**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - The popularity contest that decides Carmichael's top businesses is back in business.

Best of Carmichael awards were last year announced online due to pandemic restrictions on gatherings. 2022 winners will be revealed at a real-time gala on June 18. Certificates, proclamations, applause—and bragging rights—will reward victory.

Community nominations and votes began flowing in last week. Businesses in 30 fields are contenders. Categories include professional services, non-profits, markets, restaurants, fitness centers, churches—and many more entities that make

Carmichael a commercial and residential hub. A new category: "Best Place to Visit" has been added to the 2022 ballot. Parks, a dining mall and a public garden are already among nominations.

While new winners will emerge, repeat victors have prevailed through previous contests. The Bel Air market has consistently won Best Grocery Store. Katie Pexa's Farmers agency has nailed Best Insurance Provider at every poll. Carmichael Presbyterian supporters have rallied since 2018 to make their church Best Place of Worship.

The contest has garnered increasing excitement since the Carmichael Times and Carmichael Chamber of Commerce joined forces to originate

the event. Nominee merchants must be located in Carmichael or be Chamber members, but anyone—from anywhere in the world—can vote for any category. The celebration dinner is a festive tradition that usually sells out.

Raffles and auctions will add to the celebration dinner's competitive atmosphere. Glamorous merchandise and experiences will be up for grabs. Following a cocktail hour and catered buffet, dessert auctions will tempt bidders with bespoke gateaux, cupcakes and pies. Ticket price is \$55 per person.

## \$34.7 Million Awarded for Local Transportation Projects

**Caltrans News Release**

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Caltrans announced it is awarding \$34.7 million in state and federal funds to cities, counties, tribes and transit agencies throughout California – including \$25 million funded by Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 – to plan sustainable transportation projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions, improve the state highway system, enhance access to safe walkways and bike paths, and increase natural disaster preparedness.

"These grants are funding the planning for sustainable and more resilient transportation projects that will prepare the state for rising sea levels, wildfires and other climate related impacts," said Caltrans Interim Director Steven Keck. "By collaborating with local communities, we are working together to achieve both our climate goals and an equitable transportation infrastructure for people who rely on transit and intercity bus service."

In total, Caltrans will allocate:

\$18.4 million in Sustainable Communities Competitive and Technical Grants to 57 local, regional, tribal and transit agencies for climate change adaptation, transportation and land use planning, and natural disaster preparedness. This includes more than \$4.5 million to fund planning for 14 projects that improve safety and access for people who walk and bike; \$3.8 million in federally funded Strategic Partnership Grants to 10 projects that will plan for zero-emission medium- and heavy-duty vehicles, sustainable goods movement, wildlife connectivity, intercity bus systems and other sustainability initiatives;

\$12.5 million – all from SB 1 – in Sustainable Communities Formula Grants to metropolitan planning organizations to further regional transportation plans and sustainable community strategies. This grant will be awarded later this spring.

Caltrans awards transportation planning grants each year through a competitive process to encourage local and regional projects. Applications are evaluated on how they further state transportation goals by identifying and addressing statewide, interregional, or regional transportation deficiencies on the highway system.

SB 1 provides \$5 billion

# First Responders Training Facility Requires More Investment

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The approaching summer in California means to government officials and first responders that a potential season of large fires and large-scale disasters lies just ahead. Which is why Assemblymember Ken Cooley and Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District announced at a press conference on Friday, April 15, a request for funding for the expansion of the Zinfandel First Responder Training Facility on 3801 Zinfandel Drive in Rancho Cordova, CA.

Approval would authorize that building at the existing training facility could commence Phase 3 of the development of the 53-acre site, purchased by Sac Metro Fire in 2008—approximately 2.7 miles from their headquarters.

Earlier in the year, on March 30, 2022, Cooley submitted a one-time state funding request for \$44 million to begin construction at the Zinfandel First Responder Training Facility in order to

make it a “central hub” and help increase the resiliency of trainees. Cooley said the proposal, which is expected to be voted on in June of this year, has “strong bi-partisan support... [including] the Governor who encounters large-scale disasters in his watch.”

