Decades of Flooding

FAIR OAKS, CA (MPG) As residents along South Fork Arcade Creek cope with flooding, a solution unable to initiate, sits inside Sacramento County offices because of a series of complicated issues that have persisted for 15 years.

The solution is a 13-milliongallon-detention basin slated for the Fair Oaks-based Gum Ranch at Kenneth and Madison avenues. If built, that basin would dramatically reduce flooding in areas that FEMA has designated flood zones along the creek, according to Mike Johnson, principal

engineer, Sacramento County so no basin yet." Water Resources Department, who works on the county's general plan.

"Land, the size of Gum Ranch, typically absorbs an average of 2.8 million gallons of water for every inch of rainfall," Johnson said. "A detention basin is necessary to mitigate the run off that will happen when the ranch because a housing subdivision of impermeable surfaces, such as roofs and pavements causing rain to drain into the creek adding roughly 2 million more gallons of water into the creek for every inch of rainfall. But construction hasn't happened on Gum Ranch

The complications began in the late 1990s when opposition to the Gum Ranch development prolonged the planning-approval process for nearly a decade. In September 2006, the county board of supervisors approved the tentative Gum Ranch Subdivision Map, and then nothing happened. No building

permits have ever been filed. That could be because the property owners, Irving Gum and his wife, Claudia Gum, are purportedly leaving the farm to a nonprofit organization noted for its philanthropy projects. The Gums declined to comment.

"I don't want to think about any of this stuff anymore," Irving Gum said. "Between politicians, difficult residents fighting everything, and real estate people, I've been miserable!'

Who'll Stop the Rain?

The county's proverbial back is against the wall.

Currently, some 26-square miles of water drain into the South Fork Arcade Creek, and the flood season ranges from Nov. 1 through April 14, according to FEMA and the California-based Central Valley Flood Control Agency.

County Fair Becomes Self-Supporting

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA- (MPG) When Pamela Fyock became chief executive officer of the Sacramento's County Fair last year, she said her goal for the 2012 event was to make the event self-supporting.

Not only did the 2012 Fair become self-supporting after losing State funding in 2011, but attendance shot up by 40 percent, surpassing all previous records in its 77-year history. Eighty eight thousand people attended the 2012 Memorial Day Weekend Fair.

According to Fyock, the annual County Fair is drawing increased attention across the region as progress is being made to make the event more relevant to today's urban children and families.

"In 1939, when the Sacramento County Fair first opened, FDR had just been reelected to his second term, the average California family income was about \$1255 a year and McClellen Air Force Base had just opened. It was absolutely critical that we re-think

how we could integrate fresh, relevant educational exhibits about the region's agricultural history into the fair's attractions," said Fyock.

According to Fyock, one example of the progress being made in this arena is the County Fair's "Farm Garden in a Wheelbarrow" program. "There's no better time and no better place to educate children about the 'Farm to Fork' agricultural movement than in the formative years in grades Pre-K through 6,"she said.

This project gives students in Sacramento County public, private and home school classrooms a cost-free opportunity to compete for prizes by planting, maintaining, and harvesting their own garden.

There's not even a need for a plot of land to enter this year's competition. Students and teachers can get all the supplies they need, including soil, a wheelbarrow, seeds and even



Governor Brown Releases 2012 Judicial Appointment Data

SACRAMENTO, CA Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. today released applicant and appointee data for the administration's judicial appointments.

Since Governor Brown took office, there have been a total of 1,168 applicants for judicial appointments and 90 appointments. Women accounted for about one-third of the applicant pool and more than 34% of Governor Brown's judicial appointees. Approximately 34% of the applicant pool identified themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native; Asian; Black or African-American; Hispanic; Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; or Other/Unknown and 37% of Governor Brown's appointees were from these groups in his first two years in office.

