'Farm' Houses the Vulnerable

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) -Carmichael honorary Mayor Sal Ramirez and partner Matthew Crooks have combined commercial and humanitarian missions to provide a roof over the heads of potentially homeless men and women.

The community activists last year purchased a one-acre property on the Carmichael/Fair Oaks border. They increased the home's 3000 square feet by four extra, shared bedrooms. Their seven-bedroom property now houses 15 people, with capacity for seven more. Rent – \$925 per month - includes all meals, cable TV, utilities, cleaning, laundry and toiletries. Residents are mostly seniors. Social security or disability checks cover most boarder costs.

"Our residents are some of the most at-risk elders," explains nonprofit professional Sal Ramirez. "We want to supply a safe, supportive home and network for them. In most cases, this facility is all that stands between them and sleeping in the streets. It's one of very few room and board homes for an area with a big homeless population."

A year after opening, Fresh Start at Vassar Farm (Vassar is Matthew Crooks' middle name) seems a success. Mostly seniors, residents are quiet neighbors who adhere to a strict no-alcohol/drug rule. Boarders are referred by social and veteran agencies and, if income falls short of rent costs, the project solicits assistance from charities such as Adopt an Elder Foundation.

If a "farm" moniker seems fanciful, the partners note mature olive and citrus trees, a vegetable garden, clucking hens, two cats (Thelma and Louise) and a visiting bunny on their green acre. "We call this a sanctuary for birds, bees, butterflies and people," explains career social worker Crooks. "Our residents look after the chickens and their eggs are eaten every day. Connecting with nature and animals is therapeutic. We want this to feel like a forever home for our boarders."

The facility offers a remote, muchused smoking patio. Though all food is provided, borders can use the communal kitchen to whip up cookies and cakes. A high-ceilinged breezeway (formerly an automotive workshop) supplies social and Continued on page 3

Sacramento Spare the Air Season **Underway**

SACRAMENTO REGION. CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (Sac Metro Air District) and the air districts of the Sacramento region launched the 28th annual Spare the Air season on Sunday, May

The region's Spare the Air program runs each year from May 1 through Oct. 31, and a Spare the Air alert is issued when the Air Quality Index (AQI) for groundlevel ozone pollution is forecast to meet or exceed 126, rendering air quality unhealthy for sensitive groups. Air pollution affects everyone. Even healthy people can experience health impacts from polluted air, including respiratory irritation or breathing difficulties during exercise or outdoor activities. In addition to its harmful health effects, air pollution impacts businesses, the economy, and the environment.

Small changes can make a big difference in our community. During the past two years, the Sacramento region saw a vast improvement in air quality. Residents of Sacramento, Placer, Yolo, Solano, and El Dorado counties are encouraged to consider teleworking, taking transit, driving a low or zero emission vehicle, or using other active transportation options such as walking, biking, or riding a scooter when possible. By making individual efforts to reduce air pollution, we can come together as a community to make a much larger impact on air quality in our region and combat climate change.

Please follow these tips to continue to improve the region's air quality: Download the free Sacramento Region Air Quality app to view daily air quality forecasts and real-time air pollution readings for Sacramento, Placer, Yolo-Solano and El Dorado counties. Drive less to help reduce vehicle emissions, especially on a Spare the Air Day

Telework at least once per week, if possible. Use active transportation, such as riding a bike, walking, or taking a scooter for your errands, or as a way to commute to work. Take public transit or carpool to reduce the number of single-passenger vehicles on the road. Use a zero-emission hybrid or electric vehicle.

'Debatable' Quality Lunches

Casa Roble Freshman Urges SJUSD to Help Students Eat Better

ORANGEVALE, CA (MPG) - Casa Roble freshman Catherine Patton is unsatisfied with the meals available to students at her school.

"Here at Casa Roble High School, the quality of school lunches is debatable," Patton wrote in an essay titled, "Health is Wealth" that she recently wrote for one of her classes. "The salad bar was removed and there isn't a large variety of fruits and vegetables. Your school lunch should contain the five food groups: fruits, vegetables, protein, grain and dairy. Most of the lunches consist of pizza, hot pockets and more processed foods.

"The school isn't exactly lifestyle-friendly for those with eating disorders, allergies, diabetes, or other unique circumstances. Often, the portions in food they give are too little, not enough for the students who do choose to eat school lunches, still leaving them hungry after lunch."

