

# Hot Jazz Jubilee Coming



## Big Brothers Big Sisters is Encouraging Men in California to "Man Up" and Meet the Rising Need for Big Brothers Across the State

Across the state of California, Big Brothers Big Sisters agencies are in critical need of men, with boys making up 70% of the waiting list for mentors, and only three out of 10 inquiries to volunteer are men. The goal of the "Man Up California" campaign is to inspire, with humor and emotion, twice as many men to volunteer as the year prior.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) – This year, the Big Brothers Big Sisters Association of California (BBBSAC) is launching its first-ever statewide initiative centered on the recruitment of male volunteers to become Big Brothers. This inaugural campaign will be the first time all 17 California agencies have worked together to leverage their collective reach, with the goal of significantly reducing the number of boys who are waiting for a Big Brother in California

by recruiting twice as many male

volunteers as the prior year.

Across the state, Big Brothers Big Sisters (BBBS) is experiencing a critical need for men to volunteer. The waiting list is nearly 70% boys, yet only three out of 10 inquiries to volunteer are men. Unfortunately, boys are waiting an average of 275 days before receiving a Big Brother.


"It's time for California to Man Up! It is our desire to give men a fun and easy way to help strengthen our communities by providing boys a quality mentoring experience that is proven to help children who face adversity succeed in and out of school," said Tiffany Siart, President of BBBSAC. "This summer is the perfect time to Man Up and find out how rewarding it is to play sports, go on a hike, eat pizza, or share your interests with a child who needs some encouragement."

Boys served by BBBS are primarily children of single-parent,

low-income, or active-duty military homes, or homes with an incarcerated parent. "I am a single mother. My son's father passed away last year, and he needs a male role model in his life now more than ever," explained Jackie, a parent of a child on the waiting list in San Jose.

Due to complex circumstances, boys like Jackie's son are faced with a statistical spike in their likelihood to turn to drugs, alcohol, and violence in an effort to cope with increased stress in their lives. Parents recognize the proven benefits that come from having a caring role model in their lives, and many are reaching out for help. "My son could use a more positive male influence in his life," said Jennifer of her 10-year-old son. Mothers like Jennifer are seeking better outcomes for their sons and are looking to BBBS to partner with them to support their children.

# Heat Wave Babies Spotted Some Moms Prefer Home Deliveries

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Challenged by recent heat waves, dehydration, and predators, blacktailed deer fawns are finding American River Parkway survival particularly tough this year. Many does have instead chosen to deliver babies in residential backyards.

Thus, in recent weeks, unusual numbers of gardeners have reported surprise at what sprouted overnight in their flowerbeds. Garden deliveries are a safety measure for mothers and progeny: shade is plentiful, predators less common, and bird baths are handy troughs. Sprinklers mean greener grazing than our parched Parkway can offer.

"I looked out my window and a baby fawn tottered toward

me," marveled a California Avenue woman. "Her eyes were unfocused and her fur was wet. I guess she had just been born. I was thrilled to see nature renewed in my own yard. The mother had vanished and the baby started crying. She was running around in distress, but she stayed in my yard. Eventually, the mom came back, suckled her baby, and they wandered off together. I haven't seen them since."

Owner of a large property near Carmichael Creek, Allan Davis headed outdoors for a stroll. "I heard a rustle and a tiny fawn was feet away from me, just staring," said Davis. "He was so cute ... eventually he ran away, but he seemed to stay in the garden."

Later, a doe showed up. Mother and child wandered down the garden path and into the sunset,

together.

What

Carmichael residents observed was a rite of passage -- a behavioral norm often mistaken for maternal neglect. After does give birth, they abjure their little ones to stay put, then disappear. No matter how frightened, the fawns wait in prescribed areas. Moms later retrieve babies already apprised of lesson one: obedience. In following months, fawns are often left beneath thickets, camouflaged by dancing light on dappled coats. Obedience to the stay-put message is a fawn's greatest protection.

Does usually keep newborns hidden for some weeks after birth. With August upon us, new fawns are now becoming more visible on the Parkway, but

their survival depends on

Do fill birdbaths or leave water pans in shade. **Do** restrain Fido until the newcomer departs; even friendly dogs may initiate flight and injury. Canine odor might also scare off the returning doe. **Do** caution neighbors to drive carefully -- the mom might appear suddenly on a street or driveway.

