USIBWC SELECTS 11 CITIZENS FORUM BOARD MEMBERS TO SERVE 2-YEAR TERM

Commissioner Edward Drusina of the United States Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission (USIBWC) has appointed 11 citizens to serve on the USIBWC Citizens Forum Board. The purpose of the Citizens Forum is to promote the exchange of information between the USIBWC and the community about Commission projects and related activities in San Diego County, California. The first public meeting with the new board will take place on **Thursday, March 1, 5:30 – 7:30 p.m. at the Tijuana Estuary, 301 Caspian Way, Imperial Beach, CA.**

USIBWC Area Operations Manager Carlos Peña will serve as the USIBWC representative on the board. Board members serve as volunteers for a two-year term.

At the March 1 meeting, Scott Shin, Project Executive, Design and Construction Division, General Services Administration, will discuss the progress of the ongoing construction work at the San Ysidro Port of Entry to accommodate the growth of vehicle and pedestrian traffic and meet the changing needs of Customs and Border Protection (CBP). Once completed, the new port will boast 62 northbound vehicle primary inspection booths over 34 lanes and 10 new southbound vehicle lanes to the new El Chaparral, Mexico facility. Moreover, the new northbound pedestrian building will have 22 new pedestrian processing lanes, in addition to 12 northbound pedestrian lanes in the West Pedestrian building completed in 2016.

The Citizens Forum will also hear from USIBWC Area Operations Manager Carlos Peña, who will give a status report on a Commission agreement known as Minute No. 320, “General Framework for Binational Cooperation on Transboundary Issues in the Tijuana River Basin,” which enables priority issues of sediment, trash, and water quality in the river basin to be addressed cooperatively. The agreement benefits residents of both countries through sustainable management of transboundary resources. By removing trash and taking actions aimed at eliminating sediment transport into the Tijuana River channel, the goal is to achieve this sustainability. Mr. Peña will also discuss the full range of Commission projects in the San Diego-Tijuana region, including the South Bay International Wastewater Treatment Plant and the Tijuana River Flood Control Project.

The USIBWC will welcome the 11 newly-appointed Citizens Forum Board members who will be provided an orientation regarding the board’s role over the next two-year term by USIBWC Public Affairs Officer Lori Kuczanski.
