# Patriotism for a Great Day

Veteran's Day Concert Invigorates Crowd at Community Center

### CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG)

- Once again, the staff and volunteers at the Citrus Heights Veterans Community Center on Sylvan outdid themselves putting on another upbeat and invigorating event, a Veterans Day concert on November 11.

The theme for the days was patriotism, music and food and all three were carried out flawlessly.

The patriotism and music were performed by the 35 member Ben Ali Shrine Band, directed by Jerry Lopes. The National Anthem

by Francis Scott Key got the day off to a good start followed by the Armed Forces Salute.

Master of Ceremonies Mark Glover introduced each piece with a little history. The hour of 13 patriotic band pieces went all too quickly as the audience enjoyed hot dogs and other appropriate band fare.

At 88 years young, band director Lopes says he has been in music almost all his life. Following graduation from college in 1957 he immediately began teaching music in public schools. He is still sharing his music with appreciative audiences.

He says doing this work "is community service to me. I'm giving back to the community, and I've done that all my life as a musician".

### the adult distracted driving campaign also includes 300 adult traffic safety presentations statewide. "The CHP encourages drivers to make the conscious decision to drive distraction free every time they get behind the wheel of a vehicle," said CHP Commissioner Sean

Duryee. "Every distraction, even for just a few seconds, increases your chances of being involved in a crash. Ultimately, it is never worth the potentially devastating

consequences."

With multiple modes of communication and instant entertainment, cell phone use is the biggest driver distraction. Between 2019 and 2021, there were a total of 6,343 fatal and injury crashes within CHP jurisdiction stemming from distracted driving. During those same years, CHP officers issued more than 200,000 citations to drivers violating California's handsfree law. Some of the most

common types of adult distracted driving includes texting, talking on a cell phone, eating, grooming, operating a navigation system, and adjusting the radio.

Public education and increased enforcement are designed to encourage drivers to recognize the dangers of distracted driving and reduce the number of people impacted by this reckless, preventable behavior.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security.

# CHPD Updates Council on Grant Funding and Red-Light Camera Program

- During general Public Comment at the November 9 meeting of the Citrus Heights City Council, local resident Andreas Kazos spoke about broken sidewalks in his neighborhood, near the corner of Westbrook Dr. and Hallifax St., close to Auburn Blvd. For five years, Kazos said, "I've been fighting with one of your departments." Large tree roots have shifted areas of the sidewalk, which he said is causing a safety concern, especially for elderly residents like himself and some of his long-time neighbors. In addition to the hazard of broken sidewalks, Kazos said the streetlights don't work in that area, which further increases the risk of a fall.

But he said that despite

frequent complaints over the years, no repairs have been made.

Kazos said he and his wife have both sustained serious injuries due to the broken sidewalks. He suffered a broken jaw and injuries to his arm that he says will require surgery. And Kazos became visibly upset when describing his wife's injuries, for which he said she had to endure more than 12 hours of surgery to install metal bolts into her arm - which she will no longer be able to use effectively as a concert pianist.

He said two other elderly neighbors have fallen on the sidewalk and sufand dying as a result.

fered significant injuries, with one of them allegedly developing complications Kazos said his com-

plaints to City staff about

the broken sidewalks

have been ignored, and he believes two particular employees he has dealt with on this issue to be "incompetent." He stated that he has not been treated with respect in his interactions with these employees, and that they made promises to deal with the issue that have not been kept. He suggested these employees should be transferred to different departments: "It's about time you guys do some changes in your personnel." Kazos said he doesn't

want to involve lawyers in the issue: "This would have been very ugly. But I love my city." But he loves his wife as well, and

he gets very upset when he sees her scar and thinks about all "the pain she has gone through."

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -Boston's Pizza Restaurant & Sports Bar at 5511 Sunrise Blvd. in Citrus

Heights has closed.

Notice of closure was posted on the restaurant's front doors over the weekend of November 4th by franchise owner Gurtej Gill. Gill opened the restaurant on January 27, 2020. Gill was unavailable for comment concerning the reason for the restaurant's closure and a call for comment from Boston's corporate office was not returned.

The Citrus Heights restaurant, located at the corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Uplands Way, was Boston's first to open in Northern California. The location has since been deleted from the company website although single and multi-unit restaurant development opportunities in the Sacramento region remain listed. Another Boston's remains open in Fontana in Southern California.

Boston's Pizza, a Canadian-based restaurant chain with over 40 locations in the United States closure directly to the owner.

Tractor trailers were seen loading restaurant equipment and furnishings throughout the past week.

The shuttered Boston's Pizza and Sports Bar sits just adjacent to the shuttered former Marie Callendar's Restaurant and Bakery on Sunrise Boulevard.

