Welcome Back, Cinco!

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Home to nearly a dozen Mexican restaurants, Carmichael last week rolled out red, white and green flags for Cinco de Mayo.

In the space of several hours, more than 300 people—eating, drinking and being mucho merry—crammed Cantina Azteca on Fair Oaks Boulevard. The fiesta was the first Cinco celebrated by most restaurants since gatherings were nixed

by pandemic restrictions in 2019. Floodgates opened and margaritas flowed. “It’s like the old days are coming back,” rejoiced Cantina Azteca owner Ismael Pantoja.

The restaurateur provided performances by Aztec dancers and mariachi musicians. Cinco de Mayo commemorates Mexico’s 1862 victory over France at the Battle of Puebla. The date remains precious to naturalized American Pantoja. “Two years without a Cinco de Mayo are like two years without Christmas,” he said.

“It’s great to feel normal again. I made plans for a big celebration without knowing what response to expect. I was surprised by how many people came. It was an opportunity to thank customers who’ve supported us. This community turnout makes me positive about the future.”

Like many restaurateurs Pantoja has been badly hit by the pandemic—followed by cost inflation and the difficulty of retaining staff. “We’ve had a tough time,” he said. “But May 5 encouraged us that the good old days might be coming back, at last.” ★

No Gas for You

California’s clean-air regulators unveiled a far-reaching proposal requiring a ramp-up in sales of zero-emission cars, culminating in a ban on new gasoline-powered cars by 2035.

The rules to force California to end their dependence on conventional cars are a critical component to California’s goals to

tackle climate change and poor air quality.

If adopted by the California Air Resources Board this summer, the regulations would be the first in the world and could pave the way for nationwide standards. At least 15 other states pledged to follow California’s lead on car standards on previous clean-car rules, and the federal government usually follows.

Carrying out Gov. Gavin Newsom 2020 executive order ordering the board to end the

sale of gas-powered cars in California by 2035, the new proposal sets in motion the public regulatory process. Public comments will be collected for 45 days, then a hearing will be held on June 9 and the board is expected to vote in August.

“This is a hugely important inflection point. This rule finally, definitively puts us on the path to 100% zero-emission vehicles,” said Daniel Sperling, a member of

the Air Resources Board and founding director of the University of California, Davis Institute of Transportation Studies.

An alliance representing nearly all automakers said in a statement Wednesday that they are “committed to electrification and a net-zero carbon transportation future.” Many major manufacturers, including General Motors, have already announced goals to ramp up clean-car models on a similar timeframe.

Help Us Prevent Fires in Our Parks

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Summer is just around the corner and with the increase in temperatures comes an increase in fire risk. While the Sacramento County Department of Regional Parks is working to protect the Regional Parks system by reducing combustible fire fuels, they would like to remind residents and park visitors of the steps they can take to prevent fires in our beautiful parks and open spaces.

Visitors to Sacramento County Regional Parks should be aware of the following regulations:

Smoking is only allowed in developed picnic areas, asphalt surfaces, golf courses and levee tops in the American River Parkway; Open flame fires are not allowed and barbecuing is only permitted in designated picnic areas.

“In 2021, we had approximately 170 fires in our Regional Park system,” said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. “Most of these preventable fires occurred along the American River Parkway. We would like to remind all of our park users that BBQs and other sources of fire are only allowed in designated picnic areas.”

In preparation for this fire season, Rangers are making it a high priority to continue their fire prevention efforts through education and enforcement.

Recently, Rangers have seized well over 50 barbecues and other items used to contain or produce fires, and this number is expected to grow as residents flock to our parks this summer. Please help us protect our valuable and beloved resources by following the rules in our parks. If you see smoke or a smoldering fire, call 9-1-1. All other non-emergency issues can be reported via 3-1-1 or on the park’s website, regionalparks.saccounty.gov. ★



Girl Scouts Take on the Outdoor Gender Gap

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Girl Scouts Heart of Central California aimed to crush the outdoor gender gap on April 23 and 24, when nearly 600 girls and 260 adult volunteers in an 18-county region descend on Lake Camanche to learn or improve their skills in archery, fishing, paddling, and horseback riding.