Assemblymember Cooley wrote in a letter submitted to the Assembly Budget Subcommittee, “The unprecedented demands

currently placed on emergency responders, combined with the lack of adequate training facilities, are increasing the risks faced by local first responders.”

“This facility will facilitate joint training in firefighting, urban search and rescue, and mutual aid coordination, including enhanced skills in interoperability of fire equipment, by Northern California fire

agency personnel,” added the office of the assemblymember.

According to Sac Metro Fire Chief Todd Harms, the property signaled for the increased development, located adjacent to Mather Airport in Sacramento County, is strategically placed at a good junction near the intersections of Highways 50, 99 and Interstates 5 and 80 and “is a perfect location for resources to be

staged for anything on the northern side of California.”

Assemblymember Cooley wrote in his letter, “The training facility would be available to public safety agencies in the Sacramento region and throughout Northern California... The size and scale of the facility, after the completion of Phase 3, will accommodate large scale multi-agency and multidisciplinary coordinated training, which is not possible with existing facilities in the region.”

Specifically, the funding would go to commence construction by adding: A) 40,000-50,000 square foot multi-purpose Administration/ Classroom/Staging Building; B) 1,000 square foot Outdoor Classroom/Storage/Restroom/ Decontamination Structure; C) 4-acre Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC); D) Multi-Story Training Tower.

# DC Sweeps Rio, Eyes League Title

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Del Campo varsity baseball team finished off a three-game sweep of the Rio Americano Raiders on Friday afternoon, April 22, as the Cougars now set their sights on a Capital Athletic League title.

DC (17-4, 7-2 Capital Athletic) and Rio (12-11, 7-5) came into the series that began Monday, April 18, each in contention for the league title with two losses in Capital Athletic play. However, with an impressive three-game sweep that included outscoring the Raiders 31-11, the Cougars are now in a two-team race for the Capital Athletic League with the Vista Del Lago Eagles (16-5, 6-3).

The Cougars and Eagles met head-to-head earlier in the season for a three-game series and Vista Del Lago took the first two before DC salvaged the last game. Each game's outcome was decided by one run. That series may factor in at the conclusion of the season if tiebreakers are needed.

"From that series we took that you got to play every pitch as hard as you can because we really were two pitches away from sweeping that series and we lost two out of three," DC coach Kevin Dawidczik said. "So just knowing that we got to take care of the baseball is a really important part of our philosophy."

Rio hosted the first game of the series against DC on Monday afternoon at Jerry Kaeser Field. The Cougars got the scoring started early, plating one run in the top of the first inning. The Raiders responded well in the bottom half of the inning, scoring three runs to take the lead.

However, the conclusion of the first inning was the best Rio players and their fans would feel for the rest of the game, as DC scored nine unanswered runs and went on to win 10-3. The Cougars scored one in the second, two in the third, five in the fourth and one in the seventh inning.

DC senior outfielder Jordan Jacobson had a great day at the plate Monday, reaching base in all four of his plate appearances. Jacobson had three hits (including one double), two RBI, one walk and one stolen base.

The Cougars were led to the win on the mound by senior pitchers Hayden Hughes and Thomas Martinez who earned the win and save, respectively. Hughes pitched five innings, allowing eight hits, three earned

runs and one walk with eight strikeouts. Martinez tossed two innings as he allowed two hits and punched out two. Junior pitcher Chase Christenson suffered the loss for the Raiders after pitching three and a third innings, giving up eight hits, nine runs (eight earned) and two walks with two strikeouts.

The second game of the series Wednesday, April 20, was played at DC. The Cougars scored first again, plating three runs in the bottom of the second inning. Rio immediately countered once more, scoring four runs in the top of the third inning to take a one-run lead. Unfortunately for the Raiders, history repeated itself, as DC scored twice in the fourth and once in the fifth to retake the lead at 6-4 which ultimately was the final score.

Martinez followed up his save on the mound Monday with a strong performance using the lumber Wednesday, earning a hit in all three of his at-bats with two runs scored and one stolen base. Junior pitcher Matt Moses earned the win for the Cougars after tossing a complete game going seven innings, allowing six hits, four runs (one earned) and two walks with seven strikeouts.

