Love and Satire on Center Stage

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Love of many kinds is running rampant at The Fair Oaks Theatre Festival this summer! Love for their beloved former Artistic Director Bob Irvin....love of satire and music.... and love of the dreaded 'reefer,' a humble pig, and Shakespeare's iconic Kate from "Taming of the Shrew." All this love comes in the form of a summer theatre season that was inspired and driven by Irvin. The season's show reflect his vision: "Reefer Madness," "Charlotte's Web," and "SHREW!," an original musical mapped out by Irvin before his untimely passing. Irvin's 30-year legacy is in good hands with Beth Duggan (the new Artistic Director), and Karen Bombardier, the director of the season's opening production of "Reefer Madness" (June 19 – July 23, 2017).

"Reefer Madness," is an outrageous tongue-in-cheek musical comedy and a satirical sendup of the 1936

low-budget film on the menace of marijuana. It is laced with heady ballads, spectacular choreography (by Jacob Montoya) and hilarious musical commentary on the nature of government propaganda.

The musical tells the tale of the Harper Affair, in which young Jimmy Harper finds his life of promise turned into a life of debauchery and murder thanks to the new drug menace marijuana. Along the way he receives help from his girlfriend Mary Lane and even Jesus himself, but always finds himself in the arms of the Reefer Man and the rest of the denizens of the Reefer Den. Winner of seven awards, including Best Production: L.A. Drama Critics Circle Award, and Best Production: Backstage West Garland Award.

A sort of twilight-zone-meetshorror-film-meets-musicalcomedy, this shows provides

may inspire a cult following! "Reefer" runs at 8:30pm Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays through July 29. Tickets range from \$12 (on Retro Sundays) to \$18 general. "Reefer Madness," an R-rated show.

Opening July 1 is "Charlotte's Web," a fun and faithful adaptation of E.B. White's classic story of a gentle pig and his unlikely friend, a spider. The one-hour show features all of the novel's favorite characters, including Fern, Homer Zuckerman and Templeton the Rat, and is followed by an opportunity for photos and autographs in the adjacent park. Tickets to all shows (Saturdays, July 1-22, 11am) are \$5

The final show of the season is "SHREW!," an original musical set in 1930s Paris. This swinging little musical takes Shakespeare's "Taming of the Shrew" as a launching off point, but brings the audience a feisty couple that's evenly matched in strength and wit. Written by published author Jennifer Longo ("Six Feet Over It," "Up to this Point"), "SHREW!" is filled with high fashion fun and music reminiscent of Cole Porter and Noel Coward. Musical Directors Lucy D'Mot, Kirt Shearer and Jonathan Blum set the perfect tone in this 'jazz age' musical comedy! Shows will run Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays at 8pm from August 11 through

September 17. Tickets range from \$12 (on Retro Sundays) to \$18 general.

In addition to theatre, the Fair Oaks Theatre Festival offers a full season of music this summer as well! Concerts include the popular folk music group "The New Christy Minstrels" (July 29 and 30), a New Orleans Jazz Night (James Pace & the Switch Blade Trio with Jessic Malone, August 5), and a Bluesy/Rock Night (Jeff Watson Band, September 30).

he said was amounting to out-ofpocket losses of roughly \$20,000 a month due to rising labor costs. Under the terms of the agreement, the county will take over roughly \$110,500 in annual operating costs for Gibson Ranch, including an estimated \$53,000 for utilities, including sewer and water quality certification; between \$5,000 and \$7,000 to

maintain and repair the wells on

the property, and provide Ose

with a \$50,000 annual contri-

bution toward reimbursements

for capital improvements and

deferred maintenance. An original request by Ose to raise additional revenue through a hike in the park's entry fee from \$5 to \$8 was not something the entire board would support. The hike was removed from Ose's proposal and the entry fee will not be raised, Ose said.

County Supervisor Sue Frost, who was among those opposing the entry fee hike, called the agreement a "rare win for everyone involved."

"The county gets to have a jewel of a park for a smaller price than everything comparable in the county, and the residents of the community get to continue enjoying the park for the same fee as they are used to paying," Frost said. "I'm extremely pleased with how this worked out."

The new agreement also calls for the county to install an automatic pay station in the park, which could net the county additional revenue of between \$7,000 and \$10,000 annually.

PaintCare: An Historic Milestone for a Unique Organization

- When Congressman Jared Huffman began sponsoring a product stewardship law for architectural paint in California in May 2009, even he couldn't envision the level of success that was to come in a few short years after the state's paint stewardship program began in 2012.

"Congratulations to PaintCare on its five year anniversary and for recycling more than 10 million gallons of paint in California," said Rep. Huffman the Second District Representative. "To go from no California product stewardship presence to 10,000,000 gallons in California alone in so short a period of time is an incredible achievement. When I authored this legislation in the California Assembly, my main goal was to make leftover paint recycling more convenient for Californians, reduce the burden of disposal on local governments, and to protect the environment. I'm glad to see that PaintCare has reached these goals with flying colors within just five years. It's a testament to a lot of hard work on the part of many different people."

