Job Loss Predicted Under New Tax



The HIT is a new tax in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), which, beginning in 2014, will impose over \$100 billion in new taxes on the small business community, their employees and the self-employed over a decade.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA – (MPG) California may lose more than 26,000 jobs as a result of a little known provision of the new healthcare law called the Health Insurance Tax (HIT). A study released today by the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB) Research Foundation showed total employment in California will decline by between 14,322 and 26,296 by 2022 because of the increased costs associated with the HIT.

California's overall gross domestic product will also be reduced as a result of the tax. Over the next decade, cumulative lost sales among small businesses will be at least \$8.9

"Businesses in California are struggling under unprecedented costs from taxes and regulations. We need to do all that we can to increase jobs,

not reduce them," said John Kabateck, NFIB California director. "This destructive tax simply must go, if we are ever to return to the thriving culture of growth and entrepreneurship that Californians once knew."

The HIT is a new tax in the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), which, beginning in 2014, will impose over \$100 billion in new taxes on the small business community, their employees and the self-employed over a decade. The tax targets the fully-insured market, where many small businesses purchase their health insurance, and will ultimately be passed on to consumers in the form of higher premiums.

Former Congressional **Budget Office Director Douglas** Holtz-Eakin estimates the HIT will increase premiums on insurance policies purchased in the fully-insured market by \$5,000 over the next decade. Eighty-eight percent of small businesses purchase their insurance in the fully-insured market.

Bipartisan legislation to repeal the HIT was introduced in February in the House of Representatives by Reps. Charles Boustany (R-La.) and Jim Matheson (D-Utah), and this month in the Senate by U.S. Senators John Barrasso (R-Wyo.)

and Orrin Hatch (R-Utah). The BSIM is a dynamic, multi-region forecasting model that analyzes the impact of policy "shocks" on the economy and is unique in ability among models to forecast the economic impact of such policy on U.S. businesses differentiated by size of the firm. For this purpose, the BSIM adhered to the Small Business Administration definition of "small business" as firms with fewer than 500 employees.

Cooley's Bill to Save State's Mobile Field **Hospitals Advances**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA - (MPG) Assemblyman Ken Cooley's effort to help strengthen California's preparedness for natural disasters and catastrophic events moved forward today with bipartisan approval of AB 355 by the Assembly's Governmental Organization Committee. AB 355 will restore funding to the 2013-14 budget year to continue to maintain three mobile field hospitals in California, strategically placed throughout the state for rapid deployment.

"Scientists forecast California will almost certainly experience a devastating earthquake over the next 30 years," said Assemblyman Cooley. "In a state of 37 million, the capacity these hospitals offer to establish 600 hospital beds in any area within 72 hours of a disaster occurring is a key part of preparedness. It is our responsibility to be ready for the inevitable."

California established its mobile field hospital program in 2006 by purchasing three, 200-bed mobile hospitals. The hospitals were fully maintained until the 2011-12 budget year, when budget constraints eliminated the program's funding. The program survived for the last two years via a short-term solution, which can no longer continue, and now risks permanent decommission.

"California will be hit by natural disaster in the future — that's a certainty – and the mobile field hospitals could be a critical asset to the State of California as an integral part of the response and rebuilding," said Chris Van Gorder, president and CEO of Scripps Health.

Second Wave Results of Regional Texting and Handheld Cell Use Campaign Announced

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Law enforcement in the Sacramento region recently concluded the second of three waves of their special high visibility driver hand-held cell phone and texting enforcement campaign, "Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other," and the results are in.

The California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) announced that 4,750 drivers were cited for texting or talking with a hand-held cell phone between February 25 and March 10. This total compares to the first wave of the special enforcement efforts

November 29 to December 9 of last year, during which 3,008 were cited.

"With better weather and more enforcement days, we expected more citations compared to last December," said Christopher J. Murphy, Director of the California Office of Traffic Safety. "What we really hope to see is a drop in cell phone related crashes in the coming year, along with the suffering and tragedies that go with those crashes."

"Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other" is a year-long enforcement campaign to reduce distracted driving on roadways

in the Sacramento region. This was the second of three maximum enforcement periods in a pilot program using the region to test tactics that may be employed nationally in the future. OTS was awarded \$600,000 in federal funds for these special high visibility law enforcement operations. The last special enforcement wave will be conducted June 17-30, 2013.