"For me, I threw my change-up really well against them and was able to keep them off balance," Moses said. "It got a little out of hand in the third inning but other than that we played really good defense. For our staff, we really just attacked their hitters. They have good bats, but we have good defense and defense wins championships."

Rio junior pitcher Brady Wilson pitched four and two-thirds, giving up eight hits,

six runs (five earned) and two walks while striking out five.

The third and final game of the series Friday took place back at Jerry Kaeser Field. DC jumped out to the early lead for the third consecutive game scoring twice in the top of the first inning and once in the top of the second to take a 3-0 lead after two frames. Moses got the game started with a leadoff single followed up by a stolen base to get to second and an error by the Raiders to advance to third base. Moses scored the game's first run thanks to a sacrifice RBI ground out from junior infielder Anthony Martinez.

The Cougars scored their second run of the first on a solo home run to right field by Jacobson. DC hit another bomb in the second inning, this time a solo blast by senior catcher Logan McCord. Rio responded in the bottom of the third inning, scoring three times to even the score.

Senior designated hitter Ryan Christiansen scored two runs with one swing of the bat for the Raiders, launching a two-run homer in the third. Christiansen is committed to play collegiately at Sacramento State next year for his dad, Reggie.

In the top of the fourth inning, the Cougars all but put the game away, scoring five runs to take a commanding lead. DC scored the first run of the inning on a double from junior infielder Robbie Perry to retake the lead. Then, Moses stepped up to the plate and crushed a two-run homer, bouncing off the top of the green storage bin in left field,

silencing the home crowd and drawing cheers from the Cougar faithful who made the short 15-minute drive.

DC added on three more runs in the fifth and four in the sixth. Rio scored once in the bottom of the fifth, but it was all for naught. The game ended after six innings due to the 10-run mercy rule and the Cougars won 15-4, completing the three-game sweep to sit atop the Capital Athletic League.

"Our guys play with a lot of poise and control, we work on it religiously and we had a good approach," Dawidczik said. "We knew a lot about their team, pitching staff and what they were going to throw at us. Their sequences seemed to be kind of similar and we just had a really good plan to execute and never panicked."

"I think this group is really senior heavy and (with) guys who have been there before and guys who are poised to play hard no matter what the score is. So, answering back has kind of been our motto."

Moses shined once again for DC, reaching base in four out of five plate appearances. The junior center fielder had three hits, three runs scored, two RBI, two stolen bases and one walk. Two of his three hits went for extra bases as Moses had one double and one home run in the blowout victory.

"I was seeing the fastball really well," Moses said. "It had gotten to the point where they just never threw me the fastball, so I was able to sit on off-speed (pitches) and see it well and drive it."

Christiansen went 2-for-3 with two hits, two runs scored and two RBI for the Raiders. The 6-foot-2 senior also had one double and one homer.

Junior pitcher Austin Wilhelm got the start on the bump for the Cougars as he pitched three innings allowing three hits, three earned runs and one walk with two strikeouts. Junior pitcher Evan Johnson earned the win for DC after pitching two innings and giving up two hits and one earned run. Junior pitcher Caden Beloian took the loss for Rio as he pitched three and a third innings allowing seven hits, six earned runs and one walk with one K.

The Cougars played a three-game series against El Camino this week. The Raiders played a three-game set against Sacramento with a single game against Kennedy in between games two and three. 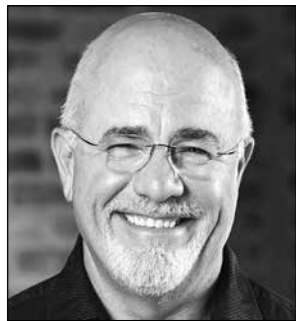

### You Can Have More Than 1

Dear Dave,  
A relative of mine recently mentioned she had two life insurance policies. Is it okay for a person to have more than one life insurance policy? If so, why would someone do that?