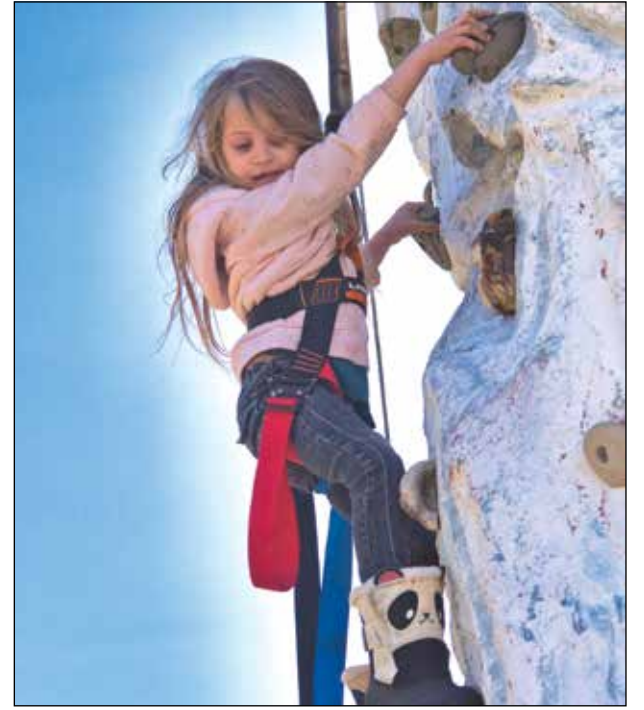
The Outdoor Adventure Campout is an overnight camping experience, April 23-24, for Girl Scouts in grades K-12. Participants choose from one of four "trails," to focus their weekend on fishing, horses, paddling, or target sports.

All girls will be able to hone their outdoor survival skills, climb a rock wall, swim in a lake, camp with their troop, and learn more about nature. According to the 2021 Outdoor Participation Trends Report, funded by the Outdoor Foundation, the philanthropic arm of the Outdoor Industry Association, 2021 had the highest rate of American participation in outdoor activities on record, largely due to COVID-19. However, nearly half of the U.S. population did not share in the positive health outcomes of the outdoors. In addition, female participation in outdoor activities remained stagnant at just 46%, despite the fact 51% of the U.S. population is female. The study also revealed an extreme lack of diversity in outdoor activities, with nearly 75% of outdoor participants identifying as white.

At Girl Scouts, we

believe girls are forces of nature, and they were meant for outdoor adventures. GSHCC is dedicated to supporting year-round outdoor experiences because every outdoor adventure grows a Girl Scout's "I've got this" attitude. And once they unlock that confidence, they'll aim as high as the stars they see outside their tents.

The inaugural Outdoor Adventure Campout occurred in 2019 with 600 total participants, including adult volunteers. Out of concern for the health and safety of girls and volunteers, events in 2020 and 2021 were conducted virtually, and girls camped in their backyards and living rooms.

"We are thrilled to see a 40% participation increase from the 2019 Outdoor Adventure Campout," said GSHCC CEO Dr. Linda E. Farley. "We are even more thrilled to bring this

Make Way for Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With the days getting longer and temperatures on the rise, motorcycle riders are making their way up and down our state highways. The California Highway Patrol (CHP) emphasizes the importance of paying close attention to a motorcycle rider's location, sharing the roadway, and working together to keep all motorists safe as we travel throughout the state.

"Motorcycle riders statistically face greater danger than other motorists," says CHP Commissioner Amanda Ray. "Safe riding practices and cooperation from all road users will greatly help reduce the number of fatalities and injuries."

In 2020, the CHP responded to approximately 6,500 crashes involving a motorcycle. Nearly 80 percent of those crashes involved an injury and 328 motorcyclists tragically lost their lives.

As part of May's Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month, the CHP will employ education and enforcement efforts to help

call attention to the dangers and vulnerabilities motorcyclists face on the road.

As motorcyclists are often vulnerable on the road and may be difficult

to see, riders should always be keenly aware of their surroundings, follow all traffic laws, and wear protective clothing, including a legally required U.S. Department of Transportation-approved helmet.

To help both new and experienced riders understand the laws and refine their safe riding skills, the CHP is proud to oversee California's official motorcycle training program. Students who pass the California Motorcyclist Safety Program (CMSP) will be issued a Certificate of Completion of Motorcycle Training, which may be used to waive the motorcycle skills test at the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). Graduates would only be required to pass the DMV knowledge test to receive the motorcycle endorsement. But the automakers added that it's critical for governments to ensure that "everything from (electric car) infrastructure, demand, critical minerals and supply chain are in place." Even then, the companies said the state's proposed rules "will be extremely challenging even in California and may not be achievable" in other states.

