Volunteers Battle Trash

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Garbage warriors are at war in Central Carmichael. Armed with brooms, bags and grabber tools, a task force sets out weekly to clean public and business areas. “Theoretically, we should not be cleaning outside business properties,” admits activist Becky Starr, “Merchants should do it themselves. But they don’t all keep up with litter on their frontages.”

Led by Starr and fellow volunteer Alison Shepherd, the Carmichael detail rolls up sleeves for 90 minutes each Friday. Civic cleanliness is a shared passion. Starr recalls a Minnesota childhood where littering was taboo. “I became totally irritated by the amount of trash in my Carmichael neighborhood,” says the retired food industry professional. “It seems like many people have lost respect for our planet.”

“At first I went out and picked up by myself. I committed to keeping California Avenue clean. I soon realized I could go out every day

and fill bag after bag. It was hard to make an impact on my own. When I heard about an organization called Sacramento Picks It Up! on Facebook, I realized there were other people out there like me. I started posting pictures of my garbage collections. Group members cheered me; I soon found local people who wanted to join me.”

Befriended by the Carmichael Improvement District, the volunteers get help from a CID maintenance contractor with bag pickups. If volunteers encounter overwhelming accumulations, district professionals roll in heavier artillery. “Cleanliness is a big part of what we impose on the community,” explains CID executive Rebekah Evans. “Clearing trash is a daily grind and there are limits to what we can do in five days a week. We’re grateful heroes bless the district with their volunteerism.”

Much of the worst garbage comes from homeless camps. “It’s a serious problem,” says Starr. “We can only clear encampments that are evacuated, but the mess is disgusting.” Volunteers glove up and use

tongs to bag soiled clothing and food containers. Drug syringes must be sealed in containers. “We provide all our own equipment,” says Starr. “Anyone who volunteers must also be responsible for their own safety.”

In bright safety vests, the volunteers are sometimes mistaken for Sheriff program miscreants. “We laugh about that,” says Starr. “We prefer to be seen as people who benefit the community. The real criminals toss waste out of cars, with no concern for the environment. Beautification is what we’re going for, but I want people to recognize their responsibilities, too. We can all contribute to keeping neighborhoods, creeks and rivers free of human contamination.”

The workers’ toil does not go unnoticed. Supporters include Carmichael Elks, who offer the lodge dumpster for trash bag disposal. Shopkeepers sometimes emerge from stores to thank volunteers. Some motorists shout a drive-by thank you. Pedestrians stop to chat. “Everyone agrees it’s a

CTC Allocates \$589 Million for Transportation Improvements

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Transportation Commission (CTC) allocated \$589 million for projects to repair and improve transportation infrastructure throughout the state. Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017, accounts for \$302 million – more than half of the funding.

“This investment follows our ‘fix-it-first’ commitment to repair California’s aging infrastructure, while at the same time increasing transit and active transportation options,” said Caltrans Director Toks Omishakin. “These projects will make our transportation system safer and more convenient for all users and create thousands of good-paying jobs in the process.”

Among those projects approved was one on State Highway 32 in Chico from Muir Avenue to Highway 99 that will rehabilitate pavement, install signals and lighting, upgrade Transportation Management System (TMS) elements, rehabilitate drainage systems, and upgrade facilities to Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. The project was allocated \$3.51 million.

Caltrans also presented the CTC with the draft 2022 State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) at our meeting. Aimed at preserving the condition of the highway system, the draft 2022 SHOPP accounts for \$17.3 billion in funding over a four-year period and includes projects for safety, restoration, road and bridge preservation, and other highway-related facilities.

The CTC will host a public hearing in February to receive comments on the draft SHOPP. All the comments will be considered in the final version that goes before the CTC for adoption at its March meeting. All 2022 SHOPP projects are available on the Caltrans’ Ten-Year Project Book website, ProjectBook.dot.ca.gov

SB 1 provides \$5 billion in transportation funding annually split between the state and local agencies. Road projects progress through construction phases more quickly based on the availability of SB 1 funds, including projects that are partially funded by SB 1.

Classes offer in-depth exploration of the FBI’s investigative priorities including terrorism, counterintelligence, civil rights, cybercrime, public corruption, and violent crime. The scheduled sessions hosted one evening a week for eight weeks are complemented by an optional day of in-person demonstrations by specialty teams and a firing range experience offering gun safety and an appreciation for the weapons every agent must have demonstrated proficiency with.