– Victoria  
Dear Victoria,  
There aren't any rules against having more than one life insurance policy. The only real problem is it might complicate your life a little in terms of having multiple premium withdrawals, checks or possibly additional policy fees to worry about

every month. It's cheaper just to have just one policy, generally speaking, but regardless of whether you have one or more, I always recommend having 10 to 12 times your annual income wrapped up in a good, level term life insurance policy.

Different people have different personal and business financial situations, so there could be many reasons to have more than one life insurance policy. I have lots of insurance connected to our estate plan, our business and different kinds of things. Most life insurance companies will only write so much in coverage for one person, so when this has been the case, I just went to another carrier for additional coverage.

Also, some people buy more than one life insurance policy just to feel secure from a provider standpoint. If one insurance company

goes out of business, they'll still have another policy – or more – in place. That's not usually a big problem, though, since the majority of insurance companies have insurance to back them up with the state, or are very financially stable.

I hope this helps, Victoria!

## RICHARD E. FENKNER • 1/3/1940 – 2/6/2022

On February 6, 2022, Richard E. Fenkner, aka Rich, Dick, and "Eagle", passed away in his Sacramento home with his family by his side as was his wish. He was 82 years old.

This one-of-a-kind, limited edition, Richard E. Fenkner was born on January 3, 1940 in Seattle, Washington to William and Eleanor Fenkner. Richard was the middle child. He is survived by his older brothers, Bill and Al, as well as his younger brother, Donald and sister, Kathleen. Richard treasured his siblings and remained connected with them throughout his life. Phone calls and conversations would often begin with something mundane like the weather, but would eventually settle in with one arm draped over the head in a relaxed pose somehow natural to all Fenknors.

Rich Fenkner graduated from Seattle's O'Dea High School in 1958. His early escapades with elementary school friends made for a lifetime of stories. Like in 1958 when Rich and Al Chapman were walking down to the Army recruitment office in Seattle to enlist. They bumped into Kenny Schmidt on the way who innocently asked "Could I come, too?" That day the US Army got not two, but three new recruits. Rich served much of his time as a Private near Anchorage, Alaska on a confidential mission, the details of which he kept to his grave. On Sept 8, 1961 he completed his Army service.

Rich went on a blind date with Barbara J. Duffy in October 1962 and by June 15, 1963 they were married in Seattle. Over their 21 years of marriage, Barbara and Rich raised three children, Anne, Jim, and Elizabeth.

Dick joined the Seattle Post Office in 1963 on the very bottom rung: unloading mailbags on the night shift. From there he earned his associate's degree in management from Green River College. In 1979 he was invited to serve as Postmaster of Carmichael, CA, a position he relished and proudly held until his retirement in 1996.

No full life is bereft of trials or tribulations. In 1984, he and his first wife, Barbara divorced.

Then on the evening of November 7, 1988 his life was magically transformed. A bubbly blonde from the postal marketing department invited Richard E. Fenkner to a play. Dick and Mary crisscrossed America making new friends and swapping stories wherever they went. Rare was a Presidential library, State Capitol grounds, national park or historic site they didn't visit.

By 2004, Dick and Mary returned to Sacramento for good. Grandchildren had begun to arrive and Dick and Mary found a home in which to welcome and adore them with unconditional grandparent love. From Dick's family came Anastasia, Natalie, Sophia, Victoria, and Sam. From Mary's family: Logan, Dylan, Zoey, Maxwell, Mathew and Walt. Dick also enjoyed time with his stepsons: Kevin, Allan, Patrick, Chris and their families as well as Mary's sisters, Barbie and Nano.

In retirement Dick occupied himself with reading, gardening, and making the acquaintance of others. In 2021, he was diagnosed with Lewy body dementia.

Richard Fenkner prided himself on knowing the names, birthdays and "significant others" of everyone who worked for him. He was quick with wit and good humor, and ever the gentleman and patriot. 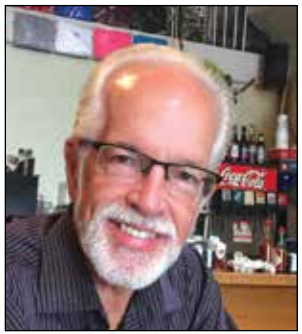








# Transportation Tax Initiative

If you saw my last column ... "More Tax Please," you are aware of the recent court opinions which are now allowing politicians to take dusty, previously failed tax proposals and repackage them as new "citizen initiatives." And, by doing so, local government is bypassing the constitutional requirement for a two-thirds voter approval, and letting a "citizen initiative" for a new tax pass by only a simple majority vote requirement. SO MUCH EASIER TO PASS NEW TAXES!!

