CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - The spirit of small-town Americana surged in the suburbs on July 4. With Carmichael's famous parade canceled – for a second year – many residents resurrected down-home neighborhood traditions.

Scaled-down pageants brought out bicycles, volunteer bands, lemonade stands and front-porch bunting.

Human Services at CSUS, revived the neighborhood tradition during heightened COVID restrictions in 2020. “We benefited from momentum this year,” she reported. “We had more families, more cars and more fun. More than 40 children – plus parents and decorated doggies – rode or strolled in the mile-long route. The procession assembled a colorful phalanx of decorated bikes, scooters, skateboards, kiddie cars and a golf cart. A local musician beat a vibrant marching tempo on drums. Residents sipped coffee and applauded. “The community misses our big July 4 parade,” observed an onlooker. “But it was great to see a little neighborhood energized in such a patriotic way. We all hope they’ll do it again next year.” ★

CWD Implements Drought Stage 2 Contingency Plan

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - California has now experienced two (2) back-to-back dry winters (2019-20 and 2020-2021). In fact, last winter tied for the third driest in more than a century of record keeping. As a result, flow conditions in Carmichael Water District's (District) primary supply source, the American River, have been significantly reduced. In addition, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) notified the District to stop diversions of water from the American River under the District's water right licenses and permit. In response to the SWRCB's curtailment notice and associated impacts, the District's Board of Directors has declared a Water Shortage Emergency Condition. As part of the declaration, the District is calling for a 10% to 20% reduction in water use per stage 2 of the District's Water Shortage Contingency Plan (WSCP). The District maintains a WSCP for use during drought periods or times of supply shortages. The plan serves as a guide for the District in responding to water supply shortages and responding to regional and statewide impacts from drought conditions while maintaining water quality, safe operating conditions, and fire flow capability.

The District is asking customers to do their part by following the WSCP Stage 2 mandatory requirements. The requirements are as follows:

Unnecessary and wasteful uses of water are prohibited; No water runoff from property allowed; All water plumbing, fixtures, or heating or cooling devices must not be allowed to leak or discharge. All known leaks must be repaired within seven (7) days or less depending on the severity of the leak; Free flowing hoses are prohibited for any use, all hoses must have an automatic shut-off control nozzle capable of completely shutting off the flow of water; Car washing must use a bucket and hose with an automatic shut-off control nozzle; Washing down impervious surfaces such as driveways and sidewalks is prohibited unless for public health and safety purposes; All pools, spas, decorative or ornamental fountains, ponds and water features must be equipped with a recirculation pump and maintained leak free. communities in reviving live performance gatherings. The City of Roseville has begun a series of tribute band performances at Vernon Street Town Square. Fair Oaks last month kicked off an entertainment season with a concert by Carmichael-raised singer/guitarist Todd Morgan. Morgan and the Emblems debuted what continues as final-Thursday entertainment each month, ending September 30. Supported by the area's Park District, its Chamber of Commerce and the Fair Oaks Theater Festival, the season also offers comedy and theater productions on final Fridays and Saturdays at Fair Oaks Park. Thursday music is free; paid admission is required for Friday and Saturday shows. Mission Oaks Park District will sponsor a concert by rock band On Air at the Mission Oaks Community Center on September 26.

Due to 2021 budget shortfalls, Carmichael Park District made a painful choice between staging live concerts and blowing the budget on a July 4 fireworks display. "We simply could not afford both this year," explains CRPD administrator Mike Blondino. "It came down to 17 minutes of fireworks at \$17,000 -- or eight weeks of concerts. We decided the concerts would serve more people for a more worthwhile length of time." CRPD gigs will have food trucks on hand and picnics

and dancing are encouraged. "We missed everyone last summer," says Blondino: "We hope to see all the great dance moves they've been working on over the last year or so."

leaks must be repaired within seven (7) days or less depending on the severity of the leak; New landscape installations should be limited to drought-tolerant plants and natives;

All landscapes must be watered during cooler morning or evening hours to reduce evaporation and minimize landscape runoff. No watering allowed between the hours of 10 a.m. and 7 p.m.; Keep watering of lawns and landscaping to only three (3) days a week; Odd number addresses – Outdoor watering is limited to Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday; Even number addresses – Outdoor watering is limited to Wednesday, Friday, and Sunday; No watering allowed on Monday; Trees, shrubs, and vegetables may be watered any day by means of drip irrigation, soaker hoses with timer, or hand watering; No irrigating turf or ornamental landscapes during and 48 hours following measurable precipitation; Repetitive violators will be subject to penalties and fines.