Above all, honor the little newcomer's presence as a brief, precious gift. We are all nature's children. Responsibility to share begins in our own yards.

## Rep. Bera Announces Wounded Warrior Position Available in **His Rancho Cordova Office**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - U.S. Rep. Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-7) announced Friday, July 26, that the House of Representatives Wounded Warrior Program is accepting applications for a position in his district office in Rancho Cordova. He urged eligible disabled veterans in Sacramento County to apply.

"I recently had the incredible privilege of meeting with some of our troops in Afghanistan and was able to witness first-hand the bravery and professionalism of our American military," said Bera. "It is an honor to be able to add one of our nation's brave service members to my dedicated staff, and an excellent opportunity for the men and women who served our nation in the Armed Forces to continue their public service and learn about the options available to them as they transition to civilian life."

The available position is a field representative and caseworker who would be responsible for facilitating and coordinating responses to a wide range of requests received from military and veteran constituents. The employee would serve as a liaison between the Congressman's office and various veterans organizations in the district. A full job description can be found here.

The Wounded Warrior Program was established to create fellowships that provide employment opportunities within the House Representatives. The fellowships will provide veterans with experience and exposure to ultimately broaden their scope of transition opportunities. Positions are available in Congressional district offices nationwide.

According to the Wounded Warrior Program, applicants must have served on active duty since Sept. 11, 2001, have a 30 percent or greater serviceconnected disability rating, and have fewer than 20 years of



service. In addition to a current resume, applicants must submit a copy of their DD214 and a VA letter confirming they have at least a 30 percent serviceconnected disability rating to housewoundedwarriors@mail. house.gov. They should not send resumes directly to the office of Rep. Bera.

Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. represents Sacramento County. Born and raised in California, Bera is a physician and the only Indian American currently serving in Congress. He's fighting to rebuild an economy that works for middle class families and to reduce our country's debt in a responsible



#### Don't Rush to Flush

Many people often stockpile unused medicine in their homes, making these drugs easier for children and teens to access. Prescription drug abuse has skyrocketed in recent years and studies show that many teens get their drugs from the medicine cabinet of family and friends unknowingly.

Flushing unused medications down the toilet or pouring down the sink drain is the wrong thing to do. When medications are disposed through the sewer system, many pass right through the wastewater treatment process because most treatment plants were not designed to specifically remove all drugs from wastewater. Even today's most advanced treatment technologies have a tough time eliminating all of the active chemical compounds in the

thousands of different medications in use today. That's why the Environmental Protection Agency recommends household pharmaceuticals be collected and destroyed in hazardous waste incinerators to protect the environment and public health -- and the safest and best way is to dispose medications in designated drop-off take-back bin.

Using a take-back bin ensures unused medications are quickly removed from the home to prevent accidental poisonings and abuse by teens, plus the drugs will be securely collected and properly disposed of. Prescription medicine, overthe-counter drugs, medicated ointments and lotions – and even pet medications – can all be disposed of in a designated take-back bin.

For Carmichael residents there is a convenient "Don't Rush to Flush" collection bin at the at Sheriff's Department North Patrol Division Headquarters, 5510 Garfield Avenue near Auburn Boulevard. Telephone 874-1021



Have you figured out that God's plan for your life is often different than your plan? Why? Because God has a better plan! The Bible says in Isaiah 55:8-9, "This plan of Mine is not what you would work out neither are My thoughts the same as yours. For My ways are higher than yours."

The problem is we think we know what's best, what's going to make us happy, so when we pray, we don't just ask God for something. We tell Him when we want it. We have all these specifics, and we get disappointed when God doesn't agree with what we want. God says, "Wait a minute, I've got a better plan! 

The "Man Up" campaign is harnessing the power of social and broadcast media to reach men where they live most. Through integrated touch points such as an interactive landing page, a social media campaign, and a YouTube series featuring official "Man Up" spokesperson, Bruce - a 13th century Scottish Warrior puppet – "Man Up California" is offering a new approach to recruitment.