And also with this new method, local governments do not even have to bother with those pesky things like public hearings, keeping the public informed, and having reasonable public debate!! That darn public, don't they know the political elites know what is best for them? (sarcasm)

As I said before, now any special interest group with enough cash can push taxes that benefit themselves. If I can convince the bare majority to tax others for some "feel good" topic, then I'm the winner and feel no pain. I can tax business or the perceived wealthy for whatever issue has the emotional attention of the majority. All I have to do is pay enough signature gatherers!

And, so it is with a half

percent, 40 year, transportation sales tax hike for Sacramento County. First proposed in 2016 and voted down; then resurfaced in 2020 to be pulled off the ballot at the last moment when the Sacramento Transportation Authority realized it would again miss the two-thirds threshold for passage.

Their consultant said the tax increase would not pass if there was any organized opposition to it. At that time, the Sacramento Taxpayers Association (SacTax) led the community wide coalition to oppose that proposal. The coalition consisted of business, agriculture, social groups and others - including the NAACP and the National Action Network; and the reasons to oppose the tax hike have not changed too much in the past two years.

First, it is still a bad time to propose a new tax. Although the pandemic appears to be subsiding, the county's economy is still weak. One third of SMUD customers are either behind or have stopped paying their bills altogether. And small family businesses are still closing their doors. Inflation is raging. The cost of food and fuel is way up! This proposal has been kicking around for years, but county leaders seemingly cannot read the room that homeowners, renters and businesses are struggling.

Second, while we likely need roadway improvements because of age and deterioration, local governments, and especially Sacramento, have a history of neglecting infrastructure and instead fund fancy new projects or programs until roads, sidewalks and other infrastructure start to

fall into disrepair. It is only then they run to taxpayers for more money. We believe that historic neglect and lack of prioritization shouldn't be rewarded.

Third, this is a highly regressive tax falling disproportionately on the shoulders of the working poor and the middle class, hence the historic opposition by the NAACP and NAN.

As a concluding comment, the proponents of this half-percent tax increase are well aware of the broad spectrum of community concern and opposition of over the past years ago. Yet, as President of the Sacramento Taxpayers Association, nobody has reached out to us to even discuss digging up this sad proposal from the grave. That just gives the impression that the powers at hand simply scoff at the community at large, and simply want to take the easier path for themselves by holding out their hand for more money from us with the hope that they can beguile the public most of the time.

# World's Most Extreme Pro-Abortion Bill Signed as World Recoils

Those are the names given to five children allegedly killed by an abortionist near or at term - whose remains were recently recovered in the Washington, DC, area by pro-life activists. The five were among 115 babies' bodies allegedly discarded by an abortion clinic and scheduled to be incinerated at a Maryland power plant.

The extremely graphic, gruesome, and deeply disturbing images of those five children have now been made public.

The Progressive Anti-Abortion Uprising organization, whose members turned the remains over to authorities, said in a press release, "Their late gestational ages as well as their apparent sustained injuries potentially show violations of the Partial Birth Abortion Act as well as the Born Alive Infants Protection Act which are federal crimes."

Pro-life activists and members of Congress are calling for full investigations. In contrast, Democrat lawmakers in states across America are working to rapidly pass laws granting immunity for the slaughter of babies in the womb up to birth, and in some cases after birth up to 28 days!

Democrats are feeling the pressure to enshrine radical abortion rights now out of fear that the U.S. Supreme Court decision in the pending case of Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization will reverse its infamous 1973 pro-abortion decision of Roe v. Wade. Since Roe, abortion has taken the lives of at

least 63 million children in America and has been the number one cause of death worldwide for many years.

