Mesa Verde finally breaks ground on sports complex

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Many generations of Mavericks finally got their wish granted Tuesday morning when Mesa Verde High School broke ground on an impressive, brand-new sports complex.

"Finally, is the word that I keep hearing a lot," said MVHS Athletic Director and alumnus Travis Miller at the groundbreaking ceremony. "Alumni, students and anyone connected to Mesa Verde knows this is a long time coming."

Mesa Verde opened in 1975. This is the seventh of nine signature projects for the San Juan Unified School District. The new complex will have a stadium designed for football and track and field as well as new tennis courts.

"Groundbreaking ceremonies have a long history and significance," Miller said. "They are ways to signify the importance of a place and that's what we're here to do. Over the years, many of us have dreamed of this project coming to fruition."

Reducing Homeless Deaths in Sac County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In Sacramento County, 2021 was an unprecedented year for loss of life in this region. The Sacramento County Coroner had more overall deaths reported to their office than any other year in history – 8,677 deaths reported. Sacramento County similarly saw an increase in the deaths of its

unhoused population.

NOTE: The Coroner's Office does not receive a report of every county resident's death. For example, deaths signed off by a supervising doctor are not reported to the Coroner. Additionally, natural deaths occurring in a hospital or medical facility and/or under a hospice physician's care are not coroner cases which require a coroner death investigation.

The Coroner releases a report every year of the deaths, causes and some demographics for people experiencing homelessness at the time of death. In 2021, 199 deaths were

reported to the coroner's office that were investigated and determined to be people who were experiencing homeless. While this is an increase from the years prior, it is not the same incremental increase as the overall increase in the homeless population, based on the most recent point in time count.

The causes of death among the unhoused population vary, but overwhelmingly, the causes are unnatural – death by substance use, vehicular or homicide. Decedents were overwhelmingly male, and there was a disproportionate number of black and Hispanic deaths compared to the overall homeless population demographics

population demographics.
Substance abuse continues to be the leader in untimely deaths of the unhoused population at nearly half of all deaths in 2021, as compared to just 3 percent of the overall county population.

county population.

Sacramento County continues to invest in existing and new programs to help meet the needs of the homeless population. The

County is investing \$181 million annually on current and new programs, and services and to mitigate the impacts of homelessness. Not only does the County fund 1,300 indoor shelter beds on any given night, but continues to fund new and diversified programs such as:

Increasing the offerings in 2022/23 to those experiencing behavioral health, both mental health and substance abuse, crises:

\$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds for Substance Use Disorder residential treatment;

\$5 million for behavioral health crisis stabilization units required in Medi-Cal;

\$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds and federal match for additional Full Service Partnerships;

The County has approved two new-concept locations for Safe Stay Communities, adding another 165 indoor beds that provide privacy, dignity and a place for people to receive services to end their homelessness;

The County added 11

new behavioral health staff to the Encampment Service Teams to connect people to mental health and substance abuse services; Allocated \$1 million in the 2022/23 budget to expand the scattered site sheltering program;

Allocated \$10 million in ARPA funding for a Landlord Engagement and Assistance Program (LEAP), which will fund re-housing of 300+ households from shelters and encampments;

Allocated \$28 million in MHSA funding since 2017 through the MHSA Housing Program and No Place Like Home Program;

The County has 221 housing units funded through MHSA and an additional 234 coming in the next two years.

The solutions to end homelessness are complicated and multi-faceted, and there is no "one size fits all," but through the hard work and dedication of the County, our cities and our partners, we are committed to work with compassion and urgency to decrease deaths in our homeless population.

County's New Inspector General Appointed

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously today to approve Francine Tournour as the new Inspector General for Sacramento County. Tournour will begin serving in that role on Sept. 1, 2022.

"Following a nation-wide recruitment, we're pleased to announce Francine Tournour was selected as the best and most qualified candidate," said Board Chair and District Five Supervisor Don Nottoli. "We look forward to welcoming Ms. Tournour and her work in providing independent review and accountability in her role as Inspector General."

Two collaborative interview panels were convened for the Inspector General search, whose members included the Chair of the board, the Sheriff, representatives from both the Law Enforcement Management Association and the Deputy Sheriff's Association, and members from the Community Review Commission.

