Fish are a Jumpin'

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The 2022 Chinook run is in full swim.

Now cooled sufficiently for spawning, the American River is teeming with migrating salmon. Nimbus Fish Hatchery recently opened ladder gates and is harvesting eggs and milt for artificial fertilization.

The Chinook giants climb to the facility via a \$9.7 million ladder that replaced an antiquated weir system last year. "We've been pleased with its operation," notes hatchery education specialist Laura Drath, "The new ladder works for the fish. Its location opens up more spawning habitat in Nimbus Basin. It also eliminates danger to staff who had to

work on the old weir."

Thirty-pound fish were already leaping as Nimbus technician Ryan Reed winched up ladder gates. Irresistibly drawn to water that courses down ladder steps at 25 cubic feet per second, 100 Chinooks completed the passage in the first hour.

Their weeks-long migration runs the swimmers ragged. Ending a three-year life cycle, reproduction is now a final goal. Many spawn naturally and die in river shallows before reaching the ladder. But more than a century of river alteration means insufficient gravel beds remain to accommodate salmon and steelhead nests.

Much gravel restoration has been recently achieved; salmonids can

be now seen breeding in augmented beds near Ancil Hoffman Park and Sailor Bar. The hatchery is nevertheless tasked to artificially fertilize about nine million eggs in mitigation for Nimbus Dam's impassable barrier. Salvageable fish meat is processed in Oregon for distribution at California food closets.

Eggs hatch in about six weeks. In spring, fry are released to begin their journey to the Pacific.

For now, the primal dance of death continues at Nimbus, as fish pitch ebbing strength at currents, rocks and ladder steps.

Salmon processing continues at Nimbus until mid-December. Anyone may visit the Fish and Wildlife department facility at 2001 Nimbus Road, Gold River. ★

Public Health Awarded Grant for Child Safety Seats

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Public Health, along with partner agency Mercy San Juan, will educate parents and caregivers on how to properly secure children in a safety seat.

The \$71,500 grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) pays for a variety of community outreach events, including education classes and training on the installation and use of child safety seats to parents and caregivers, specifically focused on underserved and refugee communities.

The car seat safety program includes Child safety seat inspection events and education classes. Child Passenger Safety Technician (CPST) training and recertification courses. Child safety seats at no cost for families in need. Partnering with local organizations on car seat safety community outreach efforts in underserved communities.

The program runs through September 30, 2023.

"The OTS grant funding is critical in helping families, caregivers and education professionals keep children safe," Dr. Olivia Kasirye, Sacramento County Public Health Officer said. "Protecting children is everyone's top priority, and properly secured car seats are one significant way to prevent harm to children in the event of a crash."

"Like seat belts for teens and adults, correctly installed car seats are the best protection for children while they are traveling," OTS Director Barbara Rooney said. "Car seat programs are an important traffic safety ally."

St John the Evangelist School is located at 5701 Locust Avenue. Because fair traffic clogs surrounding

streets, free shuttles will run from Carmichael Elks Lodge parking lot to St John's Church.

"People come here from all over Sacramento - even from out of state," says Holbus. "Our market is a Sacramento tradition. It's a weekend that says Christmas is here at last."

Ceremony Recalls Vietnam Heroes

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Carmichael's Vietnam Memorial was last weekend central to community Veterans Day commemorations. Flags, music and memories were shared by almost 180 visitors. The ceremony was also live-streamed.

The first-known California monument to the Vietnam War, the memorial is in the Koobs Nature Area on Engle Road. First dedicated in 1973, its steel edifice honors La Sierra High School graduates who died in the Vietnam War. La Sierra graduate Brigadier General Don Currier addressed the gathering and urged businesspeople to hire veterans. "They are dependable and loyal," he said. "They have training and maturity. Veterans' life experience builds character that's all too rare in today's workplace."

La Sierra High graduate - and later school administrator - Tony Asaro read the names of deceased La Sierra teachers and alumni who served the US in WW2, Korea, and Vietnam Wars. "They put their lives on the line and came back to serve our community," said Asaro. "Saying their names aloud makes sure they're not forgotten."

Grant Bolsters CHP's Focus on Sideshows and Street Racing

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Illegal sideshows, takeovers, and street racing remain a major cause of death and injury on California roadways.