If enacted, 35% of new cars, SUVs and small pickups sold in the state must be zero-emission starting with 2026 models, then increasing yearly, reaching 51% of all new car sales in 2028, 68% in 2030 and 100% in 2035. Of those, 20% can be plug-in hybrids.

The rule does not apply to sales of pre-owned cars, and it wouldn't do anything to force the millions of existing gasoline-powered cars off roads. Only about 2% of cars on California's roads were zero emissions in 2020.

Vehicles that run on gasoline or diesel fuel are the state's biggest sources of planet-warming greenhouse gases, smog and dangerous particles. Under the proposed regulation, about 384 million fewer metric tons of greenhouse gases will be emitted between 2026 and 2040, according to air board staff – a little less than the total amount that the state emitted in 2019 across its economy.

California has already enacted standards that will require roughly 8% of new cars sold in the state to be zero emission in 2025, according to air board staff. That goal already has been exceeded: About 12% of California's 2021 new vehicle sales were clean cars, according to state data.

But the pace would have to triple in just five years to reach the new target, which the automakers dubbed "aggressive."

One of the biggest roadblocks could be the lack of charging stations for electric cars. Nearly 1.2 million chargers will be needed for the 8 million zero-emission vehicles expected in California by 2030, according to a state report. Right now, there are only about 70,000 with another 123,000 on the way, falling far short.

Another obstacle is the cost of the vehicles. "The cost to manufacturers will be high per vehicle in the early years, but significantly decrease over time by 2035," the air board's staff report says.

The economic benefits of the mandate are expected to exceed the costs: The costs could run \$289 billion over the lifetime of the rule while the economic benefits could reach at least \$338 billion – a net benefit of \$48 billion, according to air board staff.

Electric cars now cost more to purchase, but price drops plus savings on gas and maintenance would add up, saving consumers an estimated \$3,200 over ten years for a 2026 car and \$7,500 for a 2035 car, the air board calculated.

In an effort to address consumer reluctance, manufacturers would be required to meet minimum performance, durability

and warranty requirements for zero-emission vehicles. Cars must be able to drive at least 150 miles on a single charge, up from the current 50-mile mandate, and batteries will need to last longer and carry a manufacturer's warranty.

The goal is to ensure that new and used zero-emission vehicles "can serve as full replacement vehicles for conventional vehicles in every household in California," the air board says.

Environmental advocates had raised concerns about previous drafts, saying they ramped up too slowly, allowing millions of cars powered by fossil fuels to remain on the roads since the average car is driven for 12 years.

Starting at a sales requirement of 35% is "a marked improvement," said Don Anair, research and deputy director of the Union of Concerned Scientists' clean transportation program. Still, he said, "It's kind of the bare minimum. So we really see that as a floor, not a ceiling, to get started."

Environmental groups urged the board to set a more stringent target of 75% zero-emission sales in 2030. They also are seeking mandatory equity provisions that would ensure electric cars are in communities that suffer the most pollution.

Under the proposed rule, car manufacturers would be allowed to meet a small portion of their sales targets through 2031 with credits aimed at helping low-income residents. For instance, they could earn credits for selling less-expensive new zero-emission cars costing less than \$20,000 or ensure that vehicles are offered up for resale in the state.

Last year Newsom approved a \$3.9 zero-emission vehicle budget that included about \$1.2 billion to bolster rebates and other clean-car incentives, particularly for low-income and disadvantaged communities. Another \$300 million will go toward building charging and fueling infrastructure.

Newsom touted the \$10 billion zero-emission vehicle funding package in his January budget blueprint, which he said would

"expand access and affordability for all."

The state auditor has warned the Air Resources Board, however, that it "has generally not determined the effects its incentive programs have on consumers' behavior and thus, has overstated (greenhouse gas) emissions reductions its incentive programs achieve."

While battery-powered cars emit no pollutants, the generation of the power that runs them does. However, air-quality regulators say emissions from electricity generation are far lower than from vehicles. Much of California's electricity comes from natural gas, solar, wind and hydropower.

Other nations are on similar paths toward phasing out fossil fuel-powered vehicles, but no state or nation has adopted a rule that bans them. However, the European Union is considering a large package of climate change laws that would, in effect, prohibit fossil fuel cars by requiring a 100% cut in all carbon dioxide emissions by 2035.

