SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Silver Dragon, a popular Chinese restaurant for over 30 years in the Sunrise Village in Citrus Heights, has found a new home at 8116 Madison Avenue in the Fair Oaks Plaza.

The restaurant closed on Jan. 24, 2021, leaving loyal patrons without their favorite dishes until its new location opens later this summer. Owners of Silver Dragon were unavailable for comment, but evidence of exterior construction at the restaurant is underway.

Wildlife Care Association Gets a Hand from Wells Construction Corporation

Here's some information about the Wildlife Care project while I watch the quick build. The workers that run the rescue at the Wildlife Care Association, are mostly volunteers. I could feel his excitement. He also told me since he started, 1750 animals have been you think about that number in terms of them coming in with all kinds of needs it is amazing they lived. He said they come in a lot from being hit by a car,

poisoning, which is usuwhen they have eaten an affected prey animal killed by poison. They personally do not have the license to keep the raptors, but can care for them until they can be turned over to a licensed care facility. There is an emergency number that is 916-965-9453. I keep talking about "birds" because it is the Aviary being built. But, Dave wants it know they rehab all types of critters. Most mammals, Dave said, go out to private homes where the care giver has gone through a training and care program before they can actually care for them in their homes. For instance, there is Chris with the endearing name of "the crazy racoon lady". At one time she had 38 in different stages of getting well. He named other such people whom he works with with similar endearing names and preference of certain animals.

Two donuts down, I think, and after writing all these notes, I asked Dave if there was anything else before I closed out this week's story on the beginnings of The Wild Life Association. He said he wanted people to know when animals are well and returned to the wild, they have a policy of where to return the animal. Adult birds are released within 10 miles of where they were found. Raccoons and Skunks must be released within 10 miles from any buildings or properties where people live or work. Lastly, there is ALWAYS A THRILL to be there when you release an animal. He LOVES being here. Also, always looking for volunteers to help with rehab, feedings, cleaning etc.

I thanked him for his time and information. Then looking lovingly back at that half full box of doughnuts, I threw away my napkin and coffee cup. I told him there was too much information for just one article and that the following week's article will be about the Flight Aviary being built all the ins and outs and how they got the money and supplies... Shook his hand and head out to write this up before I can't read my scribbles. Until next week, be safe and hug yourself first!! ★

Eventually, Frank was paying for as many as seven storage units himself, and delivering furniture to Woodland, Davis, Jackson, Elk Grove, Del Paso, and to all cities in the Greater Sacramento Area. These home furnishings have been picked up from Frank with the furniture donors by members of the volunteer furniture team, and were initially stored in 10'x20' commercial storage units and delivered to the new living quarters of enrolled formerly homeless veterans at the request of Mather VA social workers who are implementing the HUD-VASH program. As the program grew, so did the storage requirements that were not donated. Frank has been struggling for several years to get help from Mather VA

and local government to ties, and to acquire some financial support from local Veterans Service Organizations to help take some of the load off, so he wouldn't have to continue paying for the needed storage units himself, but without much success.

chow mein, hot and sour soup and various lunch specials.

"We have been blessed to serve you and your families for the past 30 years in this location and hope to see you again very soon," said a message taped on the restaurant door at the time of its closure last January.

According to the sign left by its owners, a lease for the location could not be renewed, as Sunrise Village is undergoing major renovation. The restaurant's former location and commercial businesses in the Citrus Heights shopping plaza have since been gutted, awaiting new tenants.

In Citrus Heights, Folsom Palace Asian Cuisine & Bar is planning to open a third restaurant at 5450 Sunrise Blvd., Suite E, in the Sunrise MarketPlace business improvement district. The restaurant has locations in Folsom and Eldorado Hills and will open in the location of the former PizzaRev, a pizza franchise restaurant. Adjacent restaurants in the same retail center are Dos Coyotes, Nation's Giant Hamburgers, and Menchie's Frozen Yogurt.

An initial building permit has been submitted to the Citrus Heights planning department, said Alison Bermudez, city planner. "We reviewed their initial request and have sent it back with our notes."

The building permit submission was filed by Leck Soungpanya, doing business as Leck Associates.

