Services at Gibson Ranch

**Agreement Signed for** 

Sacramento Region – In an effort to provide seamless and ongoing services to residents who board their horses at Gibson Ranch, the County has entered into an agreement with the Grace Foundation to provide temporary horse boarding management to begin September 1. The Grace Foundation, a well-known equine rescue and rehabilitation facility located in El Dorado Hills, agreed to manage the program after the former concessionaire terminated its contract with the County.

The agreement with the Grace Foundation is short-term, conditioned to last for six months. Sacramento County has released a request for proposals seeking an operator who can manage the entire Gibson Ranch which includes 350 acres of parkland, the horse boarding facility, a nature preserve and picnic areas. . The

deadline for the request for proposals is September 3. The County is looking to have a new operator in place by the first of the year.

The Grace Foundation agreement is a Fee for Service agreement. The County chose to execute a Fee for Service agreement because of the short-term nature of the agreement. The maximum amount of the agreement is \$73,000 for six months of service. Revenue from horse boarding will help offset costs of feed and the Grace Foundation's management services.

# **STAR Shows Gains in San Juan Unified School District**



STAR results provide important data that can be used to improve our practice of teaching and learning.

Citrus Heights – Results from the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) program released in August show strong gains in Englishlanguage arts performance at grades 5, 8 and 9, mathematics in grades 5, 7, and Algebra 1, grade 8 social science and high school world history, and a

narrowing of the achievement gap in science for students with disabilities, English learners, Hispanic students, African American students, and low socio-economic students.

"Improvements in STAR results are always encouraging and our dedicated teachers, staff, students, and families should all be proud of the accomplishment," said San Juan Unified School District Superintendent Dr. Pat Jaurequi. "Though STAR results are just one the many measures we use to determine student achievement in San Juan Unified, they provide important data that can be used to improve our practice of teaching and learning."

Compared with last year's results, the number of students scoring proficient or advanced in English-language arts for grades 5, 8, and 9 grew by four percent, six percent, and three percent respectively. However, the percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced in English-language arts at grades 2, 3, and 4 fell by three percent, four percent, and three percent respectively. The drops come after results in 2008/09 showed growth of five percent or more in grades 2, 3 and 4.

"San Juan Unified is investing heavily in early literacy skills with a focused implementation of community-developed and results based strategic plan" said Chief Academic Officer Glynn Thompson. "While we certainly work toward improvement each year it is not unexpected to see small declines this year at grades 2, 3, and 4 after showing strong growth in 2008/09."

In mathematics no grades showed significant declines while the number of students scoring proficient or advanced in grades 5, 7 and 9 increased by five percent, six percent, and three percent respectively. Significant improvement was also seen in Algebra 1 with the number of students scoring proficient or advanced increasing by three percent.

Performance on science tests remained comparable to previous years on each of the grade level exams given to grades 5, 8 and 10. On individual course exams, a three percent gain was shown in the number of students testing proficient or advanced in Earth science while the number fell by five percent in physics. In 2008/09 the District had seen an 11 percent increase in students scoring proficient or advanced in physics.

"Closing the achievement gap is essential if we are truly to be a community that cares about the success of all students. While the results we see from STAR in science are encouraging this year, we still have much more work to be done," said Thompson.

History-social science is tested in grades 8 and 11 and in world history. The percentage of students scoring proficient or advanced in grade 8 grew by five percent and by 3 percent in world history. This year's results continue a trend in the last several years to see steadily increasing performance in history-social science.

Principals, teachers, and staff will analyze results for each school site and use the data to support continued improvement of teaching and learning in the District. Parents and community members can see state, county, district, and school level results on the California Department of Education's Web site.

# Will Governor Refuse to Represent the Will of the People of California, Again?

Ultra Liberal Bills, Passed Legislature, Now Go To Gov. Schwarzeneggar



Four ultra liberal bills passed the California State Legislature. SB 906, changes marriage to "civil marriage". SB 1460 provides financial aid for illegal aliens. SB 543 provides mental health treatment for minors without parental consent. SB 810 establishes a new state bureaucracy for a singlepayer health plan.

SB 906 which is already on the governor's desk, changes marriage to "civil marriage", inserting the new term in various places in the family code. The author of this bill is Mark Leno who previously authored several failed same-sex marriage bills. This new bill SB 906 lays the groundwork for legalizing same-sex marriage in the future. Prop 8, marriage between a man and a woman, passed with a majority of the people's vote and thus is the will of the people. The California State Legislature should have respected the will of the people and opposed this bill. Will Governor Schwarzeneggar respect the will of the people and veto it?

**SB 1460,** financial aid for illegal aliens, is a bill that is also on the governor's desk. It requires the California State University System and California community colleges to offer grants, scholarships, and loan programs to some students who are in this country illegally. In the light of the state's fiscal instability, passing this bill through the legislature was irresponsible, now we will see what Governor Schwarzeneggar does.

**SB 543,** mental health treatment for minors without parental consent is also on the governor's

desk. This bill authorizes a minor as young as age 12 to consent to mental health treatment or to residential shelter services without the consent of a parent, if the minor is "mature enough" in the opinion of a "professional person" (as defined in the bill). This bill undermines parental authority and unless parents have been accused of abuse or present a threat to the health and safety of a minor, they must be contacted prior to professional treatment. It is shocking that this bill which tramples on parent's rights, passed the State Legislature, will Governor Schwarzeneggar stand up for parental rights and veto the bill?

