## **IRS** Apology Not Accepted

WASHINGTON, D.C. (MPG)-- In response to IRS officials today (May 10th) admitting that its agents actively targeted Tea Party groups for increased scrutiny during the 2012 election, the nation's largest Tea Party group and a subject of IRS inquiries over the past year, issued the following statement:

"What we've long suspected to be the case is now confirmed to be true. The Obama administration has used the IRS as a political weapon. The IRS may claim that it is 'sorry.' But given the damage that has been done, their apology is not accepted," said Niger Innis, Chief Strategist for TheTeaParty.net.

"What would Democrats have done if the Nixon administration ordered the IRS to actively target the National Organization of Women or the American Civil Liberties Union? Nixon had his own enemies list and resigned. These activities are eerily similar, and yet Obama remains in office even in light of Fast and Furious, the Benghazi tragedy, and now the active targeting of his political opposition. FAIR OAKS, CA - (MPG) History is brought to life at the new Fair Oaks Historical Society Museum, located at 10340 Fair Oaks Blvd. On May 8, 2013 members of the Fair Oaks Historical Society (FOHS), the Chamber of Commerce and eager members of the community gathered for the grand opening of the newly refurbished 400 square foot history museum filled with over 100 years of displays, photos and artifacts.

Raised in Fair Oaks in the 1960s, Assemblywoman, 6th District, Beth Gaines attended the event, presenting a certificate of recognition from the state of California to FOHS president Joe Dobrowolski. Gaines reminisced about her days at Del Campo High School, and living near the gravel pits so important to the history of the city. "Fair Oaks is important to me. I'm so proud to be representing it," she said. Zachary Yeates, field representative for Congressman Ami

Bera, and Sacramento County

Supervisor, Susan Peters also attended.

Previously located at the Fair Oaks Recreation Park District building at 7997 California Avenue, the new museum also tells the important part the Sacramento Water District has played in the history of the city. The Water District is renting the building for the museum for \$1 a year. Society president Dobrowolski, looks forward to newer residents of Fair Oaks having a place to visit to learn about their new home.

Plans are for the museum to be opened Wednesday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The intent is to hire community college students to staff the center.

The historical society conducts research, records oral histories, and has published a booklet: "The Early Years of Fair Oaks." Residents of all cities are invited to visit or join the FOHS and attend their quarterly potlucks. Visit www. fairoakshistory.org for FOHS information and application for membership.

#### **Gas Prices Climbing Again**



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA - (MPG) Average retail gasoline prices risen 13.8 cents per gallon in the past week, averaging \$3.95/g yesterday, according to GasBuddy's daily survey of 720 gas outlets in Sacramento. This compares with the national average that has increased 6.2 cents per gallon in the last week to \$3.57/g, according to gasoline price website GasBuddy.com.

Including the change in gas prices in Sacramento during the past week, prices yesterday are 11.4 cents per gallon higher than a month ago.

"Many motorists remain skeptical of the so called reasons that we blame higher prices on: refinery production and maintenance, tightening supply, and the now completed switch over to EPA mandated cleaner summer gasoline. Tight gasoline supply exists especially along the West Coast, and other factors are coming into play in some of the bigger metro areas where more expensive reformulated gasoline has hit pumps," said GasBuddy. com Senior Petroleum Analyst Patrick DeHaan.

# SMUD Invites Public Input on Proposed Rate Actions

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) Board of Directors is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes to begin in January 2014.

In the General Manager's Report & Recommendation (Report), released by SMUD General Manager & CEO John Di Stasio, staff outlines a proposed two-step rate increase of 2.5 percent in both 2014 and 2015 for all customers to meet projected shortfalls resulting from the higher costs of renewable power required by the state, the increase in the number of participants in the low-income energy assistance program, and debt service obligations. SMUD's rates remain lower than most other utilities in California. Of the 19 largest electric utilities in the state, SMUD has the third lowest average cost per kWh. The Report also recommends a restructuring of the residential rates that will be phased in gradually over

SACRAMENTO, CA-(MPG) four years to better align rates with SMUD's cost to serve customers. This restructure will help residential customers make better informed choices about their energy consumption and utilizes new smart technology. SMUD seeks to transition to flat rate pricing with the goal of recommending time-based pricing by 2018

> The Report also addresses the following items:

• A new approach to the Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR) for low-income customers to help neutralize bill impacts by increasing the discount but adding a cap to the total discount.

• Modifications to street lighting rates making efficient LED lighting more cost beneficial.