To qualify as volunteers, individuals must:

- Be over 18 years of age.
- · Have a valid Social Security number with no criminal background.
- Be available to volunteer for at least one year.

Men and Spanish-speaking volunteers, in particular, are in high demand.

Individuals who are not able to volunteer are being asked to consider donating to help sponsor a waiting boy, who will then be carefully matched with a

screened volunteer and receive ongoing support and access to events.

Federal Agency Obtains \$40,000 for Estate of Employee with Disability



According to the EEOC's lawsuit, in 2009, a Tire and Lube Express Bay manager who had worked at the Wal-Mart store in Placerville, Calif., since 2003, was fired on account of his disability (atrial fibrillation, a heart condition that causes shortness of breath and difficulty walking) and because he had complained about discrimination and filed a charge with the EEOC.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) prohibits treating workers unfavorably because they have a disability and requires employers to make reasonable accommodations to applicants and employees with disabilities. The ADA also prohibits retaliatory actions against employees for re-questing an accommodation or filing a charge with the EEOC. After attempting to resolve the case through pre-litigation conciliation efforts, the EEOC filed the lawsuit (EEOC v. Wal-Mart Stores, Inc., CIV. 11-3327 JAM CKD) in U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of California.

In the year following the filing of the EEOC's lawsuit, the worker suffered a fatal heart attack. However, the EEOC and Wal-Mart were able to resolve the lawsuit following a settlement conference before Magistrate Judge Carolyn K. Delaney. Under the two-year consent decree resolving the lawsuit, in addition to the monetary settlement to be paid to the estate of the deceased employee, Wal-Mart has agreed to conduct ADA training of management officials at its Placerville store.

EEOC San Francisco Regional Attorney William R. Tamayo said, "Disability and retaliation discrimination continue to exist. Employers should upgrade their training of officials and managers to ensure compliance with the ADA. The training provided in this decree is critical to good employment practices."

EEOC San Francisco District Director Michael Baldonado added, "Retaliation cases represent the largest category of charge filings with the EEOC. In Fiscal Year 2012, retaliation claims were made in more than one-third of all charge filings across the country. This shows that too many employers are still making the serious mistake of punishing their workers for complaining about unfair treatment. We vigorously enforce retaliation cases to preserve people's access to receiving help from our agency."



Dear Dave,

Do you think having cancer insurance is a good idea? **Brittany** 

Dear Brittany,

No, I don't believe buying cancer insurance is a good idea. However, I do believe everyone needs health insurance. If you have a good health policy in place, it's going to cover you in the event you're diagnosed with

Lots of insurance companies offer these policies because cancer is such a scary thing. It's a hot-button topic, and many people have lost friends and relatives to cancer. I don't believe in cancer policies though. You need a good emergency fund of three to six months of expenses, long-term disability coverage and a solid health insurance plan.

My favorite health plan, and what I use personally, is the Health Savings Account (HSA). With an HSA you have money sitting there to cover some of the ancillary things. Most cancer policies won't cover alternative treatments and things like that, and lots of them are income policies, meaning they replace a portion of your income, but that's what disability insurance is for. - Dave


I love that you're taking charge of your life and looking to make things happen. Just make sure you use a little wisdom and some planning in the process. Never jump off the dock before the ship has arrived!

\In American literature, the biggest religious pretender of all time is probably Sinclair Lewis' Elmer Gantry. While most of us have not read the book, we may remember the movie. The film was a 1960 masterpiece starring Burt Lancaster in an Emmywinning role as the charismatic but corrupt evangelist.

Gantry begins his career in the early 1900s at a Baptist seminary in Kansas preaching at a little country church while trying to seduce the daughter of one of the deacons. Eventually he becomes a traveling evangelist who steals from the till, chases skirts, and stays drunk most of the time; but his preaching is phenomenal, so he always has a crowd.

After working his way through the Baptists and the Pentecostals, he becomes a Methodist, rising through the ranks until he is pastor of a huge church in New York City, and the president of the "National Association for the Purification of Art and the Press." Gantry drew larger and larger crowds, and would personally lead raids on the red-light districts, busting brothels, bars, and speakeasies.

