## **New Grocery Store Construction Begins**



The grocery store set to occupy this space has not been named publicly yet.

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - Interior construction has started in a prominent commercial suite space at the Sunrise Village shopping center on the northwest corner of Sunrise Boulevard and Madison Avenue, where an unnamed grocery tenant is slated to open in the space.

The general contractor, W.L. Butler, headquartered in Redwood City, has fenced off a substantial portion of the parking lot, setting up temporary mobile offices and equipment at the job site, which is to the left of Jo-Ann Fabric and Crafts.

W.L. Butler, with additional office locations in Livermore, Stockton and Irvine, specializes in the construction of commercial mixed-use, retail and grocery projects throughout California.

Marisa Brown, Citrus Heights communication spokeswoman, responded on behalf of the city building department.

"5425 Sunrise Boulevard in Sunrise

Village has numerous permits for various construction to prepare for the tenant improvements specific to the grocery store," Brown said.

"The (primary) tenant improvement permit has not been issued yet but we anticipate it will be issued in the next few weeks," she added.

W.L. Butler is sharing a large portion of the parking lot space in the Sunrise Village Shopping Center with Moorefield Construction, a family-owned general contractor, with offices in Sacramento and Santa Ana, which is building out Club Studio, a new 36,152-square-foot fitness club scheduled to open this summer.

Moorefield Construction has completed the gutting and reconstruction of all the existing commercial spaces with the exception of the closed Rite Aid drug store within the Sunrise Village Shopping Center and built out new space for the two new anchor tenants, City Sport and the retail grocery store under construction.

A W.L. Butler on-site construction superintendent confirmed that

interior work has started at the Sunrise Village Shopping Center job site but referred further comment to its corporate office, which did not respond to either an email or phone request by press time.

The tenant is listed as "grocer coming soon" in online marketing information by the property owner MerloneGeier Partners of San Francisco. Sunrise Marketplace executive director Kathilynn Carpenter confirmed in an earlier email that the name of the grocer planning to open has not yet been released.

Redevelopment of the 150,000-square-foot Sunrise Village shopping center has been ongoing since the first quarter of 2021.

Sunrise Village Plaza at the corner of Madison Avenue and Sunrise Boulevard in Citrus Heights is owned by the San Francisco-based Merlone-Geier investment company. The center is undergoing a \$15 to \$20 million remodeling and expansion project, which also includes new landscaping and upgraded signage. ★

### **Lawsuit Against** San Juan Water Alleges Illegal **Rate Increases**

- On April 10, the Citrus Heights Water District (CHWD) and the Fair Oaks Water District (FOWD) jointly filed a lawsuit against the San Juan Water District (SJWD) to challenge what they said was an unlawful plan for annual rate increases over the next five years.

In a joint press release by the Citrus Heights Water District and the Fair Oaks Water District on April 11, the two districts stated that the lawsuit was a "last resort" but necessary to protect their rate payers from being illegally overcharged.

"SJWD approved unfair rates that also make it more expensive to use local water supplies that we've already invested in," said Fair Oaks Water District Board President Chris Petersen.

Said Citrus Heights Water District Board President Caryl Sheehan, "We are committed to making sure our customers pay their fair share and no more. Local residents, business owners and our districts pleaded with the SJWD Board to work with us but they simply approved the rates over our opposition."

The San Juan Water District Board of Directors passed a motion in December 2023 to raise their wholesale rates by 5% for 2024, 2025, and 2026, and then by 4% in 2027 and 2028, for a total 23% increase over five years. The increase passed 4-1, with only director Pam Tobin dissenting.

In an April 12 press release, the San Juan Water District described it as a "nuisance lawsuit." San Juan Water District Board of Directors President Manuel Zamorano said the rate increases "are fair, reasonable, responsible and meet all legal requirements."

San Juan Water District's position is that the fiveyear plan for annual increases was based on the need to address inflation while covering operating and maintenance needs, planning for future capital investment projects, and repaying a \$24 million State Revolving Fund loan.

"This litigation is completely unnecessary and misguided, and we anticipate that the Superior Court will rule in our favor," Zamorano said. "The fact is, San Juan



Last month, the Board of Supervisors heard a presentation about broken families and the struggles of our region's most vulnerable children. The numbers were startling, and the stories were heartbreaking.

We heard about the impact of families suffering from economic stress and children pushed into courts that could result in removal from their families. We also heard about a grant for a pilot program that purports to help - one that other jurisdictions claimed was reducing incidents of children being pushed into the family court system.

