

Reducing Homeless Deaths in Sac County

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In Sacramento County, 2021 was an unprecedented year for loss of life in this region. The Sacramento County Coroner had more overall deaths reported to their office than any other year in history – 8,677 deaths reported. Sacramento County similarly saw an increase in the deaths of its

unhoused population. NOTE: The Coroner's Office does not receive a report of every county resident's death. For example, deaths signed off by a supervising doctor are not reported to the Coroner. Additionally, natural deaths occurring in a hospital or medical facility and/or under a hospice physician's care are not coroner cases which

require a coroner death investigation.

The Coroner releases a report every year of the deaths, causes and some demographics for people experiencing homelessness at the time of death. In 2021, 199 deaths were reported to the coroner's office that were investigated and determined to be people who were experiencing homeless. While this is an increase from the years prior, it is not the same incremental increase as the overall increase in the homeless population, based on the most recent point in time count.

The causes of death among the unhoused population vary, but overwhelmingly, the causes are unnatural - death by substance use, vehicular or homicide. Decedents were overwhelmingly male, and there was a

disproportionate number of black and Hispanic deaths compared to the overall homeless population demographics.

Substance abuse continues to be the leader in untimely deaths of the unhoused population at nearly half of all deaths in 2021, as compared to just 3 percent of the overall county population.

Sacramento County continues to invest in existing and new programs to help meet the needs of the homeless population. The County is investing \$181 million annually on current and new programs, and services and to mitigate the impacts of homelessness. Not only does the County fund 1,300 indoor shelter beds on any given night, but continues to fund new and diversified programs

Increasing the offerings

in 2022/23 to those experiencing behavioral health, both mental health and substance abuse, crises:

\$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds for Substance Use Disorder residential treatment; \$5 million for behavioral

health crisis stabilization units required in Medi-Cal; \$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funds and federal match for additional Full

Service Partnerships; The County has approved two new-concept locations for Safe Stay Communities, adding another 165 indoor beds that provide privacy, dignity and a place for people to receive services to end their homelessness;

The County added 11 new behavioral health staff to the Encampment Service Teams to connect people to Continued on page 3

Food Locker Gets New Leader

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Food Locker announced the hiring of its firstever Executive Director, Carrie Johnson. With an extensive background in non-profit and community-focused engagement. Johnson is leading the RCFL into a new era of leadership and service to the East Sacramento County region.

The Rancho Cordova Food Locker is the largest official USDA food distribution site in the greater Rancho Cordova/ eastern Sacramento County area, distributing approximately 44,000 lbs. of food to over 1,000 households each month. Since its establishment in 1987, the Rancho Cordova Food Locker has been dedicated to serving individuals and families in need throughout the greater Rancho Cordova area.

"Bringing Carrie on as our Executive Director provides an opportunity for us to increase the quality of our services and, ultimately, expand access to fresh and healthy food choices for families fighting hunger in our neighborhoods," said Ross Johnson, president of the Rancho Cordova Food Locker board of directors.

For most of its history, the Rancho Cordova Food Locker was run by a passionate group of volunteers. Since 2019, the Food Locker has seen a 30% increase in the number of households facing food insecurity. In 2020, the Food Locker took an important next step, becoming an official USDA food distribution site and 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization.

"This new role with the Rancho Cordova Food Locker is an important opportunity for me to help those most in need in a community I care deeply

Locker, I've seen how access to food directly impacts the day-today lives of our most vulnerable populations. By investing in the operations and sustainability of the Food Locker, we are going to be able to expand not only our ability to provide healthy food options for the community, but also - in time - identify and expand our reach to other satellite facilities across the city."

With more than 15 year's experience in the not-for-profit sector, Johnson is a recognized leader in convening private, public, and non-profit organizations to better communities in-need. Her recent experiences at Paratransit, Inc. and SAFE Credit Union allowed her to partner with executive leadership teams to craft strategic initiatives that directly benefited clients. While a Stanford Youth Solutions (formerly Stanford Home for Children), Johnson

Food Locker. Johnson is also very familiar with the Rancho Cordova community, living in the city since 1985.

"I feel like my entire career has been building up to this point. I know the power relationships can bring to businesses and non-profits. Whether it's identifying new resources – both in time and money -or helping shine a light on the need for support services in our own backyard, I am excited to bring my experience to this community I care so much about," said Johnson. "I've seen the power of the Food Locker as a volunteer and member of the community, and I know we are starting a new chapter in its history that will leave a lasting mark on this city and beyond."