• New Combined Heat and Power (CHP) rate for non-renewable generators.

• Revised late fees for public entity commercial customers.

• Reduce bill impacts to small commercial customers by combining demand and energy criteria

for the small commercial rate. • Revisions and modifications to the Rates, Rules and Regulations to enhance clarity and consistency.



The Fair Oaks Cemetery District and the Memorial Day Ceremony Committee are finalizing plans for one of the most popular and inspiring Memorial Day ceremonies in the area.

The Fifteenth Annual Memorial Day and Avenue of Flags Ceremony will be held Saturday, May 25, at the Fair Oaks Cemetery, located at 7780 Olive Street, Fair Oaks. The formal ceremonies start at 10 AM.

This year's theme is to honor "Our National Cemeteries", with the emphasis on Hawaii's Punch Bowl. The Punch Bowl is a cemetery located in Honolulu, Hawaii that serves as a memorial to those men and women who served in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Dedicated on Sept 2, 1949, approximately 53,000 WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam veterans and their dependents have been interred. It is administered by the National Cemetery Administration of the U.S. Department of the Veteran Affairs and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

area utilities such as gas and cable television will be contacted to determine whether they have underground facilities at the excavation site.

Underground utility lines are not always located in the street; some utilities may be located in backyard easements.

There is nothing that comes into your life without God's permission. God doesn't cause evil. God doesn't cause bad things to happen to you, but He will use them if you allow Him to. The Bible says, "To those who love God and are called according to His plan everything that happens fits into a pattern for good. For God chose us to bear the family likeness of His Son." Romans 8:28-29. There is a divine pattern to everything that is happening to you, a divine purpose to everything going on in your life, even the problems.

When problems come our way we tend to wonder, Why is this happening to me? Where are my problems coming from? Did I cause them? Did the devil cause them? Did God cause them? Regardless of where your problems are coming from or why you're having them, God can use them in your life if you'll let Him. So when problems come your way, the wrong question is, "Why, Lord?" The right question is,



you want to teach me? What, Lord, do you want to produce in me through this difficult time?"

"Everything that happens fits into a pattern for good. For God chose us to bear the family likeness of His Son" God uses every problem to produce in you the character of His Son. If God is going to make you like Jesus, then He's going to allow you to go through some things that Jesus went through.

There were times when Jesus was betrayed. There were times when Jesus suffered. There were times when Jesus was lonely. There were times when Jesus was angry, upset with people, discouraged and confused. God allowed Jesus to go through all these things. Do you think God is going to spare you from these things? What makes any of us think we'll be exempted from suffering, loneliness, betrayal, discouragement or confusion?

God's going to allow you to go through similar circumstances that Jesus went through - count on it, because He wants to perfect you. Hebrews 5:8 says, "Jesus learned obedience through suffering." If Jesus learned obedience through suffering, how do you think you're going to learn it? Hebrews 2:10 savs, "Jesus was made perfect through suffering." How

"What, Lord?" What, Lord, do do you think you're going to be made perfect? God perfects you, first through His word, 2 Timothy 3:16-17, then the Holy Spirit, Romans 8:11, I Corinthians 3:18, and then if those two don't work, He uses circumstances. Even if you read the Bible 5 hours a day or follow the Spirit's leading most of the day, how many hours a day do you have circumstances? 24 hours. So God depends on circumstances the most to perfect you.

You cannot choose what is going to happen to you next week, next month or next year. You don't have that choice. But you can choose how you're going to respond, how you're going to react — whether it's going to make you or break you, whether it's going to be a stepping stone to maturity or a stumbling block to failure. What really matters in life the most, is not what happens to you. What happens to you is not the most important thing in your life. What happens in you is what matters most. And that's your choice.

## Sacramento County DA Reports Recent cases of interest

#### CASE: Tresa Bales-Sterba (05/14/13)

#### PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kimberly Macy, DUI Vertical Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Tresa Bales-Sterba pled no contest to gross vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated, felony driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs with injury, and all allegations of personally inflicting great bodily injury and causing bodily injury.

On October 5, 2012, Bales-Sterba was driving near Mariposa and Greenback Lane in Citrus Heights when she sped through a red light causing a crash that critically injured a 6-year-old boy, who died from his injuries three months later. His then 8-year-old brother was also injured, but later released from the hospital. The brothers were walking to school with their mother when the crash occurred. Bales-Sterba faces a maximum possible sentence of 15 years in prison. Sentencing is set for July 15,

2013 at 8:30 a.m. in Department 8 of the Sacramento Superior Court.