Like 2011, Governor Brown's 2012 judicial appointees included a number of notable firsts:

• Halim Dhanidina, the first American-Muslim judge ever appointed in California

• Jim Humes, the first openly gay justice to serve on the California Court of Appeal

· Miguel Marquez, the first Latino justice to serve on the Sixth District Court of Appeal

· Rosendo Peña, the first Latino justice to serve on the

Fifth District Court of Appeal

- Chris Doehle, the first female judge to serve on the Del Norte **County Superior Court**
- · Kimberly Colwell, the first openly lesbian judge to be appointed to the Alameda **County Superior Court**
- Mark Andrew Talamantes, the first Latino judge to serve on the Marin County Superior

This is also the first time in the state's history that a Latino/a is serving on all six Courts of Appeal in California.

Under SB 56 and SB 182, the Governor is required to disclose aggregate statewide demographic data provided by all judicial applicants by March 1.





as president of WBEA from 2011-2012.


This past November, Roietta was awarded the Outstanding

Here it is Spring again and a new gardening season is starting. The days are getting longer and the weather is warmer. Well maybe. Early Spring can be cold, depending.

For a lot of people gardening can be a chore like cleaning the bathroom or washing the walls. For real gardeners, nature lovers, or people that live in the real world, gardening is a joy, an artistic endeavor and a way to connect to the living world.

I am a long time teacher of the way gardening can be fun. I have spent the last fifty years teaching people in nurseries, giving seminars and doing garden design for people. This column is dedicated to showing you how to have success gardening and learn to enjoy it.

Sacramento is blessed with one of the best gardening climates in the country. Yes, I know about Hawaii, Florida and San Diego but I also know about Nevada, North Dakota and New York. We are blessed!

Going outside now you should

see things starting to grow and bloom. If you are lucky there are some bulbs starting to break through the ground in your garden, maybe even blooming. Some of the camellias are starting to open. A few of the deciduous trees and shrubs are starting to stir. If your garden doesn't have anything happening now it should. It's too late to plant early spring bulbs now, but you have a calendar right? Mark down next October and get yourself down to the nursery and look for bulbs.

I am not a big fan of the traditional large daffodils and tulips because they tend have a life span of just a few years and then they dwindle. I prefer to plant some of the small flowered species Tulips, small flowered Narcissus (Daffodils) and a host of other naturalizing bulbs. These will last years and always surprise you when they come up!

Moving on to what you can do now. For me the least enjoyable task is weed control. The trick to

long term weed control is preventing weeds from seeding. If you are open to chemical weed control, kill the existing weeds, if not hoe them down and clean up. Immediately, put a two inch mulch of Mini or Micro Bark over the ground. No – two inch mulch is not a misprint. This will dramatically reduce the seedling weed invasion, and keeping the rest of the weeds OUT will be much easier. Remember, DO NOT allow weeds to seed.

This one project will simplify the rest of the gardening year. In my garden I mulch ALL the planting areas and renew every three to four years.

Next time I will be talking about how to make your garden interesting year round.

Easter is the greatest event that has ever been recorded. It is the most celebrated event in history. This year over a billion people around the world will celebrate Easter. 



Get your face out of your depthfinder or tackle box long enough to notice shifting winds, current, water conditions and diving birds after baitfish. Soon you'll start noticing patterns in the way big fish feed. Remember that big fish don't feed often. When they do though, they want a mouthful, so use big fresh caught live baits and big artificial baits Do vour homework by researching topo maps and looking for new untapped waters to try and keep those best places to yourself.



Dave's Thoughts on **HARP**

What do you think about the HARP program, and what exactly is it? - Ivy

Dear Ivy,

The Home Affordable Refinance Program is designed for people who have made their payments on time but are underwater on their mortgages. Being "underwater" means they owe more on their homes than the homes are worth. So basically it gives them the opportunity to refinance their home loans.

The HARP program is the only part of the Making Home Affordable program that actually worked. And to be honest, it has worked well. In contrast, the recent Home Loan Modification program is a piece of junk and all about political posturing. About 93 percent of the people who applied for a home loan modification didn't get one. It was just another case of the government pretending to do something.

