Teaming Up For Students

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - A nonprofit, PRIDE Industries and MealPro in Citrus Heights have teamed up to help provide disabled youth an opportunity to gain valuable culinary job skills they will need to enter a commercial kitchen, and quickly get to work.

The first three students completed their training last week and more are expected to enroll soon, said MealPro chief executive Officer and Chef San Catanio, founder and chief executive of the Culinary Staples Foundation (CSF) who taught the course at MealPro's Citrus Heights headquarters at 7749 Greenback Lane.

"We're especially proud of our first three course participants who have received their completion certificates," said Catanio.

The three students, Kobe, Isaac and Stephen, identified by first names, who recently completed the culinary staples training program that was taught by Catanio, received a thorough introduction to kitchen safety and the professional prep cooking skills needed to work in a fast-paced, modern commercial kitchen environment. The trio also earned their food handling certificates.

"Our goal is to help prepare our students with the confidence they'll need for entry-level restaurant positions in the local Sacramento region and to encourage their success." Catanio said.

PRIDE Industries and another nonprofit, On My Own Community Services, had made past presentations to the Citrus Heights Chamber of Commerce about their missions to help disabled workers obtain training and find meaningful work resonated with him, said MealPro founder and chief executive officer Andy Sartori.

"MealPro eagerly signed up to become an employer partner with PRIDE Industries, and we've since provided some internships to their participants," Sartori said.

"That's about when Chef Dan Catanio and I decided to create a specific program at MealPro to teach participants the basics of working in a commercial culinary environment," he said.

MealPro itself has doubled the size of its Citrus Heights operations, as Sartori bought the building which houses its corporate headquarters and its commercial kitchens.

Catanio is a well-known executive chef in the Sacramento region.

His non-profit Culinary Staples Foundation (CSF) is headquartered at MealPro in Citrus Heights. Catanio, also a past executive producer of the "Culinary Magic Cooking Show", has produced over 100, 30-minute cooking shows for a local community access cable channel.

In time, Catanio hopes to offer to the public a regular schedule of cooking classes in MealPro's Greenback Lane commercial kitchens.

"We've now opened this culinary arts training program to the community at no cost," Sartori said.

The recent two-week culinary training program for disabled youth in Sacramento and Placer counties was taught at MealPro's corporate headquarters in Citrus Heights, Sartori said.

While MealPro provides on-site culinary training, the staff at PRIDE Industries in Citrus Heights will help provide job placement opportunities to the three recent program graduates.

The three students, Kobe, Isaac and Stephen, took courses in the fundamentals of food safety, kitchen equipment and customer service as well as receiving hands-on experience.

Participants must either be currently enrolled in PRIDE Industries, or if they wish to participate in the culinary arts training program without enrollment in PRIDE, must complete a required interview and drug screening.

Catanio said all participants should demonstrate a willingness to learn and a desire to seek employment in the culinary industry with an availability to attend in-person training from Monday through Thursday from 9 am to 1 p.m. at MealPro's culinary center at 7433 Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights.

MealPro is focused on creating a custom approach to nutrition, the kind that helps athletes perform, and busy professionals stay healthy," Sartori said. "We want to make custom nutrition affordable and accessible to everyone – everywhere. And we believe our best work can make a sustainable, positive impact in people's lives." ORANGEVALE, CA (MPG) - Hannah Naten, nephrology nurse at DaVita Orangevale Dialysis Center, was recently honored with The DAISY Award® For Extraordinary Nurses during National Nurses Week. The award is part of the DAISY Foundation's programs to recognize the super-human efforts nurses perform every day.

DaVita leaders, fellow care team members and patients celebrated Naten for her continuous efforts to go above and beyond to care for her dialysis patients and support other DaVita teammates. 



CSL Plasma Opens in Citrus Heights

cITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - CSL Plasma at 7830 Macy Plaza across the street from Target and adjacent to the

Dollar Tree store has opened.

The new Citrus Heights center is CSL Plasma's sixth plasma donation center in California, according to Rhonda Sciarra, director of communications for CSL Plasma, headquartered in Boca Raton, Florida. The center, open 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesdays to Fridays, and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays, is closed on Sundays and Mondays.

Sciarra said the Citrus Heights center had hoped to open early in 2023, but the planned opening date was moved back due to state licensing processes which needed to be completed.