If the Chair and Vice Chair are absent or unable to preside, the members present will select a member present to act as temporary Chairperson; **Acts on procedural matters** or questions; **Recognizes a member of the board** desiring to speak on an item; **Is entitled to vote on all matters before the Board**, participate in discussion relating to any

matter, make motions without relinquishing the Chair, and second any motion without relinquishing the Chair; **Sits on other boards/commissions** as a representative of the County of Sacramento and is the point of contact for questions from the public regarding the meetings (i.e., coordination of resolutions/presentations and general questions not specific to a district, etc.).

The Chair and Vice Chair serve annual terms. ★

Blocking A Million Cyber Threats Each Day

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - What if every person in the United States, about 333,000,000 people had tried to hack into Sacramento County government information systems in 2021?

The reality is that the amount would still be shy by roughly 27 million. Last year, there were a whopping 360 million unauthorized attempts to connect to Sacramento County information systems, and each of them was successfully blocked by network filters. At the same time, email filters were successfully blocking 145 million malicious email messages.

In 2021, Sacramento County Successfully Blocked Cyber Threats:
360,000,000 Unauthorized Network Attempts
145,000,000 Malicious Email Message Attempts

Network and email filters are just two of the ways Sacramento County's Department of Technology (DTech) is working vigorously to protect the confidentiality, integrity and accessibility of the County's information systems and the data within them.

Some other ways:

Every day, cybercriminals try to trick Sacramento County employees into clicking malicious links. Thanks to DTech's ongoing Security Awareness training required for the entire workforce, employees are becoming more sophisticated about these persistent "phishing" attempts. In the fourth quarter of 2021, employee

and contractor phishing susceptibility was only 6.6 percent, compared to 17.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2020, and compared to the overall government susceptibility rate of 26 percent.

To prevent cybercriminal takeovers of County accounts, DTech has implemented two-factor authentication, which requires users to verify their sign-in to County systems, webmail, and other external-facing web services.

Whenever a vulnerability is discovered in systems or workstations, DTech takes quick and thorough action to implement a software patch. Today, 99 percent of critical and important security patching is being completed within 30 days.

"The fact is, we are so focused on cybersecurity that most of our 14,000+ Sacramento County employees have no idea of the millions of malicious attacks we are blocking and intercepting on our network and email systems every single day. It is now our reality that all U.S. government agencies, big or small, are a target for cybercriminals from all over the globe. We make every effort to be one step ahead of the millions who try to break in," said, CIO and DTech Director Rami Zakaria.

Each workday, County workforce members go about their tasks knowing that although there is an army of cybercriminals constantly seeking to steal County data or disrupt operations, only a very tiny fraction of these attempts will succeed. DTech's mission is to keep shrinking that tiny fraction. ★

crime how much trash is in our streets," notes Starr. "But some seem incredulous that we remove voluntarily; they think it's the County's responsibility."

"Our philosophy is this: if not me then who? And if not now, then when? We shouldn't wait for local government keep up with this issue. We can make a difference ourselves."

Starr shares credit with ten like-minded men and women and co-leader Alison Shepherd. "Like me, Alison went out on her own to pick up in her Fair Oaks neighborhood," explains Starr. "We met through Facebook and realized we had equal commitment. We make an effective team. Our other volunteers are also fantastically motivated."

The group targets a specific area each Friday. Their 90-minute stint yields dozens of trash-filled bags. If work ends far from a dumpster, a County maintenance truck comes to remove the harvest. Litter is nevertheless a never-ending labor. "It's disheartening to drive by the same place—days after we've cleaned it—and see new trash there," concedes Starr. "But we maintain hope that citizens will one day get back to better habits."

Sacramento Picks It Up! includes about 1300 volunteers and works in conjunction with Sacramento County Regional Parks. Donations are accepted for equipment and expenses. To help, go to Sacramento Picks It Up! on Facebook or email Sacramentopicksitup@gmail.com. ★

Tips For Safe Home Heating This Winter

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - As overnight temperatures drop into the mid and low 30s, families will continue to use furnaces and heaters to stay warm. To make sure you're heating your home safely, review the following simple tips to stay warm this season.

