

Poll Workers Needed for Elections

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County's Office

of Voter Registration and Elections is calling upon civicminded citizens to work at polling places for the upcoming election on November 8.

No prior experience is necessary and training will be provided. Workers will be provided a stipend for their training and service on Election Day. And citizens fluent in Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, Tagalog, Hindi, Korean and Japanese are strongly encouraged to apply.

To be a poll worker you must meet the following criteria:

- Be at least 18 years of age or be a high school student that is at least 16 years of age and in good academic standing.
- •A resident of the State of California.
- Be able to read and write in fluent English.
- Available to work on Election Day November 8 from 6:00 a.m. until all duties are completed (approximately 10:00 p.m.).
- Attend a mandatory training class prior to election (approximately 2½ hours).
- Have transportation to and from the training class and to the polling place on Election

Cooley Bill Protecting Historic Park Names Now Law

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

The California Heritage Protection Act (AB 2249) was signed into law on September 21st by Governor Brown, Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) has announced. AB 2249 ensures park concessionaires in California's state parks cannot trademark historic place names simply due to their status as a concessionaire. The bill was introduced by Assemblyman Cooley and Assemblymen Frank Bigelow (R-O'Neals) and Adam Gray (D-Merced) in response to the U.S. National Park Service's controversial renaming of several landmarks at Yosemite National Park due to a dispute with their ex-concessionaire. "This bill makes clear that trade-

marking of historic names in state

parks by concessionaires without any independent basis for a claim is unacceptable and our state Department of Parks and Recreation cannot sign off on the type of trademarking conduct that produced the Yosemite dispute," said Assemblyman Cooley. "With AB 2249's signature, that kind of behavior will disqualify a concessionaire from receiving a concessions contract in California, which makes the bipartisan unanimity of the Legislature especially impressive."

The Ahwahnee Hotel has been re-named the "Majestic Yosemite Hotel," Curry Village is now "Half Dome Village," the Wawona Hotel is "Big Trees Lodge" and Badger Pass Ski Area is now called "Yosemite Ski and Snowboard Area."

AB 2249 ensures nothing of the same kind occurs in a California state park. To keep concessionaires from co-opting state landmarks, this bill adds to state law a prohibition on concessionaires claiming ownership of a name associated with a California state park and disqualifies a bidder from future contracts if they attempt such trademark claims.

"Our state parks are not like football or baseball stadiums, trading sponsorship deals to the highest bidder," said Assemblyman Gray. "The people of California protect and preserve these landmarks as a part of our history, and it is the people of California who own their storied names."

"I have the privilege of representing Yosemite National Park and know first-hand how treasured these landmarks are by the people of our state," said Assemblyman Bigelow. "I'm proud to co-author AB 2249 to protect historic sites up and down California."

Yosemite National

California's

Park is on the short list of America's most magnificent parks and is filled with historic landmarks built decades ago—some date back to the 19th century. The Ahwahnee Hotel was built in the 1920s in a valley meadow with the sheer granite of Half Dome as its backdrop; its filing for the National Register

of Historic Places explains its name comes from a local Native American word meaning "deep, grassy meadow.' Nearby Curry Village is named after the couple who established a summer camp there in 1899. The Wawona Hotel, in the southwest cor-

ner of Yosemite National Park, was originally constructed 140 years ago, in 1876. All three were placed on the National Register of Historic Places in the 1970s.

Assembly Bill 2249 will take effect January 1, 2017.



Bera Urges FDA to Take Action in Response to EpiPen Prices

EpiPens Cost Upwards of \$600 for a Single Prescription

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On August 25th, 2016, Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-7) called on the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to take immediate action to make lower cost alternatives available in response to exorbitantly priced EpiPens from the drug manufacturer Mylan. Currently, EpiPens have a virtual monopoly on the market for emergency allergy attack treatment. In the letter, Congressman Bera asks the FDA to address processes that may limit competition and allow some companies to drastically increase prices. Today, Mylan announced they would offer additional coupons for EpiPens, but have not addressed the underlying cost.



Congressman Bera has previously urged the FDA to regulate the prices of life-saving drugs.

"As a doctor, I know that in the case of an allergic reaction no time can be wasted and we can't allow anything to stand in

the way of immediate access to epinephrine." said Bera. "\$600 for an EpiPen is outrageous, and Mylan must be held accountable for their pricing on a life-saving drug. That's why I'm calling on the FDA to make sure that families have other more affordable and safe options to EpiPens so that no one needs to make a choice between paying their bills or having a life-saving drug."

Congressman Bera has previously urged the FDA to regulate the prices of life-saving drugs. He leads the push to ensure that drug companies are not able to charge excessive prices for drugs, like in the case of Martin Shkreli and Turing Pharmaceuticals.