CSL Plasma is a division of CSL Behring, a global biotech leader headquartered in King of Prussia, Pennsylvania. The company operates more than 300 CSL Plasma collection centers across the U.S. and overseas, according to its website.

Priscilla Tabarez, assistant center manager, provided a tour of the new Citrus Heights facility which features 34 individual donor stations.

Front counter CSL staff help new donors through the initial registration process before they are led to an individual donation screening section for their privacy.

A flyer which is provided to new donors in the reception lobby provides useful before and after donation advice. Another describes the general method of new donor payment fees throughout the month of July.

For adequate hydration, prospective donors in good health should consume 2-3 quarts of non-alcoholic fluids per day, avoiding alcohol and caffeine as they may contribute to dehydration, according to CSL donation literature. To avoid lipemic plasma (plasma with a high fat content), prospective donors are also urged to stay away from high fat foods before donation.

New donors are recommended to eat a light meal or snack and drink extra fluids in

the 24 hours after they donate.

Plasma is a straw-colored liquid which carries red blood cells, white blood cells and platelets. In the donation process, red blood cells are returned to the body in saline infusion.

"The proteins, antibodies, clotting factors and other nutrients in it also make plasma useful in treating those suffering from trauma, shock, burns or other emergencies that could happen to any individual," said Dr. Rachpal Malhotra, executive director, CSL head of plasma donor safety in a Zoom interview.

Plasma collected at the Citrus Heights CSL facility is used by its parent company CSL Behring for the sole purpose of manufacturing lifesaving plasma-derived therapies for people in more than 100 countries.

"There's a critical need for plasma throughout the world," Malhotra said. "Plasma is used to produce many life-saving therapies that treat diseases such as primary immunodeficiency, hereditary angioedema, inherited respiratory disease, hemophilia and other bleeding or neurological disorders, just to name a few."

The donation process typically takes not more than 90 minutes. No advance donor appointment is required,

he said.

In early 2020, the 10,000-square foot CSL Plasma in Sunrise MarketPlace received an extensive refresh, with new added staff and donor parking spaces. The building, built in 2005, had been vacant since September 2019 when its former occupant Dimples Records closed.

Nearly 30 new full- and part-time jobs have been created at the Citrus Heights facility, Sciarra said. General staff includes medical reception and support technicians, phlebotomists, nurses (LVNs, LPNs and RNs) as well as operations and quality management personnel.

A mature CSL Plasma center, operating for about three years, has the potential to provide nearly 50 full-time jobs in a local market, she explained. Annually, CSL Plasma contributes nearly \$6 million per center in employee payroll and average donor compensation, much of which is spent locally, she said.

To donate at a CSL Plasma collection center, donors must be in good health, between the ages of 18-74, weigh at least 110 pounds, have no tattoos or piercings within the last 4 months, meet eligibility and screening requirements, and also have valid identification and a permanent address,

Sciarra said.

"CSL Plasma is proud to be a vital part of the communities where employees and plasma donors live and work," Sciarra said. "We're excited to continue our expansion on the West Coast and look forward to positively contributing to the greater Citrus Heights community as we have done throughout the

country."

CSL Plasma donors receive a payment as part of the donation process. At the conclusion of the donation, the payment is loaded directly onto a reloadable card and is immediately ready for use. While fees vary by location, eligible, qualified donors can receive up to \$500 their first month for their donation of life-saving plasma.

MicroGreens Delivered Fresh to Your Doorstep

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) -

Lil' Bits Microgreens, a new Citrus Heights small business local food startup farm is delivering four varieties of fresh, nutrient-dense microgreens to their customers' doorsteps.

Owners Brice and Lorena Baxter started their business in January 2023 by offering four varieties of nutrient-dense microgreens originally by referral through their friends and through social media.

Business has "grown" steadily with delivery to a customer base in Fair Oaks, Orangevale, Citrus Heights, Roseville, Folsom, Rocklin, Granite Bay, Rancho Cordova, and Gold River. The couple is now looking to reach out to attract the commercial market, marketing their microgreens to local restaurants and grocers in the area.

"Microgreens are the earliest stage of a vegetable plant's development, after the sprouting stage," Baxter said. "They are "living foods," and purposefully utilized in their most nutritious and delicious state where their nutrient content is more concentrated."

