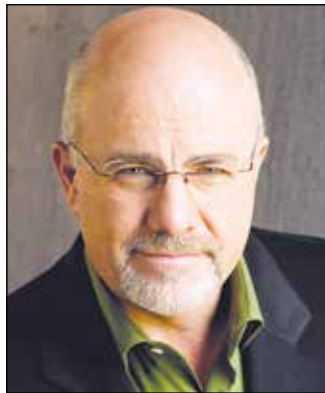

## LIFE Legacy in the Heart of Auburn

Check Out General Gomez Arts and Event Center

**AUBURN, CA (MPG)** - The General Gomez Arts and Event Center (GGAEC) opened its doors on March 28. Carolynn Basque and Coppelia Burns own GGAEC. But the story of how it came to be called General Gomez goes back over a century.

Let's start here: Carolynn Basque and David Burns (Carolynn's brother

and Coppelia's husband) are proud descendants of Ernest W. Burns, who was an early pioneer of Auburn.

E. W. Burns began hand-rolling cigars in 1887. The name of his cigars would eventually be General Gomez because, according to the Burns family, the cigar stood for liberation, independence and freedom, and was named after E. W.

## PCWA Board Approves Expanded Water Restrictions

**AUBURN, CA (MPG)** - The Placer County Water Agency (PCWA) Board of Directors adopted the Stage 2 Water Warning condition under PCWA's Water Shortage Contingency Plan at its meeting on April 16. The expanded regulations comply with the State Water Resources Control Board's emergency regulations adopted on March 17 and the Governor's executive order issued on April 1.

"As we work to comply with complicated state regulations, we have to rely on public understanding and responsibility to successfully meet the mandated reduction levels," PCWA General Manager Einar Maisch said. "The Board's adoption of the Stage 2 Water Warning is the first step in preparing PCWA and its customers for any additional reductions."

PCWA has been operating under a Stage 1 Water Alert condition designed to achieve a reduction of up to 20 percent since April 2014. In addition to Stage 1 restrictions, the Stage 2 Water Warning condition limits irrigation to two days per week and is designed to achieve up to a 30 percent reduction in potable water use. Communications will be sent to all customers informing them of the Board's adoption of the Stage 2 Water Warning and what it means in terms of their water use practices. Additional information will be posted to the Agency's website.

PCWA's revised Water Storage Contingency Plan was adopted by the Board on April 2 and ensures that the Agency's water supplies will be sufficient for the duration of the 2015 drought despite dismal snowpack and below average precipitation.

Deputy Director of Technical Services Tony Firenzi, the Agency's drought project manager,