While more than 500 businesses in Citrus Heights received millions in forgivable loans from the well-known Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) during pandemic-related shutdowns last year, 19 local restaurants were lucky enough this year to have their applications approved for new funding allocated to restaurants in the \$1.9 trillion American Rescue Plan.

A total of \$28.6 billion was allocated to the American Rescue Plan's "Restaurant Revitalization Fund," of which \$5.7 billion went to restaurants in California and \$4.85 million of that went to restaurants in Citrus Heights. Cal Restaurants (Boston's Pizza) received a \$651,177 grant from the Restaurant Revitalization Fund.

"Shutdown has affected us severely and we struggled throughout the year with all the closures," Gill said in an earlier interview.

"We had just opened about six weeks before (the) pandemic hit and had trained our team, (only) to end up losing several team members and (then) rehiring and training again several times throughout the year," Gill had said. ★

# Sunrise Marketplace Promises Magical Moments in December

The first event on the roster – a portion of what is known as Magical Moments at Sunrise Marketplace – is the Laser Light Show Spectacular and Night Market in partnership with Kauai's Night Market, guests of all ages can enjoy crafts, activities, vendors, and then a 45-minute laser light show as the grand finale of the evening.

The laser light show was formerly put on in the Lowe's parking lot across the way from the Sunrise Mall, but due to space limitations it was moved to the Sunrise Mall parking lot in recent years. This year, it is in the Macy's Men's parking lot on the Greenback side of the mall.

Last year, the laser show was projected onto the wall of the mall, but this year it will be displayed on a jumbo screen in order to allow it to be in the Macy's location with higher visibility. Besides the night market and show, there will also be carnival games, face painting, and even a magic show. It is a family-friendly activity that SMP hopes to continue on as a tradition as in years past.

According to Lisa Cordell, SMP's Marketing

& Special Projects Manager, the main goal of the Magic Moments series is "to bring the community out together – to just have a fun, safe event and maybe attract consumers from our secondary trade area."

"Hopefully they will come back to shop and dine in the district," she said.

The laser show and night market is expected to draw between 500 and 1000 people to its two showings. Performances are at 6pm and 7pm, and the market and activities open at 4pm. All activities are free, and food will be available for purchase.

While the evening is sure to be a hit, visitors are encouraged to keep in mind that they will be sitting outside in December.

"It's going to be cold," said Cordell. "Bundle up. If you would like to bring chairs to watch, you are more than welcome to."

If you attend the Laser Light Show Spectacular and Night Market and love it, you can continue the Magical Moments fun throughout the month. Next up is a Nutcracker performance happening inside of the Sunrise Mall and performed by Sac Civic Ballet. This special condensed version is being performed at 5:15 PM and 6:10 PM on December 14. Outside of the performances, there are plenty of interactive opportunities including an Elf on the Shelf story hour, character visits with Nutcracker characters, and special giveaways.

Lastly, on December 21 from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm, join other members of the community for a Winter Wonderland skate party at Sunrise Rollerland. Tickets are \$10 and the three-hour session starts at 6pm.

SMP hopes to offer more events in 2024, including the return of Burgers and Brew in May of 2024. Cordell encourages those interested in community events to visit shopsmp. com and get on the newsletter list.

"Always check back for all the activities that go on in the district. That [website] is a really good place to find out what's going on," said Cordell. "There are contests going on continually too, including money and gift card prizes."

# Veterans Day Service Honors All Veterans

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - The sounds of the Harmony Express Men's Chorus, including the Armed Forces Medley and Battle Hymn of the Republic greeted those arriving at Sylvan Cemetery for the traditional Veterans Day ceremony.

Master of Ceremonies and Commander of American Legion Post 637 Paul Reyes greeted attendees and introduced dignitaries including all members of the Citrus Heights City Council.

Former Citrus Heights Mayor Sue Frost, now a member of the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors, spoke of how she learned from her husband the difference between the general public and veterans who have experienced life in a war zone. They have a unique understanding of freedom and have made many sacrifices, including giving up their individuality, serving time away from family, and facing the possibility of death. She emphasizes we should be grateful for the freedoms that veterans have fought to protect. Even we as citizens must do our part to be vigilant and protect the freedoms our veterans have fought for.

Frost concludes by thanking all veterans for their service and sharing the poem, "It is the Veteran," by U.S. Air Force veteran Von Walker Loop.

Police Chief Alex Turcotte emphasized the bond shared between the police department and veterans, many of whom have become police officers and other first responders upon leaving the service. He emphasized how "the support for our veterans and police in Citrus Heights is overwhelming."