In Colorado, only three days after news broke about the 115 aborted baby corpses in Washington, progressive Democrat Gov. Jared Polis brazenly signed into law North America's most extreme pro-abortion law, all the while celebrating the new law's grant of absolute unrestricted freedom to kill innocent babies.

Among the disturbing provisions of new Colorado law (deceptively called the "Reproductive Health Equity Act"):

Unborn babies are explicitly stripped of any rights under state law.

All babies can be aborted at any time up to birth with no civil or criminal legal consequences for anyone.

Minors are empowered to obtain unlimited abortions with no parental notification.

While a number of Republican-led states have passed laws protecting the unborn in anticipation of Roe's reversal, Democrat led states are following Colorado's lead. California and Maryland are even considering measures allowing babies to be killed after birth - outright legalizing infanticide. It's a strategy to create abortion 'sanctuary' states ahead of the possible overturn of Roe.

Children are a gift from God (Psalm 127: 3), and shedding innocent blood is an abomination to Him (Prov. 6:16-19).

In the Bible, Israel was forbidden from worshipping the false god Molech (Lev. 18:21), a practice which involved child sacrifice.

Biblical scholars believe Molech's priests would place live infants into the outstretched arms of the idol, which had been superheated by fire, cooking the child to death. The sacrifice was committed to earn prosperity from the false god.

How different are Colorado and other Democrat-controlled states these days from the cult of Molech? In just 50 years, activists have gone from claiming a "right" of abortion (not found in the U.S. Constitution), to demanding taxpayer funding and enthusiastically supporting the death of babies up to and well after birth.

Is the outright butchery exposed in images of aborted children in Washington any different than the detestable ritual of child sacrifice to Molech? Consider recent reports of women happily taking abortion pills on the Supreme Court steps while taunting pro-life activists - all for the attention of the adoring left-wing media.

The overturn of Roe is far from certain. But even if it is ultimately retracted by the High Court, states under Democrat control (like Colorado) will still be abortion havens. Americans who value the sanctity of life and want unborn babies protected must continue to stand for truth, insist that lawmakers protect life, work for the election of genuinely pro-life candidates, and resist all attempts to legalize the barbaric practice of child sacrifice.

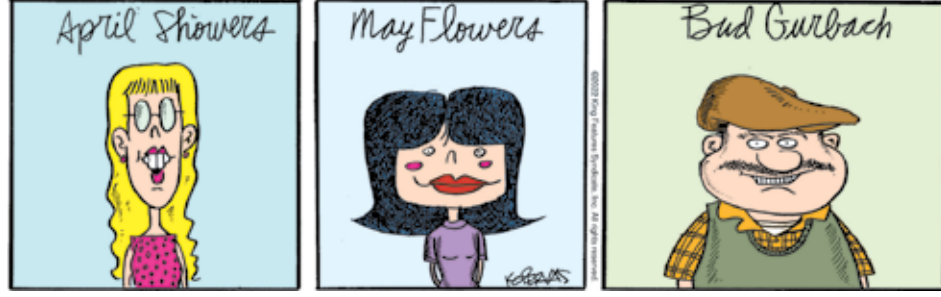

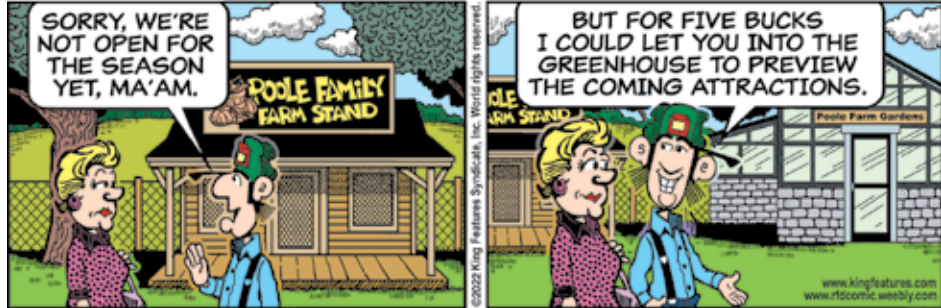