He denounced all the other churches for their weaknesses, but was committing worse sins than the ones he was preaching

against. As the old movie poster said, "Tell 'em Gantry...save 'em from sin. Just don't tell 'em about your own whisky and women."

Granted, the evangelist type is an easy mark. Public religious figures are easily labeled as "hypocrites and charlatans." Gantry wasn't the first and he certainly won't be the last. But his real wickedness was not his sins. We are all made of clay. It was his two-faced dishonesty.

He did what he did, not out of love for God, but out of love for the applause of the crowds. He did what he did out of pride, ambition, and self-glory. He was not performing for his Maker; he was performing for the audience. That is hypocrisy.

The word "hypocrite," in its original context, is not a negative description. It is a great old word right from the Greek and Roman theaters of ancient times that means "play-actor." A hypocrite was a person who played multiple roles on the stage. In one scene he or she played one character. Later, the actor would don a mask or a costume and play another character – maybe three or four different personalities on stage in a single night.

But over time a hypocrite came to mean a person who changed his or her mask depending on the circumstances. As Jesus used the word, a hypocrite was one who played to the crowd. He or she was someone who performed for the audience – like Elmer Gantry - and at points, like every one of

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said that hypocrites

"receive all the reward they will ever get." If you play for the crowd, he inferred, if your ambition is to draw attention to yourself, then when you get it, you earned your pay. There is no further reward, benefit, or other prize. God has nothing for you but an empty hand.

Alternatively, Jesus offers a healthier way. "When you give," he says, "don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing. When you pray, go to a closet and shut the door. When you sacrifice for a cause, don't broadcast it." In other words, keep your religious activities on the quiet side; as much as possible, keep it between you and God. Otherwise, you risk corrupting what would be a good deed.

No matter what it is: Missionary work, teaching, preaching, giving, praying, singing, organizing, helping - if it is done to impress or draw the attention of others, no matter how noble the act, it is wrong – for if it is not driven by love for God and neighbor, it becomes driven by pride and ego.

My friend Landon Saunders said it superlatively many years ago. Commenting on the religious tendencies for show-and-tell he suggested that we "Wear our religion like we wear our underwear; make it rarely visible." That's good advice, indeed.



Q. I've noticed lately that some drivers have the year sticker on the left side of their license plate and the month sticker on the right. Essentially, the stickers are reversed. What's the correct way to place stickers on license plates?

A. Manufactured California license plates indicate "Month" on the left side of the license plate and "Year" on the right side of the plate. Vehicle owners should place their registration year and month stickers/tabs correctly as indicated on the plates.

Q. Depending on the waiting time during my next visit to the DMV, I might need to check emails from work on my smart phone while I wait in the lobby. Is this allowed in the DMV office?

A. Excellent question! More customers than ever before have cell phones and mobile electronic devices. We simply ask customers to please put their phones away while they conduct transactions at the DMV customer service window. You can still use your mobile device while you wait in the DMV lobby, but once you approach the counter, we need your complete attention. Remember to make an appointment before visiting the DMV.

Q. I paid for my vehicle egistration well before expiration date but am going to be

moving out of California before the new registration period begins. Is it possible to receive a refund now that I'll need to register my vehicle in another state?

A. It depends on the circumstances. You must register the vehicle in the other state before the prior California expiration date, in order to be eligible for a refund. For your convenience, visit www.dmv.ca.gov/online/refund/ refundprograms.htm and click on the "Refund Application" link.

Once you've completed and submitted the Application for Refund, you will be notified of the status of your application within 30 days of its receipt. Don't forget to include the unused registration and sticker with your application and the date the vehicle left the state.

Q. Does California use facial recognition technology in driver licenses and ID cards?

A. No, the California Department of Motor Vehicles does not use facial recognition technology in its issuance of driver licenses or identification (ID) cards.

Q. When is the best time to visit the DMV? I'm trying to avoid having to wait in line as much as

A. California's Department of Motor Vehicles continues to make significant improvements in overall wait times at our field offices. The best time to visit a field office is with an appointment.

