ROCKLIN, CA (MPG) - With a grant from the Community Needs Fund at Placer Community Foundation, 25 youth ages 8-12 from Excel Roseville got to be engineers for the day on that is similar to Photoshop. July 30th at the Hacker Lab Sierra College in Rocklin. Three representatives from Code for Hood, a local organization that focuses on hosting "hackathons" and coding workshops in urban neighborhoods, taught the sessions and led the youth through hands-on activities.

"Is this real science?" Tristan, age eight, asked Nile, a UC Davis student and instructor for the day. "It's all real science!" replied Nile. "This is science in action."

The day began with a few definitions. Alan Ware, a mechanical engineer and one of the teachers, told the group, "Hacking, at its core, is a creative solution to a problem." He dispelled the myth that all hacking is negative, a commonly held notion of the practice. Alan also helped the youth to understand the work done by engineers. The students toured the recently opened Hacker Lab, learning about the laser cutter, the industrial sewing station, and the 3D printers.

Throughout the day, the kids moved between three stations. The first station taught them a program named Gimp, a free and open-source graphics editing program Participants learned how to combine and revise images; one enthusiastic student put a cat in space with his newfound skills. Another station employed SketchUp, a 3D modeling software. "I briefly showed the kids how to use it and then they took the

mouse from me," Alan said. "And when you put kids in front of 3D software, they run with it!" The final station allowed the youth to play with mini inventor's kits that allowed for the creation of interactive electronic objects. By correctly connecting wires, the youth made small light bulbs illuminate. "It was a good day because we got to play with electricity," said Jared, age nine.

Excel Roseville serves families in North Roseville to sustain a healthy, stable environment that creates a positive impact on the lives of at-risk children. Excel Roseville programs have an emphasis on education and



academic support, life skills training, and encouraging creative outlets.

Tamika Bennett, Excel Roseville's executive director, explained how meaningful the field trip was for her students, saying, "The smiles around the room say it all. These kids are putting mathematics into action and having immediate success, which boosts self-esteem, a feeling that will stay with them for a long time." With grants such as these, Placer Community Foundation works to improve the lives of all our residents and respond to priorities as they arise in our community.

Brown Signs Compact with United Auburn **Indian Community**

PLACER COUNTY, CA (MPG) -Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. announced that he has signed a tribal-state gaming compact between the State of California and the United Auburn Indian Community.

The compact reflects a continued commitment by the Tribe to revenue sharing with non-gaming and limited gaming tribes so that the economic benefits of gaming reach tribal governments that have not chosen to operate a tribal casino. Under the terms of this compact, United Auburn will become one of the largest contributors to the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund. The terms also provide a framework for the sharing of gaming revenue with Placer County and other local jurisdictions for fire, law enforcement, public transit, education, tourism, and other services, and provide incentives for investments in renewable energy projects, non-gaming-related economic development projects, and health care facilities that provide a mutual benefit to tribal members and local residents. In addition, up to \$9 million may be directed by the Tribe specifically to finance infrastructure projects on non-Indian lands within Placer County that benefit the Tribe and the surrounding community.

The compact continues to assure the protection of the health and safety of the casino patrons, guests, and employees and affirms the role of a tribal-state association of gaming regulators to provide a framework within which tribal and state gaming regulators can exchange information and collaborate to ensure that the gaming public has continued confidence in the integrity of casino

Music with a Higher Purpose Placer County No-Camping **Ordinance Has Taken Effect**

nance banning unauthorized camping on Placer County land went into effect on August 6th. Placer County recently had a cleanup of the area most impacted by this new law, the Placer County Government Center in north Auburn.

The new ordinance says that anyone camping, using a campfire, or storing belongings on the lawn will be subject to citation or arrest. Fliers and signs were posted in advance to encourage people to immediately remove their belongings and to notify them of the planned cleanup day. County staff and advocates for the homeless worked for weeks to proactively inform homeless people in the area about this change. A dumpster was also provided to help them dispose of any unwanted belongings.

On August 11th, five days after the ordinance went into effect, evidence technicians from the Placer County Sheriff's Office collected personal property left on the lawn; cataloged the property; and securely wrapped, tagged, and stored it to be kept in possession for 90 days. Inmate crews followed behind to clean up the lawn area. Notices were left to alert people whose belongings were collected about how to retrieve their property.

'We are using a reasoned, balanced approach that treats homeless campers with respect and preserves their belongings while ensuring that camping on the lawn area comes to an end," said County Executive Officer David Boesch. "Homelessness is an issue we take very seriously, and we continue to seek a long-term solution to address


homelessness throughout the county."

