Arms and Legs are Not a Luxury

SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG) - Did I get your attention? If you're reading this article in your community newspaper, you're probably turning the pages to view vital stories, features, and advertisements published to keep you informed of the happenings in your neighborhood. Now, imagine the frustration you would feel if you have no arms or hands to aid you in grasping the pages, the simplest of every day tasks. You have an artificial limb to provide you physical freedom, give you self reliance and ability, but it's propped up on the sofa a few feet away, unable to be utilized. It doesn't fit properly, and your medical insurance won't pay to have it repaired or adjusted because you've used up your allotted yearly or lifetime benefit. For the over two million people in the United States who have suffered the loss of one or more of their limbs, this situation is not unusual and is a harsh reminder that things are just not what they seem within President Obama's Affordable Healthcare Act. In California, it's been given the

catchy name Covered California. The main goal of the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare), signed into law in 2010, was to make health

insurance not only affordable but comprehensive for everyone.

Federal law contains a set of 10 "essential health benefits" providers must guarantee consumers of individual, small business insurance policies, and government sponsored programs (Medi-Cal). The White House has said repeatedly that these Obamacare guarantees "eliminate substandard policies that don't provide minimum services." States were allowed to craft their own set of essential health benefits, and California even came up with several additional benefits that range from organ transplants for HIV sufferers to Phenvlketonuria treatment. Although a minimal allowance for prosthesis is available under the Rehabilitative and Habilitative portion of California's declared essential benefits, there doesn't appear to be an equitable provision for the replacement, repair, and maintenance of artificial limbs.

The Perfect Combination

An Educational Feast

According to the healthcare cost and utilization project state in-patient database, California leads the country in hospital amputations performed: 14,800 in 2012. Due to this staggering number of new surgeries, California insurance carriers realize providing prosthesis coverage for an amputee who has suffered the trauma of losing a limb is vital. But when there are financial caps put on the lifelong process of actually being able to use the device, it can be devastating. Losing a limb is obviously a permanent occurrence.

During the lifetime of an amputee, the physiology of their severed limb changes due to many different reasons. Since a prosthesis is individually made in the initial stages of loss, any variance in weight, shrinkage of a stump, infection, etc. can

Arrest Made in Recent Threat of Violence Against Bella Vista High School

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - A 14-year-old each affected school. Bella Vista High School student suspected of authoring a threat of violence last week was arrested on campus today following an investigation by school and law enforcement officials. She faces a felony charge of making criminal threats and was booked into juvenile hall by the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department.

The arrest comes as investigations into copycat incidents at other district schools continue. Threats have been discovered at five high schools in the last two weeks. Although no evidence has been found indicating any of the threats are credible, law enforcement and district staff members have had an increased presence at High School families on today's

The Bella Vista student, a freshman, told school officials she had hoped to get a day off school and had no intent to carry out the

"The impact of the threat has been very real. Instructional time was lost when students staved home, and the threat caused anguish, uncertainty and fear in our community." said Bella Vista High School Principal Peggy Haskins. "Though it saddens me greatly to see one of our students face such harsh consequences for a poor choice, the nature of the threat and anxiety it caused are unacceptable for our community."

The threat was found in a girl's restroom Friday afternoon indicating a school shooting would occur Monday, Oct. 27. School staff members immediately notified the Sheriff's Department and the district's Safe Schools office and began an investigation. Attendance was down nearly 50 percent on Monday as families kept students home as a result of the threat.

Solo Vehicle Collision Resulting in Fatality

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - The California Highway Patrol, East Sacramento Area Office, is investigating a fatal collision that occurred on Sunset Avenue east of Sunset Place Lane, in Fair Oaks, CA. The collision occurred on October 28, 2014, at approximately 2:30 a.m.

An unidentified driver was driving a 2007 Nissan Frontier eastbound on Sunset Avenue when the driver entered a left curve and allowed the Nissan to leave the south roadway edge. The Nissan overturned and struck a tree, where it caught fire and became fully engulfed in flames. The Sacramento Metro Fire Department arrived on scene shortly after and extinguished the flames; however, the driver, who remained in the vehicle, perished at the scene and remains unidentifiable.

Excessive speed appears to be a contributing factor to this traffic


collision. Whether or not the driver was wearing a seatbelt at the time of this collision is unknown.