Q. What happens to people who attempt to cheat on their written tests at the DMV?

A. The use of testing aids is strictly prohibited. This includes, but is not limited to: The California Driver Handbook, cheat sheets, electronic communication devices such as a cell phone, hand-held

The DMV may also take an action against your driving privilege or the driving privilege of anyone else who assists you in the examination process. When a driver is suspected of cheating, the test is confiscated by Field Office personnel and is referred to the Driver Safety Branch for investigation. The DMV may:

- · Refuse to issue a driver's license or ID card.
- Revoke the driving privilege of any driver involved in fraudulent activity.
- Cancel an application for a higher class license when the applicant is found to have been cheating.
- If the driver is revoked, the action will remain in effect for a period of one year.
- The driver is eligible to retest at the end of the action.
- If the application is cancelled for a higher class license, the driver may be redirected to take all applicable tests under observation.

It was another sunny day in Arizona 7 years ago, but across the world in Ramadi, Iraq it was a different story. I couldn't even tell you what I did that day but that evening I was at my small group and we were celebrating my birthday which had been the week before.

Within 30 minutes life would change from cake, ice cream and receiving a gift of a Willow Tree Angel named "Courage" to using that courage to survive the most devastating moments of my life.

I arrived home to find my son Kristofer waiting on the sidewalk to inform me the Navy was there. I glanced at the two Navy Officers in their dress whites on my porch and fell into Kristofer's arms and cried "Noooooooooooo!" I knew why they were there.

We entered the house and they tried to prepare me for what they were about to tell me. They had been in my home for about 30 minutes while Kris tried to find me.

"We can tell by being in your home you are a woman of faith and you are going to need to rely on your faith for what we are about to tell you. Your son Marc Alan Lee has been killed in Action." I couldn't breathe; I felt a pain in the core of my being that no parent should ever have to feel. I began to cry my river.

It's hard to believe it has been 7 years since that young man sacrificed his life defending his teammates, and our freedoms.

I still can't comprehend how you can fight in an intense fire fight for two hours, in extreme temperatures of 120 degrees, carrying 150-180 lbs. and still have the mental focus and strength to make the decision to do the right thing and risk your life for others. Courage like Marc

displayed doesn't just happen. It is engrained in you by your creator, it is the choice to follow the Biblical morals and values taught to you, it is the opportunity to practice in other difficult circumstances that life brings you or your BUD's instructors produce. Marc displayed physical and moral courage often witnessed on the battlefield, but courage need not be displayed only in the battlefields of combat as we fight and defend America and the freedoms we have been blessed with.

Our American History is rich in examples of patriots who displayed courage in numerous circumstances, willing to give everything if need be for what they believed in, to provide liberty and a better life to those they left behind.

There is a huge hole that is left from his absence. I will never share the dinner table with him, or feel his arms hug me in the way only a Mother and Son can hug, or see his smirky grin, beautiful brown eyes, dark curly locks, or experience his playful antics or hear his encouraging words. I won't get that dance at his wedding, or hold his children and watch them grow, or have him hold me or care for me when I get

I had no choice in the news that was delivered to me on Aug 2nd, but I did have a choice how I responded. God made it very clear to me that night as I read Psalms 27 that He was right there with me, He was my rock and my strength. "I would have lost hope if I had not believed I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living. Wait on the Lord, be of good courage and he will strengthen your heart; wait I say on the Lord." Psalms 27:15&16

I had seen God do amazing things in my life and I had

confidence in Him that He would carry me through and be my strength. I chose to proceed through the grieving process and encourage and help others with the hope God gives me daily.

Marc's name means Mighty Warrior and today I remember him and as I do every day honor his courage and sacrifice. He left behind his weapon, his armor and his boots and laid down his baton which I picked up and carry on. To everyone who served and sacrificed for my freedoms and yours, I say "THANK YOU."

Marc's final gift to me was his teammates and I am blessed to have so many "adopted boys" and share their families and their love. God multiplied my family exponentially and I am a blessed woman

So as you enjoy your sunny Aug 2nd and live your normal life and watch your children and grand-children play today give them an extra hug, count your blessings, and remember our fallen warriors who sacrificed all of their tomorrows and hope for a future so you could enjoy today.



