. The nonprofit approached the City of Citrus Heights about collaborating to ensure the property remains in service to the local senior population.

According to the non-binding Letter of Intent terms, City staff

Life Foundation to get grant funding for senior housing. In turn, the Life Foundation would own and operate the senior housing project and perform ongoing grant administration. The Life Foundation would also provide community health education programs for youth and families in Citrus Heights. The City would have approval rights over future changes in management companies operating the property.

Climate Emergency Mobilization Task Force Seated

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted on August 9 to appoint 13 members to the newly created Climate Emergency Mobilization Task Force.

On Dec. 16, 2020, the Board of Supervisors (BOS) adopted a resolution declaring a climate emergency and directing the formation of the Task Force. On March 23, 2022, the BOS approved a resolution that set the Task Force compensation and composition, endorsed the guiding principles and scope of work, and directed the Sustainability Manager to begin a public application process to fill member seats.

"We are excited to start working with the 13 newly appointed members of the Climate Emergency Mobilization Task Force," said John Lundgren, Sustainability Manager. "After a thorough interview process, we have picked 13 of the best candidates in the region to provide input, guidance, oversight and assistance to my office, and to serve as an advisory body to the County."

The interview panel consisted of the Sustainability Manager and staff from the National Weather Service Sacramento, the County Planning and Environmental Review Division, and the Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District.

The 13 members appointed today are: Technical Expertise Members: Justin Hwang (expertise: air quality), Austin Miller (expertise: agriculture), Mackenzie Wieser (expertise: built environment), Roslyn Roberts (expertise: economics), Kevin Head (expertise: energy), Ghazan Khan (expertise: transit/transportation).

Bera Secures Funds for Sacramento Meals on Wheels Program

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) -Representative Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-07) announced on July 26, that he secured \$750,000 in the House Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations package to support Meals on Wheels in the Sacramento region.

Funding for the project was included in the FY23

County Proclaims MonkeyPox Public Health and Local Emergency

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, August 9, Sacramento County proclaimed a public health emergency and a local emergency in order to ensure appropriate resources and funding are available to the County in its response to monkeypox.

The proclamations of a public health emergency and local emergency do not signify an increased risk to the residents of Sacramento County. A proclamation of emergency allows the County to provide or receive mutual aid from other jurisdictions and assists in opening up available resources, mutual aid and staffing.

The proclamations follow the State of California's proclamation of emergency on Aug. 1, regarding monkeypox and the funding that would be made available. Proclaiming a local emergency is a prerequisite for requesting and receiving available federal or state funding.

"Proclaiming a state of emergency in response to Monkeypox helps the County to ensure uninterrupted access to resources necessary to lessen disease transmission," said Don Nottoli, Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors. "The proclamations should not be a reason for elevated concern; but rather, considered as mechanisms to assist in our mission to better respond to and contain the virus."

The County continues to work closely with the Centers for Disease Control and the California Department of Public Health on coordinated testing, investigations, and providing guidance and assistance to health providers in monitoring for monkeypox symptoms and gathering information to detect new cases for laboratory testing and confirming infection.

Transmission of monkeypox virus occurs when a person comes into contact with the virus from an animal, human or materials contaminated with the virus. The virus enters the body through broken skin (even if not visible), respiratory tract or the mucous membranes (eyes, nose, or mouth).

Symptoms of monkeypox include; fever, headache, muscle aches, backache, swollen lymph nodes, chills and exhaustion. Within 1 to 3 days (sometimes longer) after the appearance of fever, the patient develops a rash, often beginning on the face then spreading to other parts of the body. The incubation period (time from infection to symptoms) for monkeypox is usually 7-14 days but can range from 5–21 days. The illness typically lasts for 2-4 weeks.

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
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Sunday Funday Returns in September

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Two Ordinances to Prohibit Camping Approved

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Board of Supervisors on August 11, approved two ordinances addressing camping and encampments near critical infrastructure such as levees and government buildings, wildfire and flood risk areas during severe weather, near shelters for persons experiencing homelessness, youth-serving facilities and a separate ordinance prohibiting camping on the entire stretch of the American River and Dry Creek Parkways. The Board will formally adopt the two approved ordinances on August 23, and they will go into effect 30 days later.

As was mentioned several times by staff, county counsel and supervisors, these ordinances going into effect will not result in the wide-scale clearing of encampments. The County has both a legal and moral obligation to identify the highest priority camps, identify the needs of the campers and offer services and shelter as appropriate. The County is committed to applying a thoughtful approach in order to balance the needs of both the campers and the impacted community surrounding encampments.