Raj Rai, Director of Communication for the San Juan Unified School District, explained that the lunches currently available to students are within the recommended guidelines.

'School meals meet or exceed the latest federal and state requirements and are designed to ensure that students receive a balanced meal low in fat and sodium," Rai said via email. "Current guidelines for lunch require that we offer five components daily: fruits, vegetables, whole grains, meat/meat alternatives and milk. A student

the five required components and at least one of those three must be a fruit or a vegetable."

"San Juan Unified is committed to serving healthy meals that support students' academic efforts and a healthy lifestyle. As a result of the USDA's extension of special COVID-19 waivers, we have been able to offer free meals to all students in the district this school year."

The 15-year-old Patton argues that students with financial difficulties are unable to choose what they eat which is why schools should make an effort to serve healthy food.

"Some students have no choice but to eat school lunch, due to it being free," Patton wrote. "If students have low-income families, they're forced to get what's cheap, whether it's healthy or not, because their families cannot afford it."

Patton believes Casa can do more to educate students about what they're putting in their bodies outside of school as well.

"Casa could do a

on them in 10 years, it might change their mindset." An educational presentation isn't the only idea that Patton had on how Casa can improve the food being

served to students. "Although we have a cooking class, it isn't required," Patton wrote. "A cooking class could be beneficial for knowing how to cook and for the healthy eating aspect. Our school could also start a gardening class and teach students to grow their own organic food and use that fresh food as ingredients in the cooking class."

Patton argued that if the school had the funds for it, some things students would enjoy include a smoothie bar and snack boxes that are

like bento boxes filled with fruit, vegetables, organic hummus, juice, milk, water and a little desert.

"If you give kids pizza and burgers every day, 80% of the students will get sick of that," Patton said. "You could have vegan food, a salad bar, Chinese food, sushi, smoothies, veggies, and fruit and 90% of the students would prefer it over the unhealthy food."

However, Rai argues that some suppliers may be facing difficulties due to food shortages.

"Many of our food distributors are facing challenges in manufacturing and product unavailability or shortages may necessitate menu substitutions from our published menus on occasion," Rai said.

Following a review of the SJUSD middle and high school lunch menus for April, chicken nuggets and patties, bean burritos, mini cheeseburgers, and pizza are offered on the menu daily. Fruits, vegetables and milk are also offered on the menu as part of the five meal components required by the school district.

"There are several health risks that come with the school lunches being served nowadays, like the high amount of salt, fat, sugar, and empty calories the foods contain," Patton said. "Diabetes, obesity, cancer and more can all stem from school lunches. If we don't make a change, the numbers for obesity and diabetes will just keep rising higher.

"It's up to us to change the food we are consuming, to have healthy eating habits, to better our schools and our students."

Investing in New KidsVaxGrant

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In an effort to expand COVID-19 vaccine access for youth, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) is offering \$10 million in grant funding through the newly launched KidsVaxGrant. This makes healthcare providers enrolled in the state's Vaccines for Children (VFC) program eligible to receive funding of up to \$25,000 per site to expand operating hours.

'Vaccines are the most powerful tool we have to protect our children and our communities from the dangers of COVID-19," said Secretary of the California Health and Human Services Agency, Dr. Mark Ghaly. "This grant program will make COVID-19 vaccines more accessible to children and their families by recruiting new providers and supporting existing providers by expanding operating hours. As a father and a pediatrician, I assure you COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Please make an appointment to get your family vaccinated today.'

Since its inception in 1995, the state's VFC Program has played an essential role in vaccinating youth by supplying providers with vaccines for children at no additional cost to parents or guardians who may be unable to afford them. The state aims to increase access to the COVID-19 vaccine by recruiting additional providers into the California COVID-19 Vaccination Program and by helping providers expand their operating hours to make vaccinations more convenient for families. Longer hours CDPH has contracted with Physicians for a Healthy California to administer the KidsVaxGrant program statewide.

Newly enrolled VFC providers that are part of the California COVID-19 Vaccination Program could be eligible for \$10,000 in KidVaxGrant funds per site to establish COVID-19 vaccination services. VFC providers already enrolled are also eligible to apply and could be awarded \$15,000 grant per site. The deadline to apply is

To be considered, providers must expand their operating hours. Expanding the capacity of providers to open their doors beyond normal business hours allows for additional vaccination options for working families. Operating hours must be increased by a minimum of 15 hours outside of standard operating hours during a 60-day period.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - A "State of the PBID" dinner last week marked five successful years for Carmichael's Property and Business Improvement District. Almost 120 supporters packed the recital hall at Tim's Music Store to celebrate.