The California Office of Traffic Safety, the California Highway Patrol, and the 37 local police departments from Modesto to Marysville, Vallejo to South

Lake Tahoe that partnered in this

latest effort are also joining with hundreds of law enforcement agencies across the state in April for National Distracted Driving Awareness Month.

"Between this special regional enforcement and April's statewide high visibility enforcement, Sacramento area drivers can't miss the "Phone in One Hand. Ticket in the Other" message," said Murphy.

Distracted drivers talking on a hand-held cell phone or texting receive a first-time ticket costing a minimum of \$159, with a second offense costing \$279. The goal of the special enforcement

operation is not to issue citations, but to raise awareness of the dangers of distracted driving and to keep drivers from being distracted by their phones in the first place.



You may not know how to answer that question if you don't understand grace. Grace is God giving to you what you don't deserve: His love, His forgiveness, His acceptance. Grace is the central theme of the New Testament. If you don't get anything else get this, God loves you unconditionally. That's called grace.

Legalism and perfectionism are based on the fear of God rather than the love of God. You may think, "But doesn't the Bible say the fear of God is the beginning of wisdom"? Yes but you must understand what that word "fear" means. Proverbs 9:10, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom...." The word for "fear" means "reverence" or "to be in awe of". God doesn't want you to be afraid of Him; He wants you to love Him. Jesus didn't say if you're afraid of me you will keep my commandments (John 14:15)

will keep my commandments.

One of the greatest emotional

hang-ups that people have today that causes more misery, more fear, more heartache and more depression than anything else, one that you might be dealing with today, is perfectionism. What is perfectionism? It's trying to gain and maintain the approval of God, the approval of others and maybe even the approval of you, by trying to be perfect. You have this constant feeling that you don't measure up. You go through life giving it your best shot and always feeling that you come up short. Like you're not good enough and you feel like a failure. Then you start thinking, "What's the use...If God demands perfection why even try?" The Christian life becomes a frustrating rather than fulfilling; it becomes a burden rather than a blessing. It's no wonder some people avoid God; they have a misconception of Him.

Every basic problem of man comes down to a misunderstanding of who God is, what God is like and what God has promised to do in your life. Some people see God as a cruel and unreasonable judge. We've been conditioned by a performance-oriented culture and we've transferred that over to God. We invent an un-pleasable

He said if you love me you God that cannot be satisfied no matter what we do, because you don't understand grace yet.

Life's greatest burden is trying to measure up to a standard that God has already said no man can measure up to. Trying to get what God says you already have in Christ. Trying to become what God says you already are: loved, accepted, and forgiven when you open up your life to Jesus Christ and make Him your Savior and the manager of your life.

If you've never opened your life to Jesus Christ, do it right now. Say, "Jesus I realize that I can't live a perfect life and that's why I need you in my life; that's why I need your grace. I don't understand it all but I believe you love me and I want a relationship with me. I want to love you back and I want to have a relationship with you. I confess that I'm not perfect and ask for your forgiveness and grace in my life. Help me to understand your grace and love better, in Jesus name, amen."







Sacramento County DA Reports

Recent Cases of Interest

CASE: Rosemary Eusted (04/12/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco, Special Assault & Child

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Rosemary Eusted was convicted by jury of 17 counts of lewd and lascivious acts with force against a child under the age of 14.

Eusted began continuously molesting two female family members in November of 1997 at her Rio Linda home. The victims were 6 and 7 years old at the time. They did not report the sexual abuse for several years out of fear of retaliation and further physical abuse.

In May of 2005, Eusted was convicted of two counts of child molest in Placer County. In that case, her victims included her ex-boyfriend's three daughters whose ages ranged from 5 to 10 years old. These victims traveled from Twin Falls, Idaho, Red Bluff and Marysville to testify in the Sacramento County

Deputy District Attorney Quirina Orozco states "This trial brought together a tragic sisterhood of young girls who banded together to stand empowered in the face of their abuser. The defendant robbed them of their innocence, dignity, and the sanctity of their childhood. For the first time, each victim finally had the opportunity to look her in the eyes and say 'You cannot hurt me anymore."

Eusted faces a possible maximum sentence of 425 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 10, 2013 at 9:00 a.m. in Department 31 before the Honorable Michael Kenny.

