## Citizenship Ceremony Held for Young Americans

ORANGEVALE, CA (MPG) -

On March 17th, the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services Sacramento Field Office held a ceremony at Twin Lakes Elementary School in Orangevale. Seventeen young people, ages 10 to 24, took their citizenship oath in front of 150 students. When a parent naturalizes, his or her children below the age of 18 automatically become citizens. That was the case for those honored, each of whom received a certificate to show as proof of U.S. citizenship.

## Local Scout Works His Way to Eagle

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - At the Boy Scout Court of Honor on March 14th, Del Campo High School senior Brandon Singer (17) received his Eagle Scout rank in the Boy Scouts of America, Troop 325. He worked his way up through the ranks from the age of eight, earning 39 merit badges as well as the World Conservation Award, On My Honor, Historical Trails Award, BSA Lifeguard, and Thomas S. Monson Award. "I did everything that I could to be active in Boy Scouting," Brandon said, "so it wasn't hard for me because I lived it."

Paul Anderson, local contractor and a Scout leader for 30 years, presented the Eagle Scout badge to Brandon. "Any boy who gets through an Eagle nowadays has pretty much figured out how to do things in life," Anderson said. "In order to accomplish an Eagle project, you learn how to be a project manager, which is a skill that just about everybody needs in their job—how to lead people and how to organize things."

Brandon's Eagle project improved the area surrounding the Mather Navigator

Memorial, which represents the men and women of the United States Air Force who trained as navigators at Mather Air Force Base throughout World War II and beyond. With nearly 90 volunteers, Brandon created a new path with a safer entrance and better wheelchair access, removed the entrance to the old path, added a culvert for proper drainage, and laid new bark around the memorial's center walkway. The group also put up a plaque indicating the monument's use as a sundial. The project logged 250 service hours for the actual site work.

Donations of materials fully supplied the project needs. Contributors included Sacramento County, Lowe's, River City Rentals, and Cascade Continued on page 6



## Don't Use It or Lose It

Californians Believe in Conserving Water, Drought or No Drought Residents are Willing to Make Significant Changes to Their Own Water Use

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - As California enters a fourth year of drought, a new statewide poll reveals that the vast majority of Californians (90%) are willing to make significant changes to conserve water both inside and out, and more than 80% believe it's important to conserve water regardless of whether the state is in drought or whether conservation is mandated by local water agencies.

The statewide poll of 801 registered voters—commissioned by the Association of California Water Agencies in partnership with the statewide conservation education program Save Our Water—also found that more than 80% of Californians view the drought and water shortages as "extremely" or "very" serious problems. Some 86% of polled residents believe that California is in a state of persistent water shortage.

Californians nearly universally agree that the drought is the most pressing problem facing the state and is more concerning than the economy, education, health care costs, and taxes.

"California is indeed a dry state that can expect to see persistent droughts in its future. This polling underscores the fact that a vast majority of Californians understand this new normal," said ACWA Executive Director Timothy Quinn. "But the poll also shows that an overwhelming majority of Californians are willing to significantly change their water usage whether we are in a drought or not. This is a sea change in public opinion and bodes well for our future."

Mark Cowin, director of the Department of Water Resources, noted that the poll indicates over three-quarters

The polling also indicates that of Californians have been getting the existing ones as the state remains locked message about the state's ongoing in a grinding fourth year of drought. The drought. DWR is a partner with ACWA in the Save Our Water program.

> "Clearly, Californians understand the magnitude of this drought," said Cowin. "Just as important, they understand that they can help California cope through the collective power of individual actions. If we all shut off sprinklers, make the effort to fix a leak, and urge friends and neighbors to do the same, it will make a difference."

> The poll of registered voters was conducted February 22nd through March 1st by the polling firm Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates (FM3). Its findings arrive as the State Water Resources Control Board prepares to act on proposed new emergency water conservation regulations today and extend

Sierra snowpack is at record low levels and January was among the driest months

"This poll's findings stand out among our many years of tracking water issues in California," said Dave Metz, principal and president of FM3. "We've never seen such a huge majority recognize the severity of the water crisis as well as such a large group that views the water problems as ongoing and warranting continued conservation."