I joined my colleagues in supporting this pilot project. But upon reflection, I shouldn't have.

I so was focused on the numbers, the needs of these families, and the struggles of the children - as well as the grant dollars from the state for a pilot project that wouldn't cost county taxpayers or reduce other services we provide that I didn't take the time to consider the broader issues.

building blocks of our society - and I will always step up to strengthen families and support parents. However, I should have looked deeper and realized that this pilot program isn't really the best way to help families and the data presented didn't tell the whole story. Even though my vote wouldn't have changed the outcome, I should have voted "no."

I made a mistake - and I have to own that.

After looking more closely at the pilot program, I'm concerned that it sets a precedent that could be used to justify a wider use allocation of public resources based on racial preferences. In fact, the pilot project itself violates the California Constitution - which prohibits the state from granting privileges or immunities to a citizen or class of citizens that are not granted to the same terms to all citizens. (See California Constitution, Declaration of Rights, Article 1, Section 7B).

I'm also concerned that throwing money at a problem - even though it isn't county tax dollars - without addressing the deeper issues plaguing so many families isn't going to make things better.

Instead of throwing money at the problem, we should be focused on supporting parents. And instead of dividing people by race, we should be celebrating our shared commitment to our families. The pilot project isn't a panacea - it has insufficient restrictions and not enough accountability and doesn't address the underlying causes of family crises.

The challenges families face in these often conflicting times, the incidents of abuse, and the growing number of children struggling with school or getting into trouble won't disappear with a \$750 check. And doling out those dollars based on race, rather than need, perpetuates divisions in our society.

I know it's not politically expedient to admit you made a mistake, and there was little media attention, so I could have just remained quiet and few people would have noticed. But I think you deserve to know the truth - not just when it's convenient, but also when I mess up.

## Lawsuit Against San Juan Water Alleges Illegal Rate Increases

provides the best water in the state at the lowest rates going, and this litigation will be a waste of ratepayer dollars."

In addition to Citrus Heights Water District and the Fair Oaks Water District, the other wholesale customers are Orange Vale Water Company and a portion of the City of Folsom, as well as San Juan Retail, which is part of the San Juan Water District and supplies more than 10,000 retail customers, mostly in the Granite Bay area.

California Proposition 26 states that agencies cannot charge more for services than what it reasonably costs to provide those services. But the court filing alleges that San Juan Water District is using increased wholesale rates to offset costs for their retail customers: "San Juan-Retail customers have the highest water use per customer in the Sacramento Region and one of the highest water use per customer in the State. The administrative costs of managing and responding to 10,675 customers are far greater than the administrative costs of managing and responding to 4 customers. Nonetheless, in certain contexts, San

Juan has allocated a shocking 85% of these costs to its wholesale arm, and only 15% to its retail arm."

Both the Citrus Heights Water District and the Fair Oaks Water District have their own wells to access groundwater but they do not have enough to supply all their customers, so their only option is to purchase surface water from San Juan Water District. The two districts state that San Juan Water District effectively operates as a monopoly and is abusing that position to illegally institute dramatic rate increases.

Because the new wholesale rates are flat fees charged quarterly, rather than a variable rate depending on each district's usage, "local water agencies are disincentivized to conserve or use local, reliable groundwater," as stated in the joint press release. "This appears to conflict with State policy or decades-long efforts to build regional water supply resiliency. The current rate plan could make the region more vulnerable to water shortages and keep rates artificially high for CHWD and FOWD customers."

San Juan Water District's response to the complaint is due to the court by May 27. ★

## Bera Votes for Series of Bipartisan Bills to Support Ukraine and Israel

- On April 20, U.S. Representative Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-06) released the following statement after voting for a series of bipartisan security supplemental bills which provide critical security assistance to Ukraine and Israel, bolster security and stability in the Indo-Pacific, and deliver essential humanitarian aid to civilians in Gaza:

"I am proud to vote to advance these critical pieces of bipartisan legislation to ensure that America rises to meet this important moment in history.

"As a senior Democrat serving on the House Foreign Affairs Committee and the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, I am keenly aware of the numerous national security challenges facing our nation and our allies and partners.

