# **Cancer Survivors Come Together at Relay for Life**

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Children scrambled around a sunny athletic field while a band played rock 'n' roll music in the distance. Nearby, adults and teens power-walked the surrounding track, its edges dotted with camping tents and a lemonade stand, and volunteers arranged folding chairs for a late-night movie screening.

The atmosphere at the Sacramento Waldorf School in Fair Oaks was festive and upbeat, though the purpose for being there was somber: numerous participants at the Relay for Life event on April 18th had their lives affected by cancer at some point. The 24-hour American Cancer Society campout drew 15 teams of volunteers over the weekend, most of them survivors or loved ones out in full force, fighting back.

"I've had cancer in my life since I was five," said American Cancer Society community manager Brandie Owens. Her father was diagnosed with malignant melanoma that started as a disfigured mole and eventually spread to his brain. "I don't know cancer without hope," Owens said, crediting her father's endurance of several surgeries and drug trial therapies with inspiring her to help find a cure.

Relay participant Dave Wesley has been involved with Relay for Life for more than 20 years since he overcame prostate cancer. Wesley, whose father died of the same disease, has earned the St. George National Award, American Cancer Society's highest recognition for outstanding leadership and volunteer work. He often travels the country meeting with scientists and seeking grant funding for



research, which he considers critical for advancing prevention, diagnosis, and treatment methods.

"Having had the chance to sit on research committees, we want the best and brightest people," Wesley said. "The more scientists learn...the more they know, the more they don't

## Sacramento County **Recruiting for Inspector General**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors announced a new recruitment for the Office of Inspector General. The position provides monitoring and oversight to the overall quality of law enforcement within the County, oversees investigations of citizen complaints against the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, advises County leadership to encourage best practices, ensures objectivity and fairness of investigations, and acts as liaison to the general public regarding complaints and investigations.

"The Board of Supervisors, the Sheriff, and the executive leadership of Sacramento County are committed to the sustainability of this vital public safety function," said Phil Serna, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors. "It is absolutely necessary, but recently the County has struggled to find the right fit for the position; we're reaching out again to all qualified individuals who can help us establish a strong, transparent and independent oversight function."

The Office of the Inspector General is a contract position and will not be an employee, have a direct relationship with the Sheriff, or be subject to the direction and control of the Sheriff's Department. The position will work closely with the Sheriff's Department but will be housed in a separate and distinct office space, remaining independent.

"We look forward to bringing on a qualified candidate to help us continue to bring oversight and accountability to the work we do," said Sacramento County Sheriff Scott Jones. "The Office of Inspector General can provide transparency and help maintain trust between our office and the public we serve and to that end, we look forward to the additional insight that position can provide."

- Metro Fire recently opened the application period for Fire Camp, a day camp that takes place from July 7th through the 10th. Fire Camp provides local children a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to experience today's fire service first hand. The program is designed to instill self-confidence, teamwork, and a basic understanding of the firefighting profession in a fun and exciting atmosphere.

Campers are grouped in "strike teams" of eight campers, and each strike team is mentored by two Metro Firefighters. Campers learn valuable life safety skills while discovering what it means to be a firefighter.

To attend Fire Camp, applicants must be 11, 12, or 13 years of age, with preference given to those living within Metro Fire's boundaries. Applications are processed in the order in which they are received, so apply early for a better chance of securing a spot. The deadline to apply is Thursday, June 4th.

In order for the accepted camper to attend, a parent or guardian must attend a Mandatory Orientation Meeting on June 18th at 7:00 p.m. The fee to attend Fire Camp is \$100 per camper.

## SMUD Offers Helpful Kite Flying Safety Tips

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

With just a little practice and a breeze, anyone can launch a kite away from power lines. with ease. Kite flying is a fun and easy hobby, but before flying any kite it's important to be safe because kites and electricity don't mix. The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) offers these simple electrical equipment. safety tips to help make kite flying a safe experience:

Build or buy kites made of wood or plastic. Only use cloth

Fly kites in wide, open areas

Only use cotton, linen, or nylon string. Never use metallic thread, wire, or wire reinforced string as they can cause a fire, serious injury, or death if they come in contact with energized

Only fly kites in dry weather. When kite string gets wet, it is a stronger conductor of electricity.