With these water conservation

requirements comes new challenges; and District representatives are available to assist customers with this transition. The District offers free Water Efficiency Surveys for both interior and exterior water use. These surveys help in identifying leaks and offer free water efficient devices such as high efficiency sprinklers and shut off nozzles. In addition, staff are available to help set irrigation timers for optimal efficiency. District customer can receive a free Water Efficiency Survey by calling (916) 483-2452 or by stopping by our office located at 7837 Fair Oaks Blvd. Carmichael Water District's website, www.carmichaelwd.org is the best place for up-to-date information on water shortage, drought stage conditions, and water efficiency programs.

If conditions worsen, Carmichael Water District will likely implement more restrictive measures and drought stages. As drought conditions continue, now is the time to use less water in our homes, businesses and landscapes. ★

County Updates Climate Action Plan

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Planning and Environmental Review (PER) staff are hard at work on the final draft of the Communitywide Climate Action Plan (CAP), which aims to significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions and prepare the County for climate-related impacts for decades to come.

PER staff expects the final draft CAP will be available for public review sometime in mid summer. You can be among the first to see it by signing up for email or text alerts.

Climate change is expected to affect the region in a variety of

ways: hotter temperatures and more extreme heat events; increased wildfire risks; unpredictable rainfall and flooding; reduced snowpack and impacts to the water supply, among others.

The CAP will serve as a policy and technical document that will be used to update other plans and codes – such as the Sacramento County General Plan and County Building Codes – to help the County reach greenhouse gas reduction targets.

"The Climate Action Plan is an extremely important project so we are really taking our time and listening to our residents and the experts to make sure that we get it right,"

said Todd Smith, Principal Planner. "Our goal is to have an implementable communitywide plan that reduces Sacramento County's contributions to climate change while addressing its impacts."

Following public review, PER staff hopes to get the CAP before the Board of Supervisors for approval in late fall 2021.

Presentations from past public workshops and Board of Supervisors meetings that give examples of some of the concepts under consideration are available on the Planning and Environmental Review website.

SJUSD Faces Lawsuit and Push for Board Expansion

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The San Juan Unified School District (SJUSD) Board of Education held a special meeting on July 1, to resume the transition from at-large elections to trustee-area elections. They heard public input and discussed their preferred criteria for the creation of a trustee-area map, which will be used in the November 2022 election.

The process began in February 2020, when the SJUSD received a demand letter from attorney Scott Rafferty alleging that the current at-large election system could violate the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) by impairing the ability of minority voters to influence the outcome of board elections. The CVRA has a “safe harbor” provision, which gives the agency 45 days to voluntarily decide to transition the election system; a lawsuit cannot be filed during that time. Safe harbor allows another 90 days after the resolution for potential maps to be drafted and to conduct the necessary public hearings.

On March 10, 2020, the SJUSD board adopted a resolution stating their intention to transition to trustee-area elections. They held the first required public hearing on March 31, 2020, through teleconference in accordance with the stay-at-home order in effect at that time. An executive order from the governor in April 2020 allowed agencies to pause the transition timeline in an effort to ensure public safety during the pandemic. The board chose to pause the transition until public meetings could be held in person, citing low engagement at the March 31 meeting.

Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) also received a demand letter from Mr. Rafferty in February 2020. Despite the executive order allowing a paused timeline, FCUSD instead voted to continue their process by holding the public hearings through teleconferences. FCUSD approved a trustee-area map last summer that was used in the November 2020 election.

As a result of the SJUSD board’s decision not to move forward with the transition ahead of the 2020 election, Rafferty filed a lawsuit in Sacramento County Superior Court in October 2020. The lawsuit alleges that the SJUSD never intended to comply within the safe harbor

timeframe because even while holding the first hearing through teleconference they were also submitting a letter to the governor requesting the timeline be paused on the assertion that compliance wasn’t possible due to COVID restrictions. The lawsuit stipulates that the executive order did not prohibit teleconferenced public hearings and that SJUSD should have moved forward as planned. Among other allegations, the lawsuit states that the board wanted to wait until after the 2020 election in order to protect the incumbents who were up for reelection.