CASE: Ramces Orellana (04/10/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Timothy Carr, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that 40-year-old Ramces Orellana was convicted by jury of 13 counts of committing lewd and lascivious acts on a child under 14. Orellana was the live-in boyfriend of the victim's mother. He molested the young girl when she was

between the ages of 11 and 12. Orellana will be sentenced on May 17, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. in Department 11 by the Honorable Trena

Burger-Plavan.

CASE: Jermaine Campbell (04/03/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene

District Attorney Jan Scully announced that the Honorable Cheryl Chun Meegan sentenced Jermaine Campbell to life in prison without the possibility of parole, plus 25 years to life. Last month, Campbell was convicted by jury of first degree murder, first degree robbery, the personal use of a firearm and the special circumstance of committing a murder during the commission of robbery

In October 2010, Jermaine Campbell and Jonathan Hudson shot and killed 54-year-old James Walker while robbing him. Sheriff's deputies found Mr. Walker sitting in the driver's seat of his taxi cab and he

Jonathan Hudson was convicted by a separate jury of first degree murder, first degree robbery and was found to have been armed with a gun. Hudson's sentencing is set for April 26, 2013 in Department 18 of the Sacramento Superior Court.

CASE: Charles Gaskin & Sandra Sheaves (03/27/13)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Valerie Brown, Homicide Unit

District Attorney Jan Scully announced today that Charles Gaskin pled no contest to the first degree murder of Neil Hayes. He also admitted an enhancement for the use of a deadly weapon. Gaskin's wife and codefendant, Sandra Sheaves, pled no contest to a felony charge of being an accessory to murder. She also admitted an enhancement for misuse of information obtained from the Megan's Law website.

In June 2009, Neil Hayes was released on parole and contacted Charles Gaskin, whom he had met while they were incarcerated at the same prison. Gaskin and Sheaves let Mr. Hayes stay in their garage as he had no permanent residence. Sheaves accessed the California Department of Justice's Megan's Law website and found that Mr. Hayes was a registered sex offender.

Sheaves showed the information to Gaskin, who is a member of the Peckerwood white supremacist gang. On July 1, 2009, Gaskin and Sheaves confronted Mr. Hayes in the garage and Gaskin repeatedly hit him in the head with a large rock. Gaskin then wrapped duct tape around his mouth, bound his hands behind his back and wrapped him in garbage bags. Gaskin and Sheaves drove to Placerville and dumped his body in brush alongside a remote road.

Gaskin faces a mandatory sentence of 25 years to life in prison, plus one year for the weapon enhancement. Sheaves faces a sentence of 8 years in prison, which she will automatically be allowed to serve in county jail under realignment. The defendants will be sentenced on May 3, 2013, by the Honorable Sharon Lueras.

Cooley's Bill to Save State's Mobile Field Hospitals Advances

Van Gorder is considered an expert in mobile field hospital operation, having been involved with Scripps in the response to both Hurricane Katrina and the Haiti earthquake. "The flexibility of the mobile field hospital is not well understood. It can be deployed in a variety of ways, depending on situation and need. Just like we have military, law enforcement and fire resources held in reserve, we should do the same with medical resources and mobile field hospitals."

Based on the Uniform California Earthquake Rupture Forecast (UCERF) model, California has over a 99% chance of experiencing a magnitude 6.7 or larger earthquake during the next 30 years. During

the same time period, the probability of having a magnitude 7.5 or higher earthquake is 46%.

"It is not a question of 'if' California will face a catastrophic natural disaster, but when," continued Cooley. "Mobile field hospitals are an integral part of disaster preparedness and I thank the committee members for recognizing their importance."





Don't Ask for a Murphy Visit

Dear Dave,

Is there ever a time you should dip into emergency fund savings in order to pay off your home early?

- Eric

Dear Eric,

The only time I would advise this is when your emergency fund is too big, and you have a very small amount left to pay on the house. Keep in mind that your emergency fund should be three to six months of expenses, not three to six months of income. Besides, paying off the house doesn't fall into the category of an emergency. The fact that you have to pay for your house doesn't catch anyone by surprise.

I understand it can be very tempting to throw a bunch of money at your house, get rid of the mortgage payments, and own it outright. But I wouldn't drain my emergency fund to make it happen—even if it meant being completely debt-free sooner. Life happens, and the moment you write that big check and weaken your emergency fund, the central unit will go out, the roof will spring a leak, or you'll have major repair issues with a vehicle.