"These ordinances provide another tool for County staff and our outreach partners to engage with folks experiencing homelessness camping illegally, assess their needs and determine the best course of action to move them away from critical infrastructure," said Board Chair Don Nottoli. "The time has come to balance the needs of our unsheltered population with the impacts that our communities and environment have been facing for years."

The ordinances provide law enforcement officials with the authority to specifically address the activities in these particular locations because of public health, safety and welfare concerns.

The critical infrastructure ordinance adds Chapter 9.120 to the Sacramento County Code to prohibit camping and encampments in the following priority areas:

In, on or within 25 feet of critical infrastructure or the entrance/exit of critical infrastructure; Up to 1,000 feet of a location providing year-round overnight shelter to people experiencing homelessness and the entrance/exit to such locations: Inside of, or within 30 feet of wildfire and flood risk areas during severe weather; And, within 25 feet of a youth-serving facility, defined as public or private primary or secondary schools and public libraries.

Violations would first be subject to verbal and written warnings and any

person who violates the ordinance would be guilty of a misdemeanor. This also authorizes the County Executive or designee to promulgate rules, protocols and procedures for the implementation of the ordinance.

To read the full definitions of each identified priority area, read the full ordinance at the county website.

The Board also approved a separate ordinance that addresses the Dry Creek and American River Parkway specifically.

"The American River Parkway is our region's most treasured recreational and ecological asset," said First District Supervisor Phil Serna. "As the stewards responsible for its protection, we are obligated to see that it is a clean and safe place for everyone to enjoy while ensuring those who feel their only option is to reside on the Parkway, have housing opportunities and access to services elsewhere in the county."

The following are key provisions of the ordinance:

Prohibition on camping or constructing, maintaining or inhabiting any structure or camping facility in the American River Parkway or Dry Creek Parkway, except with written permission from the Director;

Prohibition on modifying the parklands (e.g. dirt, landscaping) or accumulating furniture, household goods, or other items in order to create a structure;

Bans the use or maintenance of a container with flammable or combustible liquid or a generator, except when issued a permit by the Regional Parks Director.

The intent of the proposed ordinance is to provide the County with an additional enforcement tool to address camping and the proliferation of unpermitted structures used as makeshift shelters in the Parkways and reduce public safety concerns relating to the use of flammable or combustible liquids and generators in parks. However, the ability to enforce the proposed ordinance, like the existing Code provisions, is dependent on law enforcement capacity and prioritization as well as availability of shelter, as outlined in the proposed Park Rangers' Action Plan. In addition, the Action Plan describes the County's commitment to conduct outreach efforts to offer alternative shelter and other services to individuals camping in the Parkways.

Defendant Sentenced for Human Trafficking, Kidnapping

- Commissioner Ken Brody sentenced Tony Miller to 25 years and 4 months in prison. On June 16, 2022, Miller pled to kidnapping and human trafficking

of an adult using force. Miller also admitted to a prior strike conviction for robbery.

On February 10, 2020, the Sacramento Police Department received a report that witnesses had seen a young woman crying and walking down the street naked. Witnesses then saw Tony

Miller pull up to her in his car, pull her by the hair into the car, and hit her in the face. Officers also found video surveillance of this crime. This occurred near a known prostitution stroll area, and law enforcement suspected that it may be related to human trafficking. Detectives were able to identify and later locate both Miller and the victim. They also located a second victim Miller had been trafficking. The second victim described how Miller groomed her over several weeks by pretending to be an affectionate boyfriend before turning her out to engage in

prostitution and taking all the money she made. Miller had become progressively more violent toward both victims and would physically assault them daily. Messages from Miller's cell phone corroborated what the second victim told detectives.

rates "and forcing us to make these kinds of modifications. ... so, this is just another step in that process."

Councilmember Bruins moved that the City not participate in the MOU, and that motion passed unanimously.

Council then considered abandonment of a 25-foot setback impacting 30 properties in the Larchmont Rosewood Subdivision. The setback was recorded in 1983, and Singer said, "There's no real clear record of what exactly the setback was recorded for."

Staff determined that it was likely a safety setback, because at the time of recording, the adjacent property was owned by Southern Pacific Railroad. But since that time, the property was sold and developed into more single-family homes, "so that's negated the need," said Singer. Abandoning the setback would allow the 30 affected property owners to fully use and build upon their properties in the area currently restricted by the setback.

Council voted unanimously to abandon the setback.

The Council also considered approval of various resolutions to move forward with construction of the Arcade-Cripple Creek Trail Project. The project will construct a 2.9-mile trail connecting various parks in Citrus Heights and Orangevale, as well as Sunrise MarketPlace and Woodside K-8 School. The trail will mostly follow the existing SMUD transmission corridor, providing a paved trail for pedestrians and bicycles.