The transition timeline restarted when the governor’s order expired on June 30, 2021. The demographer explained that draft maps will be drawn using 2010 census data, and then later adjusted when the 2020 data is released. When drafting the trustee-area maps, certain criteria must be met. Areas must be compact, contiguous, and nearly equal in population. The boundaries cannot be gerrymandered to dilute minority votes. Boundaries should also respect geographical features, neighborhoods, and communities of interest (those who share economic and political interests).

At the July 1, 2021, public hearing, many community members spoke in support of expanding the board from five trustees to seven as part of the transition process. They argued that in a

school district as large as SJUSD, lower income areas – such as Arden Arcade and Citrus Heights – are underserved, resulting in low rates of student achievement. Proponents of a seven-trustee board stated that having local representation would allow those areas most in need to have a stronger voice in board decisions.

Others spoke in favor of maintaining the five-trustee board, asserting that too many cooks in the kitchen can make it more difficult for the board to make decisions. They worry that with seven trustees, each might put the interests of their own area ahead of what is best for the district as a whole.

Some even stated they believe the expansion effort is driven by individuals who have run failed campaigns for seats on the board, viewing it as a way for disgruntled would-be politicians to further their own political agendas. Such comments could be a reference to Magali Kincaid, a vocal supporter of expanding the board, who unsuccessfully ran for a seat in 2018. She is also one of the plaintiffs in the CVRA lawsuit filed by Mr. Rafferty against SJUSD. “We need seven trustee areas,” said Kincaid at the July 1 meeting. “It’s time to put aside your personal interests...and bring greater accountability and empowerment into the hands of the community.”

Proponents of board expansion believe that it will create more fair and equitable governance. If each trustee serves a smaller area, they say it will improve focus on the concerns of that area – giving greater representation to those in underserved neighborhoods. Many residents from Citrus Heights support the expansion, pointing out that the city makes up approximately 25% of the district population but hasn’t had a representative on the board in almost 20 years. The Citrus Heights City Council also recently passed a resolution supporting the expansion of the board to seven seats.

Attorney Scott Rafferty spoke at the meeting as well, stating that if the board agreed during the meeting to move forward with seven seats, “we’ll settle the lawsuit; it’ll be over.”

Board members thanked everyone for their input and assured the audience that draft maps for both five and seven trustee areas would be created for consideration. Through board consensus, they advised that each trustee area should have at least one high school within its boundaries. They also removed residency of current incumbents as a consideration, stating that should not be a factor.

Draft maps will be presented at a special meeting on July 13, for review by the board and more public input on the trustee-area boundaries. ★

SMUD Takes Groundbreaking Road to Eliminating Carbon Emissions

Following several months of community meetings, workshops and public input, the SMUD Board of Directors recently approved a Zero Carbon Plan that commits us to removing carbon emissions from SMUD's power supply by 2030. It's the most ambitious clean-energy plan of any large electric utility in the United States.

There are many reasons why we set such an ambitious schedule.

Sacramento's poor air quality and the growing effects of climate change through drought and wildfires prompted us to act as quickly as we can. In the American Lung Association's "2020 State of the Air" report, Sacramento was ranked the sixth-most polluted city in the country based on days of unhealthy levels of air pollution in the ozone layer. The public health implications are real - the Sacramento region's childhood asthma rates are more than 20 percent higher than the national average. That's

unacceptable.

SMUD's Zero Carbon Plan will focus on proven and new clean technologies, new business models and partnerships, the remodeling and retirement of our natural gas plants, and regulatory and financial strategies. While SMUD is one of the greenest utilities in the country, we currently rely on natural gas for about half of our power generation. We plan to close two of our gas plants by 2025 and re-tool the others.

At the same time, we're committed to maintaining reliable, around-the-clock service while keeping any rate increases at or below the rate of inflation. As much as they support our clean-energy efforts, our customers tell us that affordable rates and reliable electricity are their top two priorities. We will not sacrifice either of those.

To those who doubt whether we can pull this off, my response is:

If not now, when? And if not us, who?