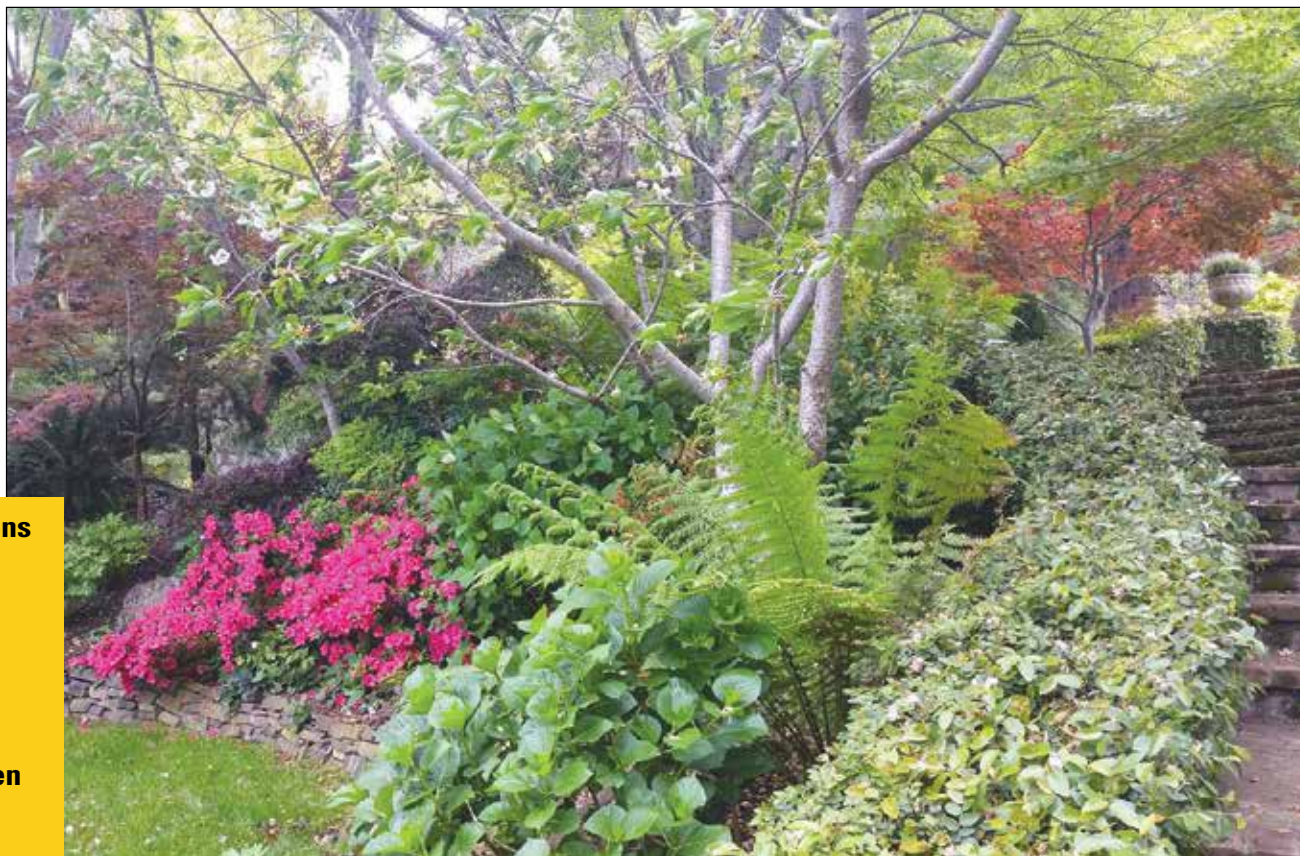
## 'Bloomtastic' at Maple Rock Gardens

**AUBURN, CA (MPG)** - The wheels are on and the carts are ready to go for this year's Auburn Funk Box Derby happening Sunday, April 26 in downtown Auburn.

The event begins at about 8 a.m. with cart check-in at Lincoln Way and Cleveland Ave.

The Funk Box Derby, put on by the Auburn 2030 Club #19, is an event similar to a soapbox derby. "But ours is more fun," said organizer Brian Muentner. "It's funky and whacky! The carts are graded more on show, appearance and enthusiasm, rather than speed." While speed is a factor, it is not a requirement.

Come in hungry, as The Daily Egg, at 844 Lincoln Way, downtown, is providing breakfast for only five dollars. "Each person who wants breakfast can get a coupon in front of The Daily Egg, walk in, pay them and get the 'Funk Box Breakfast Special,'" said Muentner. "It's two pancakes, eggs and a choice of sausage or bacon." The breakfast will go from 8 to 10 a.m.

A variety of vendors will also be on hand during the event. People start to show up with

At about 11 a.m., the parade of carts heads uphill from Lincoln Ave. and Cleveland Ave. to Harrison Ave. "Then the race begins! Carts race downhill on Lincoln Way from Harrison

Ave. to Cleveland Ave.," said Muentner. "It's a total blast!"

presented results of the April 1 snow surveys to the Board. PCWA snow courses on the American River watershed registered at 1 percent of average while PG&E's Yuba-Bear watershed registered at 3 percent of average. To date, seasonal precipitation within the watershed is 39.1 inches, or 65 percent of average.

In other news, PCWA directors: • Heard from Linda Yager, PCWA Deputy Director of Customer Services, regarding the agency's water savings incentive program for agricultural and rural residential landowners. Under this program, participants can receive rebates of up to 50 percent of the cost for installing irrigation upgrades

and/or turf replacement.


• Approved the initiation of the Middle Fork Project Communications Systems Upgrade Project. The project will increase the reliability and efficiency of communications facilities used for the Middle Fork American River Project.