The total project cost estimate is \$10.3 million - including construction costs totaling \$8.4 million, plus 10% contingency costs estimated at \$846,603; construction management at \$823,340; construction design support services at \$60,804; tree mitigation at \$41,720; and a \$135,645 contract with Sacramento Tree Foundation.

The City has significant grant funding for the project, such as Active Transportation Program Grant, Recreation Trails Grant, and Per Capita Park Grant funds. The city also has funds available through their park impact fees, storm water utility funds, Measure A funds, waste management funds, and tree mitigation funds. The City will need just \$2 million in gap funding, which will be provided through a zero-interest loan from Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG), with the city repaying \$500,000 per year for four years beginning in July 2023 (with a pledge by the Council not to use money for the General

to begin construction. Another financial risk to delaying the project is that many of the grants have specific spending timelines, and if the project isn't completed within the required timeframe, the City would have to pay back those funds.

During Public Comment, many spoke in support of the project and the improved quality of life it will bring the community, by providing a safe and accessible trail system that will allow more people to get outdoors and enjoy nature in the area parks and open spaces.

Other residents voiced safety concerns about how pedestrians and bicyclists could be kept safe when the trail crosses over busy thoroughfares or narrow neighborhood streets where vehicles often speed or run through stop signs.

City Engineer Leslie Blomquist said that a variety of traffic calming measures such as raised crosswalks, flashing signals, etc. - will be implemented at locations where the trail crosses city streets.

Councilmember Bret Daniels said that although he initially wasn't really on board with the project, he now fully supports it: "The train has left the station. ... This is going to pass tonight, and it should." He did ask that some specific concerns brought up during the meeting be considered as the project moves forward, and he suggested safety improvements could be made by making minor adjustments to where the trail crosses busy or narrow roads.

Vice Mayor Tim Schaefer said he also supports the project, and he commended staff for listening to resident concerns and making compromises to address those issues throughout the process. He also thanked all the public commenters: "None of this is wasted effort. Any great idea will stand up to a great debate, and I think we've had a good debate here."

Councilmember Steve Miller agreed that all the concerns brought forward serve to "make the project better." And he pledged that while mistakes might be made along the way, City Council and staff will always work to fix them.

Mayor Porsche Middleton said she is passionate about creating a regional trail system and making sure that the city and surrounding areas are "incorporated into what the feeling of Citrus Heights is, which is about family, community, safety, and being able to get around and bring in more folks who want to enjoy nature."

To the public, Mayor Middleton said, "We hear you, we respect everything that you've said tonight, and we're going to do

Community Development Director Casey Kempenaar explained that although the construction bid came in higher than initially estimated, delaying the project to request more bids could result in even higher bids with the current volatility in the construction industry. 



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Zombie Build Back Better Would be an Apocalypse for Taxpayers

The Democrats' Build Back Better bill has risen from the dead. Sen. Joe Manchin, D-W. Va., who killed the massive spending package last year, is back in conversation with his party's leaders about advancing a slimmeddown version of the measure.

Taxpayers would be better off if Build Back Better died again. The legislation, if passed, would make permanent the wasteful Obamacare subsidies that went into effect in March 2021 under the American Rescue Plan, and that are scheduled to expire at the end of the year.

The legislation made Obamacare tax credits more generous for those making less than 400% of the federal poverty level, or about \$111,000 for a family of four. In addition, it extended subsidies to people making more than four times poverty by capping what they'd have to pay in premiums at 8.5% of income.

The cost of these subsidies has far exceeded early estimates. Though the expansion is only scheduled to last until the end of 2022, the Congressional Budget Office originally predicted it would cost \$34.2 billion over the agency's 10-year budget window.

But a recent CBO report reveals the expansion will cost \$30 billion this year alone – 50% higher than original projections, per former Trump administration economic advisor Brian Blase.

Many of those taxpayer dollars will be funneled to disproportionately

wealthy Americans. As Blase has pointed out, couples making \$500,000 in some parts of the country are newly eligible for more than \$7,000 in exchange subsidies. It's no wonder more than 1 million Americans making over four times the poverty level have enrolled in Obamacare this year.

Forcing taxpayers to continue picking up their health insurance tab will come at an enormous cost. The CBO pegs the cost of a permanent subsidy expansion at \$220 billion.

That's senseless. Cementing these ill-targeted subsidies in place would create an apocalypse for taxpayers.