The electrification of buildings and vehicles is a key part of the Zero Carbon Plan. As SMUD's power mix incorporates more renewable sources such as solar and wind, powering our homes, offices and cars by electricity will reduce greenhouse gas emissions significantly since buildings and vehicles are the largest carbon emitters in the state. And we'll have the infrastructure in place to support the

plan and transition.

One of the biggest strengths of the Zero Carbon Plan is its flexibility. We're not taking such a large step in any one direction that we can't pivot if we need to, based on new technologies, customer preferences and market conditions. We know where we're going, in other words, but our path is flexible. This plan gives us the adaptability to choose the best route.

We realize we can't accomplish our aggressive goal by going it alone. We need the support of a wide range of players, including our residential and business customers, elected officials, local business groups, community leaders, technology companies, start-ups, car manufacturers, solar companies, and more. We're committed to full transparency and to making sure that all of our customers, including those living in historically under resourced communities, reap the full benefits of our effort.

SMUD offers a variety of energy efficiency, electrification and electric vehicles rebates and incentives for customers who want to join our Clean Power City effort immediately. We encourage you to sign up to receive notifications at smud.org/cleanpowercity. We'll let you know when the Board is discussing the Zero Carbon Plan.

Together, we can create a cleaner, healthier, more sustainable future. ★

Data Undercut Newsom's 'Roaring Back' Claim

Virtually any utterance from Gavin Newsom's mouth these days, as well as those from his press office and other outposts of his administration, contains the phrase "roaring back."

When, for example, the Legislature passed a state budget to meet the June 15 constitutional deadline, Newsom issued a statement declaring that "California's economy is coming roaring back."

Not surprisingly, it's also the key slogan in his resistance to a campaign to recall him, something voters will decide later this year.

"Gov. Gavin Newsom has California roaring back," the announcer in one of his campaign spots declares. "Newsom is delivering money to your pocket. Plus an extra \$500 bucks for families with kids - \$4 billion straight to small businesses through the nation's largest grant program - cleaning up our streets and getting 65,000 homeless Californians into housing - and free pre-K for every California child, regardless of income."

To some, it might appear somewhat unseemly that Newsom so obviously merges his official actions - and taxpayers' money - with

his political campaign, but the once-discernible line between politics and policy vanished long ago.

That said, do the facts support Newsom's repetitive "roaring back" claim?

To be sure, some Californians have prospered in the 15 months since Newsom declared a public health emergency due to COVID-19 and imposed restrictions on personal and economic activities.

Those who could continue to work at home maintained their incomes and those on the top rungs of the economic ladder were enriched as the values of their investments such as stocks expanded, thanks largely to the Federal Reserve's cheap money policies.

Newsom has a multi-billion-dollar revenue surplus mostly due to taxes on the affluent, money he's now spending on the wide array of new benefits he's touting in his campaign ads.

However, broader economic data offer scant support for the "roaring back" mantra the governor is chanting these days. It's more like creeping back - slowly.

The state's monthly report on employment, issued on June 18, frames the glacial pace of improvement. The state lost nearly 3 million jobs after Newsom ordered widespread business closures in March 2020, and since then we've recovered roughly half of them. Our 7.9% unemployment rate is still twice what it was before the shutdown and is the third highest of any state, slightly under Hawaii and New Mexico.

In addition to the official unemployment rate, the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics makes other calculations, including an important one on underemployment, called U-6, which includes not only workers without jobs but those who are only marginally attached to the labor force and those working part-time.

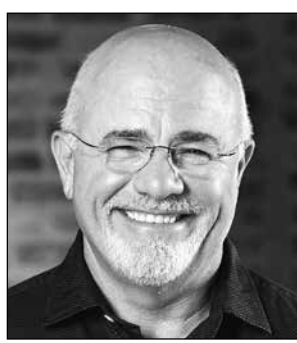
California's U-6 rate through the first quarter, 18.4%, was four percentage points above the national figure and the third highest of any state, behind Hawaii and Nevada. Even more disturbingly, the U-6 rate in Los Angeles County, 24.1%, is higher than that of any state.

The federal Bureau of Economic Analysis reported this month that during the first quarter of this year, California's economic output increased by 6.3%, slightly lower than the national rate and in the lowest third of the states.

