## A Day of Giving

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Local nonprofits were big winners in the May 6 Big Day of Giving. Many achieved support that surpassed fundraising hopes. Choreographed by the Sacramento Region Community Foundation, the 24-hour give-a-thon this year assisted 688 organizations. Top Carmichael beneficiary, the Effie Yeaw Nature Center, rallied \$68,000 in support. Friends of Sacramento Library raised almost \$103,000 – a windfall that in part assists Carmichael Library.

The Kiwanis Club of Carmichael Foundation set a \$10,000 goal and gave a massive thumbs up when more than \$22,000 flooded in. “We’ve had to cancel six of our biggest annual fundraisers in the last 15 months,” said Kiwanian Michael Koerner.

“The BDOG result allows us to continue community giving until we can resume our normal fundraising activities next year.” A \$5000 check from Lyon Real Estate boosted the club’s appeal.

Effie Yeaw supporters rejoiced in gifts that topped projections by more than \$18,000. Administered by the American River Natural History Association, the facility funds educational programs solely through public generosity. The Center was COVID-closed for part of last year and forced to cancel many income-generating programs. “We were thrilled and thankful the community stepped up,” said Center spokesperson Kathy Fleming. “It’s been a rough year. Our appeal was boosted by large donations from several local families; these were used as matching incentives for hundreds more donors.”

Carmichael Parks Foundation

realized over \$14,000 – 40 percent more than last year. This total included matching funds from community philanthropist Paul Pennington. Two \$500 incentive prizes further assisted. Awarded by Big Day organizers, these rewarded the group with most donations in one hour. “Our directors set alarms and gave online between 4 and 5 am,” explained president Sue Boucher. “In that hour, we raised \$4170.” The Foundation provides youth program scholarships and improvement for Carmichael’s many reserves.

Kids helping Kids is a student-run nonprofit at Del Campo High School. On May 6, the teenagers raised almost \$7000 to aid children in need. Support included a \$1000 gift from Supervisor Rich Desmond. The District 3 leader also wrote checks for the Children’s Receiving

## County Supervisors Vote to Implement Laura’s Law

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously on May 18 to implement “Laura’s Law” - state legislation authorizing the courts to order outpatient treatment for individuals with a mental illness who may be a danger to themselves or others.

“Laura’s Law” was named after 19-year-old Laura Wilcox, who was killed in 2001 while working as a receptionist at the Nevada County Department of Behavioral Health. Her killer was a former patient of the county’s outpatient mental health clinic, who had been diagnosed with severe mental illness. After the incident, Laura’s parents chose to advocate for assisted outpatient treatment (AOT) for individuals who meet strict legal criteria.

AOT permits courts to order treatment for those 18 years or older who suffer from a serious mental illness, are unable to survive safely in the community without supervision and meet at least one of the following criteria: Been hospitalized two or more times in the last 36 months due to mental illness; Demonstrated violent behavior toward themselves or others in the last 48 months; Has been offered treatment on a voluntary basis and refused it; Or, is deteriorating.

“We acknowledge that this is a complex issue with proponents on each side of this decision,” said Ryan Quist, Behavioral Health Director. “We are committed to engaging with all of our stakeholders in a community planning process to minimize concerns and design the best program for Sacramento County.”

California counties previously had the option to “opt in” to the program and that has been done in most of the larger counties. Sacramento County has historically not opted in to providing AOT services.

The process changed, however, with the passage last year of AB 1976, which requires counties like Sacramento to hold public hearings at the Board of Supervisors about whether to “opt in” or “opt out,” and if a County chooses to “opt out,” they have to provide specific reasons. The deadline for Counties to have a hearing and formally decide is July 1, 2021.

In Sacramento County, the program is estimated to cost \$2.5 million annually. The Board of Supervisors

## Redistricting Begins in Sacramento County

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The process for redrawing boundary lines for each of the five supervisorial districts in Sacramento County has begun.

Every ten years, following the Census count, the resulting census data is used to geographically define electoral districts, at all levels of government, through a process called redistricting. Redistricting ensures that each of the electoral district boundaries have about the same number of people and comply with the federal Voting Rights Act of 1965.

Redistricting will look different this year than in years past. This year, the County will comply with the Fair Maps Act, which revised the criteria and process used by counties and cities when they adjust electoral district boundaries. The Fair Maps

Act intends to maximize public participation and increase transparency in the redistricting process by requiring substantial public hearing and outreach requirements for adjusting district boundaries.