If a kite gets caught in

electrical lines or falls into a substation, leave it there. Do not touch any part of the kite or string and keep everyone away. To have a SMUD employee come out to safely retrieve a kite caught in power lines or equipment, call 1-888-742-SMUD

## **Donated Medical Equipment Is Key to Animal Adoption**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - To ready shelter animals for adoption, medical services are often needed. Some animals come to Sacramento County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter with abscessed teeth, skin conditions, and badly in need of grooming. Others may have internal medical conditions or been injured and in need of surgery. Still others just need some "manners" or a bit of TLC at a foster home. These are just some of the things Sacramento County does daily to prepare the roughly 15,000 animals for adoption that come to the shelter annually.

Shelter Veterinarian Jean Rabinowitz said, "Who would adopt a pet that needs hundreds of dollars in veterinarian services right off the bat? The answer is, not many. We need to address the health issues of our shelter animals in order to get these perfectly wonderful animals into permanent homes."

The County's Bradshaw Shelter has been awarded grants and donations for specialized medical equipment that helps provide enhanced veterinary services to more effectively treat the shelter animals. Whether it's to perform diagnostics or surgery, the state-of-the-art equipment like the digital X-ray machine, orthopedic power equipment, anesthesia delivery system, and the new dental unit enables County veterinarians to quickly assess, make diagnoses, and treat the animals that are on a journey to find new homes.

Department Director Dave Dickinson said, "Having this equipment at the shelter eliminates stressful offsite transport, speeds care and gets us to our goal of increasing adoptability of our animals, and simultaneously reduces the shelter's population. We will always have animals in need of life-saving medical services, and community donations and volunteering can help the Shelter continue to offer these vital services to shelter animals."

In fact, the donation by Sacramento County residents, Jack and Kathleen Sellers, of nearly \$8,000 for a veterinary dental unit with compressor (\$5,995) and dental scaler (\$1.795) has already increased the adoptability of the Shelter

"Something as simple as poor dental health can be the door to other detrimental and expensive medical issues," said Dr. Rabinowitz. "That's why this new dental equipment is so important. Through the generous donation from the Sellers, we can now treat the animals that come through our Shelter, get them healthy and ultimately to their new families."

Kathleen Sellers came to know Dr. Rabinowitz through her work to help senior and special needs Chihuahuas. At any one time, Jack and Kathleen have several of these senior citizen dogs in foster care on their ranch. While fostering a senior Chihuahua named Autumn from the Shelter, Kathleen brought her to Dr. Rabinowitz for surgery. Unfortunately, due to her age, Autumn was in advanced kidney failure and couldn't have the surgery.

Kathleen, committed to her mission to help other Chihuahuas, was interested in fostering Pepper, another of Bradshaw's Shelter animals. Dr. Rabinowitz explained that, unfortunately, Pepper needed extensive dental work, and that's when Kathleen and her husband saw an opportunity to do even more to help shelter animals by donating the money needed for the dental unit.

Kathleen Sellers said, "We made this donation in memory of Autumn and Pepper and also sponsored a Habitat Room at the Bradshaw Animal Shelter. Without the teamwork of the vets and the dental technicians who volunteer their time. this wouldn't have been made possible. I appreciate all the Shelter staff and volunteers for what they do to help these animals get forever homes."

When the public makes Special Medical Needs Donations, those contributions are earmarked for medical procedures for the County's Shelter animals or for needed surgical equipment, supplies, and medications.