"The Ukrainian people continue to wage a valiant fight against Vladimir Putin's unprovoked and illegal invasion. Now in its third year, Ukraine is in dire need of assistance to replenish defense stockpiles and give brave Ukrainian soldiers the support they need to win their battle for freedom and democracy. While long overdue, this bill provides urgently needed support to aid Ukraine in defending its homeland and countering Russian aggression.

"Last weekend's unprecedented drone and missile attack by Iran on Israel underscored the strength of Israel's defense capabilities. This legislation replenishes Israel's Iron Dome and David's Sling missile defense systems and provides other critical security assistance to further strengthen the security of Israel and its people. I remain supportive of the Biden administration's efforts to restore stability and avoid further escalation in the region.

"In December, I introduced H. Res. 935 alongside Rep. Andy Kim (NJ-03), urging the Biden administration to

help facilitate the scaling up of safe, timely, and sufficient delivery of humanitarian aid to civilians in the Gaza Strip. As the humanitarian situation in the Gaza Strip continues to unfold amid ongoing conflict and instability, it is critical that we provide essential supplies including food, clean water, and medication. This bill provides additional funding to ensure humanitarian aid reaches civilians in Gaza, Haiti, and Sudan.

"As Ranking Member of the House Foreign Affairs Indo-Pacific Subcommittee, I am committed to maintaining peace, stability, and prosperity in the Indo-Pacific. This bill provides funding to strengthen the security of our partners in this vital region.

"As a small minority of extreme Members try to stifle progress, I am proud to stand with a strong bipartisan majority that believes that America must continue to lead the free world in efforts to end the war in Europe, contain the conflict in the Middle East, and prevent a war in Asia. I call on my Senate colleagues to promptly pass these critical pieces of legislation and send them to President Biden's desk for signature."







## The Pantless Chaplain



Whenever I meet fellow veterans, we'll often engage in some good-natured ribbing. I set up the first joke by announcing that I'm an Air Force vet, which inevitably invokes the response, "Oh, you mean you're a 'Chair Force' vet."

I understand that nickname because Air Force members occupy a lot of chairs doing heavily technical work in places like the Space Force and Cyber Command.

I first met those seat-techies in 1994 while on my first active-duty assignment at Onizuka Air Force Station in Sunnyvale,

Declassified that same year, Onizuka was dubbed the "Blue Cube" because of its shape, color and lack of windows. Outside the cube, sat three parabolic dish antennas that the chair jockeys in blue jumpsuits used for "flying" military satellites.

A few miles away, I sat in a chair in our chapel offices on Moffett Field, a Navy base acquired by the Air Force that same year. My workday often included planning worship, counseling and meeting with

In these days before 9/11, chaplains, like most military officers, wore a simple uniform of sky-blue shirt anddark-blue Poly/ Wool pants that resemble blue Dockers. We called the ensemble our "Blues." Add the rank, name tag and a Protestant cross, and I became an instant chaplain.

It was the same uniform I'd worn for monthly weekend duty as a USAF Reservist, so I quickly mastered the routine for daily wear. We had no one inspecting us for proper haircuts, uniforms or shoe shining. We were all friends and "trusted professionals."

With a 7:30 a.m. daily start, I'd often suit up in my darkened bedroom on summer mornings, leaving the exhausted mother of our four children asleep.

Early one morning I decided to bypass office work to make a few visits around the cube. I walked through classified work areas introducing myself and giving an encouraging word. I returned to the office before lunch with a feeling that I had done some good chaplain-type work.

"Good," that is until I was greeted by Janet, our chapel manager and Non-Commissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC).

Janet was a law-and-order manager, good with regulations and policies. She had a sharp eye for detail that helped her chaplains stay sharp too.

I knew something was up when she asked, "What are you wearing today, Chaplain?" Her question sent me inspecting my shirt

for uneaten breakfast.

"Look farther down," she said.

Forget the friendly "Chair Force." I was beginning to feel like a recruit standing before his drill instructor.

Finally, unable to hold her snicker, she said, "Those can't be your uniform pants."

"Why?" I asked, still staring at my wellcreased blue pants.

"They look more like Levi Dockers® than official Air Force Blues." Suddenly I was the picture of patrio-

tism – a red face on a white man wearing blue pants. She was right. In my haste to dress in

my darkened room, I'd donned my Levi's Ultimate Chino Straight Fitinstead of my Air Force Poly/Wool pants. There's no telling how many airmen on

my morning rounds noticed Dockers on their new chaplain. But just like the people in Hans Christian Andersen's fable, "The Emperor's New Clothes," they'd said nothing.

