CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District Station 21 in Citrus Heights was base camp for kids with ages ranging from 11-13 attending the 2022 Fire Camp from July 12-15. From Tuesday to Friday, kids experienced the four-day week as firefighters, becoming for a few days part of the Sac Metro Fire District family.

Fire Camp kicked off Tuesday morning at 9 a.m. with an introduction and a tour of Fire Station 21 located at 7641 Greenback Ln. Since the event was canceled during the COVID-19 shuttering, Metro Fire decided that the returning theme for the week was 'having fun'.

According to Chris Dargan, Fire District Community Relations Coordinator, "[Participants] spend the week working as teams while playing games, learning life skills,

experiencing a small part of what being a firefighter is like and helping fight a fire in a controlled environment using training props."

"Campers build a sense of teamwork and responsibility," Dargan said, "[and] are organized into 'strike

teams' of eight campers each and mentored by two firefighters."

Team spirit was fostered by creating team names, team flags and getting official t-shirts and hats for the occasion.

CAL EXPO, CA (MPG) - Opening weekend of the CA State Fair & Food Festival was a roaring success, drawing tens of thousands of visitors after a two-year pandemic pause. Fairgoers of all ages enjoyed rides and games, food and drink, live music, livestock, exhibits, and more.

"We're very excited that the opening weekend was so well received by our guests, who helped celebrate California with an exciting, successful, and safe start," said Rick Pickering, Cal Expo General Manager and CEO.

The exciting shrills coming from the rides and the positive buzz from first-ever California Cannabis Exhibit, were among the main attractions on opening weekend. As of Sunday afternoon 8,225, unlimited ride wristbands have been sold; 14,000 fast passes sold; over 10,000 ride tickets were sold. Amongst all the thrilling rides, the White-Water Flume ride was the most popular with over 8,500 riders, understandably considering the hot temperatures.

Country Fair Cinnamon Rolls wins back-to-back Best of Show in the Food Festival Completion, this time with its Cinnamon Toast Caramel Roll. Other big winners are first-time vendors at the CA State Fair & Food Festival, Bula Pies Fiji for its Chicken Curry hand pie, and Cakes by Jeff won awards for two of his delicious, sweet treats. Soul on a Roll and Wing Mahal also won ribbons.

The clear bag policy that we've implemented - similar to Golden 1, River Cats & Sac Republic, helped eager fairgoers get through the gates quickly and safely so they could start enjoying the fun.

"On Thursday, we honor our military, veterans and first responders for Appreciation day," said Pickering. "I want to thank all of our law enforcement officers and security team, who are doing an exceptional job helping to keep the state fair the safest place families can be this summer".

The CA State Fair & Food Festival runs daily through Sunday, July 31st at Cal Expo. ★

Sunrise MarketPlace Debating Ban on New Gas Stations and Car Washes

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The Sunrise MarketPlace in Citrus Heights is currently debating a ban on new gas stations and car washes that may be proposed in their shopping center.

The decision is being pondered in an attempt to "revitalize" the MarketPlace, according to a recent story from ABC10.

Citrus Heights has proposed an "overlay zone proposal" that will "further refine the uses allowed in the Sunrise MarketPlace to make sure the area is

solely used for shopping, dining and entertainment," according to ABC10.

The Sunrise MarketPlace's mailing address is 5912 Sunrise Blvd. However, the shopping center is very large and ranges from PetSmart near Tall River Drive to The Habit Burger Grill located on the corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Madison Avenue.

The story written by ABC10 on July 12 stated that, "The city developed the Sunrise Tomorrow Plan for the Sunrise Mall site in November. From the Sunrise Tomorrow Plan came a survey the city says is the basis of the overlay

zone proposal."

According to the survey results, the City of Citrus Heights community responded by saying that they wanted more entertainment and dining options available to them.

"The city of Citrus Heights is 98% built out and the marketplace is almost completely built out," the ABC story explained. "City officials say the overlay zone proposal will help preserve some land."

For those worried that their favorite convenience store, gas station or car wash in Citrus Heights may be closing, fear not! All existing locations will

stay, and only new proposed projects will be banned under the proposed ban.

"Right now, we are seeing a lot of pressure for uses that are more conducive for passing through traffic traveling down Sunrise Boulevard and not necessarily stopping in Citrus Heights," said Citrus Heights community development director, Casey Kempenaar, to ABC 10. "So, we want to make sure we give those folks [an] excuse to stop here, shop here, play here and be entertained here."