The California Highway Patrol (CHP) recently received a federal grant that will support the state's redoubled efforts to crack down on reckless driving behaviors that continue to wreak havoc throughout the state.

Building on the \$5.5 million in the 2022-23 state budget for the CHP to implement the Campaign to Eliminate Street Racing and Sideshows (C.E.S.R.S.), the \$1.5 million Sideshow, Takeover, Racing, Education, and Enforcement Taskforce (STREET) grant will help efforts to decrease the number of fatal and injury traffic crashes attributed to illegal sideshows, takeovers, and street racing.

In 2019-2020, speed

was a factor in approximately 40 percent of all fatal and injury crashes in California. In years 2020-2021, preliminary data reflects the number of people killed in crashes caused by reckless driving increased 21 percent from the previous period. The CHP continues to receive a high number of reports on sideshows and street racing and the negative consequences associated with such careless exploits.

"Reckless driving behaviors are a significant threat to all who use California's roadways," said CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. "The STREET grant will provide for a focused education and enforcement campaign, targeting aggressive driving behaviors, street racing, and sideshow activities."

During the past two years, California has seen significant increases in the number of incidents from unsafe driving behaviors, including motorists exceeding 100 mph on state highways, illicit street racing and sideshow activities, and speed-related crashes.

To address the issue, from January 1, 2021, to September 30, 2022, the CHP conducted enhanced speed enforcement

operations on state routes that have seen an increase in speed-related issues. During this period, the CHP issued 40,593 citations to motorists exceeding 100 mph. CHP also collaborated with allied law enforcement agencies, leading to the creation of street racing and sideshow task forces and social media campaigns posting the dangers associated with high speed, aggressive driving behaviors, and street racing.

The STREET grant allows for a comparable campaign starting this month through September 30, 2023. Funding for the STREET program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

As an added deterrent, Governor Gavin Newsom recently signed Assembly Bill 2000 (Gabriel), making it illegal for a person to participate and/or engage in a motor vehicle speed contest or in an exhibition of speed in an off-street parking facility. The measure goes into effect on January 1, 2023.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

Could the Ocean Slake California's Thirst?

“Water, water, every where, And all the boards did shrink; Water, water, every where, Nor any drop to drink.”

Poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge penned those words in his 1798 poem, “The Rime of the Ancient Mariner,” to describe the plight of becalmed sailors who could die of thirst while surrounded by limitless expanses of undrinkable seawater.

In a way, it also describes California's plight. Despite its 3,427 miles of Pacific Ocean coastline, including bays, inlets and tidal marshes, the state has an ever-widening gap between its demand for water and its supply.

Naturally, there has been a decades-long debate over whether the state should tap into that endless supply of seawater to bridge the gap, emulating other arid and semi-arid societies, particularly in Australia and the Mideast.

From a technical standpoint, it's a no-brainer. Desalination plants, including a few already operating in California, do exactly what they are supposed to do — strip the salt from seawater, converting it into freshwater suitable for drinking or any other purpose. The barriers to

building dozens of desalination plants along the coast are economic, environmental and political.

Such plants require oodles of electrical power to pump in the seawater, push it through filters that remove the salt and then return the uber-salty brine waste either to the sea or into another process.

A massive desal program would place a new burden on a power grid that already struggles to keep up with demand on very hot days as it evolves from natural gas-fired power plants to renewable sources such as wind and solar. Desal's power demand also contributes heavily to the bottom line costs of producing water, making it more expensive, at least so far, than water from other sources.

Finally, environmental groups have generally opposed desal projects on assertions that pumping seawater into the plants and returning brine to the sea run the risk of damaging delicate marine ecosystems. But the groups have another, unspoken reason for opposition. Restricted water supplies have been used as a tool to oppose new residential development and increasing water supply undercuts that political tool.

In combination, all of those points were cited in the California Coastal Commission's rejection of a much-debated desal project at Huntington Beach in Orange County earlier this year. The plant would have been a near-clone of a desal facility in Carlsbad, further south along the coast.

At the time, it appeared

to be a death knell for the expansion of desalination in California — something that Gov. Gavin Newsom's administration envisions in its overall plan for closing the demand/supply gap as climate change and semi-perpetual drought diminish traditional supplies from winter rains and snowfall.

However, last month the Coastal Commission approved another Orange County desal project, one that would use somewhat different technology to pump in seawater and dilute the leftover brine before returning it to the sea.