To that end, Sacramento County’s Redistricting 2021 webpage is live and will be a vital resource for County residents to learn more about redistricting, the importance of public participation in redistricting and how to participate in the process.

The website also includes current district and other important Sacramento County maps for reference, as well as past and future meetings/hearings, FAQs, and an explanation of the Sacramento County Redistricting Process (with printouts of the process available in ten languages).

Redistricting is important because it determines which neighborhoods

and communities will be grouped together for the purposes of electing a Board member. Residents have the opportunity to provide input on what kind of boundaries should be drawn to best represent their community. Redistricting is based on the idea of “one person, one vote” which makes sure all people can be represented fairly, and how district lines are drawn influences who is elected.

Sacramento County residents are encouraged to participate in the redistricting process. Residents can sign up for Redistricting news stories, information and upcoming meetings via email or text. People can also view past and upcoming meetings at the Redistricting Meetings webpage and are encouraged to check in for additional upcoming workshops and hearings.

The Board of Supervisors will work

directly with County staff and redistricting consultants to engage the public through workshops, hearings, community meetings, mapping tools and public outreach to complete the redistricting requirements and adopt new boundaries.

Sacramento County will schedule public workshops in all five supervisorial districts, virtual workshops, and Board of Supervisors presentations about redistricting, the process, mapping tools and other information beginning in June and running through the rest of the year.

The County will receive 2020 Census data from the state as early as September 30, 2021. The original plan was to deliver the data to states on or before March 31, 2021; however, COVID-19 significantly impacted Census operations which caused the nearly six-month delay in data delivery.


# Parental Stress During the Pandemic: You Are Not Alone

Staying isolated from friends and family, committing to indoor activities, and the switch to a virtual lifestyle are only a few of the many adjustments individuals have made during the COVID-19 pandemic. Isolation is essential in preventing the spread of COVID-19 but has resulted in heightened feelings of worry and frustration, especially among parents.

Families, understand that you are not alone. Those stressful, negative emotions are natural and reactionary behaviors – the result of an abnormal period in our lives. According to a survey conducted by the American Psychological Association, almost 50% of parents reported high stress levels because of the pandemic. Feeling trapped at home, facing overwhelming financial worries, and the constant need to supervise your child's educational day can understandably feel debilitating.

Parental stress can cause harmful and lasting consequences for both children and parents without healthy outlets and protective factors. Multiple research studies<sup>2</sup> determined that stress is a large contributing factor in child abuse. An accumulation of parental stress, generated from emotional and physical demands of parenting, contributes to abusive parenting methods: controlling behavior, neglect, and even harsh forms of discipline. A case study from The National Center for Biotechnology Information revealed that economic, emotional, and physical stressors from the

coronavirus have significantly elevated feelings of stress, anxiety, and depression in households.<sup>3</sup> Parents who continuously find themselves in stressful situations are more prone to developing aggressive behaviors or increased frustration; as a result, potential for child maltreatment has risen during this time. However, parents who are in supportive environments and have outlets and skills to manage their emotions are far more likely to have reduced levels of stress, and therefore, a lessened risk of compromised parenting. Greater parental support and perceived control during the pandemic are associated with lower perceived stress and child abuse potential.

NP<sup>3</sup> school psychologist Dr. Jeremy Greene

emphasizes the importance of combating parental stress during this difficult time. He states that “parents are the foundation of their child's life and often are the individuals who the child looks towards in assessing how to react in regards to a stressful situation. Thus, considering the pandemic and the shifts that have occurred for most of our children, it is important that parents continue to be mindful of how their stress impacts their child's stress levels, as well.”

Fortunately, there is an abundance of resources available which offer support to parents and children who feel overwhelmed with their role of parenting as a result of the current pandemic.

Families Under Pressure. Helping Relieve Today's

Parents & Kids” by Laura Dockett (Psychotherapy Networker): Laura Dockett iterates her own feelings of parental stress during the pandemic, opening up with the initially strained relationship with her own children. Dockett admits to feelings of anger and frustration due to the pandemic but is working to address attitudes/emotions from her children with compassion and understanding. Her willingness to be vulnerable about these struggles eased feelings of shame and anxiety from many parents.

