

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Few people born in 1922 rise early, fetch the newspaper and read every page before the rest of the household is at breakfast.

Elsie Hall was driving a car well into her 90s. She still reads voraciously, plays piano (she has only to hear a tune to play it) and is amusing in conversation.

The secret, says Elsie, is to “Stay busy, stay active. I never drank alcohol or smoked cigarettes. I have good

health and I thank God for my life. I’ve had some problems, but it’s all been worth it.”


Her birthday party filled the American River Community Church with friends and relatives. The family photo contained 19 great and 21 great-great grandkids – with three more on the way.

Much of the matriarch’s life has been devoted to children. Elsie and daughter Nancy McCreery launched Wonder-Land Christian Pre-School at their church in 1968. Long after each of their retirements, the school thrives.

Born in Canada, Elsie entered the United States as a child and grew up in Camas, WA. She recalls a fifth-grade teacher who decided her hair was too long and scissored it off. “Imagine the lawsuit these days,” says the retired teacher. “I was embarrassed and wore a hat every day after that. Back then, teachers weren’t disciplined. They were considered next to God.”

Lacking money for lessons, she taught herself piano. Tap dance tuition happened secretly; her Baptist parents considered dancing sinful. *Continued on page 3*

**Dusty Baker
Wins First
World Series
as Manager**

HOUSTON, TX (MPG) - In the aftermath of the 2022 World Series conclusion, one statement has been said synonymously by people all around the country in various forms: “I’m so happy for Dusty.”

Sacramento local Johnnie B. “Dusty” Baker Jr. finally got the proverbial monkey off his back on Saturday night, winning his first World Series title as a manager after 25 seasons. Baker’s Houston Astros defeated the Philadelphia Phillies in six games, clinching the series victory with a 4-1 win over the weekend.

At 73 years and 143 days old, Baker is the oldest manager in Major League Baseball history to win a World Series, surpassing Jack McKeon who was 72 when he won the title with the Florida Marlins in 2003. Dusty is now a two-time World Series champion, along with the ring that he won in 1981 as an All-Star on the Los Angeles Dodgers.

“I just knew it was going to happen, sooner or later, you stick around long enough, and you got good teams, its going to happen sooner or later,” Baker told ESPN minutes after the triumph. “I said if I win one, I want to win two, so I might as well go for two, we’ll see!”

Before beginning his MLB career, Baker graduated from Del Campo High School in Fair Oaks in 1967 where he was a four-sport athlete playing baseball, basketball, football and track and field. He still lives in the 916 during the offseason.

Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg recognized Baker’s accomplishment with a tweet on Saturday night.

“I hereby declare Dusty Baker Day in Sacramento,” Steinberg tweeted. “We’ll make it official sometime very soon. Dusty is a great Sacramento. So happy for him!!!” ★



Ceremony Recalls Sacrifices

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Carmichael and Fair Oaks stalwarts gathered last Saturday to recall fallen heroes of nation and community. The “Wall of Honor” ceremony was observed at Patriots Park.

Built in 2008, the reserve’s stone monument is dedicated to 15 local men – from military, police, CHP and fire-fighting forces – who died in service during Carmichael Park District’s 60-year history.

Their sacrifice unites surrounding neighborhoods each November. The named heroes fell in uniforms of U.S. Army, Marines, Air Force, Navy, CHP, police and fire-fighting services. Plaques recall sacrifice from Vietnam War years until recent times.

Ceremony attendees included Gold Star families; elected representatives and park district leaders. Congressman Ami Bera was among speakers. “With Veterans Day coming up,” said Dr. Bera, “it’s

Raiders Lose in Division II Section Playoff Semifinals

VACAVILLE, CA (MPG) - The Rio Americano girls varsity volleyball team's season came to an end on Tuesday night, suffering a three-set sweep at Vacaville in the semifinals of the 2022 Division II CIF Sac-Joaquin Girls Volleyball Playoffs.

The No. 3 seed Raiders (34-8, 12-0) had a rough opening set against the No. 2 seed Bulldogs (23-6), falling 25-12. Rio came back strong in the second set, but ultimately lost 25-22.

Vacaville pulled away with the match victory by winning the final set, 25-20. This is the second time the Raiders were swept by the Bulldogs this season. Vacaville swept Rio in two sets on October 8, winning 25-22 and 25-16.

The Bulldogs were swept in three sets by No. 1 seed Whitney of Rocklin at Natomas High School in the D2 championship game on Saturday.

