Author Salutes Women in Politics

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - It started with lunch. Community relations consultant Chris Hunter was dining with women friends who'd been elected to serve the City and County of Sacramento. Realizing her companions had much to add to California's political history, Hunter began research for a book recently published as "We can Do This!"

Riveter Rosie's wartime mantra is relevant, considers the author. "These women were often up against the odds. They did a great job." Despite stridency associated with

many 1970s activists, Hunter's subjects were not consciously feminists or political animals. "They were mainly teachers, nurses and moms," says Arcade resident Hunter. "They stepped up because they wanted better communities."

The book spotlights the 'first and second wave' of women whose service eased the way for those who followed in more recent years. Former Sacramento Mayor Heather Fargo collaborated in the project and regards the history long overdue. "It's time women who helped shape Sacramento in this era were given the respect they deserve," she says. "They had huge impact."

Several of Hunter's 1970s pioneers served unincorporated Sacramento. The first woman elected to Sacramento's Board of Supervisors—former nurse Sandy Smoley—got paramedics on firetrucks. Supervisor Illa Collin broke ground for the American River Parkway. Supervisor Muriel Johnson campaigned for the arts and persuaded successor Susan Peters to prolong a tradition that for 50 years labeled District 3 "the girls' seat."

Sacramento has elected – and reelected – two female mayors. Anne Rudin spoke out for gay rights and the banning of assault weapons.

Voting has Officially Begun

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Voter Registration and Elections (VRE) has begun delivering Vote by Mail (VBM) ballots to the U.S. Postal Service for distribution to all currently registered voters in the County for the June 7, 2022, Statewide Direct Primary Election.

Voters may use any Ballot Drop Box throughout the County to return their ballot. VRE has a drive-through Ballot Drop Box in the Election's Office parking lot at 7000 65th Street, Sacramento. This Ballot Drop Box is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week until 8:00 p.m. on Election Night.

Voters are encouraged to return their ballots early and sign their pink VBM envelope in order for their ballot to be counted. Information on the days and hours of operation for Ballot Drop Boxes or upcoming Vote Centers is available on the VRE website at <http://www.elections.saccounty.gov> or use the direct links in the Key Election Dates below. No postage is necessary for voters returning their ballots by U.S. Mail using the pink Vote by Mail envelope.

For more information, contact VRE at (916) 875-6451, email voterinfo@saccounty.gov, or use the toll-free voter assistance hotline at (800) 762-8019. The hotline has the ability to connect voters with disabilities with TTY (Text Telephone).

Key Election Dates

Monday, May 9: Mailing of ballots to all registered voters has begun. Voted ballots may be returned in any of the Ballot Drop Boxes located throughout the County.

Monday, May 23: Close of voter registration for this election. Voter registration forms must be postmarked by this date or delivered to the VRE Office at 7000 65th Street, Suite A, Sacramento, CA 95823 by 5:00 p.m. Online voter registration must be completed before midnight on this date at www.registertovote.ca.gov.

Tuesday, May 24: Conditional Voter Registration (CVR) begins.

Saturday, May 28: 11 Day Vote Centers open.

Tuesday, May 31: Last day a Vote by Mail (VBM) ballot can be mailed to you. After this date, VBM ballots are only available at the VRE Office or at any of the 87 Vote Centers.

Saturday, June 4: All Vote Centers open throughout the County.

Tuesday, June 7: Election Day. ★

Students Compete as Finalists in Regional Environmental Contest

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Caring for Our Watersheds proposal writing contest challenges students to research their local watershed, identify an environmental concern and develop a realistic project to address that concern in their community.

Students with the top ten proposals of 315 that were reviewed presented their ideas to a panel of judges at the final competition. First place is \$1,000 cash to the winning team and \$1,000 cash to the winning team's school. In total, over \$27,000 in prize and implementation money is available to students and schools who participate in the program. Finalists were from the following schools: Foresthill High School, George Washington Carver School of Arts and Sciences, Grant Union High School, Mira Loma High School, Sierra Academy of Expeditionary Learning and The MET Sacramento. Caring for Our Watersheds is a joint program of Nutrien and the Center for Land-Based Learning.