The next regular meeting of the PCWA Board of Directors will be held on Thursday, May 7, 2015, at the PCWA Business Center, 144 Ferguson Road, in Auburn. PCWA board meetings are open to the public.

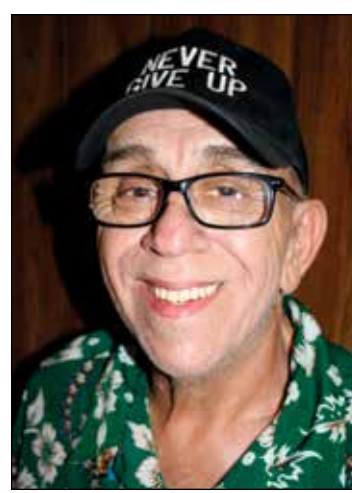

**AUBURN, CA (MPG)** - Auburn Police Chief John Ruffcorn and Auburn Recreation District (ARD) Administrator Kahl Muscott held a town hall meeting March 16 at the City Council Chambers with 75 concerned citizens, including local politicians, in attendance.

Chief Ruffcorn took the lead in addressing safety concerns in Auburn parks, primarily Overlook Skate Park and the School Park Preserve. Knowing the heightened concerns of Auburnite's, Ruffcorn read off the statistics of complaint calls into the Auburn Police Department (APD) and responses made involving Overlook Skate Park.

"Chief Ruffcorn said this is a societal problem that could be solved with enough dollars and personnel," said Placer County Supervisor Jennifer Montgomery. "But the costs would be prohibitive, and the statistics didn't bear out allocating existing personnel full-time to the parks. He is committed to enhancing patrols and adding additional existing resources."

With confidence Ruffcorn assured the town folks that Auburn Parks were being looked over by his men. It wouldn't take long before the anxious crowd started off with Bootlegger's owner Ty Rowe speaking out about safety for his kids that use the Skate Park. Chef Rowe and his kids, primarily, have witnessed and experienced bullying, rocks being thrown at them and drug usage/dealing by teenagers.

Others spoke of how overlooked Overlook Park was and video surveillance became part of the suggestive solutions coming from the crowd. Mayor Keith Nesbitt, former mayor Maki and

Ty Rowe suggested fundraising to put in place cameras to overlook the Skate Park. Citizen's started to realize their part in the solution to working hand-in-hand with law enforcement.

The police phone lines were problematic to the citizens. Sometimes a 911 call got you bumped (when using a cell phone) to another local city delaying response time. Ruffcorn said he'd look into it and advised people to include in their emergency numbers, besides 911, (530) 823-4234 or (530) 823-4222 which would get you directly to Auburn dispatch.

The present number of police is in place to fit the needs of Auburn according to statistics of crime and community concerns. How can we work together? The community has to be involved! Ruffcorn does have a volunteer citizen's patrol that follows up on police responses and community calls.

Neighborhood Watch programs, independent of APD, can be trained and taught how to develop something in any neighborhood. What say you Auburnite's? Are you willing to step up and be a part of the solution and overlook your neighborhood?

A 12-step recovery programs exists in the Overlook park area. Abrupt fencing has been put in place by ARD in the area. This has impeded participants to park next to their module. ARD locks the gates to the fence prior to meetings letting out and forces cars onto Pacific Street making things difficult for handicapped participants and folks with strollers.

Auburn School Preserve Park next to the Taco Tree by Placer High has drug usage and dealing going on. Placer High Assistant Principle Steve Caminiti said publicly that a bunch of trees need to be cut down in the park to prevent pot smoking and dealing. Local Auburnite Mary Piette said "I suggest that if the city and school are worried they should step up foot patrolling

before cutting down trees." Of the many long comments I got from the crowd here are parts of their statements:

• Mayor Keith Nesbitt: "This is government at best ... open communication and exchange of ideas with the public. We will actively pursue cameras at the skate park and the partial clearing of trees at the School Park Preserve. It sounds like former mayor Maki and Chef Rowe are willing to have a campaign for cameras fundraiser."

• Former mayor Maki: "We need to all step up as a community, APD cannot do this single-handedly."