In addition to donating medical funds, the community can help in other ways to get shelter animals adopted. The Shelter's volunteers and foster providers help shelter animals to brush-up on their manners and provide consistency and behavioral training, while other animals can get stressed out at the Shelter and need a home environment with a foster care provider. A little one-on-one TLC by volunteers and foster providers is often the solution that gets a skittish animal, or one that is acting out, on

the right track to adoption. Meghan Ramczyk, Rescue/Foster Coordinator said, "I liken the shelter to city living, and just like people, city living can stress them out; that's where foster providers are truly life savers and can help an animal decompress in a home environment. I've seen remarkable transformations in animals with just a couple weeks offsite. When potential adopters see a happy animal, they are more apt to adopt them.'





Over the last two years the world has combated the largest Ebola epidemic in history. And the current upsurge, beginning in West Africa in 2013, continues even though it has fallen off the front pages of our newspapers.

Ebola is a fearful disease. There are multiple strains, a dreadful mortality rate, and scientists know precious little about it, as Ebola is relatively new to the medical community. The first outbreak was less than 40 years ago, so unlike the flu, the mumps, or polio, generational knowledge of the disease is lacking.

To that point, scientists don't know exactly how the virus leaves the animal population and crosses over to humans. They don't know where the natural reservoir, that is the primal source, for the disease is located. They don't know how Ebola will evolve and mutate going forward - there is just so much we do not know.

Yet, what we do know is this: Health workers have been at the forefront of combating this disease, unselfishly submitting themselves to incredible risk in the process. They remind me of Christ who would walk among the diseased and infected, unafraid to touch, to heal, and to

I heard one of these workers, a nurse, interviewed via radio late last year when the Ebola hysteria was at its peak. The interviewer asked a good

question: "What materials or supplies do you need to improve your work?" I waited to hear her speak of more money, more hospital beds, more IVs, or what not - all were definitely needed.

But the nurse gave a surprising, most beautiful answer. She said, "What we need are new biohazard suits; ones with full, clear screens so the patients can see our faces." She went on to describe their current outfits: Bulky, hot, with only eye holes to peer out of, or cumbersome goggles.

Then she spoke of how patients were scared, sick with this gruesome disease, afraid of dying, isolated from their family and friends, and were being cared for by "foreigners" who didn't necessarily speak their language. She concluded: "We need the new suits so they can see our faces...so they can see us smile at them, and be less afraid."

This nurse is a skilled caregiver, regardless of her technical proficiency, for she understands that the healing process requires kindness, warmth, and clarity as much as it requires antibiotics and oxygen tanks. "So they can see our faces," is simply, good medicine

Her words reminded me of the great Aaronic blessing from the Hebrew Bible. It goes something like this: "May God bless you and protect you. May God smile on you and show you grace. May God look you full in the face and give you peace." It's all that anyone could ask for, good medicine for sure: To have

That is, he is caring, loving, and healing, showing his face to those who will see it. Yes, that face is sometimes masked by religion's camouflage or some creed's bulky, cumbersome language.



What's important to you? What do you believe in? Are you willing to stand up for your convictions? Can you withstand criticism of your views? Will you take a stand in spite of being urged to just go with the

When you have strong, unshakable beliefs you are willing to take a stand in support of your convictions. You don't care what others think of your position. You don't care about majority opinion. Fads are of no concern. Being accepted isn't of any importance.

The stands you take aren't for sale. Your stands are rooted in a solid foundation of character. You will not change your stance because of money. You can not be pressured to alter your beliefs. The stands you take define who you are. Your actions aren't based on what others think.

People who don't, won't, or can't take a stand, have no core beliefs. Their position shifts based on the prevailing opinion. They will readily alter their stands for money or due to pressure. It's easy for them to get caught up doing things they shouldn't be doing.

The news headlines are filled with examples of people who don't have strong enough core

beliefs to take a stand. The lives of people from every social and economic strata self-destruct as a result of inappropriate behavior. They stretch the limits of hypocrisy. There are few temptations they can resist

As commendable as it is to take a stand, it is not easy. This is especially true when your position is not popular. You will face lots of pressure to alter your views. Many people tend to go with the crowd. It takes courage to hold your ground.