I'd advise looking into the HARP program if you've got a good credit history and you're underwater on your current home. Lots of HARP program applications are being approved, and the deals are closing. That's what really matters when you find yourself in a situation like this.

It "God said it, I believe it, and that settles it." This slogan is one of today's all too common bumper sticker defenses of the Bible. The phrase is sometimes amended to read, "God said it... and that settles it," to reflect that personal belief is inconsequential in the matter.

Proponents of this view caricaturize the Bible as a divinely dictated book of statutes whose truth is crystal clear to anyone who has sense enough to simply read. Of course they fail to clarify that what they call the "truth" is their view of the truth, shaped by their unique set of circumstances, experiences, and presuppositions.

I often encounter fervent, sincere, Bible-believing people who say things like, "We need more of the Bible around here." I don't disagree, but the sense I get is that what some people really want are for their interpretations of the Bible to be upheld, validated, and shouted at everyone else in the room.

They want the preacher to hit all the hot buttons on all the hot issues – and hit these buttons with some zing - so that they can shout "Hallelujah, we are right and everybody else is wrong!" Then they can continue with business as usual, celebrating their own spiritual beauty and criticizing the ugliness of those with whom they disagree.

God Said It... And That Unsettles It

Thus, "believing the Bible" can create hard-hearted, judgmental, graceless religionists who patrol society with their personalized weapons of rigidity and arrogance. In such cases, both belief and the Bible have been misappropriated. Christians can become "settled" for sure, but are simultaneously nothing like their namesake, Jesus Christ.

I think there is a more principled approach to dealing with the Scriptures (even if my suggestion is shaped by my own unique set of assumptions): What if we begin to read the Bible descriptively rather than just prescriptively? That is, what if the Bible describes the human search for the Holy – and the Holy's interaction with the human rather than simply prescribing religious behavior?

Such a change would allow us to be set free from stagnant dogma that "settles it," and instead put us on a journey of faithful exploration. We could then read the Scriptures, not to confirm our righteousness and others' wrongness, but looking for clues to how we can better know God.

After all, that's what I believe the Bible is all about: God spoke through the lives, experiences, and writing of those who went before us, so we could know him. And he is best known in the person of Jesus. Everything before Jesus is prelude, everything we read about him is gospel, and everything we read after him is reflection.

So we can see that the goal of the Scriptures is not to give us ideas about religion; not to help us form sharper or better doctrinal statements; or to build theological armaments against those who believe differently than we do, or to answer all of our questions. It is to bring us face to face with Christ, and to become like him.

Consequently, we must be cautious not to fall more in love with the statues of the Scriptures than the actual Subject of the Scripture. We must guard against being more committed to our presuppositions about God than the Person who came to show us who God is and who we can become. We cannot be more smitten with the Bible than we are with Jesus, as strange as that may sound, for that is nothing less than a subtle form of idolatry.

Our faith isn't built on the Bible. It is built on a Person. There is only one foundation for Christian faith (the Bible says as much!), and that foundation is Jesus Christ. Upon him our faith rests, upon him the church is built, and he is what the Bible is about.

I'm not advocating setting the Bible aside, but to actually embrace it, and see to whom it points. This may be an unsettling way to approach the Scriptures, but being "settled" isn't the point; knowing and becoming like Jesus is.










Dare to Live Without Limits COMPASSION

"If you want others to be happy, practice compassion. If you want to be happy, practice compassion." -- The Dalai Lama

Having compassion for others is essential if you are going to attract the things you want in your life. If you just care about your own needs, you will wind up repelling those people and circumstances you

A compassionate person cares about other people. Whenever possible, a compassionate person tries to lend a hand to those in need. A Case in Point

The Case of the **Bad Brakes**

President Harry Truman kept a sign on his desk that said, "The Buck Stops Here." Truman believed that certain responsibilities were the exclusive domain of the President and could not be delegated.

California has a similar legal concept, although the phrase is less colorful than "the buck stops here." Lawyers and judges call this concept "a nondelegable duty." Here's an example of how it works. I'm using fictitious names, but the story is based on an actual case called Maloney v.