Environmental groups gave their blessing to the Dana Point project, which made a big difference in the Coastal Commission's attitude, as is the fact that it's only one-tenth the size of the Huntington Beach project and would serve purely local customers of the South Coast Water District.

The approval was an indication that desalination could, as the state's water plan envisions, play a significant role in California's water future, which will be much different than its abundant past.

That said, desal probably wouldn't be the silver bullet of limitless supply that some have hoped it would be. It would be more of a reliability factor, something that Californians could depend on working when traditional supplies fall short.

State Violated Environmental Laws in \$1.2 Billion Capitol Annex Project

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Save Our Capitol! issued on October 31, 2022, the following statement regarding the matter of Save Our Capitol! vs. California Department of General Services (DGS) and Joint Committee on Rules of the California State Senate and Assembly (JRC):

“By failing to recirculate the Capitol Annex Project's Environmental Impact Report (EIR) after making substantive changes, DGS and JRC violated the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), a statute which implements a statewide policy of environmental protection. The substantive changes included:

Relocating the underground parking garage from the south side of the Capitol to the east side; Destroying approximately twice as many trees as were initially identified; Expanding the project's boundary; and, Designing the new Annex with a wholly incompatible and dangerous glass exterior.

“Recirculation was required due to the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) expanding the Project's boundary beyond 12th Street and more than doubling the 20-30 trees that the Recirculated Draft Environmental Impact Report (RDEIR) represented would be removed, revealing that the project would affect an estimated 133 trees. DGS and JRC failed

to prove how expanding the Project's boundary and doubling the number of trees to be removed from the historic Capitol Park would not exacerbate a significant environmental impact, in violation of CEQA.

“Because the changes to the project scope include new and/or exacerbating impacts and a new unstudied alternative that would reduce impacts to historic resources, additional review by the decisionmakers and the public of the EIR was required. Yet, DGS and JRC did not recirculate the EIR, instead choosing to deprive the public and responsible agencies of their right to review and comment on the Project's true impacts to the Capitol Complex.

“As stated in our appeal, there is no urgency to proceed with the unvetted Capitol Annex Project which disregards CEQA's requirement of transparency and its protections for the public interest.”

A hearing on the case before the Third Appellate District is scheduled for November 14, 2022.

The purpose of Save our Capitol! is to preserve the site of the historic Capitol and its surrounding Park as the center and symbol of Californians' right to truth, transparency, and trust in self-governance. California Invests Nearly \$3 Billion for Transportation Improvements

Caltrans News Release

SANTA BARBARA, CA (MPG) - The California Transportation Commission (CTC) has allocated nearly \$3 billion for projects to repair and improve transportation infrastructure throughout the state. The allocation includes more than \$452 million in funding from the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA) and more than \$123 million in funding from Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

"This allocation - which includes a significant federal investment - allows Caltrans and our local partners to continue building the equitable, sustainable, and safe transportation system on which future generations will depend," said Caltrans Director Tony Tavares.

Projects approved include:

\$3.5 million in federal IIJA funding for a City of Rancho Cordova project for roadway, sidewalk, curb ramp, bike lane and traffic signal improvements on Mather Field Road between Folsom Boulevard International Drive;

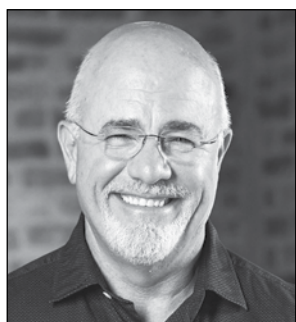
\$2 million in State Highway Operational and Protection Program (SHOPP) funds for project development and right of way costs for intersection

and safety improvements at Live Oak Boulevard/Encinal Road and State Route 99 in the Lomo Crossing area in Sutter County;

\$520,000 in SHOPP funds to develop a safety project for a new traffic signal at the intersection of State Route 32 and County Road P near Orland, Glenn County.

The CTC allocated more than \$2.1 billion to Caltrans' Division of Local Assistance in its annual federal fiscal year investment. These local assistance funds are used by more than 600 cities, counties and regional agencies throughout California to build and improve roads, bridges, tunnels and other transportation infrastructure, and for projects that enhance safety and help protect the environment. Annually, more than 1,200 new projects are authorized through the Local Assistance Program.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually that is shared equally between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1. Dave Ramsey Says

Don't Buy Until the First One Sells

Dear Dave,

My wife and I are looking to move from Washington, D.C., to Greenville, South Carolina, in a couple of months, and then sell our current home in February or March after she gets things wrapped up with her job. We are a little worried, though, because of all the things we're hearing about the housing market crashing. Could you speak to this, please?