This case was prosecuted by the DUI Vertical Prosecution Unit. Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS), through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

#### CASE: Steven Thompson (05/03/13)

#### PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Michelle Becker, Prison Prosecution Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard sentenced Steven Thompson to 28 years to life in prison. Last month, Thompson was convicted by jury of assault on another inmate, personally inflicting great bodily injury and possession of a weapon at California State Prison, Sacramento.

Thompson is currently serving time in prison for first degree murder and attempted murder. In 1981, he shot at two unarmed high school students from his car after an altercation. Both victims were hit and one died at the scene. Before he was apprehended, Thompson plotted to kill the other victim so he would not be able to identify him.

While incarcerated, Thompson stabbed another inmate on the yard with an inmate manufactured knife. The victim suffered a punctured lung as a result of the assault.

Deputy District Attorney Michelle Becker stated, "The outcome of this case demonstrates how the Three Strikes Law is keeping violent recidivist criminals off the streets."

#### CASE: Michael Lynn Love (05/03/13)

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that her office appeared at the Board of Prison Terms hearing where parole was again denied for 51-year-old Michael Lynn Love for a threeyear period. On August 10, 1979, in a crime that shocked the community, then 17-year-old Love went to his neighbor's house in Rio Linda armed with a baseball bat and a knife. He encountered 62-year-old Faye

Alexander outside the home, beat her over the head with the bat, and stabbed her repeatedly, killing her. He then went inside the home and found 63-year-old Charlie Alexander, an invalid, lying on the couch. He also killed Mr. Alexander by beating him with the bat and repeatedly stabbing him. Love also strangled, stabbed, and killed the Alexander's three dogs.

Love then dragged Mrs. Alexander's body into the house. He poured cigarette lighter fluid over her body and elsewhere around the house, and set the house on fire. After his arrest, Love claimed that he had only gone over to the house to commit a robbery, but snapped when Mrs. Alexander started to yell at him.

Love was convicted of two counts of murder in 1981 and is currently housed at the California Men's Colony in San Luis Obispo. Assistant Chief Deputy District Attorney Marv Stern appeared at the hearing and later stated, "Our obligation to public safety does not end with the conviction. This office will continue to represent the People of Sacramento County whenever dangerous criminals come up for parole. Love committed a terribly heinous crime, and should never be free again."

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that the Honorable Maryanne Gilliard sentenced Marcus Jamal Beavers to 16 years and 4 months in prison. Last month, Beavers was convicted by jury of robbery and assault with a firearm.

On May 30, 2012, Beavers was a parolee-at-large with an active arrest warrant when he robbed and pistol-whipped Jeremy Anderson. A coordinated effort by the Sacramento Sheriff's Department Special Enforcement Detail and the State Parole Apprehension Team led to the capture of Beavers and his eventual conviction.

The General Manager's Report and Recommendations (Report) includes a proposed two-step rate increase of 2.5 percent in both 2014 and 2015 to meet projected shortfalls resulting from higher costs of renewable power required by the state, the increase in the number of participants in the low-income energy assistance program, and debt service obligations. Even with the proposed rate increase, SMUD rates remain among the lowest in California and would be approximately 24 percent below PG&E.

The Report also recommends a restructuring of the residential rates that will be phased in gradually over four years to better align rates with SMUD's cost to serve customers. This restructure will help residential customers make better informed choices about their energy consumption and utilizes new smart technology. SMUD's goal is to transition from tiered pricing to time-based pricing by 2018.

During the residential rate transition, SMUD proposes a new approach to the Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR) for low-income customers to help neutralize bill impacts.

The Report also addresses the following items:

- Modifications to street lighting rates making efficient LED lighting more cost beneficial.
- New Combined Heat and Power (CHP) rate for non-renewable generators.
- Revised late fees for public entity commercial customers.
- Reduce bill impacts to small commercial customers by combining demand and energy criteria for the small commercial rate.
- Revisions and modifications to the Rates, Rules and Regulations to enhance clarity and consistency.





"There is something rotten in the state of Denmark." That is a centuries old phrase from William Shakespeare's masterpiece, "Hamlet." Going back to your high school English class, you might remember that strange things were indeed going on in Hamlet's world.

His father, the Danish king, had been murdered. His uncle was behind the conspiracy and had taken over the country. Ghosts and apparitions were visiting the castle. One of the characters finally states the obvious: "Something is fishy around here." Denmark has smelled rotten ever since.

