Thanks to Yanks Promotes Appreciation, Support, and Respect for Those Who Serve the Country

very November, the Thanks To Yanks non-profit organization based in Milford, collects household items for veterans who are homeless or in need. As part of their Hope for Heroes campaign, the drive looks to members of the community to donate toiletries, clothes, gift cards, and other needed goods as listed. The group then provides the items to local veterans and veterans' shelters.

"Between November 1 and 11, people can drop off items we're asking for at Imperial Toyota, 300 Fortune Boulevard, in Milford," said Mike Shain, who founded and leads Thanks to Yanks. "After that, we will appreciate help with the sorting and distributing, including any items dropped off after the end date."

Imperial Cars, with locations in Milford and Mendon, is "Proud to support our veterans," said General Manager Mike Penner. "Our support ranges from veteran's discounts at our dealerships to partnering with veterans' groups and organizations. We're glad to assist Thanks to Yanks in collecting and helping to distribute donations." This spotlight article was made possible by a contribution from Imperial Cars.

While November is the time for the Thanks to Yanks main



drive, the organization conducts programs year-round. "We work with the veterans' service officers in Milford and nearby towns, along with other veterans' groups, to identify needs," said Shain. "One thing we do is send care packages overseas, including Dunkin coffee – they've been generous, or Girl Scout cookies. The recipients enjoy the taste of home.

"Recently, we gave out gift cards to veterans' agents, who provided them to veterans and families in need. We've also given out oil heating vouchers. We receive very appreciative thank you notes — the family didn't know what they were going to do, and our contribution really helped. It's touching when you can solve someone's problem.

"This past summer, we held a July Fourth celebration and fundraiser at the Italian American

Veterans Club. It was a picnic with a dunk tank, cornhole, face painting, and raffles."

Contributions are welcome throughout the year as well. "People who want to support what we do send in checks," said Shain. "A donation just came from a woman in Mendon in memory of her son who served many tours. Letters like the one from her are very moving."

Shain, who is not a veteran, started the organization in 2006 and involved his two sons and their scout group. "Post 9/11, a lot of military families were separated," Shain said. "We wanted them to know they weren't alone in their struggles. So we held a thank you luncheon after the Memorial Day parade." Thanks to Yanks grew from there, to provide support, express appreciation, and promote respect for veterans, military members, and their families.

To donate funds or to volunteer with the November drive or other efforts – from getting

together school supplies to arranging centerpieces for events to applying for grants — contact the organization, or follow facebook.com/thankstoyanks. "At this time, we're also looking for a few board members — that role takes just a couple hours a

month," said Shain.





A family variation of Colcannon (Irish mashed potatoes) Contributed by Mary Dalton

- 6 cups boiled potatoes, peeled and diced

1 cup sugar 3/4 cup flour 2/3 cup canned pumpkin 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

1 tsp. baking soda

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease, then line a cookie sheet

Bake approximately 12-15
minutes, or until the top is

spongy and not sticky
Turn onto lightly sugared dish



Cut up peppers, onions and saute with olive oil until cooked through. Set aside. Fry up potatoes with olive oil, season with salt, and chipotle black pepper (or pepper if you prefer). Then add pepper and onion mixture to peppers and toss together. Drain any excess oil, water etc.

Take the casserole pan layered with biscuit, add in scrambled eggs, cheese, meat, potato, pepper and onion mixture and layer with cheese and finish with some cheese on top too.

Open the other can of Pilsbury biscuits and layer the top the same way you did the bottom. Pinching them together so no holes in dough. Cut a few small slits in dough

Bake 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until golden brown on top.

Tip: Prepare the day before and leave in the fridge. Take out early to bring to room temp then cook.