Federal Jury Finds Sacramento Man Guilty of Sex Trafficking

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - After a six-day trial, a federal jury found Antonio Deshawn Long-Andrews, 28, of Sacramento, guilty of sex trafficking by force, fraud, or coercion, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents and evidence presented at trial, between August 2017 and Dec. 5, 2018, Long targeted a young woman using force, threats of force, and coercion to cause her to perform commercial sex acts for his financial benefit. Long's commercial sex operation occurred on the streets and inside motel rooms in Northern and Southern California cities, including Sacramento, Oakland, San Jose, Santa Ana, and Orange.

According to evidence presented at trial, on Sept. 28, 2018, as part of his sex trafficking operation, Long repeatedly punched the victim inside his car in the parking lot of a motel. During the attack, the victim tried to exit the car, but an associate of Long kept her inside the car while Long continued to beat her. An eyewitness saw the attack, and the motel's security camera recorded the victim being dragged under Long's car. Although the victim was injured and had two black eyes, a week later, Long continued to

engage her in commercial sex acts for his benefit.

During recorded calls from the Sacramento County Jail, Long maintained control over the victim, conveying that she was expected to earn money for him by selling her body to strangers. After Long's release from the Sacramento County Jail, Long continued his exploitation of the victim from late November 2018 until his arrest on Dec. 5, 2018.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Sacramento Police Department, the California Department of Justice, and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The California Highway Patrol, the Sacramento Sheriff's Department, and the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office assisted in the investigation. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Jason Hitt, Christina McCall, and Nirav Desai are prosecuting the case.

Long is scheduled to be sentenced by U.S. District Judge John A. Mendez on Oct. 18, 2022. Long faces a minimum sentence of 15 years in prison and a maximum statutory penalty of life in prison, and a maximum fine of \$250,000. The sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines.

How California Mistreated Workers who Lost Jobs in Pandemic

When Gov. Gavin Newsom shut down much of the state's economy $2 \frac{1}{2}$ years ago to slow the spread of COVID-19, more than 2 million workers suddenly lost their jobs.

Logic and compassion should have made easing the economic blow to those workers and their families a top priority.

Unfortunately, however, it fell to the Employment Development Department, which had already demonstrated incompetence in a previous recession, to handle the tsunami of claims for unemployment insurance benefits — and the predictable result was a total meltdown that deprived desperate workers of muchneeded cash.

While countless claims for state benefits were delayed, sometimes for months, or erroneously denied, EDD's staff approved many fraudulent claims for special federal benefits, resulting in more than \$18 billion being paid to fraudsters, including some inmates in state prisons.

Legitimate payments, when made, quickly exhausted the Unemployment Insurance Fund and the state was compelled to borrow more than \$20 billion from the federal government to maintain

many years to repay. EDD's massive mana-

gerial disaster could, and should, have been prevented had the state's politicians not ignored numerous indications that EDD and the unemployment insurance (UI) program were train wrecks waiting to happen.

On Monday, the Legislature's budget analyst, Gabe Petek, issued a detailed and sharply worded report on how EDD failed and what should be done to avoid a repeat.

"These failures trace back to the (unemployment insurance) program's basic design, which has encouraged EDD to adopt policies and practices that make it unreasonably difficult for eligible workers to get benefits," Petek told the Legislature. "Although these problems are not new, the pandemic has highlighted the need for the state to rebalance the UI program in ways that make getting incapable of absorbing even benefits to eligible workers a top priority."

Petek's report also castigates EDD for concealing the extent of the unemployment insurance backlog by adopting a "narrow interpretation" of a state law requiring the agency to report data to the Legislature.

As a result, Petek said, "the Legislature was unaware of the widespread reliance on procedural denials at a time when the department could not process incoming mail and phone calls. Had getting payments to eligible workers been a top priority, the department could have reported the full scope of claims that were found ineligible — instead of the narrowest scope ---- to bring working for California news-the issue to the Legislature's papers.

benefits, a debt that will take attention and begin work toward a solution.'

It was, in brief, incompetence compounded by coverup. One wonders whether anyone in the bureaucracy will be punished for concealing the facts.

The report lists ways in which the application process could be streamlined, eliminating duplication and making it much easier for legitimate claims to be approved and benefits to be paid. It also hints that something must be done about the deplorable condition of the Unemployment Insurance Fund, which is financed by payroll taxes on employers.

California is one of only a few states that tax the minimum amount of a worker's earnings, \$7,000 a year, under federal law. A decades-long stalemate between employers and unions over taxes and benefits left the insurance fund a mild recession, much less the COVID-19 shutdown, forcing the state to borrow from the feds

Petek's report challenges Newsom and the Legislature to make certain that the EDD disaster doesn't happen again. That would require procedural overhauls and technological upgrades, but also doing something about the Unemployment Insurance Fund. It's shameful that the richest state in the nation borrowed billions from Washington to pay benefits to workers who were unemployed because of a state emergency decree.


