## A Reason for the Season

Live Nativity Encourages the Spirit of Christmas

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Live Nativity, admission free, returns this year after an enthusiastic response from the public in 2015. Like last year, visitors pass shepherds in the fields, see the Three Kings arriving from afar, and enter Bethlehem, where the marketplace bustles around them complete with census takers and Roman guards. Mary, Joseph, and the Baby enter, all accompanied by music and narration. Six babies will make their acting debut as the newborn Christ during the four-day run from Thursday, December 8, through Sunday, December 11. The show has four presentations per night: 6:30, 7:00, 7:30, and 8:00, at 2100 California Circle in Rancho Cordova.

"'The baby is real!' is a common reaction we've had," said Heather McCauley, who is in charge of casting and direction, as well as numerous other logistical matters. "(Visitors) felt like they were going back in time and being a part of the first Christmas."

McCauley, who lives in El Dorado Hills, is a music and drama teacher.

Manned by an all-volunteer cast and crew, one set of 100 actors perform on Thursday and Saturday, and another, different set of 100 on Friday and Sunday. There are also numerous behind-the-scenes workers taking care of costumes, lighting, sound, and such things as parking, check-in, and ushering, for a total of around 300 volunteers per night.

McCauley said that it is amazing to see so many people come forward and give so much of their time to make this event happen. "It is such a special gift that we're giving to the community, that people love, all different religions, and it's something that people are looking for at this time of the year."

Last year the count of visitors attending the presentations reached 7,400, several thousand more than expected. Because of that, this year's organizers have added a reservation process, more seating, and have made other arrangements for the convenience of the patrons.

The Live Nativity is presented by the Folsom Stake of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The Stake president, Daniel Harrison, presides over congregations of the Church in the Folsom/El Dorado Hills area. "The goal is to try to help people feel that they are actually in Bethlehem and that they have a meaningful Christmas experience remembering the birth of Christ, which is the reason why we celebrate," Harrison said.

This year reservations are recommended, but no one will be turned away. For reservations, directions, photos, and more information about the performance, see www.LiveNativity.org. The presentations are located at 2100 California Circle, off of Folsom Boulevard near Folsom Auto Mall, turning south onto Birkmont Drive, then left on California Circle.

## Fair Oaks Water District Introduces New Director

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Fair Oaks general election. The term of Realtor specializing in the Water District's new Director Pete Schroeder is due to take office on January 1, 2017.

Established in 1917, the Fair Oaks Water District (FOWD) is governed by five Board Members. The Board Members are publicly elected to four-year staggered terms representing geographical divisions. The FOWD had an opening on the Board of Directors due to the resignation of the Division III Director. Pete Schroeder, an active member of the community of Fair Oaks, was elected to the open Division III Director seat in the recent

this appointment will expire in December 2020.

Mr. Schroeder is not a stranger to the District or the community. In 2014 he was the Fair Oaks Chamber of Commerce "Citizen of the Year" and has served on both the Fair Oaks Rotary Club and Fair Oaks Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. In 2015 he founded Fair Oaks Community Action Partnerships, which brings together organizations in an effort of support and cooperation. Mr. Schroeder is currently the president of PGS Business Coaching & Consulting and an active Century 21

community of Fair Oaks. His education includes a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics and a Master Certification as a Business Coach.

FOWD stands as a committed and involved member of the community. With the appointment of Director Schroeder, the District is currently led by five Board Members, including: Dave Underwood, Misha Sarkovich, Randy Marx, Mike McRae and Pete Schroeder. Director Sarkovich and Director Marx are the longest-tenured FOWD Board Members, having each served nearly twelve years on the Board.

While serving a population of approximately 37,500 people on approximately 6,053 acres, FOWD has essentially not increased rates for the past twelve years, while investing approximately 40 cents of every ratepayer dollar back into capital during the same time period - maintaining approximately 14,000 metered service connections, six groundwater wells, 180 miles of pipeline, a 3 million-gallon water storage tank and an in-house billing system – entering 2017 with zero debt and over 100% of annual revenue in reserve Source: FOWD

## Fire in Orangevale Home Displaces Family of Four

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Just after 8:30 on November 18, Metro Fire crews were dispatched to the 9200 block of Lostwood Lane in Orangevale for a report of visible flames from the roof of a house. First arriving crews reported a working fire and immediately initiated fire attack. Firefighters located the fire, which had started in the chimney and spread to the attic, and extinguished it, while searching for victims, and ventilating the structure.