-Nick

Dear Nick,

Your emotions and things you hear can creep up on you. I get that. But the fact is, there are still four buyers out there for

every house that's up for sale. Now, are the buyers and the market as active and frenzied as they were several months ago? No. But you have to remember, the last couple of years have been crazy-strange times for the housing market.

I've been in the real estate business since 1978, and I've never seen anything like it. Usually, it takes about 90 days to sell a house. You'll get some offers, and none of them will be at full price, but everyone will have time to think about things. That's normal, and it's probably a lot closer to how things will work themselves out for you now in Greenville.

But in any economy, my advice to you would be don't buy another house until yours has sold. If you end up with two house payments and your old house is sitting empty while you're having to pay for the

mortgage, taxes, utilities and all the upkeep to make sure it's ready to show, you're going to become what's known as a motivated seller. I don't want you to just give it away, but you'll need to be very careful to make sure the timing on this deal makes sense.

Personally, I wouldn't buy another house until the first one sells.

New Federal Funding to Help California

DOT News Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - California has the green light to start using federal infrastructure funding to expand electric vehicle (EV) charging stations along the state's interstates and highways following the recent federal approval of a joint plan by Caltrans and California Energy Commission.

The U.S. Joint Office of Energy and Transportation's signoff on the California Deployment Plan for the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Program makes an initial \$56 million in funding available to install charging stations throughout the state. Funded by the federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 (IIJA), California expects to receive a total of \$384 million for the program over the next five years. The federal funding will build on California's historic \$10 billion, multiyear investment to accelerate the transition to zero-emission vehicles by improving affordability and expanding charging infrastructure.

"Thanks to the Biden-Harris Administration's approval of California's NEVI plan, we can start putting historic levels of federal infrastructure funding to work to close gaps in our state highway system's evolving EV charging network and improve availability and reliability for low-income and rural residents," said California Transportation Secretary Toks Omishakin. "Coupled with unprecedented levels of state investments in zero-emission vehicles, this funding will help supercharge California's nation-leading efforts to drastically cut climate-changing pollution from the transportation sector."

The IIJA funds will add to efforts to complete a 6,600-mile statewide charging network and deploy 1.2 million chargers by 2030 to meet the anticipated charging

needs of the state's EV fleet.

"With this unprecedented federal investment, California can advance our vision of a unified network of charging stations along the state's busiest corridors," said California Energy Commission Commissioner Patty Monahan. "This new network will increase charging access, particularly in the rural areas of our state, and help EV drivers charge up on long trips."

The state's NEVI plan focuses on construction of fast-charging stations near interstates, U.S. routes and state routes throughout California. These charging stations will increase the availability of charging options, improve the reliability of the charging network and remove barriers to accessing EVs. NEVI funding will also support upgrades to existing infrastructure, charging stations' operation and maintenance costs, community and stakeholder engagement, workforce development, and related mapping and signage.

California surpassed one million zero-emission vehicles (ZEV) sold in 2021 and leads the country in all ZEV market metrics including the highest level of public funding, the largest EV market share percentage, and the most extensive public charging infrastructure. The success of the state's programs has led to ZEVs becoming a top export and has spurred major advances in manufacturing and job creation.

Sacramento Man Sentenced to 57 Months for Cocaine Trafficking

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Jason Tolbert, 45, of Sacramento, was sentenced yesterday by United States District Judge Troy L. Nunley to 57 months in prison for possession with intent to distribute cocaine, United States Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, Tolbert was one of 15 federal defendants arrested in 2021 for trafficking narcotics as part of a DEA-led multi-agency operation targeting cocaine and heroin traffickers in North Sacramento. Tolbert was intercepted during wiretaps in 2018 trafficking powder cocaine. Upon his arrest, he was in possession of over a kilogram of cocaine and a loaded firearm. Tolbert is the first defendant to be sentenced.

This case was the product of an

investigation by the Drug Enforcement Administration, Sacramento Police Department, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, United States Marshals Service, Homeland Security Investigations, and California Highway Patrol. Assistant United States Attorneys Cameron L. Desmond and Aaron Pennekamp prosecuted the case.