America was founded by people willing to take a stand for what they believed in. They risked their lives to do so. After all, what chance did an untrained group of farmers have against the awesome might of the British army? If you think it's tough taking a stand, be inspired by those who gave you the freedom to hold firm in your convictions.

What do you gain by standing up for what you believe in? It provides a solid basis for all you do. You have a clear view of who you are and where you are going. You won't be blown off course by whims or temptation. You will have a clear conscious and won't have to be looking over your shoulder.

You can build up the habit of standing firm. Start practicing with issues important to you. Speak up for what is right and against that which is wrong. It's OK to be ridiculed. It's often part of the process. People would rather criticize your stance than take their own.

As you continue to stand up for what you believe, the process will become second nature. You will no longer have any internal conflict as to what you should do. So take a stand and be your own person.

## "Kids Don't Float" Life Vest Program is Underway

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The Sacramento region has experienced unseasonable warm weather over the past few weeks, sending families and adults flocking to our beloved waterways. The American River Parkway Foundation began installing the Kids Don't Float boards on March 30th, 2015.

The American River Parkway Foundation has unveiled its Kid's Don't Float program two months early. The lifesaving program allows individuals to borrow a life jacket while they are enjoying Sacramento's waterways.

In 2008, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors adopted an ordinance requiring life preservers for access to the public waters within the County of Sacramento. The ordinance reads in part, "It is unlawful for any parent to permit his or her child under the age of thirteen (13) in his or her care to access any public waters unless such child is wearing a life preserver." Violation of the ordinance is punishable by a fine of \$500 and/or six months in jail.

From now through Labor Day, the life vest stations will be re-supplied and inspected twice a week by the Drowning Accident Rescue Team (DART), Sacramento Metro Fire, and Sacramento County Park Rangers. The station locations include Discovery Park (two sites), Ancil Hoffman Park, Howe Avenue river access, Watt Avenue river access, Paradise Beach, River Bend Park, and Sunrise river access. Each station offers 20 life

vests in various kid sizes.

Executive Director Dianna Poggetto said the Foundation will spend \$10,000 to purchase new life vests. "There are going to be a lot of people heading to the river in the coming weeks and, with the current conditions, practicing water safety rules and wearing life vests will be even more critical in preventing drowning accidents."

Cyclists, runners, picnic-goers, and nature lovers are among the more than eight million people a year who use the Parkway for various recreational activities. For more information on ARPF volunteer and donor programs, please see www.arpf.org or call (916) 486-2773.





Meanwhile, heat oven to 350°F. Remove plastic wrap from rolls and bake 25-29 minutes or until golden brown. Cool in pan on wire rack while preparing glaze.

until doubled in size.

Extract 1/4 teaspoon salt

Heat oven to 375°F.

Working with 1 disk at a time, roll each to 1/8-inch thickness on generously floured surface. Cut cookies using 2-inch round cutter. Place on cookie sheet and make indentation in dough with thumb. Spoon 1/2 teaspoon pastry filling into each indentation.

Bake 16–18 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool cookies on pan on cooling grid 5 minutes. Remove from pan; cool completely on grid. Dust with confectioners' sugar before serving.

### **DREAMWEAVER**

We all dream. It's mandatory even if you don't remember what that wild and crazy dream was about. Besides, if you do remember it, it's pretty confusing. But Justina Lasley told me on POPPOFF that we need to pay attention to our dreams and use them as a guide. She said that dreams will never take us off course from being uniquely the person we were born to be. Justina is Founder and Director of the Institute for Dream Studies and author of several books, her latest "Wake Up" Use your nighttime dreams to make your daytime dreams come true. But you need to remember those dreams first, so I asked Justina for the Top Ten tips for Dream

1) BUY A DREAM JOURNAL like the one at www.DreamJournal. org to show your unconscious that you are committed. Before sleep, record the date and a brief synopsis of the day.