Lucy brought her car to Fred's Repair Shop to have the brakes overhauled. Lucy picked up the car, paid Fred for the work and drove around town without any problem

About three months later, Ethel was driving to Raley's for her weekly grocery shopping. She stopped in a left-hand turn lane on Sunrise Avenue to wait for the traffic signal to change. Lucy, en route to a yoga class, pulled into the left-hand turn lane behind Ethel. When Lucy stepped on her brake pedal, the brakes failed, and Lucy's car collided with the rear of Ethel's car. Ethel suffered neck and spine injuries and sued Lucy for damages.

After the accident, the brakes on Lucy's car were examined by her insurance company. It was determined that the failure was caused by a hole in the hydraulic hose, which caused the hose to rub against the right front wheel. After three months of friction, the hose ruptured, without warning,

and the brakes failed. That's when Lucy could not stop her car and hit Ethel. The rubbing against the wheel resulted from the faulty installation of the hose at Fred's when the brakes were overhauled.

Lucy's attorney asked the judge to dismiss the case against her. Lucy neither knew, nor had reason to know, that her brakes were defective until the moment of the accident. The brakes had given no warning of their imminent failure. The hole in the hose would have been apparent only to a mechanic, not to the average person. Lucy was abiding by all traffic laws when she collided with Ethel and had a good faith belief that her car was fine. Why should Lucy, rather than Fred, be liable to Ethel?

Here's where the nondelegable duty entered the case. The court's decision was that Ethel definitely could sue Lucy for liability. The vehicle owner is liable for injuries caused by defective brakes – even if a service garage supposedly repaired the brakes but did a negligent job. California's Vehicle Code imposes on the vehicle owner the duty to maintain the brakes in good working order, and that duty is nondelegable.

The law's reasoning is based on a concern for public safety. If the work in question involves a grave risk of bodily harm or death, liability is assigned to the person who selects the contractor. The vehicle owner can select a reputable repair shop that provides a customer with indemnity (i.e., the repair shop

will reimburse the customer for loss or damages resulting from the repair shop's negligence.) Although Lucy may be liable to Ethel, Fred may be liable to Lucy.

There are other nondelegable duties in everyday life. A property owner has a nondelegable duty to keep his or her property reasonably free from hazards. An apartment building landlord has a nondelegable duty to keep the lobby, elevators and staircases safe. A trucking company is liable for the negligence of an independent contractor drivers if he or she causes a traffic accident. Surgeons have a nondelegable duty to remove sponges and clamps from the patient's body when finishing an operation. The bottom line is that an improperly maintained car poses a grave risk of serious bodily injury or death. California courts say that the responsibility for minimizing that risk rests with the person who owns and operates the vehicle. To paraphrase Harry Truman: if your car has bad brakes, and those brakes cause an accident that hurts somebody, the buck stops with you.

City to Use Grant Monies to Ease **Traffic at Mills Middle School**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA -(MPG) Traffic in front of Mills Middle School will be less frustrating for parents when they make left turns into the school's driveway and parking lot during the next school year. The City of Rancho Cordova has been awarded a \$270,000 grant from the State's Safe Routes to School Program to add a left turn signal light and a dedicated left turn lane in front of the school.

Currently because there is only a center turn lane and no traffic light, drivers wanting to turn left have to wait for a gap in oncoming traffic, often causing a long backup of cars when parents bring their children to school in the morning.

"Because they are frustrated with the congestion, some parents drop their kids off across the street and the children then have to cross busy Coloma Road to get to school," said John Samuelson, the City's Street Operations and Maintenance Manager who wrote the successful grant application. "The traffic signal and the dedicated left turn lane will allow drivers to more easily turn into the school driveway, making it safer for them and for the students."

Construction and installation of the new light and turn lane will be done during the summer months and is anticipated to be completed when school starts in the fall.