The Placer County Board of Supervisors adopted the nocamping ordinance July 7th after community concern arose over the prevalence of homeless campers at the government center. The county worked with community groups to provide a temporary homeless shelter nearby, which opened in June, and continues to work with those groups to develop a better long-term solution as quickly as possible.

The county continues to

pursue a regional, public-private partnership approach, based on the recommendations of our nationally renowned consultant, Dr. Robert Marbut. Additionally, at its meeting on August 4th, the board of supervisors voted to renew grant agreements with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to receive funds for permanent supportive housing, shelter and health care services, totaling nearly \$800,000.

Roseville Labor Negotiator Under Fire Rocklin Pro-Am Disc Golf Tournament

ROSEVILLE, CA (MPG) -International Association of Fire Fighters Local 1592, International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 1245, International Union of Operating Engineers Local 39, Roseville Police Officers' Association, and Roseville Police Association sent a letter to the members of the Roseville City Council notifying them that they find it offensive that the City of Roseville has retained attorney, Mr. Timothy Davis, to be the labor negotiator.

"We, as bargaining groups for the City of Roseville, can only perceive your contract with Mr. Davis as a direct attack on our labor force and are shocked that the City of Roseville would support Mr. Davis at the expense of the City of Roseville and its employees.

"Mr. Davis has a well-worn track record of creating toxic relationships between city employees and city leadership. One need only look at the detrimental impact he had on the cities of San Diego and Santa Cruz.'

The bargaining groups have asked that the Roseville City

Council stop spending taxpayer dollars on a negotiator that demonstrates disregard for the safety and operations of the City of Roseville. They have also asked that the City Council does what is in everyone's best interest, which is to meet the needs of the men and women who serve the City of Roseville every day.

> As the number of smartphones on the market continues to rise along with computer accessibility, Code for America and Placer County see potential for


participation to increase above the 44.5% of eligible participants who currently use the program.

PLACER COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Placer County's investment in road maintenance work is getting a big boost this year.

The Public Works Department maintains more than 1,000 miles of roads in unincorporated areas throughout the county. The county pared back the road maintenance budget significantly during the recession, but has been working to restore budget support since then. The 2015-16 proposed county budget, similar to the budget approved for 2014-15, includes an additional general fund contribution of \$1 million for roads.

"I compare road maintenance projects to having the oil changed in cars and trucks," explained Engineering Manager Kevin Taber of the county's road maintenance division. "Oil changes don't make a car run noticeably better, but help prevent major breakdowns that require expensive repairs. Road maintenance projects are a cost-effective way to achieve a similar goal: prolonging the life spans of county roadways."

Work has already been completed on the first of this year's three major projects: a \$1.8 million road resurfacing program that provided chip-seal and other surface treatments on almost 50 miles of various county roadways. For the chip-seal work, Telfer Highway Technologies used smaller rocks than usual and swept roads after work was completed to give bicyclists a smoother ride on newly resurfaced roadways.

Chip-seal treatments provide good wearing surfaces and act as weather-proofing membranes. They typically are used on rural roads with relatively low traffic volumes or as the bottom layers of multi-layer surface treatments.

On July 7th, the Placer County Board of Supervisors awarded a \$1.4 million contract to Teichert Construction of Rocklin for the second project: a hot mix asphalt overlay treatment for English Colony Way, Seeno Avenue, Cedar Oaks Drive, and Fuller Drive in the Granite Bay area. In addition, overlays are scheduled for stretches of Virginiatown

Road in Newcastle/Lincoln that are affected by pipe-laying work for the Mid-Western Placer Regional Sewer Project.

Work on that project was underway at the end of July and paving was completed in early August. Hot mix asphalt overlays are a maintenance option used to extend the useful lives of roadway pavement. The overlays reduce the rate of deterioration, correct surface deficiencies, reduce permeability, and improve ride quality.

On July 21st, the board approved going out to bid on another \$1.4 million project: hot mix asphalt overlay work in North Lake Tahoe. Approximately six miles of roads in Carnelian Bay will receive overlays.

The board is tentatively scheduled to award a contract on September 1st so work on the project can begin after the Labor Day holiday. The selection of roads for maintenance work is based on such factors as road conditions, traffic volumes, and





PICKS OF THE WEEK



Marion Cotillard in "Two Days, One Night'

"Aloha" (PG-13) - Defense contractor Brian (Bradley Cooper) has to close an important deal, face his past mistakes, fall in love, reconcile with his ex-wife, learn about Hawaiian culture and stand up to the military-industrial complex in this jumbled joyfest from Cameron Crowe ("Jerry MaGuire," "Almost Famous"). While on business in Hawaii -- his former home -- Brian is paired up with a perky Air Force liaison (Emma Stone). They are soon in love, but there are a bunch more subplots in the way, including ones with Alec Baldwin, Bill Murray, Rachel Mc-Adams and John Krasinski.