But the sergeant, like the little boy of the story, was the only one brave enough to call out her proud chaplain for his "nakedness."

I tried minimizing my mistake with the adage, "No one's perfect. We all put our pants on one leg at a time." "Still," she said, "Perhaps chaplains

ought to heed the Jesus protocol and 'Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Matthew 5:48). But, but..." I stammered as she reloaded.

"And I think even Jesus might tell you that perfection begins with first choosing the right pants."

And with that, I returned home to change pants. Obviously, my argument no longer had a leg to stand on.

## **Social Security Matters** Older Husband and Working Wife Seek Guidance

The earnings limit for

Dear Rusty: I am 74 years old, retired and receiving Social Security. My wife will be 65 in January of 2025. Our hope was to start paying off some credit card expense by her receiving SS when she turns 65, however it appears there would be a substantial reduction to her benefits. Her work income is \$37,500 a vear, and she wasn't planning on retiring from work at age 65. Because I am 11 years older, we felt it makes sense to use her Social Security as a means to lower our debt. We have \$27,000 in credit card debt, and I don't really want to use my 401(k) funds due to taxes. We pretty much live on my Social Security and pension. Signed: Seeking Suggestions

Dear Seeking: Your wife's full retirement age (FRA) for Social Security purposes is age 67. Because she will not yet have reached her FRA in January 2025 (when she is 65), if she claims SS to start at that time, not only will her monthly amount be reduced, but she will be subject to Social Security's annual earnings test. The earnings test sets a limit for how much can be earned by beneficiaries who claim SS before FRA.

2024 is \$22,320. The limit for next year is not yet published (it's based on changes to the national wage index) but will be a bit higher likely about \$23,500. Thus, I can't provide the exact impact, but if your wife's 2025 earnings exceed next year's limit, Social Security will take back \$1 in benefits for every \$2 over the limit (half of the amount over the limit). So, if your wife earns \$37,500 per year, that will likely be about \$14,000 over the limit and Social Security will take back half of that (\$7,000). They "take back" by withholding future benefits, or you can repay them in a lump sum. So, you will have a choice – repay Social Security from your other assets, or they will withhold your wife's SS benefits for the number of months needed to offset her penalty for exceeding the earnings limit. The number of months they will withhold depends on how much is owed and what your wife's monthly SS benefit is. For example, if your wife's age-65 SS benefit is about average (\$1,900) and her penalty for exceeding the limit is \$7,000, Social Security would withhold your wife's benefit for 4 months to recover the penalty, but she would receive her full bene-

of the year. Unless your wife tells them in advance that she will exceed the limit, Social Security will find out the following year (after you file your income taxes). But, in any case, your wife cannot avoid the annual earnings test

fit for the remaining 8 months

for working before reaching her full retirement age. The earnings test goes away when your wife reaches her FRA of 67. Until that time, if she continues working she will have a choice to have her benefits withheld for a portion of the year, or simply repay Social Security in a lump sum (in which case her benefits would continue uninterrupted).

FYI, there is a silver lining in this, because if your wife has benefits withheld because she exceeds the earnings limit before her FRA, after she reaches her full retirement age Social Security will give her time credit for the months when benefits were withheld, which will result in her monthly Social Security payment amount increasing somewhat at her full retirement age. Thus, over time, your wife may recover the benefits which were withheld for exceeding the annual earnings limit. But to get 100% of the benefit she's earned from a lifetime of working, and be exempt from Social Security's earnings limit, she would need to wait until she reaches her FRA to claim.

**Imagination** 

Imagination is more important than knowledge. Imagination looks to the future. Knowledge is a result of the past. You know what you have already experienced. You imagine what you want to happen next.

The list of accomplishments that would never have happened without imagination is virtually endless. Modern medicine, automobiles, airplanes, electricity, radio, TV, computers, the internet, space travel, and telephones would never have become reality if the inventors of the world did not first imagine them as possible.

How active is your imagination? Do you think about how much is possible? Or do you restrict yourself by what you believe is impossible? If your imagination has been smothered, the good news is that you have the power to rekindle it.

A good first step is to stop listening to what other people feel is possible, practical, or realistic. Take a few minutes each day to imagine what you would like to be doing. Visualize your life being any way you want it.

