

# **A Lifetime of Dedication**

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Carol Spiker, past president of the Citrus Heights General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC), recently received a prestigious award from the nonprofit Heifer International, which helps people in underdeveloped countries lift themselves out of poverty.

Since its founding in 1944. Heifer has been able to assist over 22.6 million families in 125 countries around the world to become selfsufficient as a result of monetary donations to fund the gifts of animals and other resources for these families. In 2014, Heifer celebrated its 70th anniversary and partnership with GFWC by creating an award, the Linda Dennis Heifer Hope Award. Spiker was the recipient of this initial award that was given out at the 2015 GFWC International Convention in Nashville, Tennessee on June 15th.

When baby boomers across America heard their parents say, "Clean your plate; there are starving children in China," many children

did just that and never thought more about it. Spiker asked her parents, "Can we send our food to them, even the stuff I like?" Later, when she learned about how Heifer helped people in underdeveloped countries make a living and feed themselves through farming and other avenues, she was sold.

Spiker's official involvement with Heifer began after a 2009 presentation by Heifer International at one of her club meetings. When she heard the percentage of people in the world who go to bed hungry every night, she knew she had to get involved. In 2010, as Sutter District's new president, Spiker's signature project was Heifer. She invited the same speakers to present a program at the district convention. The response from members was

Following Spiker's term as district president, she requested to be the CA State Chairman of International Outreach. Heifer International had just been accepted as a Partner. Holding this chair from 2012 through 2014, she traveled to state meetings, boards, conventions, and gave workshops to spread the

Heifer message. Members again responded and CFWC's International Outreach Partnership projects and programs took top honors at the state convention both years, along with recognition from Heifer International.

In October of 2014, in appreciation for her continuing work with GFWC, Spiker was invited to attend Heifer's local 70th birthday celebration. There, she accepted an award on behalf of the club members who worked so hard during her chairmanship. This award was then passed on to state board members at their February 2015 meeting in Sacramento.

Her passion was also a family affair, as Spiker honored her family members by donating chickens, goats, trees, and honeybees to Heifer in their honor. As a token of those donations, she would give the honorees salt and pepper shakers and other knickknacks representing the farm animal or gifts she had donated in their name.

Spiker's dedication to Heifer also involved her church in Fair Oaks, California. When the children of the Sunday school challenged the Continued on page 2

·One in four teachers see nothing wrong with bullying and will only intervene 4% of the time.

• A victim of bullying is twice as likely to take his or her own life compared to someone who is not

•One out of 10 students drops out of school because they are bullied.





# **Folsom State Prison Inmate Riot Leaves One Dead**

FOLSOM, CA (MPG) - Sacramento investigators are continuing their probe of the homicide of inmate Hugo Pinell and the subsequent riot that involved approximately 70 inmates.

Two inmates allegedly stabbed Pinell at approximately 12:55 p.m. on August 12th. The riot started immediately after the attack. Pinell succumbed to his wounds and was pronounced dead at 1:22 p.m.

Correctional peace officers used significant amounts of pepper spray, approximately 160 rounds from less-lethal munitions, and three warning shots fired from the Mini-14 rifle to stop the disturbance that lasted for about 20 minutes.

So far, correctional officers have recovered at least 15 inmate-made weapons. The

B Facility maximum-security general population yard is still being processed as a crime scene. Inmate movement and programming on B Facility is limited to facilitate the ongoing investigation.

A total of 29 inmates were injured. Eighteen were treated for their injuries at the institution. Eleven were transported to outside hospitals for treatment of stab and puncture wounds, broken bones, head trauma, and other serious injuries. Five of the 11 inmates were admitted; one is in an intensive care unit in critical condition suffering from a severe head injury and multiple stab wounds. No staff members were injured in the disturbance.

Two inmates have been identified as suspects in the alleged murder of Pinell. Hugo Pinell, 71, was serving six life sentences for murder, rape, battery, aggravated assault, and voluntary manslaughter.

Pinell, who was born in Nicaragua, was convicted of rape in 1965 in Marin County and sentenced to life with the possibility of parole. Pinell began his sentence on March 19th, 1965 at San Quentin State Prison, where he was convicted in 1968 of attacking a correctional officer and was transferred to Folsom State Prison. There, he attacked another correctional officer and was transferred to a Correctional Training Facility in Soledad,

where in March 1971 he stabbed and killed Correctional Officer R.J. McCarthy.

