GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - For the first time since the 2018 spring season, the Gridley Bulldogs baseball program hoisted a CIF Northern Section plaque as they beat West Valley 8-0 in the NSCIF Division III Championship on Saturday, May 20.

When the Herald visited the baseball team as they practiced in Farmers Hall in the middle of the March due to the infestation of rainy weather, a goal was

CHP Shifts into Overdrive to Halt Reckless **Driving**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is accelerating its efforts to halt illegal street racing and sideshows plaguing the state's roadways and destroying the lives of innocent victims. To increase awareness about the devastation and destruction caused by this illegal and dangerous driving behavior, the CHP unveiled a new multi-media campaign while standing amid a three-dimensional installation featuring an actual crashed vehicle along Melrose Avenue in Los Angeles.

The billboard, a striking visual reminder, is just one of the more than 50 displays being erected throughout the state reminding drivers about illegal street racing and sideshows, "Thrills That Kill." The public can expect to see the billboard campaign through the summer months in areas of California that have seen a high number of illegal street racing and side show activity. Among the locations: Los Angeles, the Bay Area, and the Central San Joaquin Valley.

Illegal sideshows have been occurring at an alarming rate in California, and they continue to get bigger and more dangerous. In 2021, the CHP responded to more than 7,300 incidents statewide with nearly 123,000 participants. While the number of incidents decreased by approximately 50 percent last year, there is still a significant amount of work to be done to keep California's communities, and those who use our roads, safe.

"Illegal street racing and sideshows put lives at risk, upset the quality of our neighborhoods, cause damage to private and public property, and in some cases, have resulted in the death of innocent people," **CHP Deputy Commissioner** Troy Lukkes said. "Through our ongoing efforts we want to send the message throughout California that this dangerous and illegal activity will not be tolerated."

Over a 5-year period, illegal street racing and sideshow activities have resulted in 264 crashes. Of those incidents attributed to this reckless behavior, 30 Continued on page 4

GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - Got a killer long drive or tight short game? Gridley Education Foundation is looking for participants and sponsors for its "Swing for the Schools" annual golf tournament and luncheon.

For roughly the last 20 years, the tournament has been one of the principal fundraisers of the GEF. Monies raised support Gridley schools and students through the purchase of needed sports equipment or uniforms that don't fall withing the funding cycle of the school, scholarships, and even stand-up desks with the intention of giving students a break from the monotony of desks.

In addition to the registration fee of \$150, participants and non-participants can sponsor a hole on the green for \$150, advertise their support with a 5-cart sponsorship (name on 5 golfcarts) for \$300, or be a "Friend of the Foundation" which includes company recognition on a hole and on the program for \$175 - \$500. For \$700, a team of 4 can play on the private course with recognition on hole, and \$1000 will earn you the "Title Sponsor" position, which includes 4 players, recognition on a hole and at the event. Contests included under the tournament's registration fee are "closest to the pin", "men & women's accuracy drive", a "putting contest", and more.

Additional contests run by students directly benefiting their groups or teams will be available to participate in for an additional charge. For example, the GHS Volleyball team will be running a "pipe game" and the GHS baseball team will hold a "longest drive" contest.

Participation in the GEF Tournament is limited due to the size of the private golf course and is typically held to 125 golfers. The dress code is PTGCC (Peach Tree Golf and Country Club) - shirts with collars, tucked, with no blue jeans.

Deadline for registration is June 1st, 2023, and approaching quickly. The tournament will be held June 19th, starting promptly at 8:00 am at Peach Tree Golf and Country Club, located at 2043 Simpson Dantoni Rd., Marysville, Calif.





At the final hurdle, her form was perfect as she passed Rodrigues-Sanchez at the line with a personal record of 47.60 giving her the title