What has legislators so excited about PaintCare and Product Stewardship though, is not just the success PaintCare has had in collecting a combined 20,000,000 gallons of paint for recycling in those states and jurisdictions with paint stewardship laws (with California accounting for a little more than half and the seven other states and the District of Columbia accounting for the remainder) Ken Pereira, Waste Management Specialist for Sacramento County, highlights the cost savings to municipalities:

"Sacramento County's Department of Waste Management

and Recycling (DWMR) is committed to excellent environmental stewardship. Historically, DWMR has spent approximately \$150,000 annually in order to divert leftover or unwanted paint products from the landfill, and ensure that they are reused or recycled. Thanks to our successful relationship with the PaintCare organization, DWMR has reduced those annual costs to less than \$8,000 per year. These cost savings directly impact our rate payers and also allow DWMR to expand and improve the county's Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Program."

PaintCare is the flagship organization under the growing header of Product Stewardship, an environmental strategy in which product manufacturers have the primary responsibility to establish, fund, and manage programs that minimize the environmental impact of products across the entire product life cycle, including end-of-life management. Government agencies help set performance goals for the programs and ensure accountability and transparency. This means that PaintCare is a unique non-profit operator, at once a partnership between private business and public agencies, and yet its own independent body. California Product Stewardship Council Executive Director Heidi Sanborn on PaintCare's role in the evolution of the general public's under-

standing of product stewardship. "PaintCare has demonstrated

that a producer designed and operated system can provide a much more convenient collection system than the government can because they have more locations where people normally go to shop. It's called "take-back" because the retailers are taking back what they once sold making it convenient for their customers. We know if recycling is convenient and free at end of life and the public is informed how to use it and it has a sustainable funding source, the programs work very well. A great benefit of the paint stewardship program in California is that is has freed up millions of dollars of public money to be used on other hazardous waste collection."

PaintCare Executive Director, Marjaneh Zarrehparvar, has earned a reputation over the past five years as being an effective mitigator in the sometimes-tricky relationship between private business and public sector waste and environmental agencies. Kelly Moore CEO, Steve DeVoe, on PaintCare's leader:

"I have had the pleasure of working with Marjaneh now for a number of years both as a paint manufacturer and retailer, and I'll tell you, I think the secret to PaintCare's success is a lot simpler than it might seem. All too often with product stewardship, it seems that businesses, governments and nonprofits can start out as adversaries. But Marjaneh and her PaintCare team have collaborated effectively with everyone and created a program that has processed 20,000,000 gallons of unwanted, leftover paint. I think we are on the right track to process millions of gallons more. PaintCare is a great model of product stewardship and shows what can be done."

Highway Patrol Offering Free "Start Smart" Classes

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)
- The leading cause of death for Americans 15-20 years old is motor vehicle collisions. In an effort inform and to reduce motor vehicle collisions in California, California Highway Patrol (CHP) North Sacramento area will offer a free Start Smart class. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), mile for mile, teenagers are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers.

Recent collisions involving teenagers in our area demonstrate the importance of these types of classes. The classes are used to promote traffic safety to both parents and teens. We encourage both parent/caregivers and teens to attend the class.

The CHP's Start Smart program is a driver safety education class which targets new and future licensed teenage drivers between the age of 15 -19 and their parents/guardians.

The Start Smart class will cover collision avoidance techniques, driver responsibility, collision trends, distracted driving laws, alcohol related driving laws and the provisional license

process. The program also offers an opportunity for new drivers and parents/guardians to ask CHP Officers clarifying questions. The class incorporates videos and classroom discussion.

and Sewer Treatment Plant at

It is highly encouraged that at least one parent/guardian attend the class with their teen driver. Kids Don't Float and Neither do Adults

Visiting Sacramento County's public waterways and rivers is a traditional way to cool off and enjoy the outdoors . . . but before you take the plunge remember Life Looks Good on You and so does a life vest. Drowning Doesn't.

Putting a life vest on before going into the river is the smart and safe thing to do. And remember it's the law for children under 13 to wear a life vest because kids don't float. Wearing one could help save a life including your own.

There are several life vest borrowing sites in the Sacramento area including at area fire stations and on the American River Parkway at Discovery Park (2 sites -- kids and adults), Ancil Hoffman Park (kids only), Howe Avenue river access (kids only), Watt Avenue river access (kids only), River Bend Park (kids only), and Sunrise river access (kids only).