Mental Health Resources for Natomas Families: This website provides multiple support resources for both parents and students in Natomas. The website's header introduces a counseling service called Care

Solace. Care Solace provides easy access to mental health support services for families and refers them to the best and most affordable therapy or mental health programs.

They also work with families who do not have insurance. Further down, you will find the Virtual Tutoring and Wellness Center (VTWC). VTWC offers parenting classes and counseling headed by Natomas school psychologists and social workers. At the bottom of the website, there are online resources specifically catered towards tips for coping with stress during the pandemic.

Parenting Tips During the Pandemic and Supporting Families During COVID-19: For parents who feel overwhelmed juggling work,

household responsibilities and childcare at the same time during this pandemic. This article provides tips for family guidelines, online school, and managing behavioral problems in a safe and proactive manner.

Self-Care for Parents: “For parents, prioritizing your own well-being benefits your whole family.”

California Parent & Youth Helpline and National Parent Helpline: If you are a parent or youth feeling overwhelmed, these helplines offer support in the morning until evening via phone call, live chat, or text. Don't be afraid to reach out if you are feeling stressed!

WarmLine Family Resource Center aims to assist parents of children with special needs. They offer free consultations, help connect parents who feel isolated with other families to formulate meaningful connections, create community events catered towards children, and offer workshops and online resources for additional support.

Recognizing the importance of self-care and garnering support from others is a huge step forward, and looking into these resources can help you work towards a healthier environment for yourself and those around you.

Home of Sacramento, Effie Yeaw Nature Center and Sacramento Parks Foundation.

Sacramento Fine Arts Center whipped up nearly \$18,000 – a \$500 “Early Dog Prize” helped fill the artists’ pot. Fair Oaks Theater Festival’s appeal generated almost \$11,000. Nature lovers opened wallets for conservation causes. The Placer Land Trust had a compelling net of \$174,000. The American River Park Foundation and Save the American River Association achieved \$15,245 and \$12,625 respectively.

Children’s Receiving Home of Sacramento collected more than \$85,000. Soil Born Farms – a Rancho Cordova enterprise that promotes sustainable food production – harvested almost \$32,000. Orangevale/Fair Oaks Food

Bank gained \$11,500 in donations. Carmichael’s Homeless Assistance Resources Team (HART) was aided by \$4500. Fair Oaks Rotarians raised \$6900. In North Highlands, California Aerospace Museum supporters set a goal of \$20,000 and landed a \$27,000 refuel.

To the delight of the Sacramento Region Community Foundation organizers, overall BDOG donations set a nine-year record at \$13.3 million. Top beneficiaries included The Salvation Army (\$345,000); Sacramento Food Bank (nearly \$240,000); ACC Senior Services (more than \$200,000); Sacramento SPCA almost (\$198,000); Yolo Food Bank (\$195,500). Crocker Art Museum topped cultural causes with more than \$167,000 in gifts. Kiwanis Family House banked over

\$135,000 and Shriners Hospitals gained \$100,000.

“People really responded to need,” confirmed Sacramento Region Community Foundation CEO Linda Beech Cutler. “People seem to realize that non-profits are critical to communities. BDOG aims to make philanthropy possible for everyone, so we were delighted when more than 36,500 people gave. More than a quarter of our donors were first-time givers and most contributed \$50 or less. Small amounts make a huge difference. Despite the many challenges we face, the spirit of generosity is alive.”

Sacramento Regional Community Foundation’s Big Day of Giving has provided fundraising opportunities for nine years. The 2022 BDOG is scheduled for May 5. For more details, visit [www.bigdayofgiving.org](http://www.bigdayofgiving.org) ★

# Newsom Transforms Taxpayer Protection into Welfare

California actually has a government spending limit, hard as that may be to believe, and Gavin Newsom is making a mockery of it, just as his predecessor did.

In 1979, a year after signing off on the revolutionary Proposition 13, voters passed Proposition 4, implementing the “Gann Limit,” which would peg California’s state spending to the 1978-79 level and only let it grow adjusted for inflation and population. State revenues above the voter-approved limit can be reckoned with several different ways, including refunding half of the excess revenues to taxpayers, with the other half going to schools.

Newsom is choosing the refund path for this year’s massive Gann Limit excess, which is currently estimated at \$16 billion dollars. But instead of sending their money back to the taxpayers in relation to how much they paid, giving everyone a slice of the rebate in proportion to their tax contributions, Newsom is turning the program into a giant transfer payment scheme.