The Raiders were led in kills by two senior outside hitters. Lulu Voss had a

team-high eight kills and was followed closely by Nikita Rogaski who had seven of her own. Both players also had two serving aces.

Voss led Rio with eight Digs and junior libero Livia Bacchi recorded five digs. Junior setter Grace Stone tallied 18 assists.

The loss to Vacaville snapped a seven-match winning streak for the Raiders. Despite the loss, it was still a strong season for Rio, finishing 12-0 in CAL play to earn its eighth league championship.

Only one fourth of the team are seniors and will be graduating. The Raiders graduating in the Class of 2023 are Rogaski, Voss and defensive specialist Mae Hutchinson.

Despite the defeat in the section playoffs, the season is not over yet. Rio qualified for the 2022 CIF State Girls Volleyball Championships as the No. 16 seed. The Raiders played No. 1 seed Clovis North (24-10) in the first round on Tuesday night, November 8. The result of the match was unknown as of press time. ★

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The Jesuit varsity football team outscored Gregori of Modesto 31-0 in the second and third quarters combined to earn a lopsided victory in the first round of the 2022 Division II CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Football Playoffs on Saturday afternoon.

The No. 5 seed Marauders defeated the No. 12 seed Jaguars 38-10. Gregori (4-7) outscored Jesuit (9-2) 10-7 in the first and fourth quarters combined. However, the disparity in scoring from the middle quarters proved to be too much for the Jaguars to overcome.

An early fumble by the Marauders was the difference in the game early. Gregori got a 25-yard field goal from junior kicker Jace Guzman midway through the first quarter. Jesuit drove into Jaguars territory towards the end of the first 12 minutes of play, but the first period ended with Gregori ahead 3-0.

The Marauders got on the scoreboard shortly into the second quarter as junior quarterback CJ Lee completed a 10-yard pass to senior running back Tatum Pappas for the touchdown. Following a Jaguars punt, Jesuit senior running back Anthony Seibles got into the action with a 15-yard rushing touchdown.

Senior middle linebacker Jagger Shaddix shut down Gregori's next drive with a tackle for loss, leading to another punt. The Marauders added three points

before the half with a 27-yard field goal from junior tight end and defensive end George Hemmen. Jesuit led 17-3 at half-time racking up 228 yards of offense compared to 37 for the Jaguars.

The Marauders' star quarterback scored the first point of the second half with his legs, rushing 58 yards into the end zone. Both teams then traded punts. Jesuit's next touchdown was set up by another Gregori punt. Shaddix, who also plays running back, rushed 49 yards to the end zone to put his team up by four scores. The third period ended with the Marauders up 31-3.

Jesuit scored its final points of the afternoon following a turnover on downs by the Jaguars. Seibles scored his second touchdown of the day in the fourth, rushing in from five yards out. Hemmen successfully converted the point after try, as he did in all five attempts Saturday. Gregori scored its lone touchdown of the day on a seven-yard pass from junior quarterback Conner Bailey to junior wide receiver Jaxx Baroda. Guzman nailed the PAT.

The big lead allowed Jesuit to empty its bench and let other players gain play-off experience. Junior quarterback Jack Payant connected with junior wide receiver Maximus Diepenbrock late in the game for a big gain. The Marauders ultimately defeated the Jaguars 38-10.

Jesuit will play at No. 4 seed Rocklin in the quarterfinals on Friday night at 7 p.m. ★

A church member spotted Elsie jiggling to the radio in a friend's house and reported her to church deacons. On senior prom night, she and her date walked around town in their formal clothes. "These rules were hard because I loved to dance," she says. "So I filled my time with sport." In exchange for cleaning her teacher's home, she learned to play violin.

During the Great Depression, she and her brother often invited hungry men home. "Mother never knew how many she needed to feed, but was always

happy to share," she recalls. "When canning time came, we sat on the back porch, preparing whatever came from our garden. We had no idea we were poor. We made up games. Technology was not a word we knew. I still believe simple is best."

Learning to roller skate at 17, she fell in love with rink manager and watch-maker Carl Hall. At 18, she bought an \$8 wedding gown and married her skating partner. "We had a day for our honeymoon and drove to the coast," she says. "We picked up a soldier who was hitch-hiking. Then we had a flat tire. I

was glad he was there to help, but our honeymoon was not as I'd imagined."