Imagining what you want puts your brain to work trying to figure out a way to make it happen. Once an idea is put into your mind, it will spend 24 hours a day trying to bring the thoughts to

Just look at people who constantly imagine negative situations. Invariably these people experience exactly what they are imagining. It's easy to identify them. They advertise their imagination with statements such as "bad things always happen to me," "I never have any good luck," "I can't seem to make things work," "I can't do it," "it's not possible," or "I'm just not that successful."

Make sure you are not imagining outcomes you really don't want. If you are, immediately replace them with thoughts of what you actually do want. You have to be vigilant. It so easy to start imagining the wrong things.

Your imagination is the first step to creating the future you want. It's the mental blueprint your brain uses in directing your thoughts and actions. Since it's rare to accomplish more than you imagined, allow your imagination to soar to any destination you desire. The greater your imagination, the greater

## **Business Groups and Lawmakers Battle Over Ballot Measure to Limit Tax Increases**

Californians will be coughing up many billions of dollars this month as they file their federal and state income tax returns and pay the second installment on their property taxes.

How much?

Annually, individual Californians and Californiabased businesses pay roughly a half-trillion dollars in federal taxes – personal income taxes, Social Security and Medicare payroll taxes, primarily. They also pay at least another half-trillion dollars to state and local governments - personal income taxes, sales taxes and property taxes, primarily.

By any measure, California is a high-tax state.

The Tax Foundation, a Washington-based organization that tracks nationwide tax trends, recently reported that California's state government levies the nation's highest taxes per capita at \$7,200, which translates into about \$280 billion a year. As a portion of California's \$4 trillion economy, its \$540 billion in state and local taxes rank fifth highest at 13.5%.

These numbers – and the state's multibillion-dollar budget deficit – set the stage for a monumental, multifront war over taxation this year, including three statewide ballot measures that could dramatically alter the politics of taxation.

The Democratic Party's progressive wing, strongly backed by public employee unions, contends that new taxes are needed to maintain vital welfare, education and health care services. However, Gov. Gavin Newsom has publicly rejected tax hikes and proposes a budget that closes the deficit, at least on paper, with spending deferrals, bookkeeping maneuvers, loans and an injection of money from the state's rainy day reserves.

Two years ago, California's two most authoritative polling organizations, UC Berkeley's Institute of Governmental Studies and the Public Policy Institute of California, asked residents about their tax burdens and both found increasing discontent, in part because they were feeling the pinch of other costs of living.

The polling punctuated voters' rejection of a tax increase measure on the 2020 ballot that would have changed Proposition 13, the iconic property tax limit approved by voters in 1978, by increasing taxes on commercial property.

Hoping to leverage popular resistance to tax increases, business and anti-tax groups led by the California Business Roundtable have qualified a measure for the November ballot that would make raising state and local taxes much more difficult.

If passed, the measure would require two-thirds votes for any local tax increases, effectively overturning a state Supreme Court ruling that local taxes proposed via initiative require only simple majority votes. It also would subject any state tax increases to voter approval as well as two-thirds votes by the Legislature.

The measure's qualification has touched off a legal and political war with Newsom, the Legislature and pro-tax interests, such as unions. Newsom and the Legislature have filed suit, hoping to persuade the state Supreme Court that the measure is a constitutional revision, rather than an amendment, and thereby cannot be enacted by initiative.

The contending interests have filed written arguments with the court, which has not formally decided whether to accept the case. If it does, it will have only a few months to declare whether or not the measure goes on the ballot.

The Legislature has also placed its own measure on the ballot that, if passed, would require the business tax limit measure itself to get twothirds voter approval. And it passed another ballot measure to reduce vote margin for local tax and bond measures that increase spending on housing and infrastructure to 55% from the current two-thirds, potentially nullifying the Business Roundtable measure.

It's a showdown that's been building for nearly five decades, ever since Prop. 13 won approval. With countless billions of dollars at stake, hundreds of millions of dollars are likely to be spent for and against the three interrelated measures.








## Media Icon Joey Mitchell Leaves a Legacy of Laughter

After 50 plus years on the air, an icon in radio signs off for his final journey. But I'm sure if there is a microphone in the clouds, Joey Mitchell will be at the helm with his joyous voice that always made his fans feel that he truly cared about each and every one.

What can I say about Joey that hasn't already been said... talented, dedicated, award-winning personality, a great sense of humor, total love of family and what meant so much to me was that he was genuinely a really nice guy and gentleman. He greeted everyone he met with a big smile and you felt he knew you forever.