Paul Gann, the father of Prop. 13 and the namesake of this taxpayer protection plan, would be dumbfounded by Newsom’s willful misunderstanding and shameless appropriation of his taxpayer-protection initiative.

The wealthiest taxpayers in this state, the top five percent, paid nearly 70-percent of California income taxes last year. Those citizens were also supposed to get relief from the Gann Limit. Instead, they get nothing.

Newsom is sending rebates to the bottom two-thirds of tax filers only. What about the top-third, who paid a whopping 97-percent of the total income taxes in 2018, for example? In Newsom’s redistribution plan these top payers are simply out of luck, even though it’s their payments providing the bulk of the excess. And before you shout, “tax the rich!” understand that in that same tax year, we are talking about people making \$60,000 a year.

It’s great that the Governor wants to help taxpayers during the pandemic, even though it was state policy that caused so much of the damage to small businesses and killed so many jobs. If the governor and legislature want to make more direct payments to citizens out of the general fund, after Gann Limit refunds have been fairly distributed, be my guest.

In fact, I challenge Governor Newsom and the legislature to find ways to make the state more affordable and livable for all citizens, starting with lower taxes on personal income, on business income, on gasoline, and by eliminating green energy mandates that

have forced our electricity prices up 9-times faster than the national average over the past decade. These steps would help every day of the year, not just on the day he announces his budget.

Getting money back into the hands of job-creators – by lowering costs and equitably rebating the Gann Limit dollars – would actually fuel a California rebound.

But to repurpose a taxpayer protection act, approved by voters, into a new tax and welfare plan, is bad-faith politics and speaks to why Newsom is facing a recall.

Governor Brown’s 2017 budget dodged the Gann Limit by magically reclassifying \$22 billion in spending as neither state nor local, as required by the original Proposition, making it disappear, along with the hopes of fiscal conservatives.

Brown would not adhere to the mandates of the 1979 Gann Limit reform; he tricked his way past the law and shafted taxpayers along the way. Apparently, Governor Newsom was watching and learning, waiting for his own opportunity to betray the intent of California’s voters.

Mission accomplished. Newsom’s plan is ugly political alchemy, where he mutates a rebate program into a new tax on the homeowners, small business owners, teachers, police and other middle-class people who will be paying the taxes they will never get back. He should refund ALL taxpayers according to their tax payments and quit manipulating the Gann Limit for his political needs. ★



**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - Crises such as the year-long Covid pandemic and the following administration of vaccines has given many a chance to rise to the occasion and be their best selves. Unfortunately, these moments often-times also lend themselves to a little mischief such as what happened this April when staff at *The Landing at Carmichael*, an independent senior living community, realized their bus had its catalytic converter stolen.

Natalie McNeal, Executive Director of *The Landing*, explained to the Carmichael Times, “Independent senior living communities, unlike assisted living residences, are not required by state mandate to have in-house clinics,” because residents here generally do not have extremely critical health conditions. Independent communities are part of a continuum of options available to seniors depending on the lifestyle and health needs of residents, which keeps the cost of living at one more affordable.

McNeal continued to relate, “When the vaccine became available, we wanted to make sure to vaccinate all the residents who wished to do so, especially those who were wheelchair-bound and had trouble getting into automobiles. Many of our tenants are quite active and know they can approach us with any suggestions or ideas they have. So, one of them made the contact with their doctor, Dr. Wali Danesh, in Folsom who offered

to administer the vaccination to all our community.”

“When we went to start the bus that we use to shuttle residents to their appointments, we realized someone had done something to it, and we couldn’t get to Dr. Danesh’s clinic,” said McNeal, “the catalytic converter had been stolen!”

McNeal said that many of their residents also used a separate transportation organization called Paratransit, Inc., and since they were already signed up with that service, *The Landing* staff decided to give them a call.

When they got to Dr. Danesh’s clinic, the patients did not have to get out of the Paratransit transports. The nurses boarded the air-conditioned buses and vaccinated all aboard.

Paratransit also offered to fix the independent living’s bus in their fleet garage which turned out very convenient for the senior living community.

## California Still Mistreating Its School Kids

The traditional school year will soon end, but the maltreatment of California's 6 million public school students – especially those from poor non-white families – shamefully continues. Although on paper California's schools have reopened their classrooms after being closed to battle the spread of COVID-19 infection, most pupils will close out the year still struggling to learn at home or, in too many cases, having given up for a lack of technical and human support.