The City received three

additional Highway Safety Improvement Program grants for other improvements that will improve safety and the flow of traffic. Work is scheduled to begin this summer on installing a traffic light at the Aramon Drive and Coloma Road intersection and the installation of signal interconnect equipment that will coordinate the traffic signals along Coloma Road and improve the flow of

Next year, a traffic signal will be installed at the Douglas Road and Grantline Road intersection. For more information, please contact the Public Works Department at 851-8710.



Decades of Flooding... Any Answers?

The creek flows from the southeast side of Hazel Avenue and snakes it way northwest to the east side of Sunrise Boulevard where it converges with the North Fork Arcade Creek, about one-eighth mile north of Greenback Lane. Complicating issues is past development decisions to realign the creek bed between Illinois and Kenneth avenues in addition to filling in the creek bed between Phoenix Field and Illinois, to use underground pipes.

In the area between Hazel and Kenneth avenues, the creek flows along the north side of Piedre Way and Sheraton Drive. Those streets are the homes, east of Kenneth that are hardest hit

during extreme storms. "Our policy now is it is okay if the street and property have water," said George Booth, Senior Engineer, Sacramento County Water Resources Department. "We just don't want the homes filling with water. In that case, we advise them to raise

their home." That is not acceptable to homeowners who blame deferred improvements to the drainage system as the county approved in-fill development projects during the past 40 years.

"The county should be held responsible for the problem they created instead of telling flood victims we need to spend money to fix the mess," said Bev Moran, whose family has lived on Piedre since 1971. "It's been unreal over the decades how the flooding has kept getting more severe as the area developed."

To comply with the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, county water resource officials prepared a master plan for how it will resolve flooding throughout the county. On page 9, it lists: "South Branch Arcade Creek — Gum Ranch Basin. This plan is for complying with the Sacramento

County Local Hazard Mitigation Plan to qualify for FEMA grant programs."

Booth said he has tried to get the basin installed.

"I called Mr. Gum and asked him if he would sell us a piece of his land where the creek flows through, but he said no," Booth said. "I was looking at applying for a FEMA Grant. I want to build that project for the community."

Gum declined to discuss the

Curiously, Gum's development plans requires him donating 14.3 acres so a detention basin can be built to mitigate the runoff from his project. Also, when the project begins, the build will have the exorbitant expense of constructing a detention basin if

Gum does not allow the county to build the project.

"Detention basins take about five years for the environmental regulatory reviews and permit processes and costs a million dollars in permits and process costs plus \$800,000 an acre for mitigation costs," Booth said.

The reason the county cannot force the Gums to allow the county's version of a basin, is within the California Environmental Quality Act, which essentially states no government entity can force any person to allocate land for the purpose of mitigating existing problems, and or, issues that are not a direct result of the project when completed.

Government's Role to Protect Property

The county could have filed an eminent domain lawsuit years ago, to seek court intervention forcing the Gums to sell the needed acreage for a basin. The procedure is a government entity obtains a fair market value appraisal of the land. Then they must send a copy to the owner along with a written offer to purchase. If the landowner refuses, the government is entitled to file an eminent domain action. It only has to prove to the court that the land is needed for a public purpose and that an offer of valuable consideration was made and refused, according to Professor John Spankling, at the Sacramento-based Pacific University, McGeorge School of Law, who is a national expert on land law and has written 4 books on the subject.

"Government's core function is to protect public life and property," therefore, people flooding would qualify as needing protection," Spankling said.

Ironically, Irving Gum is no stranger to the eminent domain process. His aunt Emma Ipsen, who had owned the farm before him, put him on title to 70 acres on the south end of her 160acre farm. In 1961 San Juan School District took 50 acres of the 70 acres through an eminent domain action, to build Bella Vista High School. At the same time, the county filed an eminent domain action to acquire a section across her south border to build Madison Avenue.

"We gave up and let them have it," Gum said.

A Flood of Problems

"I 'm worried because we are way over due for another devastating storm," Moran said, whose home and property have

flooded in every extreme storm since 1976.

