County Budget in the Black

Special Sacramento **County Report**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -

Following years of reductions, Sacramento County's fiscal outlook is looking up for the second year in a row. After reconciling accounts and making adjustments to June's \$3.6 billion dollar proposed budget, the County is in the black. Savings from controlling expenditures have contributed to a surplus of \$32.5 million that is available to augment critical services and pay past debt.

"I'm happy to report that we have discretionary funds to invest in our community and to address the Board's service priorities," said County Executive Bradley J. Hudson. "Because the departments held the line on expenses we're beginning to recover from the impact of the "Great Recession."

Of the \$3.6 billion, less than a half billion is actually discretionary, and we can decide how to spend it, Hudson added. "I am recommending the resources be allocated across a variety of programs to optimize the use of the funds, while paying back loans and building up our contingency funds. Many of these programs were cut to the bone during the recession and had to be restored."

Of the \$32.5 million that is available, some of the recommended changes include:

- Contingency Funds: \$2.2 M • Loan Repayment: \$11.7M
- Sheriff: \$4.9 M
- Investment in services, includ-
- ing parks, code enforcement. supervision of drug offenders, District Attorney, Public Health to address communicable diseases and Animal Care: \$4.5 M • Health and Human Services to
- backfill state budget cuts: \$6.5 M

"We're not out of the woods yet," Hudson added. "The next few years will continue to be rocky as the economy continues its slow recovery." Ongoing fiscal challenges include increased pension costs, negotiated salary and benefit obligations, repaying \$59 million in past internal borrowing, and replacing funding taken by the State for the Affordable Care Act, said Hudson. "We also need to backfill about \$21 million in one-time resources used to balance previous budgets."

"It's important to take the long view, and we're going to need four to five percent annual growth in discretionary revenue over the next five years to stay fiscally healthy; last year's growth was less than one percent," Hudson added. "We'll continue to focus on streamlining services, increasing efficiency through the use of technology and holding down

The budget hearing will be on Tuesday, September 10, beginning at 2 p.m., and will feature presentations form the County Executive, Sherriff and other departments. The hearings are held in the Board of Supervisor Chambers at 700 H Street and are open to the public. They may also be watched live on Metro Cable Channel 14.

The Board of Supervisors approved the budget on September 10, 2013.

Assembly Select Committee Pursues Revitalizing Established Communities



SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) Wednesday, August 28, Assemblyman Ken Cooley chaired the first hearing of the Assembly Select Committee on Community and Neighborhood Development. The ten member, bi-partisan committee heard from policy and administrative experts who spoke about the impacts of suburban sprawl on our metropolitan areas, and funding needs to help revitalize our aging communities.

"As metropolitan areas grow, it's important that we do not forget about the needs of our older communities, and help keep them desirable places to live that can attract jobs and private sector investment," said Cooley. "We moved to our neighborhood because we liked what was there.

Now, some of our older areas are faced with quality of life challenges that stand as barriers to community revitalization."

During the hearing, Bill Fulton, Planning Director for the City of San Diego and past Mayor of Ventura, noted that infrastructure and amenities in communities that most people would consider newer are nearing 20 years old.

'State infrastructure bonds and redevelopment funds have helped aging communities improve themselves, but are becoming more difficult to get," Fulton said. "Community facilities, like parks and libraries, need to meet certain expectations in order to make older communities desirable. Without funding to maintain and revitalize them, they often fall below that level of what the community wants."

Juan Matute, Director of the UCLA Local Climate Change Initiative, highlighted the challenges older cities and first tier suburbs face with a greater need for community development funding and fewer tools to stay competitive with new neighborhood developments.

Matute presented a recent paper highlighting that financial tools in the local government toolkit have evolved across the last 40 years and concluding the tools currently in the toolkit have not kept up with today's desire for more compact, less autodependent communities.