The organization – among many similar entities in Sacramento – was formed by main street businesses in 2017.

Carmichael district's fiefdom extends through three miles of Fair Oaks Boulevard and surrounding streets. Commercial property owners are assessed to provide an annual PBID budget - currently \$500,000. These funds beautify, improve safety and generally benefit merchant prosperity. County Supervisors last year voted for the organization to continue for a further 10 years.

The dinner feted businesspeople and honored three beautification projects: Carmichael Oaks Shopping Center's new paint job; Crossroads Church's re-invented landscaping; an amusing graphic by Marconi Dental Group that put a smile on a previously unsightly dumpster.

"This is your PBID," Executive Director Rebekah Evans told supporters. "In our sixth year, we'll carry on efforts to make Carmichael safe and invitingly clean. We're accomplishing this with the focus of our contractors, joint law enforcement and our leaders. The results are all around us."

Dinner speakers included County Supervisor Rich Desmond, District Attorney representative Thien Ho and business strategist John Kabateck. Supervisor Desmond said he considered the Carmichael organization most effective of all Sacramento County PBIDs.

"Nothing has turned the (Fair Oaks Boulevard) corridor around like the creation of this PBID," he approved. "We've seen dramatic improvements. Celebrating this event is an honor for me."

activity space. Some of the eclectic furnishings were donated; Crooks and Ramirez sourced other pieces in consignment stores. No one complains about sharing bedrooms. "Residents enjoy the companionship; some have formed strong friendships," explains Matthew Crooks. "Sharing a warm room is a palatial alternative to a tarp in the streets."

A live-in manager oversees boarder welfare; special needs are met by health visitors. A third project partner, social worker Eliza Stonsby, provides resident case-management and helps with doctor appointments. "Applying for benefits, locating a driving license – even contacting family – some tasks can overwhelm our guests," says Ramirez. "We help them through this."

"We provide a clean slate for residents to have a fresh start in life. Birthday parties are celebrated, and we give everyone a nice Christmas. Some say they don't remember the last time they enjoyed a family setting for the holiday. At Vassar Farm, they've become their own family. And they rally to help each other."

Tucked behind high hedges on a busy street, the facility has raised no neighbor issues. "The place is well-managed; supervised 24 hours a day," explains Crooks. "We find plenty to keep residents busy. Lots of books and crafts. Growing vegetables is another option. Every room has a TV-these hardly get turned off."

Crooks is semi-retired; Ramirez works for non-profit California Council on Science and Technology and dovetails honorary mayoral duties for the Carmichael Chamber of Commerce. As a commercial enterprise, Vassar Farm has yet to turn a profit.

Says partner Crooks: "Our goal is to cover costs without comprising quality of life for our residents. We might never make money. Some things are more important. Sal and I want to be humanitarians first. We're supporting the most vulnerable members of our community. It's a scary reality that these could be anyone in our family, including ourselves."



Fire Prevention Efforts Underway

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Fire season seems to start earlier and earlier, and the Sacramento County Department of Regional Parks has already initiated its multi-pronged plan to reduce fire risk, defend wildlife habitats and protect our natural resources and the neighborhoods adjacent to the parks.

For its 2022 Fire Fuel Reduction Action Plan, the Department of Regional Parks has lined up sheep and goat grazing contracts, is utilizing maintenance crews to maintain fire breaks, and is issuing fuel break maintenance permits to properties bordering Park properties.

"Thanks to the additional funding we were allocated in the last round of budget hearings, we were able to increase and get a head start on – our fire fuel reduction efforts this year," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "Our maintenance crews have already begun targeted herbicide treatments and removing fire fuels in the areas they can reach, and the goat and sheep grazing will begin shortly for the areas our manned crews can't reach."

To decrease the number and size potential of wildfires in our parks system, the techniques used will be applicable for each area and will include:

• Firebreaks - A combination of mowing, soil discing and targeted herbicides will be used where appropriate

to create perimeters around open fields, along fence lines and behind neighborhoods. This work is scheduled to be completed by end of June.

