Dinosaurs of the Sahara exhibit now open at Science Center

Great Lakes Science Center will take guests back to the prehistoric era with Dinosaurs of the Sahara, a whole new dinosaur experience, making its world debut here from May 26 through September 4.

Created by Dr. Paul Sereno and the team at the University of Chicago's Fossil Lab, Dinosaurs of the Sahara brings the unique world of African dinosaurs to life with original fossils from the Sahara, one-ofa-kind mounted skeletons and flesh models, and a show-stopping giant 32-foot rearing long-necked Jobaria skeleton!

Guests will get to touch real fossils, including a SuperCroc skull, and relive the excitement and adventure of Dr. Sereno's recent ground-breaking Saharan expeditions with real footage from the field and an interactive dinosaur dig site. Get an up-close look at Africa's greatest predators, including spinosaurs and Africa's T-rex-sized predator, Carcharodontosaurus. Meet some of the most bizarre plant eating dinosaurs imaginable,



like Nigersaurus, nicknamed the Mesozoic cow, and see where and how these amazing creatures were discovered.

Look overhead at a pterosaur with a 12-foot wingspan and see mounted skeletons of the prehistoric predators Afrovenator and Suchomimus and skulls of other favorites like Spinosaurus and Rugops.

Since the early '90s, Sereno and his team have excavated more than 100 tons of fossils, bringing to light a menagerie of new species, many of which will be on exhibit.

Dinosaurs of the Sahara is included with general admission.







Dog bite prevention for kids

Warmer weather is on its way and that means more outdoor activities. It also means more dog bites. As we spend more time outside, we increase our chances of being bitten by a dog. Just how serious is the problem? The Center for Disease Control (CDC) estimates 4.5 million people are bitten by dogs each year and the majority of them are children. One in five of those bites require medical attention.

Who's at risk?

Children are most at risk for a bite, especially those between the ages of 5 and 9. Adult males, the elderly, home service providers such as mail carriers, and those who have a dog in their household are also at increased risk.

How can dog bites be prevented?

Dog bites are a largely preventable public health problem, and adults and children can learn to reduce their chances of being bitten.

Before you bring a dog into your household:

- Consult with a professional (e.g., veterinarian, animal behaviorist, or responsible breeder) to learn what breeds of dogs are the best fit for your household.
- Dogs with histories of aggression are not suitable for households with children.
- Be sensitive to cues that a child is fearful or apprehensive about a dog. If a child seems frightened by dogs, wait before bringing a dog

into your household.

 Spend time with a dog before buying or adopting it. Use caution when bringing a dog into a household with an infant or toddler.

If you decide to bring a dog into your home:

- Spay/neuter your dog (this often reduces aggressive tendencies).
- Never leave infants or young children alone with a dog.
- Don't play aggressive games with your dog (e.g., wrestling).
- Properly socialize and train any dog entering your household. Teach the dog submissive behaviors (e.g., rolling over to expose the abdomen and give up food without growling).
- Immediately seek professional advice (e.g., from veterinarians, animal behaviorists, or responsible breeders) if the dog develops aggressive or undesirable behaviors.

How can I protect my children?

To help prevent children from being bitten by dogs, teach the following basic safety tips and review them regularly:

- Do not approach an unfamiliar dog.
- Do not run from a dog or scream.
- Remain motionless (e.g., "be still like a tree") when approached by an unfamiliar dog.
- If knocked over by a dog, roll into a ball and



lie still (e.g., "be still like a log").

- Do not play with a dog unless supervised by an adult.
- Immediately report stray dogs or dogs displaying unusual behavior to an adult.
- Avoid direct eye contact with a dog.
- Do not disturb a dog that is sleeping, eating, or caring for puppies.
- Do not pet a dog without allowing it to see and sniff you first.
- If bitten, immediately report the bite to an adult.