The loss of redevelopment agencies in California in 2012 removed a vital tool from local governments' toolkit. Although some tools still remain-including general obligation bonds, infrastructure financing districts and assessment districts—local governments in California lack a dependable financing mechanism that can be consistently used for infill, infrastructure, and redevelopment.

"People want to see their neighborhoods improved, and aging communities are depending on us to figure out a solution to shape the next half-century of revitalization for established communities," said Cooley. "I think we realize that not every tool is good for every community. We have to set politics aside and give California's cities and counties the financing tools they need to attract private investors and spur the redevelopment that's good for them."

NFIB/California Continues to Oppose Minimum Wage Hike

SACRAMENTO, CA, (MPG) -The National Federation of Independent Business/California issued a statement reiterating opposition to Assembly Bill 10, which would increase California's minimum wage by \$2.00 per hour. The bill was passed by both houses of the Legislature and is headed to the Governor's office for signature.

"It seems that our legislature has been ignoring the voices of small business owners around the state that now is not the time to increase costs on our job creators," said John Kabateck, NFIB/CA Executive Director. "The irony is that this bill was passed by the same legislative leaders who rejected markedly higher wage increases

proposed by public employee unions in recent state negotiations. They settled on a 4.5% increase, saying that's the most our already-strapped state could handle at this time. But a 25% increase on small business owners doesn't seem to be a problem for them."

"Apparently, our elected officials continue to see small business owners as an ATM for the state, first with the passage of Proposition 30 and now with increased costs in the form of a minimum wage hike. Our only question is – when will it end? Or if it doesn't, how many more businesses on Main Street will close?"

"It is time to stop the foolishness in the Capitol – we can only hope that Governor Brown will see the harm in this legislation and veto it when it reaches his



Congressman Bera Calls for Investment in Sacramento County Infrastructure

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) -

Congressman Ami Bera, M.D. (CA-7) called for investment in Sacramento County infrastructure recently, after touring several local transportation projects with representatives from the Sacramento County Department of Transportation (SACDOT), the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG), Operating Engineers Local 3, and Laborers Local 185. The tour featured recently completed, active, and planned transportation projects near or along Highway 50 in the Rancho Cordova area.

"Our infrastructure in Sacramento County is in dire need of improvement," said Bera. "In our region, nearly 3.4 million trips are made over structurally deficient bridges every single day and the deteriorating state of the levees is also extremely serious. These improvements need to be made, but not only will they keep our families safe, they will also put Californians back to work and reinvigorate our economy."

Bera highlighted the Partnership to Build America Act of 2013 (HR 2084), as a smart way to make these kinds of needed infrastructure upgrades. A bipartisan bill Bera has co-sponsored, the Partnership to Build America Act, would help pay for our fastdeteriorating infrastructure like

roads, bridges, and levees, without increasing the nation's debt or raising taxes. Instead, it gives companies that bring foreign earnings back to America a tax savings if they invest in a new, U.S. infrastructure fund. If passed, it would create significant American jobs in the short-term and help U.S. competitiveness in the long-term.

CDPH Warns Consumers Not to Eat Santos Rewadi Sugar Candy Imported From India

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Dr. Ron Chapman, director of the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and state health

officer, today warned consumers not to eat Santos Rewadi Sugar candy, batch number 12/030, imported from India after tests conducted by CDPH found the product contained levels of lead that exceeded the state's standards. Consumers in possession of the candy should discard it

immediately. Recent analysis of this candy by CDPH determined that Santos Rewadi Sugar candy, batch number 12/030, contained as much as 0.22 parts per million (ppm)

of lead. California considers candies with lead levels in excess of 0.10 ppm to be contaminated.

Santos Rewadi Sugar candy, imported and distributed by Santos Inc., San Leandro, California, has initiated a voluntary recall. CDPH is currently working with the distributor to ensure that the contaminated candies are removed from the marketplace. Santos Rewadi Sugar candy product is sold in a seven-ounce (200g) package that is clear with a green and yellow border on each side with a red and white top banner that displays the brand name "Santos" written in yellow, and includes a picture of an elephant. The bottom of the package displays the name, weight and "product of India" in a yellow rectangle and red banner.