This effort is part of an Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) operation. OCDETF identifies, disrupts, and dismantles the highest-level criminal organizations that threaten the United States using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach. Sac State blows past Portland State, 45-17, to improve to 10-0

HILLSBORO, OR (MPG) - The No. 2 ranked Sacramento State football team remained unbeaten, earned its school-record 10th regular season victory and dominated Portland State in a 45-17 win at Hillsboro Stadium on a cold Friday night.

The Hornets are now 10-0 overall and 7-0 in the Big Sky Conference. The 10 wins breaks the school regular season record of nine which came in 2019 and 2021. It also equals the best win total for any season, matching the effort of the 1988 team which ended the year 10-3 with the help of two NCAA Div. II play-off wins.

Sacramento State has now won 18 consecutive Big Sky games which is the second longest streak in league history. The team has also won 14 straight road games against FCS teams, and 10 road games against all opponents — the longest streak in FBS or FCS.

The game had a wild start with three combined fumbles, two plays of at least 30 yards, and a touchdown in the first six minutes. The Vikings took the opening kickoff and picked up 33 yards on their first play of the game. The team then coughed it up on the next play and the ball was recovered by Brock Mather.

Sacramento State quickly gained 44 yards on a pass from Asher O'Hara to Pierre Williams to get inside the 10-yard line. Facing 3rd-and-goal, Asher O'Hara tried to spin his way into the end zone but had the ball knocked loose and recovered by PSU for a touchback.

Two plays later, Portland

State attempted a trick play with a double reverse which was bobbled on the toss and recovered by Killian Rosko inside the 20. Sacramento State finally broke through with a 5-yard pass from O'Hara to Williams to give the Hornets a 7-0 lead.

The Hornets added to their lead early in the second quarter with a 41-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski. The Hornets brought the ball to the 11-yard line during the drive but were driven back to the 23 following a sack on third down. A strong headwind was no challenge for Sentkowski who made his 12th consecutive field goal this year.

The lead continued to grow with a 7-play, 80-yard

drive which resulted in a touchdown with 7:49 left in the second quarter. The big play during the drive was a 41-yard rush from Cameron Skattebo and the drive ended with a 4-yard pass from Jake Dunniway to Pierre Williams for the score. The score marked, surprisingly, just the second multi-touchdown game of Williams' brilliant career. The second score moved him into a tie with Marshel Martin for third place in school history with 21 receiving TDs.

After a three-and-out from the defense, the offense kept rolling with a 5-play, 73-yard drive which ended with a 39-yard TD run from O'Hara for his longest rush of the season. The touchdown also

extended O'Hara's streak to all 10 games of this season and 12 straight games dating back to last year.

Sacramento State needed just three plays to score on the first series of the second half. The drive was setup by a 38-yard kickoff return from Elijah Tao-Tolliver. Jake Dunniway then found Williams for a 51-yard gain which pushed the receiver over the century mark. Marcus Fulcher then cut back to his left for a 4-yard score just 70 seconds into the half.

Portland State started the second half with senior Nathan West at quarterback. The Vikings ran on the first 11 plays of the drive and were able to bring the ball into the red zone before

settling for a 32-yard field goal from Gianni Smith for the team's first points.

Sacramento State answered with another quick touchdown drive. After Skattebo went over 100 yards during the series, Fulcher took an option toss from O'Hara and eluded defenders for a 35-yard score.

The fourth quarter had another wild stretch. The Hornets first stopped Portland State inside the 1-yard line on fourth down. The offense moved the ball out of the shadow of its own goalpost but fumbled. That turnover set up a 36-yard touchdown rush from Quincy Craig for Portland State's first touchdown.

The Viks then attempted

an onside kick which was picked cleanly by Martin who returned it 45 yards for a touchdown.

Sacramento State finished the game with 451 yards on just 56 plays for an average of 8.1 yards per play. The team rushed for 237 yards and threw for 214.

The quarterback tandem of Dunniway and O'Hara combined to complete 15-of-21 passes with each throwing a touchdown without an interception.

Sacramento State's final regular season game will come on Nov. 19 in the Causeway Classic against UC Davis at 2 p.m. The Hornets can clinch at least a share of the Big Sky title with a win. ★
