## Breakfast for the Birds

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - If omelets and ornithologists seem odd pairings, all eggs dished up Effie Yeaw Nature Center's Bird and Breakfast event are unfertilized. No chick will be injured in the making of this breakfast.

Just as well, because fundraiser's patrons are - from beginner to experts -true bird lovers. And the March 22 and 23 events will incorporate their most peckish dream: all you can view; all you can eat. On a crisp morning in Effie Yeaw's 80-acre preserve, binoculars will likely zoom in on nesting hummingbirds, broody hawks and migratory species returning from winter vacations. Given the season, mating displays are inevitable and Audubon Society guides will lead voyeurs to view the anything-goes program. An hour-plus trek rambles through the preserve and along river banks. Though deer and piscine views are likely, flighted species are this event's gee-whiz material. Few observers could spot a thumb-nail size hummingbird nest. To view it through a telephoto scope -- bulging with microscopic babies -- is beyond cute. "Audubon people research our preserve and the riverside in advance," says Effie Yeaw staffer Betty Cooper. "They know where the cool stuff is and will lead small groups from spot to spot, explaining what they see."

A 24-year spring tradition for many

Effie Yeaw supporters, the \$40 (\$35) for American River natural History Association or Audubon members) safari is followed by a gourmet breakfast on Saturday. "It has always sold out and we've hated turning people away," says Cooper. "Last year we expanded it to two days. Both sold out. On Sunday, Carmichael Kiwanis will serve a pancake breakfast." Saturday's foray does not accommodate children. Family-friendly Sunday includes kids for \$10 (\$8 for ARNHA or Audubon tykes).

A silent auction of bird-related goodies accompanies breakfast. Proceeds assist the Nature Center's survival. Promises Cooper. "It's a rare opportunity to experience animal lifecycles and study the things you often pass by without seeing." Bird and Breakfast is not recommended for very young children. Participants should wear comfortable shoes and bring binoculars.

'Bird and Breakfast" begins at 8 a.m., both days. Bookings are essential and numbers are limited. To learn more about the fundraiser, call (916) 489-4918. ★

### Bera Tours Farms and Businesses Impacted by Drought

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Congressman Ami Bera recently toured local dairy and cattle farms in Elk Grove and Rancho Murieta, as well as companies in Folsom that rely on the local clean water supply, to survey and bring attention to the local impacts of California's drought. Bera brought a representative from the United States Department of Agriculture Natural Resources Conservation Service along for the farm tours so that the federal agency could learn more about the drought's impact on Sacramento County.

"California's historic drought is hurting many Sacramento County small businesses and farmers, which impacts not only individuals, but our entire local economy." said Bera. "I'm doing everything I can to both help those being affected in the short term, and to find long-term solutions for securing water access and storage that add to our water supply rather than taking from it." Bera visited Walter Hardesty Beef, Van Steyn Dairy, and Van Vleck Ranch. The ranchers raised concerns about having to cull their herds to stay afloat as production costs rise. Though



ranchers are no strangers to drought, the current drought conditions are worsened, the say, by several dry years in a row. The Sacramento County Farm Bureau helped arrange the tours. Bera also visited Kikkoman Soy Sauce manufacturing plant and Gekkeikan Sake factory in the City of Folsom. Both

companies located in the area because of its direct access to clean surface water and agricultural products in the valley. Both companies are conserving water in ways that have yet to impact production, but have concerns if the drought situation does not improve. The drought is anticipated to cause price increases

for the agricultural products that are essential to the production of soy sauce and sake, such as rice, soy, and wheat. In addition to the tours this week, Bera held a Drought Resources Workshop Tuesday with representatives from the

USDA and Small Business

Administration to inform local

ers about the resources available to them from the federal government. Those who were unable to attend the workshop but need help can call Bera's office at (916) 635-0505 or visit his Drought Relief Resources page at bera.house.gov/droughtrelief for more information.

Bera is also working in Congress to preserve Sacramento County's water supply. He has helped lead the fight against the misguided Bay Delta Conservation Plan to build tunnels under the Delta, and a recent partisan water grab bill. Both would take alreadyscarce water from Sacramento County and send it to other parts of the state. He also voted in January to reauthorize the Emergency Drought Relief Act and helped secure funding for upgrades to the Folsom Dam that will increase its water storage capacity to help during future dry periods and give us greater flood protection. ★

### We Are Prepared, but Every **Water Drop is Valuable**

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - The current water situation in the greater Sacramento metropolitan region is unprecedented, testing the individual and collective planning and past actions of the region's municipal water purveyors. The Fair Oaks Water District (FOWD) has planned and implemented actions to mitigate many of the anticipated risks to the reliability of our water system.