Test your smoke detectors regularly, and make sure you have at least one carbon monoxide detector in your home. Never use propane heaters, barbecues, hibachis – or any heater with an open flame – indoors. They produce carbon monoxide, a clear, odorless gas that can be fatal to humans and animals.

When using electric space heaters, make sure they are completely unobstructed on all sides, and turn them off when leaving the room. Never use an appliance like a kerosene heater, propane gas grill or heater, stove, oven, or dryer to heat your home.

When using a properly ventilated fireplace: Get your chimney inspected and/or cleaned annually by a professional. Use a glass or metal screen in front of your fireplace to protect against sparks, and make sure your damper is open before lighting. Never leave

a fire unattended. Never use lighter fluid or any other type of accelerant to start your fire. Always keep children and pets away from heat sources. Keep flammable materials such as clothing and blankets away from heat sources.

Cold weather can make it tough for some families to stay warm, so SMUD offers programs to help low-income customers save on their electric bills. Eligible customers can take advantage of SMUD's Energy Assistance Program Rate (EAPR), a discount rate that can save customers money on their bill. EAPR customers may also be eligible for our residential weatherization program. Qualified customers can, at no cost to them, have their homes and apartments weatherized to improve energy efficiency and keep down energy costs. Customers needing help with their bills can also apply for the EnergyHelp program. SMUD is not shutting off power, nor charging late fees during this time. Newsom's Vacillation on Vaccinations, Phase 2

Is California – and its politicians – ready for VAX War II?

More pointedly, is Gov. Gavin Newsom ready?

Three years ago, the Capitol was wracked by one of the most heated conflicts in its history – legislation to make it more difficult for parents to exempt their children from mandatory vaccinations if they attended public schools. A bill sought to close a loophole that allowed doctors to approve exemptions without specifying reasons, leading to doctor-shopping by anti-vaccination parents.

Hundreds of opponents besieged the Capitol, claiming that the legislation would violate parental rights and require vaccines that could trigger autism or other adverse reactions. The measure's author, Sacramento Sen. Richard Pan, and other backers were accosted and threatened and on the final night of the legislative session, someone in the Senate gallery threw a cup of what authorities said "appeared to be blood" onto the Senate floor.

Eventually, the bill passed and was signed by Newsom in his first year as governor, but he engaged in some bizarre political theater before finally acceding.

As the bill was moving

through the Legislature, Newsom suddenly demanded a number of changes that weakened its provisions. "I'm a parent," Newsom said at one point. "I don't want someone that the governor of California appointed to make a decision for my family."

After two weeks of private negotiations, he finally accepted a revised version, telling a reporter, "All those amendments, if they're made, stamp of approval."

Two-plus months later, however, Newsom did another 180-degree pivot, demanding more changes. Eventually, a final compromise was reached, but Newsom had violated one of the Capitol's unwritten rules of conduct: once you make a deal, you don't renege. It drove a wedge between the new governor and lawmakers that affected other issues.

The possibility of renewing superheated vaccination warfare arose this week when Pan, a physician, introduced legislation to close what he regards as a huge loophole in Newsom's promise to have all school children vaccinated against COVID-19 when vaccines are available for youngsters.

"We have to be willing to take a stand," Pan said. "We need to be able to respond to this pandemic and future pandemics, but there is this asymmetrical warfare going on right now, and we're seeing the anti-vaccine movement trafficking in misinformation, threats, and violence."

Once again, Newsom's position is uncertain.

When he announced the school vaccination mandate in October, Newsom

boasted that California was the first state to impose such a requirement

"The state already requires that students are vaccinated against viruses that cause measles, mumps, and rubella (so) there's no reason why we wouldn't do the same for COVID-19," Newsom said. "Today's measure, just like our first-in-the-nation school masking and staff vaccination requirements, is about protecting our children and school staff, and keeping them in the classroom."

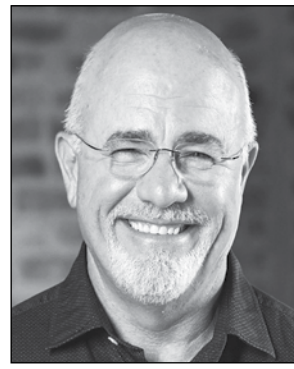
That would seem to be a strong endorsement of mandatory vaccinations. However, Newsom subsequently watered it down, at least verbally, by repeatedly reminding parents that they could opt out under state law's "personal belief" exemption. Pan's new bill would eliminate that exemption, leaving only precise medical conditions as a way to avoid vaccination.