Pregnant women and parents of children who may have eaten this candy should consult their physician or health care provider to determine if medical testing is needed. Consumers who find this candy for sale should call the CDPH Complaint Hotline at 1-800-495-3232. 



Wealthy, But Not Spoiled

Dear Dave,

How do you make sure you don't spoil your child when you're wealthy?

– Ryan

Dear Ryan,

I know this will sound mean to some people, but you simply explain to them that they are not wealthy.

I remember a time years ago, after we'd gone broke, that we managed to scrimp and save and finally had a little bit of wealth. We bought a nice car and my son piped up from the back seat, all smug and satisfied, "We're doing pretty good, huh?" I'll admit it was kind of funny, but it was also a teachable moment. I looked at him and said, "I'm doing pretty good, but you're broke!" That was a pretty consistent message around the Ramsey household as the kids were growing up. If you're not working and making yourownway, you've got nothing.

The second thing is we taught them, from a very young age, was to work. That can start with simple things like kids cleaning up their rooms or doing the dishes after dinner. It should carry over to the teenage years as well. Every able-bodied child should be working and earning money, whether it's their own entrepreneurial idea, at a store in the mall or babysitting.

Dave Says

The third thing we did was based in our faith. As evangelical Christians, we taught our kids that we don't really own anything. It all belongs to God, and one of our jobs is to wisely manage the things He entrusts to us. The first rule is to take care of your own household—the important stuff. After that, it's okay to have some nice things, but it's not all about pleasure. It's also about giving and extraordinary levels of generosity.

Teach them to work. Teach them to be givers. And gently remind them once in a while that they've got nothing until they go out and earn it. - Dave

A Rough Lesson

Dear Dave,

My dad opened a credit card account in his name a few years ago to help with my college bills, and he made me an authorized user. Now he's delinquent on the card and I'm receiving collection calls and notices. Do I owe the credit card company money? - Steve

Dear Steve,


No, an authorized user is not liable. The account is in your dad's name, and you didn't sign anything. He's the one legally responsible for the money owed.

I want you to be careful, though. Lots of credit card companies will badger people and use all kinds of pressure and guilt trips to try to collect money from people who don't owe them anything. They just want their money, and they really don't care who writes the check.

Get them to remove you as an authorized user today. Send them a letter demanding this via certified mail, return receipt requested, so you'll have proof. Also, make sure they understand that you'll sue them for about \$10 million if they don't comply immediately. You shouldn't be reported to the credit bureaus for any of this, but companies can report just about anything—even inaccurate information—to the bureaus.

You have rights as a consumer, and you are not legally liable for credit card debt when you're just an authorized user. But make sure you check your credit report regularly in the future. Some of these companies make a habit of repeatedly downloading misinformation to the bureaus in an effort to bother and bully people into paying debts they don't owe!

converted to Catholicism. This man was a depository of mindwarping experiences, not the least of which was a personal story I loved to hear.

A parish he once led desperately needed to expand its ministry. But one man in the parish absolutely resisted, always squelching prospective change by saying something like, "My grandfather gave the land for this church; my daddy cleared the trees for the building; and we're not going to change a thing" (Catholics don't have a monopoly on this sentiment).

Thad finally had enough. In his remarkable way, he secured a diocese blessing and obtained a piece of land on the other side of town. He called the local house builders, and had the church relocated! I have this charming picture in my mind of the church, steeple atop, rolling down the road on stilts led by a vestmentclad Father Thad, reading the gospel and splashing holy water along the way.

When I first heard that story I told Thad, "If you were a Protestant, you could have just started another church (And with a wink, I'd add, "A church with a real baptistery"). His response was priceless: "Why start another church, when you can take it with you?"