For a municipal water purveyor, reliability is a measure of a water system's expected success in managing shortages potentially faced by its customers. Low reliability in the water system translates to greater possibilities of frequent and potentially severe limits placed upon the customers. Higher water supply reliability equates to lower risk of customer shortages; but potentially at much greater cost. Considered another way, the degree of reliability is based upon the combination of short-term demand management and supply augmentation options readily available to reduce the severity of shortages. The balancing act between maintaining high degrees of reliability and not placing exorbitant costs on the customers is an on-going effort for water purveyors.

FOWD, acting with several other regional water agencies, has implemented a variety of programs over the past several years to manage reliability through diversity of its water supplies. Such programs in the region include the implementation of the American River Basin Conjunctive Use Program; development of the Integrated

Regional Water Management Plan; implementation of the Water Forum Agreement; enhancement of conservation programs; and the development of additional local supplies such as groundwater and remediated groundwater to optimize the beneficial uses of this region's ground and surface water resources.

FOWD recognizes water use efficiency as an integral component of its current and future strategies to manage water supply reliability for its customers. FOWD actively implements its own conservation best management practices and supports and encourages implementation by its customers. FOWD has also implemented a Water Shortage Contingency Plan to reduce water demands during water shortage emergency such as currently being faced. The Water Shortage Contingency Plan is formalized through Resolution No. 0109 (2001) establishing five stages of water conservation action. FOWD is currently in a "Stage 3 Water Warning", requesting all customers to reduce water by at least 20 percent to help conserve water for the Sacramento region.

Established in 1917, FOWD has served the residents and businesses of Fair Oaks for almost 97 years. Operating as an independent special district, FOWD remains committed to helping the municipal water purveyors in the greater Sacramento region maintain at least public health and safety water supply at all times; especially during this time of drought. As proof, during the week of February 17 to February 23, FOWD supplied over 7,200,000 gallons of ground water to other Water Agencies; while taking no surface water

from Folsom Lake. In this one week alone, FOWD was responsible for keeping over 36,000,000 gallons of water in Folsom Lake. In addition, FOWD is currently making additional investments in water supply that will contribute even more to the current, critical water needs of the Sacramento region.

As part of its efforts to manage customer water supply reliability, FOWD planned and invested in critical groundwater sources over the past several years. These groundwater assets were anticipated to supplement supplies during surface water shortages, but never as complete replacement to surface water. This current drought crisis is the first time that FOWD has had to actually consider providing our customers with a reliable water supply based solely on groundwater supplies for a prolonged period of time. This is indeed an unprecedented water supply situation for FOWD, and even though FOWD will be able to keep water supply flowing to our customers, potential additional reductions to the level of service may be required - depending on the participation of every FOWD customer to implement voluntary water reductions.







Congratulations for joining us for the debut of this column Executive Caregiver Notes, which I hope to be a resource for you and others like you, regarding issues confronting the family caregiver.

I'll bet you had no idea, but you, the unpaid family caregiver - and all the other 34 million like you - are the fastest way to bankrupt our nation, America, The Beautiful. "What?" you ask.

What I mean is this: If all you unpaid family caregivers suddenly went on strike and demanded pay for all the unpaid family caregiving you do, our country, our society would be brought to its knees.

The best estimate is that 90% of all long term caregiving for seniors is performed by...well, YOU! - the unpaid family caregiver. In dollars, that equates to, roughly speaking, a whopping \$500 billion annually.

### Caregiver Briefings

To put that in perspective, imagine all the senior care residences under our country's vast, beautiful for spacious skies. Add to that picture ALL the paid private-duty in-home caregivers serving seniors in their own homes from sea to shining sea. Add all that up in to one lump sum, stand atop the purple mountains' majesty, looking down across the fruited plain, and you'll see that it's merely pennies compared to what you, family caregiver, are doing day in and day out faithfully.

Congratulations, then, for joining us on our debut discussion in this column Executive Caregiver Notes. Once a month we will pose some questions and discussion on topics for family caregivers. I hope this column will be well worth your look-see, and provide you with some helpful information from my 40+ years exposure to caregiving (yes, I started at age 6, but that's another story for another day), and perhaps even a little "respite" from the daily grind. This column, then, is dedicated to YOU!

