## **Dispose Unwanted Meds at Rancho Police Center**

*Rancho Cordova* – Have you wondered what to do with your unused or expired medications? On Saturday, September 25th, National Take-Back Day events will take place at specific sites throughout the country.

The Rancho Cordova location is the Rancho Cordova Police Service Center, 10361 Rockingham Drive, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

National Take-Back Day provides an opportunity for the public to safely dispose of expired, unwanted, and unused pharmaceutical controlled substances and other medications. This one-day effort is intended to bring national focus to the issue of increasing pharmaceutical controlled substance abuse. The program is anonymous.Prescription and over the counter solid dosage medications, i.e. tablets and capsules will be accepted.

Intra-venous solutions, injectables, and needles will not be accepted.

Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative.

## Northern California Red Cross Chapters to Consolidate

Sacramento - During these difficult economic times the American Red Cross must be very efficient with dollars that are being donated. After meeting with Board leadership volunteers in the Yolo and Lake Counties Chapter, Capital Region Chapter and Sonoma and Mendocino Counties Chapter, it became clear that a realignment for Yolo and Lake County was necessary. The realignment will streamline staffing efficiencies and expand volunteer training opportunities, with the ultimate goal of enhancing the delivery of Red Cross mission services to all families

in Yolo and Lake Counties. Effective September 16, 2010, Yolo County will join the Capital Region Chapter, headquartered out of Sacramento, and Lake County will join the Sonoma and Mendocino Counties Chapter headquartered out of Santa Rosa. According to Capital Region Chapter Chief Executive Officer Dawn Lindblom, "This is an exciting time as we explore new opportunities to make our communities safer and better prepared for lifethreatening emergencies."

The realignment will strengthen the Red Cross presence in each of the affected communities. In the eyes of the community, the only changes they should see are increased efficiencies in Red Cross services being delivered. The Woodland office will now join the six other offices in the Capital Region Chapter: Auburn, Modesto, Sacramento, Sonora, Stockton and Tracy. Support for Lake County will be facilitated through the Santa Rosa office.

Disaster volunteers in Yolo and Lake Counties will still deliver response services to families in their local community. But when there is a large-scale disaster in either county, the Red Cross will now have the ability to use all the material and volunteer resources to help with the sheltering and mass care response needs. As Charley Santoni, Board Chair and volunteer with the Yolo and Lake Counties Chapter shared, "We've been helping each other more and have seen the difference it can make. We can be on the scene more quickly through a better deployment strategy based on sharing resources."

The health and safety volunteers and instructors will continue to teach classes within their current communities. By leveraging resources in health and safety we will be able to better coordinate class offerings such as CPR and first aid training and expand others such as water safety and life guarding.

We will now be fundraising for "One Red Cross" and will be able to deliver a global reach with a local

## The Public Employee Union Scam

Under the National Labor Relations Act, private-sector unions are allowed to extract dues and fees from workers if the employer agrees. The NLRA, passed in 1935 during Franklin Roosevelt's first term, does not, however, apply to public-sector employees-including state and federal workers-because the thinking was that this would over-politicize government and cause a conflict of interest between unions and politicians. In a Weekly Standard piece by professors Fred Siegel and Dan DiSalvo titled, "The New Tammany Hall," this problem is described:

Unlike private sector unions, the sheer number of workers represented is not the linchpin of [the public sector unions] influence. Private sector unions have a natural adversary in the owners of the companies with whom they negotiate. But public sector unions have no such natural counterweight. They are a classic case of "client politics," where an interest group's concentrated efforts to secure rewards impose diffused costs on the mass of unorganized taxpayers.

In the 1960s, many states began chipping away at the wall of separation between unions and public workers. In 1965, the Michigan Legislature revised the Public Employment Relations Act (PERA) to establish mandatory collective bargaining and exclusive representation for state and municipal government workers. This has caused the number of publicsector union employees to skyrocket.

A conflict of interest would be as follows: First, a government union elects politicians by funding their campaigns and organizing a massive get-out-the-vote drive; second, the politicians support employee pay increases, generous pensions, and condition of employment; third, the union takes dues (read: taxpayer money) and starts the cycle all over again for selected politicians. At both the state and national

At both the state and national level, public-sector union support for many Democrats has been well documented. One of the largest public-sector unions in the country, the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) has given over \$40 million to politicians since 1990, with more than 98 percent of that going to Democrats. The SEIU, AFL-CIO, and United Steel Workers have all promised big help in the coming election. In return, the Democratic Party has voted nearly lockstep with these unions' demands.