"All of us in the first responder industry, from the police to fire, we all consider each other brothers and sisters," said Sacramento Metro Fire Department Captain Brad Reynolds. "It's vitally important that we all share in this and show our support for their family members. As sad as an event as this is to bring us all together, it's very heartfelt to see this all happen."

Patrick Fintel of Sacramento County was present for the entire half-hour long procession to honor the sacrifice made by Deputy Oliver and his family. "I came to show respect to the fallen officers and their family and to let them know that we're all thinking

California Dungeness Crab **Season to Open November 1st**



CDFW reminds sport crabbers that traps and nets for Dungeness crab may not be set before 12:01 a.m. on November 1st. Those fishing with hoop nets should remember that regulations require raising the nets to the surface to inspect the contents at least every two hours.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- California's Dungeness crab sport fishery opens statewide this Saturday, November 1st. Every year at this time, recreational crab fishers eagerly set out in pursuit of these tasty crustaceans. Some set hoop nets and crab traps from boats and piers, while others fish crab loop traps on the end of a fishing rod. Still others will dive in to take the crabs by hand. Regardless of the method, Dungeness crabs are one of California's most popular

"Dungeness crab catches tend to be cyclic with several years of high crab numbers followed by a few years of lower catches," said CDFW Environmental Scientist Christy Juhasz. "Recent seasons have been characterized by high Dungeness crab production so we may begin to see more average catches in the near future."

The most popular methods for catching the crustaceans are with crab pots (or traps), loop traps and hoop nets. There is no limit to the number of pots or nets that can be fished recreationally, except when fishing from a public fishing pier where only two fishing appliances may be used. Recreational crabbers may keep up to 10 Dungeness crabs per day of either sex, or six crabs if fishing from a party boat south of Mendocino County. No one may possess more than one daily bag limit, and no Dungeness crab may be taken from San Francisco or San Pablo bays, which are

important crab nursery areas. CDFW reminds sport crabbers that traps and nets for Dungeness crab may not be set before 12:01 a.m. on November 1st. Those fishing with hoop nets should remember that regulations require raising the nets to the surface to inspect the contents at least every two hours. Any undersized crabs or other species that are accidentally caught can be more quickly released. This regulation ensures that fishermen closely monitor their gear and do not allow any equipment to be abandoned in state waters. Trap fishermen should also closely

monitor their traps because lost trap gear can become a self-baiting crab killer.

The recreational size limit for Dungeness crab is five and threequarter inches measured across the shell, directly in front of and excluding the lateral spines. Crab taken from party boats south of Mendocino County must measure at least six inches across.

Unlike rock crab species that are fished along rocky reefs, Dungeness crabs are usually found on sandy or sand-mud bottoms. Dungeness crabs generally prefer cooler northern and central California waters and are uncommon south of Point Conception. They are typically found at depths of less than 300 feet, although they have been documented down to 750 feet.

We all get stressed from time to time. We all get tempted, need wisdom and guidance for decisions, need comfort when we're sad, need help sharing the things of God with others, and need peace when we're worried. All these things can be realized through memorizing Scripture. I know of no other single spiritual exercise as powerful as memorizing God's Word.

No other single exercise pays greater spiritual dividends! Your spiritual walk is strengthened.

Your attitudes and outlook change. Your confidence soars! Your faith will grow stronger.

Decision making and sharing what God is doing in your life will become easier. All this happens through memorizing Scripture.

You may be thinking, "I'm not disciplined enough!" Remember discipline is "delayed gratification". That's all it is. I do the difficult now to enjoy the benefits later. If you understood the benefits of Scripture

memorization, you would have no problem memorizing a verse a week. If you're not memorizing Scripture, it just means that you don't yet understand the tremendous benefits.

If you're interested in spiritual strength and power then you're going to be able to do it. How important was it to David? Psalm 119:72 "The law you gave me means more to me than all the money in the world." That's how important God's Word ought to be to us.

So how do you do it? You can memorize during your quiet time. Another good time is when you're exercising. I like to do it while I'm waiting in a line at the store or in spare moments.

Many times I'll take a scripture verse written on a little card or tag and I'll work on it, memorize it, speak it out loud or whisper it. At bedtime is a good time so you go to sleep thinking spiritual


There are three major keys to memorizing scripture: The first key is to review. Go over and over it. The second key to memorizing scripture is to review. The third key is to review.

Say the verse reference before and after. The hardest part to remember is the reference, the address. So say it at the start and at the end. Read the verse aloud many times. You memorize by saying it aloud. You don't memorize things by reading it. You memorize things because your ear is a large factor with what you memorize.

