CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Pancakes are in. Pandemonium is out. After more than 40 years of frenzied egg hunts, Carmichael Recreation and Park District last weekend replaced roughand-tumble with a gentler option.

Nearly 300 adults and children sat down to Breakfast with the Bunny in Carmichael Park Clubhouse. The Easter celebration followed two years of pandemic hiatus for CRPD Easter

Admission cost of \$5 per person included a calorific breakfast and treat bags. Carmichael Kiwanis Club members cooked and served food. County Supervisor Rich Desmond flipped pancakes and stood in line for his bunny encounter. Children's crafts were offered in the rose-bordered parking lot.

Did participants miss the old egg scramble? Evidently not.

Noted a hunt veteran: "Weeks of work went into preparing for that chaos. On the day, a siren blared and it was all over in half a minute. Most children were well behaved; some parents charged barriers and pushed tots aside to grab eggs for their own kids. Timid little ones were terrified. Many kids got nothing. There were always tears afterwards. Here today, grandparents, parents and kids are having a relaxed time. No one's crying."

Indeed, laughter colored the event like flowers daubed on cheeks by attendant face-painters. The breakfast was so popular that three sittings sold out before Easter weekend. Walk-ins were also accommodated. Nearly a thousand pancakes were served; gallons of coffee and orange juice were chugged.

CRPD staff and volunteers seemed pleased with the reinvented tableau. District administrator Mike Blondino indicated CRPD's new celebration was here to stay. "We wanted to move to a non-competitive, multi-generational experience," he explained. "This event was a real community partnership. I saw a lot of happy people."

Bunny Breakfast proceeds will benefit the Kiwanis Family House. The Sacramento facility provides accommodation for families of UC Davis Children's Hospital patients.★

Grand Jury Finds Board of Supervisors **Ignored Health** Officer During **Covid Crisis**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - An extensive investigation into the handling of the COVID-19 crisis by the Sacramento County Office of Public Health (OPH) has led the Grand Jury to find that the County Board of Supervisors ignored its Public Health Officer for five months before finally engaging in any sort of dialogue regarding the County's COVID-19 activities and its impact on County residents.

The Grand Jury's report states that when the pandemic hit Sacramento County, the OPH responded immediately. However, despite asking for assistance early on, Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye was allowed to appear before the County Supervisors only after Board members received a confidential email from Dr. Kasirye. That communication detailed the range of the OPH pandemic response efforts and the enormous burden being borne by staff and volunteers committed to protect the community.

The exemplary level of service and commitment exhibited by Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff and volunteers made the critical difference in the County's rapid and effective COVID-19 response, the Grand Jury investigation found. In stark contrast, the Board's apathy during the most significant public health emergency in over a century, one that impacted every resident of Sacramento County, delayed needed OPH program funding and undercut public health order enforcement. Under such emergency circumstances, OPH response efforts and funding instead should have been the Board's first priority.

In the face of an overwhelming public health emergency, Dr. Kasirye and OPH staff were well prepared to carry out COVID-19 pandemic response activities, according to the Grand Jury's findings. OPH utilized its dedicated staff, along with a volunteer corps of professionals, issuing and enforcing COVID-19 public health orders in coordination with its state and federal counterparts. However, OPH enforcement efforts aimed at protection were stymied by lack of cooperation from Continued on page 12

Next Hornets Coach Introduced

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Journeyman coach David Patrick was introduced as the new Sacramento State men's basketball coach on Tuesday afternoon, April 15, at the Hornet Athletic Center.

Patrick is the 15th head coach in program history. He most recently served as the associate head coach for the men's basketball team at the University of Oklahoma last season.

"It's a dream come true for me," Patrick said Tuesday at his introductory press conference. "(My family and I) have always wanted to come back to California in the right situation. I was in a good spot at Oklahoma (and) had no reason to leave unless it was for a great opportunity. When you see Sac State after being in NorCal for a long time, I just thought it was somewhere that was untouched, somewhere that could really blossom."

Patrick takes over for interim coach Brandon Laird, who stepped in for Brian Katz after he retired days before last season began following 13 seasons due to a health issue. The Hornets won five of their last seven games to end the season and had 11 total wins, the most wins for any first-year Sac State head coach in the Division I era. Laird spent 11 years with the Hornets program.