California's proposal comes as gas prices soar to more than \$5 per gallon in the state. Critics say the Newsom administration is sending mixed messages about gasoline-powered cars by proposing rebates for car owners.

The zero-emission vehicle proposal will require approval of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for implementation. Since the 1960s, the state has led the country in cleaning up the exhaust that creates California's choking smog. The federal Clean Air Act gave California authority to set its own tailpipe emissions standards.

The Trump administration acted to eliminate that authority but President Joe Biden's EPA overturned the decision in March. Newsom called it "a major victory for the environment, our economy, and the health of families across the country" and said the state "looks forward to partnering with the Biden Administration to make a zero-emission future a reality for all Americans." ★

Gavin Newsom's First Term: Reality Bites

Last weekend, Gavin Newsom released the first video ad of his campaign for a second term as California's governor.

It is, therefore, an appropriate moment to look at what he said he wanted to accomplish as governor during his 2018 campaign and how it has turned out.

A two-word summary would be "reality bites."

Candidate Newsom, touting a book entitled "Built to Last: Successful Habits of Visionary Companies," embraced its central point that visionary leaders should seek "big, hairy audacious goals."

"I'd rather be accused of (having) those audacious stretch goals than be accused of timidity," he said at one point.

True to that philosophy, Newsom told voters he wanted to do big things, such as creating a single-payer health system, solving the state's chronic shortage of housing and completely converting California to renewable energy.

During his 2018 campaign, the state Senate passed a single-payer bill and Newsom enthusiastically endorsed it, saying there was "no reason to wait around."

"I'm tired of politicians saying they support

single-payer but that it's too soon, too expensive or someone else's problem," Newsom said.

The 2018 bill stalled in the Assembly but when another bill cleared the Senate and was pending in the Assembly this year, Newsom made no effort to get it passed and it died without a vote.

A commission Newsom appointed to study single-payer's feasibility has issued a report that lays out options but offers no clear path to implementation. Essentially, single-payer is no more likely today than it was four years ago.

Instead, Newsom's budgets have incrementally extended Medi-Cal coverage to uninsured residents, including undocumented immigrants, but in the long term, that coverage depends on the state's notoriously volatile revenues.

As he was running for governor, Gavin Newsom pledged to "lead the effort to develop the 3.5 million new housing units we need by 2025 because our solutions must be as bold as the problem is big."

The pledge would have required increasing production to 500,000 units a year, but actual construction has been, at best, about 20% of that figure. Newsom downplayed his pledge to "a stretch goal," telling the Los Angeles Times, "It's a stubborn issue. You can't snap your fingers and build hundreds of thousands, millions of housing units overnight."

And so it has gone - Newsom edging away from "big hairy audacious goals" one-by-one when they proved impossible to achieve in the real world.

Two recent positions on

high-profile environmental issues also illustrate how reality has tempered his governorship.

One reality is that California is afflicted by severe drought and, due to climate change, may face permanent shortages of water. One very controversial option is tapping the limitless supply of ocean water and stripping out its salt.

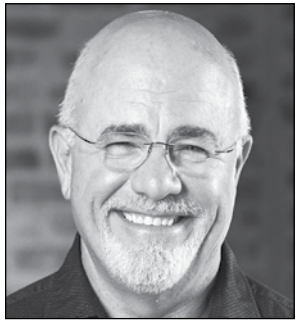
Recently, the state Coastal Commission recommended that the state's second desalination plant not be built, but Newsom reiterated his support. "We need more tools in the damn tool kit," Newsom told the Bay Area News Group editorial board.

That, at least, was a consistent position, but he modified his stance on another real world issue - whether California's only remaining nuclear power plant, Diablo Canyon, should be shuttered as now scheduled.

The San Luis Obispo County plant generates at least 6% of the state's electrical energy and closure could leave California, whose power supply is already marginal, in the dark.

Newsom had supported decommissioning Diablo Canyon but told the Los Angeles Times editorial board last week that California will apply for federal funds aimed at keeping threatened nuclear plants in production, saying, "We would be remiss not to put that on the table as an option."

Inmate Convicted of Violently Assaulting Another Inmate

Sac County DA's Office News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Bob Bejarano was convicted by a jury of assault with a deadly weapon by an inmate serving a life sentence, possession of a weapon in prison and possession of heroin in prison.