Defendant Convicted for Multiple Sexual Assaults

DATE: June 7, 2017

CASE: Steven Anthony McCarter (Case #16FE002313)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Tate Davis, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution

Steven Anthony McCarter was convicted by a jury of two counts of rape by force with personal use of a deadly weapon, two counts of assault with a deadly weapon, two counts of assault by means likely to produce great bodily injury and assault with the intent to commit rape against two separate women.

On November 21, 2015, a homeless victim was sitting on a street curb near Sacramento State. McCarter offered to drive her to get food, which she accepted. McCarter then provided her with alcohol and asked her to stay in his motel room. The victim agreed to stay in his room with the understanding there would be no sex. The victim later awoke to find McCarter naked with his arms around her neck. McCarter punched and elbowed the victim in the face several times, choked her until she couldn't breathe, and wrapped his belt around her throat in an attempt to suffocate her. When the belt broke, the victim begged McCarter to stop beating her. McCarter proceeded to rape the victim twice. The victim escaped the next morning and was taken to a hospital for her injuries and a sexual assault exam. The District Attorney's Crime Lab analyzed DNA collected from the exam, which was later matched to McCarter's DNA.

On January 23, 2016, a second victim was walking and carrying grocery bags in south Sacramento. McCarter offered to give her a ride, which she accepted. The two talked about meeting again later that night. When the victim became stranded at a light rail station, she called McCarter and asked for a ride home. McCarter picked her up and drove to a liquor store. He then stated he was too drunk to drive and asked if they could stay in a motel for the night. The victim agreed with the understanding there would be no sex. When the victim was in bed, McCarter demanded she remove her clothing. When she refused, McCarter punched her in the face and hit her in the eye with a liquor bottle. The victim was able to fight McCarter off and escape. The next day,

the victim went to a hospital and reported the attempted rape. She later identified McCarter in a photo lineup.

Allegations that McCarter suffered four prior convictions will be determined at sentencing.

Sentencing is set for July 14, 2017, at 10:00 a.m. in Department 17 before the Honorable Bunmi Awoniyi.

Defendant Sentenced for Attempted Murder of His Children

DATE: June 7, 2017


CASE: Charles Ewers (Case #15F02083) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child Abuse

The Honorable Jaime Roman sentenced Charles Ewers to 18 years to life in prison. On May 4, 2017, Ewers pled guilty to two counts of attempted murder and admitted to two enhancements for causing great bodily injury and using a deadly weapon.

On April 4, 2015, sheriff's deputies responded to Ewers home after receiving a call from his estranged wife, who was concerned about her children after Ewers failed to return them at the agreed upon time. Deputies heard the sound of a running car motor from the garage. They forced entry into the garage, where they found two children in the car, ages 8 and 10, with bloodied heads and faces. Yellow hoses were connected from the exhaust pipe to a small opening through the rear passenger window. Deputies immediately removed the children from the vehicle. Ewers remained in the driver's seat with a replica airsoft gun on his seat before he was later removed.

Ewers admitted to deputies that he had given his children Ambien to make them drowsy and had planned to suffocate his children by carbon monoxide poisoning. When they failed to get drowsy, he used a mallet to strike them each repeatedly on their heads, causing extensive injuries to their head and bodies. After physically assaulting them, he then forced the children into his running car and told them they were all "going to Heaven."

When questioned by law enforcement, Ewers stated, "I am in control. I am not in a rage. I am in control and I am sad that it didn't work out. If I could try again, I would." He later explained that he had planned the act for several months and was looking for the right time to do it.



Buy leased building?

Dear Dave,

I've operated my own small business for a couple of years. In that time, I've been leasing the building that houses my company. How do you know when the time is right to buy a place and stop leasing?

- Chris

Dear James,

I'm a big fan of leasing the first few years after starting your own business. It's even better if you can work out of your home, but I understand that's not always practical.

In my mind, you should only buy a building when you have a good idea what your building needs will be from a solid track record. Growth is a good thing, but in some cases you may want to hold off buying a building if you're growing too rapidly. Don't make the mistake of focusing too much on real estate and not enough on generating revenue and managing your growth intelligently. You would also want to make sure you're going to be in anything you buy for a while, because you don't want to be stuck with a residual value. A residual value is the remaining value of an asset after

it has been fully depreciated.

In the first three to five years of starting your business, you should lease. After that, you can choose to lease with an option to buy or, in the right situation, buy a building — debt-free, of course. —Dave

Dear Joel,

I think out of three things school, work, and where you live – you need to decide which is your number one priority. If it were me, school would come first.

In order to go to school without borrowing money, you're going to have to work. Getting out of school on time, and attending some of the events that will take you toward your career, will pre-empt work. You'll have to work enough to pay for things, but if you can finish school and hit your academic

and graduation goals while staying at home a little bit longer, that's a pretty good deal. It's a nice thing your parents are offering, but I can understand your desire to be out on your own.