According to a report from The State Hornet, the student news organization at Sac State, Laird and Katz were unhappy with the mishandling of the coaching staff's departure by the Sac State Athletics Department.

Sac State Athletic Director Mark Orr has known Patrick for years, dating back to their days together at Saint Mary's College. Patrick served as an associate head coach for the men's basketball team from 2006-2010 while Orr was Director of Athletics and Recreation.

"The previous staff left great character here, that's where it starts at," Patrick said. "The talent is one thing but high character kids is what you want to be around. I can get the players, that's not the hard part. It's the character, it's guys that wanna win and guys that wanna win at a high level. And we'll do that here, I promise you that.

"We're going to recruit from the inside out. We'll recruit here locally and then build out from nationally and internationally."

It didn't take long for Patrick to get started

recruiting from the NCAA transfer portal.

On Monday, April 14 he signed 6-foot-9 Australian forward Hunter Marks, a three-year starter who is transferring from Hartford. Several college basketball reporters were surprised Marks signed with the Hornets rather than a high-major school, indicating that the new Sac State coach got a steal of a prospect. Four days later Patrick reunited with Callum McRae, a 7-foot-1 Kiwi center who is transferring from UC Riverside.

Patrick brings many years of college coaching experience at several different stops with him to Sacramento. Since 2006 when Patrick retired from his playing career overseas, he has been an assistant coach at six collegiate programs.

In 2018, he got his first head coaching job at UC Riverside, where he spent two seasons. Patrick made an impact in his short stint with the Highlanders, as he currently holds the best two-year start in school history with a 27-38 (.415) record. In his second season at UCR, he led the team to a 17-15 record, which is the most wins in the program's Division I era.

"This isn't a steppingstone job for me," Patrick said. "I've got two girls that are (in) tenth grade and sixth grade, we're not trying to jump spots. If you look at my resume, I've kind of moved a little bit the last year or two but that's not what we're about. We're about staying somewhere and staying here to make it last."

With his experience, Patrick has brought in some great players over the years. He has recruited 19 players who have gone on to play professionally with 11 of them playing in the NBA. Seven of those players were selected in the NBA Draft and four were first round picks.

In 2016 while Patrick was at LSU, his godson Ben Simmons was selected with the first overall pick in the draft by the Philadelphia 76ers. Simmons has gone on to become the 2018 Rookie of the Year, a three-time All-Star and has been selected to the All-Defensive First Team twice during four seasons in the league.

"I am so excited for coach Patrick to take on the role as head coach at Sacramento State," Simmons said in a Sac State news release. "He is one of the most underrated coaches and recruiters in the country. When I went through the recruiting process, there was never a doubt that I wanted to be coached by him. He is more than a coach,

he is family. He cares deeply about his players, not only as it relates to basketball, but also life."

Other current NBA players that Patrick has coached include Desmond Bane of the Memphis Grizzlies, Moses Moody of the Golden State Warriors and Patty Mills of the Brooklyn Nets. The 46-year-old Patrick has coached on five NCAA Tournament teams, four NIT teams and was an assistant coach on the Australian men's national basketball team that won bronze at the 2020 Summer Olympics.

"I think if you win in the classroom, you win on the floor," Patrick said. "This degree will help you longer in life because the ball is going to stop bouncing at some point. And this is a lifelong deal with me. I want to be at their weddings, when they have children, this is about a life term relationship, not just the four years that I'm going to be with these student-athletes."

Patrick said that he is going to rely on his older players and prioritize playing defense and rebounding.

"Everybody wants to shoot and play offense," Patrick said. "But they'll tell you the first day of practice every morning we're starting with bricks and getting after it. I promise you we'll be one of the best defensive and rebounding teams not only in the Big Sky (Conference) but in the country, I guarantee that."

The new Sac State men's basketball coach addressed the size of the Nest at his introductory press conference. The 1,012 seat multi-purpose gymnasium that the Hornets play in is one the oldest and smallest venues in all of NCAA Division I college basketball.

