



#### **RUDOLPH NOSES**

#### Ingredients

- Rolos 1 Bag
- Holiday M&M's 1 Bag
- Pretzels 1 Bag

#### Instructions

- Preheating oven to 170 degrees or the lowest setting on your particular oven.
- Meanwhile, unwrap Rolos and separate M&Ms.
- Cover a cookie sheet with a silpat or parchment paper and place pretzels in rows. Top each pretzel with a Rolo and bake for @ 4 minutes or until the Rolo is soft.
- Remove the warm pretzel/Rolos from cookie sheet to a room temperature surface. Push one red M&M (M side down) into each nose. Let your completed noses sit out until they have hardened.




#### **SANTA HAT BROWNIE BITES**

- 1- 8×8 pan of your favorite brownies, cooled (or store-bought)
- 16-20 small strawberries, cleaned and hulled
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, room temperature
- 8 ounces mascarpone cheese, room temperature
- 2-1/2 to 3 cups powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- pinch of salt

#### Instructions

- Use a small circular cookie cutter to cut the brownie bites
- Using a stand mixer or hand mixer (I used a hand mixer), beat the butter and mascarpone cheese until light and creamy, about 2 minutes. Add vanilla extract and salt. Add 2-1/2 cups of sugar, half a cup at a time and continue beating until smooth. Add more sugar, if needed, to reach desired consistency and sweetness.
- If you have disposable decorating bags and piping tips, put half of the frosting into the



- bag, zip the bag, and snip a tiny bit off of one corner.
- To assemble the Santa hat brownie bites, pipe a ring of vanilla buttercream on top of each brownie.
- Top the tip of the strawberry with a dot of buttercream (or mini marshmellow) to finish the Santa hat.

#### PIZZA CANDY CANE CRESCENT

(Food Network Kitchen)

#### **Ingredients**


- One 8-ounce tube refrigerated rolled crescent dough
- 1/3 cup prepared pizza sauce, plus more for dipping
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella
- 24 slices pepperoni
- 2 tablespoons sesame seeds
- 2 large fresh basil leaves

#### Instructions

- Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.
- Unroll the crescent dough and separate the triangles along the perforated lines.
- Cut the triangles in half lengthwise so that you have 16
- Overlap 2 pieces of parchment to make a 24-inch-long piece.
- Arrange the crescent triangles lengthwise in a long row on top of the parchment, with the pointy ends upright and the flat ends



- overlapping just slightly (the row should be as long as the parchment paper). Gently press the overlapping pieces of dough together so to seal.
- Spread the pizza sauce over the thickest part of the strip of dough (about 1 1/2-inches). Sprinkle the cheese over the sauce and top with a layer of
- Fold the pointy ends of the dough over top of the pepperoni tucking them under the dough to enclose the filling. Gently curve the top end of the dough to the left to make a candy cane shape that is the length of the back of a baking sheet.
- Transfer the parchment onto the back of a baking
- Sprinkle the sesame seeds on top of the dough.
- Bake until the dough is golden brown and the cheese is melted, 8 to 10 minutes.
- Tuck the basil leaves into the candy cane to make a bow. Serve with more sauce for dipping.