But political cronyism knows no party lines, and many Republicans likewise have been guilty here in Michigan.

In just the past year, the state has had several such instances. Last fall, nine Michigan Education Association-supported House Republicans nixed a 3 percent costsaving plan for the school aid budget. In April, MEA-supported Senate Republicans watered down a modest bill that would "increase state and school employee payroll contributions to their pension system by 3 percent, cap pension 'service credits' at 30 years, and create a somewhat less generous defined benefit system for new school employees." At the same time, a union subsidiary of the SEIU pushed GOP Senators into coming up short on a vote that would have opened a prison to competitive bidding and privatized it, if privatization promised to save money.

Last August, one Republican state senator came under fire for introducing a bill that would have forced some 42,000 in-home health care workers into a union, sending approximately \$6.6 million in taxpayers' money to the SEIU in the form of "dues."

Unfortunately, what has happened in Michigan has taken place elsewhere in America. The end game for these types of relationships is already happening in our country's most public unionfriendly states: in California, where budget gridlock has forced the government to issue IOUs and minimumwage salaries to public officials, and in Illinois, where the governor has promised massive tax hikes combined with severe cuts to education. Both states have some of the highest tax rates in the county, and yet both face pension obligations that they cannot ever hope to pay.

These types of political dealings and financing may not be illegal, but they're still an offense to the political process. Politicians can take money from government-employee unions and then vote on legislation that directly improves the financial wellbeing of these entities. A possible quid pro quo exists that would not if public-sector unions were restricted from giving money to politicians.

Politicians granting unsustainable government-employee salaries, benefits, and pensions is a problem everywhere, but the states with the strongest public-sector unions will have the hardest time correcting the problem. More broadly, as long as these incestuous relationships between government unions and the political class remain in place and unchallenged, the size and scope of government will continue to grow.

Lately I've been reminded of an old campfire skit. The leader is speaking calmly to the gathered campers when someone races in with arms flailing, shouting: "Help! Help! It's all around me!" The host reacts with genuine concern: "What's all around you?!" The intruder smiles, shrugs and replies nonchalantly: "The air."

Goofy, I know, but I've recently been experiencing that same feeling. Not about the air, but about chemical substances – 80,000 potentially toxic synthetic substances in current use in the U.S, of which only 200 or so have been safety tested by our government.

Under current law, chemical products are judged "innocent until proven guilty," rather than asking industry to research a substance's safety before companies put the stuff into the environment. It's just that sort of thinking that got us in trouble with DDT, dioxin, and PCBs – once "beneficial" chemicals now deemed deadly, and banned.

A slew of new safety studies, two new congressional bills, and numerous product recalls (including 28 million boxes of Kellog cereal this summer) have amped up debate over the potential toxicity of chemical compounds that are, literally, all around us: in our food, water and air, and scariest of all, in our bodies and the bodies of our children.

Let's look at just two suspect synthetics: Bisphenol A (commonly called BPA), and the phthalates (a family of compounds). Both are endocrine disruptors that mimic natural hormones in the human body with potentially harmful effects. I say "potentially" because evidence is still deemed "inconclusive" by the federal government despite hundreds of studies linking these chemicals to various cancers, reproductive and sexual disorders, obesity, and behavioral problems like attention-deficit

disorder. Bisphenol A has especially come under scrutiny since its health impacts

most effect pregnant women, babies and children. This hard plastic additive is found in an incredible range of consumer products, including food and drink containers (especially their linings), baby bottles, reusable water bottles, and other food packaging. Detectable BPA was found in 92 percent of canned food tested in a study released this spring by the National Workgroup for Safe Markets, a coalition of public and environmental health groups. More worrisome, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found traces of BPA in the urine of 93 percent of all people tested.

Phthalates are added to plastics to increase flexibility and durability. Any soft, pliable plastic item found in the office, car or home is likely to contain phthalates including children's toys. Phthalates are also common additives to shampoo, hair spray, cosmetics, detergents and lotions – essentially any personal care product containing fragrance. Have I mentioned that they're all around us?