Memory is a skill you can learn. It's a muscle you can strengthen. In fact, memorizing

Scripture will cause your brain to have a stronger memory in other areas. Study after study has shown this. Most important, Jesus Christ will help you. "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." Philippians 4:13. By the way, that verse would be a great verse to memo-







Lately, I've been thinking about my friend, Charles, and missing him. He was a husband, father, English teacher, social worker, canoeist, bluegrass player, therapist, connoisseur of green-apple moonshine, and a good friend.

He spent the last decade of his life as the Director of Student Services in my hometown school district, on the front lines of advocacy for some of the most vulnerable children in the community. It was a role he relished almost as much as playing Gordon Lightfoot and John Prine songs on his guitar.

Charles died a few years ago, succumbing to leukemia. Friends of his gathered on a scraggly piece of land along the Tallapoosa River in North Georgia for his memorial service. I am certain that we gathered exactly where Charles wanted us. He loved that piece of land and the river that runs through it. He used it as a retreat for his body and soul. It was his sanctuary.

I use the word "sanctuary" intentionally, for Charles wouldn't enter a church. You see, there was always a rebel's spirit behind Charles' jolly smile, and he had

lost a good deal of faith in politics, education, matrimony - in the human race in general. He seemed to have lost the most faith in religion.

He and I would often speak of religion. At such times I could always count on him to sum up his faith by quoting Emily Dickinson: "Some keep the Sabbath going to church; I keep it staying at home; With a bobolink for a chorister, and an orchard for a dome...God preaches - a noted clergyman and the sermon is never long; So instead of getting to heaven at last, I'm going all along!"

Yet, for all the lost confidence, Charles never lost his hope for living in a better world. This was, after all, his calling. He wanted life to be better, more just, peaceful, and whole. While often disappointed, he kept wishing - and working - for nothing less than the Kingdom of God (though he disagreed with my terminology).

The "Kingdom of God," can invoke images of a faraway heaven where we will live in the sweet by-and-by. I don't think that is accurate, because heaven is just not that far away. Jesus taught that while there is an eternal element to Christianity, having faith is not so much about moving up and out when we die; it is about embracing and fostering the presence of God in this current world.

Imagine (to quote another of Charles' favorite musicians) a world with "nothing to kill for." Imagine all people "living life in peace." Imagine a world where the

"lion will live with the lamb, where swords are beaten into plowshares, and justice rolls down like the waters." But do more than imagine such a future - do more than simply wish for it - work for it. Implement it. Practice it. Live it.

I believe, with all my heart, that one day all of creation will be remade. I believe the universe will be divinely washed clean of all that has gone wrong, and the world will be set right. But I do not believe such faith gives me permission to be a spectator waiting for utopia. Such faith compels me to act, as Charles did, living as God would have this world to be.

So it never troubled me that Charles didn't go to the "House of God" on Sundays. Rather, it encouraged me that he went to do the work of God every day. I was never bothered by his claims to have no faith. Rather, I was challenged by how he actually practiced his faith. So what if he wanted the church to be "better?" He was making the world better.

Let this be a challenge to us all - especially those of us who enthusiastically gather each Sunday or Sabbath: Not all of God's work is done within the four walls of the church house. In fact, the lion's share of it is done outside. And that's good, because that is where it is needed the most.

I'm following your plan, so I also have \$1,000 in my starter emergency fund and am working side jobs to make extra money. Since my job field is volatile, I've lost and found a couple of jobs in the last few years and have an older car. Should I beef up my emergency fund in case I go through another job loss or I have problems with my vehicle?

Dear Sarah,

In your case, I think you might want to increase your emergency fund to around \$3,000. Usually, I'd rather people focus on knocking out debt once they have a beginner emergency fund in place, but it sounds like you've got extenuating circumstances in your life. Older cars, especially those with lots of miles, could need attention at any time. And you're right about your job too. The newspaper world is pretty volatile and even downright insecure at times. This isn't your fault, but I'm glad you're looking ahead.

Just push the pause button on paying off debt for the moment, and build up your emergency fund a bit more. That will give you a little more wiggle room in case life decides to throw something unexpected at you. Then, go back to paying off debt before you increase your emergency fund to a full three to six months of expenses.

Having a little financial stability is a big thing for you right now, Sarah. It will help you feel a little more secure until the debt is gone. And once that happens, you'll really be able to fly!