"The gym doesn't matter, it's the people," Patrick said. "If you're going somewhere for just the gym, you ain't going for the right reasons. (If we) get a real trust and relationship with these student-athletes, it doesn't matter where they play at."

Patrick will now attempt to do something that no Sac State basketball team, men's or women's, has ever done: Win a Big Sky Conference Championship and advance to the NCAA Tournament.

"People say, 'Why Sac State? Why would you take (the) Sac State (head coaching position)? You're at a Power Five job.' But I see this place being somewhere you can compete for Big Sky Championships yearly," Patrick said. "I promise you we'll win a lot of games here over at Sac State."

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The Knights of Columbus Fair Oaks Council recently donated a 4D Voluson S8 ultrasound machine worth \$47,000 to local nonprofit Sacramento Life Center, which provides free medical services and resources to low-income pregnant women and teens. The local Knights of Columbus group secured the machine, thanks in part to the nonprofit 4US-Adopt-A-Center that provided a quarter of the funding

needed. "We are so very thankful to the Knights of Columbus and 4US-Adopt-A-Center for this amazing piece of technology that we never could have afforded without them," said Marie Leatherby, executive director, Sacramento Life Center. "Thanks to this machine, our patients will not only have more information about their baby's health, they will be able to see facial features

and a detailed portrait so they can feel even more connected."

Now in its 50th anniversary year, the Sacramento Life Center offers compassion, support, resources and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned or unsupported pregnancy. The Sacramento Life Center's licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and mobile clinic that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, pap smears, well woman exams, patient advocacy for men and women, education and resource referrals. Staff also assists patients in signing up for Medi-Cal Presumptive Eligibility for Pregnant Women and provides a wide range of baby supplies through its onsite baby needs closet, including diapers, clothes, formula, wipes and more. The nonprofit also offers a 24-hour hotline and program for women who have

experienced pregnancy

In 2018, the Sacramento Life Center achieved accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, which ensures the group has met nationally recognized standards for the provision of high-quality health care. 

California State Railroad Museum Begins Multi-Phased Front Lobby Renovation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A multi-phased renovation project is now underway in the lobby of the California State Railroad Museum.

Once finished, the renovation efforts will result in a completely refreshed, redesigned, and reinterpreted space to welcome community from near and far. On average, the California State Railroad Museum welcomes nearly 300,000 visitors during a typical year.

The exciting lobby renovation and redesign will allow for a better flow for visitors arriving at and departing from the Museum with easy-to-follow wayfinding signage. As a focal centerpiece to the refreshed lobby, the large interior wall that first greets visitors will feature eye-catching railroading images and compelling video plus provide resource-rich and regularly updated information about new exhibits, related

content, directional information and more. The spacious layout and thoughtful utilization of space will also better accommodate special events and evening gatherings for interested groups and organizations looking for unique venue locations.

Throughout the renovation process, efforts will be made to minimize impacts to the visitor experience. Periodically, the

front desk check-in area, public access points and pathways will need to be adjusted and/ or visitors may be redirected through the main hallway or through the East Theater to arrive at the Transcontinental Railroad Gallery. All elevator and stairs will still be accessible for public use throughout the duration of the renovation process.

While subject to change,

the first phase of the lobby renovation is scheduled for completion by the end of 2022 and the full multi-phase project by the end of 2024.

Bera Named to COMPETES Act Conference Committee

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Representative Ami Bera, M.D (D-CA) released the following statement after being selected to serve on the Conference Committee for the America COMPETES Act.

"I am honored to be appointed by Speaker Pelosi to serve on the Conference Committee for the America COMPETES Act. This legislation presents a once in a generation opportunity to invest in America to ensure that the United States remains a leader on the global stage and that the American worker can compete and succeed in the global economy of the 21st century.

America's greatest assets have long been our innovation, our ingenuity, and the American people. By investing in these once again, we will lay the foundation for our country's success and prosperity for generations to come, while unleashing our potential to outcompete any nation on earth. I am proud to be a part of reinvesting in those assets yet again.

As a senior member of the House Science, Space, and Technology Committee, I look forward to the opportunity to strengthen provisions in this legislation that will ensure the United States remains the undisputed leader in science and technology. As Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific, Central Asia,

and Nonproliferation, I will leverage our active engagement with allies and partners across the Indo-Pacific to ensure this bill invests in American diplomatic, economic, and security partnerships in a way that demonstrates our enduring commitment to the region.