Despite the many studies indicating risk, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency simply lists BPA and phthalates as "chemicals of concern." The U.S. Food and Drug Administration currently allows both compounds in food packaging. The U.S. government only recently restricted the use of certain phthalates in children's toys and child-related products, a step the European Union took back in 2005.

"America's system for regulating industrial chemicals is broken," declared Senator Frank Lautenberg (D-NJ) this spring when introducing the Safe Chemicals Act of 2010. This bill, if passed, would replace the antiquated and inadequate Toxic Substances Control Act of 1976, shifting the burden of chemical safety to industry in order for a product to stay on the market. In a separate bill, the Food Safety Modernization Act, an amendment by Senator Diane Feinstein (D-CA) would ban BPA from food-related products.

Of course, the chemical industry is fighting to water down both bills. And if passed, neither will bring immediate change. BPA and phthalates will likely both require a slow phase-out.

In the meantime, there are ways to reduce your family's BPA and phthalate exposure. For starters, evaluate food packaging, personal care products, and soft plastic toys - the kind likely to end up in a little one's mouth. Though a federal ban on phthalates in kid's toys has taken effect, older toys may still contain the chemical. Also, read the ingredients on personal care products for fragrance additives which may include phthalates. Phase out reusable plastic food containers in favor of glass and stainless steel. Canned food consumption should be limited (since most cans are lined with BPA) especially for young children and pregnant women.

Unlike that fellow rushing to disrupt the campfire, I'm not trying to evoke panic, but I am offering a friendly warning. Until government and industry take a more responsible role in chemical safety, it's your and my job to protect our families as best we can.

Rancho Cordova Mayor Ken Cooley agrees, saying that the Annual Corporate Report event "pulls together for us the best and most timely financial information to



Recently, I was introduced to a beautiful young lady who had recently attempted suicide. Her cousin brought her to church because he loves her and wanted to inspire her to see the value of life and the gift that her life is. Though we prayed for her, a week later she would make a second attempt and would return to the emergency room to await her fate.

While I leave her nameless here, I took her home with me in thought because this was not the first time I have faced this sad story. In fact, it is an all-too-often reality that I face in my work in ministry and with teens. Like you, I want to know why would someone think to take their own life? While my answers are varied, one common theme is, an overwhelming sense of failure.

What constitutes a failure? And how could someone, so early in life feel that they have reached it. Last year, a young man in his late thirties was successful in committing suicide. He was discovered by his two children hanging in a bedroom in his house. He did it because he was deep in debt in his restaurant business and saw no way out. What's clear to me is that in every

tation, equated to personal failure. Our society feeds into a warped value system through the media promoting the message, "you're not enough, so get more!" Get more clothes. Get a better job. Get a better house. Get a better body. Get a faster car. Get more money, etcetera, etcetera, etcetera. Social media websites even subtly encourage this "get more value" through displaying the number of friends you have, implying the more you have the better you are. Likewise, you are encouraged to post your thoughts and people can actually vote "like". Even I have found myself checking on Facebook to see if people "liked" the quote I posted for the day. However, when we come to depend upon others liking us in order to feel significant, then the reverse is equally true, we feel insignificant when they don't. There is a distinction between soul evolution and "getting more." As one's soul evolves it reveals the treasures that comes with growth. More and better do not constitute growth or soul expansion, as these ideas are based upon false external comparison. Rather than seeking to become more, we should focus on becoming a greater expression of Spirit. Let's focus upon being available as an avenue of ever expanding good. As this well spring of good flows through you, it is inevitable that we will become positively impressed with what we voluntarily express. Yes, the pursuit of material wealth,

personal success and , happiness all have their place. The problem is that when the search for these things starts outside of oneself, they will truly never be found. The Master Teacher, Jesus the Christ said, "the kingdom of God is within." This kingdom is the "realm of ever expanding good." It is when we are willing to search within for happiness, success, and love that we will encounter the Source of all love, all life, all beauty, all joy, all peace saying, "welcome home."

Our lives are God's gift to us and what we make of our lives is our gift back to God. Let us make ourselves available to allow the splendor of God's light to express in and through us. As Ricke Byars Beckwith says in her song Use Me, "God needs us to shine Its light, as me, as you. So, use me O, God I stand for you and here I'll abide as you show me all that I must do!"