A spokesperson for the restaurant could not be reached.

Kathilynn Carpenter, executive director of the Sunrise MarketPlace business improvement district, confirms the restaurant is in the early permitting stage, with an opening date not yet set. Business incorporation documents have been filed for "Folsom Palace Sunrise Inc," with an address of 5450 Sunrise Blvd, Suite E.

According to the company's web site, the business has been in the food and restaurant industry for over 20 years. Its dine-in menu features popular entries such as moo shu pork, curry beef or chicken and various seafood offerings prepared with low sodium, less oil and no MSG.

Would you believe 60% of Americans report an average gain of 29 pounds during the pandemic? Nicolette Pace, founder of NutriSource, provides education and counseling on what you can do about it with a few tips she shared on POPPOFF.

- 1. JUICE IT UP. Drink warm lemon juice with water in the morning. Take the juice of half a lemon and add a pinch of cayenne pepper to strengthen the body and detox. It wakes up the digestive system and contains Vitamin C for skin and immunity and to balance the ph of the body. It flushes out the system and rehydrates the body...a fluid breakfast.
- **2. GET SERVED.** Move your food plate away from the serving area to limit the potential to eat seconds. Family style is a no-no for celebrities who need to be slim for performing on camera, stage, or modeling.
- 3. TAKE MEASUREMENTS. Measure volume in serving utensils like a favorite ladle or serving spoon as well as glasses, cups, mugs, bowls, and plates that you use frequently.
- 4. BUZZ IN. Caffeine can perk you up in more ways than one. Take some before a workout since it is a clinically proven ergogenic aid, which means it acts on the central nervous system, reduces fatigue, and allows for greater exertion as feelings of work load and pain are reduced.
- 5.GO WITH YOUR GUT. Eat probiotic-rich foods to enhance your good gut bacteria, which in turn will keep your weight down. Look for fermented foods like kombucha tea, kefir, yogurt, lebne, miso and fermented vegetables.
- 6. SKIP PROCESSED FOODS. Eat Lookin' good!

processed foods minimally as much as possible. "Uncured meats (naturally done with celery juice), organic poultry and meat, in season fruits, vegetables, and seafood (preferably locally or regionally grown) will give max nutrients for energy, vitality, and anti-aging and beauty inside and out.

- 7. SIP SMART. Lighten up on caffeine and replace sugary beverages, artificial sweeteners, and alcohol with nutrient-rich green tea, white or black tea, yerba mate, or cocoa. Drink citrus- fruit, or herb-infused waters like herbal tea and mineral water for daily hydration.
- 8. WORKOUT WISELY. Before exercising, avoid large volumes of fluid or food, especially when toning core muscles, to avoid cramps and digestive upset. However, be sure to take at least 12 ounces of fluid an hour. Dose protein and slow carbs one to four hours before to enable sustaining energy.
- 9. MIND YOUR MORNING MEAL. Don't eat if you're not hungry when you wake up. Just make sure that you eat within four hours of waking up.

Bills would Hamstring Future California Recalls

As signatures on petitions to force Gov. Gavin Newsom into a recall election are being tallied, the Legislature would, if enacted, make future recalls of California's elected officials less likely.

Two Democratic state senators, Ben Allen of Redondo Beach and Josh Newman of Fullerton, are carrying measures they say are needed to reform the recall process.

Newman's Senate Bill 663 would allow targets of recall campaigns to access the lists of recall petition signers and try to persuade them to remove their signatures. Current law allows only election officials to access their names to validate signatures.

Currently, signers have change their minds. SB 663 would extend that to 45 days.

Critics say that revealing the names of petition signers would subject them to harassment by recall targets and their supporters.

Newman, who went through a recall election himself in 2018, told the Senate's election committee this week that "this bill has no impact whatsoever on the recall effort against Governor Newsom" because, as now written, it would not take effect until next January.

it take effect immediately and thus impact the Newsom recall, but only with a twothirds vote of the Legislature and Newsom's signature, thus making it highly unlikely.

The Senate elections committee approved SB 663 and another Newman measure, Senate Bill 660, that would ban the now-common practice of paying professional petition circulators by the signature, not only for recalls is considering bills that but also for initiative measures and for referenda to invalidate laws passed by the Legislature.