"Making sure we have land available to do so is paramount." ★

Ancient Near Eastern History Featured at State Fair

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A new face at the Sacramento State Fair this year at the Valley Sculpture Artists (VSA) booth is Raad Alnahat, an immigrant from Iraq who will be filling the VSA demonstration spot Chris Thompson held at the fair for many years.

Alnahat has many credentials and will be demonstrating his unique process of combining sculpture and ceramics to construct large figures during the two weeks of the fair. He will show his particular process for how he constructs larger format forms. His work reflects his culture, featuring works from biblical days. After Israel, Iraq has the most biblical history of any country in the world.

One of Alnahat's pieces is a six-foot tall, 250-pound statue of the last great king of Assyria. King Ashurbanipal of the Neo-Assyrian Empire reigned for 38 years from 669 BC to his death in 631 BC in Nineveh. The four intricate sections of his piece include the head, a lion and an engraved tablet with writing in four languages.

Alnahat studied in Iraq, receiving his Certificate of Fine Arts in Baghdad in 1985, specializing in sculpture. He has taught painting, ceramics and calligraphy for over 10 years and participated in many galleries and exhibits in Iraq, including his own personal exhibit 1987. He shared in an email that he had to leave Nineveh, Iraq, in 2008 because of the war. He traveled to Turkey and lived there for two years showing his work in

numerous galleries as well as teaching calligraphy.

"I came to the United States in 2010 with my family and began studying

all forms of art to improve myself, but I mostly enjoyed ceramics because it relates closely to my style. I studied at American

River College and one of my large sculptures stands in their Art department today. Through my work in ceramics, I was

able to combine ceramics with sculpture. My work is mostly influenced from our history in Iraq such as the Babylonian empire,

Assyrian empire, etc." Alnahat will be demonstrating his unique style daily at the VSA booth from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. ★

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The last few weeks of the 2021-22 school year were filled with celebrations for Ottomon Way Elementary School and John Barrett Middle School as teachers Nicolette Pulley and Logan Grinsell were recognized as the 2023 Teachers of the Year.

At San Juan Unified, teachers are not just chosen for their student-focus, but their site leadership, willingness to make adjustments, and their focus on ensuring our students are being taken care of emotionally and socially.

Both these teachers have spent years mastering their crafts and learning how to connect

with students in this district.

Grinsell began working at San Juan Unified almost 10 years ago and has spent his entire career at John Barrett Middle School. Aside from teaching science and art, Grinsell is the school musical director, a track coach, and the MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science, Achievement) advisor for students.

In his application for Teacher of the Year, Grinsell shared what the definition of a teacher is and why he is surpassing that definition.

“Based on this definition, teaching is nothing special,” said Grinsell. “But what is lacking from the definition that I bring is the passion and heart to make teaching

one of the best professions to get into.”

As for Pulley, she began working at San Juan Unified eight years ago and has spent her entire teaching career with the district.

Over the last year, Pulley has provided more than 12 hours of professional development to site staff and six hours of training for instructional assistants to implement reading. She also provided on-campus support for K-3 teachers completing Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS).

In her application, she explains that it is essential to rely on the unique strengths and gifts of school site staff to help student achievement.

“Personally, I communicate my appreciation for my staff through service-based leadership,” said Pulley. “I serve my team in my ability to share my professional areas of expertise where I feel confident that I can lead my team in a forward direction.”

Both Grinsell and Pulley have been nominated to compete for the Sacramento County Office of Education Teacher of the Year award. ★

During the week, the 48 participants composing the ‘strike teams’ were taught at multiple stations about the variety of tasks regularly performed by Sac Metro Fire.

Such skills and tasks included: Learning hands-only CPR; Safely using a fire extinguisher; Putting out flammable liquid fires; Forming a bucket brigade; Training for a hose lay; Auto extricating from a car crash demo; Throwing shore-based water rescue bags; Playing water hockey; Climbing a 100-foot ladder; and interacting in a Q&A with a 9-1-1 Dispatcher.

Campers had a blast with an instructive

fun-filled four-day itinerary. Day One and Day Two were held at Station 21 in Citrus Heights; Day Three at the Roseville Fire Department training grounds; Day Four morning at Sunsplash in Roseville; Then, an afternoon picnic with family at La Sierra Community Center in Carmichael.