Tournour began her career in law enforcement as a Deputy Sheriff in Contra Costa County, where she quickly gained an appreciation for the complex field of law enforcement. After working in law enforcement for a brief period, she began working for the City of Sacramento as a Deputy Director for the Office of Public Safety Accountability.

In 2008, she was promoted to the Director role of that office, where she was responsible for conducting all complex and sensitive investigations for the City's 1,300 employees.

Tournour has a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Madonna University and a master's degree in Emergency Management from California State University, Long Beach.

The Office of Inspector General was created to facilitate the Board of Supervisors' responsibility to oversee without interfering with the Sheriff's investigative or personnel deployment functions.

The Inspector General ensures the integrity of the citizen complaint process and the thoroughness and

Bar Owner Vows to Reopen **After ABC Suspension Ends**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The party is over, for now, at Rocky's 7440 Club on Auburn Boulevard in Citrus Heights. The bright neon lights are out. The doors are locked. The parking lot is empty. One of the most popular bars in the Citrus Heights area has been shut down by agents with the California Department of Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC). The 30-day suspension action issued by ABC will not allow Rocky's 7440 to reopen until September 15th.

The owner of this establishment, however, says his club will reopen once the suspension is lifted.

The state order to shut down follows what ABC calls an investigation into numerous complaints from home and business owners that surround the club, plus calls for service by the Citrus Heights Police Department (CHPD).

"For over a year, the CHPD responded numerous times to address reports of DUI, public intoxication, fights, battery, theft, and assault with a firearm at Rocky's 7440 Club," an ABC news release states. "ABC found that Rocky's was operating as a disorderly premises."

ABC lists the liquor license owners at Rocky's 7440 Club as Richard and Arika Moffitt of Roseville. The news release issued by ABC says the owner of the establishment did sign a settlement with the agency that includes the 30-day suspension as well as new operating conditions on the license to serve alcohol at the club.

This agreement will result in restrictions on serving patrons outdoors, hosting live entertainment at the club and will also affect the hours of service. In addition, Rocky's 7440 Club will be required to provide two uniformed security guards on site whenever there is live entertainment.

"Rocky's is also on probation for the next three years," said ABC Public Information Officer John Carr. "ABC has the power to revoke the club's license to serve alcohol if there is any further

CHPD Sgt. Anthony Boehle confirms that officers have been forced to respond to several recent incidents, which include two different shootings outside the club that left six people injured. Four people were injured in one shooting incident in May of last year. That one event forced CHPD to shut down streets in the neighborhood around Rocky's 7440 Club while the investigation into the violence took

The first shooting incident near the club proved to be just the start of trouble. A second incident took place the very next weekend. Two others were injured following a second shooting. CHPD reported both incidents were gang related.

Sgt. Boehle told MPG that CHPD will be paying close attention to Rocky's once the 30-day liquor license suspension is

"If we have a business that is causing problems, then we are going to pay attention," said Boehle. "It is against the law to over serve someone. We will encourage our patrol officers to conduct bar checks. If we discover something that is out of order, CHPD will take action to correct the problem and notify ABC."

The owner of Rocky's 7440 Club believes the news stories about the shootings and his club have not been accurate. Richard "Rocky" Moffitt claims both incidents did not take place at the bar or anywhere on his property. In a statement that was emailed to MPG, Moffitt says both shootings occurred at businesses that are located nearby his club.

"My long-time business and its employees are being punished for something that happened during a once in a lifetime (COVID) pandemic, off our property and in areas that are out of our control,' Moffitt wrote. "I run a very safe business and always have been a vocal advocate for public safety and support law enforcement."

Attorney Jeff Kravitz represents the professional license defense firm of Kravitz & Chan in Sacramento and has been defending the liquor licenses of clubs like Rocky's 7440 for over 25 years. He tells MPG that the probation action issued by ABC "sounds worse than it is," and it could have been longer.

"This type of ABC action happens all the time," Kravitz told MPG. "I always counsel my clients that ABC is going to come to the business again after it reopens. This agency will run stings."

Carr confirms that ABC will continue to monitor Rocky's 7440 once the suspension action is served. Any further violations could result in additional actions. The agency has acted this year alone to permanently revoke liquor licenses at convenience stores in Kerman, Fresno, Hanford, Gilroy, and Marysville.