Allegations that Bejarano has a prior strike conviction for shooting inside an occupied car and failed to remain free from prison

custody for at least 5 years were found true. The following special allegations were also found true: the crime involved great violence, great bodily harm, or other acts disclosing a high degree of cruelty, viciousness or callousness; Bejarano was armed or used a weapon at the time of the commission of the crime; the manner in which the crime was carried out indicates planning, sophistication or professionalism; Bejarano has engaged in violent

conduct that indicates a serious danger to society; and Bejarano has served a prior term in prison or county jail.

Bejarano was an inmate at California State Prison-Sacramento. On January 14, 2018, a correctional officer observed Bejarano put an unknown item in his mouth. It was later determined to be methamphetamine wrapped in cellophane. On August 30, 2018, Bejarano approached

inmate Eric Rodriguez who was playing basketball by himself. Bejarano called Rodriguez over to him and stabbed Rodriguez repeatedly with an inmate manufactured weapon. Rodriguez wrestled Bejarano to the ground, took possession of the weapon and began stabbing Bejarano. At this point, correctional officers saw the fight and ordered them to stop. When Rodriguez continued to stab Bejarano, an officer fired one shot from the tower, striking

Rodriguez. Although life saving measures were immediately performed, Rodriguez did not survive. Bejarano was transported to the hospital, where a CT scan showed that he had ingested two foreign items. Bejarano admitted to swallowing two bindles of heroin.

Bejarano faces a maximum sentence of life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 13, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 34 before the Honorable Alyson Lewis. ★

Homeless Man Convicted of Multiple Violent, Sexual Assaults

Sac County DA's News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Layman McFadden was convicted by a jury of rape by force, three counts of oral copulation by force, two counts of domestic violence, three counts of assault by means of force likely to produce death or great bodily injury, two

counts of false imprisonment and making criminal threats. The jury also found true allegations that McFadden's crimes involved great violence, cruelty, viciousness, and/or callousness; McFadden took advantage of a position of trust to commit the crimes; and McFadden committed sex offenses against more than one victim.

Between 2019 and 2021, McFadden was homeless and living in camps along the American River Parkway. During that time, McFadden assaulted three women who were also homeless and living in the same camps. In September 2019, McFadden strangled, raped, and forced one of the victims to orally copulate him. In June 2021, he strangled,

assaulted, and threatened to kill a second victim. In July 2021, McFadden strangled, assaulted, and forced a third victim to orally copulate him.

McFadden faces a maximum sentence of 78 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 31, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 26 before the Honorable Shama Mesiwala. ★

Defendant Convicted of Transportation of Fentanyl for Sale

Sac County DA's News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Jose Aguilar-Chavez was convicted by a jury of transportation of fentanyl for sale.

On September 2, 2021, CHP officers stopped Aguilar-Chavez for a traffic violation. Upon contact with

Aguilar-Chavez the officer noticed an overwhelming smell of rotten fruit and suspected the odor was used to mask the scent of illegal narcotics from his K-9. The officer then deployed his narcotics-sniffing certified K-9 partner. The K-9 alerted on the back passenger compartment of the vehicle. Upon further

inspection, the officer discovered 36,000 fabricated "M30" Oxycodone pills. The District Attorney's Crime Lab analyzed the pills and confirmed they were fake and contained fentanyl. Less than one individual pill can be potentially fatal. The street value of the pills range between \$180,000 - \$720,000.

Aguilar-Chavez faces a maximum sentence of 5 years county jail prison. Sentencing is set for June 10, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

molested several young girls who were in foster care at the home from 2008-2011, but information about the daycare abuse did not come to light until later disclosures by the children.

David Belmares faces a

maximum sentence of 68 years to life in prison and Jared Belmares faces a maximum sentence of 40 years in prison. Sentencing is set for June 3, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Laurel White. ★

Is There a Medicare Penalty for Leaving A Rehab Facility Too Soon!!

Dear Toni:
Ten days ago, I placed my mother who has Medicare in a "rehab facility" for approximately three weeks, thinking that her post-hospital therapy would go better there than it would here at home.... WRONG.... I enrolled my poor mother into The Halls of H*ll, and now, I desperately need to spring her OUT OF THERE!

My problem is this: we are fearful that she will be penalized in some way for NOT staying the entire 20 days.

Thank you in advance for the advice/help. Sincerely yours, Loretta from Denver

Hello Loretta:

I have never seen a Medicare penalty for not spending the 20 days in a skilled nursing or rehab facility. If you feel the facility is not giving your mother the care she needs, it is her right to leave. I would report her unhappiness to the facility's administrator.