The federal bureau also reported that California's personal income grew by 42.8% during the first quarter, which sounds impressive until one looks at the nation as a whole and learns that California's growth was the second lowest of any state. The bureau notes that nationwide, "transfer payments" - mostly federal aid programs rather than earned income - accounted for virtually all of personal income growth.

California's economy is recovering, to be sure. But "roaring back?" Hardly.

They'll Play on your Emotions

Dear Dave,

I'm on Baby Step 2. I've paid off almost all my debt, and I'm living on a monthly budget. Recently, I got a call from a debt collection company about an old medical bill. They threatened to garnish my wages, and from the way they talked I'm afraid they may actually do it. How should I handle this situation?

First of all, they won't garnish your wages. They can't. For that to happen, they would have to go through all the formal, legal steps of suing you, and then they'd have to win the case. Debt collectors like to play with people's emotions because, many times, folks will give in and do whatever

they want—whether they can afford it or not.

The worst thing you can do in these situations is react with panic or fear. Talk to them calmly and rationally, and explain your financial situation. You may be able to reach a compromise that works for both of you. If they get nasty, or continue to lie to you, let them know you'll file a complaint with the FTC (Federal Trade Commission). Pushy debt collectors have a habit of getting polite and reasonable in a hurry when faced with the possibility of the federal government stepping in.

Do everything you reasonably can to pay your debts, Gwen. You owe the money, and that means you have a legal and moral obligation to pay them. But you don't have to put up with a collector's lies and harassment!

In addition to serving on the board of trustees, the student trustee chairs the Los Rios Student Advisory Committee (SAC), which provides a forum for communication and exchange of ideas, information, and concerns among students.

The SAC is comprised of student leaders from each of

the colleges' student senates (typically the Student Senate president) and chaired by the student trustee. The SAC meets each month, before each regularly scheduled board of trustees meeting, to address issues that affect students. It provides a forum for communication/exchange of ideas, information, and concerns among students.

One key responsibility of SAC is to ensure students participate in district/college governance, and that students have a voice in the development of policies and processes that have a significant effect on students.

Ask Toni

Why Is My Medicare Premium An Extra \$471?



Toni King

Toni:

My husband, John and I need your guidance because I believe I have made a mistake enrolling in Medicare. Last year, John was laid off due to COVID-

19 and has lost his employer health insurance and so I have enrolled in Medicare since I am turning 65 in August. John is a Veteran and is receiving his healthcare from the VA, so he did not have to enroll in Medicare and his healthcare is not costing us anything.

Why is my Medicare costing me an extra \$471 for Medicare Part A and \$148.50 for Medicare Part B? I thought Medicare Part A was free. Is there some form that I did not fill out because I have not worked very much since we married 40+ years ago and was a stay-at-home Mom and now I am the caretaker for our elderly parents? Please explain what I should do to correct my Medicare mistake.

Thank you, Susan from Cleveland, Ohio
Susan:

Most Americans do not realize that they must work a certain amount of time and pay taxes to have Medicare Part A at no cost. This is what your problem is and the Toni Says® Medicare office can help you solve your problem.

For you to qualify for Medicare you must have worked and paid Social Security and Medicare taxes from your payroll check. The Medicare Beneficiary must have worked at least 10 years or 40 quarters (paying taxes) to qualify for Medicare Part A at no additional cost. When you sign up for Medicare Part A, you may want to enroll in Part B, that also has a monthly premium, if you are not working full-time with yours or your spouse's employer benefits.

The premium for Medicare Part A is

\$471 each month if you do not qualify for premium free Medicare Part A. If you paid Medicare taxes for 30-39 quarters not 40 quarters, then the standard Part A premium is \$259 each month.

Those who did not work or pay into Social Security System for 10 years and are married such as is your situation Susan, should apply for Medicare under their spouse's Social Security number to qualify (if spouse worked 10+ years or 40+ quarters). If one never married or possibly lived with someone as a domestic partner and they did not work enough quarters, then they will have to pay for Medicare Part A.

My advice to you Susan would be to call your local Social Security office since it is the government office which oversees America enrolling in Medicare. Explain your situation that you have always been a stay-at-home spouse, your husband has worked enough quarters to qualify and that you need to appeal your Medicare Part A premium of \$471. Tell the Social Security representative that you are seeking premium-free Medicare Part A due to your husband having enough quarters to qualify.