ABC also acted this year to revoke the liquor license of Grandma's Sports Bar and Grill in Bakersfield. An ABC investigation found that Grandma's was operating a "disorderly premises," forcing the Kern County Sheriff's Office to respond to multiple crimes and assaults at the bar.

"This type of action does take place on a case-by-case basis," Carr said.

Rocky's 7440 Club likes to bill itself as more than "just a bar." The club's website claims that it has been the "center of community meetings, family gatherings and has sponsored many local charities." This list includes the Children's Receiving Home of Sacramento, the CHPD's Toys for Tots Program and the Mesa Verde High School Football Team.

Sgt. Boehle, however, says the service calls for crimes such as stabbings, shootings and patrons arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol must come to an

"I've been with CHPD since 2006," Boehle said. "There have been other establishments in this city that have gone the way of the dodo (bird) because of crime problems."

Taking Steps to Accelerate Home Construction

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, at its Aug. 9 meeting, voted to approve amendments to the Sacramento County Zoning Code and Countywide Design Guidelines, in an effort to streamline housing approval and speed up building in specific areas of the Unincorporated County.

These amended Zoning Codes and Design Guidelines will make it easier for developers to build more multifamily homes, like apartments and duplexes, in areas of the Unincorporated County that could include south Sacramento, Fair Oaks, Arden Arcade, Foothill Farms, Vineyard, North Highlands, Rio Linda, Elverta and Antelope.

Additionally, the amendments also aim to cut down on the costs and amount of time it takes to have minor deviations from the county's development standard approved for

"We hope that these changes will especially help some of the Unincorporated County's lower-income, diverse communities," said Wendy Hartman, Principal Planner. "In some cases these changes could cut the cost to process a request from approximately \$14,000 to \$4,300 for a multifamily project, and cut the amount of time from ten months to three months."

Among the more substantial changes included in the amendment are: Reducing how far smaller multifamily projects have to be set back from an abutting single-family home with a minor special development permit; and Allowing builders to construct more duplexes on small infill lots without needing additional approval.

Former Sears at Sunrise Mall on Market for \$8M

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The shuttered Sears Roebuck store and two adjacent buildings situated on a 21.3-acre parcel of commercial land at Sunrise Mall in Citrus Heights is up for sale with an asking price of \$8 million, according to the listing broker, Colliers Retail Capital Markets, based in Southern California.

A sales brochure published on the web by Colliers on August 25th describes a "unique opportunity to purchase three separate buildings which total some 281,278 square feet at a listed cost of approximately \$28.44 per square foot.

The vacant former Sears, at 5900 Sunrise Boulevard, was built in 1972, and last renovated in 1999.

The listing includes the approximate 247,641 square-foot, three-story Sears retail store, a 24,107 square-foot, multibay auto center and a 9,530 square-foot former parts and service center.

The property description states, "A rare opportunity to acquire approximately 21.3 acres of commercially zoned land in the Sacramento area at an asking price well below replacement cost."

Asking price is \$8 million with \$4 million down financed at a 3.5 percent interest rate over 30 years, according to Colliers.

News of the upcoming commercial property sales listing was provided by Kathilynn Carpenter, executive director of Sunrise Marketplace. Adjacent to the Sunrise Mall, the former Sears sits on what is described as the second busiest intersection in all of Sacramento County.

The Sunrise Mall is the centerpiece of the Sunrise MarketPlace shopping district that features over 2.2 million square feet of retail inventory, according to Carpenter.

The property is being marketed by El Warner, a retail specialist for Colliers International Los Angeles-Orange County Office and Jordan Gomez, associate vice president and team leader of the Private Capital Group at Colliers International.

Calls to the southern California office of Colliers International for comment were not returned.

"This property features ± 21.3 acres of commercially zoned land primed for redevelopment in a city (Citrus Heights) excited to work with mall owners and provide them with the opportunity to densify, diversify, and breathe new life into the heart of the City," according to the listing brochure.

Sunrise Mall sits on the second busiest intersection in all of Sacramento County in between the largest employment center outside of downtown Sacramento.

Potential buyers are advised that the former Sears offers an "irreplaceable in-fill location in Citrus Heights and an exceptional redevelopment opportunity with the ability to add multiple pads."

on each side, a press box on the home sideline, a scoreboard and flagpole, a building for concessions and restrooms and areas for shot put and discus. The existing softball outfields will be renovated. The new tennis courts will be in between the new parking lots and existing baseball field.