WOLVERINE (Rated PG-13)

Hugh Jackman returns as the mutant hero, the titular character in "The Wolverine." The movie raises two questions: Why is he in Japan? Why does he still sport mutton chops?

When he's not baring his adamantium claws, Jackman's Wolverine is known as Logan. In what is the sixth film (counting spinoffs) of the franchise, Logan is first spotted looking like a homeless mountain man in the Alaskan wild, or maybe it's the Yukon. Whatever, it's some place cold and uninviting.

Living like a recluse in a cave, Logan communes with nature, even managing a peaceful coexistence with a grizzly bear companion. His solitary existence is disturbed by the appearance of reckless hunters bent on snagging a large, shaggy-haired ursine trophy.

Confronting the repugnant hunters at the town saloon, Logan reverts to his old superpowers to ward off his foes, drawing attention from the enigmatic Yukio (Rila Fukushima), who entices him to Japan. So we have the answer to the first question.

Memories of World War II are fresh in Logan's mind, as he remembers, while interned in a POW camp, saving the life of a young Japanese soldier during the atomic bombing of Nagasaki, and thereby revealing his miraculous self-healing powers.

"WOLVERINE" CLAWS ITS WAY TO TOP OF SUPERHERO ACTION HEAP

Shifting to the present day, Logan has not aged, but the soldier he rescued, Yashida (Haruhiko Yamanouchi), is an elderly, extremely wealthy industrialist, now confined to his deathbed, wistfully hoping for immortality.

Logan's Wolverine, who does not age, possibly holds the key to a life without end, hence the interest by Yashida and assorted shadowy, mysterious figures, obviously connected to the Yakuza, to Logan's secret.

Lured by the curious Yukio to Tokyo, Logan ends up getting a scrubbing and makeover from geisha girls, but he keeps the mutton-chopped sideburns. The answer to the second question remains elusive and unknowable.

Dutifully paying his respects to the dying Yashida, Logan discovers that the industrialist's granddaughter Mariko (Tao Akamoto) stands to inherit his fortune, and as a result, her life is in serious danger.

For one thing, Mariko's father is a ruthless tycoon who is apparently involved with sinister forces that seek to take control, by force if necessary, of the Yashida financial empire.

A spectacular fight sequence with ninja warriors at Yashida's funeral service causes Logan and Mariko to go on the run, even hiding out for a time at a seedy hotel that caters to customers renting rooms by the hour.

Meanwhile, Logan is undergoing an existential crisis, evidenced by the frequent dream sequences in which his former lover, Jean Grey (Famke Janssen), a fellow mutant that he had to kill, reminds him of misfortune and tragedy.

More than troubling dreams

are at work. Logan is also consumed with thoughts that his immortality is a curse and a burden that hinder his ability to live a normal life, a thought more pressing now that his romantic feelings for Mariko have taken hold.

Due to other strange things going on, Wolverine finds his physical strength ebbing away, his superpowers gradually dwindling and his immediate ability to heal from all wounds no longer a given.

But before falling into a state of impaired faculties, Wolverine manages a spectacular fight to the death on top of a speeding bullet train with a Yakuza assassin.

With the train hurtling along the tracks and through tunnels at a speed of 300 miles per hour, the rooftop battle is skillfully staged and stunning for its heart-pounding suspense. This could be the film's best action moment.

Not so fine is the climactic battle scene inside Yashida's mountainous lair, where Wolverine must fight a giant robot. We've seen enough of this in films like "Pacific Rim," and, well, others I have already forgotten.

"The Wolverine" is filled with plenty of faceless villains, mostly ninja types who are fairly well disguised in their black robes and masks.

The most interesting bad guy is actually a femme fatale (Svetlana Khodchenkova), the blonde nurse who tends to Yashida but has a secret agenda. Though she is attractive, one would be advised not to kiss her.

Though it may not be saying much, "The Wolverine," even when it falters at the end, is one of the better superhero movies of the summer. That's mostly a credit to Hugh Jackman's nuanced performance.

A word to the wise: Be sure to stay for the credits. The future of the franchise hangs in the balance with a breathless teaser.