Metz noted that 83% of those polled said conserving water is "extremely" or "very" important whether or not water agencies are requiring water conservation, suggesting that, for Californians, "conserving water has become more of a core value than simply a reaction to

regulations, restrictions, or other external factors."

The Save Our Water program is using the poll's findings to improve outreach to consumers this summer and to help local water agencies develop their own outreach programs on drought and conservation.

A desperate executive sought the counsel of an old guru who lived in a mountain cave. The executive was living a harried and hurried life. He was frustrated, his prayers were powerless, and his soul was tired. The holy man listened to his guest for a while, then retreated deep into his cave, returning shortly with a

He scooped water from the muddy little stream passing by the mouth of the cave and offered it to the executive to drink. Of course, the executive rejected it, even though he was very thirsty from his journey. The water was far too dirty.

After a while he offered the water again, but this time, all the silt had settled to the bottom of the basin and the water was clear and pristine. The man readily drank it. The wise man then asked, "What did you do to make the water clean?" The man answered, "I didn't do anything."

"Exactly!" said the old monk. "Your life is dark and troubled; it is disturbed and muddy because you are always allowing the water to become agitated. Only when it is calm will you have peace. So do nothing. Be still and let the water settle."

Be still. That's harder than it sounds, no doubt, but it is one of the best things for the health of our souls. Learn to turn down the noise (and stop contributing to the noise). Learn to cultivate some distance from this

clamorous world, because distance is a good thing when it comes to things and people who are harmful. Learn, by healthy boundaries to keep the raucous environment that is contemporary society at arm and ear's length, and you might begin to let the water of your own soul peacefully settle.

I don't have to work very hard to convince you that this world is a noisy place, do I? Talking heads, radio and viewpoint shows, 24-hour news, analysis on every hand, opinions like armpits: Court is always being held, comments are always being made, and there is a constant eagerness to share the oh-so-correct perspective. There's always someone babbling about something, and the air becomes so saturated with pandemonium, it seeps into our souls.

Jesus understood this. He once instructed his disciples, "When you pray, close the door and pray to your Father who is unseen...do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them." What a stark and necessary correction. Even in prayer, the "fewer the words the better,"

"Do not be like them," Jesus says. That is, "Don't be like this ear-splitting world that thinks loud opinions will actually be heard. Don't put on a show with your yammering, bloviated prattle. Shut up. Be still. Get quiet." It's good for you, not to mention

how everyone else will appreciate is as well.

It's not unlike the familiar story from Lyndon B. Johnson's administration as told by Skip Heitzig. Once, at a special dinner, Johnson was hosting a few members of his staff, and he called upon one of the men to say grace. The man, named Jim, began to pray and President Johnson, in his brash, demanding way interrupted. He said, "Speak up, Jim, I can't hear you." Jim answered, "With all due respect, Mr. President, I wasn't talking to vou."

Oh, that's exactly what Jesus is teaching his disciples. Too often, far too often, public prayer (much of religious instruction, actually) is not an invitation to stillness and humility before God. It is an invitation to commotion. It is "babble," or "vain repetition" as the King James Version translates Jesus' instructions. It is foolish rambling, tedious chattering, words that continue to stack up, but never really mean anything.

I have a friend who noted recently the the words ""listen" and "silent" are spelled with exactly the same letters and mean the same thing. And I think stillness is the quickest way to hear God, to "let the water settle," and find true peace.



Andrey Mudik, 15, of Citrus



This book, provides the knowledge to go past the traditional granny squares, to the sophisticated, elevating crocheters to the possibility of fascinating, with inventive new ways to crochet.

multiple broken and dislocated bones. I stayed in two hospitals for 7 months and 17 months of therapy followed. Not a life a teenager expects.

Some teens believe drinking alcohol is mixed in with the fun. That is wrong, especially if driving is included. Why copy a drunken driver? My dreams for life unexpectedly ended after a drunken driver hit me.

I cannot drive and hear perfectly now, but can talk and walk. That is a huge achievement.

My letters in newspapers throughout California and speeches at Central Valley schools brought more sober drivers to the roads.

Teenagers, show us you have learned: Do not drink and drive. This saves lives, including yours.