Mira Loma High School students Clara Nordahl, Celina Chen, Nora Ransibrahmanakul, and Benjamin Hartman and placed first, second, third and fifth respectively, in the 2022 Caring for Our Watersheds contest.

Nordahl's proposal is to advocate for passage of the 2022 California Plastic Waste Reduction Regulations (CPWRR) Initiative and a reduction in the consumption of single-use plastic. She plans to raise awareness and garner support for the initiative by creating informational posts and colorful infographics to share online through public social media platforms.

Chen's proposal is to organize an electronic waste collection program at school and coordinate with Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps for pick-up and transport to the recycling facility. She will also produce and distribute an informational pamphlet on the environmental impact of E-waste and

tips for proper disposal/ recycling.

Ransibrahmanakul's proposal is to initiate a school program that teaches sustainability and innovation through the hands-on experience of maintaining a vertical hydroponics system in the classroom. She will install the system and create educational modules explaining the science of hydroponics and the potential benefits of this new agricultural technology.

Hartman's proposal is to reduce mask pollution by providing and encouraging the use of biodegradable masks. While still providing the same level of protection, biodegradable masks will not persist in the environment as long as the single-use polypropylene masks.

Nordahl won \$1000, Chen won \$900, Ransibrahmanakul won \$800, and Hartman won \$600 in the competition. They also won equal matching amounts for their classes at Mira Loma High School.

Arana Katasema, Jaiden Gonzales, Bernie Xicotencatl and Bella Marroquin won \$350 in the

competition. They also won an equal matching amount for their class at George Washington Carver School of Arts and Sciences. In addition, the team is eligible for \$1000 in project implementation funds. In total, students compete for over \$6,000 cash rewards and participating schools are eligible for over \$11,000 cash rewards. Nutrien also provides \$10,000 in funding to help implement students' ideas.

The team's proposal addressed an issue that has never been seen before in this contest but was very relevant to them as Resin artists. Their project aimed to promote the use of an eco-friendly art material, Ecopoxy, as an alternative to synthetic resins currently used by many artists. Some synthetic resin products can be harmful to the environment and have adverse effects

on human/ animal health. The team created a website and blog and hosted a booth at the Sacramento Earth Day Festival to display their art made of Ecopoxy and educate the public.

"The purpose of the contest is simple," says Nutrien's Senior Manager of Community Relations and Investment, Rose Lecky. "Our goal is to encourage students to learn about their local watershed and be inspired to make improvements to the land, air and water. With community and school support, we have seen the creativity and determination students have for protecting and preserving the environment. It's inspiring when they

turn their ideas into reality."

Each year more projects are implemented with the help of community resources and environmental organizations. Anyone who enters the contest is eligible for funding to complete his/ her

project. "Seeing students implement their projects is truly impressive. Caring for Our Watersheds not only encourages youth-led ideas, but helps make them happen," says Beth Del Real of Center for Land-Based Learning.

Mayor Heather Fargo championed the environment and women's (and animal) rights.

On the national level, Congresswoman Doris Matsui fought for improved health care and ramped up flood prevention. She remains a vocal proponent for girls' STEM education.

Hunter's homage includes women who headed action groups. Lung Association leader Jane Hagedorn took on Big Tobacco against choking odds and achieved a public places smoking ban. Carmichael teacher Effie Yeaw founded Save the American River Association and won protection for heritage oaks. "Yeaw was a gentle lady," notes Hunter. "But she was knowledgeable and articulate. No one could effectively disagree with her."

Grace (and humor) under fire was a job requirement: male City Councilmembers expected Anne Rudin to make coffee. She wouldn't. Illa Collin was told not to wear pants to State Reclamation Board meetings. She did. Anne Rudin was offered makeup artists before TV appearances. "It's not clear if her male colleagues got the same service," says the

author. "At any rate, she declined."