Truth told, that is pretty good ecclesiology. Ecclesiology is what seminarians call the "doctrine of the church." It answers the question: "What is the nature of the church?" And after several hundred years of modernity and religious institutionalism, more and more people are recognizing that the church is not a building. Sure, we say, "I go to church at

such-and-such place," but the real church is a people, not a place. It is a body, not a building. It is a living movement, not a fixed mailing address.

When the last homilies, sermons, songs, testimonies, and prayers are offered at your congregation or parish on Sunday morning, you don't leave the church. You will leave a specific gathering of the church, certainly, but you take the church with you – because the church is you. You take it on the road, across town, into your workplace or university, into your living room, classroom, and board room: You embody the presence of Christ in the world.

Yes, I learned a lot from Father Thad. I learned that holding to fixed stereotypes prevents us from embracing the extraordinary individuals we meet along the way. I learned that communication between faith groups is the best possible means of reducing misunderstanding and conflict. I learned that overcoming problems sometimes requires boldness and creativity.

And I was reminded that whether we are sprinkled, dipped, poured, dunked, barely damp or soaking wet, we will not be defined so much by "where we go to church," but by whether or not we will be the church once we leave the building. As Father Thad put it so accurately: "Why start another church, when you can take it with you?"

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) - Forty years ago, Sacramento stage director David L. MacDonald had what he calls "a Mickey Rooney moment." He persuaded friends to stage a Broadway-style review to raise money for needy children.

Along the road, his efforts also raised countless children who dedicated themselves – not just to supporting his annual show – but to musical theater as a career.

MacDonald's Best of Broadway production opened an anniversary season titled Celebration at Fair Oaks Village amphitheater last weekend. In many ways, it was old home weekend. Regional Parks Rangers have full peace officer authority under the California Health and Safety





\$14,000 For Job Training and Financial Literacy Programs

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

Women's Empowerment recently received a \$10,000 grant from Bank of America for its job readiness programs and a \$4,000 grant from Umpqua Bank to fund its financial literacy programs for women who are homeless.

"If a woman is going to permanently break the cycle of homelessness for herself and her children, she needs a job and she needs to understand how to use her money wisely," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "We are thankful to Bank of America and Umpqua for recognizing that women who are homeless face substantial barriers to employment and money management, but can be profoundly successful when they receive the right training."

Women's Empowerment's initial eight-week program for women who are homeless addresses their basic needs such as health and housing while preparing them to become work-ready. The job readiness component is mostly taught by volunteers from the community

and includes computer literacy training, resume writing, communication skills, mock interviews, dressing for success and more. They also meet with an onsite employment specialist to search for jobs. Once women graduate from Women's Empowerment, they can join the advanced job readiness program that includes internships, paid job training programs, certifications and more.

Women in the program also receive basic financial literacy training and individual counseling on saving, debt management, bank services and financial negotiations. Once they graduate from Women's Empowerment, they are eligible to join the advanced financial literacy program that includes a money management curriculum, more in-depth individual counseling and a grocery store field trip to practice budgeting.

"So many women enter this program with gaps in their understanding of money management, as well as strong emotional ties to money since many have been victims of financial abuse," Culp said. "This program not only educates them, but helps them work through some of their emotional barriers to good money management so they can be successful long term."

Women's Empowerment offers the only comprehensive job readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The 2009 Nonprofit of the Year has graduated 1,064 homeless women and their more than 2,000 children. Last year, 89 percent of graduates found homes and 78 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded solely through private donations from the community.

Criminal Tax Evasion Bill Headed to Governor's Desk

Legislation Could Help Recoup Part of the Approximately \$9 Billion in Tax Evasion Annually

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -A bill that will codify a partnership made up of the

California State Board of Equalization (BOE), Franchise Tax Board (FTB), Employment Development Department (EDD), and Department of Justice (DOJ) is headed to the Governor's desk. Legislation unanimously supported by the BOE (Assembly Bill 576, V. Manuel Pérez) would strategically target sales, income, and employment tax evasion using existing resources from the part-

"The underground economy costs California billions of dollars every year and makes it even more difficult for legitimate businesses to operate in our state," said Board of Equalization Member George Runner. "This strategic bi-partisan effort will better coordinate state efforts to combat criminals who by avoiding their tax obligations

ners' respective departments.

effectively impose a tax increase on the rest of California."