Social Security will look over both yours and your husband's Social Security accounts to verify that he has enough quarters. Be prepared to provide a certified marriage license showing you are married and will have to mail the original certified marriage license (not a copy) to that specific Social Security office.

For Medicare enrollment questions either call your local Social Security office specific 800 number or call the Toni Says Medicare hotline at 832/519-8664 for help.

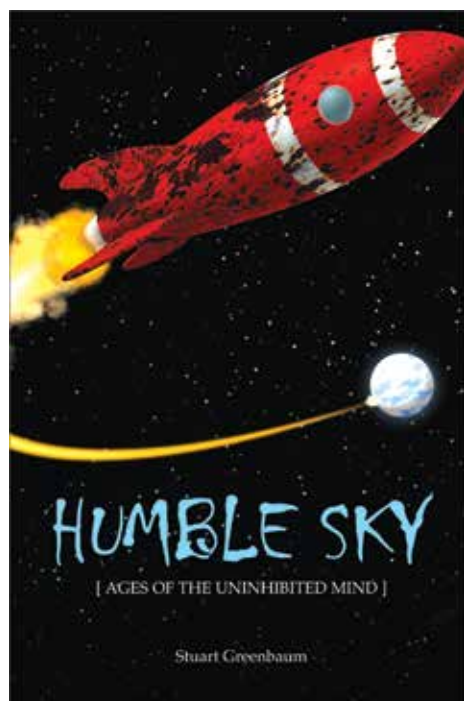

"This is a wonderfully thought-provoking, sobering tale that offers plenty of space for interpretation," said James M.