Pinell was involved in the August 1971 uprising at San Quentin State Prison that resulted in the murder of three correctional officers: Paul Krasenes, Jere Graham, and Frank Deleon. Following his convictions and subsequent life sentences for the murders and assaults, Pinell was incarcerated at Corcoran's California State Prison and Pelican Bay State Prison.

Until his transfer to Sacramento's California State Prison on January 8th, 2014, as a result of the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation's case-bycase reviews of gang-validated inmates, Pinell was the longestserving Security Housing Unit inmate. He had been denied parole 10 times, most recently in May 2014.

Sacramento's California State Prison opened in 1986 and is a maximum-security prison that houses approximately 2,300 general-population inmates and employs about 1,700 people. The institution houses inmates serving long sentences and those who have proven to be management problems at other institutions. It also houses inmates requiring specialized mental health treatment.

Recent cases of interest

CASE: David Acuna & Guadalupe Cabrera

Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that the Honorable Michael Kenny sentenced 31-yearold David Acuna to 39 years to life her mouth, and covered her face with in prison and 32-year-old Guadalupe Cabrera to 8 years in prison. On May 7, 2015, a jury convicted Acuna of first-degree murder, personal use of a weapon, arson, and use of an accelerant. On April 20, 2015, Cabrera pled no contest to arson, use of an accelerant, and accessory after the fact to murder.

On February 1, 2013, Acuna knocked Patrick Kendrick unconscious during a dispute over electronics. Acuna then dragged Mr. Kendrick into the kitchen and stabbed him seven times in the neck and back, killing him. Acuna left the scene and asked Cabrera to help him obtain materials to craft two Molotov cocktails. Both defendants returned to the apartment and started a fire in an attempt to conceal evidence of the homicide.

**CASE:** Kenneth Anderson

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Laura West, Adult Sexual **Assault Prosecution Unit** 

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that 24-yearold Kenneth Anderson was convicted by jury of five counts of forcible sexual penetration by a foreign object and one count of unlawfully attempting to dissuade the victim from reporting the crime to law enforcement. The jury also found true special allegations that Anderson bound and personally inflicted great bodily injury on the victim during the commission of the sexual assault.

On March 25, 2014, Anderson entered a Subway restaurant approxi-**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District mately one hour before the victim was scheduled to open the business. He reset the alarm so the victim would not know he was inside when she arrived at approximately 6:30 a.m. Anderson struck the victim in the head, duct taped a shirt. He then proceeded to sexually

**CASE:** Andre Oroy Sr.

assault the victim.

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Bruce Chang, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced that Andre Oroy Sr. was convicted by jury of two counts of committing a lewd and lascivious act

Oroy molested a 3-year-old female family member. The conduct occurred when Oroy was babysitting the victim while her mother was at work. The victim in this case is the third family member to be molested by Oroy.

Oroy faces a maximum potential sentence of 25 years in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for September 9, 2015, in Department 17 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.

People may think about writing down their family memories, or putting together a photo album on grandma and grandpa, but many never actually take the time to do so. Often we wind up with pictures, letters, militarv memorabilia, and the like scattered about. Goldenlynk can help create a visual connection with all of this information, and much more.

Designed to capture stories through video sessions and resulting in the production of a top-quality DVD for all to share, Goldenlynk will interview individuals and let them tell their life's history, the good and the bad times, the chance to share the wisdom and experience of a lifetime. People are humbled by life's experiences when they begin to tell their personal and intimate

stories. Fisher mentioned that for those being interviewed, talking to a stranger such as himself actually allows the person to open up and say something about their lives that they may have a hard time expressing to a loved one face to face. Through the video, the person can leave these memory moments for loved ones to share. Goldenlynk will create multiple DVDs of their interview session as well.

Recently, Fisher preserved the stories of an 88-year-old gentleman who, soon after the interview, passed away. As the family was settling their relative's estate, they were made aware of the Goldenlynk DVD and expressed to Fisher their delight in having this DVD as a part of their family history. Fisher said, "They were able to

Dare to Live Without Limits Forces of Nature: Dealing with the Unexpected

Be prepared for a variety of scenarios. Don't wait until something happens to take action. For example, buy an umbrella or raincoat before it rains. 





### **How to Protect Your Eyes from Macular Degeneration**

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is macular degeneration hereditary? My mother lost her vision from it before she died a few years ago, and now at age 65, I'm worried I may get it. What can you tell me?