Within 45 minutes I had received three phone calls each being from a person who was experiencing a crisis in their life. One person had lost their job, the next was losing their marriage, and the last was dealing with a defiant family member who was wreaking havoc. Earlier that morning-before even coming to the office-I had read this verse: "The Lord reigns, let the earth be glad; let the distant shores rejoice."

## What Stole Your "Glad"?

#### (Psalm 97:1)

Calamity and heartbreak occur at an astounding rate of frequency in our world. It touches the lives of great and small alike on our continent, in Europe, Asia, and even the smallest island nations. So....with all this evil taking place around us, in us and to us; how can we be glad? If the Lord reigns why is there so much suffering? And how can we possibly be glad when the God in charge seems to be asleep on the job?

The verse teaches that "gladness" is linked to the character of God—not the events of our life. If one does not know and trust the character of the Person in charge, then it becomes impossible to remain "glad" in times of pain. It is similar to trusting a doctor when the pain of surgery is prescribed so that a cure might be possible. The pain of surgery does not prove the doctor is incompetent.



Sacramento – On November 17, 2009 at approximately 7:56 a.m., Joshua Raver, a 16 year old from Orangevale, and his 11 year old brother Joey, were riding their bicycles on Pershing Avenue east of Hazel Avenue. As Joshua was riding he fell off his bicycle and landed into the westbound lane of Pershing Avenue. A citizen, Mrs. Laura Gerard, stopped her vehicle in the westbound lane to protect Joshua from being struck by other vehicles. Off-Duty CHP Officer, Martin McQueen, stopped at the scene and was advised by Joey that Joshua had an existing medical condition. A citizen, Mrs. Pam Elliott, also stopped at the scene to render aid to Joshua. CSTL embraces Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and Narcotics Anonymous (NA) and requires residents to be an active member in one of those or similar 12-step programs. How much is Motel 6 without the food and extras?). It would cost a person more than \$3000 a month to duplicate what we provide in our area where the rents run \$850-\$950 per month or more for an unfurnished apartment without the food and other amenities.

Resident accountability is the key. Long term sobriety happens by a person choice not because they are mandated. Residents have a midnight curfew and may have two overnight passes per week. Residents agree to and may be alcohol and drug tested at any time by urine analysis. The following is a partial list of the amenities available for those living in Phase I; breakfast, lunch, dinner (I am told is Restaurant quality) cooked for the residents, snacks, drinks (coffee, punch, etc.), toiletries, Free Laundry, recreation room, pool table, weights, Cable TV, Big Screen TV in meeting room where we have a double feature "Movie Night", a professional type ping pong table, darts, Video games, board games, house computers and wireless Internet, AA/NA Meetings (Approx. 20 per Week) and more!

The Phase II (SLEs) is for those who have lived in Phase I for a minimum of 30 days, are working a good 12-Step program and desires less structure. These folks are committed to their recovery and want to continue to be part of the CSTL family. Phase II rent ranges from \$395 to \$550 (most rooms \$495 which is \$16.50 per day). All the Phase II homes are fully furnished, all utilities are paid,

cable TV is provided and everyone lives in a single room.

We have been told that we look like a "tribe" which makes sense. A tribe is: "A unit of sociopolitical organization consisting of a number of families, clans, or other groups who share a common ancestry and culture and among whom leadership is typically neither formalized nor permanent." This makes sense! We have our own congress of residents that make our laws and our own court that enforces our laws.

We host approximately 20 open and registered 12 Step meetings, both AA and NA and a few Bible Studies at out location at 8938 Madison Avenue, Fair Oaks, 95628. It is a beautiful area that has all of the outsides resources available such as stores, fast food, gas stations and a bus line.

CSTL, Inc. is registered and certified with California Association of Addiction Recovery Resources, as a Sober Living Environment. Over the years we have taught others how to do a sober living. If you wish to tour our homes or want to make arrangements to move in please call us at 916-961-2691.

We also have a Detox Facility for those who need to withdrawal for the toxins. It is generally difficult if not impossible for one to go through this process safely alone. Our detox is a six bed, social model detox that is progressive in its philosophy and techniques. Their phone number is: (916) 965-3386. Our detox also provides outpatient groups and one on one counseling for those who want seek it.