In an effort to help families navigate through the maze of long term care, I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to join our community discussion by emailing me questions or issues that you

would like to see covered in the future.

So in closing, I would like to leave you with a few more points to ponder about you,

the unpaid family caregiver: First, Caregivers report having difficulty finding time for one's self (35%), managing emotional and physical stress (29%), and balancing work and family responsibilities (29%).

Second, about 73% of surveyed caregivers said praying helps them cope with caregiving stress, 61% said that they talk with or seek advice from friends or relatives, and 44% read about caregiving in books or other materials.

So, until next time, please do me, and the rest of "America! America!" a big favor and take care of yourself, because you are what we sing about - amongst other things when we say, "God shed His grace on thee." Yes, you, unpaid family caregiver, are a big part of that grace being shed upon us, so please, please know this: You, unpaid family caregiver, deserve - and even more so, NEED - to be taken care of and have time for yourself.

Have you ever been in one of those fun houses, the kind they have at the fair? You walk through this semi-truck trailer and they have all sorts of mirrors. Some make you shorter, some make you taller, some make you skinnier and some make you look fatter. You get a distorted image of yourself. That's what happens in life. It's easy to get a distorted view of yourself. You may have been severely ridiculed in the past. People have made fun of you.

You may have memories of prejudice or memories of abandonment. You've been severely criticized, put

down, emotionally abused. Your brain is like a tape recorder – it's recorded it all: it's all there. The hurtful things that you've experienced. The things that people have said to you. The hurtful acts people have done to you. It's all there. The good the bad, the true the false. It's all been recorded. The problem is, your brain doesn't distin-

or bad- it just records them.

When you were a kid, there were some things said to you that were flat-out lies, but you believed them and it's distorted your view of you. The Bible says, "Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing." Proverbs 12:18 (NIV). Remember that rhyme we used to say as kids, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but names never hurt me?" Wrong! Things people say do hurt us! It hurts to be ridiculed. It hurts to be put down. It hurts to be criticized.

When you were a kid, you may have had other kids, or worse a parent or other authority figure in your life, say things like... "You're dumb...You're ugly...You're awkward...You're a klutz...You're never going to amount to anything...I'm sorry I had you...Why can't you be more like your brother, your sister." You believed it and it went into your recorder. It may have been 10, 20, 30 years ago or more, but you're still acting on old tapes. You're operating on faulty data and when you operate on faulty data, it produces insecurity and feelings of inferiority, a distorted image of yourself. When you operate of faulty data, you think things like, "I just don't measure up... guish between them- between I'm not good enough...I'm

### Discount Animal Adoptions

Animals make wonderful companions for people of all ages, bringing friendship and unconditional love into their owners' lives. For senior citizens whose children have moved out and often live alone, that companionship can be very important and much appreciated.

To help seniors find the companionship that can enrich their lives by having a fourlegged friend, the Sacramento County Animal Shelter has lowered adoption and licensing fees. Seniors age 62 and over only have to pay \$10 per year to license a spayed or neutered animal and only \$25 for a threeyear license.

And there's a discount for adopting a senior animal, too. Any animal over six years old is just \$25, and there can be deeper discounts for animals over the age of eight. The all-inclusive adoption fee covers microchipping, vaccinations and spaying/ neutering of the pet.

### Senator Nielsen Introduces Drought Relief Legislation for HOA Residents

### SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Despite the recent rainfall in Northern California, California continues to face unprecedented low water levels in its reservoirs. Water districts across the state have either implemented mandatory conservation plans or are in the process of implementing one. For residents living in communities governed by homeowners associations (HOA), this means that they are caught between breaking the water reduction mandate to comply with their Covenants, Conditions & Restrictions (CCR) to keep their lawns greens or pay their HOA potentially hefty fines.

To relieve homeowners of this dilemma, State Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Gerber) introduced Senate Bill 992 to prohibit HOAs from assessing fines for brown lawns during a governor- tions and restrictions. Nielsen's

declared drought.

"Californians truly want to do their part in conserving water during this drought from taking shorter showers to not watering our lawns," said Senator Nielsen. "Unfortunately, the folks residing in some HOA communities are required to water their lawns or be subject to steep fines for unmaintained

Specifically, SB 992 responds to news reports that some HOA residents are facing fines of between \$100 to \$1,000 for yards that are not "wellmaintained."