I look forward to working with my fellow conferees to iron out final legislation to send to the President's desk."

The Conference Committee will include members from

both the House and Senate, tasked with resolving the differences between the House-passed America COMPETES Act and the Senate-passed United States Innovation and Competition Act (USICA). The Committee's goal is to produce a final bill that can pass both the House and Senate and be signed by the President.

Representative Bera voted to pass the America COMPETES Act in February 2022. The legislation included several critical provisions authored by Bera. ★

Sacramento County Project Roomkey Houses Hundreds

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Project Roomkey (PRK) was launched in Sacramento County in April 2020 in response to the growing concern of vulnerability to COVID-19 our unhoused population was facing. PRK was introduced as a statewide solution to an emergency situation and the County, City of Sacramento and Sacramento Steps Forward pooled their resources to bring it to fruition.

The program was intended to be shortterm, to allow for the COVID-19 virus to run its course and then ramp down the sheltering efforts as community efforts lessened. As we now know, the program has been running for nearly two years and has served more than 2,000 people - having provided isolation for persons who contracted the virus and private units for people to safely shelter in place. As a result, of these efforts, hundreds of people have exited to stable and safe locations.

Due to the unexpected duration of COVID response, state and federal dollars were made available for use to extend local PRK efforts. With state and federal funding running out, the threat of COVID-19 waning due to increased vaccination rates and lower transmission rates, Sacramento County and its many partners are ramping down the prevention and isolation units and working closely with community providers to transition PRK participants into long-term housing solutions.

The PRK program was never intended as a long-term solution to homelessness and is not a sustainable sheltering model as the program is incredibly expensive – more than \$4000 per person a month and relies on resources that were only available due to the community-wide shutdown. Hotels that offered up their space need to resume their place in tourism, and Goodwill employees reimagined as shelter staff need to return to their chosen field of work.

Project Room Key by the Numbers through January 2022:

Total sheltered: 2,051; Total exited to stable housing: 425; Total exited to temporary housing or emergency housing: 361; Still in PRK motels: 335; Average length of stay: 7.5 months; 88% have been there for more than a month; 63% have been there more than 3 months; 27% have been there over 6 months; 21% have been there over a year.

PRK Program ends at La Quinta

The PRK program at La Quinta closed on March 15 and all participants were provided shelter or housing options; with many having received many options over the course of their stay. While the County has taken the lead on managing operations and funding the shelter components, re-housing involves many public and private partners.

Over the last month, housing efforts have intensified across PRK to ensure connectivity to community-based programs that will carry them well beyond their time at PRK. With the closure of the first site, County staff and partners have ensured all participants had a safe place to transition to. At the February presentation of the ramp-down plan there were 121 participants at La Quinta, of those: 55 participants have moved to the two remaining PRK motels; 53 participants will receive 21-day motel vouchers (which will be extended when housing has been identified and participants have continued to work on next steps with their community-based housing provider); 6 have moved into housing; 2 chose to exit voluntarily; 5 were exited for egregious program rule violations.

Federal Reimbursement Funding Extension

DHA was recently informed that FEMA's non-congregate shelter reimbursement will be extended until June 30, 2022 (formally scheduled to end March 31. 2022), and the CA Department of Social Services has also confirmed that Counties can request additional Emergency Solutions Grant funding for continued PRK efforts. As such, DHA will be reevaluating the closure dates of the final two motel locations in concert with our partners from the City, Sacramento Steps Forward and SHRA, who provide critical re-housing supports for those in PRK, and will determine how best to use the funding options now accessible for this purpose.

Shelters and housing programs

The programs, services and funding offered through the County of Sacramento is dynamic, but below is a partial list of the programs the County funds to help shelter, house and care for our community members experiencing homelessness. The programs are often a collaboration between many County departments, including Human Assistance; Health Services; and Child, Family and Adult Services.