Her watchmaker husband's skill with instruments led to work in Idaho, then Portland. When WW II began, Carl joined the Army but stayed stateside, finessing airplane instruments. Both Hall children – Nancy and Tom – were war babies.

Moving to Oregon after the war, Elsie rented an old school building and taught kindergarten classes. The Halls' migration to California came in 1958. Settling in Carmichael, they joined the American River

Community Church (then called First Baptist Church of Carmichael).

Skip a decade. Carl worked for Grebetis Jewelers; Elsie checked groceries for Raley's and Nancy worked for the Post Office. Together, mom and daughter returned to college for education credentials. They started Wonder-Land as a morning preschool. By the 1970s, it was an all-day service schooling children up to 12 years.

Wonder-Land kids still hear Bible stories. "Faith was always the basis of our education," explains Elsie. "We taught

children Jesus loved them and wanted them to do what was right."

Elsie lost Carl in 2011 and never remarried. When she retired after 38 Wonder-Land years, Nancy became principal. Mother, daughter and son-in-law Nick McCreery now live together.

"A career with children is a life well spent," Elsie considers. "God allowed my daughter and me to be part of so many lives. Our former students are preachers, teachers, lawyers, doctors – and parents. They're proof that we did something worthwhile." ★

Is California Strangling its Golden Goose?

Citing a Bloomberg News article, Gov. Gavin Newsom crowed last month about the probability that California would soon pass Germany to become the world's fourth largest economy.

"While critics often say California's best days are behind us, reality proves otherwise — our economic growth and job gains continue to fuel the nation's economy," Newsom said.

Throughout his governorship, Newsom has been obsessed with bragging that California is a global leader in just about every human activity — and subtly suggesting that he's the reason for its success.

It's not surprising, therefore, that he didn't mention another recent Bloomberg article, reporting that California is faltering in a major economic indicator it had long dominated — initial public offerings (IPOs) of stock by expanding corporations.

"Only nine companies headquartered in California went public during the first three quarters of 2022, compared with 81 that launched IPOs during the same period last year," Bloomberg said in an analysis of filings. "Even more dramatically, California's share of US IPO proceeds fell to 2% through Sept. 30, compared

with 39% for 2021."

Jay Ritter, a University of Florida finance professor, told Bloomberg that California's meager IPO activity "is almost entirely" due to declines in valuation among Silicon Valley tech startups.

This is no small thing. The formation of new companies, followed by IPOs, has been a feature of the Silicon Valley-based technology sector for decades, creating untold billions of dollars in new wealth that filters through other sectors and generates immense amounts of income tax revenue for the state.

"We are already seeing an immediate effect," Brian Uhler of the Legislative Analyst's Office, told Bloomberg. "And it does appear to be significant."

In September, California employers' income tax withholding payments were down 5%, or \$354 million, from a year ago with diminished IPO activity a driver of the decline, Uhler said.

During the first three months of the state budget's fiscal year that began July 1, state revenues were nearly \$5 billion below expectations, virtually all of it in income taxes.

The precipitous decline in IPO activity once again raises the question: Are California's high taxes, high living and business costs and ever-tightening regulation strangling its golden goose?

A new report from Stanford University's Hoover Institution provides evidence that the goose may be flying away.

The report by Joseph Vranich, whose company advises firms on relocation,

and Lee E. Ohanian, a Hoover Institution senior fellow, says "the number of companies relocating their headquarters out of California in 2021 occurred at twice the rate of 2020. Our findings show that 352 companies moved their headquarters to other states just in the period from January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2021 ..."

Some of those relocations have been spectacular, such as McKesson, the nation's ninth largest corporation, and Tesla, the leading maker of electric cars, from California to Texas.

The report covers only shifts of corporate headquarters, but there are other corporate moves, such as the Walt Disney's relocation of 2,000 jobs from Los Angeles to Orlando, that are also negative indications. And corporate decisions not to locate in California or expand operations in the state are never publicly reported.

California may replace Germany on the global list of economies but that statistical exercise is far less important than the possibility that California's economy has peaked.

Newsom is too smart not to know what the Bloomberg IPO article and the Hoover report imply. It may explain why he opposes Proposition 30, which would hike California's marginal income tax rate to more than 15% and give investors another reason to shun the state.

You're not responsible for your brother's reaction to all this, James, but you can control your words and use them in a caring

manner. Do this with a kind spirit, and remember we all make mistakes. He may take it well, or not so well. But you're not really helping someone who's immature or irresponsible with money when you give them cash. At that point, you're an enabler. It's like giving a drunk a drink.