The Rancho Cordova Food Locker currently operates under the umbrella and oversight of the Catholic Charities, although there are no religious activities or requirements associated with its food distribution program. Supported by the Sacramento Food Bank and Family Services affiliate network program, the Food Locker benefits from collaborating with a group of like organizations throughout the Sacramento Region, which are providing food-related support to those

The Food Locker also has a strong partnership with the City of Rancho Cordova. Thanks to the support over the past six years from the city's Community Enhancement & Investment Fund and American Rescue Plan Act funds, the Food Locker has purchased a box truck and forklift, upgraded IT and food storage, focused on capacity building, and more. In addition, the Food Locker works with the city's Homeless Outreach Team to provide food and wraparound services for homeless individuals and families.

"The City of Rancho Cordova is proud to partner with the Rancho Cordova Food Locker to support those in need in our community," said City Manager Cyrus Abhar. "We have seen the demand for healthy food and support services increase, especially during the pandemic. Through an ongoing investment in the Food Locker's services and operations, we can fight food insecurity and provide a helping hand to our residents."

"Many of our guests are members of the working poor and immigrant communities. And children make up nearly one-third of the individuals we serve. Our guests are our friends, neighbors, colleagues and classmates," said Johnson. "Providing wraparound services with the City of Rancho Cordova helps those seeking food identify if other programs can alleviate hardships they're facing."

While some of the food distributed from the Rancho Cordova Food Locker is provided through the UDSA food distribution program, the Food Locker also receives regularly donated food from local grocery stores and restaurants.

Operating three days per week and offering special annual food giveaways for both Thanksgiving and Christmas, the Food Locker is also identifying additional access points to support the community. The growing need as well as the quantity of food donated indicate a significant need for improved and expanded facilities to continue operating at the pace needed to support current and future guests.

"We are committed to expanding access to fresh and healthier food choices through our network of food partners, fighting hunger and feeding hope to the residents of Rancho Cordova and surrounding communities," said Johnson. "We envision becoming a connector for residents facing food insecurity by providing more than just food, but also the resources that would allow them to live the life they wish with dignity and grace."

County's New Inspector **General Appointed**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously today to approve Francine Tournour as the new Inspector General for Sacramento County. Tournour will begin serving in that role on Sept. 1, 2022.

"Following a nationwide recruitment, we're pleased to announce Francine Tournour was selected as the best and most qualified candidate," said Board Chair and District Five Supervisor Don Nottoli. "We look forward to welcoming Ms. Tournour and her work in providing independent review and accountability in her role as Inspector General."

Two collaborative interview panels were convened for the Inspector General search, whose members included the Chair of the board, the Sheriff, representatives from both the Law Enforcement Management Association and the Deputy Sheriff's Association, and members

from the Community Review Commission.

Tournour began her career in law enforcement as a Deputy Sheriff in Contra Costa County, where she quickly gained an appreciation for the complex field of law enforcement. After working in law enforcement for a brief period, she began working for the City of Sacramento as a Deputy Director for the Office of Public Safety Accountability.

In 2008, she was promoted to the Director role of that office, where she was responsible for conducting all complex and sensitive investigations for the City's 1,300 employees.

Tournour has a bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Madonna University and a master's degree in **Emergency Management** from California State University, Long Beach.

The Office of Inspector General was created to facilitate the Board of Supervisors' responsibility to oversee without interfering with the Sheriff's investigative or personnel deployment functions.

The Inspector General ensures the integrity of the citizen complaint process and the thoroughness and fairness of related Sheriff's Office investigations, while fostering positive relations with the community. The Community Review Commission acts in a supporting role to the Office of Inspector General and acts as a conduit between the community and the Office of Inspector General.

Sign up to receive email or mobile text messages when new Community Review Commission meeting information is available.

The Inspector General works independently on items detailed in the scope of services. The Inspector General will present recommendations relating to these examinations to the Board of Supervisors, County Executive and the Sheriff.

The Office of the Inspector General is a contract position. The current contract is effective Sept. 1, 2022, through Aug. 31, 2023, with the option to renew the agreement for two additional one-year



Excelsior Pre-School Gold River Now Open

- Excelsior Pre-School Gold River's grand opening took place on the evening of August 10 with ribbon-cutting, open house, tours of the facility and festival of food trucks. "We're doing this so we can get out to the community, so they know what we're about," said director Nancy Fugate, "(so) they know that we're really high quality and we're there for the families and the children." The facility is located at 2317 Gold Meadow Way, Rancho Cordova. Attending were the pre-school staff, present clients and possible future ones, Win Pont home office representatives, and a bunch of obviously delighted preschool age children.

The school uses an emergent curriculum in its program. Teachers observe and listen to the children as they play, determine their areas of interest, then develop a plan which reflects those interests. This process provides greater insight into the needs of the individual child, and allows for learning that is play-based, project-based and promotes investigative learning. The curriculum supports whole child development and improves kindergarten readiness. It is also interesting to the children and more likely to keep their attention.