Mentor native creates children's book on climate change

A Mentor native and new Bowling Green State University business graduate is using the skills she learned at the university to help children understand the important role they can play in preserving the planet.

Jade Rush (class of 2023) wants children to understand at a young age that they can make a difference through small actions. So, she followed her own advice and wrote a book — creating public good through education and activism.

The sustainably made book, "Evelyn the Environmentalist Takes on Climate Change," introduces young readers to current environmental issues and teaches them how to make a difference.

"Children are our future," Rush said. "My goal is to educate children in an entertaining way so they can learn about some of the things happening around them and know that even though they're young, they can still make a change and impact the planet."

Rush, who majored in marketing with minors in entrepreneurship and environmental science, debuted her book and publishing company in 2022 at The Hatch, a semester-long immersive program in the BGSU Schmidthorst College of Business that culminates with students presenting their business ideas to alumni investors in a format similar to the popular television show "Shark Tank."

"The Hatch was such a great experience," she said. "I'm so grateful to have been a part of it. It



strengthened my confidence and helped me navigate many of the processes involved in continuing this book-writing and publishing venture."

Ryan Holley, an assistant teaching professor in the Schmidthorst College of Business, said he saw from the start how motivated Rush is to succeed.

"I remember Jade being ambitious, mission-driven and thirsty for personal and professional development when I first met her during her freshman year, and that certainly hasn't changed," he said. "She went full beast mode during her time in The Hatch program and has continued hustling and campaigning for her much-deserved success with her book. It's been a privilege to watch Jade soar."

Rush received funding during The Hatch to create a website for her publishing company,

Green Adventures Publishing, LLC., which she established to ensure the book is a model for sustainability. She also raised more than \$14,000 through a Kickstarter campaign to fund printing and distribution costs.

"I wanted to make sure that everything was being done in the most environmentally friendly way possible, and it seemed self-publishing was the only way to guarantee that," Rush said.

"Evelyn the Environmentalist Takes on Climate Change" is made from 100% recycled unbleached post-consumer paper and uses plant-based inks.

It's only available in paperback, which uses fewer materials than a hardback book. Rush also added an interactive piece by including a wildflower seed page at the back of the book.


"Children can tear the page out of their book and plant it in their backyard or a pot," she said. "They can watch as the flowers grow and see how it helps the bees and other insects in the ecosystems around them.

"The flowers will grow back every year, meaning children can see how their one action has made a lasting impact."

Rush wrote the second book in her series of three during an English class at the university focused on the theory and practice of picture books, which she took the semester following The Hatch. She expects that book, "A Recipe to Recycle," to be available in mid to late fall 2024.

H2O-to-Go Bus to provide free drinking water at local events

The Lake County Department of Utilities (LCDU) and Laketran recently collaborated in a joint effort to transform a previously retired transit bus into a mobile water dispenser.

The idea first took shape roughly one year ago when Laketran retired one of its Dial-A-Ride buses from standard use based upon a federally regulated maintenance schedule. Rather than auctioning the bus, Laketran partnered with the LCDU in an effort to repurpose the vehicle. Although the concept might appear simple, transforming a bus originally designed to transport people into a bus designed to transport hundreds of gallons of water required significant redesign and re-engineering. Seating was removed and retrofitted to hold a 250-gallon commercial grade water tank, water cooling system, and water bottle filling dispenser. Work was done by LCDU staffers. After close to a year of planning and modifying, the H2Oto-Go bus was born.

This initiative is beneficial in sev-



eral ways: it provides free access to clean drinking water during public events, it reduces the need for single-use plastic bottles which typically make their way to the landfill, and it helps people stay hydrated.

Furthermore, when not being used for events, the H2O-to-Go bus will be used by the LCDU for emergency purposes when clean drinking water is needed at a disaster site. Along with evacuating residents to safe locations, and providing a mobile warming station with their buses, the LCDU can now transport fresh drinking water on-site for those in crisis or first responders.