Income is the problem

Dear Dave,

We had our first child a few months ago, and some of the bills have gone to collections. We've paid what we could, but we each make only about \$15,000 a year. Now, we're getting calls and letters from collectors wanting our checking account information and electronic access. When we won't give it to them, they accuse us of not following the terms and conditions of the agreements. They say we'll be penalized if we don't comply. What should we do?

Dear Stephanie,

You're doing the right thing by not giving them your account information and electronic access. The stuff they're saying is just collector talk, and they're full of crap. The

next time you talk to one of them, just let them know you have every intention of paying what's owed. But the bill is going to be paid by you. There's nothing in an agreement like that which gives them the right to your account numbers or electronic access. These people can stop lying and act right, or they can go jump in the lake.

The biggest issue here is your income. If I'm your husband, I'm going to find an extra job delivering pizzas a few nights a week for the time being. He could make an additional \$1,000 a month for the next 10 months, and that problem would be solved. Instead of working 40 to 45 hours a week, try working 60 to 80 for just a little while.

Still, you both need to examine your career track for the future. Look into different types of training and education with the attitude of doubling or even tripling your income in the next five years. I want you both to develop long-term plans to increase your income, and a short-term plan to get out from under this debt in a hurry. That's the kind of thinking that will get rid of collectors faster than anything else. They're just a symptom of the bigger problem.

Arms and Legs are Not a Luxury

cause the device to become ill fitting and useless. Multiple trips to the prosthetist (limb maker) are necessary to correct the problem. Sometimes it even requires more than one artificial limb be crafted within the same year. Because there are financial caps and special rules associated with this ongoing treatment by insurance companies, the likelihood of a complete restoration, repair, or replacement is diminished and an otherwise vibrant, self sufficient member of society is reduced to becoming a slave to their disability, and in some cases, an invalid requiring constant assistance; a costly insurance benefit which IS offered under most California insurance plans. To better understand the demoralizing and hopeless lifelong ramifications that can result from state controlled insurance exchanges placing financial caps, and thoughtless rules on the needs of people who have lost limbs, we can look at New York's lifetime cap.

If an individual suffers the loss of two limbs and requires prosthetics, under the "one limb per lifetime" rule, that person may have to make a choice as to which limb he or she wants to replace with an artificial device. In the event both legs or both arms are amputated, does the patient choose the right or the left, since only one may be paid for? Many children fall victims of accident or illness that result in the loss of a limb. At their young age, they will receive an artificial arm or leg. However, as they grow, the device doesn't grow with them, rendering them in need of additional artificial limbs throughout their life to continue on a path of independence and normalcy. This rule and the practice of "capping," no matter what the level in any state, is cruel and in the long run, due to secondary complications, has the potential to carry excessive expense above what the initial cost would be.

California passed a law in 1986 (10123.7 CA Insurance Commissioner) recognizing that prosthetic limbs need to be covered by private insurance. In 2007, the



wording was amended to proclaim that coverage must be "adequate." Unfortunately, it does not stipulate that insurance companies must cover prosthetic devices and ongoing care. According to the Amputee Coalition, this has created a situation where some plans (including many California Kaiser Plans) provide minimal or no coverage for prosthetic devices. By enacting the Insurance Fairness Amputee Act through government legislation, the needs of limbless individuals would be treated as other basic essential care items, guaranteeing amputees receive the attention they deserve at a reasonable cost.

Even with ongoing federal health reform, the Department of Health and Human Services bulletin released earlier this year indicated that prosthetic coverage was included with physician and specific office visits and surgery among other classifications. In simple terms, receiving an artificial limb and the necessary ongoing care that will assure it's useful is put in the same category as going to the doctor when you have the flu or having an appendix removed. This means the same percentage of co-payments and financial caps would come into play. Since an artificial limb can cost between \$5,000 and \$50,000 depending on the type and mobility requirements, the out of pocket expense to an amputee can be prohibitive under this interpretation.