- Ladder Fuel Hand-Crews In limited, hard-to-reach areas, hand-crews will remove vegetation that allows the potential for a fire to climb up or move into urban areas.
- Grazing There are hundreds of acres of undeveloped or protected land in our Regional Parks. Goats and sheep are ideal for vegetation management and

are great at eating down weeds, bushes and grass that manned crews cannot get to. Grazing is expected to occur between April and the end of June.

Annual Encroachment Permits - Residents who live adjacent to Regional Parks' properties are able to apply for free annual encroachment permits to maintain a fire break behind their property line. These allow residents to string-trim grass and weeds for up to 50 feet beyond their private property line. To request a permit, provide your name, address and contact information to Regional Parks at parksinfo@SacCounty.gov.

Additionally, the Ranger Division will continue its increased education and enforcement efforts related to illegal fires and cooking along the parkway in an effort to reduce the number of new fire outbreaks.

Visitors to Sacramento County Regional Parks should be aware of the following regulations:

- Open flame fires are not allowed and barbequing is only permitted in designated picnic areas.
- Smoking is only allowed in developed picnic areas, asphalt surfaces, golf courses and levee tops along the American River Parkway.



2 Sacramento Area Men Indicted for Cocaine Trafficking

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A federal grand jury returned a two-count indictment on March 31 against Jose Manuel Chavez Zepeda, 54, of Carmichael, and Denis Zacarias Ponce Castillo, 37, of Sacramento, charging them with conspiracy to distribute cocaine and distribution of cocaine, U.S. Attorney Phillip A. Talbert announced.

According to court documents, from at least April 22, 2016, until March 2022, Chavez distributed cocaine in kilogram quantities that he obtained from a source of supply in Mexico connected to the Cartel Jalisco Nuevo Generación (CJNG). Ponce worked for Chavez as one of his larger sub-dealers and later as his "stash pad" manager. In June 2021, Chavez and Ponce sold a half kilogram of cocaine to a confidential source in Sacramento.

This case is the product of an investigation by the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, Homeland Security Investigations and the Sacramento Area Intelligence/Narcotics Task Force (SAINT). Assistant U.S. Attorney David Spencer is prosecuting the

If convicted, Chavez and Ponce face a maximum statutory penalty of 40 years in prison and a \$5 million fine. Any sentence, however, would be determined at the

discretion of the court after consideration of any applicable statutory factors and the Federal Sentencing Guidelines, which take into account a number of variables. The charges are only allegations; the defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.

This effort is part of an

Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Forces (OCDETF) operation. OCDETF identifies, disrupts and dismantles the highest-level criminal organizations that threaten the United States using a prosecutor-led, intelligence-driven, multi-agency approach. Do You Have an Uncashed **Sacramento County Check?**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Currently, the County has nearly 6,000 uncashed checks, totaling more than \$2.1 million. How does this happen and could this be your unclaimed money?

If a Sacramento County issued check goes six months without being cashed by the rightful payee, the information becomes available in a PDF document on the Unclaimed County Warrants (checks) webpage. The data is also searchable on the County's Open Data portal.

Think you might have an uncashed check with Sacramento County? Here are quick and easy ways to find out:

From the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage, scroll through the check numbers on the Unclaimed Warrant listing PDF document (use the Find feature [Ctrl+F] to search names or other terms in the PDF).

Go to the Sacramento County Open Data portal. Once on the portal, click the "Finance" icon; click the "County Outstanding Checks" link; then either use the "filter" cone-shaped icon for specific value sorting, or the column headings for alpha/numeric listings to get ascending or descending sorts.

If you find your name or business on the data listing, go to the Unclaimed County Warrants webpage to find out about the documentation and information needed to

validate that you are the rightful payee to receive the funds.

More Unclaimed Monies

The Revenue Recovery Division of the Department of Finance has unclaimed payments that are a result of not having a current address for the recipient. On the Open Data portal, under the Finance category, check out the Revenue Recovery Unclaimed Payments data and search for your name. If you locate a claim due to you, contact Revenue Recovery at (916) 875-7815, and provide the following information:

- Claimant's Name
- Date of Birth
- Address (Current and Previous)
- Phone Number
- Amount of the claim
- DRR Account Number • Court Docket Number
- Date of Order
- Defendant's Name
- Proof of Identity (Driver's License or ID Card)
- Proof of Payment: Copy of check, money order receipt or credit card confirmation
- Information regarding the incident (case information)

Sacramento County makes this data easily available on its websites, Open Data Portal and other measures to ensure the information is accessible and the monies go to the rightful payees.