The vandalism spree that occurred late in the evening on Aug. 15 was unlike any act Gold River has seen. Sure, we have our outbreaks of crime like any community. Heck, even Mayberry had a bank robbery. But as far as unlawfulness performed in multiple villages in addition to the school, this was precedent setting for our sleepy bedroom community.

Instead of waking up to a normal Tuesday in Gold River, residents in various parts of the neighborhood were greeted with houses and cars defaced with the N-word, the F-word, drawings of male genitalia and swastikas, and a sidewalk spray-painted with the phrase "white power." Even the elderly was disrespected. Such a deplorable discovery couldn't help but raise the obvious emotions and many questions. Neighbors shared in the shock, dismay, anger and wonders of why, but those whose property became someone else's billboards for racial slurs and vulgarity were no doubt rocked to the core.

Local TV news lives for stories like this, easy and alarming, and lacking investigative skills they simply interviewed the sheriff's department public information officer and a few of the victims. KCRA did a live report from Gold River Discovery Center without showing the demolished gazebo and other destruction left there by vandals who, we'd learn later, attended the school earlier in their young lives. Reporters' disappointment of not finding a juicy hate crime story came to some relief to our community. We sure didn't need prejudice-motivated crime on top of everything else being dealt with in a neighborhood news media described as "quiet" and "upper-class."

Since no one got hurt (thank God), I stop short of saying that the culprits acted like a pack of pit bulls being unleashed in a dog

A Night of 'Unsophisticated' Crime

I'll bet a lifetime supply of spray paint that the people whose cars, garage doors, windows, sidewalks and streets were bashed, broken and tagged with offensive language and symbols don't care a rat's you-know-what that the destruction or the destructors were unsophisticated or not. These homeowners were forced to spend their Tuesday and their own money, no doubt, undoing the damage caused by hooligans who got their jollies on at least 10 homes, three cars and an already under-funded public school.

Solace for the victims and a worried community would come 10 days after the rampage when five 18-year-old males and one

men's names, mugshots and account of their night of naughtiness will live in infamy. That's an especially long time when the public shaming begins as a teenager. You don't see their names and mugshots in this column for that reason.

The victims with damaged property and anyone still jittery since the vandalism spree might feel otherwise, but I find myself genuinely wishing for the six young men to learn from this and lead happy and successful lives once they pay for their crimes, of course. At the Safety Committee meeting, Rick Boster, Gold River Discovery Center principal, said, "We hope this will be a turning

just shy of that age – a juvenile in the eyes of the law – were arrested on charges of felony vandalism and conspiracy to commit a crime. Their MO, Sheriff Garcia said at the Safety Committee meeting, was "to do one big thing before they went off to college." In hindsight, perhaps river rafting or a night at an 18 and over gentleman's club would have made better choices.

As Sheriff Garcia said at the Safety Committee meeting, these young men "did dumb ... really dumb." We'll see how dumb in the eyes of the law, but these things take time. Sentencing for the five being charged as adults won't be for several months, according to the sheriff's department. Restitution is possible for the victims, but we were told that's an even longer process. The lengthiest consequence facpoint in their lives." I can't agree more, not only for their welfare, but ours. We don't need any more drains on society, especially ones with a criminal record. The good news for the six men is America likes rooting for those seeking and seizing second chances. So there's your potential silver lining in this spray-painted and bashed-in dark

The one certain positive that came out of summer's news-making vandalism spree is Gold River banded together to address a common concern. The circumstances were unfortunate, but the 170 residents who attended the Safety Committee meeting now have stronger relations with community leaders and know to call the Sacramento Sheriff's Department and not Gold River Patrol when a crime is witnessed or suspected. Surprisingly, that's a real issue which surfaced at the meeting. Check out the "Community Information" tab at grea.info for more information. You'll also find minutes from the safety committee meeting under "Resource Center."

As much as I'd like to end on a happy note, I feel obligated to report that less than three weeks after the six arrests I stumbled upon fresh graffiti along Gold Rush Drive, near the trailhead and just steps from a manor home that got hit with racial scrawling that awful night. The word, tame in comparison to what we saw in August, was spray-painted on the sidewalk. Was it an act by the same guys? A copycat? Whoever it was, let's hope he/she/they got it out of his/her/their system. But if not, at least use chalk next time. Same message, so much easier and cheaper to remove.