**SB 810** is a bill that establishes a new state bureaucracy and imposes single payer healthcare, it prevents any health care service plan or health insurance policy except for the new California Health Insurance System Plan. This bill has passed the State Legislature and could go to the governor at any time. SB 810 would ruin the health insurance industry, and could cause financial ruin for the state, because any government provision must be paid for by raising taxes or charging fees. Again in the light of the state's fiscal instability, how could the State Legislature pass this bill? And more importantly, will Governor Schwarzenegger veto it?

These four ultra liberal bills are on the verge of becoming law. SB 906, which creates "civil marriage" and lays the groundwork for same-sex marriage. SB 1460, that provides financial aid for illegal aliens, which could cause financial ruin in our state. SB 543 which allows minors to access mental health care without parental consent and thereby tramples on parental rights. Then lastly, SB 810, which establishes a new state bureaucracy, imposes single payer health-care and thereby could cause financial ruin in our state.

# **Carmichael Non-Profit Starts a Farmers Market** and Creates Jobs for Teens!

*Carmichael* – It is no secret that we are facing tough times economically and while unemployment rates go up for many people in the states, the staggering teen unemployment rate of 26.1% (according to the United State Bureau of Labor Statistics; and compared to 10.0% for adult men and 8.0% for adult women) cannot be ignored. This is the highest it has been for over 41 years. And it is affecting youth all over the country. Even with the raise in minimum wage rates, today's youth continued to lose jobs to out of work adults making it increasingly more difficult for youth to gain valuable job experience(s) and opportunities to earn an income.

The BeMoneySmartUSA Foundation, a local non-profit training organization located in Carmichael has just opened a very "special" certified farmers market that not only supports the non-profits fundraising needs to provide financial and entrepreneurship education programs for youth in the community, they have also established a venue to support local teens with job opportunities! Through

the organization's "Rent-a-Teen" program, local farmers and vendors selling goods and produce at the market have the opportunity to hire teens from a pool of trained youth supplied by BeMoneySmartUSA Foundations Teen Entrepreneurship program to help them. Some of the teen job opportunities include positions in communications where youth act as freelance journalists who conduct interviews with the vendors, customers and local businesses to provide content for the Farmers Market's monthly newsletter. Youth also have the opportunity to work in hospitality, where they meet and greet patrons as they visit the market and assist them as needed by carrying produce back to their cars. They are also responsible for sharing information about the market and the BeMoneySmartUSA Foundations mission.

"Working at the Farmers Market has helped me learn how to talk to people confidently and practice the value of good customer service", says Alexandra, 15, who works in Communications and has participated

BeMoneySmartUSA two in Foundation camps, both in Finance and Business. After participating in these camps, Alexandra learned what it takes to start a business and being involved with the Farmers Market has offered her the opportunity to put the new skills she'd learned into practice. Youth who have participated in the BeMoneySmartUSA courses become eligible to apply and work in the Rent-A-Teen program.

"Building relationships with the customers is really important for creating a warm and friendly experience", says Austin, 17, who works as the Market Coordinator and has attended five BeMoneySmartUSA workshops. Austin continues explaining the wonderful feeling of satisfaction he gets when customers and farmers are benefitting equally from the community Market, while also supporting a good cause. "At the end of each market day, we (BeMoneySmartUSA) collect produce from the farmers and vendors who donate (upon our request) several pounds of fresh produce to give away to other youth and family charities,

# **ACLU Again Refuses to Ask U.S. Supreme Court to Review Ten Commandments Case**

time to expire without filing a petition with the U.S. Supreme Court requesting review of the Ten Commandments case in ACLU v. Grayson County, Kentucky. The Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals ruling, which upheld the Ten Commandments in the "Foundations of American Law and Government Display," now stands. Since 2005, this is the fourth time the ACLU has lost a Ten Commandments case and refused to ask the Supreme Court to review the matter.

Located on the second floor of the Grayson County, Kentucky, courthouse, the "Foundations of American Law and Government Display" includes the Ten Commandments, Magna Carta, MayflowerCompact, Declaration of Independence, Bill of Rights, Preamble to the Kentucky Constitution, Star-Spangled Banner, National Motto, and a picture of Lady Justice, with an explanation of the significance of each. The purpose of the display is educational and is intended to reflect a sampling of documents

The ACLU has allowed the that played a significant role in Grayson County display. the development of the legal and governmental system of the United States.

The case began in 2002 when the ACLU filed a lawsuit against Grayson County and a federal judge ruled against the display. Mathew Staver, Founder of Liberty Counsel and Dean of Liberty University School of Law, presented the winning oral argument on behalf of Grayson County in April 2009 at the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals. The display is identical to the displays at issue in the ACLU's lawsuits against McCreary and Pulaski Counties in Kentucky, which Staver argued at the U.S. Supreme Court in 2005. Also in 2005, this same Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld the same Ten Commandments display in Mercer County, KY, which Liberty Counsel also defended. The Sixth Circuit governs Kentucky, Ohio, Tennessee and Michigan. Notwithstanding this identical and controlling precedent, the federal judge entered a permanent injunction against the

The ACLU chose not to ask the U.S. Supreme Court to review the case, and now the time has expired to make such a request. The Foundations Display has not been reposted in the Grayson County Courthouse.

Commenting on the case, Staver said: "We are pleased that this case is now closed and that the 'Foundations of American Law and Government Display' will now include the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments are part of the fabric of our country and helped shape the law. It defies common sense to remove a recognized symbol of law from a court of law. The ACLU might not like our history and might run from it, but the fact remains that the Ten Commandments shaped our laws and may be displayed in a court of law."

As a result, I actually think the two have formed a bond, which is no small feat considering that Pupsy's personality leaves a lot to be desired. No "Miss Congeniality" is she! But you should hear her howl in the car as we pull up to Bob and Duke's house.