Product choices of 60g of broccoli, 100g of sunflower, 100g of peas and 75g of crunchy mix cost \$6 each and are delivered in individually sealable containers.





Former Correctional Sergeant Found Guilty of Perjury in Cover-Up of Assault of an Inmate

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On July 17, 2023, a jury found a former California state correctional officer guilty of perjury in connection with a federal grand jury investigation into a conspiracy to cover up an assault of an inmate, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced. Following a three-day trial, Brenda Villa, 32, of North Highlands, was found guilty of one count of perjury.

According to the court records and evidence presented at trial, Villa was a correctional sergeant supervising other officers at California State Prison – Sacramento (also known as New Folsom State Prison or CSP-Sacramento) when correctional officer Arturo Pacheco unlawfully assaulted an inmate under color of law. Following the assault and the inmate's death, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) initiated an internal investigation. As the CDCR internal investigation proceeded, a federal grand jury began investigating federal criminal charges in conjunction with the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the U.S.

Attorney's Office.

Villa was called to testify in front of the grand jury about her role and the actions of her fellow officers in covering up the unlawful assault. Villa lied under oath to the federal grand jury investigating the incident.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation with assistance from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. Assistant U.S. Attorneys Michael D. Anderson and Rosanne L. Rust are prosecuting the case.

Former correctional officers Arturo Pacheco and Ashley Aurich pleaded guilty and were sentenced to 12½ years and 21 months in prison, respectively.

Villa's sentencing will be scheduled in front of U.S. District Judge William B. Shubb at a future court hearing. The next hearing in the case is on Monday, July 24, 2023. Villa faces a maximum statutory penalty of five years in prison for perjury and a \$250,000 fine. The actual sentence, however, will be determined at the discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables.

"Public Safety is the #1 responsibility of government. It is and will continue to be my #1 priority," said Daniels. "We all have an absolute right to feel and be safe in our lives. Our kids should be able to play in parks without concern or harm. Our communities should not look like third-world countries with broken down RVs and garbage

everywhere." Daniels emphasized the need to bring a stronger approach to minimizing homelessness by focusing on giving people a hand up instead of a handout, increasing mental health services and housing facilities, and prosecuting those that commit lowlevel crimes. "We get what we tolerate," said Daniels, "For too long, the negative aspects of homelessness, especially blight, have been tolerated. That needs to change. In Citrus Heights, we show compassion by offering people resources for housing and services, but we also take a firm stance on not allowing blight or ignoring low-level crimes. It's not perfect but it's a lot better than most places."

Daniels said his Top Three Priorities will be Public Safety/Homelessness,

Transportation/Roads, and Taxes/Spending. "Nothing is more important than your safety and in today's world, that mostly centers around homelessness and our response to it. You should also be able

to drive down the street without hitting potholes big enough to chip your teeth," Daniels said, "We spend hundreds of millions of dollars on public transportation and other alternatives but nowhere near that on roads. That needs to change. And most importantly, we need to address these issues without asking for more dollars from hardworking families. I have successfully fought two efforts to raise taxes in Citrus Heights, I am a proud member of the Sacramento Taxpayer Association, and I pledge to oppose any effort to raise your taxes.'

Daniels lives in Citrus Heights with his wife Nichole and their 6-yearold daughter. He has three adult children including his daughter Stephanie who is an Instructional Aid at Coyle School in Carmichael, his son Chris who is a Youth Pastor at Lakeside Church in Folsom, and son Brock who is a Corporal in the United States Marine Corps at Camp Pendleton. He has lived nearly his entire life in the district since moving to Citrus Heights when he was 12 years old. He has four granddaughters. Daniels is the Founding Member and President of Toys for the Troops Kids, a non-profit organization that has collected and distributed over 150,000 toys to the kids of our military troops during Christmas over the past 20 years. He has served as a PTA President and Little League Coach, is a United States Air Force veteran, enjoyed a 20-year law enforcement career including patrolling the streets of nearly the entire district, and is now retired.

Two Fatal, Fentanyl Related Overdoses Reported in North Sacramento

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Friday, July 21, 2023, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office responded to two assist calls for service with the Sacramento Metro Fire Department in the northern part of Sacramento County. The first incident occurred at approximately 9:10 AM, where Sheriff's North Patrol Deputies responded near the 3600 block of Elkhorn Boulevard to assist with a 46-year-old male lying unresponsive behind a business. Fire personnel arrived on scene and conducted lifesaving measures; unfortunately, he was

pronounced deceased on scene.