District 3's Sandy Smoley endured a divorce while in office. Daily proceedings were covered exhaustively by the press. She later had a double mastectomy. She told Hunter her breasts were front page news in the Sacramento Bee daily. "I'm just glad I didn't have cervical cancer," quipped the former Supervisor.

Running for City Council at 30, Kim Mueller (Now the first female District Judge to serve Eastern California) was told she looked too young. To be taken seriously, she acquired a frumpy 'candidate outfit' and stomped precincts in matronly pumps.

Trailblazers grinned and bore frivolous interpretations. When women occupied half of the City Council seats in 1990; someone (not a female councilmember) suggested the term 'manholes' was sexist. A 'sewer furor' flushed Sacramento onto the world stage. Critics attributed the absurdity to "women taking over the council." Maintenance covers was eventually deemed politically correct. "Words do have power," notes author Hunter. "Man—as the generic—was dropped. Into the sewer, one presumes."

For wives and moms in office, election success meant long hours. Sacramento's first black woman city councilmember, Lauren Hammond, tried to tally her working week. "I stopped counting at 60 hours," Hammond said. "It was probably close to 80."

Comments Hunter: "These women worked hard. They raised children; they ran homes, and they ran cities. I felt honored talking to them. They're mostly retired now but they're still passionate about their communities."

Hunter will donate book copies to area high schools. "I want to encourage involvement in local government and to show girls whose shoulders they will stand on," she says. "These female pioneers worked around obstacles with humor and common sense. Their persistence won in the end."

"We Can Do This" proceeds will support the League of Women Voters' Anne Rudin Scholarship. The book is available in public libraries, bookstores and online. For information, visit www.wecandohissacramento.com

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Riding a streak of five consecutive multi-hit games, junior infielder Martin Vincelli-Simard was named the Western Athletic Conference Hitter of the Week on Monday after a stellar showing at the plate helped Sacramento State to a 4-0 week and its first league sweep of the 2022 campaign.

It is the first career weekly award from the conference office for the Boisbriand, Quebec, native and the second offensive honor of the year for a Hornet after Dawsen Bacho collected weekly laurels back on April 18. Freshman teammate Colin Hunter has also earned WAC weekly honors, picking up the first pitcher of the week award of the season back on Feb. 21.

Entering the week batting just .218 on the year, Vincelli-Simard picked up right where he left off in his three-hit game to close out the Grand Canyon series on May 8, finishing with two-or-more hits in each of the Hornets' contests last week, hitting .563 (9-for-16) with nine total hits, seven runs scored, six extra base hits, and seven RBI to raise his batting average 59 points to .277 on the year.

For the week, Vincelli-Simard slugged 1.188 thanks to four doubles and a pair of home runs, while posting a .579 on-base percentage after also drawing a walk and absorbing a hit by pitch. He also lofted a sacrifice fly to drive in a run — one of six on the week for the Hornets, who entered the four-game stretch leading the NCAA in the category.

Vincelli-Simard opened the week with

his second straight three-hit game to tie his career high, finishing 3-for-5 with three runs scored, a home run, and three RBI in an 11-9 midweek win on the road at Fresno State. The three runs batted in matched his season high, while the home run was his first in a month since leaving the yard at New Mexico State.

As Sacramento State opened its final WAC series of the regular season, Vincelli-Simard proceeded to rattle off three-straight two-hit games as the Hornets completed the sweep of Utah Valley, scoring four times and driving in four-runs, including a pair of doubles in Saturday's 5-2 victory and double and a home run to help his team to a "Senior Day" victory on Sunday.

Since the calendar switched to the month of May, Vincelli-Simard has been the Hornets' hottest hitter over the last nine games, batting .424 (14-for-33) with nine runs scored, seven doubles, a triple, a home run, and 10 RBI, slugging .879 for the month and adding six walks for a .500 on-base percentage. Defensively, he has been perfect at first base, going errorless in 77 total chances.