"Those homes east of Kenneth were built in the 1950s and there were things done we wouldn't do today," Booth said. "We know more about flood plains."

Booth is referencing how the 1950s developers built homes on Piedre and Sheraton, which were a flood plain, and those streets are where the creek was originally located.

The developer dug a trench in the side of the hill and concreted it to keep it stable to realign the creek. Then created quarter-acre lots below it, fronting the streets. Residents on those streets say "it has been a colossal failure since it was created." They add that every decade has had at least one extreme storm causing the creek to spilling over and gushing through their homes and properties and down to the street.

"The flooding gets so bad my son has gotten the raft out of the garage and rowed up to Illinois Avenue, where people had to park up the hill near Madison Avenue and walk down to get in the boat so my son could paddle them to their homes that had water inside."

The Turnbull and Woods family members, who have owned acreage above the creek since prior to 1950 when the area began developing, say South Fork Arcade Creek always spilled over its banks during extreme storms, and during those times, such as the flood of 1955, the lots that now front the streets was where under water.

The Catch 22.

Because a basin has not been built, other problems causing flooding cannot be remedied, county officials say.

One of the problems is the two, 8 foot, side-by-side culverts under Kenneth Avenue, allowing the creek to flow under the road to the other side where the creek flows through the Gums' property. In extreme storms, the creek water crests above those two culvert openings then slams against the top and side walls, creating a tidal wave crashing backwards onto incoming rushing water causing the water to spread sideways purported 100 feet, and because Kenneth was stories to Draffin and Moran. raised ions ago for the culverts Most, would only talk off the and prevent the road from being submerged during flooding, the raised road acts as a dam for the east side residents.

"We don't do anything about that problem right now, because to fix the culverts at Kenneth, without the detention basin, would cause a devastating deluge of flooding downstream far more severe than what is happening upstream," Johnson said.

Sheraton resident, Pamela Smith, points out how flood insurance is out people's budget and they have had to pay for damages themselves.

"It's not reasonable we have buy insurance when the county knows what needs fixing," Smith said. "Even during average storms, the creek turns my backyard into a lake and when the water recedes, my yard looks like a junkyard with tires and garbage everywhere. Apparently that's the county's maintenance plan – let the flood waters wash the debris on to our properties to clear out the creek."

Further upstream, east of Illinois, two elements that add to Piedre homeowners' plight is the homes were built on slabs, and the other is Illinois is raised where it crosses Piedre and Sheraton, so it dams the water on the Piedre side. For decades, men have waded through the 2 feet or higher of water, to open manhole covers to drain the rising floodwater.

"I wish they wouldn't do that because its not safe and that's not where the water is supposed to drain because it's only diverting the problem to a new location to make more problems elsewhere," Booth said. "We made many upgrades about a decade ago in that area. We cleared clogged pipes and added inlets."

Many of the residents in that area said those fixes have worked in normal storms, but because they have not experienced a severe storm since the 1990s, they do not know how well the fixes will protect them.

Anemic Flood Insurance


Colleen Draffin, who lives on Latin Way, the street above Piedre, also has had decades of flooding and FEMA and insurance claims.

"We have had it filling with water in the floods of '86, '95 and '98 storms," Draffin said. "The 1998 storm destroyed most of the interior of our home and furnishings, so we became pro-active by purchasing sump pumps and making monthly deposits into a savings account instead of paying for flood insurance. Policies too high especially with a \$1,000 deductible and the price kept increasing with each claim we had to file. FEMA said we couldn't keep turning to them. The amount of money we had to outlay was too high, so, we're self insuring and praying for the best."

Many homeowners interviewed for this story had similar record, citing fear of county building enforcement knowing how bad things are in their home from past flooding, and or, fear of their mortgage company finding out they do not have flood insurance.

One resident showed MPG reporter their home where floodwater had gone under the home and raised up through the floor boards. They had to remove the oak flooring and now just have floorboards where you can see the ground underneath through the thin gaps.

Residents upstream and downstream reported that the intense storm in November 2012, flooded their yards, but not their