But in reality, Denmark doesn't stink at all. It's a wonderful place. In fact, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, and the Scandinavian nations of Northern Europe are officially the happiest countries in the world. This seems so counterintuitive to me. No offense to the Scandinavians, but when I think of happy places, the cities of the Nordic north do not quickly come to mind. Nevertheless, the statistics don't lie.

Every year the Legatum Institute in London publishes its annual Prosperity Index that gauges the happiness level of the world's countries. Consistently, Denmark, Norway and the sister Scandinavian nations are at the top of the heap. On the other

end of the scale, the countries of Haiti, Afghanistan, the Congo, and the Central African Republic have more than a stench to deal with. These countries are consistently at the bottom of the happiness list, reflecting terrible misery for their populations.

If you are curious, the United States is currently ranked 12th on the Prosperity Index. Not too bad, but we were much happier in the near past. We have been sliding downward for some time now. Our society as a whole is not as happy as it once was, and honestly I don't think that comes as much of a surprise.

While this survey says a lot about societal happiness, it says hardly anything at all about personal happiness. You can be a healthy, wealthy, free and secure Norwegian and be absolutely miserable. You can be a Haitian child living half-starved on the streets of Port au Prince and be filled with wondrous joy.

You can be a comfortable, successful, suburban, mortgagepaying, SUV-driving husband of one and father of two and be wretchedly unhappy. You can be a poor immigrant, a single mother with four children living in squalor, scraping for every meal, and be as happy as a singing bird in a tree.

Happiness is affected by our environment. That much is true. Happiness is a product of our genetics (scientists say that an elongated 5HTT gene will make you happier on average than most). But ultimately, barring emotional or mental dysfunction, happiness is a choice we make. No, we don't live in Scandinavia. We have no control over our chromosomal makeup.

We can't do anything about our age and very little to change our personal economics. There are simply some things we cannot change.

But, there are other things we can do something about. We can opt to live near our friends. We can decide to practice gratitude. We can do work we find fulfilling. We can opt out of the blame game, and quit holding God, life, circumstances, past lovers, exwives, former business partners, parents, and reality responsible for doing us in.

We can make choices that will lead us toward becoming happy, joyful people or we can make choices that will result in us becoming chronically unhappy people. Regardless, that choice belongs to each and every one of us.

It was Viktor Frankl, famed Jewish Holocaust survivor and brilliant Austrian psychiatrist, who best articulated the power of choice in personal happiness. Reflecting upon his time in the concentration camps he wrote, "Everything can be taken from a man but one thing: the last of human freedoms – to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances."

If you want to be happy you don't have to move to Northern Europe or wait for science to alter your genetics. But you do have to choose to be happy, and no one else can make that choice for you.

#### **HEAD TRASH**

Do you find yourself pushing hard to succeed, but you just can't get traction? Why? Could it be you're working against yourself? I know it sounds strange, but not after I spoke with Tish Squillaro, who co-authored "Headtrash" with Timothy Thomas, on my POPPOFF Radio Show. They refer to thought patterns and emotional tendencies that hinder our ability to respond to business issues in a productive and professional way. Head trash is the negative voice of your subconscious. With eighteen years of business consulting experience, they have come up with seven traits we need to trash so we can make intelligent, effective decisions in our lives. They are Fear, Arrogance, Insecurity, Control, Anger, Guilt, and Paranoia. But wait just one minute. How do I talk back to my subconscious? I have trouble enough dealing with my conscious self. I think my paranoia is setting in. They call Tish the CEO Whisperer, so I asked her to whisper in my ear some ways to deal with this head trash and turn it into a positive. Here goes. These are the recommendations for:

1) FEAR: Build up the big decisions - if you have been frozen by fear, your decision making muscles have atrophied. Don't push too much strain on them all at once. Start by making smaller decisions that are less frighten-

ing. Be consistent. That's the only way real change will take place. Over time you gain confidence vou need to make the big decision that probably seemed impossible.

2) ARROGANCE: Cultivate humility - arrogant leaders tend to think of humility as weak. That's a false perception. Humility means being realistic about yourself, your abilities, your ideas. It means being honest enough to accept your limitations and admit that you are not perfect. You acknowledge that you can, and do make mistakes. Humility is about truth, and if you want to move forward, you need to be firmly rooted in the truth.

3) INSECURITY: Truly embrace compliments and Value your Worth - instead of leaping to devaluate yourself. Grab the opportunity to pat yourself on the back after any success. It may be as simple as allowing yourself to accept a compliment without diminishing the praise. Then fan the spark of positive feedback into a small fire that you learn how to feed. If you can't do it for yourself, find a career coach or counselor who can help you.