Having clinched the No. 2 seed for next week's WAC Tournament at Hohokam Stadium in Mesa, Ariz., Sacramento State closes the 2022 regular season with a three-game non-conference series against Bay Area rival San Jose State. The Hornets host the opener on Thursday (May 19) at 6 p.m. at John Smith Field, with the final two games scheduled for Excite Ballpark in San Jose on Friday (May 20) at 6:05 p.m. and Saturday (May 21) and 4:05 p.m.

Newsom's Electric Car Nirvana Collides with Reality

Gov. Gavin Newsom and the California Air Resources Board publicly boasted last week about making great strides toward eliminating fossil fuels and their greenhouse gases.

The board released "a draft plan that, when final, will guide the state's transition to a clean energy economy, drastically reduce the use of fossil fuels, achieve carbon neutrality by 2045 or sooner, and significantly clean the state's air especially in disadvantaged communities disproportionately burdened by persistent pollution."

Much of the plan is concentrated on transportation — particularly cars and trucks — which is the largest single emitter of carbon dioxide and other pollutants.

"That means rapidly moving to zero-emission transportation, electrifying the cars, buses, trains, and trucks that now constitute California's single largest source of planet-warming pollution," ARB said.

Newsom, meanwhile, crowed that with new state subsidies, sales of battery-powered zero-emission vehicles (ZEVs) have exceeded 16% of all new vehicle sales so far this year, more than double the proportion in 2020. He also noted that Californians make

half of nationwide purchases of electric vehicles.

"Our state is on the frontlines of extreme weather, and we're taking aggressive steps to protect Californians from the costs of climate change — transitioning away from the big polluters fueling this crisis and towards clean energy," Newsom said. "These incentives make it easier and cheaper to make that transition."

This year's increase in electric car sales was, no doubt, spurred in part by a steep hike in gasoline prices, as well as subsidies — which poses an interesting dichotomy. Newsom has decried those fuel price spikes and wants the state to offset them with payments to motorists, which would reduce some of their motivation to buy electric cars.

Moreover, were California to eventually ban sales of gasoline- and diesel-powered vehicles and go 100% ZEVs, as Newsom also advocates, charging their batteries would impose immense new burdens on an electric power grid that's already strained to meet demand.

By happenstance, as Newsom and the air board were issuing their upbeat messages about the shift, a financial data website, Forbes Advisor, was revealing that California has one of the nation's worst records on providing recharging sites for ZEV owners.

Its study, drawn from U.S. Department of Energy data and numbers from all 50 states, found that North Dakota is the nation's most ZEV-friendly state with one charging station for every 3.18 electric vehicles.

Wyoming, Rhode Island,

Maine and West Virginia round out the top five.

And California? It has the fourth highest ratio, just one station for every 31.2 ZEVs. New Jersey is the least accommodating to ZEV owners, with one station for every 46.16 electric vehicles.

Okay, so California is lacking when it comes to infrastructure needed to support the ZEV nirvana that Newsom and the ARB envision, both in terms of electrical power supply and sites to connect that power to electric cars.

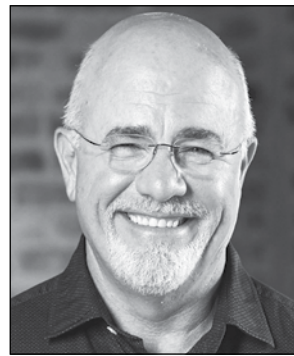
However, the situation may actually be worse.

Again by happenstance, last week brought us evidence that not only is California failing to provide enough ZEV charging stations, but those it does have often don't work.

David Rempel, a retired professor of bioengineering from UC Berkeley, and a team of volunteers tested 181 public Bay Area charging stations with 657 plug-in kiosks and found 73% in working order but 23% had inoperable screens, payment failures or broken connector cables and in 5% cables were too short to reach vehicles recharging inlets.

California's much-vaunted shift to electric cars may turn out to be one of the state government's many high-concept programs that become managerial disasters, another Department of Motor Vehicles or Employment Development Department.

It's about being a little less selfish, and a little more Christ-like. I believe it makes God smile when we put other people's needs ahead of our own wants.