The second incident occurred at approximately 1:15 PM, where Deputies responded to a location near the 7400 block of Watt Avenue to assist with a 16-year-old male juvenile lying unresponsive behind a dumpster. Fire personnel arrived on scene and again conducted lifesaving measures; unfortunately, he was also pronounced deceased on scene.

Both cases appear to be fentanyl overdoses. The Sacramento County Coroner's Office will determine the cause of death in both incidents and forward its findings as prescribed by law. They will also release the names of the deceased after notification has been made to his next of kin.

Social Security Matters

I'm a Veteran. How Do I Get My Extra Social Security?

Dear Rusty: As a military veteran, I was told that the final amount of my Social Security should be a little higher as a reward for military service. If so, I have two questions: 1. How much is the boost? 2. How can I know that amount has been applied? Signed: Unsure

Dear Unsure: We receive questions about this fairly often from our military veterans. I want to first thank you for your service to our country and then assure you that, as a military veteran myself, I have thoroughly investigated this subject - the so-called "Special Extra Credit for Military Service," which is widely misunderstood. Although someone suggested that your Social Security benefit "is supposed to be a little higher" because you are a military veteran, allow me to share how this somewhat obscure rule actually works.

Any extra money for military veterans does not come in the form of a special "boost" to their Social Security benefit because of their military service; instead, certain older veterans receive extra credit to their earnings for the years they served. Those extra earnings are applied only to those who served in specific years, as additional dollars added to their actual earnings record for their service-years. The amount added to the veteran's true service-year earnings varies a bit depending on

which years you served. For example, if you served between 1957 - 1977, your actual earnings for each service-year would be increased by \$300 for each full quarter you had active duty pay to a maximum of \$1200 additional earnings per service-year. The credit is computed a bit differently for those who served between 1978 - 2001, but the maximum annual earnings credit for those service years is the same - \$1,200. And, for clarity, those who served before 1957 get extra earnings credit under an entirely different formula, and those who served after 2001 receive no extra credits for their military service years.

So how might this affect

your Social Security bene-

fit? Well, when your benefit is claimed, Social Security reviews your lifetime earnings record, inflates each actual annual amount to equal today's dollar equivalent, and selects the highest earning 35 years from your lifetime record to calculate your "Primary Insurance Amount" or "PIA" (your PIA is the amount you are entitled to at full retirement age). If your military service-years are among the 35 years used to compute your PIA when you claim, then the "Special Extra Credit for Military Service" will result in a somewhat higher PIA (a slightly higher monthly SS benefit). If the highest earning 35 years in your lifetime record do not include your military-service-years, then those extra credits added to your earnings for your military-service-years will have no effect on your Social Security benefit (because using those service-vears would result in a lower benefit). How Social Security applies those special extra credits to your service-year earnings also varies depending on when you served. Those who served

before 1968 needed to show their DD-214 to get the extra credits, but those who served in between 1968 - 2001 were automatically given the extra credits based on their military service records.

So, if your military ser-

vice was between 1968 and 2001, your earnings during the years you served were automatically increased by SS to reflect your "special extra" earnings and - if those years are among the highest of the 35 years used to compute your SS benefit - you are now receiving the extra benefit amount you're entitled to from those credits. If you have at least 35 years over your lifetime where you earned more than your pay while serving in the military, your current benefit is more than it would be if your military service years were included. If you have questions about your earnings during your military service years, you may wish to obtain a copy of your lifetime earnings history from Social Security to review those amounts (easiest way to get your lifetime earnings history is via your personal "my Social Security" account at

Bankruptcy Filings Rise 10 Percent

Report from U.S. Courts.com

Personal and business bankruptcy filings rose 10 percent in the twelve-month period ending June 30, 2023, compared with the previous year.

According to statistics released by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts, annual bankruptcy filings totaled 418,724 in the year ending June 2023, compared with 380,634 cases in the previous year.

Business filings rose 23.3 percent, from 12,748 to 15,724 in the year ending June 30, 2023. Non-business bankruptcy filings rose 9.5 percent to 403,000, compared with 367,886 in the previous year.

