Job Summary

The Bilingual Education Instructor will be primarily responsible for translation of program materials and instruction of both onsite and offsite public events teaching about human impact on watersheds in both English and Spanish. Programs will happen primarily in spring and summer season with heavier program days on weekends. This position will also be assigned general education programs as needed. Programs include, but are not limited to: day camps, scout programs, overnight adventures, outreaches, and onsite school group field trips. This is a year-round, hourly, non-benefited position. This position reports directly to the Director of Education.