There are some pretty strong indications in scripture that a tithe — which is a tenth of your income — should go to your local church. I have no problem with giving to responsible charitable organizations, too, but when it comes to tithing, I'm not sure a generic charity is the answer.

My wife and I have had times in our lives when we changed churches, and in the periods when we didn't have a home church, we'd write out the checks just like normal, but leave the "pay to the order of" portion blank. CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The annual Community Band Festival returns to Carmichael Park on June 4 and 5.

Villar Wins PCL Player of the Week

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento River Cats infielder David Villar was named PCL Player of the Week after his impressive showing at the El Paso Chihuahuas from May 9-15.

The Giants' 11th round pick out of South Florida in 2018 went 8-for-20 (.400) with nine runs, two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBIs, five walks, and a 1.620 OPS in six games against the Chihuahuas. Villar ignited the River Cats' 10-9 comeback victory on May 11 with a fifth-inning grand slam and a go-ahead 10th inning home run. He followed that up with home runs the next two days.

The award is Villar's first in his debut Triple-A season. The 25-year-old was named an MiLB.com Organization All-Star and Team MVP for Double-A Richmond last year.

Villar leads the PCL with 12 home runs and his 36 RBIs are tied for the lead with El Paso infielder Aderlin Rodriguez. He also ranks inside the top-10 in the league with a

.426 on-base percentage (sixth), .690 slugging percentage (third), 1.116 OPS (second), 19 walks, (sixth), and 27 runs (third).

This is the first weekly award for a River Cats player in 2022. They totaled five in 2021 with current River Cats outfielder Bryce Johnson (May 4-9) and infielder Jason Vosler (June 28-July 4) being two of the winners.

Fans can catch Villar and the River Cats for a 12-game homestand, starting on Tuesday, May 17 against the reigning PCL Champion Tacoma Rainiers. Tickets are available on rivercats.com. ★