> A prohibition on per-signature payments has been floated for years. Advocates contend that paying signature-gatherers by the name encourages them to mislead potential petition signers about the issues before them.

However, every recent governor has vetoed at least one version of the proposal. When he vetoed a 2019 ban on per-signature payments, Newsom said, "While I appreciate the intent of this legislation to incentivize grassroots support for the ini-30 days after the recall to tiative process, I believe this measure could make the qualification of many initiatives cost-prohibitive, thereby having the opposite effect."

> Allen, meanwhile, is offering a constitutional amendment and a conventional bill that would affect the recall process.

Senate Constitutional Amendment 3 would make successful recalls more difficult by placing the name of the targeted official on the ballot as a successor candidate.

Under current law, newspapers.

Theoretically, SB 663 voters are given two issues could be amended to make to decide - whether the official should be ousted and which of the successor candidates should be elected instead.

> That, Allen argues, is unfair because with multiple candidates, someone could win with relatively few votes. Under his measure, voters would simply decide whether to retain the incumbent with a plurality of votes or opt for one of the other contenders.

> SCA 3 also would cancel a recall election if the incumbent resigns after the recall qualifies which, in the case of governors, would mean an automatic takeover by the lieutenant governor. If another statewide official facing recall resigned, the governor would name a successor.

> Allen's second measure, Senate Bill 752, would require that before voters signed petitions for a recall, an initiative or a referendum, they would have to certify that they had read a list of the proposed measure's top financial contributors. As with Newman's SB 660, its declared aim is to prevent signature gatherers from misrepresenting the issues involved.

> It's debatable whether these measures would, as Newman and Allen contend, improve the recall and other forms of direct democracy. They certainly would make them more cumbersome and expensive and therefore less likely to succeed.

HELP!!! My Sister with Cancer Loses Medicaid!!



Toni:

My 60-year-old sister who had no health insurance or Medicare was granted Medicaid in January last year. She was granted Medicaid

because she had stage 3 breast cancer with lymph-nodes that were removed. She just learned from her Doctor that her Medicaid had been cancelled effective May 1st. My sister has not received anything from Medicaid stating that she was cancelled, and we cannot get anyone at Medicaid to tell us what the problem is. She was being paid \$703.00 as a disability check and recently she got a raise to \$1,431 for Social Security Disability which she has recently qualified to receive effective April 1st. When she went to Social Security to apply for Social Security Disability no one said she

Medicaid check. Someone told me about what you do to help people who do not know where to go or what to do. This is overwhelming because my sister cannot receive her chemo treatments any more due to not qualified for Medicaid. Can you tell me what I need to do? Thanks, Gray from Jackson, MS

would get an increase in her \$703 monthly

Oh My... Gray:

I do not get very many problems like this, but after talking with you this week, I wanted to inform my readers about this Medicaid issue. People need to know how vitally critical and important it is, when you qualify for Medicaid to be sure you stay in the monthly income and asset bracket that qualifies you for Medicaid. One dollar (\$1) too much and you can LOSE your Medicaid benefits and will have to pay 100% out of your pocket for your medical expenses.

Gray, my heart ached when you said, "you would have helped your sister with some of her expenses because of her disability check raised from \$703 to \$1,431, but you could not pay the \$2,600 per chemotherapy treatment with 8 treatments in a cycle that totaled over \$20,800. She lost her Medicaid for only \$400.00." And that you considered the state had given your sister a "death sentence" because her doctor is not giving her chemo since the medical facility is not getting paid.

Here is what I would advise you to do to help your sister:

- 1. Ask how you can have her Social Security discontinued from the \$1,431 to the original amount of \$703 for Medicaid, so that she can be in the correct income bracket to qualify for Medicaid. Who knows maybe there is a loophole somewhere?
- 2. Talk to the cancer facility where your sister was receiving her medical care and chemo treatments. Find out if there is a non-profit fund set up for situations like your sister's. See what grants or philanthropic organizations help in this type of emergency.
- 3. Contact the American Cancer Society area office and explain about her serious situation and how time is slipping away with her not receiving her chemo treatments. She needs help NOW!!