• Councilman Berlant: "I believe increased police patrol and cameras will deter crime. The community needs to be the eyes and ears for the police department."

• Councilman Spokely: "If you witness illegal activity, call APD. The volume of calls will help the police allocate appropriate resources."

• ARD's Kahl Muscott: "ARD will be considering these ideas to better increase safety at the parks, specifically Overlook and the Skate Park."

• Chief Ruffcorn: "Safety in our community, including our parks, in our number one priority. We need the help and support of everyone in the community to report suspicious activities. If we work together I know we can mitigate our safety concerns."

The chief closed by suggesting that we don't want to deter people from parks, but we want to defer people from doing bad things in the parks. Who's overlooking the parks? You, me with ARD cameras together with APD!!!

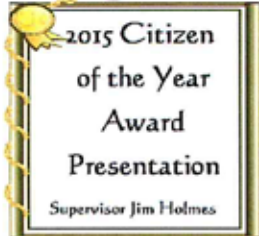

An inscription on a plaque placed at Scott's Corner in the year 2000 by the Placer County Historical Society reads:

### Long Valley School/ Scott's Corner

Built in 1868 as a schoolhouse, this structure was originally located ¼ mile east of here on land donated by George Threlkel. Moved here around 1880, it served as a school through 1889, then as Long Valley Community Hall until 1918. Robert Scott purchased it in 1932, made additions and opened a grocery store. Although sold in 1961, it's still known as Scott's Corner.

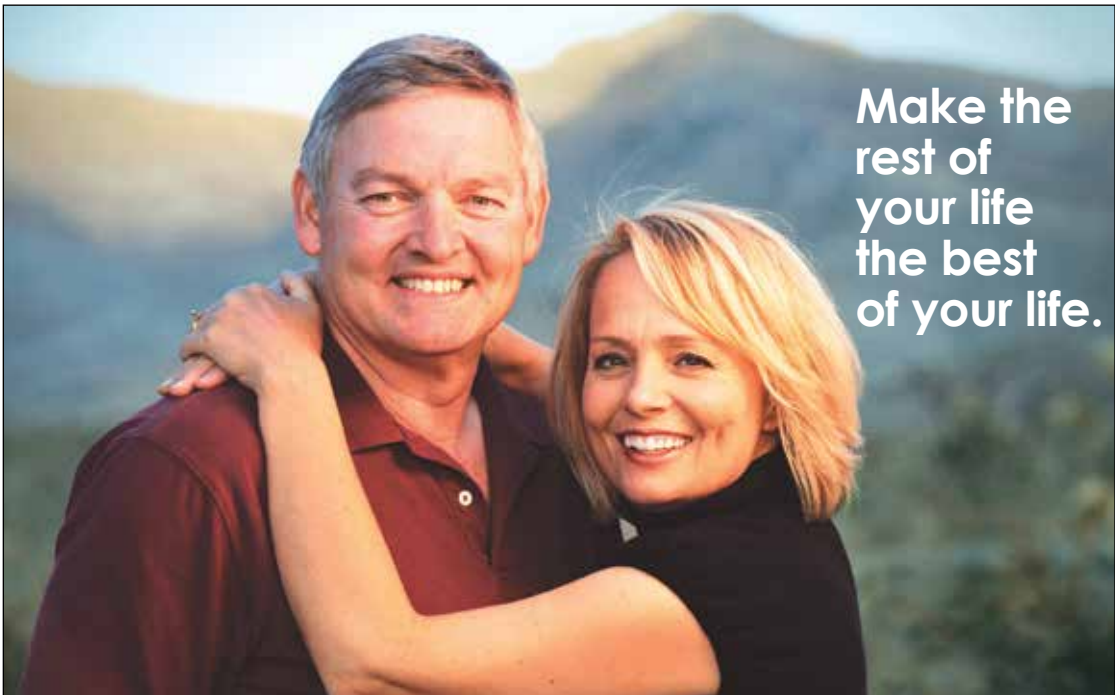

Burns read a story about the real General Gomez's effort to free Cuba from Spain.

Along with his partner and friend, Robert Wise, E. W. Burns manufactured the General Gomez cigar for many decades in Auburn.