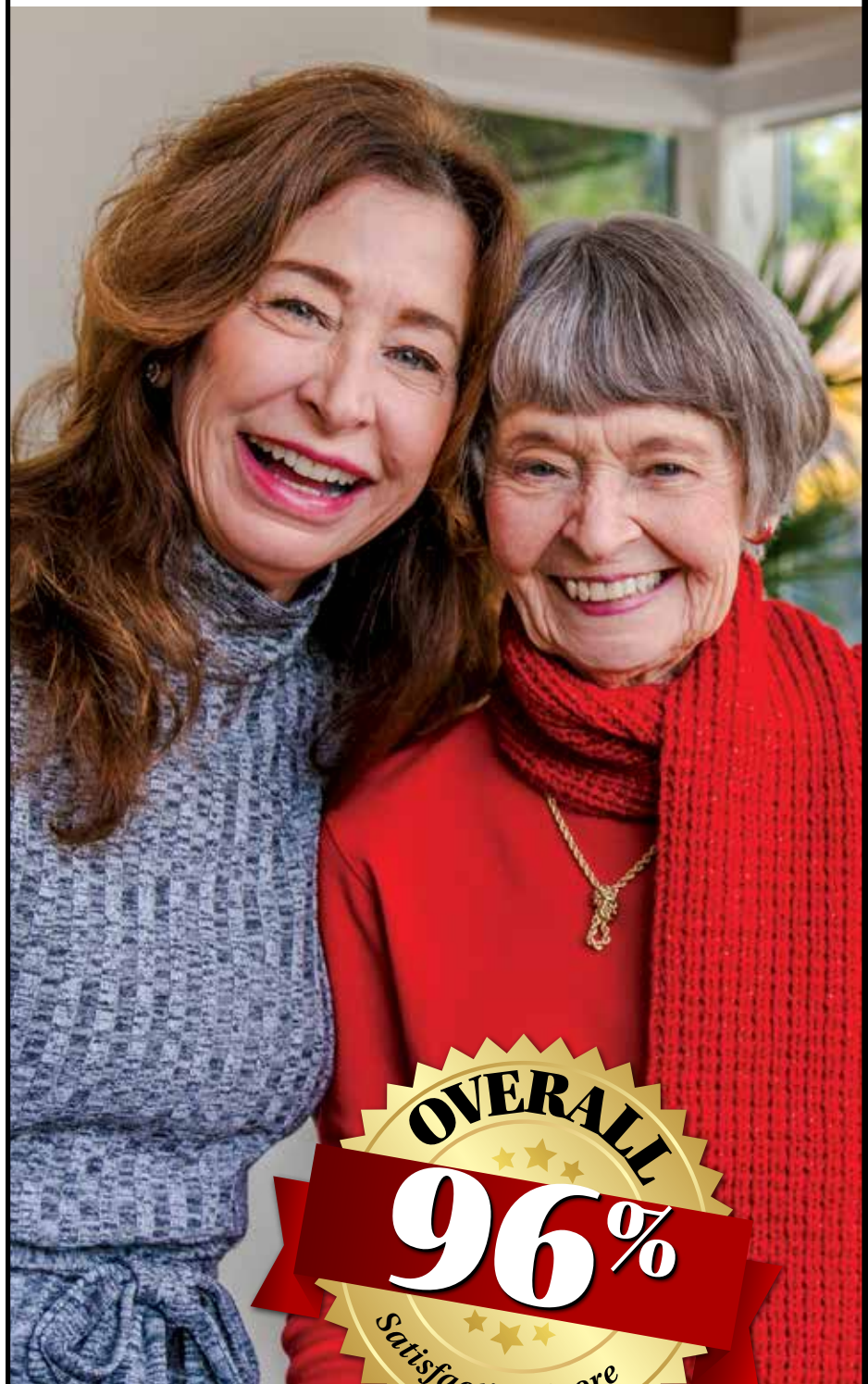

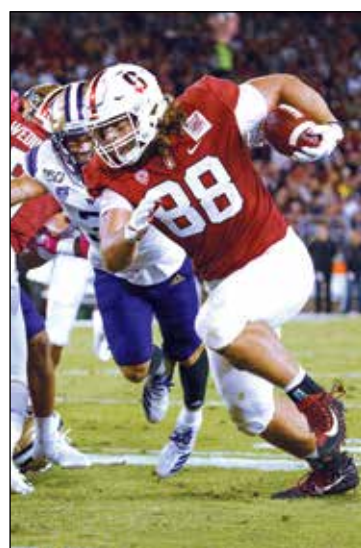

LAS VEGAS, NV (MPG) - Each April, football players from around the world have their dreams realized and shattered over the course of three stressful days known simply as the National Football League (NFL) Draft.

The 2022 NFL Draft was held April 28-30 in Las Vegas, Nevada as several Northern California hopefuls anxiously awaited through 262 picks for their names to be called. The Sacramento region only had one player fulfill his dream of hearing his name called this year. However, the Northern California region had six prominent players agree to terms on professional contracts as undrafted free agents.

Cornerback DaRon Bland out of Fresno State heard his name called on the draft's final day and was selected with the 167th pick by the Dallas Cowboys. Bland played high school football in Modesto at Central Catholic before committing to play collegiately for Sacramento State beginning in 2017. Bland recorded 92 tackles (26 assisted), three interceptions, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one sack in 30 games played over three years with the Hornets.

Bland shined as a junior at Sac State, earning first team All-Big Sky Conference honors as a defensive back and the Hornets' Outstanding Defensive Back Award. Following the pinnacle of his Hornets career, Bland transferred south to Fresno State where his brother, Keane, previously had run track.

In one season with the Bulldogs, Bland had at least one tackle in every game and tallied 45 total (11 assisted) in 13

games which ranked fifth on the team, second among all defensive backs and first among all cornerbacks. Bland also had five pass break ups, two interceptions, one tackle for loss, one forced fumble and one quarterback hit.

The 6-foot-2 Modesto native's play on a bigger stage going from the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) impressed the Cowboys enough for them to spend a fifth-round pick on him rather than risk attempting to sign him as an undrafted free agent.