4) CONTROL: Look at yourself - and ask yourself if you truly need to be involved. Does this really require your attention? Before you dive into a new timeline consuming initiative, see if you can delegate instead. And if you are sincere about wanting to change, ask yourself the hardest question..."am I getting in the way?"

5) ANGER: Breathe—when you start to feel yourself boil over, stop, breath, and think before you do or say anything you might regret. Are you so enraged that it might be a good idea to leave the room?

Fine! Get up and take yourself out of harm's way. Better than saying or doing something that leaves an indelible. You can always address the issue later, calmer and having thought it through.





## What Should I Do If I am Missing **My W-2?**

If you are missing your w-2 you could call the IRS and inform them that you are missing your w-2. Before calling them make sure you contact your employer. If they don't respond then make the call to the IRS. Have your information available such as your Social Security number to verify your identity. They may ask you about your previous filing status. Even if you don't know it that would not stop the conversation. At least you should provide them with Social Security, your address and possibly your birth date.

#### Can I Use Pay Stub Information If I don't Have MY W-2?

If you are about to file and you still don't have your w-2 you may file a substitute for w-2 form 4852. Basically you will be filling out the information that is normally on the w-2 which is your gross wages and your tax withholdings. The IRS may be able to give you the information possibly after mid-February. But let us assume that they don't have this information recorded yet because sometimes they don't have it until May of each year, then you can to the best of your knowledge estimate your YTD income and your withholdings. Your last pay stub may have this cumulative information.

#### File Substitute for W-2

File the tax return with this information on form 4852 which is the substitute for the w-2. Suppose that you discovered that your information is substantially inaccurate. You may then file an amended tax return form 1040 X. Amended returns are a nuisance. I would suggest that if the information that you submitted originally needs just a minor correction that you don't worry about it. Just when you receive an IRS notice telling you that

your information is not correct agree to whatever information they have if theirs is accurate. Thus you can save the expensive amended return fees.

#### File an Extension of Time

Alternatively you can file an extension of time on April 15 until the IRS has the accurate information available to you. Make sure to send the IRS any payments that you may know that you are going to owe. Extension of filing is not an extension of payments. You have six months from April 15 to meet the final filing deadline of October 15 for the year.

Summary: If you cannot get your w-2 you can file a substitute for w-2 form 4852.

#### **STAR TREK INTO** DARKNESS

Never attracted to the dozen or so "Star Trek" television shows and about equal number of films with original TV cast members, I would never be mistaken for a Trekkie.

James T. Kirk (Chris Pine) trying to live up to his father's legacy. The action picks up soon after

where things left off four years ago. Captain Kirk's command of the USS Enterprise is tested when he and his crew attempt to save a primitive society from a volcano poised to erupt.

Spock (Zachary Quinto), the half-human, half-Vulcan first officer trapped in harm's way on the volcano's edge, is rescued by Captain Kirk in direct violation of a prime directive from the Federation.

Returning his ship safely to Earth, Kirk is demoted to First Officer by Admiral Pike (Bruce Greenwood). We know from the first film that the swaggering Kirk is impulsive and willing to bend the rules, and here he is no different.

While punished for insubordi-

Cumberbatch) also conducts an above-ground aerial assault on a Federation conclave, killing some key members and thus necessitating Kirk's return to command of the Enterprise.

The motivations of the dastardly terrorist are not immediately known, though later revelations prove that he's a recognizable foe with an agenda more fully explained by mysterious torpedo tubes placed aboard the Enterprise.

On a mission to exterminate Harrison with extreme prejudice, the Enterprise is sent to the planet Kronos by a belligerent Admiral Marcus (Peter Weller) to seek the hiding place of the renegade.

Capturing Harrison is fraught with great risk and danger, since Kronos is an outpost for the hostile Klingons, who view any incursion on their planet as an act of war.

As unlikely as it may seem, Spock, the pensive, logical Vulcan who can never tell a lie, is in the middle of a rocky romantic entanglement with Zoe Saldana's tough-minded, yet sexy Uhura.

The Enterprise is populated with other familiar, lovable characters, from Simon Pegg's funny and frantic Scotty to Karl Urban's sardonic yet urgently attentive medical officer Bones. As expected, John Cho's Sulu is aloof and confident at the controls, while Anton Yeltsin plays Chekov with youthful, untested resolve.