Before trying to release her from the rehab facility, I would talk with your mother's doctor or facility's case manager. A better alternative than bringing her home, is hiring a personal care provider to spend time with your mother and make sure that your mother is taken care of at the rehab facility. This will take some of the burden from you since you cannot be at the rehab center 24/7.

Medicare will pay only for medically necessary health related claims. Many believe that Medicare helps with Long Term Care, but Medicare will only pay for a skilled nursing/rehab facility stay. If one cannot qualify or does not meet Medicare's qualification for skilled nursing/rehab facility care, then they may have to pay 100% of the cost.

Skilled nursing/rehab facility has 100 days of benefit with day's 1-20 having \$0 co pay per day and days 21-100 with a daily co pay that changes each year. Medicare pays absolutely nothing for assisted living, personal care homes or

extra provider care that is not medically necessary at home.

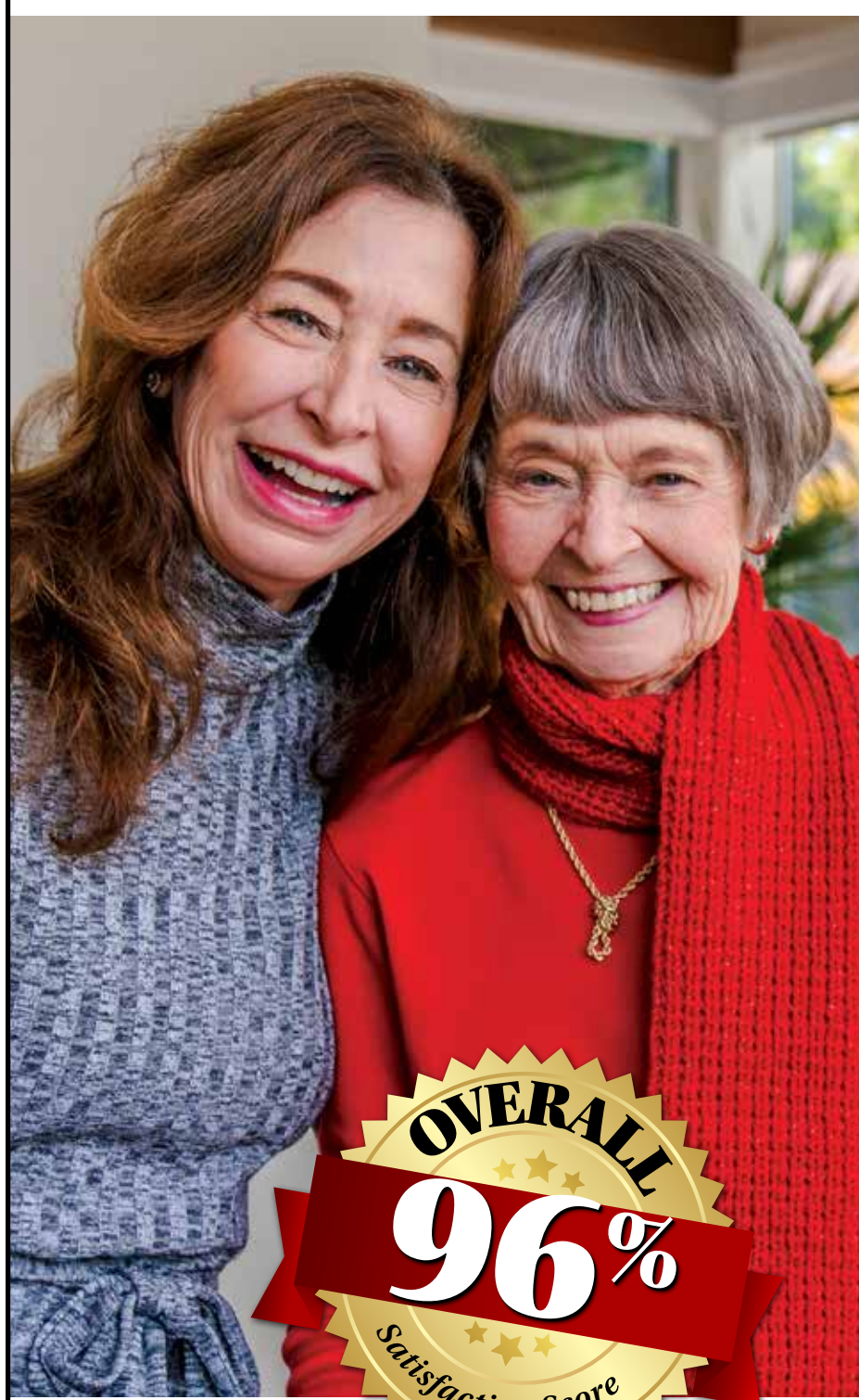

Caltrans Honors Fallen Highway Workers at Memorial

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Caltrans dignitaries, employees, families and friends gathered solemnly on the west steps of the State Capitol for the department's 32nd Annual Workers Memorial to remember and honor the 189 public servants who have died since 1921 while building and maintaining California's transportation system.

The yearly memorial – in addition to honoring families and giving staff the opportunity to pay respects to their fallen colleagues – reminds us to “Be Work Zone Alert” and “Move Over” a lane when you see flashing amber lights ahead, or slow down if not safe to do so.

“Safety is always Caltrans’ top priority and the tragedies that brought us here today have resulted in intensified safety efforts within the department,” said Caltrans Acting Director Steven Keck. “Zero deaths on our state highway system is the only acceptable

transportation system – we remind all motorists to please Slow for the Cone Zone, Be Work Zone Alert and Move Over when you see flashing amber lights.”

During the ceremony, Caltrans placed 189 orange traffic cones in a diamond “caution sign” configuration, each bearing the name of an employee lost since

number, and – as we recognize those who tragically died while at work on our

2021. A black cone in the center represented all people killed while working