OGDEN, UT (MPG) - Sacramento State, ranked No. 2 in the nation, improved to 9-0 on the season with a 33-30 victory over fifth-ranked Weber State on a windy and rainy day at Stewart Stadium on Saturday.

The Hornets never trailed in the contest and were able to make the big play when needed on offense, defense and special teams in the victory.

Sacramento State's nine-game winning streak becomes the longest in school history surpassing eight-game streaks in 1966, this year, and last season. The Hornets are now 6-0 in conference games and have defeated teams ranked in the top 15 in three consecutive contests. Weber State dropped to 7-2 overall, 4-2 in league games and suffered its first home loss of the year.

Sacramento State scored the game's first points with a 15-play, 75-yard drive which ended with a 3-yard touchdown run from Asher O'Hara. The Hornets ran the ball for all but two of the plays during the series and took nearly six minutes off the clock. O'Hara cleared the goal line on a third down carry for his 15th rushing touchdown of the year.

Weber State was able to match the score with a 16-play, 75-yard drive of its own. Like the Hornets, the Wildcats relied on the ground game during the drive with 13 rush attempts. The scoring play came through the air as Bronson Barron faked the hand-off and found a wide open Jacob Sharp in the back corner of the end zone.

Neither team scored until midway through the second quarter when O'Hara connected in stride with Marshal Martin for a 48-yard touchdown pass. The play

was the longest pass of the season for Sacramento State. The Hornets closed the first half scoring on the next series. After the defense forced a punt, the snap sailed over the head of the Wildcat punter and was downed in the end zone to give Sacramento State a 16-7 advantage at the break.

Weber State had a fantastic start to the second half, forcing the Hornets to punt on the first series and then driving 68 yards to make the score, 16-14, with 8:44 left in the third quarter.

Sacramento State needed just two minutes and 30 seconds to respond. The Hornets turned to Jake Dunningway at quarterback and the senior came through with two big passes to cap the drive. The first was a 27-yard crossing route to Pierre Williams to take the ball to the 9-yard line. On the next play, Dunningway threw off his back foot to connect with Martin. The score was Martin's second of the game and marked the fourth time in his career he has

had multiple touchdowns.

The Hornets continued to put the pressure on when Patrick Dean came down with an acrobatic interception on a long pass attempt down the middle of the field. The team turned the turnover into a touchdown with an 11-play, 75-yard drive which ate up the last portion of the third quarter and carried into the first play of the fourth quarter. The big play in the series was a 4th-and-1 pass from O'Hara to Coleman Kuntz which turned into a 28-yard gain. O'Hara punctuated the drive with a 1-yard leap over the pile for his second TD of the contest.

The Wildcats showed their ability to get back into the game on special teams when Abraham Williams took the kickoff out of the end zone and ran 100 yards untouched for a score. The kickoff return for a TD was the first allowed by Sacramento State this season. Weber State attempted to make it a one-score game but failed to convert the

two-point conversion.

As the rain picked up in the fourth quarter, neither offense was able to generate much production until Weber State scored a field goal with 4:07 remaining to make the score, 30-23. During the drive, the Wildcats took advantage of a pair of pass interference penalties. The team had a 1st-and-goal from the 10 but followed with three rush attempts which took the ball to the 5 before settling for a field goal.

The Wildcats then attempted an onside kick which rolled out of bounds untouched by either team giving the Hornets pristine field position. The team fed Cameron Skattebo for the first three plays of the drive before turning to O'Hara on the next two plays. The quarterback was stopped on 3rd-and-10 setting up a 43-yard field goal from Kyle Sentkowski to make it a two possession game.

Weber State scored the final points with a touchdown on a drive late in the fourth quarter. The team attempted a second onside kick which was recovered by Martin to seal the game.

Sacramento State outgained the Wildcats, 431-319. The Hornets compiled 204 yards on the ground and threw for 227. O'Hara led the team in both areas with 81 rushing yards and 162 passing yards. Williams and Martin each had four receptions for 74 and 70 yards, respectively.

Prince Washington led the defense with nine tackles while Eian Moore, Cameron Broussard and Armon Bailey tallying eight.

Sacramento State will play its final road game of the regular season on Friday, Nov. 11, at Portland State at 6 p.m. The team's final regular season home game will be Saturday, Nov. 19, against UC Davis in the Causeway Classic at 2 p.m. ★