Turcotte acknowledged that the phrase "thank you for your service" is not always met with a positive reaction by all veterans as it can evoke a lot of feelings and complex emotions for veterans including survivor's guilt.

# CHPD Updates Council on Grant Funding and Red-Light Camera Program

or prevention along the way for our businesses, and that's critical." Daniels said that a struggling business could be put out of business by a major theft event, so hopefully, this funding will help "prevent these things and keep our businesses thriving."

The Council voted unanimously to accept the grant funding.

The CHPD also received another grant award - \$25,411 from the 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program. These federal funds can be used for various law enforcement activities, including equipment needs.

CHPD plans to use the funding to replace five outdated radios in police vehicles, which will support the City's goal of providing exceptional police services to the community while also enhancing officer safety.

The Council unanimously approved the JAG funding.

The CHPD also provided an update about the City's Red-Light Camera Program. CHPD Lieutenant Michael Wells explained that red-light violations are extremely dangerous, causing serious collisions that can result in significant injury or death. In fatal red-light collisions, the drivers are frequently speeding and often under the influence of alcohol - and almost half of those killed in these collisions are pedestrians, bicyclists, and people in the other vehicle.

Since program implementation in 2007, in addition to collaboration with the City on other traffic safety improvements, there has been a significant reduction in red-light collisions. The CHPD believes that red-light cameras played a crucial role in that reduction.

The City's red-light cameras are currently located at eight intersections on heavily trafficked roadways where collisions tend to occur. The program is administered through a private company, Redflex, whose cameras provide full-time monitoring, with photos and videos taken of potential violations. Those are reviewed twice by Reflex to confirm violations, which are then sent to the CHPD for final review and certification. The citation is mailed to the registered owner of the vehicle, and the violation incident video is available for review. The driver can then pay the fine, or appeal in court. In 2022, 13,486 citations were issued, most of which (78%) were committed by non-residents.

Citation fees are set by the courts, and the City receives a share of that revenue. Most of that revenue goes to cover the cost of the red-light camera program, but on average, the City receives about \$78,110 per year in additional revenue for the general fund. The City's contract with Redflex is cost neutral, so even if the contract cost and program expenditures exceed the revenue, the City does not pay any additional funds beyond the contract cost.

Vice Mayor Daniels said, "Obviously, a lot of people are still running red lights." He asked if there are additional preventative measures that could be implemented to further reduce the rate of violations. But Lt. Wells said that high visibility is the best way to try to change driver behavior, so existing signage throughout the city warns drivers about the cameras, and the CHPD has a social media campaign showing closecall videos to illustrate the danger.

Mayor Tim Schaefer said that while statistics show a significant change in red-light violations in the years right after the program was implemented, in recent years the data shows the rate of violations has remained largely consistent. "I struggle to say that this is an effective program if it's not changing people's behavior. If we see year after year...the same number of violations, it's not changing anything."

Lt. Wells explained that officers are not able to monitor all intersections at all times, and there is no existing technology that will prevent all red-light violations. If the red-light program were to be discontinued, the CHPD fears that the violations would spike back up without that level of constant enforcement provided by the cameras.

This was an informational item, and no action was required by Council.

The regularly scheduled City Council meeting for November 23 has been cancelled due to the Thanksgiving holiday, so the next meeting is scheduled for December 14.

# Is Patriotism Still Here?

# Social Security Disability vs. Spouse Benefits vs. Survivor Benefits (and COLA)

Dear Rusty: I retired from working in June but will not sign up for Social Security until age 70 and, to do that, I plan to draw from my IRA for the next 3 years. My wife is receiving Social Security disability benefits and will reach her full retirement age in March of next year. I know that my wife simply reaching her full retirement age will not mean an increase to her benefit - except for COLA. What I'm wondering is, can my wife get spousal benefits of any sort based on my Social Security benefits - either before I draw or after I am drawing - apart from her benefits at my death? Her Social Security disability amount is only a fraction of my maximum benefit. Signed: Baffled

Husband Dear Baffled: Looks like you're confused about your wife's Social Security disability benefits, retirement benefits, spousal benefits, and survivor benefits. Here's what you need to know:

When your wife reaches her full retirement age (FRA) next year, her

current Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) benefit will automatically convert to become her regular SS retirement benefit at the same amount she was receiving on SSDI (disability). The amount stays the same because your wife's SSDI amount is based on her FRA entitlement.