Bankruptcy totals for the previous 12 months are reported four times annually. Filings over any 12-month period have increased only rarely since filings peaked in 2010. Bankruptcies fell sharply after the pandemic began in early 2020, despite some early COVIDrelated disruptions to the economy.

Firescaping Your Home

We have had a hot few weeks and just about everything has become like hay ready to burn. Let's face it, forests and homes have no protection against wild fires...except perhaps you. Dr. Adrienne Edwards, a plant botanist with Rachel Schleiger, a plant ecologist, came to together to help us with "Firescaping

Your home." They shared some tips on my POPPOFF Radio Show.

1. FAMILY FIRST. Know that being prepared to evacuate saves your family and that is more important than your home and landscaping. Have "Go Bag" that includes your wildland fire action plan (house preparation, packing lists, evacuation plans, and contact numbers) so when an emergency arises you and your family are ready to go.

2. STRUCTURES. Assess your house and any other structures where you live for fire vulnerability. Then prioritize fireproofing on those structures with respect to degree of hazard, and costs for upgrades. They provide lots of tips in their book, but you can also consult with a professional or contractor with experience in how to make homes fire resistant

3. LANDSCAPES. Noncombustible Zone (0-5 Ft). No more "no more foundation plantings". During fire season (depending on conditions) nothing combustible should be within 5 feet of any structure. That includes wood fencing. Lean, Clean, and Green Zone (5-30 Fr), or more depending on slope. Research indicates that thinning fuels within 30 Ft of structures, and maintaining a noncombustible zone next to structures, are far more important than anything you might do beyond the Lean, Clean and Green

Zones. Plants should be kept healthy and clustered plantings can be punctuated by noncombustible areas of rock, bare ground, and inorganic mulches etc.

4. HABITAT SUPPORT. Think about your neighbors, that is, your plant neighbors, your wildlife neighbors, and your human neighbors. The more land we develop, the more we need to provide oases for native plants. Pollinators and other wildlife need food, shelter, and water. Learn more how to provide those resources in your yard and when. The timing of when you clear vegetation can have huge impacts on pollinators and birds in particular. In a cooler, wetter year, you should leave flowers, seeds, branches and other habitat in in place longer prior to fire season to allow organisms to reproduce. In a hotter, drier year you might have to clear vegetation sooner, but many of your wildlife neighbors can be a weak link in the firescaping chain, so fire resilience also should be coordinated at the community level. For example, fences may make good neighbors, but wood fences shed embers like crazy. When attached to houses, fires can burn house-to- house following fence lines toppling like dominoes.


5. ENJOY. Enjoy the natural beauty of your region with the confidence you have prepared for evacuation if needed and reduced your fire risks while continuing to support the habitat around you. FBI Announces Results of Local Operation **Tied to Nationwide Sex Trafficking**

FBI Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Field Office, working with its state and local partners, identified, and located two victims of sex trafficking during a nationwide enforcement campaign, called "Operation Cross Country." The FBI-led nationwide initiative, in partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC), focused on identifying and locating victims of sex trafficking and investigating and arresting individuals and criminal enterprises involved in both child sex and human trafficking. Law enforcement agencies conducted targeted operations to identify and apprehend offenders, dismantling criminal networks and preventing further harm to victims. Those suspects identified will be subject to additional investigation for potential charges.

In the greater Sacramento area, FBI agents worked collaboratively with law enforcement partners from Sacramento Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, California Department of Justice, Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Yolo County District Attorney's Office during the two-week

operation. Two adolescent victims and more than a dozen adults who are possible victims of human trafficking were identified during the operation were provided access to services coordinated by operational partner Community Against Sexual Harm (CASH). Five individuals were also arrested for charges related to commercial sexual exploitation.

"The FBI's primary focus is ensuring every possible victim of commercial sexual exploitation has the opportunity to connect with service providers and move beyond the cycle of exploitation and violence," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan of the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "We are grateful for the support of our law enforcement partners to provide the victims of human trafficking with the dignity they deserve and ensure their exploiters face justice.

The FBI remains steadfast in its commitment to combatting child exploitation and human trafficking. Operation Cross Country is just one facet of the Bureau's ongoing efforts to protect the most vulnerable members of society and hold offenders accountable. The FBI encourages continued vigilance, cooperation, and reporting from the public to help identify and recover victims and bring perpetrators to justice.