EdSource, an online site devoted to California education trends, detailed the educational disaster in a recent article, having delved deeply into state Department of Education data.

"Although 87% of California's traditional public schools have reopened for some form of in-person instruction, fewer than half of students have returned either full time or part time in a hybrid model," EdSource revealed. "A total of 55% of all public school students, including those in charter schools, were at home, in distance learning, as of April 30, according to an EdSource analysis of new data released by the state.

"EdSource found that two-thirds of students in district schools with the largest proportions of low-income families were in distance learning, compared with only 43% of students in schools with the fewest low-income families – a disparity that may partly explain a widening learning gap between wealthy and poor students that researchers and teachers suspect the pandemic has enlarged.

"Higher COVID rates in poor communities contributed to the disparity. Parents in highly infected areas have been reluctant to send their children back to school, and teachers in those areas resisted returning. Parents in low transmission areas, meanwhile, pressured school boards to reopen."

California is something of an outlier, according to monthly surveys of school reopening by the federal government's Institute of Education Sciences. With full classroom access available to only 11% of its students, the state is at or near the bottom, according to its March survey. Other states ranged to as high as 100%. In arch-rival Texas, 93% of students have full classroom access.

Months-long stalemates between teacher unions and local school leaders over the terms of reopening have been a major factor in California's tardiness. Gov. Gavin Newsom and the Legislature's dominant Democrats, who are politically allied with the unions, have been noticeably unwilling to intervene.

However, leaving reopening decisions in local hands has undermined the

promise of universal public education and led to the disparity that EdSource noted – classroom access for kids in upscale communities and homebound status quo in poor communities.

California already had an immense "achievement gap" before the pandemic flared and there's absolutely no doubt that the disparity has widened over the last 14 months, as a December report from McKinsey & Co. on national school trends underscores.

"Educators, parents, and students know firsthand the high cost of this prolonged period of remote learning, from rising rates of depression and anxiety to the loss of student learning," the report declared. "The COVID-19 pandemic has taken an especially heavy toll on Black, Hispanic, and Indigenous communities. Along with robbing them of lives and livelihoods, school shutdowns could deny students from these communities the opportunity to get the education they need to build a brighter future."

Newsom, facing a recall election next fall, has been running around the state declaring that the worst of the pandemic is over, that California's economy will soon fully reopen and that he expects that schools will return to normal schedules after summer.

Even if those predictions come true, California's neediest children will have fallen further behind their peers with diminishing chances of ever catching up.



# Dave Ramsey Says Governor's Actions Point to Need for Long-Term Water Investment

Dear Dave,  
My husband and I are both 29, and we have good jobs that allow us to bring home \$100,000 a year combined. Recently, we began talking about starting a family. We live on a budget, but we still have about \$15,000 in credit card debt and student loans we're working hard to pay off. Do you think couples should wait until they are debt-free to have children?

Dear Missy  
You and your husband are chipping away at your debt, and that's a good thing. It sounds like you two are determined to get it paid off and take control of your finances. You're also making pretty good money, so keep up the good work!

Ok, so the truth is kids can be expensive. From medical costs and diapers, to childcare and beyond, it costs money to raise a family. But here's the thing: If you let money alone, or the perfect financial situation, determine whether you have kids or not, you may never have them. Now, would it be easier from a financial standpoint only to wait on having kids until you're debt-free and there's a huge pile of cash in the bank? Sure, it would. But children are worth more than any amount of money. If you love each other and want to be parents, and you're mature adults in every other area, don't let this debt stop you.

A child isn't going to derail your journey to financial peace. Having kids might cause you to press pause for a while on some financial matters, or slow your pace a little bit, but as long as you both stay focused and determined to manage your money wisely, chances are things will work out fine.

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Actions in a widespread drought emergency order issued by Gov. Gavin Newsom will provide some short-term benefit through voluntary water transfers and exchanges in parts of drought-stricken California, the California Farm Bureau said, while the organization expressed concern about emergency powers granted to the state water board and re-emphasized the need for significant, long-term investments to secure future food production in the state.

The pandemic has reinforced that farming is an essential business and the drought has reinforced that water is essential to farming," California Farm Bureau President Jamie Johansson said. "We appreciate any effort the state can make to provide more water in the short term to farmers who need it. At the same time, we must not lose sight of existing water-rights priorities and the need to balance supplies for food production, fisheries and cities.