on the state highway system, including private contractors, tow truck drivers, California Highway Patrol (CHP) officers and other emergency responders. The commemoration also included the Caltrans Honor Guard, who led the symbolic tribute. Additionally, flags are flying at half-staff today at the State Capitol and at all

Caltrans facilities in honor of these fallen workers.

The ceremony marked the third year in a row that no new names were added to the memorial – the longest stretch in nearly 75 years – though speakers at the memorial stressed the need for everyone to remain vigilant.

With the help of Senate Bill 1, the Road Repair and

Accountability Act of 2017, as well as the recently enacted federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, Caltrans and local agencies now have significant additional funds to repair and maintain California's transportation system. The additional funding also increases the number of Caltrans employees and contractors working on our roadways,

increasing their exposure.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, highway construction and maintenance work is one of the most hazardous occupations in the United States. In 2020, more than 6,500 work zone collisions occurred on California roadways, resulting in an estimated 1,964 injuries and 60 fatalities. Nationally, drivers and passengers account for 85 percent of the people who are killed in work zones.

In February, Caltrans announced a new Director's Policy on Road Safety, which commits the department to the Safe System approach and reaffirms the vision of reaching zero fatalities and serious injuries on state highways by 2050. This policy takes steps to further a shift that began in 2020, as state transportation leaders recognized a bolder and more focused approach was necessary to combat the troubling rise in fatalities and serious injuries on California roads. The state's 2020-24 Strategic Highway Safety Plan – managed by Caltrans and involving more than 400 stakeholders – was updated to include the Safe System approach.

Caltrans has partnered with the California Transportation Foundation to develop two funds to benefit the families of Caltrans workers killed on the job. The Fallen Workers Assistance and Memorial Fund helps with the initial needs a surviving family faces and the Caltrans Fallen Workers Memorial Scholarship is available to the children of these workers. 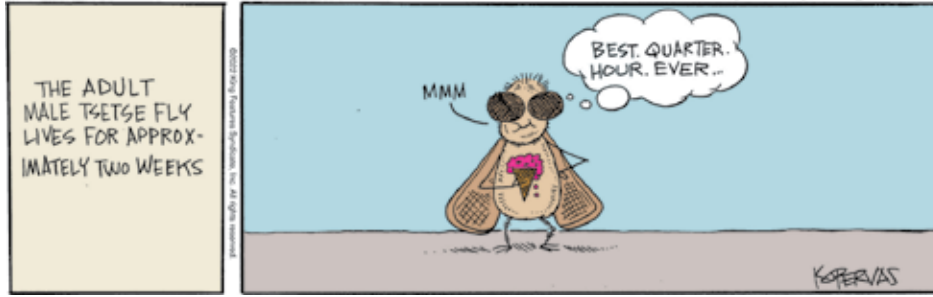