According to the Covered California information office based in Sacramento, under the Covered California guidelines, the amount of "adequate coverage" provided by private insurance and government health care guidelines is determined by the level of insurance coverage an individual purchases (bronze, silver, or gold plans). The least expensive plan would warrant the most out of pocket expense. In a study performed by the California Insurance Commissioner's office, it

to consumers to include comprehensive prosthetic coverage to Covered California's Essential Benefits list would be 16 cents per month, or less than \$2.00 per year. In perspective, paying to insure an amputee can walk or have the use of their arms and hands would cost California insurance consumers less than purchasing 40 pieces of bubble gum within a year's time. It seems like a small price to pay to guarantee the growing population of those who have lost limbs, and future amputees, the right to experience the same life everyone else can. Let's remember that arms and legs are not a luxury. If limbless individuals are not given the opportunity to be independent by offering them the allowance they need, they will have no choice but to rely on other aspects of the medical insurance industry and government sponsored programs to compensate, creating an unnecessary taxpayer burden.

We as California constituents can do something to eliminate

was determined that the overall cost Covered California's unfair practice of placing financial caps on the needs of those who have suffered the loss of one or more limbs. The Amputee Coalition, a national organization committed to enriching the lives of America's amputees, has worked to raise awareness of this issue since the passage of the Affordable Healthcare Act (Obamacare) in 2010. They've provided public comments to Health and Human Services (HSS) and the Center for Medicare Services (CMS) as well as to state governors, legislators, and insurance commissioners, emphasizing the importance of including prosthetic and orthotic devices and vital continuing care in the mandated Essential Health Benefits. Four years later, there is little resolve nationwide. The members of the coalition are working with federal legislators to provide a sign-on letter to members of Congress. The instrument requests that the HHS and CMS offices use the enforcement powers they were bestowed by the Affordable Healthcare Act to

include necessary, on-going care to amputees. Join in to make a positive, worthwhile change to a growing population by contacting your elected officials and asking them to "do the right thing." After all, it's an election year in many districts, and politicians should be reminded that voters can't get out to the polls without legs, and they can't punch the ballot without arms and hands.



Helpful Tips for the Perfect Holiday Turkey

- When shopping for your turkey, look for one with a pop-up timer.
- To thaw your turkey, keep it in the refrigerator based on its weight. For example, it should remain in the refrigerator for 24 hours for every 5 pounds. To thaw quickly, place it in the sink and cover with cold water, changing the water every half hour per pound.
- Once the turkey has thawed, always refrigerate or cook immediately.
- When you're ready to cook, baste the bird with extra virgin olive oil. Place turkey with the breast up on a rack in a shallow roasting pan in an oven preheated to 325°F. Loosely cover turkey with foil to prevent over-browning.
- The turkey is done cooking when the meat thermometer reads 180°F, or if the red stem on the pop-up timer is up and the drumstick feels soft or moves easily.
- Always allow the bird to rest for at least 20 minutes for easy carving.
- Present your turkey on a platter with a fresh and colorful garnish, such as California grapes.



Cornbread Dressing with Roasted Grapes, Walnuts and Pancetta

Servings: 12

- 2 cups red seedless California grapes
- 2 cups green seedless California grapes
- 2 cups cubed butternut squash
- 1 1/2 tablespoons olive oil
 Salt and pepper, to taste
 6 ounces diced pancetta
- 3/4 cup sliced celery
- 1 large onion, chopped 2 cloves garlic, minced
 - 5 cups coarsely crumbled cornbread (either store-bought or prepared from a mix), toasted
- 3/4 cup coarsely chopped walnuts, toasted
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh sage
- 1 cup reduced-sodium chicken broth
- 3 tablespoons butter, melted3 tablespoons white balsamic
- 3 tablespoons white bals vinegar
- 1 egg, beaten

Preheat oven to 400°F. Toss grapes and squash cubes together in large bowl with oil, salt and pepper, to taste. Spread in single layer on baking sheet and roast for about 20–30 minutes, until grapes have begun to slightly shrivel and squash is tender. Set aside.

Heat large nonstick skillet over medium-high heat and cook pancetta until it begins to brown slightly. Add celery and onions and cook until tender and onions are translucent, about 5–6 minutes. Add garlic and cook for one minute more. Remove from heat.

In large bowl, combine cornbread, pancetta mixture, grapes, squash, walnuts, sage and salt and pepper to taste, if desired. Set aside.

In medium bowl, whisk together broth, butter, vinegar and egg. Pour over cornbread mixture and toss well to combine.


Spray 9-by-13-inch baking dish with cooking spray. Spoon dressing evenly into dish. (At this point, you can either bake immediately or cover and refrigerate overnight to bake the next day.)

Bake, covered with foil, at 350°F for 20 minutes. Uncover and bake another 20 minutes, or until warmed through and golden brown.