Your wife cannot get any spousal benefits from you until you claim your own Social Security retirement benefit. Since you plan to delay claiming until you are 70 several years from now, after your wife's SSDI converts to become her regular retirement benefit at her FRA next year, she will continue to receive her own SS retirement benefit until you claim. At that point your wife will get a "spousal boost" added to her own SS retirement benefit. The amount of her spousal boost will be the difference between her FRA entitlement (same as her SSDI amount), and 50% of your FRA entitlement (not half of your age 70 amount spouse benefits are always calculated using FRA amounts, regardless of when Social Security is actually claimed).

until you start your Social Security, but after you claim she will receive her higher spousal benefit (her own SS retirement benefit plus a spousal boost) for the rest of her life, or until you predecease her. If you

die first, your wife will get

100% of the amount you

spousal benefit from you

were receiving at your death (e.g., your age 70 amount), instead of the smaller amount she was receiving as your spouse while you are both living.

Regarding COLA, after becoming eligible for benefits, everyone gets the annually awarded COLA increase whether they are already collecting SS benefits or not. The next annual COLA increase will be added to your wife's SSDI at the end of this year and added to her SS retirement amount each year thereafter, and then to her higher amount as your spouse after you claim. And even though you are waiting until age 70 to claim, the annual COLA will still be added to your Primary Insurance Amount (PIA) each year, and you will receive that past COLA in your monthly payments after you later claim.

# What went wrong at EDD?

# An Investigation of its Managerial Meltdown

In theory, we humans practice politics as a pathway to governance – providing an array of laws, regulations and services to protect and otherwise enhance the lives of the governed.

In practice, politics often – too often – become all-consuming exercises that bear only the faintest relationship to governance. Case in point: the U.S. Congress.

An aspect of that disconnect is the eagerness of those in office to build their images by constantly offering up proposals for new laws, services and programs while ignoring whether earlier laws, services and programs that officialdom birthed are performing as promised.

Often they are not, but even when informed about the shortcomings of design and/or implementation, officials tend to minimize or brush aside the criticism, fearing that acknowledgement would be a sign of weakness. Management and oversight just don't have the political sex appeal of some shiny new notion that promises boundless benefits.

Examples of the syndrome abound, particularly in a state as large and diverse as California. The state's bullet train

project is certainly one. Billions of dollars have been consumed and various

structures have been built but the project has become a zombie, something that's neither alive nor dead.

Oroville Dam is another. It was poorly designed and shoddily constructed in the 1960s and those who managed it knew of its deficiencies, particularly spillways that couldn't handle Feather River flows from extraordinary storms.

But the interest groups that provided financial support for the dam in return for water were evidently not willing to spend the money necessary to make it safe.

Officialdom didn't make it a priority, even when safety issues were raised in 2005 during the dam's relicensing. In 2017, it came extremely close to a collapse that could have killed thousands of people.

There are many others but the poster child for governmental dysfunction has to be the Employment Development Department, which imploded during the COVID-19 pandemic as millions of Californians lost their jobs and needed unemployment insurance benefits.

EDD managed to simultaneously deny countless unemployed workers of the life-sustaining benefits to which they were entitled and parcel out countless billions of dollars in benefits to clever fraudsters.

A preview of EDD's dysfunctional tendencies was felt during the Great Recession a decade earlier and the state's watchdogs, the state auditor's office and the Legislature's budget analyst, issued timely warnings of potential disaster. But three governors and hundreds of legislators couldn't be bothered to fix them and

the result was cruel chaos.

In the aftermath of the near-catastrophe at the Oroville Dam, an exhaustive and damning analysis of what went wrong was commissioned. EDD deserves similar scrutiny.

After a year of painstaking research and interviews, CalMatters investigative reporter Lauren Hepler has written a four-part series that delves into what happened and why. She also catalogs the pain that EDD's managerial collapse imposed on people who needed unemployment insurance benefits when the state shut down their jobs.

"Once COVID hit," the series' foreword summarizes, "public records and interviews reveal that California's system was initially friendlier to scammers than to many real workers - and then the state got so aggressive that many workers struggled to prove their own identities. New financial reports requested by CalMatters show that amid the chaos, the EDD and its unemployment payment contractor Bank of America split a half a billion dollars in revenue, though the bank says it ultimately spent more to cover fraud losses. Another large EDD contractor, Deloitte, made more than a quarter of a billion dollars on tech contracts and emergency contracts to build systems that state reports say buckled during the pandemic."

Will it be fixed or will EDD melt down again when another recession hits?

Veterans Services is also responsible for administering the College Fee Waiver Program for Veterans' Dependents. This program is afforded to spouses, unmarried surviving spouses, and children of service-connected disabled or service related deceased veterans. Eligible dependents are not required to pay "mandatory system wide" tuition and fees while attending either a California community college, a campus of the California State University (Cal State) system, or a campus of the University of California (UC) system. This program not only provides eligible dependents with the incentive but also the opportunity to pursue their goals.