My main goal in writing this week's column is to make the public aware to how important it is when you qualify for Medicaid, whether you are under 65 with no health insurance or are over 65 and have Medicare, that you must stay within the financial limits... One dollar (\$1) too much and you lose your Medicaid benefits and must pay 100% out of your pocket for medical expenses.

Customers are asked to keep treated wood waste separate from any other items in their load. Regular Kiefer Landfill facility fees will apply.





Take a fish tank and divide it in half with a piece of glass. Put several fish on one side. The fish will hit the divider until they learn where the swimming limits are. Remove the divider and the fish will still remain on one side of the tank.

The educational system and societal constraints are the equivalent of the jar dent on her parents for top and fish tank divider on Alice's development.

As Alice grows and interacts with others she will be exposed to jealousy. People tend to be envious of what someone else may have. Jealousy can manifest itself through ridicule, and alienation. If Alice shows ambition, unique abilities or talents she may find herself being

rejected. Each time Alice experiences a negative reaction, a layer of stone forms around her dreams. She finds it easier to go with the flow and be accepted rather than blaze her own trail.

Alice finishes school and begins working. She may not be doing the kind of work she once dreamed of due to all of the limitations imposed on her while growing up.

If Alice shows too much enthusiasm or ambition she may be admonished by her coworkers. She could be denied a promotion while someone less capable moves ahead because they are more adept at office politics.

Alice might want to go back to school to further her education or change careers. Perhaps she wants to start her own business. Her family and friends discourage her from being "unrealistic." Once again, a layer of stone is added as she receives little or no encouragement. Alice's dreams, aspirations, and abilities become so deeply buried that she forgets they ever existed.


Rollingwood Athletic Club Rolls with Your Times and Needs

ORANGEVALE, CA (MPG) Rollingwood Athletic Club (RAC) sits at the crossroads of Fair Oaks and Orangevale and is very much a symbol of the area's semi-rural vibe. You must traverse a winding, tree-lined driveway before you can even glimpse the rooftop of the club, set back on 10 acres amongst mature trees and in a valley between neighborhoods.

Despite its more tranquil atmosphere, the club isn't short on state-of-the-art facilities, from tennis courts and two large swimming pools - indoor and outdoor - to a spacious fitness area and several rooms for group fitness classes. And the amount of outdoor space has definitely helped the club make it through the challenges of the past the pandemic has not left RAC year with COVID restrictions.

During the pandemic, tennis courts were converted into outdoor March and April of last year, and training facilities and group fitness areas, moving some large equipment outside and adding sails and easy-ups to shield members from rain, wind, and sun, and so that they can continue to work out safely. "Since then, we have seen about 30% of our members return." Which means the club, which is locally

and independently owned, still has a long way to go to return to full, pre-COVID operations, although continuing to offer a full schedule of more than 30 HIT, yoga, cycle, pilates, TRX, and aqua classes.

Outside of the fitness facilities and pre-COVID, the club acted as a community gathering space, with large indoor and outdoor areas for local organizations to meet, birthday parties to be held, and even a remote space for members to work from. Currently, those spaces sit empty, waiting for the time, hopefully very

soon, when they can once again be filled with music and passing

When I visited on a Wednesday morning, the tennis courts were open and games were being played, members were trickling in for an outdoor class, and a socially distant yoga class was happening in the group fitness room.

As the area continues to resume more normal activities, the club looks forward to welcoming back those members who have been waiting in the wings for the health

situation to change, and those members will get to benefit from some of the changes that the pandemic necessitated.

What was an unused outside area behind the club will be kept as an outdoor fitness area and there is now a new pickle-ball court, which has been hugely popular. Meanwhile, the club has been able to gradually resume junior swimming and tennis programs which family members have been very appreciative of. "It's been great to see the smiles of the kids around the club," Stephani

RAC has been in business since 1978 and being adaptable, moving with the trends of the time to meet members' evolving needs and schedules, has been part of that longevity. "We'll continue to do that, putting feedback at the heart of our business," says Stephani. "We want to hear from our members and we want to offer what the community tells us they want to see from us."