While first-in crews were putting out the fire, other firefighters focused on protecting

### Firefighters, Sheriff's Officers and CHP Rescue 46 Year-old Woman

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Just after midnight on November 21, Metro Fire crews were dispatched to a home in Fair Oaks for a report of an overdose. When firefighters and Sheriff's officers arrived, the patient was no longer there. They attempted to locate her, but were unable to. After searching nearby streets, the officers pinged her cell phone, which showed it to be on the north side of the American River, near Hazel Avenue. Officers then requested the help of a California Highway Patrol helicopter, who used infrared technology to locate the woman, lying on a ledge above the river, in slippery terrain. As fire crews were en route to the new location, one of the officers climbed down the slope to make sure the

woman didn't fall off the ledge. The victim, a 46 year-old female, appeared to have rolled nearly 70 feet before stopping on a ledge a few feet above the water line. She had a decreased level of consciousness, not responding to verbal communication. Metro Fire's Rescue Task Force, with assistance from Folsom Fire, set up for a low angle rescue, using a second ambulance as the anchor. Once the rope system was in place, two rescuers were lowered to the ledge, where they quickly assessed her injuries and placed her in a rescue stretcher, so she could be safely hauled up the slope. The patient was then transported code 3 to a local trauma

## FTB Responds To Gaines' Call to Help Victimized Veterans

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) reported that, per his request, the Franchise Tax Board (FTB) has put into place a dedicated study team to evaluate the taxation of California National Guard Bonus repayments.

"I called on the FTB to create a special task force to aid California National Guard veterans who may need to file amended tax returns resulting from the resolution of this bonus scandal and am pleased to hear they are moving forward," said Senator Gaines. "I want these veterans to have FTB staff specifically dedicated to their plight so they are not mired in bureaucracy when trying to resolve their tax status. I appreciate the FTB working with these service men and women to ensure our

veterans are being honored for their service and not suffering from this betrayal at the hands of the Pentagon."

The FTB reports that they have reached out to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requesting information on the IRS interpretation of the federal tax consequences of the bonus repayment and are awaiting a response.

The FTB is also awaiting the final decision from the Department of Defense regarding the repayment of bonuses. Once the appropriate information is received, the FTB will take action to notify taxpayers and tax professionals of the appropriate tax treatment.





## **Memories of Pearl Harbor Decades Later**

CITRUS HEIGHTS, CA (MPG) - As the years pass the men that survived the attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941 dwindle. But there are those who were younger who remember it and it affected their lives in different ways. Betty Detri and Dorothy Phillips, volunteers at the Citrus Heights Veteran's Center share their memories.

Betty Detri, a junior in high school, had just turned 18 when Pearl Harbor was attacked. She lived in the city of Erie, Pennsylvania. Coming home from school that day, people were on their porches saying, "We're at war, we're at war". At home her family heard on the radio that President Roosevelt was already signing papers (to go to war) at the same time as the bombing was going on. The next day at school

teachers explained what was happening. Roosevelt had announced that men 18-55 years of age could be drafted so all the girls were upset. Many of her classmates enlisted in the Navy to avoid being drafted into the Army.

One older brother, Frank, was drafted into the Army at 18 years in 1941. He was serving at a base in Alaska when he became ill. He was returned to the U.S. where he died from cancer at age 20. Another brother, Sam joined the Navy and returned home safely following his service. Detri's husband Robert was drafted into to the Army in 1946, He served for a short tour, left the Army but then returned in 1950 until he retired in 1960 when they moved to

office of Bucyrus-Erie, one of the many defense plants on 12th & Cranberry Street in Erie. Bucyrus built 20 plus ton shovels sent overseas to construction units. She retired in 2008 after working this and many other jobs in Pennsylvania and California.

Detri's son, Thomas continued the family military tradition when he joined the Navy in 1978. serving for 28 years on several ships, including the USS Nimitz during the Iran and other Middle East conflicts. After one break in his service, he retired in 2006 as a full commander.

Dorothy Phillips was 15 years old in 1941, living in Springfield Missouri. Being too young to serve at 15, she had to wait until she graduated high school.

Her father had been a World War I veteran at 17 years old, having fought in France. She had watched so many of her high school friends join the service and she also wanted to be doing something worthwhile. Her 20th birthday was in March of 1945. With her parent's permission, Phillips joined the Navy WAVES (Women's Reserve) in June of 1945. She was in her boot training at Hunter



College in New York when the end of the war with Japan (VJ Day) was declared on August 14. The Navy asked new recruits if they would go to Hospital Corps School to work with the wounded returning home following the war. She agreed and following her six month training was sent to Jacksonville Naval Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida. She served there for one year.

Recently Phillips visited two monuments honoring Americans who had served and died for their country. She visited the USS Arizona in Hawaii and the U.S. Cemetery in Normandy, France. She was touched by the many granite crosses marking the thousands of graves of 'unknown soldiers' in Normandy. The crosses read, "Here Rests in Honored Glory a Comrade in Arms Known Only to God." Phillips said "it's just the most beautiful sight". ★