Joey was the first on-air radio guy I worked with when I first came to Sacramento in 1977. It was at the hit country music station, KRAK Radio. I would pop in with the news updates, and truly, I never knew what to expect. There were times I would go into the studio and no Joey...until he popped up from under the board trying to scare me with that silly grin on his face. But it was always in fun. He would try to break me up on the air but little did he know I came from doing a television show in Indianapolis with a crew that did all they could to break me up with antics behind the guests so only I could see. But I loved the friendship Joey shared with everyone, including me, for all these many years.

I think I admired Joey most for his caring about the community, especially when we would host telethons to raise money for so many worthy charities from Easter Seals to the Children's Miracle Network and more. Back in the '80s, there were eight or nine telethons on the air and they were the 24-hour ones. But Joey's energy level never waned. Always professional yes, but with a fun competitive spirit as we would compete for on-camera time, with the ultimate goal of raising as much money as we could for charity. Joey was always game for fun too, like when we were asked to host an event for, I believe, the Opera Association. So we dressed in silly opera garb, and we laughed our way through the event, always ready for anything we could do to help the community.

Stories about Joey were so many I had to limit them, or I would need several pages to tell them all. But I had to share this one from Ken Knoll who did lots of film work in Sacramento. When Joev was named Country Music D.J. of the year and hosted names such as Freddy Fender, Loretta Lynn and Merle Haggard at the Lonesome Armadillo in Roseville, he would do TV funny skits to promote his show. Ken still laughs at this one. Wait until you hear what happened. Ken and Joey came up with the idea to do a skit at the Folsom Zoo in the tiger cage, and yes, with a real tiger. The idea was for Joey to first dress up in lady garb, moustache, and all, and pretend that the tiger was going to attack her/ him. Then Joey would change back into guy clothes, and with the magic of television editing, come to her rescue. Funny, right? The trainer assured Joey that the tiger was tame and not to worry. To be honest, Joey

was rather nervous and began sweating some. But being the trooper he was, Joey got into the enclosure. Ken was not sure but perhaps the tiger sensed Joey's fear and began to growl and started to get too close for comfort. It was too close for Joey and he began to shout "please get me out of here." But it was hard to hear him above the laughter of the crew. Suffice to say, Joey was not going into a

wild critter space alone for a long time.

Here's one that will give you a laugh but I'm not sure Joey laughed. Ken told me about the time President Clinton came to town on Air Force One, and we don't know how Joey did it but he planted a bumper sticker on the back of Air Force One promoting the Joey Mitchell Show. Sounds funny now but the Secret Service was not amused, and

he actually got arrested. Don't know if he had to spend time in the pokey but leave it to Joey to come up with this stunt and look for more to do.

Another side of Joey was always wanting to help others in the business. Jennifer Steele, executive producer of the morning news at KFBK, had fond memories of him. She worked years and knew him more than Joey's family.

30 years. Despite his being a celebrity, she said, he was always a real human being, a mentor, teacher and nice to all.

And Big Jim Hall worked with Joey at KRAK Radio for many years. That's where I met them both. Jim and Joey both began working at KRAK Radio together. One did the morning, and one did the afternoon, and their friendship grew over the many years. Jim said he was always fearless and always wanted to support organizations to help the community. Fondly, Jim said, Joey was an incredible co-worker and friend for 40 years, along with having a caring heart and always being super funny. Jim said he was a joy to work with and to know.

There are many stories to tell and perhaps some of the pictures can tell the Joey Mitchell life and his work, but I asked his son, Joe Jr., who sent me so many wonderful pictures to choose of his dad, if he could tell me his fondest memories of "Dad" Joey. I could not end this piece any better. Here is Joe Jr and his heartfelt thoughts about his dad in his own words.

"My dad was just my dad to me, and I never really appreciated all he had accomplished until I grew older. Many people didn't know he had severe and painful scoliosis that would keep him up nights. Getting up at 3 a.m. was a chore for anyone, but for him, it was a daily struggle to get ready for his radio show. Even though he was in pain, he always had a smile on his face and wanted to make people laugh. It wasn't an act, it was who he was. He truly was an amazing man, husband, father, friend and radio legend who will leave a huge void in our hearts. I strive to be like him. He was my HERO!"

What more can be said about this icon and truly good human being?

And so the memory of Joey Mitchell goes on and I'm sure he is wowing them up there behind the mic with his wit and big smile. We will miss you Joey, but our memories will always be with us. Rest in peace, good friend.