“The week culminated with a family day where campers invited their family to a picnic day where the kids can show off the skills they have learned throughout the week and introduce families to their fellow team members,” Dargan added.

It's that time of year when wedding bells chime and bank accounts are cleared out for that perfect wedding day. But what happens after they tie the knot? It's better practice to focus on the positive contributions your partner is making, express appreciation on a regular basis, and offer emotional support to yourself and one another. These habits will go a long way when times are the toughest.

3. THINK LONG TERM. Consider your marriage a lifelong project you

will be co-creating together. Keep in mind that what might look like an insurmountable obstacle, incompatibility or even a character flaw may be a building block to a stronger connection.

4. STAY CURIOUS. View disagreements as inevitable. Approach differences with curiosity, not looking for the "truth" but instead to understand the other's perspective. Through the generosity of the Citrus Heights Messenger, this column serves to provide an update about matters affecting the community of Citrus Heights.

Two months ago I wrote a commentary in the Citrus Heights Messenger to explain that the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors would be holding a vote in July on whether or not to place a local tax measure on the November ballot that would allow the County to open up Cannabis retail stores in the unincorporated parts of Sacramento County like the areas bordering Citrus Heights (Orangevale, Carmichael, Antelope) and receive an extra tax from those businesses. I asked the community to write to me to let me know their thoughts on this, and I promised to report back after the vote. On July 12th that vote took place, so I would like to use this opportunity to fill you in on what happened.

After I wrote that commentary, I was flooded with responses. Broadly speaking, the responses I received on social media were largely in favor of allowing a November vote, and the responses I received via phone calls, e-mails, and physical letters were largely opposed to it. My main takeaway was that the community was fairly evenly split on this issue, which tracks with the responses I have received over the years when I ask

about this topic in my yearly community survey.

A few days before the meeting when the final language of the proposal was given to me, I was rather conflicted on what I would do as I could sympathize with both points of view. Those who wanted me to vote in support noted the medicinal benefits of cannabis and how the people should be allowed to vote on the issue - and those who wanted me to vote in opposition noted the public health and public safety concerns. But as I reviewed the proposal, two major things stuck out to me that swayed me to vote in opposition.

First, while the proposal would only allow this cannabis tax in the unincorporated portions of the county, it allowed every citizen, whether they lived in the unincorporated portions or not, to vote on this. That struck me as extremely unfair, especially given that only roughly one third of the people in the county live in the unincorporated area. So a strong majority of the unincorporated residents may oppose this, but it could still pass. For good reason, we don't allow residents of Nevada to vote for California Governor, and we don't allow residents of Canada to vote for the President of the United States - and we shouldn't allow residents of Sacramento City to vote for an issue that only impacts the unincorporated areas.

Second, the money that would be collected by this tax would have gone directly into the county general fund, and could be spent on

whatever the Supervisors deemed fit. There are no guarantees that the money would be spent to help solve problems that would sprout up as a result of opening these stores in our local communities - problems like the need for extra law enforcement, and the need for more education to the youth about cannabis. I believe that when taxes are imposed, it is the duty of the government to very clearly define where that money will go. Government has a transparency problem, and levying taxes without any explanation on how it will be spent only furthers that problem.

The vote to place it on the November ballot needed four votes in order to pass, but it only received three votes so it failed. Immediately afterwards, one supervisor proposed that at the end of July we should revisit this issue and try to fix some of these issues that were presented in the meeting. At that meeting I will once again come with an open mind, and do my best to represent the best interests of my constituents.

Defendant Sentenced to Life for Multiple Child Sexual Assaults

Sac County DA News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 17, 2022, the Honorable Delbert Oros sentenced Alvaro Rodas to 130 years to life in prison.

On June 28, 2021, Rodas pled to four counts of lewd acts upon a child under 14, two counts of forcible lewd acts upon a child under 14, four counts of sex acts with a child under 10 years old, and one count of child endangerment.

Rodas sexually assaulted several children over a period of more than 10 years starting in California in 2006. He also forced some victims to participate in sexually abusing other child victims. In June of 2017, Sacramento police officers responded to reports of sexual abuse made by two of the victims.

When officers conducted a consent search and search warrant of Rodas's home, they found child pornography and videos of some of the sexual assaults against the victims. ★

Defendant Convicted of Sexually Assaulting 2 Girls for 10+ Years

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Kim Alan Douglas pled to separate cases for a total of 11 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child under 14 years of age.