Nearsighted Susan

Dear Susan,

Having a parent or sibling with macular degeneration does indeed increase your risk three to four times. But the good news is there are things you can do to protect your eyesight, and a number of treatments that are available if you do happen to get it. Here's what you should know.

### What is AMD?

Macular degeneration, also known as age-related macular degeneration (or AMD) is the most common cause of vision loss in people over age 50, affecting about 10 million Americans.

AMD is a progressive eye disease that damages the macula, the part of the eye that allows us to see objects clearly, causing vision loss in the center of your vision. This affects the ability to read, drive, watch television and do routine daily tasks, but it does not cause total blindness.

There are two types of AMD - wet and dry. Dry AMD, which affects about 90 percent of all people that have it, progresses slowly and painlessly over a period of years. While wet AMD is much more aggressive and can cause severe vision loss in a matter of weeks or months.

Factors that can increase your risk of getting AMD include age (60 and older); smoking; excessive exposure to sunlight especially if you have light-colored eyes; certain genetic components; a family history of AMD; high blood pressure; obesity; and being Caucasian.

For anyone over the age of 60, it's a smart idea to get your eyes examined by an ophthalmologist every year. They can spot early signs of AMD before vision loss occurs. Early signs, however, may include shadowy areas in your central vision or unusually fuzzy or distorted vision. The Amsler grid at amslergrid.org, is a good tool to check your eyes for AMD.

### **Preventing AMD**

While there's currently no cure for AMD there are some things you can do if you're high risk. One option is to talk to your doctor about taking a daily dose of antioxidant vitamins and minerals known as AREDS - vitamins C and E, plus copper, lutein, zeaxanthin, and zinc. Studies by the National Eye Institute have shown that AREDS can reduce the risk by about 25 percent that dry AMD will progress.

Most drug stores sell these eye supplements in tablet or soft gel form over-the-counter for around \$20 to \$30, but be aware that not all eye supplements contain the proper formulation.

Choose either the PreserVision Eve Vitamin AREDS Formula. PreserVision Eye Vitamin Lutein Formula, PreserVision AREDS2 Formula, or ICAPS AREDS. These four options contain the right formula mix.


Other lifestyle adjustments that may help prevent or delay AMD include eating antioxidant-rich foods such as dark green, leafy vegetables, and cold-water fish for their omega-3 fatty acids; protecting your eyes from the sun by wearing UV protective sunglasses; controlling high blood pressure; exercising regularly; and if you smoke, quit.

### **Wet AMD Treatments**

For wet AMD, there are several effective medications (Lucentis, Avastin and Eylea) available that can stop vision loss and may even restore it. These medications are given by injection into the eye, and repeated every month or two, perhaps indefi-

Note that each of these three drugs works equally in treating wet AMD, but there's a big cost difference. Avastin costs just \$50 per month, compared with \$2,000 for the other two. So experts recommend Avastin as the first choice for most people with wet AMD, especially if you don't have supplemental Medicare coverage.

The Sixties, which to this day generates feelings of nostalgia for what many view as the coolest decade, enjoyed a long run of spy capers that might have been, in certain ways, the antidote to anxiety about the tensions underlying the height of the Cold War.

Early in the decade, James Bond, the suave, cool superspy, made his debut with "Dr. No," quickly followed by "From Russia with Love," "Goldfinger," and an endless stream of 007 adventures.

Less serious efforts mimicked the Bond popularity, with James Coburn as master spy Derek Flint and Dean Martin as secret agent Matt Helm. Like James Bond, both Flint and Helm, exuding Sixties cool, were popular with the ladies.

The spy business was not confined just to the big screen. Of course, there was the hugely popular 1960s television series "The Man from U.N.C.L.E.," starring Robert Vaughn and David McCallum, which has now been adapted by director Guy Ritchie for a fresh take on the stylish spy genre.

Set in 1963 at the height of the Cold War, Ritchie's "The Man from U.N.C.L.E.," developed as an origin story, centers on the seminal yet reluctant alliance of two agents on both sides of the Iron Curtain given the mission to stop a mysterious international criminal organization.

Henry Cavill's debonair CIA agent Napoleon Solo, dressed in a natty suit, is first seen crossing Checkpoint Charlie into

### STYLISH ACTION IN "MAN FROM U.N.C.L.E." RETRO SPY CAPER

East Berlin. His mission is to extract the daughter of a vanished German scientist, who is the key to infiltrating the criminal organization.