For those who are not fortunate enough to hear their names called, the final pick of the draft isn't necessarily the end of the road. Each year, many undrafted players are signed as free agents from teams around the NFL, Canadian Football League (CFL) and now even the recently resurrected United State Football League (USFL) immediately after the draft concludes.

One of the first NorCal natives to sign with an NFL team as an undrafted free agent was tight end Stone Smartt from Old Dominion University. The Sacramento native who played high school ball at Del Oro in Loomis agreed to a deal with the Los Angeles Chargers.

Smartt is a versatile player that offers L.A. flexibility, similar to New Orleans Saints' do-it-all Swiss army knife type player, Taysom Hill. The 6-foot-4 Smartt spent the first half of his college career as a quarterback before converting into a wide receiver. With his weight at 232 pounds and given height, Smartt could become a formidable tight end in the NFL.

The next tight end from Northern California to sign an

NFL contract was Tucker Fisk who played at Davis Senior High School before going on to play in the PAC-12 Conference at Stanford. Fisk, who split time in college between tight end, defensive end and special teams, reached an agreement with the Atlanta Falcons.

The 6-foot-4 Davis native could provide flexibility for Atlanta given his ability to play on all sides of the ball. Fisk earned the Jack Huston Award in 2021, which "goes to the player exemplifying aggressiveness, exceptional performance and unheralded efforts."

Tucker has followed the same path as his dad, Jason, who played football at Davis and Stanford before moving on to the NFL. Jason Fisk was a seventh-round pick of the Minnesota Vikings in the 1995 NFL Draft. The Davis native played defensive tackle for five teams during his 12-year career, recording 386 tackles, 19 sacks, four forced fumbles and three interceptions. Tucker will now attempt to top his father's accolades in the league.

Joining Fisk in Georgia was another Davis product, except this 309-pound rusher played collegiately for the Aggies. Bryce Rodgers was a defensive lineman at UC Davis for five seasons dating back to 2016, earning All-Big Sky second team honors during his senior season in 2021. Rodgers led the Aggies defensive linemen in tackles with 18 (10 assisted) while adding two sacks, two quarterback hurries, one forced fumble and one blocked kick.

Fisk and Rodgers may be teammates for the first time, but they may already have several mutual friends and acquaintances after each played football in Davis and Palo Alto. Fisk

started in Davis before moving to Palo Alto. Rodgers did the opposite growing up in East Palo Alto before migrating to Davis.

Rodgers was not the only former Aggie agreeing to terms with a National Football Conference (NFC) South division team, as punter Daniel Whelan signed with the Saints. Whelan currently holds the UC Davis record for longest punt average (44.01 yards) in a career and a single season average record (46.25) that he achieved in 2021.

The Irish All-American is "arguably the greatest punter in Aggie history," according to UC Davis Athletics. Whelan earned All-America first team honors from four organizations in 2021: Stats Perform, AFCA, HERO Sports and Phil Steele. The 6-foot-6 Irishman was also named to the All-Big Sky Conference first team and a finalist for FCS Punter of the Year after the shortened 2021 spring season.

Whelan will be competing with third-year punter Blake Gillikin for the starting job. Gillikin is ranked second all-time in career punting average (43.03) at Penn State. However, Whelan's average in college was nearly one full yard longer, which may have led to the Saints organization deciding to sign him.

Rodgers and Whelan were not the only former Aggies to agree to terms with a professional football team. Offensive lineman Kooper Richardson, who spent his first four collegiate seasons at UC Davis, signed with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the CFL. Richardson was adaptable for the Aggies splitting time at tackle, guard and center.

Before coming to UC Davis,

Richardson played at Folsom High School for his dad, Kris, who was the Bulldogs' coach until 2019 when he became the assistant head coach and offensive line coach at Sac State. Richardson played two more seasons for the Aggies but ultimately deciding to transfer to Sac State to play for his dad again in his final year of eligibility. The 6-foot-5, 295-pound lineman earned All-Big Sky second team honors in 2021.