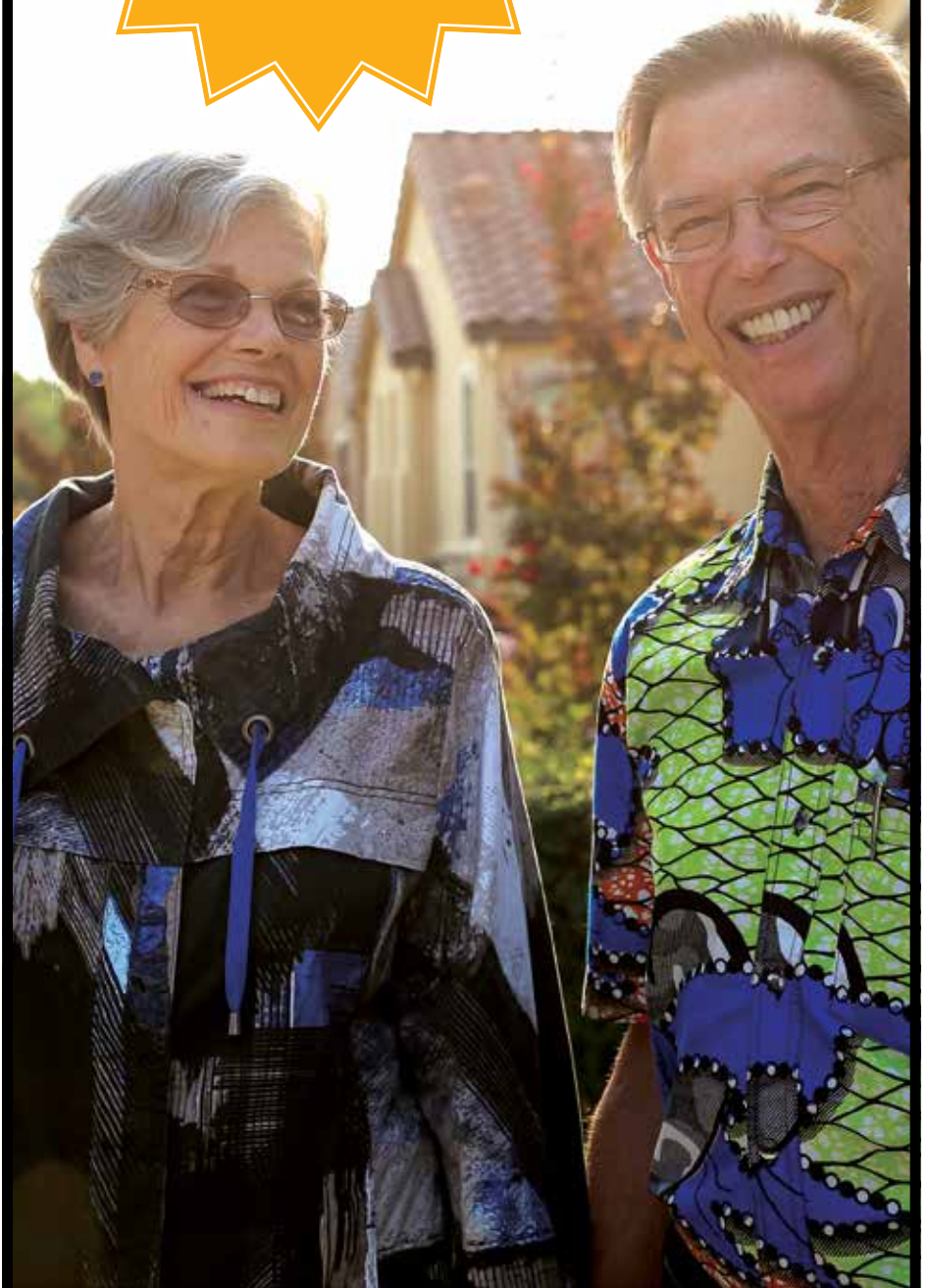

Halting Child Support Debt

Legislature looks to halt collections, for some

California lawmakers have advanced a budget proposal to stop collecting child support debt from some parents who are receiving cash assistance, but the proposed solutions are a far cry from what advocates for those debt-holders sought in January.

The Legislature’s budget proposal would reduce or expunge debt owed to the government – not the debt owed to families – for parents whose only source of income is from Supplemental Security Income or State Supplementary Payment, the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants, a combination of SSI/SSP and Social Security Disability Insurance benefits, or Veterans Administration disability benefits.

The proposal could cut a break for a narrow subset of the larger population of Californians who owe child support debt to the government; the state did not release to CalMatters the exact number of people receiving those benefits who owe child support debt, and it’s unclear if the state has that number.

For context, the Senate Appropriations Committee found that removing all people in arrears from child support debt would cost the state hundreds of millions of dollars and save only \$3.7 million in the general fund by letting go of 98 full-time Department of Child

Support Services employees who work in child support debt collection.

The proposal still needs to be negotiated with the Newsom administration.

Still, advocates for the poor had asked the state to go farther by forgiving old, uncollectible debt. And the current proposal leaves the state’s 10% interest rate on child support debt, one of the highest interest rates of its kind in the country.

The theory behind child support is that a parent who doesn’t have custody of a child supports the child with monthly payments. But that’s not how it works

in practice for parents who also receive cash assistance from the federal welfare-to-work Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program, known as CalWORKS in California.

As CalMatters and The Salinas Californian reported last month, California takes a piece of the child support payments owed to custodial parents, usually mothers, receiving these cash benefits. In some cases, that piece is more than half of the total payment. Meanwhile, if the noncustodial parent falls behind on child support payments, that debt piles up through

an interest rate of 10%.

The state itself, in a report commissioned by the child support services agency, has had academics saying since at least 2003 that much of that debt is uncollectible. If states don’t recover the money from parents, the state itself owes the federal government the debt. Some states have begun to pass through 100% of child support payments to families, and Colorado passed a law dictating that the state repay the federal government.

Most states are like California, which passes through \$100 for families

on public assistance with one child and \$200 for families with two or more children. Last year, Gov. Gavin Newsom vetoed an Assembly measure that would have eliminated California’s 10% interest charges, saying the state needs the money.

Last week, the governor’s office told CalMatters that “given the revenue impact” of ending collections on child support debt, Newsom “sought to have this issue addressed through the budget process” when he vetoed the Assembly measure.

It seems that day has arrived.

Federal data shows California is keeping an unusually high portion of the child support payments – more than 3½ times the national average. That has a knock-on effect for the parents responsible for that debt: They have a harder time getting and keeping jobs, their drivers’ licenses are subject to revocation and the children and non-custodial parents receive less.