"By widening the drought emergency, the governor has recognized the reality facing much of rural California: Our future is not guaranteed," Johansson said. "By proposing to invest in canal repairs and other projects, he has shown a willingness to address part of that longer-term problem, but where are the projects the voters invested in when they approved a

water bond seven years ago?"  
"Following a year of economic shut-down for our communities, record wildfires, blackouts on the state's electrical grid and soaring home prices, it is apparent Californians face a quality-of-life issue. We hope this is a watershed moment in which we realize that building, not just planning, will preserve that way of life," he said.

"In addition to longer-term infrastructure needs, we also need to ensure family farms – and the people, communities and businesses that rely on them – are able to survive this year. We urge the governor to engage with family farmers, at the local level, to understand how best to ensure that our farms and the food they produce will be available to Californians for years to come," Johansson said.

"Water to farms means food for families, jobs for farm employees and much-needed help for rural economies," he said. "With predictions that climate change will lead to even less certainty about precipitation and water supplies, California must commit to a full-scale program to increase storage, enhance efficiency and create new supplies through water recycling and desalination."

The California Farm Bureau works to protect family farms and ranches on behalf of nearly 32,000 members statewide and as part of a nationwide network of nearly 5.6 million Farm Bureau members. ★





# Understanding Hospice!

Hello Toni:

As a certified case manager and critical care unit RN, I am advising adult children who are desperately seeking advice for their parents that are closing in on end-of-life issues. Those that have serious health care issues should be offered every option for proper planning as end-of-life care...most appropriately... hospice!

Can you explain hospice for your readers as I am sure this will help those who are seeking answers for their frail loved ones and give the caregiver some well needed rest?

Thanks in Advance...Susan from Denver Susan:

**HOSPICE ...** is a subject no one wants to discuss to their elderly family member when they are ill but can seriously help a family when their loved one is terminally ill as the illness takes a toll on the caregiver and the patient.

Many people wait too long to begin hospice benefits and believe hospice is for the last days to help a person die peacefully. Many doctors and individuals wait too long to order and receive hospice.

Hospice can give hope along this journey with education, medication to manage symptoms, support to the patient and family, and counseling services for the patient, family members and care givers.

Health care professionals in the hospice system consist of physicians, nurses, social workers, spiritual counselors, certified nursing assistants and volunteers. A hospice provider comes to where the patient lives to provide the care.

In the Medicare & You handbook, it explains what hospice is in Medicare terms and what Medicare covers for hospice under Part A of Medicare. A doctor that orders hospice must certify that you are terminally ill and have 6 (six) months or less to live. When you agree to hospice care, you are agreeing to comfort care (palliative care) instead of care to cure your illness. You also must sign a statement

choosing hospice care instead of other Medicare-covered treatments for your terminal illness.

Hospice can be recertified every 6 months by a hospice medical director or hospice doctor if you are still terminally ill. Original Medicare will be billed for your hospice care.

Hospice will cover all medical care for the terminal illness and Medicare will pay for health problems that are not related to your terminal illness (co pays will apply). Medicare-certified hospice care is usually given in your home or other facility where you live, like a nursing home.

For those who are enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan, when you are receiving hospice, the hospice benefit will be paid for by Original Medicare, not your Medicare Advantage plan. You will pay your co pay for any medical care that is not associated with the terminal illness.

- Medicare costs under Hospice:
- **You pay nothing for hospice care (Medicare pays)**
  - **You pay a copayment of up to \$5 per prescription for outpatient prescription drugs for pain and symptom management.**
  - **You pay 5% of the Medicare-approved amount for inpatient respite care.**

You can choose to walk through this journey helpless or have control over your end-of-life plan of care. Know that hospice provides comfort, dignity, protection of your wishes, love, and support.

Talk with a geriatric case manager or geriatric doctor if you have some concerns or need some advice with your loved one's terminal healthcare issue.

## May is American Stroke Month

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The American Heart Association/American Stroke Association, the world's leading voluntary organization focused on heart and brain health, is raising awareness about strokes for American Stroke Month in May. Strokes don't discriminate. They can happen to anyone, at any age - and about one in four people worldwide will have one in their lifetime. The good news? 80 percent of first strokes may be prevented.