In a draft that was widely considered to be "weak" when it came to quarterbacks, Vacaville native Carson Strong expected to hear his name as one of the 262 called, but the moment never arrived. Strong, who attended Vacaville High School, was not drafted due to medical concerns over his knee according to the NFL Network. Strong agreed to terms with the Philadelphia Eagles who, if Strong stays healthy, could have gotten a steal of a prospect.

The 6-foot-4 Strong started for three seasons at the University of Nevada, Reno where he completed 852 of 1,252 (68%) attempts for 9,368 yards and 74 touchdowns in 31 total games. In 2021, Strong earned Mountain West Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors after tossing 366 of 523 (70%) passes for 4,175 yards and 36 touchdowns.

Two players from Sacramento to keep an eye on who were expecting to be signed but have not yet been are Grant Union High School alumni, center Orlando Umana and safety TieNeal Martin. Umana played collegiately at The University of Utah and Ole Miss. Martin began his college career at Yuba College before transferring to the University of Tulsa. ★

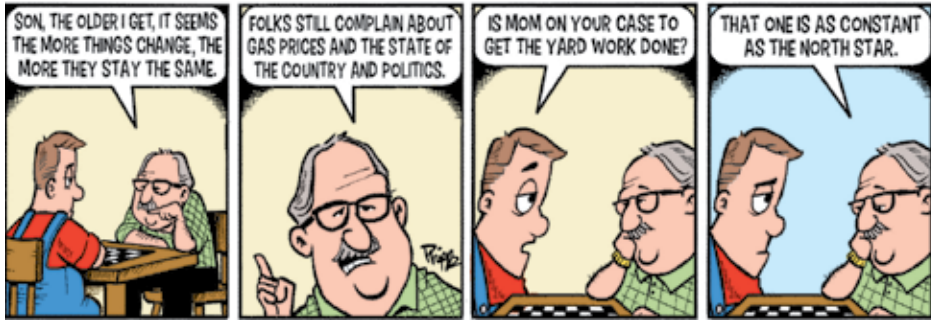

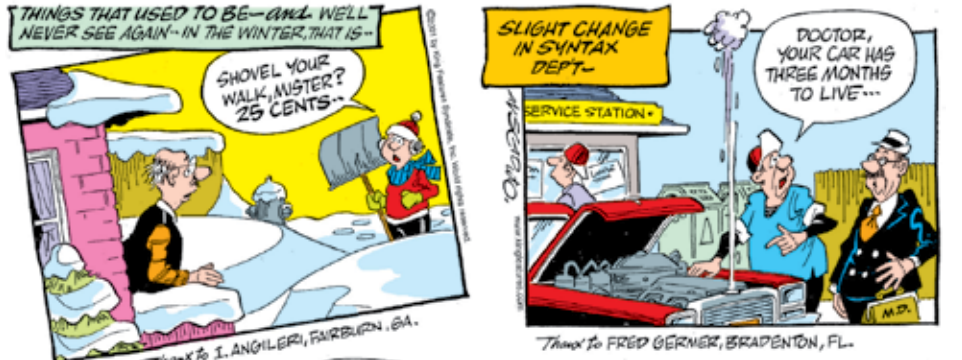

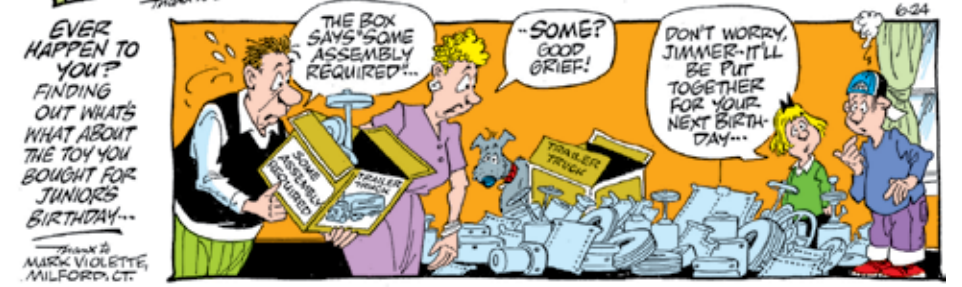