"This stadium project has been many years in the making," said MVHS Principal Jennifer Petersen. "We are very excited for its completion and for our campus to finally be complete. We are looking forward to creating our own traditions for generations of Mesa students to come."

Petersen went on to explain the importance of a high school having their own stadium for not only sports, but also social events.

"Football season sets the tone of the culture on a high school campus," Petersen said. "It's not something you can really replicate when you play all of your games away on other campuses. The feeling of excitement on a campus on game days is why I love working and being a part of a high school community. But it's not just about the game of football, it's about the social event that is occurring on your campus.

"In addition to the sports events, we will also be able to hold our own graduation ceremony right here on campus (for the) Class of 2024. This stadium will be a wonderful asset, not only to our school, but to the community at large."

Dignitaries on hand for the ceremony included Board President Michael McKibbin, Ed.D, and SJUSD Superintendent Kent Kern.

"I want to recognize the voters in this area that voted for our bond measure, in this case Measure N," McKibbin said. "These facilities don't happen without voters saying that we trust you, we want you to improve our properties (and) we want to have facilities that are at the level of creativity, imagination and intellectual chility of our students."

Three students led the Pledge of

Allegiance and each individually spoke. Those students were Tyler Bruno, Jasmine Doyle and Sabrina Ni.

Council Approves Community Block Party Trailer Program

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - At the August 25 meeting, the Citrus Heights City Council considered approval of the Community Block Party Trailer program. In May, Council allocated \$50,000 from the federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding for the purchase and outfitting of the trailer, which will be stocked with all the essentials needed to host community events, including tables, chairs, coolers, barricades and cones, lawn games, a small sound system, and trash containers. It will be available for rent by neighborhood associations, community service groups, nonprofits, and other groups that serve the community.

Offering a stocked event trailer for community use is intended to facilitate more community connection, which is one of the City's strategic goals. The Community Block Party Trailer will be the first program rolled out by the newly formed Economic Development and Community Engagement Department. The City is currently recruiting for a management analyst position in this department, who will administer the registration and reservation process for the trailer. A communications officer will assist with program branding and promotion, and the General Services Department will coordinate trailer delivery and pickup.

The Community Block Party Trailer program will have eligibility requirements, and it will not be available for individual residents or businesses to rent for private celebrations. Community groups will have to complete an application to be added to the program database, and rental agreements and waiver forms must be signed to confirm reservations. There won't be a rental fee, but applicants will have to cover the cost of event insurance, with the option of utilizing the insurance offered through the City. Applicants will also be responsible for getting all required approvals and/or permits to hold their event, such as road closure permits for block parties on public streets or owner approval for parties held on private property.

Although the program guidelines exclude individual residents from renting the trailer, Councilmember Jeannie Bruins asked about whether residents in a neighborhood unaffiliated with any established community groups or organizations could rent the trailer for a block party. She pointed out that the intention of the program is to foster more community involvement, which such an event would do.

Economic Development and Communications Manager Meghan Huber agreed that a neighborhood party would meet the goal of community connection, so staff would figure out a way to register the group.

Councilmember Bruins said, "I'm very happy to see that we're going to do this, at least initially, without charge." But she recommended that the City require a deposit, which would be returned to the applicant after the trailer is returned in the same condition it was received.

The Council voted unanimously to approve the Community Block Party Trailer program, which will launch in the fourth quarter of this year.

Council also considered a Memorandum

of Understanding (MOU) with the Low-Income Family Enrichment Corporation (the Life Foundation), a nonprofit that is currently under contract to purchase the Auburn Oaks assisted living facility at 7501 Sunrise Blvd.

The Life Foundation reached out to the City in June about pursuing a collaborative grant application through the Community Care Expansion (CCE) Program. With City sponsorship, the Life Foundation could be eligible for a \$17 million grant that would allow them to purchase Auburn Oaks and permanently dedicate the facility to serving the low-income senior population.

City Manager Ashley Feeney explained that the property has been serving local seniors for decades. It was built in 1975 as a senior residential facility, and in the early 1980s it was partially converted into an assisted living facility. It was acquired by Partnership in 2020, with Goodwill leasing it in late 2020 for a combination of independent and semi-independent residential units.