Stroke prevention is especially important now as much of what puts you at risk for a stroke, uncontrolled high blood pressure, smoking or unhealthy weight, also increases your risk for complications due to COVID-19. High blood pressure is the leading preventable cause of stroke and up to 40% of Black adults in the U.S. have high blood pressure.


Stroke recovery begins the moment you suspect a stroke. The sooner a person can be treated for stroke, the more likely they are to have a successful outcome. He advises everyone to be ready to act FAST if they suspect a stroke.

The acronym F.A.S.T. stands for: Face Drooping - Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven? Arm Weakness - Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? Speech Difficulty - Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "The sky is blue."

Time to Call 9-1-1 - If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 9-1-1 and get to a hospital immediately. (Tip: Check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared.)

Stroke is largely beatable through high-quality rehabilitation and patient support as well as implementation of the Association's Rehabilitation Guidelines. Stroke rehabilitation can help patients build their strength, capabilities and confidence, potentially regaining skills and returning to independent living. Rehab can also help patients better manage other conditions they have, which may affect daily living or their risk for a second stroke.

## Armed Subject Barricaded in Vehicle Surrenders

**CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG)** - At approximately 1:00 pm on Monday, May 17, 2021, the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center received a call from a female resident who stated that her former boyfriend had physically assaulted her. The male subject had fled the home by the time deputies arrived. Later that evening, at approximately 9:04 pm, the same female resident called the Communications Center and stated that the male subject was back at her

home with a gun. The male subject fled the residence again before deputies could arrive but was spotted overhead by the Sheriff's Office Star Helicopter who alerted North Patrol Units to the location. North Patrol Units attempted to make a vehicle stop but the male driver led deputies on a lengthy pursuit through surface streets with speeds up to 90 MPH. The driver high-centered the vehicle on a median at the intersection of Grant Avenue and Fair Oaks Boulevard where it was disabled. The driver refused deputy's commands to exit the vehicle. Sheriff's Special Enforcement Detail (SED) and Crisis Intervention

Negotiating Team (CINT) were called to the scene. Negotiators were able to deescalate the situation and talked with the driver over several hours eventually convincing him to exit the vehicle peacefully. The Sheriff's Office is grateful for the assistance of the California Highway Patrol, Sacramento Police Department, Elk Grove Police Department and Folsom Police Department. Multiple firearms were located in the vehicle. Alejandro Garcia (37), of North Highlands, was arrested and booked into the Sacramento County Main Jail on 8 felony charges with a total bail of \$150,000. ★

The County must adopt final maps no later than December 15, 2021, which means the County will have approximately six weeks to complete its redistricting work – a very compressed timeframe.

### Timeline for Redistricting Work

May-September 2021: Hold public hearings and community workshops

about the Redistricting, the process, mapping tools tutorials and other redistricting information.

October-November 2021: Draft map preparation and review

November-December 2021: Map adoption.

Nov. 17: First reading of County ordinance adopting final district maps.

Dec. 2: Second reading of County ordinance adopting final district maps. ★

and Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services will meet again in September to determine funding.

### Community Input

In March, Sacramento County Behavioral Health Services virtually hosted informational sessions and solicited community input via a brief survey for community members to hear input on whether to implement or opt out of Laura's Law/AOT. 280 individuals participated in the survey. Nearly

three-quarters of participants indicated that they think Sacramento County should implement Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) (73 percent), 15 percent of participants indicated that they think Sacramento County should opt-out of AOT, and 12 percent of participants indicated that they were neutral or unsure about the decision.

### Court Requirements of AOT

AOT is a court-ordered outpatient treatment service for adults, ages 18 years and older, who have a

serious mental illness and a history of (a) psychiatric hospitalizations, (b) incarcerations, or (c) acts, threats or attempts of serious violent behavior towards themselves or others. Consumers must first be offered voluntary treatment within the past 10 days. The court cannot order involuntary administration of medications.

Family members, roommates, treatment providers and law enforcement may request an investigation to determine whether the consumer meets criteria. Only the

County mental health director or his or her designee may file a petition with the court. The person named in the petition has a right to a defender appointed by the court.

If a judge finds that the individual meets the criteria, the AOT order would be for a 180-day treatment period, not to exceed 180 days. After 180 days, the director of the AOT program can apply for an additional 180 days of treatment. If the consumer is not compliant with treatment, the consumer can be transported to a hospital and held

up to 72 hours. After 72 hours, the same hospitalization inpatient criteria such as being a danger to self, others, or gravely disabled.