The property housing the GGAEC has been in the Burns family for 130 years. During that time it has been home to several long-term businesses — most recently, the ARTS Building. The business and energy of the ARTS Building is still very important to the Burns family, who say they want to take the great vibe of that by introducing General Gomez to the community and reviving the discovery of liberation, independence and freedom.

"We're adding the word 'expression' to that, for (the acronym) L.I.F.E.," said Basque. "We're calling the upstairs gallery the L.I.F.E. gallery."

To kick off the new life of the space, the art showing at the L.I.F.E. Gallery has been "Aqua Vistas," showcasing the spirit and essence of water and the activities surrounding water. "Water is life," said Basque.

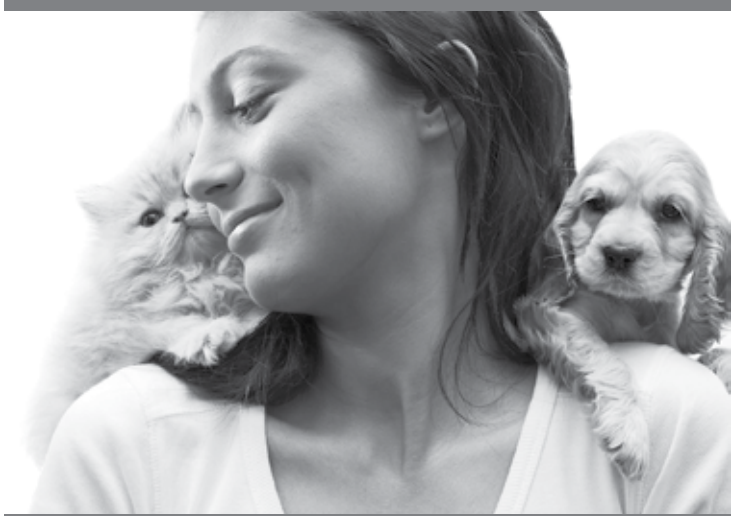

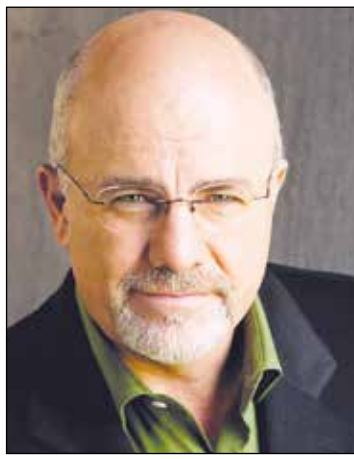

### Pay it, but with caution

Dear Dave, I got a department store credit card, using my real age at the time, when I was 17. I ran up a debt of \$150, and the balance has grown to over \$350. This was 10 or 12 years ago, but a debt collection agency started calling again the other day wanting the money. Hasn't the statute of limitations run out by now? What should I do?

Elizabeth

Dear Elizabeth, There is a statute of limitations, but there are a couple of other things to consider, too.

First, the debt is not collectible because a minor alone cannot enter into a legally binding contract in any state. The second thing is they can screw up your credit report for a very long time, and it sounds like they're in the process of doing that right now.

Here's my advice. Call them and explain that they are past the statute of limitations, and that you are considering suing them. After that, remind them that you were a minor when someone approved you for the card, which means the store you signed up with can be sued as well.

However, since you did take stuff from the store, offer them the original \$150 to settle the deal. Get it in writing that the account is settled in full by this amount, and don't give them electronic access to your money. When you get the settlement offer in writing, keep a copy of the letter and a copy of the cashier's check you'll use as payment.

Pay it because you owe it, Elizabeth. It's a moral issue. And hopefully as a result you can get these kinds of people out of your life for good!

**REMEMBER OYUR DREAMS.** Put your recording materials by your bed and ask your unconscious to share a dream with you.

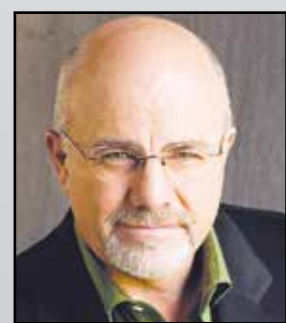