Criminal tax evasion in California's underground economy deprives the state of approximately \$9 billion annually through a spectrum of illegal activities such as selling counterfeit goods like "knock off" designer items, exploiting victims of human trafficking, and smuggling tobacco products and other goods into California without paying the required taxes. A report issued by the UCLA Labor Center this year pegs this loss at 11 percent of the total tax revenues owed to the state.

AB 576 creates the Revenue Recovery and Collaborative Enforcement (RRACE) Team to formalize data sharing and communication among the BOE, FTB, EDD, and DOJ. The legislation enables these agencies to strategically collaborate and criminally prosecute those who evade state sales, use, excise,

income, and employment taxes, with no added cost to state taxpayers. The team's efforts will benefit Californians through its likely recovery of tax dollars which are vital to providing state services, such as public schools, highways, public safety, and health care programs.

The five-member California State Board of Equalization (BOE) is a publicly elected tax board. The BOE collects more than \$53.7 billion annually in taxes and fees supporting state and local government services. It hears business tax appeals, acts as the appellate body for franchise and personal income tax appeals, and serves a significant role in the assessment and administration of property taxes. Natural Pest Control

Pest control is always on any gardener's mind. In todays environmentally conscious world, organic pest control is of major interest. Organic Pest control includes prevention, biological control and organic pesticides.

Prevention:

Prevention includes choosing what you grow to reduce potential problems. It includes things like growing mildew resistant rose varieties, nematode resistant tomatoes, planting so there is a lot of air movement around your plantings to reduce fungus disease and insect populations (this allows predator

insects to get at the pest.). Sanitation is also an important part of prevention. By reducing the chance of infestation you reduce the incidence of disease. Don't use diseased or insect ridden garden materials in compost piles, Clean up all dropped fruit and flowers and get rid of old rose foliage after the winter prune. Pest Predator:

The most important of these are: Ladybugs, Praying Mantis,

Lacewings, Beneficial Nematodes, Encarsia Wasp and Predator Mites. Lady bugs can work in Aphid control, Praying Mantis eat larger flying insects, Lacewings control Aphid and similar insects. Beneficial Nematodes kill grubs in the soil, Predator Mites control two Spot Mite and Encarsia Wasp control Aphid and Ash White Fly.

Lady bugs and Praying Mantis are available during the spring. The rest may be ordered on line. My personal favorite for Aphid control are Encarsia Wasp. These are minute wasps about the size of fine ground pepper and they lay an egg in an Aphid and eat them from the inside. Best of all is they permanently establish themselves.

Organic Pesticides:

Organic Pesticides include natural materials such as Horticultural Oils to control sucking insects such as Scale, White Flies and Aphid. Oils also control many insect eggs when applied in winter.

Natural materials also include Copper, Sulfur and Lime Sulfur used as fungicides. These are best used as preventatives rather than eradicants. There is also a new

organic fungicide called Serenade (this is an extract from a special bacillus) that helps control a broad range of funguses.

The Slug & Snail control called Sluggo also comes under the category of natural materials and is generally accepted as an organic pesticide.

Other Organic Pesticides include what are called Botanicals. These are plant extracts. Nicotine has been one of the most effective; not used now because of it's extreme human toxicity. Rotenone, Pyrethrum, BT, and Neem are botanical pesticides that are available for many sucking and chewing insects.

All these pest controls are allowed under most organic gardening regimes. In any case they are easy on the environment. ★



Coronado, California - So Close, Yet a World Away

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

Although Coronado Island is just two miles from downtown San Diego, it is a world away. When you cross the graceful two-mile bridge to Coronado, you'll discover a town that has preserved its unique historical culture and a beach that is rated one of the "Top 10 Family Beaches in North America."
