## Council Hears Part II of Annual Budgets

GRIDLEY, CA (MPG) - One of the first items of action at Monday's Gridley City Council Meeting was the revision of the resolution to rename streets located at the Industrial Park. Previously, they planned to change "Elaine Court" to "Paradise Way" and "Industrial Park Drive" to "Hall Drive" in honor of the late Frank Hall. Mayor Johnson made the motion to use Hall's full name, officially making the street's new name "Frank Hall Drive."

The Council then heard the second half of the annual budget presentation with reports provided by Parks and Recreation, Gridley-Biggs Police Department and City Engineers.

Under the command of Trina Leishman, Gridley Parks and Recreation has made exciting new changes, both to their facilities and their programs. The Parks and Recreation Center at Vierra Park has been deep cleaned, repainted and its kitchen updated with a new oven and hood. As a result, facility rental has increased by 30%. Leishman anticipates an expansion of their Senior Nutrition & Socialization Program with a developing partnership with a Paradise program in the works. The new program would provide daily meals for seniors with delivery optional, instead of just two days a week.

Continuing, Leishman outlined the summer camps and classes planned for this year (visit their Facebook page for more info) and reviewed the Soccer and Basketball seasons. City Soccer leagues saw a 65% increase in players, reduced operating costs by \$1,200 and are planning all girl teams for next season. Due to renovations at the Sycamore School that will make their field unavailable during the season, Parks and Recreation is hoping to work with the Fairgrounds in order to temporarily use their facilities. The Basketball program has also seen an increase in players, up 25% and a \$2,000 reduction in operating costs. Events such as Breakfast with Santa and the Kids Fishing Day are also doing well and generating funds for the department.

GBPD Chief Byers outlined new programs implemented within the department. Officers now review over 900 pages of policy in daily 15-minute daily training bulletins with the electronic policy

# Budget Committees Approve Funding for Camp Fire Schools

**SACRAMENTO CA (MPG)** - On May 22nd, the Assembly Subcommittee on Education Finance approved Assemblyman James Gallagher's (R-Yuba City) request for disaster relief funding for school districts impacted by the Camp Fire. The Senate Subcommittee on Education also approved the request at a hearing last week.

Specifically, the committees approved a provision in the Governor's revised budget that ensures school districts and charter schools that experienced attendance losses won't lose associated funding for at least three fiscal years. Assemblyman Gallagher, Senator Nielsen (R-Tehama), and Assemblyman Dahle (R-Bieber) submitted requests to both the Governor and the subcommittees urging this backfill.

The approved budget provisions will also allow Paradise Unified School District to request the Fiscal Crisis and Management Assistance Team conduct an assessment of the need for future funding relief for Paradise beyond 2020-21, given the uncertainty of their outyear needs at the moment.

"Our schools and the teachers that continue to selflessly serve our students amidst their own losses need to have assurances that the fire will not negatively impact their funding. Not only will this give families assurances and support as they rebuild their lives, but it is crucial to the economic

recovery of Paradise and other affected areas," said Gallagher.

It will take years for impacted communities to recover and rebuild, and while people are displaced, public services like education could be severely impacted. The Local Control Funding Formula provides a base amount of funding tied to each district's average daily attendance. Therefore, if students are temporarily displaced due to a fire, it could have huge financial implications for a school district.

The budget language approved by the subcommittee will provide a financial buffer for schools, including local charter schools, which experienced attendance loss due to the fire. Without this backfill, impacted school districts could have lost anywhere between \$3.9 and \$11.8 million in the 2019-20 school year and between \$12.2 and \$36.5 million in the 2020-21 school year.

The Camp Fire, which started in Butte County on November 8th, 2018, was the deadliest and most destructive wildfire in California state history. It burned 153,336 acres, killing 85 individuals and destroying 18,804 structures. The fire displaced over 50,000 people and devastated the communities of Magalia, Concow and Paradise.

manual system. CAPSS, a new automated pawn system which tracks items pawned throughout the U.S, has made it easier for officers to identify and retrieve stolen property. Creative arrangements with BCSO (Butte County Sheriff’s Office) have provided coverage in dispatch during slow periods, saving the GBPD money. Chief Byers also outlined changes in the Volunteer program with the hopes of resurrecting the program. Additionally, the K-9 program is fully funded by outside sources. In not-so-good news, Council heard reports from City Engineer Trin Campos, about the status of Gridley’s roads. Due to years of postponed maintenance, the city currently has a \$22 million maintenance backlog in regard to its street pavement operations. According to Pavement Management Program, a report on the overall structural integrity of city roads, Gridley’s streets average a 40 on a scale of 100, designating them as “poor” quality. The Council’s object is to aggressively improve street conditions and plans to be hyper-vigilant for grants and other avenues of funding to repair Gridley’s roadways. City Works Department will continue to grind and overlay asphalt where possible. ★