Too Much for Date Night Dear Dave,

My husband and I have a baby and are trying to live on a budget and pay off about \$14,000 in debt. He wants to spend \$100 a month for a date night, but I think this is too much under the circumstances. I'm a stay-athome mom right now, and after taxes he makes about \$3,200 a month. What do you think? - Ashley

Dear Ashley,

You win on this one. If you'd told me vou guys make \$150,000 a year, then I'd say he was being completely reasonable. But with your income and a lot of debt to boot, it sounds like he's just looking for an outlet to spend some money. The good thing is you're working together and beginning to take this personal finance thing seriously. You're just a little bit apart on the particulars in this area.

I think you back this amount down to \$40 or \$50 for now.

That's plenty for a reasonable dinner and perhaps a baby sitter for a couple of hours. If you have family or friends nearby, you might not have to figure babysitting expenses into the equation at all. Keep in mind, too, that going out on a date doesn't have to mean spending money. Years ago, when my wife and I were broke, we did tons of stuff that didn't cost a dime. Picnics in the park or a pretty hike through the woods are great ways to spend time together while keeping the pocketbook in your pocket.

Be creative and make sure you find ways to have "us" time on a regular basis. But you're right on this one, Ashley. You can go out and have plenty of fun together without spending a lot of money!

He would have missed the joy of now.

Now: There are few words with more potency but hardly a word more fallow or underutilized, because most of us do not live "in the now." We don't even aspire to live in the broader category of "today," having trading the present for a regretful past or a fearful future, a trade that leaves no life left to live.

Those of us who have fixed our eyes on the rearview mirror feel the days gone by slashing angrily at our heels with the unanswerable questions of regret. Where did my life go off the rails? How could I have made such terrible mistakes? What could I have done differently? Why hasn't God (or my parents or my spouse or my employer) treated me fairly or at least as well as others?

Such questions only end with inadequate replies, proving the axiom true: "There is no future in the past." But there is no future in the future either; not a view of the future that is tainted with fear! Yet, countless people live their lives in a hypothetical time machine, always worrying and fretting over a distant yet to come that might never materialize.

These future-fearing people fill

the air with their own questions, questions that usually begins with the words, "What if?" What if I lose my job? What if I am diagnosed with cancer? What if I run out of money? What if the economy collapses? Again, such questions can't be answered. They can only rob the worriers

of the time they have today.

And of course there are those who are preoccupied with the future differently. They aren't worried. They are enthused. They have schemes and plans for tomorrow, but tomorrow never comes. They say things like: "I'll do it one day (whatever 'it' is). Life will be better next week...next month...next year...next decade. Eventually I'll get around to it. In the end I will achieve my goals." But in the end, the end comes far too soon, and all the best-laid plans never materialize.

If we are engrossed with the snarling monsters of our past, obsessed with the fearful uncertainties of tomorrow, or spend our precious few days prepping for an ethereal future, this much is certain: We give away today; we miss the now.

Right now might not be your greatest moment, but now is all you have. Give now all you have, and you might be surprised at the joy you will discover.

The Power of Now We Never Needed Arm Guards, We Had Mrs. Ammon

The Gracious Mistress of the Parsonage and I were watching television listening to a news report and I simply broke out into laughter.

"What are you laughing at?" my wife asked.

"I'm just thinking of Mrs. Ammon. When I went to school we didn't need any armed guards, we had Mrs. Ammon and nobody crossed her."

The news report went on to say how they were trying to put armed guards at every school in our country. I suppose that is a good idea, I do not know all the ins and outs of the politicalness of that report. Everything these days seems to have some kind of a political angle to it. Now that political angle is intruding itself into the public school system.

This is all an attempt to protect our school children. I am all for that.

I was thinking, however, that when I was a youngster we did not need that sort of thing. We had Mrs. Ammon and her infamous hickory stick. Very few people remember a time when a teacher had, as one of her tools for education, a hickory stick and knew how to wield it, and wield it they did.

Somebody may ask how I know about that. Very simply. I am the product of a teacher wielding the hickory stick. It is hard now to remember the occasion that called for the application of that hickory stick. Actually, there was more than one occasion calling for such teacher and student interaction.

The old saying was that our teacher would apply the "Board of Education" to the "Seat of Learning." Believe me when I say, I earned a degree in that.

Somebody will say, "Things have changed."

I will agree that things have changed, but most things have

not changed for the better. Back in "the day" when I was a member of the public education system, the teachers were in charge. A basic rule in our house prevailed, "If you get a paddling in school, you get a paddling at home." It was assumed the teacher was right.