Signs of Change in Game Diversity

By Noah Howard

The singular issue that has rocked the world of gaming over the past five years has been diversity. Videogames have traditionally been a medium dominated in audience by white males, so, like most other popular art forms, white males were predominantly placed into lead roles. But while the gameplaying demographic began to change, as people from nonwhite-male groups (which, let's face it, are most groups) became more visible in both circles of development and fan communities, it seemed like the diversity of games' protagonists failed to adjust accordingly.

The problem was that the entire debate quickly devolved from a nuanced conversation about the role of race and gender in media into a so-called "Social justice warrior" vs socalled "alt-right" battleground. Just recently, an editorial on GameSpot commending a recent game-based movie for its primary female character turned into an absolute nightmare in the comments section, as people defending the author clashed with people hyperbolizing her point in every outlandish way

From an outsider's perspective it may appear that the conversation has gone nowhere. When requests for diversity are violently struck down it can be tough for developers to tell if either opinion represents the true perspective of most gamers or a vocal minority. But actually looking at this year's triple-A, big-budget extravaganzas, it seems like the demands for



where all races and genders are represented, but where no singular type of person holds a veritable monopoly over the medium we all love.

diversity have been heard, and thankfully, the normal supporters of white-visage-domination in games have been more or less

Of the ten biggest games coming out over the next six months. only three (by my count) feature a single white male protagonist for their entire duration. If you consider October and November specifically (October and November are usually when the year's major releases come out, due to their close proximity to Christmas), that number drops to two, with all major releases either allowing you to choose what sex to play as (like Dishonored 2), featuring more than one protagonist of a diverse background (Battlefield 1), or starring a distinctly non-white character (Mafia 3, Watch_Dogs 2, Final Fantasy XV).

But despite past 2016 releases with an equal dedication to diversity (Overwatch in particular, easily one of the most effortlessly diverse games ever made, comes to mind), most big 2016 games up to this point have featured a white male protagonist. To some extent, that's

not inherently a bad thing. The likely reality is that a disproportionate amount of consumers of these games are still predominantly white and male (I say "likely" because gaming demographics have never been sufficiently studied; industry evaluations often use the term "gamer" to group people who play a free mobile game on their phone with people who spend \$1000+ annually on games and gaming hardware). As such, until that likely reality changes (as it is in the process of doing), developers will still aim to reach as wide an audience as possible while using as little resources as possible.

Don't get me wrong; the level of diversity is still too low, but what we've seen this year is a step in the right direction. A step towards a world of gaming where all races and genders are represented, but where no singular type of person holds a veritable monopoly over the medium we all love.

Back to School? Learn About Tax Credits for Education

If you pay for college in 2016, for an eligible student. you may receive some tax savings on your federal tax return, even if you're studying outside of the U.S. Both the American Opportunity Tax Credit and the Lifetime Learning Credit may reduce the amount of tax you owe, but only the AOTC is partially refundable.

Here are a few things you should know about education

The American Opportunity Tax Credit is worth up to \$2,500 per year for an eligible student. This credit is available for the first four years of higher education. Forty percent of the AOTC is refundable. That means, if you're eligible, you can get up to \$1,000 of the credit as a refund, even if you do not owe any tax.

The Lifetime Learning Credit is worth up to \$2,000 per tax return. There is no limit on the number of years that you can claim the LLC

You may use only qualified expenses paid to figure your credit. These expenses include the costs you pay for tuition, fees and other related expenses for an eligible student to enroll at, or attend, an eligible educational institution. Refer to IRS.gov for more on the rules that apply to each credit.

Eligible educational institutions are those that offer education beyond high school. This includes most colleges and universities. Vocational schools or other postsecondary schools may also qualify. If you aren't sure if your school is eligible ask your school if it is an eligible educational institution, or see if your school is on the U.S. Department of Education's Accreditation

In most cases, you should receive Form 1098-T, Tuition Statement, from your school by

February 1. This form reports your qualified expenses to the IRS and to you. The amounts shown on the form may be either: (1) the amount you paid for qualified tuition and related expenses, or (2) the amount that your school billed for qualified tuition and related expenses; therefore, the amounts shown on the form may be different than the amounts you actually paid. Don't forget that you can only claim an education credit for the qualified tuition and related expenses that you paid in the tax year and not just the amount that your school billed.

The education credits are subject to income limitations and may be reduced, or eliminated, based on your income.

To see if you're eligible to claim education credits, use the Interactive Tax Assistant tool on IRS.gov.

New US Post Office Requirements Puts Senior Citizens Health at Risk

and I moved to a Senior Mobile Home Court in Rancho Cordova. It's a beautiful place to live. You are required to be 55 years or older and many of our owners are in their 80's and 90's. This court, located near Hwy 50 and Sunrise Blvd, was first built back in the 1960's, with many narrow roads and NO SIDEWALKS.