Sheltering (Capacity per night)

"ProjectAttain! exists to help adults who opted out of their education for one reason or another get back on track with achieving their goals. Our efforts to support systems change in education and workforce development will be bolstered exponentially through our collaboration with CivicLab and by working in collaboration with the other partner programs across the country."

More than 810,000 adults across Northern California's 25 counties make up this initiative's territory, possess some college, vocational training, or high school credits, but have not completed their degree, certificate, or diploma. In the six-county Sacramento region alone, more than 400,000 individuals face the same circumstances. The Public Policy Institute of California predicts the state will have a shortfall of at least 1.5 million individuals with bachelor's degrees by 2030. Additional data indicate the shortfall increases to over 3.3 million when factoring in certificates. ProjectAttain! aims to learn CivicLab's state-ofthe art processes to develop processes that will ultimately dissolve this issue in

"This often overlooked and underinvested population deserves the opportunity to finish what they started," said Evan Schmidt, Valley Vision CEO and ProjectAttain!'s Executive Director.

California's north-state.

"ProjectAttain! is here to help those who have paused their education find their way back because we know that employers, economies, and communities benefit when more adults complete their education."

CivicLab's initiative launched in February 2022 with ProjectAttain!'s guiding team, comprised of leaders in workforce and education, attending a two-day Stakeholder Engagement Process Learning Lab at CivicLab's headquarters in Columbus, Indiana. The ProjectAttain! team will return in April 2022 for CivicLab's System Building Lab to improve plans for making lasting change.

"Though many partnerships are deserving of this recognition and support, ProjectAttain! demonstrated they had the relationships, capacity, and capability to make real change," said Dakota Pawlicki, director of Talent Hubs at CivicLab.


ProjectAttain! was selected through a national call for proposals. Each partnership in the cohort includes higher education institutions, nonprofit organizations, public agencies, private-sector partners, and other local stakeholders who work together to improve education and workforce outcomes. To be selected, partnerships were required to submit plans that both improve outcomes for their residents and make lasting changes on higher education and workforce systems during the two-year grant period.

"Ascendium is pleased to help build the systems necessary to ensure more learners from low-income backgrounds earn degrees and credentials."

ProjectAttain! began in 2018 as a bold idea that mobilized area leaders to shed light on working-age adults with some college but no degree. ProjectAttain! has grown into a dynamic nonprofit bringing together organizations, talent, and seed funding to serve as a catalyst for equitable social mobility and economic growth for all working-age adults returning to complete a formal educational credential at the diploma, certificate, or degree level.



Did NATO Push Ukraine into War?

Commentary by Harold Pease, Ph.D.

There are at least two sides to every story, globalists own all six of the major news outlets thus, mostly globalist news is presented in America. When censorship prevails there exists one side.

The Deep State media still refuse to share two important aspects of the Ukrainian / Russian story—Ukraine's connection to the New World Order and NATO's roll in provoking Russia. As to the first, LibertyUnderfire. com formally published, "Putin is Destroying the New World Order in Ukraine." The other presents NATO as the foundational cause of the conflict. Cold War history, foreign to most millennial journalists, cannot be omitted. The facts presented here can easily be verified, not by an non-degreed fact checker employed to discredit any view outside the globalist view, but by a common 20th Century textbook or encyclopedia.

Russia correctly saw the alliance as a threat to its socialists interests. In response she created the Warsaw Pact in 1955 comprised of eight surrounding nations to counter NATO, They too adopted the philosophy an attack on one by the West is an attack on all. Its eight members were: Albania, Bulgaria,

Czechoslovakia, East Germany, Hungary, Poland, Romania, and Russia,. A standoff between the NATO, "freedom" nations, and the Warsaw Pact, socialist nations, lasted for the next 36 years. The Berlin wall collapsed in 1989 and two years later, in 1991, the Soviet Union disintegrated under Russian President Mikhail Gorbachev.

A unified Germany was looking to join one or the other alliance. President George H.W. Bush wanted to ensure Germany joined NATO and made an offer to Russian President Mikhail Gorbachev. That offer "suggested if Germany became a NATO member NATO would stop expanding 'not one inch eastward'—no new members. Today the US says it made no such promise, that no such agreement was ever struck, but hundreds of memos, meeting minutes, and transcripts from U.S. archives indicate otherwise." Germany joined NATO in 1990. Part of that understanding was that both the Warsaw Pact and NATO would dissolve. Russia dissolved the Warsaw Pact ending the Cold War, NATO did not.