2) BEFORE GOING TO BED, MANIFEST YOUR INTENTION TO REMEMBER YOUR DREAMS. Put

your recording materials by your bed and ask your unconscious to share a dream with you.

**3) GET TO BED A LITTLE EARLIER THAN USUAL.** Shifting your sleep schedule often helps.

4) AVOID TAKING UNNECESSARY MEDICATIONS BEFORE BED. Antihistamines and certain other medications can inhibit recall. Vitamin B6 is thought to increase recall.

5) IF YOU WAKE IN THE NIGHT, FOCUS ON ANY DREAM IMAGES YOU HAVE. Jot down a few words to jog your memory in the morning. Don't let sleepiness talk you into believing you will remember in the morning or that images have no significance. It is easy to talk yourself out of the necessary steps for recall.

6) SOME PEOPLE FIND IT HELPFUL TO DRINK EXTRA WATER BEFORE BED. Then you might have to get up in the night, thus waking up close to a dream segment and achieving recall.

7) IF YOU HAD NO RECALL DURING THE NIGHT AND YOU CANNOT MAKE ANY CONNECTIONS TO YOUR DREAMS UPON WAKING, STAY QUIETLY IN BED. Keep your eyes closed, and imagine some of the people in your life or some settings that are familiar to you. Sometimes just after flipping through these images will stimulate a reminder of a dream.

#### 8) UPON AWAKEING, RESUME THE SLEEPING POSITION YOU WERE IN WHILE DREAMING.

This is usually your most comfortable sleeping position. This is a very successful tool.

9) WRITE ANYTHING YOU REMEMBER...EVEN IF IT'S ONY ONE WORD, AN EMOTION, OR A PHYSIOLOGICAL RESPONSE.

One word can sometimes lead to important information. If you awake with a song or poem in mind, write it down. Nothing is insignificant.

10) IF YOU CANNOT REMEMBER ANYTHING, MAKE AN NOTE TO THAT EFFECT IN YOUR JOURNAL. "I do not remember anything about my dreams last night. If I had I would take time to remember it." It is amazing how receptive your unconscious is to your true efforts.

According to Justina, once you are serious about the process, the unconscious will reward you with dream memories. You're going to be amazed at what you have been sleeping through. # Cancer Survivors Come Together at Relay for Life

Hale of Fair Oaks. He walked in remembrance of his mother who died of colon cancer in 2008. Hale—a veteran of 121 relays—honors her memory by walking one mile for each of the 4,992 quilts that she made in her lifetime. So far he's tallied up more than 2,900. Though Hale came alone, he was among many friends that he's made over the years at Relay for Life. "I have a relay family, I guess," Hale said.

Among those relay relatives was 17-year-old Katherine Bingaman. She was sponsored by Hale for the Miss Relay

Ambassador contest, which she won earlier that day for her knowledge of ACS facts. She was struck by the pervasive nature of cancer and how many people she knows who have been affected by it, including her mother and grandmother, though her experiences have not been limited to her family. "Multiple friends of mine have had parents die," Bingaman said.

Many events and activities at the relay were symbolic, starting with the 24-hour duration of the event symbolizing the non-stop struggle that cancer survivors face. Relay favorites such as the Survivors Lap and the Luminaria ceremony celebrated those who have survived and mourned those who did not.

For Bingaman, Relay for Life is about more than her own experiences; it's her way of taking up arms with everyone else against

cancer and showing solidarity.

"I relay for everyone because I think everyone's connected to cancer," Bingaman said. "I don't want it to be that way."

- The most comprehensive research ever conducted into teen crashes found substantial evidence that distracted driving is a much more serious problem than previously known, according to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety. Video analysis finds that distraction was a factor in nearly six out of 10 moderate-to-severe teen crashes. This is four times as many crashes as official estimates based on police records.