That's going to disturb your entire school process. Guess what your number one priority was in that scenario? Moving out! If it's the tail that's wagging the dog, it has become the number one priority. If it's disrupting work, and thereby disrupting your academics, then you've put your priorities on the wrong thing.

In my mind, the number priority should be finishing school on time, and attending as many connected events as possible. Meanwhile, you're working so much that you're able to continue doing all this debt-free. If that means you're staying at home a little bit longer to pull it off — do it!





Happy Father's Day

You probably think Father's Day began just because there was a Mother's Day or maybe card companies had a hand in it. What if I told you it was all about a daughter's love for her father. That's how Father's Day really began, and it all started on the west coast. The thought for creating a day for children to honor their fathers began in Spokane, Washington. The idea came to the mind of Sonora Smart Dodd while listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909. After the death of her mother she, along with her siblings, was raised by her father... William Jackson Smart. Sonora wanted to tell her father how special he was and what role he played in her life. She wanted to honor her father's parental sacrifices that he made for his children. She wanted him to know what a courageous, selfless and loving man he was.

POPPOFF! with Mary Jane Popp Since Sonora's father was born Johnson issued the first presiin June, she wanted to celebrate dential proclamation honoring

it on June 5, but the pastors needed extra time to prepare their sermons so she chose to hold the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane on the 19th of June in the year 1910 at the YMCA. In 1916, even President Woodrow Wilson went to Spokane to speak at a Father's Day celebration and wanted to make it an officially recognized federal holiday, but Congress resisted. They feared that it would be commercialized. In 1924 President Calvin Coolidge recommended that the day be observed throughout the nation, but he stopped short of issuing a national proclamation.

However, in the 1920's, Sonora stopped promoting the celebration because she was studying at the Art Institute of Chicago, and it faded into relative obscurity. In the 1930's she returned to Spokane and started promoting the celebration again, raising awareness on the national level. And she had help from some of those trade groups that would benefit most from the holiday like the manufacturers of ties, tobacco pipes, and other traditional presents. In 1966, President Lyndon



Triple Your Taxes for the Fourth of July?

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

Are you ready for California to double your taxes? What about triple or quadruple them? A bill currently making its way through the state Legislature could push tax rates up beyond imagination, making us tax serfs to the state, and driving hundreds of thousands of jobs out of California.

Senate Bill 562 (SB 562), the "California Healthcare for All Act," proposes to ban private insurance coverage and force every citizen in the state into the equivalent of the Medi-Cal system we provide for the poor and disabled, where state-provided healthcare would be the only option. The costs would be staggering.

A recent analysis by the California Senate Appropriations Committee estimated that implementing SB 562 would set back California taxpayers \$400 Billion. This year's general fund spending including roads, schools, universities, prisons and more

billion. In a highly-taxed state that just recovered from years of massive deficits and still teeters on the edge of fiscal ruin, where is this additional taxpayer money supposed to come from? Four hundred billion is more than \$10,000 a year from every man, woman and child in the state. Do most California families have that kind of money laying around?

That extraordinary cost is consistent with estimates from other states and is the major reason that singlepayer schemes have been voted down or abandoned before implementation. New York state is currently proposing its own SB 562. In 2019, when New York's plan would be active, the state expects to collect \$82 billion in taxes, but would need another \$91 billion to pay for its singlepayer scheme. New York, as is the case with California, will more than double its overall revenue. See a trend?

And that \$91 billion number might be charitable. An analysis by healthcare expert Avik Roy concluded that New York's plan could cost \$226 billion a year, nearly quadrupling the state's current tax collections, just to pay for healthcare, not government's other responsibilities. Roy estimates that the plan would jettison 175,000 jobs from the state, as "high-wage, high-value industries move to neighboring states" as a result. California, a much larger state, could shed hundreds of thousands of jobs under SB 562's crushing fiscal mandate.

California's plan also proposes to pay for all care for all residents, regardless of whether they are in the state

- is estimated around \$124 illegally, or whether they are here legally but just moved here to take advantage of the state's "free" medical care. California, already the king of the tax dollar giveaway, would become the hot new destination for immigrants and indigents seeking care, driving the costs even higher.

> And, even if the costs were not fantastically, impossibly high, SB 562 presents other problems for California healthcare. Our state suffers from a shortage of healthcare providers, particularly in rural and inner-city areas, a condition that would only be intensified by the provider rate caps in the bill.

Single-payer systems are also prone to deadly wait times since they ration care to reduce costs.

The United States is a medical innovator and California is the nation's bioscience hub. That will disappear in the price-controlled, socialized system California legislators are trying to dump on the people. Price caps, a key component of single payer plans, spell doom to medical innovation.

Remaking the entire healthcare system is a terrible idea if the reform is going to make healthcare slower, less innovative, and wildly more expensive.

SB 562 is an ill-advised plan with unpayable costs that would make California taxpayers sick.