That promise was broken and "NATO refused to cease its operations. And to add insult to injury, they kept the door for membership open. Russia saw it as a stab in the back and NATO kept pushing the dagger deeper." Without any effective resistance to NATO expansion it continued to assimilate country after country coming ever eastward toward Russia—absorbing former USSR, or Russian federated countries. In 1999 Poland. Hungary, the Czech Republic joined NATO followed five years later, in 2004, by another wave of seven Central and Eastern European nations: Bulgaria, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Slovakia, and Slovenia. In 2009, "Albania and Croatia joined NATO and the most recent entries are Montenegro and North Macedonia, both situated in Russia's backyard.... As of 2021, NATO officially recognized three more aspiring members, Bosnia/Herzegovina, Georgia and Ukraine" as wanting membership. Since then NATO had been in talks with Sweden. Finland and Serbia for membership ("Two Sides to Every Story: Did NATO push Ukraine into War? Gravitas Plus, by Palki Sharma Upadhyay, March 6, 2022, https://www.youtube.com/

watch?v=TzgPJeYZaOU). Although the West applauded the disintegration of the Soviet Union most Russians instead were traumatized by it. "In an instant they lost 1/3 of their territory, half of their population and most of their military might.... They

felt that an unjust settlement had been imposed on them and it was done in their moment of maximum weakness and vulnerability. So they looked at any state leaving Russia sphere of influence as both a strategic loss and a matter of national humiliation."

NATO started with 12 founding members when there was fear of Russia bringing communism to Western Europe, now it has more than doubled to 30 countries where Russia has posed little threat to retake land outside what it once governed as the USSR. So much of Eastern Europe, once part of the Soviet Union, has now been assimilated into "NATO and this happened despite Russia's protests and warnings.'

In 2007 Vladimir Putin addressed the annual Munich Conference. "NATO has put its frontline forces on our borders. This expansion represents a serious provocation that reduces the level of mutual trust. And we have the right to ask: Against whom is this expansion intended? And what happened to the assurances our Western partners made after the dissolution of the Warsaw Pact?" Said another way, "This NATO "military alliance has technically absorbed the entire security belt of Moscow" (Ibid).

We too ask Bill Clinton, father and son Bush, Barack Obama, and Joe Biden the same thing. The United States had more impact in NATO's enlargement than any other country. You are the ones who financed and built 16 or more bioweapons labs in Ukraine and placed a historical enemy military pact on Russia's very border. Why would Russia not feel threatened when NATO organized 30 nations against it? You're disregard of, and insensitivity to, NATO history is equivalent to poking the once Soviet Bear into rage.

reply, "Great." Your level of enthusiasm is much more important than you might realize. Is enthusiasm a cause or a result? Is a person enthusiastic when and because circumstances are good or do circumstances become good as a result of one's enthusiasm? Too often, people believe enthusiasm is a result. Actually, enthusiasm is much more often a cause.

Good things can and do happen without your influence. But if you are only enthusiastic in response to these chance occurrences, then you are cheating yourself by not harnessing the power of enthusiasm to improve life. Enthusiasm but it will do a lot of good. Enthusiasm generates a force that will impact everything you do.







District Attorneys Announce Settlement with PG&E

North State District Attornevs Press Release

QUINCY, CA (MPG) - On April 11th, 2022, the District Attorneys of Plumas, Lassen, Tehama, Shasta and Butte Counties announced they have reached a settlement with PG&E over that company's responsibility for the 2021 Dixie Fire.

The civil prosecution settlement obligates PG&E to make rapid payments by this summer to those who lost their homes in the Dixie Fire; to continue to make extensive improvements in the safety and reliability of PG&E infrastructure in the North State and the affected counties; to be subject to oversight by the District Attorneys through an independent safety monitor; to pay nearly \$30 million to recompense local charities and organizations involved in mitigating the effects of the fire; and to pay penalties and costs of the investigation to the DA offices (none of which can be recoverable in customer rates).