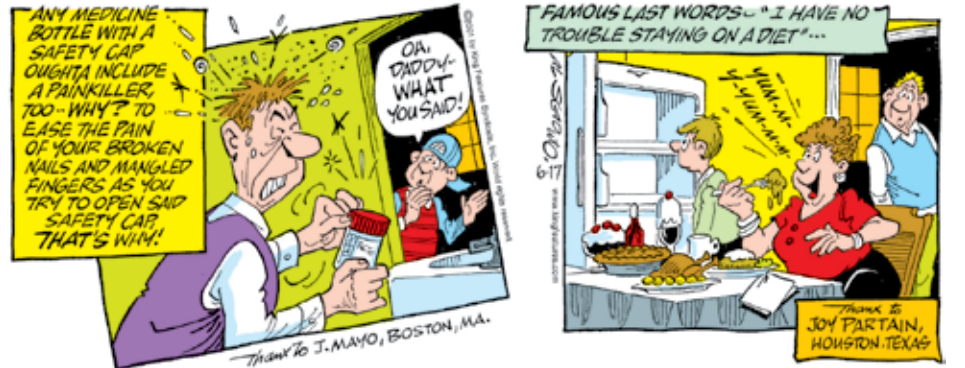

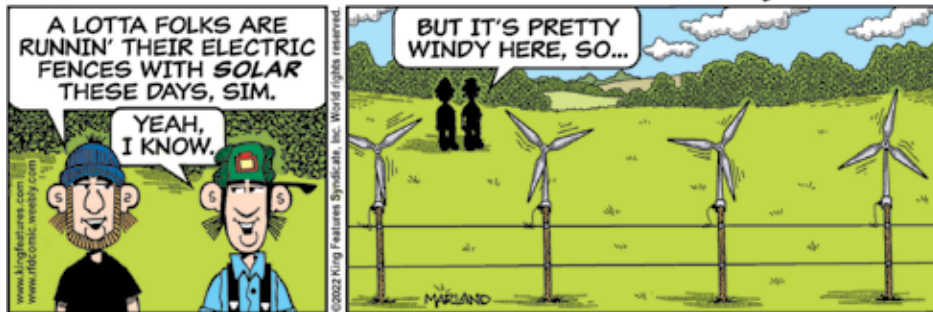

Kings Announce Mike Brown as Head Coach

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Monday, May 9, Sacramento Kings General Manager Monte McNair named Mike Brown as the team's new head coach. Per team policy, the terms of the deal were not disclosed.

"Mike has consistently demonstrated his ability to lead winning teams throughout his long and successful coaching career," said Sacramento Kings General Manager Monte McNair. "He has worked with some of the best players in the NBA and is one of the league's premier defensive minds. I am excited to bring his extensive experience to Sacramento."

Brown joins the Kings from the Golden

State Warriors, where he is currently in his sixth season as an assistant coach. He helped guide the team to back-to-back titles in 2016-17 and 2017-18. Prior to the Warriors, Brown held head coaching duties with the Cleveland Cavaliers (2005-10, 2013-14) and Los Angeles Lakers (2011-12). Brown's teams qualified for the playoffs in six of his seven full seasons as a head coach, advancing past the first round in each appearance.

In 2007, Brown led the Cavaliers to their first-ever NBA Finals appearance and was named the NBA Coach of the Year in 2008-09 after guiding the Cavaliers to a franchise-record 66 wins. Cleveland won at least 50 games in four of Brown's first

five seasons with the club, including back-to-back 60-win campaigns in 2008-09 (66) and 2009-10 (61). During the 2011-2012 lockout-shortened season, Brown led the Lakers to a Pacific Division title and a 41-25 (.621) record. He owns a career head coaching record of 347-216 (.616) over eight seasons, which ranks as the ninth-best winning percentage in NBA history among coaches who have registered at least 500 games at the helm.

Prior to joining the Cavaliers in 2005, Brown was associate head coach of the Indiana Pacers for two seasons (2003-05) after spending three years as an assistant with the San Antonio Spurs (2001-03), where he also captured an NBA title.

Brown began his career with the Denver Nuggets in 1992, spending five seasons as a video coordinator and scout before serving as an assistant under Bernie Bickerstaff in Washington beginning in 1997.

A native of Columbus, Ohio, Brown is a graduate of the University of San Diego, where he played collegiately for two seasons after spending two years at Mesa Community College.

Brown was the head coach of the Nigeria men's national basketball team during the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo, held in August 2021. He has two sons, Elijah and Cameron.