Researchers at the University of Iowa analyzed the six seconds leading up to a crash in nearly 1,700 videos of teen drivers taken from in-vehicle recording devices. The results showed that distraction was a factor in 58% of all crashes studied including 89% of road-departure crashes and 76% of rear-end crashes. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) previously estimated that distraction is a factor in only 14% of all teen crashes.

Among the key findings in the

study were that drivers manipulating their cell phone (calling, texting, or other uses) had their eyes off the road for an average of 4.1 seconds out of the final six seconds leading up to the crash. Researchers also measured reaction time in rearend crashes and found that teen drivers using a cell phone failed to react more than half of the time before impact, meaning

## **Social Security Offers Lump Sum Payouts to Retirees**

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've heard that Social Security offers a lump-sum payment to retirees who need some extra cash. I have not yet started drawing my benefits and would like to investigate this option. What can you tell me?

- Almost Retired

Dear Almost,

There are actually two different kinds of Social Security claiming strategies that can provide retirees a big lump-sum benefit, but you need to be past full retirement age to be eligible, and there are financial drawbacks you need to be aware of

First, let's review the basics. Remember that while workers can begin drawing their Social Security retirement benefits anytime between ages 62 and 70, full retirement age is currently 66 for those born between 1943 and 1954, but it rises in two-month increments to 67 for those born in 1960 and later. You can find your full retirement age at ssa.gov/pubs/ageincrease.htm.

At full retirement age, you are entitled to 100 percent of your benefits. If you claim earlier you'll receive less, while if you delay you'll get more – roughly 8 percent more for each year until age 70.

#### **Lump Sum Options**

If you are past full retirement age, and have not yet filed for your benefits, the Social Security Administration offers a retroactive lump-sum payment that's worth six months of benefits.

Here's how it works. Let's say you were planning to delay taking your Social Security benefits past age 66, but you changed your mind at 66 and six months. You could then claim a lumpsum payment equal to those six months of benefits. So, for instance, if your full retirement age benefit were \$2,000, you would be entitled to a \$12,000 lump sum payment.

If you decided at age 66 and four months that you wanted to file retroactively, you'd get only four months' worth of benefits in your lump sum, because SSA rules prohibit you from claiming benefits that pre-date your full retirement age.

Another option that provides even more cash is the "file and suspend" strategy. Again, this option is only available to people on (or after) full retirement age.

Here's how this strategy works. Let's say you're 66, and you decide to delay your benefits. You could file for your benefit and then immediately suspend it. This gives you the ability to collect a lump sum going back to the date you filed. So if you need money at age 69 for example, and your full retirement age benefit was \$2,000, you could get a three-year lump sum of \$72,000.

#### **Drawbacks**

The big downside to these strategies is that once you accept a lump-sum payment, you'll lose all the delayed retirement credits you've accrued, and your future monthly retirement benefit will be reduced to reflect the amount you already received.

Here's an example of how this works. Let's say that you are entitled to a \$2,480 monthly benefit at age 69. By taking a three-year lump sum payment, your future benefits will shrink back to \$2,000 per month, which is what you would have received at your full retirement age. This also affects your future survivor benefit to your spouse or other eligible family members after you die.

You also need to consider Uncle Sam. Depending on your income, Social Security benefits may be taxable, and a lump-sum payment could boost the amount of benefits that are taxed. To help you calculate this, see IRS Publication 915 "Social Security and Equivalent Railroad Retirement Benefits" at irs.gov/pub/irs-pdf/p915.pdf, or call 800-829-3676 and ask them

to mail you a copy.

One other caveat: If you're married and you "file and suspend" your Social Security benefit, you cannot file a "restricted application" too, which gives you the ability to collect spousal benefits while delaying your own retirement benefit past full retirement age.



Craig Meyer has an extensive background in theatre and music, aiding his already spoton resemblance to Elton John's over-the-top style and unforgettable sound. On Broadway, Meyer created the role of Clinton Badger in MGM's classic "Meet Me in St. Louis" and has toured nationally in "Cats," "Starlight Express," and "Irving Berlin's White Christmas."

He can do ANYTHING."