**GRIDLEY, CA (MPG)** - In The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, a ward is a congregation that meets each Sunday for worship services. A stake is a geographical grouping of several wards. The Gridley California Stake serves three wards in Gridley and three wards in Oroville. The stake also includes three branches, which are smaller congregations than wards, that serve specific memberships: Spanish-speaking, Hmong-speaking, and young single adults. Justin Tolman, Drew Henry, and Paul Fairbanks have been chosen by senior church leaders, and sustained by local members, to serve as the new stake presidency of the Gridley California Stake. They will provide leadership, counsel, and other administrative direction to local leaders and members. In his first address, President Tolman read this scripture from The Book of Mormon: “And they did pray for that which they most desired; and they desired that the Holy Ghost should be

given unto them.” Tolman asked stake members to sacrifice one thing and add one thing that would strengthen the influence of the Holy Ghost in their lives. He also requested their prayers on behalf of the new presidency. **LIVE OAK, CA (MPG)** - Upon entering the gym at Live Oak High School last Wednesday, May 29th, visitors were met with a wall of noise as excited senior students showcased their Senior Projects. The Ron Pritchard gym, home to this year’s Senior Class Project Fair, saw a steady crowd of parents, friends and fellow students come through to view the various projects of this year’s outgoing 2019 Senior Class Projects on display. At Live Oak High School, Senior Projects have been a requirement of graduation for a little over 20 years. Senior Project Program Advisors, teachers Mike Fredericks and David Anderson, were the driving

force behind the initiation and continuation of the program at Live Oak High School. The process includes the submission of a research paper on the topic, a proposal to a panel of teachers, a video presentation, executing the project and of course, participation at the Senior Project Fair. Students have a mentor, usually a teacher, and are required to give back to the community through service-based projects. A standard senior project requires 20 hours of work or service – an example of which would be organizing a blood drive as Senior Giulia Scognamiglio did. Seniors can also take a more personal route and do something that helps

develop a skillset or knowledge in a field that interested them. If the project is of a personal nature, say refinishing an electric guitar like Senior Isaac Duenas, or learning how to produce music, like Senior Angel Espinoza, an extra 10 hours is required for a total of 30. Although hours of hard work were put forward, it was clear that the seniors also had a lot fun throughout the planning and implementation of their projects. Seniors at the fair excitedly visited each other’s stations and were happy to speak with visitors about their projects and their hopes for the future. ★

# GBPD Officers Fire Upon Rogue Vehicle

**GRIDLEY, CA (MPG)** - The morning of June 4th, the peaceful air of our community was shattered by gunshots, police sirens and the sounds of squealing wheels from a fleeing vehicle. By 9:00 a.m., Gridley would be crawling with law enforcement officers from almost every area Police Department, including Chico, Paradise, and Oroville, officers from Butte County Sheriff’s Department, Butte County Probation, Fish and Game, the District Attorney and his office, and the Department of Justice Crime Lab out of Redding.

Residents taking their kids to school or headed to work would find Sycamore Street near SavMor Foods cordoned off by yellow crime scene tape and police vehicles guarding the perimeter as the investigation into an officer-initiated shooting got under way.

The events unfolded around 4:45 a.m. on Tuesday morning. A GBPD press release reports that Officers with the GBPD attempted a traffic stop on Hwy 99, just south of Ford Avenue. The suspect vehicle, a black Honda sedan, failed to yield and fled the scene. During the resulting pursuit of the vehicle, the vehicle was involved in a collision near the 500 block of Sycamore Street. According to Butte County District Attorney Mike Ramsey, officers exited their patrol car and began to approach the driver. At

that time the driver began to drive in reverse and officers, fearing for their lives, opened fire.

The vehicle fled the scene and was later located unoccupied at 271 Ohio Street. Authorities had set up a perimeter, canvassing the neighborhood in search of the suspect. The suspect, allegedly a Hispanic male in his twenties, was pulled from inside a home at 283 Ohio Street where he had been hiding. He suffered a single gunshot wound to the shoulder and has been transported to Enloe Hospital in Chico for treatment.

According to the resident at 271 Ohio Street, witness Adam Peterson, he was awakened shortly after 4:45 a.m. by a flash of headlights across his bedroom window and a strange repeating thumping noise. He had heard sirens in the area but had no idea that shots had been fired just blocks away. His dog was growling, so he got up to investigate. If he had looked outside his sleeping children’s window, he would have seen the abandoned vehicle in his front yard – lights on and windshield wipers swaying and making that thumping sound. Instead, his search not turning up anything unusual, he attempted to go back to sleep. A short time later, Law Enforcement would discover the car and Peterson would recount the morning’s events. “There were no skid marks or anything going up to it, so it looks like they pulled in real quietly and the

next thing I know I have voices outside my bedroom window and there was about 10 Sheriff Officers.” Peterson puts it at around 30 minutes from the time he first heard the thumping to when officers arrived at his residence. He witnessed the suspect being carried out of the house at 283 Ohio Street on a stretcher, catching a glimpse of a bloody shoulder from the gunshot wound.

Peterson also alluded to a second suspect involved, a woman. He says, “they said there was a woman in the car with him, but I never saw her. I heard they detained her.”

In response to the morning’s events he said, “It’s “Crazy! My truck’s all taped off, my yard’s all taped off. Never had my front yard be a crime scene before!”

As is standard protocol in the case of an Officer Involved Shooting, the District Attorney’s Office is investigating the events surrounding the incident. Butte County DA Dave Ramsey and his department were observed at both active crime scene locations, leaving just before forensic officers from the DOJ Crime Lab Redding entered the home at 283 Ohio St.

At this time Gridley-Biggs Police Department has not been able to comment on incident. The GBPD is asking that anyone who may have witnessed this shooting to please contact the department. The investigation is ongoing and no further information is available at this time. ★