Defendants Convicted of 13 Total **Counts of Child Sexual Assault**

Sacramento County DA's Office News Release

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - David Belmares was convicted by a jury of nine counts of child sexual assault and his brother, Jared Belmares, was convicted of four counts of child sexual assault.

A family member of the defendants operated a foster care and daycare out of her home. Over a period of years between 2011–2013, the defendants molested children who were in the daycare. At the time of the abuse, the defendants were adults and the children were all under the age of 10 years old. Both defendants had previously molested several young girls

who were in foster care at the home from 2008-2011, but information about the daycare abuse did not come to light until later disclosures by the children.

David Belmares faces a maximum sentence of 68 years to life in prison and Jared Belmares faces a maximum sentence of 40 years in prison. Sentencing is set for June 3, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 33 before the Honorable Laurel White.

Fire Leaves One Dead

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - On Wednesday, April 27, at approximately 8:55 PM, Sacramento Metro Fire crews responded to a residential fire at Rampart Drive where one person died during the incident.

At arrival firefighters immediately began conducting a search and rescue inside the house after being informed that individuals were possibly still inside. In a brief release, Sac Metro Fire Community Relations Coordinator Chris Dargan

informed, "The fire was isolated to the back room which had the deceased occupant... All other occupants of the home were able to evacuate safely."

After the fire was put out, Fire Captain/ Paramedic Parker Wilbourn confirmed the loss: "Our hearts are heavy to report 1 victim was found deceased inside."

The cause of the fire is under investigation. Any questions regarding the deceased individual will need to be directed to the Sacramento County Coroner's Office at 916-874-9320.





That solves nothing, and in most cases it just rein-

IF YOU ARE A CREDITOR or

a contingent creditor of the deceased, you must file your claim with the court and mail a copy to the personal representative appointed by the court within the later of either (1) four months from the date of first issuance of letters to a general personal representative, as defined in section 58(b) of the California Probate Code, or (2) 60 days from the date of mailing or personal delivery to you of a notice under section 9052 of the California Probate Code. Other California statutes and legal authority may affect your rights as a creditor. You may want to consult with an attorney knowledgeable in California law.

YOU MAY EXAMINE the file kept by the court. If you are interested in the estate, you may file with the court a Request for Special Notice (form DE-154) of the filing of an inventory and appraisal of estate assets or of any petition or account as provided in Probate Code section 1250. Ask the DMV - Let the DMV Simplify Your Wedding Season

Did you know that the most popular time for weddings is from May through October? Whether you're headed to the altar, moving into a new home, or heading to a wedding out of state, learn how the DMV can help make wedding season more convenient and less stressful.

- Q: I just got married and want to change my last name. What are the steps to do so? Do I have to visit a DMV office to get my name updated on my ID?
- A: To change your name with the DMV, you'll first have to change your name with the local Social Security Administration (SSA) office. The DMV electronically verifies your name, birth date, and social security number with the SSA. After you've changed your name with the SSA, you'll need to complete a driver's license or identification card application, a process you can start online. Next, you'll need to visit a local DMV office to provide evidence of your name change and pay the application fee. At the time of this transaction, you'll also be required to surrender your current driver's license.

A name change is also an opportunity to apply for a REAL ID instead of a standard driver's license. For more information, visit realid.dmv.ca.gov.

- Q: I'll be moving into a new home after getting married. Do I need to visit a DMV office to change my address?
- A: You can change your residence or mailing address online in the DMV's Change of Address System. However, you cannot use this online service if you: Do not already have a California driver's license or identification card, do not have a social security number, have an army post office or fleet post office address, have an address outside of the US. or, have applied for but not yet received your REAL ID. For those, you must complete a change of address form and mail it to the address listed on the form.
- Q: My best friend is getting married out of state next summer and my passport has expired. Can I use it instead of a passport to fly to the wedding?
- A: Yes! A REAL ID is a federally accepted form of identification and may be used to board domestic flights and to enter secure federal facilities, such as military bases and federal courthouses. One benefit of a REAL ID is that it allows you to carry a single piece of identification that serves a dual purpose, as opposed to having to keep up with both a driver's license and a passport during travel, a time which is often already very busy and hectic. Starting May 2023, a standard driver's license/ID will become federal noncompliant, meaning you will not be allowed to board an airplane or enter secure federal facilities using it.