Fugate explained that the programs at Excelsior can be for either an 8-hour or a 10-hour day, and the school can also provide

"They are paid more; they five half days a week. the opening with their daughter Winslow who have a lot of special The cost is very com-

petitive. The roomy, well-organized facility has artistic and positive images throughout halls and classrooms. The whole facility is spacious and light with easy access to learning centers that invite the attention of young children. The grounds feature a large playground with equipment that kept the young visitors at the grand opening continually running, playing, and exploring.

was almost 2 years old, and Winslow's grandmother Lori Petty. Some of the others who were there were Sara Rock and her son Jameson, $2\frac{1}{2}$, and Jameson's grandmother Janna Rock. One of the fathers visiting was so impressed with the appearance and functionality of the facility he joked that he wished he could enroll himself.

"We have a team of professional teachers who are full of love and

benefits for themselves through work here." Classroom ratio is better than average at the school; rather than the usual 1 teacher to 12 students, the Excelsior ratio is 1:8. "I think that really we are bringing something new to this field," Fugate said. "We're bringing a secure place for children, but it is also perfect for staff, a place where they can really grow and learn."

Fugate herself has a

bachelor's degree in early childhood education and administration, with 30 years of experience in the field, an associate degree in business, and many different classes and training along the way.







RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The theme of this quarter's City Hall Art Show is Abstract Portraits. "I want to commend you all on thinking about what was probably a little bit out of the box for many of you, and really knocking it out of the park," said Cheryl Gleason, MACC event coordinator and curator. "Great job!"

Winners in this show are, for Best of Show – Mary Fong, After he saw my Macy's bill; First Place – Su Wickersham, Lady in Blue; Second Place - Ron Hall, Who Put Catnip in my Coffee; Third Place -Lyla Paakkanen, Drag'n Me; and First Place Youth - Janessa Hernandez, Elephant Circus. Honorable mentions were earned by David Peterson, Vietnam

Ghost; Ondra Ward, The Cow Says Mooo; Cheryl Gleason, Sisters; Penny Hanscom, Picassoese #3; Jennifer Coulter, Neurographic Woman Tres; and Denise Schmidt, Judy.

"I could easily have given out more awards as this exhibit displays merit in the theme of abstract portraits," said Juror Cherie Hacker. Hacker holds a Master of Fine Arts from the Maryland Institute College of Art, Bachelors in Studio Art from UC Davis, and served a graduate internship for the Smithsonian American Art Museum "Much recognition is deserving - Bravo to all!" Hacker said.

Fong has been doing art for a long time and has been entering City Hall art shows once or twice a year. She and her husband are both retired. She went back to school from 2015 to 2017 to get her MFA, and works in many mediums, "Oils, watercolors, charcoal - you know, whatever I can get my hands on," Fong said. This painting happened when she was working on a portrait of the whole family, and she asked her husband to pose for her. "He just viewed my Macy's bill . . . so he instantly posed with that expression," Fong said. The expression was very unique, so she did a fast sketch, 20 minutes, and in another 20 minutes used color to fill in the background. "I think art is a kind of expression and you just go do it," Fong said. "When inspiration comes up, just go for it."

Wickersham said she doesn't usually do portraits, but during COVID was taking a lot of lessons and classes online and her winning painting came out of that. "I'm always thrilled to be entered into a show, that's the best thing," Wickersham said, "but when you win, it's even more." That's not the purpose of her art, though, she does it for herself. Final Recommended Budget **Hearings Begin September 7**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors will begin Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget hearings on Wednesday, Sept. 7, at 9:30 a.m. in the Sacramento County Administration Building located at 700 H Street, Sacramento, 95814. If necessary, hearings will continue on Sept. 8 and 9 at the same time and location.

The hearing schedule, in order:

IHSS Public Authority Budget Deliberation and Approval; Introduction by the County Executive to the FY 2022-23 Revised Recommended Budget; Public Comment; Board Deliberation and Approval to Revisions of the Approved Recommended Budget

The numbers in the recommended budget change between June and September when the County receives new information, including the impact of the State Budget and updated revenue totals. Because of that new information. the Revised Recommended Budget comes back to the Board for review and

adoption in September.

The Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2022-23 Recommended Budget on June 9. The \$7.3 billion spending plan reflected substantial investments in new and enhanced programs based on the Board's priorities and a survey of Sacramento residents. The budget included annual commitments of an additional \$6.5 million to fund new programs and services addressing homelessness in the County; \$10 million to procure an additional 156 beds annually for substance use disorder residential treatment; \$7.5 million in Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and Federal matching funds to fulfill permanent supportive housing commitments; and \$20 million in one-time costs to fund pavement maintenance and road rehabilitation in the unincorporated County, among others.

Members of the public may attend the hearings and be heard on any item in the budget, either publicly, over the phone or through written comments. The budget hearings will also be telecast live on Metro Cable 14 and on sccob.saccounty. gov/Pages/BOSPublicMeetings.aspx. ★
