
Birch Buddies after school program is open from 3:15-5:00



"Ff" is the letter of the week! Saplings practiced writing the letter "F" using manipulatives, sounded the letter out, and recognized various objects and animals that start with the letter "F". Please be sure to practice at home finding things that start with this letter and sounding it out. Reinforcement from home helps a great deal!

This week, the routine of checking in with the teacher upon arrival was introduced. Saplings start by practicing writing and spelling their names on the board, and we have a brief conversation about the expectations for the day. The children have been doing an impressive job so far!

Moving into the month of November, we are starting to work on understanding the meaning of the words "gratefulness" and "gratitude". We have started this process by recognizing our friends and family. We are continuing to talk and read books about friendship, how to be helpful and how to

show our gratitude towards each other. We also sang some fun songs about family. Saplings are learning that all families are different/unique in their own ways and that families take care of each other, including our classroom family. We read various stories about manners and had an open discussion on scenarios where we need to use our manners. Brainstorming on examples of good manners, and why we need them, has really been helpful for self-reflection.


From Ms. Sara Knottski

It has been a busy week! Thank you to all the parents for meeting during conferences. It was great getting to share what I see in the classroom and to hear what you see at home. I get a lot of good insight about every student by talking to you!

In language arts, we are focusing on reading strategies. We always look at the words and try to sound out words we do not know. We use pictures for clues and to understand a story better. Students should be practicing reading every day at home! In math, first graders are learning about missing parts in an equation. Kindergarteners are learning about numbers up to 20, shapes, and 5-groups.

Winter is approaching! Please make sure all outdoor gear is waterproof and your student has a hat, mittens, snow pants, and a proper winter coat every day! Practice putting on winter gear at home so that they are more independent at school!

This week has been adjusting back into a longer week. We continue building our language knowledge and math concepts. In social studies, we continued to work on all things maps. It was chilly out so we all bundled up to go outside.

In reading, we did our first real assessment where students read through an article (by themselves) and answered comprehension questions. We have been working through a series of prefixes and

suffixes so we added a few more to our list. Students are building their ability each week to decode unfamiliar words.

In math, we did our first real math assessment. Students got to spend time solving problems they knew. We worked on adding three to four addends that are 2 digit numbers in second grade. Third graders continue to build their understanding of multiplication and division. We spend extra time building fact fluency with flashcards.

The whole class created maps this week. They also got to have a whole group discussion about different continents throughout the world. Students have had a great time with learning about the parts of a map.

It was great to meet the families of the fourth and fifth graders during conferences this week! It is always beneficial to students when there is a strong parent/teacher connection.

In language arts, the fourth graders have been working on verb tense, making inferences, and have read several stories about art and famous artists. The fifth graders have been working on verb tense, making inferences, and have been reading non-fiction texts about national parks. We have been

discussing the differences between graphic novels and chapter books. All students will be adding chapter books to their free reading time if they have not done so already.

In math, both grade levels continue to solidify their memorization of multiplication facts. Fourth grade will take an assessment soon on multiplication of multidigit numbers. Fifth grade is working on multiplying fractions.

In art, both grades learned how to draw a waving American flag. They will add these drawings to Veteran's Day cards that will be sent to veterans at the Silver Bay Veteran's Home.