It's always a wonderful sign when a famous director publicly apologizes to a star for casting her in his movie. The film already had a pall over it on its premiere, since leaked Sony emails showed the studio was none too pleased with early looks at the movie.

"Where Hope Grows" (PG-13) -Calvin (Kristoffer Polaha) had his chance in the majors, then choked under pressure and left the league in disgrace. Now he's a washedup alcoholic whose boozy antics have wrecked every relationship in his life, and his daughter (McKaley Miller) has taken the brunt of it. On his way to rock bottom, Calvin finds friendship with a grocery store worker nicknamed Produce (David DeSanctis, a young man with Down Syndrome in his first acting role), whose endearing positivity is the opposite of Calvin's wallowing.

Polaha and DeSanctis develop a real screen chemistry, never seeming wooden or forced. While the movie has this interesting dynamic, the trajectory of Calvin's soul is made clear pretty early on when it's shown that Produce is a devout churchgoer and carries a Bible with him everywhere he goes.

"Two Days, One Night" (PG-13) -- After taking a medical leave from her job manufacturing solar panels, Sandra (Marion Cotillard) returns to find that her job is up for a vote: her co-workers must decide whether Sandra is let go or if they keep their 1,000 euro annual bonus. Actually, they already decided to let Sandra go, but she pleads for a re-do, giving her one weekend to convince enough co-workers to change their vote. Cotillard brings an amazing performance that has already stirred up awards both abroad and in the U.S.

"Citizenfour" (R) - This film is the most up-close look we have at Edward Snowden, one of the most wanted and influential people of our day. A government contractor and computer-security specialist, Snowden leaked a mountain of classified information that continues to reverberate through the global stage. Back in 2013, documentary filmmaker and Pulitzer Prize-winner Laura Poitras started receiving anonymous messages hinting at huge revelations related to government surveillance. Later, Poitras and journalist Glenn Greenwald started meeting with the enigmatic source. This rare and engaging glimpse at a polarizing and still-relevant figure is worth checking out.





Go get that new, better car, Linda. Just don't go into debt to make it happen!

My wife and I are recent graduates with advanced degrees. We also have about \$300,000 in student loan debt. We're thinking about buying a rental property, and the plan is to get a mortgage with monthly payments of \$400 and charge \$800 in rent. We could use the extra to help pay off our debt. Dear Jeremy,

Are you serious? You're in a financial crisis, and you ask if it's okay to buy a rental property? No,

Right now, you guys are acting like Congress. You have a huge mess

on your hands, and you're both going to have to work like crazy to clean it up. That means living on rice and beans for the foreseeable future. It means no vacations, and you should not see the inside of a restaurant unless you're working there to make extra money.

Again, no! You should not buy a rental property. Even if you did, this plan assumes that it's constantly occupied and the renter actually pays. Those are two pretty big assumptions. Use whatever money you have to get out of debt, and live simple, inexpensive lives until you get this behind you.

Stop trying to borrow your way through all of your dreams, Jeremy. Doing that will only turn those dreams into nightmares!

to the internet. Computers, phones, cars, houses, appliances, watches, and more. Would you believe that in one high-profile cyberattack that took place in late June of 2013 and early 2014, hackers broke into 100,000 consumer gadgets, including refrigerators, televisions, wireless speakers, and media centers? They used these appliances to release almost a million malicious emails. All of this connectivity has left us wide open for cyber hacking. Oster gave me his top 10 tips for preventing your information from being stolen.

Early detection is key. Set one day a week to monitor all your statements.

- •Enroll in any real-time alerts for all your credit cards, banking, and retirement accounts.
- •Change all of your PINS and PASSWORDS on a regular basis.
- ·Subscribe to a robust credit monitoring service that has a resolution service included.
- •Never use public Wi-Fi for sensitive browsing, banking, or shopping.
- •Update your browser to the

newest version.

- •Run a full scan on your computer.
- •Back up all your files (pictures, videos, personal banking) regularly.
- •Disconnect all devices when not using the internet.
- •Limit the amount of information you share on social media. Make your accounts private.

After hearing all this information from someone who deals with these hackers on a daily basis, what I fear most is that this is only the beginning. Almost daily, we hear reports of massive hacks into not only our private information but that of major government sites and companies we all frequent. So I guess we need to be extra vigilant with this newfound tool that seems so innocent to use. I suspect there are no guarantees, but we can certainly do the best we can with what we have.