Between 2006 and 2017, Douglas sexually assaulted two girls on separate and multiple occasions when the girls would visit him at his home. One of the victims was 5 years old when the

abuse began, the second victim was 7 years old. Douglas was prosecuted and convicted of sexually assaulting one of the victims, and then the second victim came forward and disclosed that Douglas had sexually assaulted her as well.

Douglas faces a maximum sentence of 22 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 5, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 22 before the Honorable Sharon Lueras. ★

Defendant Convicted of Sexually Abusing 3 Young Girls

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 30, 2022, Nehemiah Watson was convicted by a jury of nine counts of child sexual assault. The jury also found true multiple aggravating factors.

Between 2013 and 2016, Watson molested three young girls. Watson sexually abused one victim when she was between 6 and 8 years old, the second

victim when she was between the age of 5 and 6 years old and the third victim when she was 12 to 13 years old. Watson threatened the third victim that if she told someone about the abuse he would harm a member of her family.

Watson faces a maximum sentence of 24 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 2, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 40 before the Honorable Steve White. ★

Defendant Pleads to Sexually Abusing Child in Multiple Cities

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On June 30, 2022, Edwin "Vin" Cuxeva pled guilty to 11 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with a child.

Cuxeva molested the victim when she was 12 to 15 years old and committed the abuse in multiple cities across the state, including Sacramento and Los Angeles. The sexual abuse included

multiple acts of sexual intercourse, oral copulation and fondling. During the course of the molests, the victim was impregnated by Cuxeva on multiple times, which resulted in six abortions when the victim was between the ages of 13 and 16 years old.

Cuxeva faces a maximum sentence of 28 years in prison. Sentencing is set for July 29, 2022, at 8:30 a.m. in Department 62. ★



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Beginning next month, parts of the American River will change to benefit salmon and steelhead migration.

Sacramento Water Forum programs will add nearly 42,000 cubic yards of gravel to Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus Basin. The projects – continuing habitat restoration undertaken by the agency since 2008 – are geared to improve breeding opportunity for diminished chinook salmon and steelhead populations.

Man-made river alterations have threatened these species since gold rush excavations. More recently, Folsom and Nimbus dams blocked spawning paths; dams also barred natural gravel movement to lower river reaches.

“Some salmon and steelhead return to their home water and can’t find a place to spawn,” explained Water Forum Habitat Manager Erica Bishop. “Though the Nimbus Hatchery has a role in juvenile fish production, the Water Forum’s focus is to help salmonids complete life cycles naturally.”

“Steelhead and salmon once had 200 miles of the American River watershed for spawning as they returned from the ocean,” Bishop noted. “We’ve limited this to about 12 miles. Fish can’t build nests among boulders. They need moveable gravel to make their redds (nests). The lower American River is gravel starved. We need to do everything we can to allow these fish to maintain their species.”

Lower Sailor Bar work begins August 1; the Nimbus Basin project starts August 27. In preparation, tons of Lake Natoma stones have been graded to suitable size. This gravel will be trucked to Nimbus and Sailor Bar for redistribution.

Habitat restoration includes nursery inlets to accommodate growing juvenile fish before their migration to the Pacific Ocean. Planting of native vegetation around inlets will engineer shade and bring insects to feed small fry.

In a larger 2021 project, 16,000 cubic yards of gravel were bulldozed into shallows near Ancil Hoffman Park. Working against the clock, the project restored habitat for the fall salmon migration. Soon after, steelhead spawned in the same gravel beds.

“We have a narrow work window, as specified by the Endangered Species Act,” Bishop said. “Our work is targeted over time frames least likely to affect migrating fish.”

Project success is evident. 2019 restoration above Sailor Bar resulted in 1,000 new chinook nests. The augmented Ancil Hoffman site last winter housed 30% of all American River steelhead spawning.

“Results are immediate,” Bishop noted. “We see salmon beginning to spawn as we finish our projects. We know our restored habitats work.”

“Although the ongoing drought can make river conditions challenging for fish, our projects focus on long-term improvement of river health.”

Habitat restorations have been completed at River Bend Park, Sacramento Bar and in stretches of the American River along Sunrise Road. Lower Sailor Bar and Nimbus projects will wrap by early October. Though staging areas will be fenced during construction, river access and rafter use will not be restricted. In-river work will pause to enable weekend and Labor Day recreation.

Water forum projects are supported by the Bureau of Reclamation, CA Prop 68 funding, Sacramento City and County and signatory water agencies.