I distinctly remember my first interaction with my teacher in this regard. How can you forget such a thing?

At that time, teachers were too busy to put up with any kind of fooling around in a classroom. Do not get me wrong, my teacher made it fun most of the time. For the ones who, like me, took it too far, she knew how to stop it dead in its tracks.

"Mr. Snyder," the teacher would say in a very stern tone of voice. "Is that you making all that noise?" I knew what was to

"Mr. Snyder, please go to the principal's office and I will join you shortly."

Oh boy. Those familiar words bring back haunting memories of my visit to the principal's office. You can be sure; Mrs. Ammon would not come into the principal's office, spank you and then go back to her class. On some occasions, I would have preferred her to spank me and get it

The first thing she had to do was explain to me why what I did was wrong and disruptive to the class. Then, she had to explain to me how this paddling I was about the cat was going to hurt her more than it did me.

For the life of me, I could never figure out where it hurt her more than it did me. I knew exactly where it hurt me and for the rest of the day it would be quite difficult for me to sit down in my chair. Not only did my posterior glow in pain, but the snickers of my fellow students were even worse.

At the time of the application of the hickory stick, I really did not like Mrs. Ammon. Looking back, I have a different perspective. I now know that she really had an interest in me as a person. She was trying to discipline me in ways in which I needed discipline from someone like her.

Years later, I went back and visited my old teacher, Mrs. Ammon. I took to her some books I had written and published. She said she remembered me, I really do not know if she did or not. I had to do one thing and that was to thank her.

"I want to thank you, Mrs. Ammon, for teaching me to read and to write." Then I handed her my books. She seemed to be so very happy, but not as happy as I was. This teacher made a difference in my life that I did not realize until I was older.

One thing Mrs. Ammon taught me was that I should not get away with anything. There is a moment of accountability everybody must face. Mrs. Ammon was making sure that I was facing up to the realities of life before I did too much damage to

It is sad that the politics have taken over our education system today. It is sad that we do not have any Mrs. Ammons with their hickory sticks.

When I think of Mrs. Ammon I think of what Solomon writes, "He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes" (Proverbs 13:24 KJV).

It is my opinion that we need more Mrs. Ammons in our school classrooms and less, a lot less, politics.

Here's a 'did you know' fact that floored me. Did you know that medical researchers have found that heart disease, diabetes, cancer, obesity, arthritis, depression, asthma, and even allergies have all been linked to elevated levels of inflammatory markers in the body? That's the bad news I got from Dr. Aimee Shunney, Naturopathic Physician and health educator on my POPPOFF radio Show recently. But here's the good news. "Man's rise or fall, success or failure, happiness or unhappiness depends on his attitude, a man's attitude will create the situation he imagines." - James Allen

possible? If you don't, you must discover why, and then make any necessary mental adjustments, before success will be possible.



Lewis dedicated it to his close friend J. R. R. Tolkien who had expressed to Lewis that delving too deeply into the craft of evil would have consequences. Lewis admitted as much when he wrote "Though I had never written anything more easily, I never wrote with less enjoyment . . . though it was easy to twist one's mind into the diabolical attitude, it was not fun, or not for long. The work into which I had to project myself while I spoke through Screwtape was all dust, grit, thirst, and itch. Every trace of beauty, freshness, and geniality had to be excluded."

THE SCREWTAPE LETTERS is produced by New York City based Fellowship for the Performing Arts. Max McLean serves as the Producing Artistic Director. McLean, along with Jeffrey Fiske, wrote and directed the theatrical adaptation. Executive Producer and General Manager is Ken Denison of Aruba Productions. 

FAIR OAKS CEMETERY MEMORIAL DAY AND AVENUE OF FLAGS CEREMONY

The Fair Oaks Cemetery District and the Memorial Day Ceremony Committee are finalizing plans for one of the most popular and inspiring Memorial Day ceremonies in the area.

The Fifteenth Annual Memorial Day and Avenue of Flags Ceremony will be held Saturday, May 25, at the Fair Oaks Cemetery, located at 7780 Olive Street, Fair Oaks. The formal ceremonies start at 10 AM.

This year's theme is to honor "Our National Cemeteries", with the emphasis on Hawaii's Punch Bowl. The Punch Bowl is a cemetery located in Honolulu, Hawaii that serves as a memorial to those men and women who served in the U.S. Armed Forces.