The consortium of District Attorneys, labeled the "North State DAs" in the settlement, filed a civil rather than criminal complaint in Plumas County Superior Court accusing PG&E of unlawful business practices. After negotiations with PG&E, a stipulated Final Judgment was filed resolving the case. The DAs noted the civil Judgment allowed more flexibility in demanding changes in PG&E's safety practices, and to obtain rapid restitution to those who lost homes and property in the Dixie Fire, while putting the company on essentially a five-year

The North State DAs said the settlement was part of a larger settlement involving the Sonoma County District Attorney's settlement of the 2019 Kincade Fire that also occurred in the Sonoma County Superior Court. The local DAs expressed appreciation for the technical and legal help by the Sonoma County District Attorney Jill Ravitch and her consumer/ environmental protection staff in crafting the Dixie Fire civil complaint.

The DAs stated it was decided to pursue the Dixie Fire as a civil prosecution rather than a criminal prosecution to maximize the return to the fire victims rather than to seek criminal penalties. The DAs noted that the maximum criminal fines possible in the Dixie Fire, where thankfully no one died, was only \$329,417. The civil contributions, penalties and payouts established for PG&E in the settlement judgment will

instead be in the hundreds of millions of

The DAs also expressed appreciation for PG&E's good-faith cooperation in the settlement process noting the company's behavior and safety practices seem to be improving under its new leadership. Additionally, the DAs felt the required five-year independent DA safety monitor will give assurances to the public that PG&E will live up to its promises.

Butte County District Attorney Mike Ramsey noted that although Butte County lost no structures in the Dixie Fire, he was pleased that PG&E suggested and agreed to the "Direct Payments for Community Recovery Framework" portion of the stipulated Judgment, which will allow for rapid payments to "our neighbors to the east" who lost their homes. Ramsey said the North State DAs were concerned that protracted litigation could prolong and delay payments - a situation many Camp Fire victims are still enduring due to the PG&E bankruptcy. "This settlement avoids both a bankruptcy and inordinate delay for the Dixie Fire homeowners and renters – particularly those without insurance."

Ramsey said although he agreed that PG&E has made significant progress in safety efforts, the settlement will accelerate and cement those efforts. (Such as making detailed inspections of transmission towers mandatory every year rather than the pre-Camp Fire practice of approximately every five years.)

Ramsey said he was particularly adamant that PG&E agree to an independent safety monitor that would check on PG&E's safety practices and promises with "experts in the various fields." This independent safety monitor reports directly to the District Attorneys, Ramsey said. The engineering firm selected to be the DA safety monitor already has extensive experience with monitoring PG&E through the federal monitor program recently ended. Ramsey said the selected engineering firm is also working with the CPUC in a separate monitoring program of PG&E. The DA safety monitor contract, paid for by PG&E, is much more extensive than the CPUC program. The DA safety monitor will have actual "boots on the ground" monitoring. Ramsey said, quoting Ronald Reagan, that the required independent safety monitor is important to the DAs promise to their communities to "trust, but verify" PG&E's ongoing commitment to safety.

Help ... Doctor Is Not Accepting Medicare?



Hi Toni:
This week, I went to see my primary care doctor and his office manager informed me that they are no longer accepting Medicare. I recently enrolled

in Medicare and will have to pay upfront the complete bill and be reimbursed by Medicare. His office is a small office, and the paperwork is killing him. Also, he will be retiring soon, so I need to find a new doctor. Can you please tell me what I need to do to submit this doctor visit and get reimbursed? Thank you so much.

~ Susan...Dallas, TX Hello Susan:

In these trying healthcare time, smaller medical providers whether a primary care or a specialist may be opting out of the Medicare system.

They are not accepting Medicare as your doctor is doing and will not bill Medicare for you either. They want you to submit the claim to Medicare and wait to be reimbursed.

Did the doctor charge Medicare rates or charge you their rates and want you to be reimbursed from Medicare what Medicare will pay? That is what it sounds like to me.

I am hearing through the Medicare grapevine from clients that come in the Toni Says® office for a Medicare consultation that a few older primary care and medical providers are retiring. The office paperwork whether it is for Medicare age patients or under 65 medical claims is very overwhelming.