City Manager Feeney said that the City's partnership with the Life Foundation on this project will help keep seniors in safe, reliable housing by ensuring the property remains in service to the local senior community.

City Attorney Ryan Jones said that although the City would collaborate with the Life Foundation to pursue the CCE grant funding, the City would not contribute any funds to the project. Life Foundation would own the property and be responsible for all operation and management. But the City will have review and approval rights for changes in management companies operating the property.

Guidelines of the 20-year MOU stipulate that Life Foundation would provide community health education programs for youth and families in Citrus Heights and, depending on positive operating cash flow, Life Foundation will donate \$100,000 annually to local nonprofits as directed by City Council. At the conclusion of the 20-year term, if the project is not renewed, the property could be sold, and all proceeds would be distributed to a fund dedicated to supporting local non-profits as determined by City Council.

Councilmember Bret Daniels wanted to make sure the public was clear about the details of the project: "This is not a homeless shelter. ... What this is, is the ability to step up and do what needs to be done." He said this is a "great opportunity for seniors to have a place to live and not have to worry about where they're going to live tomorrow."

The Council voted unanimously to approve the MOU with the Life Foundation. ★

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Tenants Sought for New Copperwood Square Retail Building

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A Starbucks drive-thru coffee shop opened in 2021 in a new commercial pad building at 7056 Sunrise Boulevard near the corner of Sungarden Drive in Citrus Heights in the Copperwood Square Shopping Center and is doing brisk business.

Next door, four separate adjacent retail spaces in the same building, which total some 5,446 square feet still sit vacant, looking for new tenants.

Marketing those individual retail suites is the task of the Rome Real Estate Group in Folsom.

Situated on a busy retail arterial in the Sunrise Marketplace retail corridor, that was once home to a multi-story bank building, it was demolished to make way for the new commercial center. Earlier plans to turn the site into a 24-hour gas station and convenience store were dropped amid heated opposition from local residents.

The area around Sungarden Drive and Sunrise Boulevard is surrounded by a population of over 141,900 households within a three-mile radius, according to the company.

"It's an ideal location, with a choice of retail suites ideal for a local business in Citrus Heights which might want to relocate to a good traffic location along Sunrise Boulevard," said Andy Jonsson of the Rome Real Estate Group.

What's taking time to fill those individual suite vacancies is an especially challenging commercial real estate market with strong competition from cities in the surrounding area, Jonsson explained.

"We've been marketing these suites to both regional and a national target retail audience and will continue to do so, but we also want to let local businesses in Citrus Heights know that on a competitive cost per square foot basis, these new individual suites at 7056 Sunrise Boulevard really do have a lot to offer," Jonsson said.

"We think that any one of these individual suites which are very visible from Sunrise Boulevard could ideally fit the needs of a local business seeking to relocate, especially if they are looking to find space in a new building with up-to-date utilities and features," he said.

The Copperwood Square Shopping Center is anchored by Food Maxx, Planet Fitness and Dollar Tree. Planet Fitness completed an expansion of its gym facilities earlier this year.

"We're pleased that customers continue to rediscover all that Copperwood Square Shopping Center has to offer," Jonsson said. "It's received a refresh in recent years and has seen an increase in customer traffic."

R-Red Bluff, issued the following statement in response to Senate Democrats killing his proposal on August 30, to fully fund and build Sites Reservoir:

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

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California's Ban on Gas-Powered Cars Won't be Easy

California made it official last week - the state will ban sales of gasoline-powered new cars after 2035.

Gov. Gavin Newsom, who issued the executive order leading to the Air Resources Board's adoption of the ban, issued his characteristic boast about California being out front.

"The climate crisis is solvable if we focus on the big, bold steps necessary to stem the tide of carbon pollution," Newsom said. "California now has a groundbreaking, world-leading plan to achieve 100% zero-emission vehicle sales by 2035. It's ambitious, it's innovative, it's the action we must take if we're serious about leaving this planet better off for future generations."

Declaring that the sale of gas-powered cars will end 13 years hence is the easy part. Actually transforming a huge component of Californians' daily lives, and a big chunk of the state's economy, will be immensely difficult.

Take, for example, driving range. The new regulations want zero emission vehicles (ZEVs) sold in California to be capable of traveling up to 150 miles without recharging. That might be sufficient for daily commuting within a

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




