We had a great time at Wolf Ridge and the students learned many interesting things. All the staff was pleased with how well the students behaved. Overall students enjoyed the trip, had some fun, and did some learning along the way, making the trip a success in my book! With Wolf Ridge done, we are now in the process of wrapping up the school year. Some last bits of review in math and working on finishing our class read aloud book, *Insignificant Events in the Life of a Cactus*.

The 4/5 classroom had a visit from Cook County to discuss invasive species on Tuesday. Students learned about how invasive species can impact native species, how they spread, and what areas are the most impacted. County staff even brought some preserved samples of water born invasive species, for students to take a look at. We appreciated the presentation.