Newsom's new fence-straddling is not going unnoticed.

"He's trying to be comforting and non-confrontational, but it sends a message that if you don't want to get the vaccine, don't get it," Catherine Flores Martin, executive director of the California Immunization Coalition, told CaliforniaHealthline. "Gov. Newsom struggles with this – he's trying to have it both ways."

Yes, he is.

How Much Dirt, and How Much House?

Dear Dave,

My wife and I own a small catering business. We have a few big corporations as clients, and our company has been very successful over the last two or three years. Now, we are planning to build a house. I was wondering what you think about how much should be spent on the land itself versus the construction of the actual house.

When the whole thing is

done, the payment you end up with shouldn't be more than 25% of your take-home pay on a 15-year, fixed-rate loan. The ratio of land to house can vary, and that part's up to you. If you're buying a big piece of land, you're probably going to have a higher ratio of land cost to home cost than if you bought a simple lot and put a really nice home there.

Generally, a standard subdivision lot is going to be around 20% of the total price. If you spend \$100,000 on the lot, you'll end up with a total project cost of about a half-million. Now, keep in mind that's just a fairly standard ratio. It's not a rule.

The only rule here is my rule about mortgage payments. Again, no more than 25% of your take-home pay on a fixed-rate, 15-year note. Otherwise, you can

end up house poor. And when you're house poor, it takes away your ability to save, build wealth, and give.

Having a big house and a lot of land is cool if you can afford it, Lee. But it's not worth it if it's financially stressful and prevents you from living your best life!

The "Most Radical Medical Experiment in Human History," Targets Children

We live in a day unlike any other outside the book burning of the Middle Ages, where truth is determined by who is the loudest and who is censored the least. Where everyone carries in a pocket a device loaded with the history, truth, and the wisdom of the ages, but instead, most prefer the shallow depth of social media to determine opinion. Where science

Ask yourself if you want your own child to be part of the most radical medical

experiment in human history. One final point: the reason they're giving you to vaccinate your child is a lie. Your children represent no danger to their parents or grandparents. It's actually the opposite. Their immunity, after getting COVID, is critical to save your family if not the world from this disease.

Finally, and in summary: there is no benefit for your children or your family to be vaccinating your children against the small risks of the virus, given the known health risks of the vaccine that as a parent, you and your children may have to live with for the rest of your lives. The risk/benefit analysis isn't even close with this vaccine for children. As a parent and grandparent, my strong recommendation to you is to resist and fight to protect your children." ★

Shotspotter Activation and Arrest on Lang Avenue

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On January 18, 2022, at 7:45 a.m. there was a 5 round ShotSpotter activation within south Sacramento County. Deputies were dispatched 12 seconds later. The first deputy arrived at the activation location and contacted the suspect less than five minutes later. While deputies were detaining the suspect, the communications center received its first call from a resident stating they heard gunshots.

When deputies arrived at the dispatched address, they observed an adult male subject running from them and attempting to dispose of a firearm. Dominic Alexander King (40) of Sacramento, who is on formal probation for felon in possession of

a firearm, was arrested for multiple felonies and misdemeanors stemming from the ShotSpotter activation. A probation search of King revealed possession of methamphetamine.

King was transported to the Main Jail on eight felony and two misdemeanor counts which include possession of firearm by felon, carrying loaded firearm and discharge of a firearm in a grossly negligent manner. He is being held on \$50,000 bail.

It is unclear who/what the target of the shooting may have been so the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office is asking anyone who may have witnessed or have knowledge of the incident to please contact the Sheriff's Office at (916) 874-5115 or Sacramento Valley Crime Stoppers at (916) 443-HELP. ★

We hope that this MOU will support the purchase and use of EVs while bolstering the confidence of drivers who move about our state."

"Providing the infrastructure needed to support widespread electric vehicle adoption is critical to breaking down one of the biggest barriers to EV adoption," said Pedro J. Pizarro, president and CEO of Edison International, parent company of Southern California Edison. "Edison is committed to doing our part to ensure electrification of the transportation sector is truly equitable."

The California utilities will be working together to identify key locations for

charging infrastructure in support of regional travel across the state, identify those locations that minimize grid impacts and customer costs, and define charging infrastructure characteristics that lead to more user-friendly car and truck charging.