In California, HOAs are governed by the state's corporation codes and the Davis-Stirling Act which provides a guideline allowing individual associations to establish how the association will be run by their own condi-

proposed measure temporarily exempts homeowners from complying with these codes.

"While I respect the autonomy of HOAs to self-govern and maintain standards of appearance within their developments, I am more concerned about the non-essential wateruse during the current drought. Californians, especially those on wells, are deeply concerned that they will not be able to wash their dishes and flush their toilets," Nielsen said.



One of the more indispensable words of instruction I have ever received came from Dr. Fred Luskin who was head of the Stanford University Forgiveness Project. He said, "To forgive is to give up all hope for a better past." According to Luskin, what keeps people frozen solid with the regrets and shame of yesteryear is the lingering optimism that they might go back and change it.

Forget that, Dr. Luskin says – not the past – but the prospects of adjusting anything that is now in the rearview mirror. The Apostle Paul said something similar in the New Testament. He made peace with his past and his past self (the self is the hardest person in the world with whom to make peace) with this formula: "Forgetting the past and I press on toward what is ahead."

Can we really forget the past? No. Painful memories, bad choices we have made, ways we have been harmed or harmed others, the heartbreaking losses of offense and betrayal - none of these can be changed. There is no supernatural whitewash for our memory banks or a little recessed button in the back of our skulls that will reboot our

Yet, we can forget the past if

forgetting is as Dr. Luskin has defined it; learning to live so that the past no longer controls us. Thus, forgetting is not an act of

ignoring our past experiences. It is integrating those experiences with the present. Forgetting the past is not act of erasing our memories. It is an act of hopeful defiance, whereby we keep living, keep moving, and keep keeping on.

The Chinese have a proverb to this effect. "Break the kettles and sink the ships," they say. This saying comes from an ancient military battle almost 2000 years ago. A new tribal king came to power and immediately attacked his neighbor, surrounding the city of Julu. The king of Julu called for reinforcements from his generals, and the army came marching to save their king.

But the rescuing generals dragged their feet. They wanted the enemy to wear themselves out; they wanted more time for reconnaissance; they felt they needed to strategize. So the march to save the king became a quagmire as the generals' strategizing devolved into feasting and

Finally, a junior officer man named Xiang Yu took command. He said, roughly translated to

English, "When you go to rescue someone, it is like rushing out to quench a fire. You don't dillydally, you just go do it." And that's what he did. Immediately, he marched his army across the Yellow River to engage the enemy.

Once on the other side, Xiang Yu gave his men three days' worth of food and supplies and destroyed everything else, including the boats that had brought them across the river, their tents and sleeping mats, their eating utensils, and their cooking kettles. In so doing, Xiang Yu was sending a clear signal to his troops that they had no chance of survival by going backwards. They had to move forward, and they did, rescuing their king.

The way into the future is exactly by this decisive path. We must do the hard work of feeling the pain of the past so that we might be free from it. Then the future calls us forward, not because we have forgotten the past, but because we have made peace with the past; and the only way to make that peace is to quit trying to change what is back there. We can't do anything about it anyway, so we must learn to let it go.

Will we have to let go of some painful memories time and again? You can count on it. Will some things from the past haunt us longer than others? Absolutely. Will we come to the same river crossing more than once? It is likely. But when we do, the choice will always be the



### The Village at Fair Oaks is Area's First New Home Community in 20 Years

Presidio Residential Capital Partners With Watt Communities To Build \$18 Million 55-Home Community In Fair Oaks

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Presidio Residential Capital, a real estate investment company, has partnered with homebuilder Watt Communities on a six-acre, 55-unit community on Madison Avenue that will offer the first new homes to be built in the Fair Oaks/Carmichael area in two decades. The \$18 million project will break ground in April.

According to the National Association of Home Builders' formula to determine the local impact of single-family housing in typical metro areas, adding 55 single-family homes will generate \$11.6 million in local income, \$1.2 million in taxes and other revenue for local governments, and 178 local jobs. Watt Construction estimates the project will create 100 temporary construction jobs.

Watt Communities, based in Santa Monica, is re-entering the Northern California new home marketplace after a hiatus because the company is confident about the market's comeback.

"Our company's goal is to acquire land wisely and build communities according to what the homebuyers are seeking," said Watt Communities Division President Kevin Webb. "The Village at Fair Oaks is an excellent example of that approach to development."