Armie Hammer's rough-edged KGB agent Illya Kuryakin, a volatile yet loyal soldier for Communist Russia, has also been sent to East Berlin to snatch the same vital German asset. When Solo and Kuryakin first meet, they are trying to kill each other.

Meanwhile, in an exciting, breakneck, winner-take-all street chase, Solo makes his way to the free world with Gaby Teller (Alicia Vikander), a whip-smart East German auto mechanic who is the estranged daughter of Dr. Udo Teller, once Hitler's favorite rocket scientist.

The German scientist has gone missing, presumably now in the clutches of the secretive criminal cabal, which happens to be organized by neo-fascist Italian heiress Victoria Vinciguerra (Elizabeth Debicki), an attractive ice queen who looks like a model in Vogue magazine.

Given the high stakes of dealing with a rogue terrorist group with Nazi ties, the Soviet and American agents are forced by their handlers to work together to find the missing scientist and avert nuclear disaster.

Sworn rivals, Solo and Kuryakin vent their national and professional antagonism in a bare-knuckled, bust-up-the-furniture fight designed to convey in no uncertain terms that they might be stuck with each other, but they don't have to like it.

What results from lingering hostility is a strange sort of buddy movie, with Solo as the suave and often self-serving agent (we learn that he was an art thief after World War II, then given a job in the CIA rather than jail time).

Solo's background sounds very much like the premise for Robert Wagner's thief-cumagent Alexander Mundy in the late Sixties TV series "It Takes a Thief." Both Solo and Mundy are the sophisticated playboy types.

For his part, the petulant Kuryakin, faithful foot soldier for his authoritarian homeland, deals awkwardly with his newfound role of cooperative spy, and yet he manages to pretend to be an architect engaged to Gaby as a cover when they arrive in Italy.

Using his playboy charm and skills as a thief, Solo gets close to the villainous Victoria, finagling his way into her exclusive party held during an auto race where her husband (Italian actor Luca Calvani) spends his time mostly on the track.

In the hands of Guy Ritchie "The Man from U.N C.L.E." proves to be an interesting and entertaining summer action film. As a director, Ritchie has an interesting career, starting with great crime films "Lock, Stock & Two Smoking Barrels" and "Snatch."

More recently, Ritchie directed the acclaimed block-busters "Sherlock Holmes" and "Sherlock Holmes: A Game of Shadows." However, he is not immune to bad judgment; while married to Madonna, he co-wrote and directed the execrable "Swept Away" for this then-spouse.

Fortunately, the director knows how to stage impressive set pieces and thrilling action sequences where the stunts are remarkably striking in their execution. "The Man from U.N.C.L.E." has plenty enough of both.

The best of "The Man from U.N.C.L.E." involves many moving parts, from the chemistry that develops with the trio of Gaby, Solo and Kuryakin to the sometimes playful, lighthearted tone where humor is an important ingredient.

The film is also visually dazzling, where the setting of 1963 appears so authentic that the scenic locations in "The Man from U.N.C.L.E." are indistinguishable from the style of the predecessor movies and TV shows that were actually filmed during the Sixties.

Would you believe that in one highprofile cyberattack that took place in late June of 2013 and early 2014, hackers broke into 100,000 consumer gadgets, including refrigerators, televisions, wireless speakers, and media centers? They used these appliances to release almost a million malicious emails. All of this connectivity has left us wide open for cyber hacking. Oster gave me his top 10 tips for preventing your information from being stolen.

Early detection is key. Set one day a week to monitor all your statements.

- •Enroll in any real-time alerts for all your credit cards, banking, and retirement accounts.
- •Change all of your PINS and PASSWORDS on a regular basis.
- Subscribe to a robust credit monitoring service that has a resolution service included.
- •Never use public Wi-Fi for sensitive browsing, banking, or shopping.
- Update your browser to the newest version.

- •Run a full scan on your computer.
- •Back up all your files (pictures, videos, personal banking) regularly.
- •Disconnect all devices when not using the internet.
- ·Limit the amount of information you share on social media. Make your accounts private.

After hearing all this information from someone who deals with these hackers on a daily basis, what I fear most is that this is only the beginning. Almost daily, we hear reports of massive hacks into not only our private information but that of major government sites and companies we all frequent. So I guess we need to be extra vigilant with this newfound tool that seems so innocent to use. I suspect there are no guarantees, but we can certainly do the best we can with what we have.