"No single utility on its own can create a regional charging network to eliminate range anxiety," said SDG&E CEO Caroline Winn. "But by working together within a framework of shared values, we can make a bigger collective impact to benefit all Californians and advance our state's global leadership in clean transportation."


This MOU and collaboration grew from the ongoing commitment in California to zero-emission mobility and goods movement, recently highlighted by Governor Newsom in Executive Order N-79-20. Under the order, 100 percent of sales of new cars and drayage trucks are to be zero-emission by 2035 and all on-road cars and trucks are to be zero-emissions by 2045. Although California has built out its charging infrastructure at a commendable rate, much more is needed to meet the state's zero-emission car and truck goals, and ensure that all Californians have access to safe, clean, and affordable electricity fuel.

"At LADWP, we recognize the tremendous benefits to transitioning California's vehicle fleet to electricity fuel, and we are committed to doing our part to ensure this transition is truly equitable. The opportunities to benefit from this transition apply to all Californians whether or not they own or operate an electric vehicle, these kinds of collaborations help improve and ensure those benefits," said Reiko Kerr, LADWP senior assistant general manager, Power System Engineering and Technical Services.

The MOU specifically calls out the need to support and engage with local and diverse communities along the regional corridors. The MOU emphasizes equity and community inclusion, as part of the participating utilities core values.

"The California utilities have led the nation on clean, renewable, electricity and support for electrification. I look forward to this collaborative effort and to seeing it expand with partnerships and collaboration across the United States that benefit all EV drivers by ensuring they can travel freely within and outside the state," said Eileen Tutt, executive director, California Electric Transportation Coalition. ★

Can't Afford to Pay My Medicare Premium Bill ... What Can I Do?



Toni King

Toni:

My Medicare begins March 1st and I have received my first bill. This bill is for 4 months from March 1st to June 30th. I thought Medicare was monthly. If I pay this amount, then I

cannot pay my rent for March.

This bill for Medicare is due February 25th and I was wondering if Medicare allows payments for Medicare Part B premium monthly? I cannot start my Social Security check because I work and make more than Social Security allows without having to pay a penalty because I am not at my full retirement age (FRA).

Jackie:

You are correct that Americans are paying their Medicare premiums monthly by having the premium taken from their Social Security check. Social Security will automatically take the Medicare premiums from a person's Social Security check. Social Security will send a letter informing the Medicare beneficiary that Social Security is deducting the monthly Medicare Part B premiums from your Social Security check.

GOOGLE "Medicare Easy Pay" to pay your Medicare premiums monthly from your checking account or visit www.medicare.gov and you can research topics such as how to download and properly set up Medicare Easy Pay.

Not computer or internet "smart" to research options on "GOOGLE", then get help from a family member or friend that has access to a computer and ask them to assist you in downloading the Medicare Easy Pay form.

It may take about 6-8 weeks to have the "Medicare Easy Pay" form processed. You should make sure that you keep up with your monthly premiums, so your Medicare Parts A and B are not terminated. A simple way to pay a monthly premium or your

complete Medicare premium bill by credit card until the Medicare Easy Pay form is activated is by visiting www.Medicare.com and create a Medicare account.

When creating a Medicare account, you must have applied for Medicare and have your Medicare number to open your account. On your Medicare account is your Medicare information such as:

- What Medicare Part D prescription drug plan or Medicare Advantage plan you are enrolled in.
- What your Medicare Part A and B enrollment dates are.
- What you can view on your "Medicare.gov" account is paying your Medicare premium, Medicare claims, print your Medicare card and much more.

If one does not stay current with their Medicare premiums, then the Medicare Beneficiary might lose their benefits and may be charged a penalty when they re-enroll. When someone does not have the required 40 working quarters to qualify for Medicare or are married with a spouse that does have the 40 quarters, then they may also have to pay a premium for Part A which is expensive.

Medicare Part D prescription drug premiums are not available via the Medicare site but are managed by the Medicare Part D prescription drug company. One can pay their Medicare prescription drug premium either directly to the prescription drug company by check or credit card. Once one begins receiving their Social Security check, then both Medicare Part B and Part D prescription drug premiums can be taken from their Social Security check.

Toni Says® Many do not realize that they can pay their Part B premiums monthly when not receiving their Social Security check by following the rules set up by Medicare. Take your time and study this Medicare rule.
